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DIFFERENT TRIP, SAME STORY IN VA DERBY

Four weeks ago in the GII Colonial Turf Cup, **Battle of**

Hastings (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) came up the fence to deny **Straight Story** (Giant's Causeway) after the latter had a wide trip. The tables were turned in yesterday's GII Virginia Derby, but the camera showed the same bay muzzle in front as **Battle of Hastings** came flying on the outside to nip his rival. "He's very honest and he gave me everything when he had to," rider Tyler Baze told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's an awesome horse." Having won the first two

races of the Grand Slam of Grass, the gelding may go for the next leg, the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington Park Aug. 8. The series, which offers over \$5 million in purse and bonus earnings, concludes with the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 7. **Cont. p2**

'JEWEL' SHINES IN DELAWARE OAKS

Canadian shipper **Careless Jewel** (Tapit) was let go at 10-1 while making her black-type bow yesterday in the GII Delaware Oaks,



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but belied those odds with an authoritative score. **Malibu Prayer** (Malibu Moon) gave chase throughout before settling for second, 7 1/4 lengths behind the winner. The 3-5 chalk **Bon Jovi Girl** (Malibu Moon) lagged behind

early and wound up a non-threatening fourth. "I was a little surprised nobody went with us," said winning rider Robert Landry. "It looked like speed, but sometimes when you see that, a lot of horses end up taking a hold. [Trainer] Josie [Carroll] has a done tremendous job. I just let the filly be where she was comfortable and she kicked on. She is the real deal." **Cont. p4**

ZAYAT, ROMANS PART WAYS

Fourteen Zayat Stables horses--including MGISW Thorn Song (Unbridled's Song) and MGSW Eaton's Gift (Johannesburg)--have been moved from the barn of Dale Romans, according to the operation's racing manager Sobhy Sonbol. Thorn Song, who added his second Grade I victory when he took the Shoemaker Mile May 25, is now with Mike Mitchell in California. He was fourth in the GII Firecracker H. July 4 in his final start for Romans. Eaton's Gift, winner of the GII Smile Sprint H. last Saturday, has joined Chad Brown's base in New York. The other 12 horses were divided between Mitchell and Brown. "The bottom line is that I thought my horses could be more productive on circuits other than in Kentucky," Sonbol said. "I moved Thorn Song to California because he obviously flourished out there, while he didn't care for Kentucky this year. And the Breeders' Cup is in California [this year]. With Eaton's Gift, he might go in the [Aug. 9 GII Alfred G. Vanderbilt H.] or in the [Oct. 3 GI] Vosburgh [S.]." Sonbol said the move wasn't an easy decision, but was based on figures that indicated Romans was underperforming in terms of earnings and winning percentages, as compared to the other Zayat conditioners. "I have an obligation towards my owner and my horses," Sonbol explained. "This is not something that happened overnight. It had been under consideration since January, and Dale [Romans] was aware of it."

With wins in the GIII Baldwin S. and La Puente S. at Santa Anita Mar. 1 and Apr. 11, Battle of Hastings travelled to Churchill and wound up second in the GIII American Turf S. May 1. He got back on top with a thrilling win over Straight Story in the GII Colonial Turf Cup June 20 ([video](#)), but that was only good enough to make him the 7-2 second choice here, as the bettors flocked to 8-5 Hold Me Back (Giant's Causeway), the GII Lane's End S. hero who was making his turf debut while having his first run since finishing 12th in the GI Kentucky Derby.

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How the Battle Was Won...

Straight Story was carried wide in the Colonial Turf Cup, so rider C.C. Lopez made sure the blaze-faced colt stayed out of trouble in second as Affirmatif (Unbridled's Song) raced through a :46.64 opening half over ground with plenty of give. Battle of Hastings, meanwhile, saved ground near the back of the pack before advancing as they approached the far turn. Straight Story led as they straightened into the lane, but his nemesis

rallied five wide and needed every inch of the stretch to take it by a flared nostril. The result unfortunately mirrored that of the 2007 races at Colonial, when Richard Santulli's Strike a Deal (Smart Strike) was nipped by a head and nose in the Colonial Turf Cup and Virginia Derby when the races were respectively worth \$750,000 and \$1 million.

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Trainer Bob Baffert took a hit when GI Santa Anita Derby winner Pioneerof the Nile (Empire Maker) was forced into early retirement two weeks ago, but he might have a replacement for the second half of the season in the form of homebred Misremembered. After finishing sixth on the turf in his Apr. 9 debut at Santa Anita, the chestnut graduated over this surface Apr. 29 and promptly added an allowance tally May 24. Baffert stepped him up in class for the GIII Affirmed H. June 20, and he wound up chasing Grazen home on his way to a runner-up effort.

Misremembered assumed command at the outset this time and played "catch me if you can" with Grazen while putting up splits of :24.44, :49.18 and

1:12.83. The odds-on chalk took a solid run at him, but the second choice stayed on determinedly to complete a graded double for his sophomore sire. "He's a free-running horse and I wanted to take it to the other horse early," said winning rider Victor Espinoza. It was a record-tying fourth win in the Swaps for Baffert. "It's sort of been tough, I've been depressed since Pioneerof the Nile got hurt, so this sort of takes a lot of the sting out of it," Baffert offered. "He was coming into this race in great shape and he's going to get better with age." As for breeding the winner, the conditioner quipped, "I've never had a horse like this, all our horses are terrible. John Sikura [of Hill 'n' Dale Farm]--he had the [John] Franks dispersal --he called me up and said this mare is in the sale, and she [Beyond Perfection] is open. I was looking for an old Grade I winner because my breeding operation is horrible. He recommended her. I remember her running when I first got in the business. [Jack] Van Berg had her. She won the Del Mar Debutante. He looks a lot like her."

Careless Jewel had never raced on conventional dirt before, but turned this class test into a procession. Third in her debut going six panels on Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 5, the grey filly graduated next out at Woodbine with a 3 1/2-length score in a May 9 sprint ([video](#)). She stretched out to two turns for an allowance June 21 and utilized her speed successfully en route to a 7 1/4-length victory ([video](#)). The out-of-towner broke alertly and gawked at the stands before settling into an easy rhythm on the front end. After six furlongs in 1:10.96, she found another gear and left her rivals in the dust, opening up for her first graded trophy. It was the ease of her June 21 win that led trainer Josie Carroll to pick this spot. "When [rider Robert Landry] did finally turn her loose, she just sprinted away," Carroll noted. "You do not see that a lot first time going a route. She impressed me that day, and we thought it was time to test her. Evita Argentina withstood Stardom Bound (Tapit) to land the GIII Sorrento S. last summer, but faltered behind that champion in her next two, the GI Del Mar Debutante S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Second in the GII Santa Ynez S. in her 2009 bow, the chestnut surged past the boys to land the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 16, but ran fourth in her next two, the GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland Apr. 8 and GII Hollywood Oaks June 7. Evita Argentina cabooseed the field as usual before winding up with her five-wide run. The sophomore hit the front in deep stretch and ran on well to pick up her third graded success. "I'll probably run her in the [GIII] Rancho Bernardo [H. Blind Date captured two of three starts during her juvenile campaign. She made a successful turf debut in her 2009 opener, the five-furlong Hookedonthefeelin S. at Pimlico Apr. 18, and promptly added the 8 1/2-panel Hilltop S. over that course May 15. Things didn't go as well last out in the June 27 GIII Boiling Springs S. at Monmouth, however, and the Maryland-bred wound up seventh as the 2-1 choice. Favored once more this time, the bay filly bided her time in seventh as longshot Five Diamonds (Flutter) led until the turn for home. Peach Brew's last win came in the Oklahoma Lassie S. at Remington in September, but the dark bay had picked up quite a few checks in the interim. Third to Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Martha Washington S. at Oaklawn Feb. 15, she ran fifth in the GIII Honeybee S. at the same track a month later before closing out her Arkansas stint with a third in the Instant Racing S. Apr. 11. She ran second in the off-the-turf Double Delta S. over this synthetic strip May 2, and was beaten just 2 3/4 lengths when seventh in the May 23 American 1000 Guineas over the local lawn. Sent to Prairie Meadows, Peach Brew was third by a length in the GIII Iowa Oaks June 26 in her most recent trip postward, but didn't get much love at the windows here. She was content to race in fifth as 4-5 C.S. Silk (Medaglia d'Oro) set the pace before gearing up with a five-wide bid. The Oklahoma-bred dug in gamely and got the job done with a determined effort.

Silver Timber, seventh in last year's Jaipur, endured a 13-race drought after annexing an optional claimer over this course and distance July 22, 2007. He was haltered for \$25,000 from trainer Linda Rice out of a nar-

row, slump-busting win in a sprint over the Gulfstream spinach Apr. 4, and promptly scored by four lengths in New York-bred optional claimer over this course May 15. The grey came away smoothly under Eibar Coa and went up to shadow favored Heros Reward through hot splits of :21.71 and :44.53. The two were well clear entering the stretch, but Silver Timber finally got

on top of his rival and had enough real estate left to hold sway over the closing Due Date. "I have another horse named Redefined who has raced in this New York turf division quite a bit, and it seemed to be this horse [Silver Timber] had always had troubled trips," explained winning owner Michael Dubb. "When he was in for \$25,000 in Florida, with the whole sprint season ahead of us, it seemed like a bargain. Of course, everything seems easy on paper. The well-travelled Caprice had acquitted herself well while making her last 10 starts at eight different venues. Her only win in that span came in Santa Anita's La Zanzara H. Feb. 11 and, two starts later, she ran fourth to Winter View (Thunder Gulch) in the GIII Bewitch S. at Keeneland Apr. 23. The bay mare came into this contest off a good third to Criticism (GB) (Machiavellian) in the GII Sheepshead Bay S. at Belmont May 23. 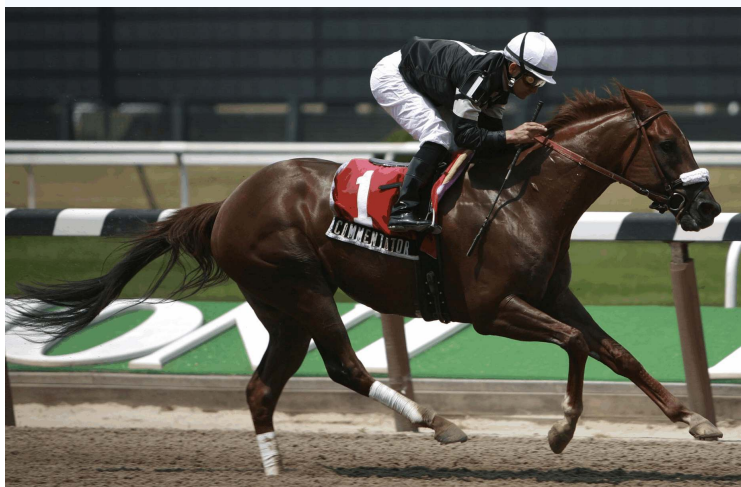

F-T JULY LAUNCHES YEARLING SEASON

The 2009 yearling season officially kicks off Monday with Fasig-Tipton's July Sale at the Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky. With just under 500 yearlings cataloged for the two-day sale, as compared to 568 in 2008, officials are hopeful that the increased focus on quality will bolster the bottom line. "We made the decision to raise the bar in terms of the quality of horses in the sale, particularly trying to eliminate the horses off the bottom end," explained Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning Jr. "We anticipated that the market was likely to be more selective in 2009 than it had been in 2008, and we made the conscious decision to ensure that the yearlings we accept to the July sale fit, both in terms of pedigree and conformation. The overall demand might be slightly lower this year, so we wanted to have a slightly reduced supply in July."

Earlier this decade, Fasig-Tipton had tinkered around with the number of yearlings being offered in July with varying success. While final figures showed increases with scaled-back catalogs in 2004 and 2006, corresponding numbers dipped in 2005 and 2007 when catalog size was increased. Heralding the impending economic crisis, numbers dropped again in 2008.

"We're trying to eliminate the yo-yo effect in the July sale marketplace," said Browning Jr. "We're trying to be a little more consistent in the approach that we take with the selection and the number of horses that we catalog. We are very pleased with the horses that we have put together and we think the overall quality this year is higher than in years past. That should help balance things out."

JULY'S GOLDEN BOY

In history, only a select few horses have made it to the GI Belmont S. following wins in the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., with a chance to sweep racing's Triple Crown. Of those, even fewer--11 to be exact--have swept the cherished Triple. Only one of them has ever been offered and sold at public auction. That honor resides with 1977 Triple Crown hero Seattle Slew. Bred by Ben Castleman at White Horse

Acres (currently Cobra Farm), Seattle Slew was the only yearling offered by Castleman at the fledgling Fasig-Tipton July Sale in 1975. In the market for an early developing two-year-old to win Sunland Park's Riley Allison Futurity, one of the richest juvenile races at the time, Karen and Mickey Taylor came upon a colt in the July catalog that looked like he had the potential to fit the bill.

"Mickey looked at the whole catalog before he went to that year's sale," recalled Karen. "He dog-eared hip 128, a colt by Bold Reasoning out of My Charmer."

Winner of the Withers S. and Jersey Derby and runner-up in the Metropolitan H., Bold Reasoning, who also set a track record for six furlongs at Belmont Park at four, retired to Claiborne Farm in 1972. His first foal crop, which included Seattle Slew, were newly turned yearlings in the spring of 1975. Bold Reasoning was injured in a breeding shed accident that April. Euthanized after developing complications, he only produced three crops prior to his death. Seattle Slew was the first foal produced by 1972 Fair Grounds Oaks winner My Charmer (Poker), who was also bred by Castleman.

"We liked Bold Reasoning because he was a relatively new sire, and the colt was a first foal out of the mare, and we really like first foals," Karen continued. "We bought four yearlings in total at Fasig-Tipton that year, and two of them were by Bold Reasoning. We liked him as a sire. He was a big horse, but he had tremendous speed, being by Boldnesian, who was by Bold Ruler. We thought the colt would have plenty of speed from his sire."

While the dark bay appeared to have plenty of potential on paper, the Taylors didn't shy away from the fact that both the colt's sire and dam were, at that time, still unproven. When it came to selecting young horses, the Taylors opted to focus on the physical element over the pedigree. **Cont. p2**

And what was the Taylors's impression the first time they saw hip 128 led out for inspection?

"The first time we met him, he didn't just walk out of his stall, he burst out with energy and fire," recalled

Karen. "He had pizzazz, he was on his toes and he gave you this eye, that he had until the day he died, that would stop you in your tracks. Everybody noticed his eye. They always talk about the 'eye of eagles' in a horse, and Slew had it. He had an eye that just could look into your soul."

While the youngster had plenty of personality and charisma, certain aspects of his physical appearance caused many to look elsewhere. But not the Taylors.

"He was well muscled, but he also had a very straight hind leg and, since Mickey was into Quarter Horses, that didn't deter us," explained Karen.

Mickey added, "His straight leg probably turned off 90 percent of the people, because at that time, people thought a straight leg was just for sprinters. He was a big reason that many changed their philosophy about those types of horses. In fact, A.P. Indy [by Seattle Slew] also has a very straight hind leg, and he went on to win the Belmont S., too."

But despite Slew's conformational shortcomings, Karen was instantly sold on the big, awkward colt.

"I liked him because he had short cannon bones and short pasterns," Karen explained. "He turned out slightly in his right front, but he walked straight through it and had a terrific stride, so that didn't bother us. I just fell in love with him the first time I saw him."

Paul Mallory, farm manager of White Horse, was charged with looking after the single-horse consignment and was given every indication early that the Taylors were the farm's best chance at getting the yearling sold.

"When we went to see Slew, Paul told us we were the only people who came back to look at him again," said Karen. "In fact, we must have gone back five times. We had to go back several times, because he would always dance around and was on his toes, and we wanted to go back and get a better look."

In only its second year, the July Sale had already been responsible for selling its first Kentucky Derby winner in Bold Forbes. However, at the time Seattle Slew was being offered in the summer of 1975, the Irish Castle colt was still racing in Puerto Rico and was a year away from winning the Run for the Roses.

Mickey recalled, with vivid clarity, the moment Seattle Slew walked into the Fasig-Tipton pavilion the afternoon of July 19, 1975.

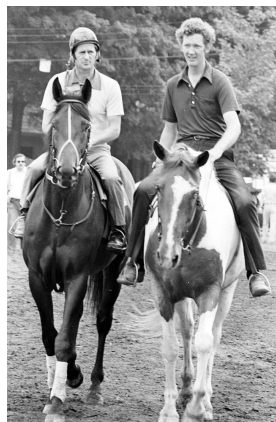
On that occasion, Fasig-Tipton's John Finney was the announcer, while Ralph Retler served as the auctioneer.

"We were sitting on the left side of the pavilion, in about the eighth or ninth row, on fold-out chairs," Mickey remarked. "There was only one other bidder--we could have been bidding against the reserve or the owner. I bid \$15,500, then there was another bid from the other side, and I went to \$16,500. To tell you the truth, I was probably going to stop at \$15,500, but Karen gave me the elbow."

Karen quickly interjected, "I gave him *two* elbows. I was pretty determined to get him."

After landing the colt for \$17,500, the Taylors purchased a few more at public sales later that season. They secured 11 yearlings in total that year. The most expensive was a colt by Speak John, later named Big John Taylor, who was purchased for \$27,000. The bay went on to annex the GII Massachusetts H. and GIII Roseben H. in 1978.

After securing Seattle Slew, the Taylors initially kept the strapping colt in Kentucky before sending him to Paula Turner at Andor Farm in Monkton, Maryland. It wouldn't be long before the baby would start to show glimmers of bigger things to come.

"We sent seven of our earlier two-year-olds to [trainer] Billy Turner at Belmont Park," explained Mickey. "Sometime in July [1976], they were going to work Slew out of the gate. Billy had the others horses breezing go really slow, but when he worked him out of the gate, Slew went in :44 flat. The clockers just couldn't believe it and turned it in as :49. I clocked him myself, so I was sure how fast he went. It was just unbelievable. At that point, we knew we bought ourselves a fast horse."

Mickey added, "We were going to run him in the latter part of the Saratoga meet and [jockey Jean] Cruguet came by to work him. Slew worked in 1:08 2/5. It was faster than older horses ran six furlongs that afternoon. I was in Washington at the time and, after that work, everyone was trying to run me down to make an offer on the horse."

After having purchased the colt for a bargain price of \$17,500 only a year earlier, did Micky find himself tempted, even in the slightest, to part with Seattle Slew?

"I never listened to the offers, I just told them he wasn't for sale," assured Mickey, adding, "Slew went on to be a tremendous racehorse and a tremendous sire. He became a sire of sires. He is the most complete Thoroughbred that has ever been, or will probably ever be. You just can't put a price on that."

FASIG-TIPTON JULY SELECT PREVIEW...

NATURAL SELECTION

Consignor Select Sales, created earlier this year, embarks on its maiden voyage at this year's Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale in Lexington. While the venture might be a relative newbie in the horse racing industry, many of the principals are not. Machmer Hall--a breeding and pinhooking operation owned by Carrie and Craig Brogden, and Carrie's mother, Sandy Willwerth--is among partners that head the new venture, along with Tom Ryan. Ryan, who worked with Coomore's stallion operation following his arrival from Ireland in 1999, made the move from the farm life to an office position with Bradley Thoroughbred Brokerage in 2001. In 2007, the Irishman officially launched Cherokee Equine International, a full service agency, and it was during his time as bloodstock agent that he met, and partnered with, the Brogdens on numerous deals.

"We thought if we could combine forces, then we could be a force to be reckoned with," explained Ryan. "If everybody else can do it, why can't we? We have plenty of experience. We've traveled a lot. Craig and I have been around the world and had seen how it was done in other places, so the fact is that we have more experience at it than the people who are actually doing it."

According to Ryan, finding someone with the experience and talent to manage the full service program on a daily basis was of vital importance to himself and the Brogdens.

"We felt we wanted to find the right general manager, somebody who is meticulous enough to keep on top of everything, and be a really good general manager. We found that person in Andrew Cary," he said.

Cary, who is in charge of the day-to-day operation of sales and administration of Select Sales, previously served as sales director for Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency from 2006 to 2008. He is also vice president of Thoroughbred Futures, a racing partnership that purchases and campaigns two-year-old racing prospects.

"My basic inspiration was to have a face for myself, our operation and the horses we breed," explained Carrie Brogden, who also serves as the director of sales. "I am very proud of the horses that have come off our farm."

Further explaining the impetus behind the operation's creation, Cary added, "They wanted to have a little more control, and instead of paying out commissions every year, they decided to keep it in-house."

For their first foray selling under the Select Sales banner, a total of 12 yearlings have been earmarked for the July sale.

"I think our horses will appeal to buyers at all price points," said Cary.

Additionally, the operation expects to offer about 75 yearlings at Keeneland in September and at Fasig-Tipton in October, and will also be represented at Keeneland in November and next January.

"We always try to place the horses where there will be the most buyers for them," explained Brogden. "You cannot take a non-select horse to July; there are just not going to be any buyers for them. Placement is key."

All Roads Lead to Paris...

Carrie Brogden, the daughter of equine veterinarians, got an early start around horses in her native Virginia and spent much of her childhood riding and competing on the local equestrian circuit. At 16, Brogden redirected her focus to her education while attending James Madison University, where she earned a degree in psychology and biology. After spending an additional eight years in a suburb outside of Washington D.C., Brogden decided to follow her passion for horses, and headed to Kentucky, where she met her future husband, Craig. Soon after marrying, the couple decided to purchase a 105-acre parcel of land--previously operated as a cattle farm--in Paris in 2001. Named Machmer Hall--after a building that honors Brogden's great-grandfather who was once Dean of the University of Massachusetts--the couple took on the full service breeding operation together. With Carrie dealing primarily with administrative and sales duties, Craig--a native Australian--serves as general manager of the operation. After adding smaller tracts of land in subsequent years, Machmer Hall ballooned to 360 acres in February 2008, when the operation's principals purchased an additional 180 acres--for a reported \$2,080,000--from Arthur Hancock's adjacent operation, Stone Farm.

Currently, Machmer Hall boards over 60 yearlings and houses approximately 180 horses, many of which are owned alone or in partnership by the Brogdens.

"We do lots and lots and lots of partnerships," said Brogden. "We are really very lucky, because we have some really great partners to work with." **Cont. p5**

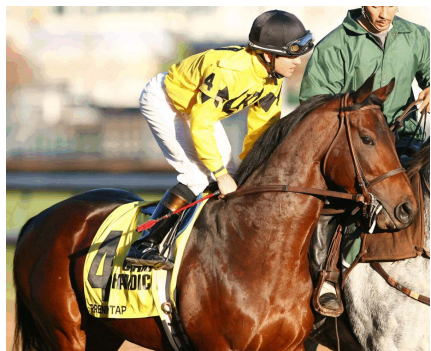

Among horses that Machmer Hall bred in partnership was **Premium Tap** (Pleasant Tap), winner of the 2006 GI Woodward S. and GI Clark H. Co-bred by Will Farish, the bay, who brought \$60,000 at OBS March in 2004, sold privately for an undisclosed amount to Saudi interests following his 7 1/4-length Clark win. In his only start for his new interests, he finished runner-up to Invador (Arg) in the 2007 G1 Dubai World Cup. Also to come out of the

Machmer Hall program are 2008 GI Vosburgh H. winner **Black Seventeen** (Is It True), who was purchased by Machmer Hall for \$35,000 as a weanling at OBSOCT and later resold for \$50,000 as a yearling at OBSAUG; **Meadow Breeze** (Meadowlake), who sold for \$45,000 at this venue in 2005 before scoring in the following

season's GI Matron S.; **Accredit** (E Dubai)--a \$32,000 OBSOCT weanling who later sold to Darley for \$160,000 at KEESEP and scored in the May 2 GII Churchill Downs S.; and **Join in the Dance** (Sky Mesa), who was also bred in

partnership and later sold privately following a second-place finish in his second career start at Arlington on June 8, 2008.

"If it's something we believe in, I am not afraid to go on and race them," said Brogden.

This term, the bay was runner up to Musket Man (Yonaguska) in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby.

Outlining the success the farm has enjoyed the past few years, Brogden added, "I am very proud that in the past five years, we have Grade I caliber horses come off the farm. I'm not saying we're geniuses or anything, there's just something special about this land and something to be said about just letting horses be horses."

Select is as Select Does ...

The first offering of Select Sales yearlings features a solid mix of young, up-and-coming stallions to complement sires with already established reputations. Among the latter group is Hill 'n' Dale resident Stormy Atlantic, who is responsible for [hip 221](#). Offered during the opening session, the filly is out of Shadow On the Moon (Deputy Minister). An unraced daughter of Grade I stakes-placed Far Flying (Far North), who is a half-sister to champion Sacahuista, the Mar. 2 foal is from the extended family of graded-stakes winner Dalhart (Forty Niner), and Garimpeiro (Mr. Prospector), dam of Grade I stakes winner Geri (Theatrical {Ire}) and graded stakes winner A.P. Arrow (A.P. Indy).

Scheduled to be led through the ring early in the second session is [hip 251](#), a son of Songandaprayer. The Jan. 11 colt is the first foal produced by Tiz Fate (Tiznow), a granddaughter of GISP Honest and True (Mr. Leader), who in turn produced juvenile champion filly Epitome (Summing). Also slated for the second day of selling is [hip 364](#), a colt by Stephen Got Even. Out of the Belong to Me mare Family First, he is from the family of GSW Sky Alliance (Sky Classic) and GISP Modification (Vindication).

"Personally, I think I have the best Stephen Got Even that I have ever seen," said Brogden of the sole colt by that sire presented in this year's catalog. "He's really is a very nice horse and very cool horse to be around."

Gainesway's Tapit is also well represented in this year's catalog, and Select Sales offers one of the stallion's progeny in [hip 321](#). Out of Cherished Trick (Phone Trick), the New York-bred colt was acquired as a weanling for \$65,000 at the Saratoga Fall Mixed Sale last October.

"Honestly, I am very happy with the whole consignment," offered Brogden. "We are really focusing on taking the really forward, mature physicals to this sale. Our horses deserve to be there. We have the Book 6 pedigrees with the Book 1 physicals. That's always been our forte, as far as our farm. We can't afford the huge pedigrees with the great conformation, because everyone wants those. So we just try to focus on having the athletes. Black Seventeen didn't get accepted to July, because he didn't have the pedigree. But if you saw him as a yearling, he would have absolutely knocked your socks off. He was gorgeous. He was all class."

With the official launch of Select Sales just around the corner, Brogden is already contemplating what may lie down the road for the fledgling venture.

"I don't want us to ever have a huge consignment," she said. "I look toward operations like Hill 'n' Dale--I think they have a really good-size program. We will never have stallions or deal with any huge numbers. We want to keep it a little more limited, but select."

Brogden, a firm believer in transparency and honesty in the industry, acknowledges that while the horse business is a "labor of love" that can be broken down into long hours and plenty of hard work, the operation's long-term view and underlying philosophy is very simple.

"My goal is to raise runners," said Brogden. "I am very proud of the horses that have gone on to be graduates of our farm, and we will continue to try and give our clients the very best."

THE LEGACY LIVES ON

It can certainly be said that Legacy Bloodstock knows a thing or two about offering high-quality yearlings by first-crop stallions. At the 2007 Keeneland September

Yearling sale, Legacy--headed by Tommy Eastham--led over a filly by first-crop sire Tapit, and sold the daughter of My White Corvette (Tarr Road) for \$50,000 to Michael Yates. Picked up for \$375,000 by trainer Christopher Paasch at last year's OBS March sale, the gray,

named Stardom Bound, went on to three consecutive Grade I victories that year, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Collecting a divisional championship in the process, the filly subsequently sold for \$5.7 million at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale.

"The good horses are the ones that you know are there, but don't require any extra teaching," said Eastham when asked about the Legacy alum. "They're generally quiet and well manered, but they really kind of sneak up on you a lot of times. Stardom Bound had such a great shoulder and length of forearm, and a great walk. We knew she was nice, but we didn't know she was going to be a two-year-old champion."

Legacy, with eight on offer during the first day's 'New Sires Showcase,' believes he has brought the right kind of horse to July, regardless of where they fall in the catalog.

"It just worked out that way this year," said Eastham when asked if it was the plan to have the majority of this consignment sell during the young stallions' segment. "We probably have more new sires than a lot of people, but this has always been the kind of place to bring those horses. There are a lot of professional buyers here, and it takes a strict conformation and a strict physical to do well here. The horse has to be very early, have a very strong top line and has to fit well. It is a good sale to bring a horse, but you'd better bring the right ones."

He added, "There have probably been more trainers here this year, and this has always been a really commercial market for the two-year-old pinhookers."

Hoping to follow in the hoofprints of Legacy's most illustrious graduate is a pair of fillies, including [Hip 16](#), a filly by freshman sire Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat). The Mar. 10 foal is out of Smooth Maneuvers (Grindstone), winner of the GIII Anne Arundel S.

"Her placement in the catalog is not ideal; I would have preferred if she was hip 216, but that's just the luck of the draw," Eastham said. "She's a very nice and athletic-looking filly. She's very commercial and very quick, which should appeal to buyers."

Scheduled for later in the first session is [hip 189](#), by Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), whose first crop are juveniles this year. The filly is the first foal out of Encore (Nureyev), who is a half to Grade II winner Smooth Jazz (Storm Boot).

"She reminds me a lot of what Stardom Bound was like," said Eastham. "Like Stardom Bound, she is very calm, good minded, and has a lot of length of forearm and a lot of length of shoulder. I think she's more of a two-turn type of filly."

The Legacy camp can only hope that the similarities don't end there.

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Tom Ryan, Select Sales Partner, on the yearling market:

"I trade a lot in the private market, and the private market is very light at the moment. It comes down to if you have the right product, you are going to get paid for it. Now, is the market going to be down [as much as] 30 percent from years' past? Probably. Everything in the world is down. I can't see why this particular market would be up. I think that, with regard to investment in these horses, we are fortunate that we are not in too deep. I wouldn't like to be coming in here with a \$125,000 foal trying to pinhook to a yearling. He would need to be spectacular and by a very, very nice sire."

Tommy Eastham, Legacy Thoroughbreds, on this season's freshman sires:

"I like Flower Alley. He has a lot of well-balanced horses. They have a lot of the qualities of Distorted Humor, who was a really good racehorse and is a great sire. Of the ones I've seen, they're big enough with good bone and foot, but they're not overly big. The medium-size horses are the ones that tend to stay sound and run, and that seems to be what he's siring so far. I think that's why the Tapits have done so well, because they are also lighter-frame horses."

HOLLYWOOD TO TRIM FALL MEET Hollywood Park will seek to trim its fall meeting by four days, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The troubled track



originally had been scheduled to run 31 days between Nov. 11 and Dec. 21, but will seek approval from the California Horse Racing Board to instead open Nov. 13. During the current meeting--which ends today--Hollywood cut live racing on

Wednesdays due to a horse shortage in Southern California. "With respect to going to a four-day week, it was by far our only alternative," track president Jack Liebau told *DRF*. "We got through the meeting without a purse cut, which I was dreading, and we were able to produce a card for each and every day we were scheduled to run. From that point of view, it was a success. If we had stayed at five days a week, we would have had a purse cut. Wednesday is a day you run and you don't generate sufficient purse money for the amount you give away. Even at four days, [racing secretary Martin] Panza had to struggle." Liebau added, "We've got a shrinking horse population that is not attributable to horses disappearing, but a sign of economic times. We've got shrinking owners. As soon as they are able to monetize a horse, as far as getting it claimed or sold, they aren't replacing it. They aren't putting a horse in training. We're in a time when it costs up to \$3,000 a month to train a horse, and that's discretionary income."

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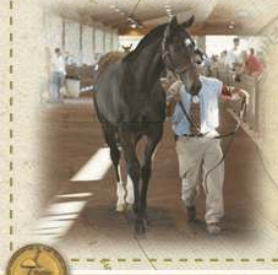

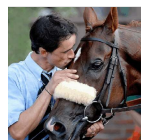
