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BIRDSTONE COLT TOPS FASIG OPENER

The dust had settled and it appeared the days' fireworks had ended, but Darley struck late to take home the session-topper at yesterday's first day of the Fasig-Tipton July Selected Yearlings Sale in Lexington. Sheikh Mohammed, represented by bloodstock advisor John Ferguson, secured [hip 228](#), a colt by GI Belmont S. winner Birdstone (Grindstone), for \$400,000. Ferguson, who was noticeably absent earlier in the session, was on hand to sign the ticket on the Apr. 4 foal. Consigned by Dapple Stud, the \$37,000 KEEJAN

yearling purchase is out of the unraced mare Slew Smarts (Seattle Slew). "We thought he was the right horse and a very good-looking individual," said Ferguson. A resident of Gainesway, Birdstone's oldest crop of foals is currently three-year-olds. The diminutive bay recorded a rare Classic double this season after Mine That Bird took the GI Kentucky Derby and Summer Bird rounded out the Triple Crown with a victory in the GI Belmont S. "He has already produced two Classic horses, so you have to take him seriously," Ferguson said about the young sire. **Cont. p2**

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Darley Returns to the Well...

In a year that started off with Barbaro (Dynaformer) dominating headlines, it was Darley's Bernardini (A.P. Indy--Cara Rafaela, by Quiet American) who bagged the three-year-old championship following victories in the GI Preakness S., GI Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. It was of no surprise yesterday that Sheikh Mohammed's interests were back to secure [hip 169](#), a bay colt from the Darley homebred's first crop. Representing Darley bloodstock advisor John Ferguson, Richard O'Gorman shut out the competition with a final \$350,000 bid. Consigned by Lane's End, the May 6 foal is out of G2 Nassau S. winner Lyphard's Delta (Lyphard), dam of GISW Indy Five Hundred (A.P. Indy) and MGSW Delta Princess (A.P. Indy).

"He was a very nice horse," said O'Gorman. "We obviously loved the sire, and we felt that this colt was the right type. We were very high on him."

Also charmed by the handsome colt was Lane's End's Bill Farish.

"He does look a little bit like his sire, Bernardini," said Farish. "He might be a little smaller than him, but this is a May foal, so that is to be expected."

Indy Five Hundred, who was purchased by Peter Minikes from the Lane's End consignment for \$210,000 at the 2001 Keeneland September sale, later sold in foal to Kingmambo to Darley for \$3 million at Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November in 2007. Lane's End also served as acting agent on a pair of other yearling scores out of Lyphard's Delta, including Absolute Return (Carson City), who brought \$300,000 at KEESEP in 2004 and Delta Miner (Mineshaft), who brought \$500,000 at KEESEP in 2006.

"It's very hard to be upset about the price, given the state of this market," said Farish. "We're content with what we got."

Darley also purchased a colt by first-crop sire A.P. Warrior for \$115,000 through O'Gorman. Out of SW Wildcatseye (Forest Wildcat), the Feb. 29 foal ([hip 50](#)) was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent. "We were looking through the horses here and we took a liking to him," said Ferguson. "He was a very athletic and correct horse, that just took our eye."

Give That Man a Cigar...

Not long after the auctioneer stopped his patter on Day 1 at FTKJUL, Dapple Stud's Mike Akers took a moment to savor his success with his session-topping Birdstone colt. "I'm standing here enjoying a fine cigar, courtesy of Darley," remarked Akers, who had adjourned to the Fasig-Tipton cocktail party.

Dapple Stud acquired hip 228 for a mere \$37,000 as a KEEJAN short yearling, before his sophomore sire had started making big headlines. Akers believed the colt he'd bought was a good one, but he never envisioned the fanfare that would ensue just six months later.

"I can't take the credit," Akers said. "We bought him from [breeder Bob K. Sliger], who raises really good horses,

and he came highly recommended in January. Then we were lucky that Birdstone came up with a couple of Classic horses. We caught a hot stallion."

It comes as no surprise to Akers that Birdstone has been a hit, however. "He was priced right [when he went to stud]," he offered. "We have bred to him every year, and two of the best foals on our farm are by Birdstone. We weren't hesitant about taking a chance, even though the jury might still have been out on him."

Dapple's son of Birdstone proved a real crowd pleaser at Fasig-Tipton. "The buyers were all over this horse," Akers said. "He was scoped nine different times, and I believe some of the scopes were for more than one buyer using the same veterinarian. He was the horse-men's pick of the sale. He's quite an athlete."

Still, the hammer price exceeded expectations. "There was quite a bit of traffic this morning, and he handled it all very professionally," Akers said. "He stepped up to the plate at every call. But, at breakfast, I would have said I'd be tickled to death if he brought \$200,000."

But Akers won't be shocked to see the colt on the 2010 Triple Crown trail. "He has a Classic frame, and I think the buyers are looking to go where the Birdstones have been going--to the Classics," he said.



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Rock Solid at Fasig-Tipton July

With only a smattering of yearlings realizing six-figure bids early in yesterday's opening session, it appeared unlikely that anything would come close to last year's top price of \$375,000. That is until [hip 147](#), a filly by Rock Hard Ten, strode into the ring. After a spirited

bidding duel that lasted about 10 minutes, it was Dennis Yokum, representing Mercedes Stables, who signed the ticket for the dark bay, landing the filly for \$350,000. Consigned by Meg Levy's Bluewater Sales, the Feb. 18 foal is out of Incredible Story (Seattle Slew), who is a granddaugh-

ter of GIII Selima S. winner Ken de Saron (Kenmare {Fr}). Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), winner of the GI Malibu S. and GI Santa Anita H., was campaigned by Mercedes Stable and Madeleine Pickens. The eight-year-old stallion currently stands for \$30,000 at Lane's End in Versailles. Mercedes Stables, which retains a majority share in the dark bay stallion, currently has 14 weanlings and 11 yearlings by the freshman sire.

"She was just the best individual in the sale," said Yokum. "She was just the best Rock Hard Ten I've seen, and we've seen a number of good ones. This filly was just a standout, and we wanted to have the top Rock Hard Ten."

And how does the filly compare to her sire?

"She *really* looks like Rock Hard Ten," Yokum confirmed. "She's just a big powerful filly. She has good length to her and she's a nice, tall, athletic filly. She's just a really good horse."

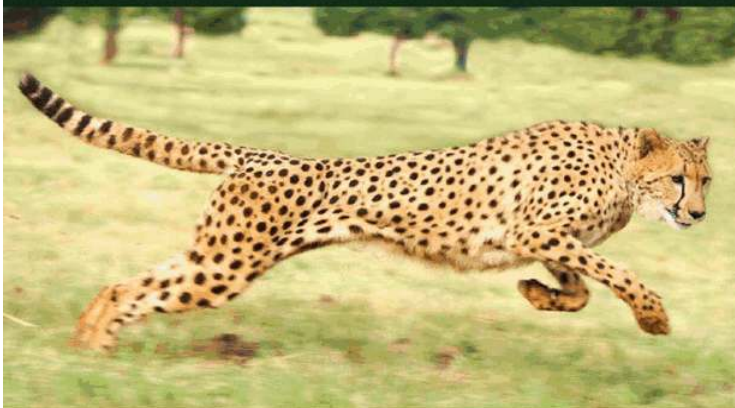
No surprise to Yokum, the dark bay was the first horse of the opening session to exceed the \$300,000 mark.

"I thought she could bring around \$300,000," said Yokum. "I thought [buyers] would be a little strong on her, because I really thought she was the best of the sale. In this market, the best ones are going to bring some money."

According to Yokum, the final price realized in a sluggish market was substantially lower than might have been expected.

"I think she would have brought about \$600,000 a couple of years ago," he said. "I figure I got her at a substantial discount."

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The Numbers Don't Lie...

Despite the flurry of six-figure sales nearing the end of Monday's opening session, final numbers slumped severely from a year ago. Fasig-Tipton officials were not surprised. "We're not happy about what happened today, but we expected it," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson. Average decreased by 24 percent, down to \$71,468 from \$93,739, and median fell 33 percent to \$50,000.

"In most markets, when there are downturns, people tend to migrate toward known, established products," said Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning Jr., explaining the opening session, which was comprised of the progeny of first or second season sires. "I'd be surprised if we didn't make up some ground [during the second session] when we will have more established sires."

Addressing some of the factors that may have contributed to the downturns, Browning added, "We would have liked to have seen more trainers than what we got, but we hope we'll see more [Tuesday]. We think we were more successful getting more owners here, but the numbers of pinhookers was down and we didn't get as many trainers as we would have liked, and that didn't help."

Despite the downturns, Browning was more optimistic looking ahead to today's second session.

"Horse for horse, it's better [Tuesday] than [Monday]," said Browning.

And when asked what it might take to reverse the current downward trend, Browning added, "If we had known a better way, we would have already done it by now, we just don't know."

Medaglia Spinning Gold at July Sale...

The crowd had visibly thinned out and just a handful of people remained in the sales pavilion, but at the back walking ring, a small group stood ready for [hip 246](#) to walk into the arena. The penultimate yearling on the afternoon, a colt by 'now' sire Medaglia d'Oro, closed the session's six-figure scores with a \$310,000 final bid from Jack Wolfe and Donald Lucarelli's Starlight Partners. Out of Tigresa (Tejano), the Jan. 31 foal is a half-brother to stakes winner War Tigress (War Chant).

"He was extremely athletic and by the hottest sire in the world," said advisor Frank Brothers. "He was just a beautiful animal. He was an extremely good walker, and just had the presence of a very nice horse."

According to Brothers, the colt will be sent to J.J. Pletcher's training center in Florida before joining Pletcher's son, trainer Todd Pletcher.

"We're looking forward to seeing him at Saratoga next summer," added Brothers.

Alone or in partnership, Starlight has enjoyed success with Pletcher trainees, including Ashado (Saint Ballado), Octave (Unbridled's Song), Purge (Pulpit) and Monba (Maria's Mon). In addition to the Medaglia d'Oro colt, Starlight also acquired [hip 189](#), a filly by Rock Hard Ten from the Legacy Bloodstock consignment for \$200,000, and four hips later, purchased another filly, this one by first-crop sire Belamy Road. The latter filly ([hip 193](#)) was offered by Warrandale Sales, agent for Lazy Lane Farms and sold for \$55,000.

Flower Power for Cheyenne Stables...

Marking his first purchase of the season, Everett Dobson of Cheyenne Stables went up to \$200,000 for a filly by first-crop sire Flower Alley (Distorted Humor). Offered by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the chestnut is out of Mazel Tov Betty (Mazel Trick), a half-sister to the stakes winning and graded stakes-placed fillies Somethingaboutbetty (Forestry) and Petunia (Lil E. Tee).

"I thought she was the total package," offered Dobson. "She was well balanced and she had all the right parts. That's going in the right direction."

According to Dobson, he was drawn to [hip 174](#)'s young sire, Flower Alley, who won the GI Travers S. and was runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic during his sophomore season. Last term, the filly represented the highest price for her sire, whose weanling average was \$49,857, when she was purchased for \$120,000 at Keeneland November. **Cont. p5**

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"She probably could have used a little more pedigree, but she was the best Flower Alley I've seen," Dobson said. "I also loved Flower Alley."

"I think this filly could have easily brought \$350,000-\$400,000 a year ago," said Dobson. "She was a real standout filly here, and I really wouldn't have been surprised if she had brought \$350,000 today."

Dobson, who has approximately 12 horses--most two-year-olds--in training with Todd Pletcher, Christophe Clement, and Donnie Von Hemel, operates out of his Lexington-based farm, Candy Meadows, which is home to about 15 horses, consisting of broodmares and foals.

Raising Dixiana...

Historic Dixiana Farm is enjoying a revival of sorts in 2009, and to commemorate its restoration to former glory, the breeding operation sets off on its maiden voyage in the sales arena at this year's July Sale. Located in Fayette County, the original parcel of land that made up historic Dixiana was broken down into smaller tracts and sold off to various interests over the latter half of the last century. Insurance magnate William Shively acquired the 302-acre Dixiana Farm from Mary Lou Wibel in 2004, and this past April added 365 acres to his property when he secured nearby Domino Stud for a reported \$13 million from Elaine Jones. Domino Stud was incorporated into Shively's Dixiana operation, increasing the modern version of Dixiana to over 1000 acres. Currently, the operation houses approximately 150 horses, which are spread out over three sub-divisions. Dixiana is the focal point of Shively's breeding operation, housing all of its mares and foals, while adjacent Woodland Farm is the site of the farm's yearling and sales-prep division. The newest addition, Domino Stud, is outfitted with a fully operational training track, and serves as the primary location where the young Dixiana horses are broken and trained, and where layups are boarded.

From two offered during Monday's opening session, the Dixiana consignment sold one in [hip 18](#), a colt by Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song) for \$100,000. The operation offers an additional four yearlings today, comprised of three homebreds and a pinhook. Representing the sole member of the consignment not foaled at Dixiana is [hip 275](#), a colt by Tiznow. Purchased for \$150,000 at last year's Keeneland November Sale, the Jan. 18 foal is out of Zadkiel (Saint Ballado), the dam of She's Cheeky (Black Minnaloushe), third in the GI Santa Monica H. The bay is also from the extended family of dual Grade I stakes winner Cheval Volant (Kris S.).

"The Tiznow colt has been very popular," said Terry Arnold, Dixiana's farm manager. "He's been forward ever since we got him. He's a big horse, but he's very smooth. He's very balanced and has a good eye."

Also up for grabs is [hip 422](#), a filly by Successful Appeal. The Jan. 11 foal is out of the 10-year-old mare Look for Good (Unbridled's Song), a half-sister to stakes winner and Grade I stakes placed Nonproductiveasset (Stalwart).

"She's looks like she's going to be an early type, so there have been a lot of pinhookers on her," Arnold said.

Dixiana will offer an additional 30 yearlings at Keeneland this September, and may send a draft to Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Sale in 2010, depending on the progress of the current weanling crop.

"Mr. Shively likes to race, so he's willing to back his horses up. They're here to sell, but if they don't, Mr. Shively is very willing to take them to the track," Arnold added.

Shively currently has horses in training with Ken McPeck, John Servis, Mike Trombetta, and Arnold's brother, Rusty. Among Dixiana's previous successes is War Kill (War Chant), winner of Keeneland's GII Beaumont S.

"We're proud of our horses, so we don't mind hanging on to them," said Arnold. "It's very cut and dry."

Smelling Like a Rose...

It is hard to argue that what Ted and Noreen O'Neill's Ann Marie Farm lacks in scale, it more than makes up for in quality. At this venue last year, the Kentucky-based operation, which is named after the O'Neills' daughter, led over a single yearling--a filly by Dehere

out of Paris Rose (Accelerator). Offered as hip 356, the dark bay was the first foal produced by the daughter of GI Santa Susana S. winner Fabulous Notion (Somethingfabulous). Secured by pinhooker Becky Thomas for \$35,000 and resold to Westrock Stables for \$250,000 at this year's OBS February Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the filly, later named Decelerator, scored in

her debut for D. Wayne Lukas at Churchill Downs May 14 before adding a victory in her latest start in the GIII Debutante S. over the Louisville oval June 27.

"It was a fair price," said Ann Marie Farm's manager Ron Patterson. "We had hoped she would bring \$50,000, but we made money at \$35,000 and that was good. We were glad that Becky bought her; we knew she went to really good hands, because we knew she would have a fair shot at being in a two-year-old sale. She was really very pretty and very fast, and she turned out to be the second highest priced filly at that sale."

This year, the operation leads over a half-sibling to the Grade III winner, a colt by Harlan's Holiday. The dark bay, one of only two in this year's Ann Marie consignment, is scheduled to sell today as [hip 467](#).

"He a really nice colt and very correct," confirmed Patterson. "We just hope that, since his sister has gone two-for-two, won the Grade III at Churchill in her last start and that Lukas is thinking of running her at Saratoga this summer, it will help him sell well."

California-based Ted O'Neill, who paid \$32,000 for Paris Rose as a yearling at Keeneland in September 2003, also owns the mare's half-sister, Paris Notion (Dehere). Paris Rose, who had complications foaling the Dehere colt last year, was bred back to Dehere this year, but failed to carry. According to Patterson, the seven-year-old mare will be bred back again next spring. In turn, her 11-year-old half-sister Paris Notion, who produced a colt by Lemon Drop Kid this season, has a yearling filly by that same sire that will be offered at the Keeneland September Sale.

The second member of this year's consignment is [hip 249](#), a colt by Dehere out of Time of Peace (Slew City Slew). The six-year-old unraced mare is out of GSW War Thief (Lord at War {Arg}), dam of GIII Transylvania S. winner Boss Lafitte (Dynaformer).

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"He is a really big, stout and well-made colt," offered Patterson. "He's very correct and very good looking. We'll just have to see what a Dehere colt brings in this market. Dehere lost some popularity [after being sent to Japan in 1999], and [Decelerator] was a member of the first crop since he returned to the United States [in 2005], and I think people have taken a wait-and-see kind of deal on him. Hopefully, the filly will help turn that around for him."

According to Patterson, an additional five yearlings are slated to sell at Keeneland in September, and a small draft of mares or weanlings will be offered later in the fall.

"Generally, we have several horses on the track at all times [in Northern California with trainer Lloyd Mason]," he continued. "So we'll bring fillies in from off the track and we'll sell a couple of the older mares at the sales each year, and then we'll bring in fillies off the track and replace them. We like to stay with 12 to 15 mares at the farm at any given time. We like to keep it small, but select."

Dr. Ronald Grothaus, a native of Toldeo, Ohio, who now heads up the veterinary team at Reynolds Road Animal Hospital in his hometown, signed the ticket on Sedona Berry for \$22,000 at KEENOV in 2003. The mare, then 11, foaled an Aptitude colt the following spring that brought \$160,000 as a 2004 KEENOV weanling. Named Level Red, he went on to run third in the GII San Felipe S. The mare was already the dam of Eishin Hampton (Dynaformer), a Japanese stakes winner with earnings of \$1,268,900, and she has proven a consistent producer. Her 2005 foal, a filly by Jade Hunter, was a \$25,000 KEENOV weanling sale for the Grothauses, and her 2006 progeny, a colt by Broken Vow, brought \$65,000 as a KEESEP yearling (he subsequently sold for \$625,000 as an OBSMAR juvenile). This Suave filly RNA'd for \$55,000 as a KEENOV weanling in 2008, but attracted more attention this time. For Grothaus and his wife, Kay, their involvement in Thoroughbred breeding is a family affair; sons Roger and Matthew, as well as their granddaughters, are active in the business. They currently have 28 horses on their Ohio farm.

She also produced a filly from the first crop by Medaglia d'Oro, Cassidys Pride, who is a stakes-placed winner of \$90,797 for Mirabelli, and her two-year-old of 2009, unraced Cassidys Jet (Proud Citizen), was a \$160,000 FTKJUL yearling. This colt added to the family's success.

This striking colt turned many heads and had all the right people scouting him out in the preliminaries. Bred by Classic Thoroughbreds, the Feb. 13 foal is out of Uncontrollable (Wild Again), who herself is a daughter of multiple stakes winner Graceful Minister (Deputy Minister). This colt also had a recent update to his page when his two-year-old full-sister Southern Truth, also consigned by Candyland Farm last year, broke her maiden for Bill and Vicki Poston in the slop at Monmouth June 5.

288, c, Speightstown--Awful Smart, by Black Tie Affair (Ire) *Consigned by John D Murphy, Occidental Thoroughbreds, agent*

The chestnut is out of Awful Smart, who was runner-up in the GI Test S. and third in the GI Gazelle S. According to Occidental Thoroughbreds' Andre Regard, the half to GSW Awfully Smart (Anees) has been very popular during the pre-sale activities. "He's been out over 110 times, and he has handled it great," Regard said. "He is a very scopey, rangy horse with a great walk, and it is a live family."

310, c, A.P. Indy--Capeside Lady, by Cape Town *Consigned by Dapple Stud, agent*

This colt's sire needs no introduction as the sire of a long list of champions, including Mineshaft, Rags to Riches, Bernardini and Tempera. Weighing in as one of the heavier catalog pages in this year's July catalog, the dark bay is out of Capeside Lady (Cape Town), winner of the GI Molly Pitcher BC H. and GI Monmouth BC Oaks.

358, f, Macho Uno--Estimation (GB), by Mark of Esteem (Ire) *Property of Adena Springs*

The gray daughter of GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner and two-year-old champion Macho Uno is a Florida-bred from Adena Springs' Southern operation. Out of Estimation (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}), the Valentine's Day-foaled filly is a granddaughter of Mohican Girl (Dancing Brave), who placed in the G2 Nassau S. Also under the second dam is group-placed Satchem (Inchitor) and Oui Say Oui (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}).

409, c, Unbridled's Song--King Shooting Star, by Storm Cat *Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent*

The Mar. 10 foal represents the only offering of his sire in this catalog. A \$175,000 RNA at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Sale last fall, the gray offers a female family that is deep in class and quality. A great grandson of SW Miraloma (Deputy Minister--Stick to Beauty), who herself is a full sister to Grade II winner The Prime Minister and a half-sister to the bluehen mare Gold Beauty, dam of champion Dayjur and Grade I winner and producer Maplejinsky.

464, c, Tale of the Cat--Our Tune, by Concorde's Tune *Property of Mulholland Springs*

This Apr. 28 foal is the second out of the Concorde's Tune mare Our Tune. Purchased for \$17,000 at last fall's Keeneland November Sale, the chestnut is by GISW Tale of the Cat, whose yearlings of last year averaged \$126,663 for 53 sold, with a top price of \$370,000.



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11 LEFT IN KING GEORGE

Trainer Aidan O'Brien will call upon a maximum team of four as he bids for a third straight win in Saturday's G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot following yesterday's confirmation stage. Seeking to add to the victories of Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill), O'Brien will rely upon last year's G1 Irish Derby hero **Frozen Fire (Ger)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and this term's G1 Irish Derby runner-up **Golden Sword (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) as well as G1 Grand Prix de Paris fourth **Freemantle (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Rockhampton (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Sir Michael Stoute challenges Ballydoyle's dominance of the 11 entries and still has last season's G1 St Leger and GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}), G1 Coronation Cup victor **Ask (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), and the dual Classic-placed **Tartan Bearer (Ire)** (Spectrum {Ire}) engaged in the £1-million event. Ballymacoll Stud own Conduit and Tartan Bearer, and stable jockey Ryan Moore is leaning towards riding the former, according to racing manager Peter Reynolds. "A final decision hasn't been made, but it looks as though Ryan is going to stick with Conduit and Mick Kinane will ride Tartan Bearer," Reynolds said. "It's not absolutely cast in stone and Ryan can change his mind at the last minute, but that's the way it is at the moment. I spoke to Sir Michael [Stoute] after they worked on Saturday and he was happy with both horses."

"They are both stepping up to a mile-and-a-half for the first time this year, so it's going to be interesting," Reynolds continued. "I suppose it's better going there with two good chances, rather than one and we are hoping for the very best." A strong Classic theme continues deep into the field with the presence of Julian Richmond-Watson's G1 Epsom Oaks victress **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}), runner-up to Ask in the June 5 G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom; and Teruya Yoshida's G1 Derby Italiano winner **Cima de Triomphe (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). "She is fine, in good nick and has gone well since [her third in] the [June 27 G1] Pretty Polly S. [at The Curragh]," trainer Ralph Beckett said of the former. "I would think that the way the race will be run, the distance and the track will all suit her. She would prefer quicker ground than a slower surface. It was a close battle with Ask in the Coronation Cup at Epsom, and I am looking forward to the race and taking him on again." The cast list is completed by the 2007 G1 Gran Criterium winner **Scintillo (GB)** (Fantastic Light) and the John Gosden-trained **Alwaary (Dynaformer)**.

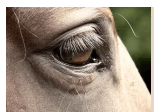

When a European stallion adds a winner of the GII Virginia Derby to a past winner of the GI American Oaks, one could be excused for thinking that the stallion responsible for these mile-and-a-quarter winners must himself be endowed with a fair measure of stamina.

The truth, though, is that the Virginia Derby winner Battle of Hastings is by Royal Applause, a champion sprinter whose 15-race career included 14 starts over five or six furlongs. Royal Applause, who is based at the Queen's Royal Studs, is probably best known in Europe as an admirably dependable sire of precocious two-year-olds, with nine group-winning juveniles in his first nine crops. He is also the sire of Acclamation, a high-class sprinter who became champion first-crop sire with numerous fast-maturing juvenile winners in 2007.

However, the last few years have also shown that there is another facet to Royal Applause's talents. Perhaps the 2004 American Oaks success of his daughter Ticker Tape helped open trainers' eyes to the fact that Royal Applause can occasionally sire animals which stay much further than he did. **cont. px**

Although none of his progeny's stakes successes had been gained over further than a mile up to that point, Royal Applause has since raised his total of black-type winners over a mile and a quarter or more to eight, thanks to Nice Applause, Royal Intrigue, Spider Power, Crime Scene (G3 St Simon S.), Take a Bow (G3 Brigadier Gerard S.), Apple Charlotte and now Battle of Hastings. The six-year-old Crime Scene initiated a stakes double completed by Battle of Hastings when he won the Shadwell Beech House Stud S. three days ago.

It is easy to understand why Americans would be interested in a son of Royal Applause when Battle of Hastings came on the market at Tattersalls' Autumn Sales at the end of October last year. Although Royal Applause's last-of-14 finishing position in the 1997 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint must represent an effective deterrent to trying his progeny on American dirt, his stock has proved very much at home on America's sharp and fast turf courses. Ticker Tape earned in excess of \$1.3 million and this tough filly has been followed by such as Whatsthescript (a dual Grade II winner at up to nine furlongs in 2008, when he was also third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile), Moth Ball (GIII Morvich H.), Spider Power (runner-up at Grade II and Grade III levels and third in the 2006 Virginia Derby) and now Battle of Hastings.

Battle of Hastings had looked only moderate over five and six furlongs for English trainer Michael Bell, but it was a different story when he tackled seven furlongs and a mile to win a pair of nursery handicaps prior to his appearance in the Tattersalls sales ring. His improved form led to his selling for 95,000gns and he has obviously proved a bargain at that price, his Virginia Derby success being his fourth at stakes level. It looks as though his new trainer wasn't expecting too much stamina, as two of those stakes successes came over six and a half furlongs and a mile, but the gelding's victory in the GII Colonial Turf Cup established that he stays well by American standards.

I must admit that this flow of talented performers at nine furlongs-plus has rather surprised me. As I said earlier, Royal Applause was a champion sprinter and his dam Flying Melody--who had sprinters as her sire and broodmare sire--produced the brilliantly speedy Lyric Fantasy to Sadler's Wells's brother Tate Gallery, plus one of Sadler's Wells's fastest sons in the G1 Dewhurst S. winner In Command. Also, his third dam Peggy West was a half-sister to Pappa Fourway. This colt earned the reputation for being one of the most brilliant sprinters seen in Britain when he decisively won all eight of his starts at three in 1955, including the July Cup, King's Stand S. and Diadem S.

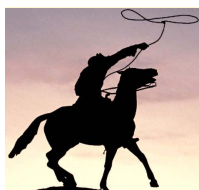
Obviously there must be some stamina in Royal Applause's pedigree which occasionally dominates the speedier elements. The most likely source is the female line of his sire Waajib, a good miler who numbered the Queen Anne S. among his victories. Waajib's first two dams were by the outstanding mile-and-a-half performers Sassafras and Ragusa and his third dam Corbalton produced the highly eccentric stayer Knockroe to a sprinter.

There is always a good chance that Royal Applause's better stayers will also have some stamina in the bottom halves of their pedigrees. Battle of Hastings is out of Subya, a versatile performer who gradually worked her way up the distance scale, winning over five, six, seven, eight and 10 furlongs. Timeform suggested that she might well have stayed even further, given the chance. Battle of Hastings' next three dams were all by horses which stayed fairly well--Arctic Tern, Damascus and Boldnesian--and the Boldnesian mare, Bold Bikini, produced the Irish Derby winner Law Society, so Battle of Hastings isn't the family's first Derby winner.

RACHEL ALEXANDRA WORKS TOWARD

HASKELL GI Preakness S. winner **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) worked six furlongs over Saratoga's Oklahoma Training Track yesterday in 1:13.88, the fastest of six at the distance. Regular exercise rider Dominic Terry was aboard for the work, which was accomplished in fractions of :13 1/5, :25 2/5, :37 2/5 and :49 3/5. She galloped out seven furlongs in 1:27 2/5. "She looked like her usual self; she was impressive and got over the ground well," said Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen. "We wanted a nice, smooth three-quarters and a long gallop. Dominic did a great job with her." Rachel Alexandra is expected to make her next start in the Aug. 2 GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park. "She has put on weight and she is a picture of health," Blasi continued. "We're right on target for the Haskell."

MINE THAT BIRD SHARP IN CHURCHILL

WORK GI Kentucky Derby winner **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) turned in a four-furlong work Monday at Churchill Downs in :48.20 as he continues to prepare for the Aug. 1 GI West Virginia Derby at Mountaineer. With jockey Jamie Theriot in the irons, the bay gelding worked through fractions of :12.20, :24.80 and :36.80. He galloped out five furlongs in 1:01.20. The work was the fourth fastest of 31 at the distance in Louisville yesterday. "He finished up well and he's going into the race very well," Theriot commented. "You can't ask for any better. I told [trainer] Chip [Woolley] that he's going into the race fantastic." Mine That Bird is expected to ship to West Virginia Friday. "I'm ready to go back to running," Woolley admitted. "It was enjoyable to be here the first month after the Belmont to just kind of relax and rest. I'm definitely ready to be rolling again and get back to running."

KARL BURKE DISQUALIFIED FOR ONE YEAR

Yorkshire-based trainer Karl Burke, who claimed a first Group 1 success with Lord Shanakill (Speightstown) in the July 5 G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly, has been disqualified for 12 months following a British Horseracing Authority inquiry into alleged race-fixing. The BHA disciplinary panel decided to postpone the start of Burke's penalty until July 28 so as not to cause what may be irreparable damage to Burke's business in that time if he does intend to appeal. The disciplinary panel said it was "very conscious of what it was told of Burke's personal situation and training operation" and that it was recognized "a penalty of disqualification has a potentially very serious effect on his owners and employees especially." Despite that, the panel "felt driven to conclude that it was necessary to impose a disqualification on Burke, and that the proper period was 12 months, bringing into account the various features of this case."

The BHA's Paul Struthers also added, "I don't know if Karl Burke is going to appeal or not, but he has seven days to do so. On the basis that he has admitted breaches of the rules, I should imagine the only thing he is likely to appeal is the penalty itself."

Burke's solicitors, Bark & Co, confirmed the trainer will appeal the BHA's decision and issued a statement last night, "The BHA imposed on Karl Burke a penalty of 12 months disqualification for providing inside information and associating with a warned-off person, Miles Rodgers. Mr. Rodgers had been an owner of horses and co-investor in land at Mr. Burke's yard. This business relationship was on-going at the time Mr. Rodgers was warned off, and continued for a short period thereafter."

"Mr. Burke also had some associations with Mr. Rodgers, including the imparting of opinion on the running of six horses. Mr. Burke received no payment from Mr. Rodgers for providing his opinion on these races. He spoke to Rodgers about these races in order to prevent any difficulty in the replacement of Rodgers as an investor at Spigot Lodge. He was misguided in associating with Mr. Rodgers in this way and has admitted these failings. He does not dispute being liable for a penalty for these breaches, but the penalty imposed by the BHA is unfair and excessive. This penalty far exceeds that which might reasonably have been expected particularly with regard to the penalties imposed on Fergal Lynch and Darren Williams. Mr. Burke has not had the benefit of a conspiracy of circumstances, plea bargaining, or otherwise in being dealt with by the BHA. It is clear that he has not been treated by the BHA comparably with Mr. Lynch and Mr. Williams, nor fairly when all matters of the proceedings are considered. He intends to appeal this decision."

Former owner Miles Rodgers has been warned off for life, the BHA confirmed. "This is an obvious case for an indefinite exclusion order. Rodgers has wreaked havoc with the sport," the panel added. The BHA announced an investigation after concluding its review of evidence from the Old Bailey trial in 2007, where Darren Williams, Fergal Lynch, Kieren Fallon plus Rodgers were all acquitted of any wrongdoing. Williams, Lynch and Burke faced charges concerning whether they supplied Rodgers with inside information in 2004. In an additional twist to the case, the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture has announced jockey Fergal Lynch has been ejected from his U.S. base. Press officer Justin Fleming confirmed, "Fergal Lynch has been ejected from Philadelphia Park racetrack for a period of one year. The decision was made on July 17, 2009. This is a private property action by the track and is not an action by the Pennsylvania State Horseracing Commission."

UTMOST RESPECT DEAD The Rumpole Partnership's **Utmost Respect (GB)** (Danetime {Ire}--Utmost {Ire}, by Most Welcome {GB}) has failed to recover after contracting peritonitis following surgery and died Sunday evening, it was announced yesterday. This term's G2 Duke of York S. hero originally underwent a procedure to remove gravel from his foot, which was successful, but was unable to fight off the secondary infection which caused inflammation to the membrane around his intestines and gut. "He was a very good horse to me and everybody at the yard," trainer Richard Fahey told *PA Sport*. The five-year-old gelding, who was a last-out winner of the G3 Greenlands S. at The Curragh May 23, had a career record of 16-8-0-2 with earnings of £241,345.

COASTAL PATH RETIRED Juddmonte Farms' **Coastal Path (GB)** (Halling--Coraline {GB}, by Sadler's Wells) has been retired due to injury and will stand his first year at Haras de Saint-Voir in Auvergne. The five-year-old homebred will alternate between bases year-by-year and will stand his second season at Haras de la Monnerie in Normandy. He was successful in his first six races, including wins in the 2007 G2 Prix Chaudenay and 2008 G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier, and met with his first defeat when third to Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in last year's G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot. Coastal Path, who was a last-out seventh when defending his title in the May 17 G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Longchamp, retires with a career record of 10-6-1-2 and earnings of €319,065.
