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HOLDING THE FORT

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Kingsfort** (War Chant) entered yesterday's G1 Ladbroke's.com Vincent O'Brien National S. with just one run and win under his belt. But when push came to shove, he had the raw material to keep his unbeaten record intact. Having scored in impressive fashion over this track and trip June 26, the bay had been targeted at this prize by trainer Kevin Prendergast, who worked the same oracle with Termagant (Ire) (Powerscourt {GB}) in last month's G1 Moyglare Stud S. Sent off the 9-4 second choice, Norman Ormiston's colt was sent to the front with a furlong remaining, and was driven out to hold the strong-finishing **Chabal** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) by a neck. "He got sick after his first run, and I was worried for a while, but it cleared up and he hasn't looked back since," Prendergast commented, adding, "He's not going to run again this year, but we will be able to dream over the winter." **Cont. p3**

TAKING CONTROL

Sent off at 14-1, **Mastery** (GB) (Sulamani {Ire}) was mostly ignored in the run-up to the G1 Ladbroke's St Leger at Doncaster, as the emphasis fell upon his favored stable companion **Kite Wood** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). But he proved strongest at the finish yesterday to provide a memorable one-two for Godolphin. The homebred already had a Classic win to his name in the May 9 G2 Derby Italiano, but he had slipped under the radar, and there were no fireworks during his warm-up second in the Aug. 18 G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York.

Still, in prime position as **Kite Wood** moved up to lead with three furlongs remaining, the longshot answered every call from Ted Durcan to gain the edge over the 9-4 favorite and Frankie Dettori in the final yards, sealing a hard-fought success by 3/4 of a length. "It was a great result, and I wasn't really surprised to see him win," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He won in Italy on the same ground, and I thought he would run a huge race. This is what we need, and is our goal." **Cont. p2**

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Ladbroke's (Doncaster) St Leger S. cont.

Mastery started out with Mark Johnston, and was transferred to Godolphin after finishing fourth in the Mar. 18 Kentucky Derby Challenge S. His first outing in the royal blue livery was a demanding one, but he showed the raw talent that connections had always suspected when beating Turati (GB) (Lomitas {GB}) by 1 1/2 lengths in the G2 Derby Italiano at the Capannelle May 9. Saddled with a five-pound penalty as a result in Royal Ascot's G3 Queen's Vase, he was a respectable third to the authoritative winner Holberg (UAE) (Halling) in that two-mile marathon June 19. Back to a mile and a half next time, Mastery filled third spot behind Cavalryman (GB) (Halling) and Age of Aquarius (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp on Bastille Day July 14. He was beaten 4 1/2 lengths by **Monitor Closely** when second under another penalty in the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York last time Aug. 18. The Godolphin second string entered this test with solid credentials, but was firmly in the shadow of that operation's long-time leading hope Kite Wood, and Ted Durcan opted to track that rival throughout the early stages as the Godolphin pair raced behind Ballydoyle pacemaker Von Jawlensky (Montjeu {Ire}). He had dead aim when Frankie Dettori turned the screw on the market leader inside the final quarter. Digging in to gain a slight lead at the furlong marker, Mastery had to battle after his barnmate rallied, but gave another spurt near the line to prevail. "The whole operation have looked after me and been a huge help down the years, so to win a race like this is great," Durcan commented. "We had the run of the race, and I let Frankie have the run on me as I knew I had him beat. This horse loved the ground and stays really well. Mastery may not be the most handsome horse to look at, but he's really hardy and is going to be a lovely stayer next season. His sire Sulamani improved with age, and I'm sure he will as well." For Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, the result capped a memorable day after the success of Poet's Voice (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G2 Champagne S. "I think one liked the ground and that was Mastery," Sheikh Mohammed said. "Everybody in Godolphin works as a team. The team is the same throughout the year, and I am very proud of them." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "Mastery was not completely overlooked, but his form left a bit to find. We said all along that he had each-way claims, but I'm a little surprised that he managed to beat Kite Wood, who should be a better horse next year. Both horses ran their hearts out, but Mastery was just a bit tougher over this distance and on this ground. We'll see how they both are before talking about any plans--they might run again, but both will stay in training next year."

The form of Kingsfort's course-and-distance maiden already looked strong before the third-placed Viscount Nelson (Giant's Causeway) finished runner-up in Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. two hours before the start of this race. The runner-up in the maiden test, Stunning View (Ire) (Shamardal), had since earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status himself at Galway, and signs that the Kevin Prendergast juveniles were a talented bunch had already been posted by Termagant

(Ire) (Powerscourt {GB}) in the G1 Moyglare S. Keen early behind the moderate pace set by the Ballydoyle duo Air Chief Marshal (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Beethoven, Kingsfort soon settled and had enough

in reserve to quicken to the head of affairs at the furlong pole. He had to give all to keep Chabal and Kevin Manning at bay in a pulsating drive to the line, but was equal to the task to provide Prendergast with a notable big-race double. "The two-year-olds have been great to me this year, as the two good three-year-olds we had in Recharge (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) and Shimah (Storm Cat) went wrong," the Friarstown-based conditioner said. "We always thought a lot of [Kingsfort]; he had a bit of a setback--he had a virus and his leg filled up--but recovered quickly and the rest is history. I bought him and the filly [Termagant] at the Goffs Sportsman's Sale within an hour of each other. He's done his bit for the year and is a big, raw, tall horse who should improve over the winter. We will run him in the spring and see where we go from there, but he could go to Newmarket for the G1 2000 Guineas in May."

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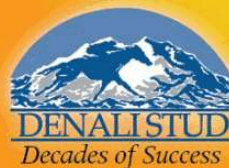

Ruffian H. cont.

Observing that the field for the Ruffian was coming up light on quantity and presented with "an opportunity at a Grade I," trainer Dale Romans made a decision to run Swift Temper just 13 days following her well-beaten second to Icon Project (Empire Maker) in the Aug. 30 GI Personal Ensign S. The plan came together yesterday, as the Mark Stanley runner drove past heavily favored Seventh Street for the most important win of her career. The chestnut has come a long way since upsetting the GIII Gardenia H. at 21-1 last August. Runner-up in the GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill Downs June 13, she went wire-to-wire in the July 19 GII Delaware H., defeating Icon Project by 2 1/4 lengths for the richest payday of her life. The clear second choice in the wagering, Swift Temper settled in the wake of Seventh Street, as that one sat just off the flank of the pacesetting Be Fair (Exchange Rate). Given her cue after six furlongs in a demanding 1:09.71, Swift Temper overtook the heavy chalk approaching the eighth pole and drew away from her stubborn rival in the final sixteenth of a mile. "I didn't like [bringing her back in 13 days], but she came out of the last race better than any race I've had her for," commented Romans, who said the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic will be under consideration for the winner.

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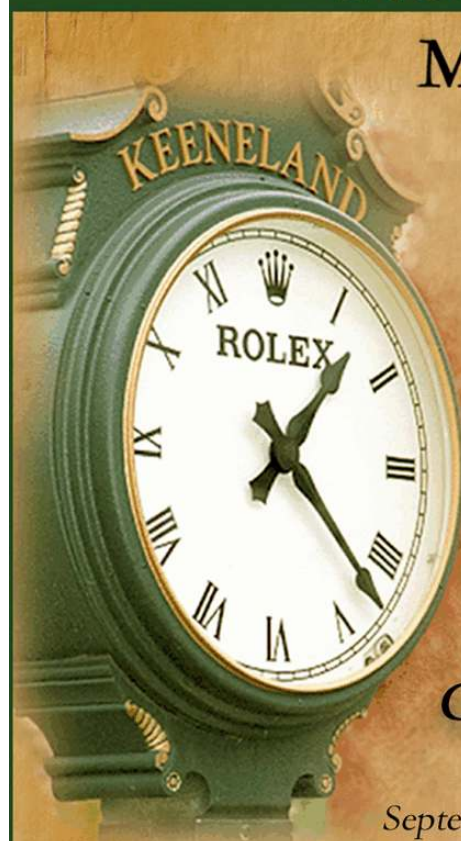

Alandi emerged as a surprise winner when registering a first black-type win in the Listed Vintage Crop S. at Navan Apr. 26. Despite his commanding display in the mud on that occasion, the bay's exploits were largely a footnote to the story of Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)'s disappointing comeback. And, while Ballydoyle's star stayer was basking in the summer glory of another G1 Ascot Gold Cup score, Alandi was creeping slowly towards this target, and there was more than a slice of bad fortune accompanying his second placings in the May 28 Listed Saval Beg S. at Leopardstown and June 27 G3 Curragh Cup.

Taking a step back when only fifth behind his Curragh Cup conqueror Profound Beauty (Danehill) in Leopardstown's Listed Challenge S. July 16, he was back on track in the deep ground prevalent at Fairyhouse when recording a facile win in the Aug. 22 Listed Ballycullen S. Settled in third behind the smooth-traveling Schiaparelli after the opening exchanges here, Alandi was having to work by the final turn, where Yeats waved the white flag after struggling some way from home. For much of the stretch, the winner looked booked for a moderate second as Olivier Peslier gave no alarm signals on Schiaparelli, but his travails earned him the lead approaching the furlong pole. Instantly joined and briefly headed by Clowance, he pulled out extra to assert in a draining final 100 yards. "I was very hopeful after he won at Fairyhouse, as I thought he rode like a Leger horse there," Mick Kinane said. "He probably should have already won four times this season, and we always thought he would travel over extreme distances. He got a bit of heart from Yeats dropping away, and he was tough." His Highness the Aga Khan's Racing Manager Pat Downes commented, "I thought he was beaten twice, but he stays the trip very well and handles conditions. He's had a great year and, other than one disappointing run at Leopardstown, he has been very consistent. He was an immature two-year-old and had a few niggling problems as a three-year-old, but we felt there was quite a bit of improvement in him. I would imagine we will have a think about the G1 Prix du Cadran [at Longchamp Oct. 4], and he is a possibility to stay in training. The important thing with him is the ground condition." Clowance's conditioner Roger Charlton told *PA Sport*, "She had been off for 14 months and had been on box rest six weeks ago. She needed the run and just got tired. We'll just have to see how she comes out of it." Jockey Seamie Heffernan said of Yeats, "He just wouldn't go today." Unheralded Miss World made it three in a row, but the story of the race was odds-on Gozzip Girl (Dynaformer), who found a world of trouble into and around the first turn and finished fourth. Miss World had a tough time of it at two, hitting the board just once in four trips to the post, and headed to the sidelines following a seventh-place effort going a mile over Aqueduct's inner track Dec. 14. Off nearly seven months, the bay made a favorable start to her sophomore season in a six-furlong maiden over a soft Belmont turf June 11, rallying to be second despite being steadied in traffic. Stretched to a turf route for the first time July 8, Miss World got through at the rail to post a one-length maiden victory and made it two straight with another rail run at Saratoga Aug. 19.

With Cornelio Velasquez taking over from Garrett Gomez, Miss World checked while in and among rivals into the first turn, then settled last but one as GII Lake Placid S. heroine Shared Account set a sluggish pace from Keertana. Steadied in traffic leaving the half-mile pole, Miss World gained four wide on the turn, engaged Shared Account and Keertana at the midstretch marker and gradually pulled clear. "It took me awhile to understand the filly," admitted winning trainer Christophe Clement. "I ran her too short and on dirt last year; she's obviously a turf filly. I don't think she had a great trip, it's just she was the best horse. We got lucky and she enjoyed the ground and we finished in front."

Unlucky Girl..

Gozzip Girl was sent off the 2-5 favorite in her first start since blitzing the field in the GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park July 5, but had as eventful an opening quarter mile as Big Brown did in the 2008 Belmont S. Drawn down on the fence, the dark bay filly, who has both led and come from off the pace, was outfooted in the early going and was snatched up going into the first turn. Having overcome that incident, she found even more trouble a few strides later when she clipped heels and nearly went down. Gozzip Girl nonetheless traveled comfortably thereafter and made an inside move into contention approaching the far turn. She had room at the wood once into the stretch, but could not muster up the necessary kick and settled for fourth. "The first jump, they were already three in front," jockey Kent Desormeaux commented. "I thought, 'Let me find a way out,' and they came back to me. They were going so slow, I was strangling her trying not to run over them. It was amazing how she stayed on her feet--she's such an athlete." The winner and runner-up could rematch in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 17.

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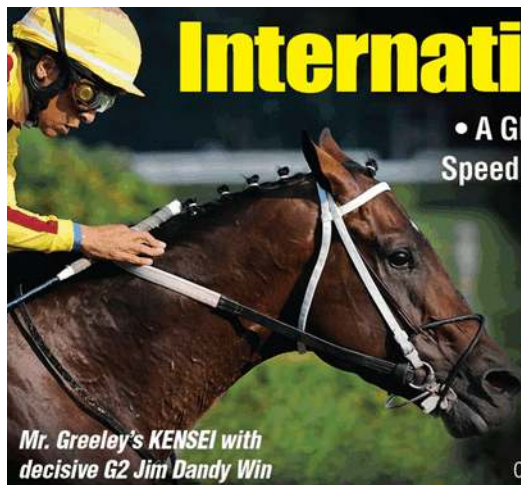
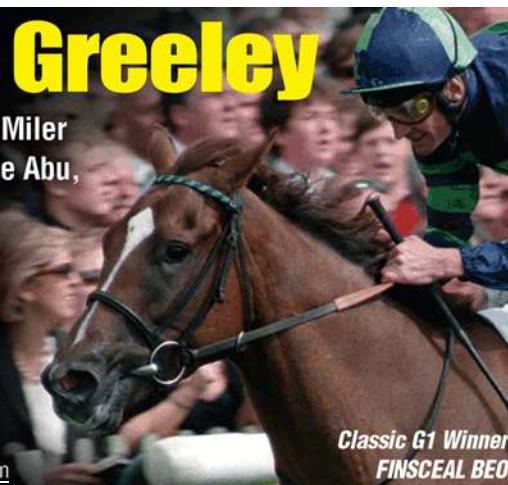

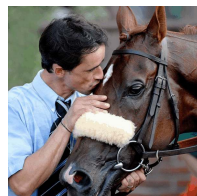

Crossharbour had an injury and came back after his layoff at Deauville and won there really nicely. Again, he'll be competitive."

WHITECHURCH WHITE HOT

David Hanley has done a bit of everything in the racing game, but his Whitechurch Farm seems to have hit its best stride with a string of recent notable pinhooking successes.

Whitechurch, selling through Warrendale Sales, topped the Fasig-Tipton July auction when John Ferguson made a final bid of \$425,000 to take home a filly by Medaglia d'Oro. Hanley and his wife Ann purchased the filly for \$85,000 at Keeneland in January. It was the second straight year Whitechurch had topped the July sale with a pinhook.

Things only got better at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga sale. A Medaglia d'Oro colt, purchased for \$165,000 at Keeneland last November, sold for \$875,000. Then a filly by Tiznow, acquired for \$240,000 last November, sold for \$725,000.

Hanley's involvement with horses began in the show ring in Ireland, and eventually led him to manage the Whitechurch Stud in Kildare. He soon began a successful training and pinhooking career in his native land. He co-bred and was responsible for the early training of 2002 Eclipse champion turf mare Golden Apples (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}).

The Hanleys relocated to the U.S. in 2001 and, in 2006, David was a founding partner in Hurricane Hall.

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When the venture dissolved two years later, Hanley found himself at a crossroads.

"When I got out of Hurricane Hall, I had my own yearlings and started prepping them myself," Hanley recalled. "We sold Hurricane Hall, where I was training, so there was a transition. I had to go and do my own thing, run my own farm," he remarked.

Now his "own thing" sounds fairly all-encompassing. "Pinhooking and breeding and anything to do with the horses, really," is the way he explains it.

Hanley is currently out of the training game, but he isn't ruling anything out.

"I don't have anything that I'm training myself at the moment, but that's not to say I won't train a couple of them again."

Hanley said he usually buys between 10 and 12 foals, which he preps himself at his Lexington farm. An expansion of the operation might be expected, given his recent success, but Hanley admits he is limited by the opportunities he finds.

"I just buy whatever I can, depending on the availability of opportunities," he explained. "You've got to try and buy value. So it depends on what is out there. If there is plenty out there, I'd buy them all. It's always difficult to buy nice horses. The ones you want are never easy to buy. Obviously, you want to get the best possible horse and pedigree for the money."

And what does he look for in a potential pinhook purchase?

"Just a nice horse," Hanley said. "An athlete--a horse that gets your attention and that you think you'll be able to sell to the guys who are trying to buy race-horses."

As the markets tightens up, Hanley sees an additional emphasis on pedigrees.

"You need a bit of pedigree, especially in today's market," he continued. "I think people have become more selective. The individual is what people are looking for and he must have enough pedigree to get it done."

The health of the market and the economy in general remains on almost everyone's mind. Looking ahead to the weanling sales, Hanley admits the economy could affect the type of foals available.

"I really don't know how this year is going to pan out," the Irishman said. "It seems like there are going to be fewer foals for sale. Whether the quality is going to be out there, you don't know until you look. I really don't know what opportunities are going to be there."

Hanley will find out if he has what people want at Keeneland September, sending out six yearlings during the marathon sale. Among the group, all selling under the Warrendale banner, is a daughter of Bluegrass Cat ([hip 1116](#)), purchased for \$175,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

"She's very light on her feet and a lovely, quality filly," Hanley said of the yearling, who is out of Killoe (Kris S.). "She's very, very racey."

"I've got two very nice horses in Book 4," Hanley continued. "An Indian Charlie colt that I think is a very nice colt and a Mizzen Mast colt that I bred that I think is also very nice."

The Indian Charlie yearling ([hip 2570](#)), a \$75,000 purchase last November, is out of Uncommon Queen (Seattle Slew), a three-quarter sister to multiple Grade I winner Excellent Meeting (General Meeting). He is also from the family of Allicansayis Wow (Street Cry {Ire}), recently second against the boys in the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup Mile.

Hanley described the youngster as, "Very, very sound and correct. A very good mover--just a real nice strong solid colt."

[Hip 2780](#), the son of Mizzen Mast, is out of multiple stakes winner Letithappencaptain (Captain Bodgit). According to Hanley, "He's a big horse, a nice mover and correct. He's a very attractive individual."

Much like with training, Hanley won't rule out selling under his own name at some point in the future.

"I used to sell when I owned horses, together with Gracefield," he said. "The last two years, since we've had just our own horses, we've sold with Warrendale. Maybe in the future we'll sell on our own. But we haven't made a decision on that." -*Jessica Martini*

Dublin-born Geoffrey Russell joined Keeneland in 1996 and, five years later, was named director of sales. In the years that followed, he has guided Keeneland through exponential growth and, over the past 12 months, has helped navigate the auction house through troubled economic times. On Thursday, the affable Irishman sat down with the *TDN's* Lucas Marquardt to discuss what Keeneland has done to promote September, the new Kee-Bid program, and some of his favorite restaurants in the Lexington area.

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TDN Q & A--Geoff Russell

The economy crashed almost exactly a year ago, half-way through the September Sale. Given the current economic climate, what are your goals and hopes for this year's renewal of September?

Our goal is that it will be a successful sale, that consignors will get their horses sold and buyers will come and be successful in bidding on the next future champions. The world is a totally different place than last year, but, being an optimist, I think we have a good sale ahead of us.

What are some of the things Keeneland has done to facilitate selling at September?

We have continued our normal recruitment of buyers, both domestically and internationally. It's not just something we do within 60 days or 30 days of a sale, it's an ongoing, year-round activity for Keeneland. We have actively been traveling the globe since January and criss-crossing America this year to talk to people and encourage them to come to September, and to all our sales. The most important thing is that our graduates have been successful, not just here in North America, but worldwide. We actually just came back from Russia, where our graduates had a very good weekend in what was their Breeders' Cup. We hope the success of those graduates will bring the buyers back.

In your view, how has the international response been? Do you think we'll see fewer international buyers or more, because of the value to be had?

It's a mixed bag. I think many of our regulars will be back here, and there will be some who won't be back. But we've had a great response and look forward to welcoming everybody back.

Some of the other things we've done is to work with the NTRA to distribute information to buyers to try and make sure everyone is aware of the stimulus package offered in the farm bill, which accelerates the depreciation of horses and gives greater tax benefits. It has a huge affect on domestic buyers. It expires this year, and it's a huge opportunity for them.

Could you explain Keeneland's new Kee-Bred program?

Well, it's one of the new services we are unveiling this year. We are hoping it will help consignors should a horse [fail to meet its reserve]. It allows a buyer to make an offer on a horse through our website, at which point a notice will be sent both to Keeneland and to the consignor to let us know there is interest in the horse. Then we'll try to get the buyer and the consignor together to see if we can get a sale done. At that point, they'll have to go through the normal channels of our sales accounting office. As you know, we do a tremendous amount of RNAs-to-sales every year, and certain consignors have a network and work very hard to get their RNAs sold. We are hoping this will spread the net a little further, and help the smaller consignors who may not have the ability to appoint one person to try and sell horses that RNA'd.

Do you have to have credit established to use the Kee-Bid system?

No, because it's not an auction system. You submit a bid, at which point Keeneland and the consignor are sent a notice. Then everything is done face-to-face, or over the phone. All we're trying to do is put buyer and seller together.

What's the response been from consignors thus far?

The consignors love it. Anything you do to help the consignor in commerce, they're all for.

Will the sales sheets be changed to reflect the sale of previously RNA'd horses?

No, we'll only report the ring prices.

You had talked about the problems with supply and demand in the Thoroughbred market well before last September. How much of the current drop in prices has to do with the financial markets, and how much with an over-supply of horses?

I think a lot of factors come into it. I think we're talking about the surplus of horses--the overproduction of horses--and I think we're starting to see a change in that in the number of mares bred this year. That'll be reflected both at the November Sale and in future sales. And the financial markets clearly had an impact, because people buy horses with discretionary income. It's a combination of both.

Unfortunately, we ended up with a perfect storm. I think people expected a correction in the Thoroughbred market because of the oversupply of horses. Some of us expected it to happen in 2007, but because of the weak dollar we overcame that. Then in 2008, we were hit by both the collapse of the financial markets and oversupply. But the turnaround since last September in the macro-world has been phenomenal. I think there's an air of confidence out there we haven't seen--six months ago people were all down, and now you're seeing a little confidence back in the general economy and in the Thoroughbred economy.

Last question. What's one non-horse-related thing all visitors to Lexington should do?

I would encourage visitors to enjoy our extensive and varied dining establishments here in Lexington. Dudley's is probably the cornerstone of the Thoroughbred industry. People should go and enjoy Dudley's in its current location, as they will be moving in December. They're moving up to West Short St., which isn't all that far away. Dudley's has been in Lexington nearly as long as I have, and I have enjoyed eating and drinking there, and Debbie Long's hospitality. I think we'll all miss the old schoolhouse, but we look forward to celebrating her new venture once it opens up later this year.

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WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Chris Brothers, Hidden Brook:

"I think the market will stay the same. We're not going in expecting any difference from the way it's been. As far as the market rebounding, it's going to be a while. The first few books should be okay, but I think the drop will be pretty significant [for the rest]."

Case Clay, Three Chimneys:

"I don't want to sound like a party pooper, but I'm not very optimistic about the market in general. It doesn't seem like people are in the spending mood. Last year at this time, there was about a billion dollars in credit for horses. That's gone down to about \$600 million, and it's on its way down to about \$400 million. The squeeze on credit is going to put a pinch on a lot of people who were buying horses last year. But to end on a positive note, there's never been a better time to buy horse; there's going to be some good value out there."

Mark Toothaker, Legacy Bloodstock:

"I think the market is going to be down. Last year the first week wasn't all that bad, but then the second week got kind of bloody. You would think that this year is going to be down overall, but we're hopeful that the first week holds up well. If you have a really good individual during the second week, you should still be fine. But if you have an average horse, or a horse that doesn't scope or X-ray, I don't know if there's going to be anybody there for those types of horses. I think it's going to be a real struggle to get those types of horses moved for any kind of money."

Pat Costello, Paramount Sales

"Activity [around the barn] has been pretty good. I'd say we're up to normal. I am optimistic [about the sale]. Saratoga was a very good sale--there were plenty of underbidders up there. Hopefully, they'll carry on."

Michael Hernon, Gainesway

"We haven't seen a lot of new money, but the activity here at the minute is serious. I think the players who are here are here looking to buy. I got a good feel this morning, based on the action. I am cautiously optimistic and realize we're obviously dealing in a down economy. I think if you have the horse, they'll be found out. We certainly work aggressively to expose horses to the right people. Lately we've had some excellent graded stakes winners coming out of the Gainesway shedrow, and I think people are in tune with that. So I am quite optimistic that Gainesway will have stock that will sell well. They are good horses, that are very well-prepped and carefully placed within the sale. We hope the results show that we've done our job well."

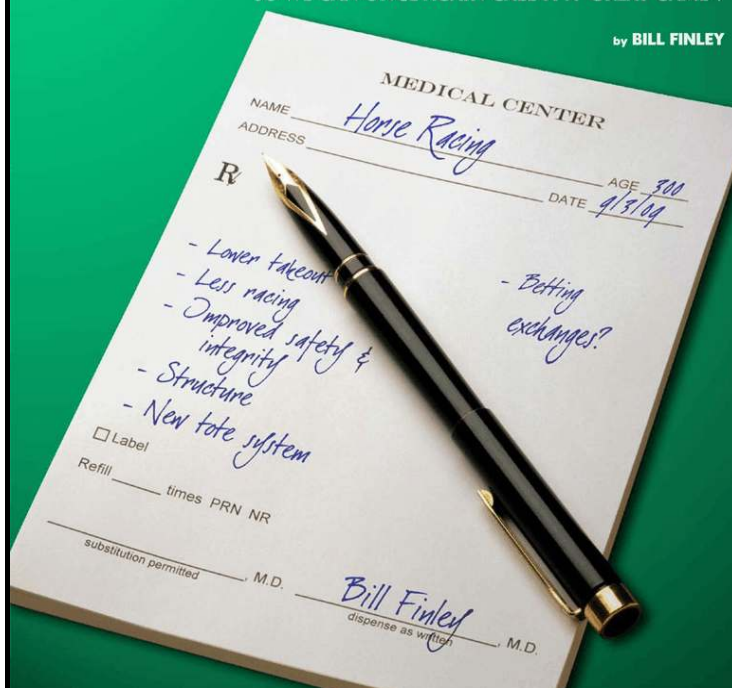
