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KEEPING IT REAL AT SEPTEMBER

As the 66th annual Keeneland September Sale gets underway today in Lexington, Kentucky, buyers and sellers alike have realistic expectations for the marathon event while the industry continues to deal with issues relating to the struggling economy and overproduction. "I am thinking we will all be getting back to basics for September," said consignator Meg Levy of Bluewater Sales.

"With an oversupply of horses, most sellers are thinking realistically on reserves. It's time to realize that breeders can no longer breed horses that they or the market have no real use for. It's also time to band together to concentrate on the realities of our beautiful sport, and the business associated with it. The 'glass half-full' side of our situation is that this is a great time for owners to get into the game, with tax incentives for buying yearlings." Mark Taylor, of leading consignator Taylor Made Farm, opined, "I think the top end--Book 1--is going to be off 25 percent from last year, is my guess. I think the middle of the market will be off more like 30 percent, and I'm really not sure what's going to happen with the bottom of the market. But the bottom was affected a lot more last year because the stock market really tanked during the second week of the sale, and I think some people really put the brakes on." Taylor added that he hopes the international bench can pick up the slack, especially during the later books. "Keeneland has done an outstanding job over the last few years bringing in international buyers, and I think the selling community owes them a debt of gratitude for bringing in all these international players," he said. "I hope their efforts are successful again this year." A total of 5,189 yearlings are cataloged for September, including 2,662 colts, 2,524 fillies and three geldings. Sessions begin at 10 a.m. daily, except this Friday, Sept. 18, which will be dark. The sale runs through Monday, Sept. 28. NO BREEDERS' CUP FOR RACHEL

The *Daily Racing Form* reports that, despite the \$1 million bonus that the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors have offered to the winner of the GI BC Classic should both **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro) and **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) compete, Rachel Alexandra's owner Jess Jackson has reiterated that his filly will not start. "My concerns are well known about the tracks in California," Jackson told *DRF*. "Bottom line...she will not race at the Breeders' Cup this year."

DEAR MI! DA RE MI DQ'D IN VERMEILLE

Longchamp stewards were courting controversy yesterday after deciding to disqualify **Dar Re Mi** (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) from first in the G1 Qatar Prix Vermeille, handing the race to the even-money favorite **Stacelita** (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) in the process. Judged to have interfered with the eventual fifth **Soberania** (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) before launching her winning run, Dar Re Mi recorded a short-neck success after finishing with a late flourish. Her subsequent demotion to fifth meant Stacelita would keep her unbeaten record following wins in the G1 Prix Saint-Alary here May 17 and G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly June 17. "It is a shame, as the best horse won the race, and this filly has been robbed of that," Dar Re Mi's owner-breeder Madeleine Lloyd-Webber said. "We came to race in France in earnest and didn't expect to see such things, but we will definitely appeal." **Cont. p5**

Hip 11, f, Unbridled's Song--Regal Miss Copelan, by Copelan
Consigned by Woodford Thoroughbreds LLC

The first offering from her consignor and breeder through the ring, this Apr. 22-foaled filly is a full-sister to the very good performer Rockport Harbor, winner of the GII Remsen and GIII Nashua S. at two and the GIII Essex H. at four. "She's just a very pretty filly," said Woodford General Manager Matt Lyons. "She's a late foal and has got a lot of growing to do, but she's got a lot of balance and is a nice, classy individual." Dam Regal Miss Copelan, winner of Monmouth's Colleen S. and a half to Grade II winner Regally Appealing (Valid Appeal), was a \$350,000 KEENOV purchase by ClassicStar in 2003, and later found her way into the Woodford band. Fox Hill Farm's Song of Solomon, a full-brother to this filly, made \$525,000 at this sale in 2007, and is two-for-three lifetime.

Hip 23, f, Lion Heart--Seattle Way, by Seattle Slew
Consigned by Paramount Sales, Agent XXV

This chestnut is a full-sister to Pretty Prolific, third in last year's GII Adirondack S. and recently runner-up in the GI Test S. She is also a half to Seattle Bay (Opening Verse), who is multiple group placed in France. "She's a fine big physical," Paramount's Pat Costello said. "She has a lovely walk and is a very nice filly."

Hip 27, c, Storm Cat--Serena's Song, by Rahy
Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig & Holly Bendoroff), agent for The Robert and Beverly Lewis Trust

This regally bred colt, out of champion Serena's Song, is a full to MG1SP Sophisticat and MGSP Grand Reward, as well as a half to GSW Harlington (Unbridled) and Serena's Tune (Mr. Prospector), the dam of GSW Vocalised (Vindication). "He's real strong and really well-developed," said Craig Bendoroff. "He's not the biggest colt in the world, but he's out of a Rahy mare who was one of the best racemares in recent times."

Hip 42, f, Medaglia d'Oro--Tastetheteardrops, by What Luck

Consigned by Paramount Sales, Agent LXXV

This bay filly is a half-sister to Grade I winner Taste of Paradise (Conquistador Cielo). "She's a very, very nice filly who is by the hottest sire on the planet now," commented Paramount's Pat Castello. "She has a nice physical, a big walk, and a lovely shoulder and head."

Hip 65, c, Tapit--Wild Vision, by Wild Again
Consigned by Gainesway, Agent LII

This dark bay colt is a three-quarter brother to Pyro (Pulpit), a multiple graded stakes winner last year who recently was an impressive winner of the GI Forego S. at Saratoga. The yearling is also a full-brother to War Echo, winner of the GIII Silverbulletday S. at Fair Grounds in February. "He's a son of Tapit, who has really emerged as a very serious young stallion," observed Gainesway's Michael Herson. "He was the leading juvenile and freshman sire last year, and he's just further improved his position this year with numerous stakes winners. He's also produced three stakes-winning colts, including a top colt in Japan." Of the yearling, Herson added, "This horse has great physical presence. He's very athletic, a good mover, and he's got an excellent temperament. He continues to show himself extremely well. I think he's an excellent prospect. With the combination of the physical and the pedigree, he really looks the part of a good horse. And he's got the pedigree right there to carry him on to stud duty if he performs on a high level."

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

John Sikura, Hill 'n' Dale Sales:

"We've had the same amount of traffic as in past years. I think there's some trepidation, as we're not quite sure what's going to happen throughout the market, from top to bottom, but, for the really good horses with the pedigree and the physical, there will be plenty of money. After the first three or four books, it'll be interesting to see what the demand is."

Hip 81, f, Giant's Causeway--Azeri, by Jade Hunter
Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent

Like her older brother, the two-year-old currently known as Vallenzeri (A.P. Indy), who went through the ring at September last year and at April this spring, this filly is the rare product of two Horses of the Year. The chestnut's dam was America's best horse in 2003, the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Azeri, who still reigns as North America's all-time leading female money winner. Giant's Causeway was Europe's Horse of the Year in 2000. "Azeri was obviously a phenomenal, unique mare," said consignor John Sikura. "The first foal sold very well, and he's training well now, and this filly is a really good individual. She resembles the mare very much, and is very correct and is a good walker. She has a good disposition and is well-made." Vallenzeri was bought back by breeder Allen E. Paulson Living Trust for \$7.7 million last year at September. He then resold to Kaleem Shah and trainer Bob Baffert for \$1.9 million at the Keeneland April Sale. He has three works to his credit at Del Mar, most recently going five panels in 1:00 3/5 Sept. 8.

Hip 111, c, Medaglia d'Oro--Critical Eye, by Dynaformer

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CLIV

This is the fourth foal from the very good Critical Eye, whose victories including the GI Hempstead H. and GI Gazelle H., as well as the GII Sheepshead Bay H. and a pair of Grade III events. "This is just a big, strapping horse who's bred to go two turns, being out of a Dynaformer mare" said consignor Mark Taylor. "People are going to be thinking Classics when they see him."

Hip 114, c, Giant's Causeway--Deb's Charm, by Silver Charm

Consigned by Gainesway, Agent VI

This gray filly is out of graded-stakes placed Deb's Charm, a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Tasha's Miracle (Harlan's Holiday). "Giant's Causeway is having a great year--he's had 10 graded-stakes winners this year alone, and two are Grade I winners," explained Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "Giant's Causeway did it all in Europe; he showed great battling qualities that he is now passing on to his progeny. This colt has a lot of charisma. He is a well-grown, well put-together attractive colt. He's a good mover out of a mare who was a graded stakes placed two-year-old, with a strong female family behind him. This colt is getting the attention of some of the top horsemen here at the sale."

Out of an unraced daughter of 1995 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint heroine Desert Stormer (Storm Cat), the bay was bred in Kentucky by Malibu Farm. "She's a really nice Bernardini filly," Legacy Bloodstock's Mark Toothaker said. "She should be one of our most popular in the first book. She's a real pretty filly." Malibu acquired Desert Heat in foal to Vindication for \$1.1 million at the 2005 KEENOV sale.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING

Reiley McDonald, Eaton Sales

"The activity at the barn has been moderate, maybe a little better even than expected, but it will certainly reflect that this will be a real buyers' market. I think people can come into this sale and buy at 70 cents on the dollar on the average from last year's prices. And in some cases, they'll find real value in the deep valleys. People who have done their homework will find that horses are going for a fraction of what they might have in past years. That is great from the perspective of racehorse owners who have a chance to come in here and play at a very fair, realistic level."

Hip 127, f, Bernardini--Fashion Star, by Chief's Crown

 This filly, named Date to Remember, was produced by the MGSP Fashion Star and is thus a half-sister to GI Pimlico Special H. winner Eddington (Unbridled). She hails from the first crop of Bernardini, who leads all freshman sires with a 2009 yearling average of \$570,833. "I think she is one of the best Bernardinis I've seen all year, and I've seen quite a few good ones," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "From when I saw her back in the spring, she's continued to move forward. She's just a big, imposing, strong, correct filly that has plenty of pedigree, and we all know how the Bernardinis have been received so far. She's going to be on the top of everybody's list that's looking for a top filly with pedigree and the potential to perform at the highest level on the track, and then be a great broodmare."

Hip 141, c, Unbridled's Song--Goulash, by Mari's Book
Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Aaron and Marie Jones

The offspring of Goulash have long been popular at Keeneland, most notably with the \$9-million sale of her daughter and champion Ashado as a broodmare prospect at November here in 2005. "Goulash has been just one of the best mares in the stud book," asserted Mark Taylor. "She's just incredible, and has made her own pedigree, starting with Ashado and then Sunriver, both Grade I winners by Saint Ballado. Saint Stephen [also by Saint Ballado] was a Grade III winner. She's just thrown unbelievable horses, year-in, year-out." Taylor added, "This colt, regardless who he's by and who he's out of, is one of the best horses I've seen all year. He's a big, scopey, correct horse that looks like he's going to want to go two turns. He looks like a Derby horse. He's got the pedigree, the mind, the conformation: he's got everything to make him a top prospect. I think he'll be one of the best yearlings buyers have seen all year."

Hip 166, c, Bluegrass Cat--Lady Melesi, by Colonial Affair

Consigned by Denail Stud (Craig & Holly Bendoroff), Agent XVI

This chestnut, from the first crop of GI Haskell Invitational winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), is out of GISP Lady Melesi and is a half-brother to MGSP Doc Cheney (Saint Ballado) and to MSP Roman Emperor (Empire Maker). WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Mark Taylor, Taylor Made Farm:

"I still think September will be very strong, but what ultimately is going to affect the way the sale is judged is that you're going to have these pockets of strength throughout the sale, especially in the first four books. But they'll be interspersed with pockets of weakness that are the average to below-average horses. In this market, if you have a well-raised, big, good-looking horse that vets good, you're going to get a fair price for it. But if you have a horse that's mediocre to just a bad individual, or if he has no pedigree whatsoever, then I think it's going to be some tough sledding."

Stacelita entered this race the new darling of the French racing scene, having emerged from the Provinces to make her mark in Paris with an impressive win in the Mar. 14 Listed Prix Rose de Mai at Saint-Cloud before her unique Saint-Alary-Diane double.

Longchamp's crowds were expectant of more heroics, and all appeared to be going to plan in the early stages as she enjoyed the perfect trip under cover behind her pacemaker Volver (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}). Allowed a gap up the fence as her stable companion emptied at the top of the straight, she was first through, and Jimmy Fortune was taking his only available option to follow on Dar Re Mi. But Da Re Mi brushed against Soberania as a result of that maneuver, and her fate was sealed; the impressive acceleration she showed to get to the front close to home was all in vain after the result of the enquiry was announced. Speaking before the ruling, Stacelita's trainer Jean-Claude Rouget said, "My filly has run a lovely race and has not run since June, so it is no disgrace to be beaten by such a good filly. If she is well and is ready, she will be supplemented for the [Oct. 4] G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe." Dar Re Mi would have been emulating her dam Darara (Ire) (Top Ville {Ire}), who succeeded here in 1986 for His Highness The Aga Khan. There was a general disquiet among the professionals and racegoers present following the DQ, and the winning ceremony was greeted by boos from the crowd. Ryan Moore judged the fractions perfectly here as the progressive Spanish Moon made all to add to his tally at the expense of the leading French older horse Vision d'Etat. In front after the first quarter, the bay was not hard pressed late to ward off Crossharbour before holding the strong run of the winner of last year's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and this year's G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Prince of Wales's S. Spanish Moon, who is currently suspended from racing in Britain due to failure to enter the stalls, had recorded a career best on his last start when winning the June 28 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. But the Arc is only a possibility, according to the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe, who commented, "Today was a good opportunity for him and maybe he needed the outing, as he had been off since June. He ought to come on a lot for it, but is not certain to run in the Arc, as there are various other options abroad in Canada, Hong Kong and Japan. We will discuss it with Prince Khalid." Vision d'Etat's trainer Eric Libaud said, "He has become slightly lazy and, on the downhill part, he was under pressure, and Olivier [Peslier] was not too hard on him. He said if he had worked on him, he would definitely have won, and so it is the ideal preparation for the Arc." 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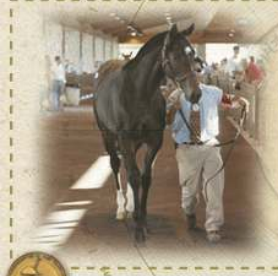

A two-time winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga, the bay showed his appreciation for soft turf with a 10 1/4-length romp over a yielding Belmont lawn in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic last September. He was out of his element when racing on the firm course at Santa Anita the following month, and finished last in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf before going on vacation. Grand Couturier was fifth in his first three outings of 2009, most recently after a troubled trip as he went after a third Sword Dancer trophy Aug. 15, but he was the crowd's choice to turn it around on the yielding going here. Longshot Up to No Good (Ecton Park) made the grass look fast as he dashed out to a 12-length lead through an opening half in :46.57. But that one was cooked before they hit the turn, and it was Winchester and Thabazimbi who took them around the bend and into the stretch. Winchester shook loose of Thabazimbi at the top of the lane, but Grand Couturier, last early, had edged closer from the inside, and he had dead aim when he angled outside for the final drive. The favorite collared Winchester at the eighth pole and drew clear. "I was waiting, waiting, and, turning for home, my horse decided to take off," jockey Alan Garcia said. "He was much the best today." Trainer Bobby Ribaudo remarked, "It's a relief. The horse was aggressive down the backside, which he hadn't been in his last few races; these are things you want to see." Looking ahead, Ribaudo added, "If he did go in the Joe Hirsch Turf Classic [Oct. 3], it's going to be a lot tougher, and he's going to have to step up off this. But, we're going in the right direction."

Successful in the 2007 G1 Mercury Sprint at Clairwood in South Africa, War Artist hit the board in last season's G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and G1 July Cup at Newmarket when undertaking a European campaign. 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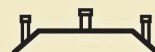

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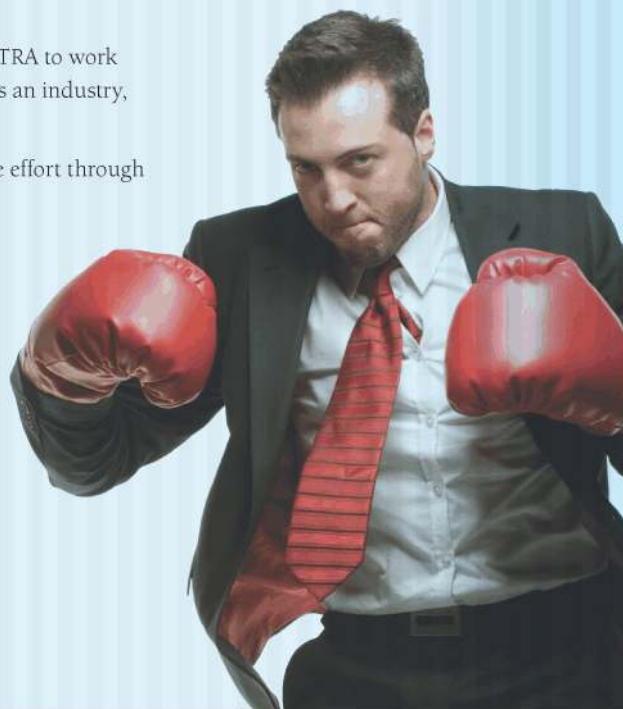

Kingsfort Wrapped up for Year...

Norman Ormiston's **Kingsfort** (War Chant) was yesterday reported none the worse for his exploits in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. Following the **TDN Rising Star's** neck defeat of Chabal (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in Saturday's Curragh contest, trainer Kevin Prendergast was keen to put a stop to his two-year-old campaign, and he reiterated that yesterday. "He's come out of the race well, couldn't be better," Prendergast told *PA Sport*. "He did it well. There wasn't much pace in the race, so he had to be

handy. He's better off being further back, but you can't have everything. He's got the money, he's a Group 1 winner, so you can't take that away from him. That's his lot, he's done his bit for this season, so we'll leave him for next season. He'll be in both 2000 Guineas: the English and the Irish. We'll monitor it and see how we go. He'll probably have a prep race, either in the G3 Guineas Trial at Leopardstown or the G3 Tetrarch S. at The Curragh."

Godolphin Ponder Targets for Star Juveniles...

Godolphin's Doncaster winners **Poet's Voice** (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Al Zir** (Medaglia d'Oro) will be set demanding tasks in the fall, trainer Saeed bin Suroor revealed yesterday. Poet's Voice, who recorded a 3/4-length success in Saturday's G2 Champagne S., is set for a tilt at the G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket Oct. 17, which could also be a target for **TDN Rising Star** Al Zir. That colt doubled his tally in a seven-furlong conditions event Friday; he also has the option of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster a week later. "Poet's Voice may go for the Dewhurst and he could stick to seven furlongs for his next race, but we will keep our options open for him," bin Suroor told *PA Sport*. "Al Zir could go for the Dewhurst or the Racing Post Trophy. He is coming on very well and he improved for his first run. I was hoping to see more horses in the race on Friday. He is still weak and will be better as a three-year-old. I like him a lot." He also reported the G1 St Leger one-two **Mastery** (GB) (Sulamani {Ire}) and **Kite Wood** (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) to be fine after the Doncaster Classic. "They are good, no problems," he continued. "We don't know what we will do with them. We will think about it, there is no final plan for them yet."

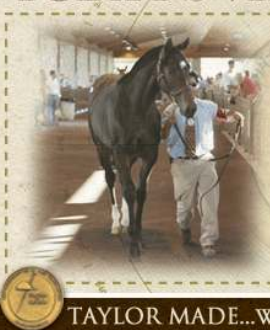

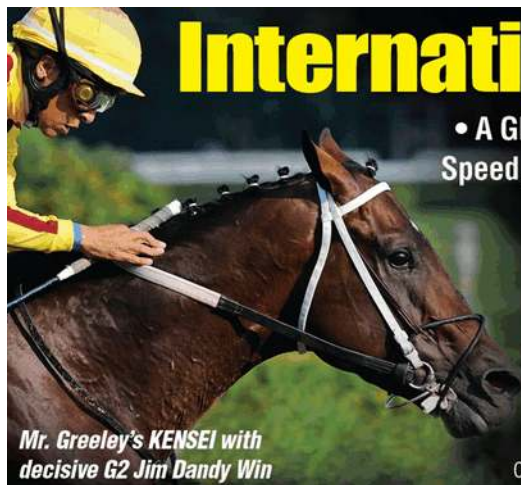
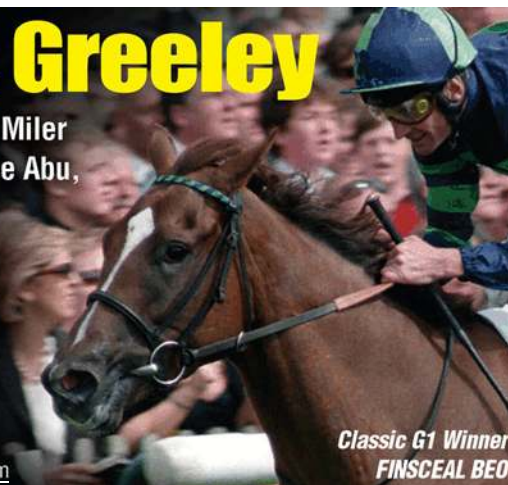

Horse Farm Workers Fund Awards Scholarships:

The Horse Farm Workers' Educational Assistance Fund has given out 32 scholarships for the coming school year. The awards were given to children of full-time workers on central Kentucky Thoroughbred farms and are tuition scholarships for post-high school education. The scholarships were given out based on economic need, merit, essays and personal interviews. The fund was established in 1996 and, since, its inception, has provided 384 scholarships. 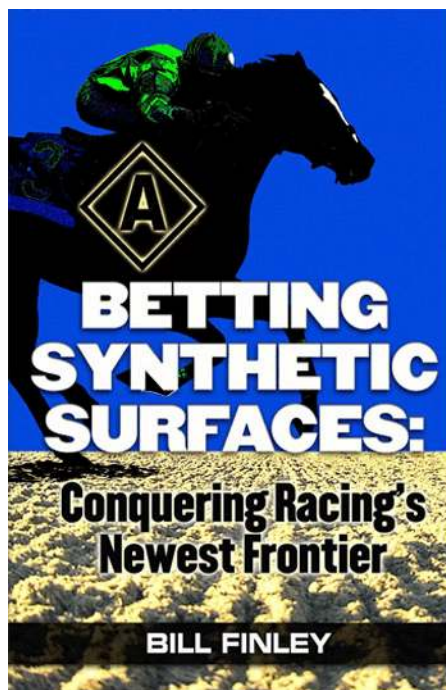
