VENTURA BEATS BOYS IN WOODBINE MILE

Ventura (Chester House) became the first female to take the GI Woodbine Mile when she bounded to the lead in the final furlong en route to a one-length victory over **Ferneley (Ire)** (Ishiguru) at Woodbine Sunday. The Juddmonte homebred, making her first start since a runner-up effort in the GI Vinery Madison S. at

Keeneland, was content to race near the back of the pack early. Angled to the far outside at the top of the lane, Ventura overtook the frontrunners in a matter of strides and outfinished Ferneley despite switching back to her inside lead and cocking her head to the right through the final furlong. The blaze-

Woodbine Mile last year, completed the mile in 1:32.04, just a tick off the course record. "Great credit to Bobby [Frankel] and all the crew for having her ready of the layoff," said Juddmonte Farm Manager Garrett O'Rourke. "She is one of his very favorites. She is a super mare, she is so full of spit and vinegar, and she came here today, and went one race better than that." **Cont. p2**

JUST AS WELL INHERITS NORTHERN DANCER

His late charge came up a bit short, but **Just As Well** (A.P. Indy) was awarded the win in Sunday's GI Northern Dancer S. at Woodbine when **Marsh Side** (Gone West) was disqualified from his first-place finish. Marsh Side, allowed to settle in second as 48-1 **Medjool** (Monarchos) cut out the pace on a daylight lead, forged to the front when the longshot ran out of gas on the turn, then drifted in when fighting off **Quijano (Ger)** (Acatenango {Ger}) in the final furlong. Favored **Champs Elysees (GB)** (Danehill), trying to rally up the rail, was forced to check sharply. Just As Well, avoiding the problems to his inside, closed well from midpack to cross the line a neck behind Marsh Side, with Quijano third and Champs Elysees recovering to be fourth. But the stewards took a good long look at the videotape and DQ'd Marsh Side for interfering with Champs Elysees. He was placed fourth, and Just As Well found himself in the winner's circle. "I feel badly," trainer Jonathan Sheppard admitted after inheriting the Grade I victory. [Marsh Side's trainer] Neil [Drysdale] is a good friend. He's got an awfully good horse. He possibly was the best horse, but he certainly beared across the course in the late stages." **Cont. p2**

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Ventura Beats the Boys in Woodbine Mile (cont. from p1)

The ultra-consistent Ventura, who has hit the board in 17 of 19 lifetime starts, ended her 2008 campaign with a win in the Breeders' Cup Filly/Mare Sprint at Santa Anita and began the season with a win in the Jan. 31 GI Santa Monica H. She was just nosed out by Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) when second in the Mar. 7 GI Frank Kilroe H. and had not been out since missing by a head when runner-up behind Informed Decision (Monarchos) over the Polytrack in the Apr. 9 GI Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland. "You don't worry about the layoff with Bobby [Frankel], he does a tremendous job, and he knows this filly like the back of his own hand," winning rider Garrett Gomez said. "She was off for a little

while, you could she was feeling her oats and the pre-race nerves. I got her calmed down, she settled in, and did everything right." Gomez added the firm turf helped his mount yesterday. "Definitely, the soft ground hurt her chances [last year]. She has such a beautiful turn of foot and on the soft ground, she was not able to show that explosive move like you saw today. It takes away from her a little bit. To come off the layoff, and to do what she did today, she is a tremendous mare." Juddmonte's Garrett O'Rourke said a return trip to the Breeders' Cup could be in the works for Ventura. "The plan was always to go back in to try to win a second filly sprint, and obviously we will sit down and discuss that," the Irishman said. "I think that they will have to bring their running shoes to try to beat her in that race. She loves Santa Anita."

Just As Well, on the board in three Grade I events this term, captured the GIII Arlington H. in July and was coming off a runner-up effort behind Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the Aug. 8 GI Arlington Million. "We thought coming out of two consecutive 1 1/4-mile races where he was closing well that this is a good time to try him at the 1 1/2-mile," explained winning trainer Jonathan Sheppard. "Julien [Leparoux] got him settled very nicely. He relaxed for him and he came with his run. He probably just took a while extricating himself. If he had a clear run right when they first turned from home, he maybe would have got there anyway." Princess Haya, an allowance winner over the Gulfstream lawn in January and over the Monmouth turf July 5, had made only two previous stakes appearances, both off-the-turf affairs. The bay filly was runner-up in Delaware's John W. Rooney Memorial S. June 13 and was coming off a second in the Aug. 2 Taylor Made Matchmaker S. at Monmouth Park. Princess Haya saved ground while settling off the early fractions. She made steady progress along the rail down the lane, while heavily favored Forever Together made a dramatic wide move and looked set to power clear. The champion failed to quicken in the final strides, and Princess Haya snuck through along the rail to just get her nose on the line first. "I was comfortable on the rail, waiting," explained winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "In the stretch, I could see the horses in the lead spread a little bit, so I came through and made my move on the rail. My horse gave me a big kick. She's got a big turn of foot." 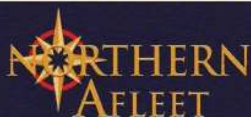

It was a big day for Darley inmate Street Cry (Ire). A few hours after daughter Princess Haya upset Forever Together in the GII Canadian S., another daughter topped Sunday's sixth session at Keeneland September. It was trainer John Ward, representing longtime client John Oxley,

Manda Island (Dynaformer), for \$370,000. It was easily the highest price on the day. On Saturday, Ward and Oxley teamed to purchase that session's highest-priced filly, a daughter of Tapit who went for \$330,000.

Hip 1966 was bred by O'Rourke's Silver Springs Stud Farm LLC and was offered by the O'Rourke Family's Plantation Stud through Paramount Sales.

"She was a big, strong filly from a lovely family," Paramount's Pat Costello commented. "She walked fantastic and had a great presence about her, and she's just lovely."

As for placing the filly in Book 3, Costello said, "We just wanted her to stand out, basically. She exceeded expectations. We knew she was always nice, but the second she showed up on the sales grounds, they just latched onto her."

Hip 1966's second dam is SW & GSP Alcando (Ire) (Alzao), who is the dam of four stakes horses, including SW & GSP Capistrano Day (Diesis {GB}).

The second-highest price on the day was paid for [hip 1874](#), a filly by Forest Wildcat who was knocked down to Tom VanMeter's Stockplace for \$270,000. The dark bay is a half-sister to SW Plagiarist (Souvenir Copy) and was produced by Feature Article (Seattle Slew), herself a daughter of GISW Golden Treat (Theatrical {Ire}).

Adriano (A.P. Indy). GI Belmont S. hero Bet Twice (Sportin' Life) is under the third dam.

The filly was consigned by the William B. Harrigan Sales Agency, the operation of Bill Harrigan, and his wife Jill co-bred hip 1874 with partner Mike Pietrangelo, who found the mare at the 2005 Barretts January Sale in Betty and Larry Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm dispersal. He paid \$21,000 for Feature Article.

"Mike and I partner on quite a few mares," Bill Harrigan explained. "He called me, I looked at her pedigree, and I said, 'Yeah, buy her.' But he gets the credit for selecting her."

Barren when they purchased her, Feature Article was sent to Petionville that spring and produced Haitian Sensation, who sold to Edgewood Farm for \$130,000 at this sale in 2007.

"He's now a maiden special weight winner in New York," said Jill Harrigan. "And there's a two-year-old full-sister to this filly who is up to working five-eighths at Belmont." That filly, named Wild News, was sold to King's Equine for \$90,000 last year.

Since buying Feature Article for \$21,000, the Harrigans and Pietrangelo have now sold \$490,000 worth of produce from her. Feature Article did not have a foal this spring and was bred back to Coolmore's young sire Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo).

Asked what made this Forest Wildcat filly special, Bill Harrigan replied, "People just really liked the way she moved--she's a very fluid mover. People also like that she's a May foal, but is already quite tall. There's so much upside when she fills out; she's going to be magnificent."

Before striking out on his own in 1996, Harrigan worked as general manager of the Kentucky division of the storied King Ranch and, prior to that, was the general manager of Fares Farm. The Harrigans' operation, located in Georgetown Kentucky, is named Miacomet Farm.

"We do a little bit of everything," said Jill. "We're a breeding operation, but we also break horses and do lay-ups."

Harrigan sports an impressive resume that includes involvement with some of the sport's best runners over the past two decades.

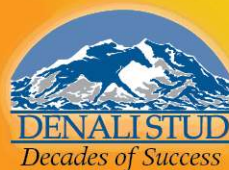

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"We've broke 17 Grade I winners, two Horses of the Year--A.P. Indy, going back a ways, and more recently Mineshaft--and five Breeders' Cup winners," said Harrigan.

Included among the Breeders' Cup winners are a pair of Phipps Stable homebreds, GI Distaff heroine Pleasant Home (Seeking the Gold) and GI Juvenile Fillies winner Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat).

"We're very fortunate to get the horses we do," said Harrigan.

Added Pietrangelo, "Bill's the best partner a guy could ask for. He does all the worrying, and he cares about the horses so much."

Adjusting to Market, Some Pinhookers Cut Orders...

Juvenile pinhookers became increasingly active during yesterday's sixth session at September, with buyers including Hartley/De Renzo, Straightaway Farm, Crupi's New Castle Farm, Hoby Kight and Eisaman Equine.

While as a group their names were plentiful on the sales sheets, few operations have been able to land more than two or three horses. That's in large part due to the fact that, in a shrinking market, both pinhookers and end users are stressing quality, putting even more demand on those that jump through all the hoops. It's also a result of buyers' spending patterns over the last two juvenile sale seasons.

"We're being more selective, because our buyers were so selective last year and we expect more of the same," explained Leprechaun Racing's Mike Mulligan. "The days of buying a useful horse and selling a useful horse for a profit seems to not be there at this stage of the game."

Niall Brennan, who owns and operates Niall Brennan Stables near Ocala, agrees.

"It's not a numbers game now," he said. "Now, it's really about quality, and it's been hard to buy quality horses for the money we need to be giving for them. We need to not get carried away with what we pay for a horse, or else we won't be here in the long run. We're not chasing horses. If you find one you like and you can live with the price, you go for it. But good horses are bringing really good money. They're bringing solid, real money, and if you're being selective, those are the ones you're trying to buy. But the end users are buying and spending a lot more money."

Mulligan added that he feels that some of the bigger-spending end users have stayed around longer than normal at September.

"It's always been that way in Books 1 and 2," he said. "But by Book 3, it used to be a bunch of pinhookers slinging it out on a nice horse, and I don't think that's the case now. There are 10, 15, 20 individuals that go through a day who are superior individuals, and so far they are going for more of a retail price, and the opportunities for us are less. We've tried on a lot of horses in the last few days and have been outrun on all but one [Leprechaun purchased [hip 394](#), a filly by Harlan's Holiday--Ms. Cornstalk for \$55,000 during Book 1]."

Leprechaun added a second purchase yesterday, spending \$5,000 on [hip 1952](#), a daughter of Johannesburg out of Love Locket.

Both Mulligan and Brennan said the result of that heightened competition, combined with general economic uncertainty, means they will nearly halve their stock for the coming season. Mulligan said he typically buys 40 yearlings a year, but expects that number to be closer to 25 this year. Brennan said his usual goal of 30 will be more like 15.

As far as the expected demand for juveniles in training next spring, Mulligan said he anticipates that it will resemble the 2009 season.

"At least that's what I hope," he said. "Certainly, last year we sold in the middle of the gloom of the whole thing. There are some economic indicators that show the stock market and a few other things are progressing. Hopefully, there aren't any more major setbacks, and I hope the two-year-old sales are around where they were last year. And maybe the premier horses will be that much more premier because there won't be as many of them."

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After Big Day, Back to Work for Hidden Brook...

Given that Hidden Brook was behind the purchase of Big Brown (Boundary), calling anything but May 3, 2008 a 'career day' for the operation might be a stretch. Still, Hidden Brook enjoyed a sensational afternoon this past Saturday, with **Awesome Maria** (Maria's Mon) winning the GII Matron S. and **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft) running second in the GII Futurity S. at Belmont. Both horses are E. Paul Robsham Stables homebreds who were born and raised at Hidden Brook.

Another juvenile, Hidden Brook sales grad **Bay to Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}), won the GIII Natalma S. at Woodbine,

while two horses purchased by Hidden Brook, **Quiet Meadow** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Condemned** (Speightstown), put forth strong efforts. Quiet Meadow was purchased for \$77,000 as a horse of racing age at last year's Keeneland November sale and was just nosed out by Rutherienne (Pulpit) in the GIII Noble Damsel H. at Belmont. Earlier on the

same card, the juvenile Condemned, purchased for client Paul Pompa, Jr. for \$350,000 at September a year ago, came home the easiest of winners in a 5 1/2-furlong maiden special weight dash.

"It was a good day for us," Dan Hall, Hidden Brook's director of bloodstock and client services, summed up modestly.

The buying team at Hidden Brook was back at it yesterday, hoping to land next year's star two-year-olds. Included in its purchases were: [hip 1649](#), a Sharp Humor--Secret Hills filly for \$85,000; and [hip 1730](#), a Yes It's True--Val Marie filly for \$175,000. Hidden Brook's only other buy of the sale was [hip 1083](#), a Johannesburg--Hatpin colt for \$270,000. All three were purchased for Pompa. Asked if they would be sent through the juvenile sales next spring, the route taken with many of Pompa's yearlings in the past, Hall said, "Paul kind of goes either way, so there's no definite plan with them right now. They'll be sent to Florida to be broken. The majority of Paul's go to David Scanlon's."

Hidden Brook was launched several years ago by friends and business partners Jack Brothers, Mark Roberts, Sergio de Sousa, Danny Vella and Hall. One of the things that Hidden Brook's success on Saturday underlines is the operation's scope in racing, selling and buying.

"We're going in a lot of different directions, but between the five of us, we have a lot of different talents and a lot of different connections, and that enables us to do it without sacrificing in any one area," Hall explained.

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The team approach works particularly well when it comes to sale time, said Hall.

"Between all of us, we see almost everything at the sale," he said, adding of their approach, "We have a certain physical that we go after, and both of those fit the criteria. You might forgive a little this or a little that, but you really can't forgive a lack of athleticism or balance. You put a lot of emphasis on the walk and on hind-end conformation."

Hidden Brook is best known for its success with Pompa, for whom it purchased GI Kentucky Derby hero Big Brown as a two-year-old in training, as well as Grade I winner Backseat Rhythm (El Corredor), but has several other clients, too.

"We buy for a guy named Mark Holiday, and we have a lot of smaller guys who we buy for on a smaller level, and then we buy some for ourselves," Hall explained. "We bought three or four fillies last year with the idea of racing them. Hidden Brook kept a significant interest in them, and some other guys took a small piece. It's a little less formal than a regular syndicate." *Cont. p9*



"We're looking to grow our broodmare band," Hall continued. "That's behind the idea of buying some of these fillies. Being a new operation, we don't have the money to go and buy some real nice mares. Not to toot our own horn, but I think we do a decent job picking out a yearling, so we'll race them and, hopefully, make our own pedigree."

Hall, a longtime employee at Adena Springs, recently left Frank Stronach's operation so he could devote his full attention to Hidden Brook.

"I started spending more time at the farm in January, and have been giving 100 percent of my time since June," Hall explained. "There was nothing negative about [leaving Adena]. I worked there for 19 years, and I still have a great relationship with them."

For Moonstone's Curtin, a Pinhooking Home Run...

Weanling-to-yearling pinhooks were the order of the day during Saturday's session, with seven of the eight top horses on the day falling under that category. Getting in on the action was Moonstone Sales' Sean Curtin. The Irishman sold the top filly Saturday, [hip 1568](#), a handsome, nearly white Tapit filly to John Oxley for \$330,000. Curtin had acquired the filly as a short yearling for just \$40,000 at Keeneland January. Moonstone consigned the daughter of the Menifee mare Mayan Milagra.

"She was a very pretty filly who vetted well," said trainer John Ward, who selected and purchased the colt for Oxley.

"She looks like she was raised right, and Tapit's doing well. She looks

like a great filly to point to the Oaks."

Oxley and Ward have won the GI Kentucky Oaks before, with Gal in a Ruckus (Bold Ruckus) in 1995, and won the 2001 GI Kentucky Derby with Monarchos (Maria's Mon). They also campaigned champion Beautiful Pleasure (Maudlin).

Born in Limerick and raised on a dairy farm, Curtin rode horses extensively as a youngster. He began working for Coolmore Ireland at the tender age of 17 and, after moving tack to the States, managed Empire Stud in Upstate New York for three years. In 2005, he struck out on his own and launched Moonstone in Kentucky.

The Tapit filly was one of seven horses he purchased to pinhook this year.

"I had four last year and made a little bit of money, so I stepped up a little bit," he explained. "It's nervous times to do it, and you always need a horse like this to step up."

Anna Gojanovich signed the ticket for the filly at January on Curtin's behalf.

"Anna had picked her out and I came and looked at her, and I didn't think I'd be able to afford her so I wasn't going to vet her," Curtin said. "Anna said I should vet her anyway, so I did, and I was able to get her for \$40,000."

At that time, Tapit was a recently crowned champion sire, having led the freshman sire list on the strength of horses like champion Stardom Bound and GI Hollywood

Starlet heroine Laragh. And while Tapit continued to sire stakes winners through late spring and early summer, those two stars were largely absent, potentially a problem when selling in a what-have-you-done-for-me-lately market. But then Tapit reminded buyers of his prowess by siring a third Grade I winner from his first crop, Careless Jewel, who rolled home by a pole in the Aug. 22 GI Alabama S. at Saratoga.

"I think Careless Jewel was perfect timing," said Curtin. "She was unbelievable in the Alabama. It seems to me there's a certain type of Tapit that do well--they're all those white-grays who are racy looking, with a lot of air under them. They stand over a lot of ground."

Curtin said his Tapit filly fell into that mold.

"She is just a filly with a lot of presence," he said. "Her color alone and how she shows herself, even as a weanling, made her a standout in the crowd."

Curtin added that he felt he got a little bit of help from the filly's damsire, too.

"When I got her, I did think she was lacking a little bit of pedigree," he admitted. "But she's out of a Menifee mare, who has done very well in the last eight months; he's had a lot of graded stakes horses. So she improved from that, and never put a foot wrong the entire time I had her. She was the type of filly where you just couldn't stop looking at her in the field."

"She's very nice," said Curtin. "She's a half to Lemonette (Lemon Drop Kid), who has won a stakes at Arlington since the catalogue and was just second in the GIII Glens Falls H. at Saratoga. She's just a running machine. They're very alike. This one is not really big, but she's very pretty."

The Silver Train filly was produced by Believability (Southern Halo). She was purchased as a weanling by Moonstone at Keeneland November for \$40,000.

GI Matron S. winner **Awesome Maria** (Maria's Mon) and stablemate **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft), runner-up in the Futurity, were both fine yesterday. "They're both in good shape," reported Lazaro Cruz, assistant to trainer Stanley Hough. "We'll wait a few days and see about their next starts, but we were happy with the way they both ran yesterday." **Worstcasescenario** (Forbidden Apple), eighth as the Matron favorite, appears to be in good shape, according to trainer Rick Violette. "She cooled out fine and she looks fine so far this morning," Violette said. "There's no obvious reason why she ran so poorly. Alan [Garcia] said she wasn't traveling well around the turn. We'll do a batter of examinations and go on from there--hopefully we'll find something we can fix." GIII Noble Damsel heroine **Rutherie** (Pulpit) exited the race "in very good order," according to trainer Christophe Clement.

QUALITY ROAD READIES FOR GOLD CUP

Quality Road (Elusive Quality) worked five furlongs Sunday at Belmont Park in 1:01.14 in preparation for the Oct. 3 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup. The colt is coming off a third-place effort in the 10-furlong GI Travers S. "You would think with having a mile and a quarter race under his belt that it would be beneficial to the next one," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He was ready for the Travers. Given different circumstances and a different surface, we might have done better, but it wasn't meant to be." Pletcher added that **One Note Samba** (Grand Reward), ninth in the GI Hopeful S., will likely make his next start in Sunday's Bertram F. Bongard S. for New York-bred juveniles. Pletcher is keeping all options open with **Condemned** (Speightstown), an impressive winner of Saturday's second race at Belmont. "There is a bit of a lull in the two-year-old stakes schedule," Pletcher said. "Perhaps there will be an overnight stakes for him. We will nominate him to the [Oct. 10 GI] Champagne S., but that's a bigger jump in class and distance than we'd like at this time."

Many Thoroughbred owners have goals, but Mike Repole has one that is unusual.

"I want to win a \$5,000 claiming race at Monmouth Park and the Belmont S. on the same day," Repole said.

Repole, who became active in ownership in 2004, has already found success in the claiming ranks, winning owner titles at Monmouth Park, the Meadowlands and Aqueduct. Now, following Nonna Mia's dominant maiden score at Belmont yesterday, he is poised to break into the sport's top echelon.

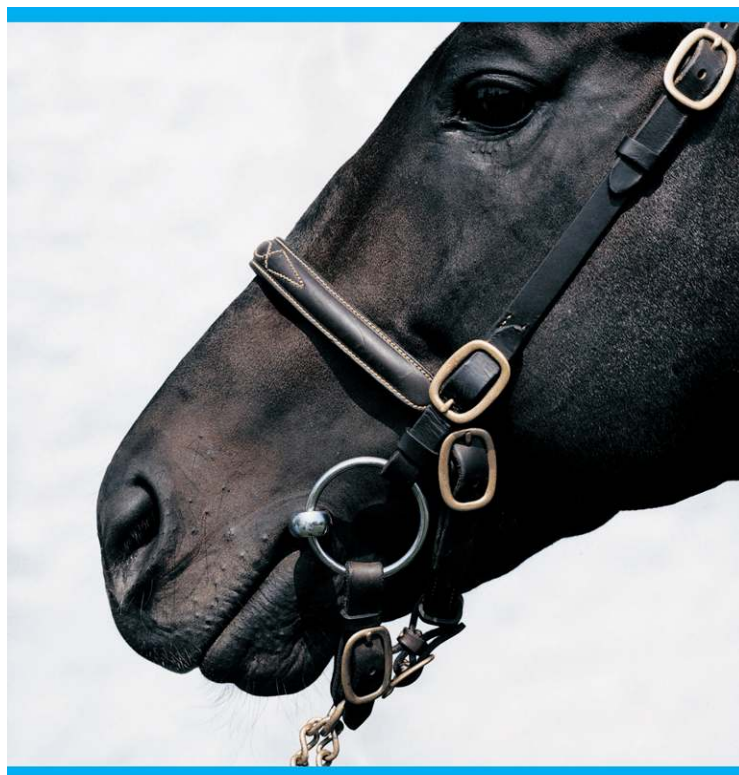
A native of Queens, New York, Repole has been a regular at New York's tracks since he was a teenager. He'd have strangers bet \$2 on his behalf back then, but now he plays for much larger stakes as he oversees his 110-horse operation, which includes yearlings, two-year-olds, veteran claimers and broodmares.

He still likes the "action" of the claiming game, but he has also worked to improve his stock by purchasing racing prospects at the yearling and two-year-old sales. One of his first acquisitions was Driven by Success (Precise End), who has gone on to finish third in the GI Carter H., GI Metropolitan Mile H. and the GII Tom Fool H.

Repole bought Nonna Mia for \$200,000 at last year's FTSAUG sale upon the recommendation of trainer Bruce Levine, Ocala-based horseman Jim Crupi and his racing manager Jim Martin.

"They'll give me a call and I'll look at the page," Repole explained. "They all picked her out; it was unanimous. Bruce is training the horse, Crupi raised the horse from a yearling to a two-year-old and Jim is my racing manager. It was a team effort, and I deserve none of the credit other than being the guy who came up with the \$200,000 to buy her."

Nonna Mia, according to Levine, wasn't fully cranked for her first start when she faded to fifth after contesting the pace. **Cont. p3**



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"She was eating sorta finicky, so I never really drilled her hard," Levine said of the filly, who ran without bleeder medication in her debut. "In my mind, I knew she was going to need her first race. I usually [add Lasix] in the second start. I don't want them to over-exert themselves. It takes a lot of water out of their system, and I don't think they need it the first time when you're just trying to get a start into them."

With that tightener, Nonna Mia was ready to roll yesterday. Repole said he has already received three phone calls from prospective buyers, but the filly, who may be pointed to the Oct. 10 GI Frizette S. at Belmont, is not for sale.

"Other than in a claiming race, I don't think I've ever sold a horse in my life," the owner remarked. "And the horse has a special meaning. 'Nona Mia' means 'My Grandmother' in Italian, and she was named after my grandmother, who is 83 years

old and is fighting cancer. She was at the track today with her Repole Stable hat. We had the entire family there. I'm not in the game to make money, because, most likely, you won't make money. I'm in it for the fun. It was a great family experience, watching my 83-year-old grandmother watch her namesake win by 12 lengths and getting her into the winner's circle. It made it a pretty special day." -J.F.

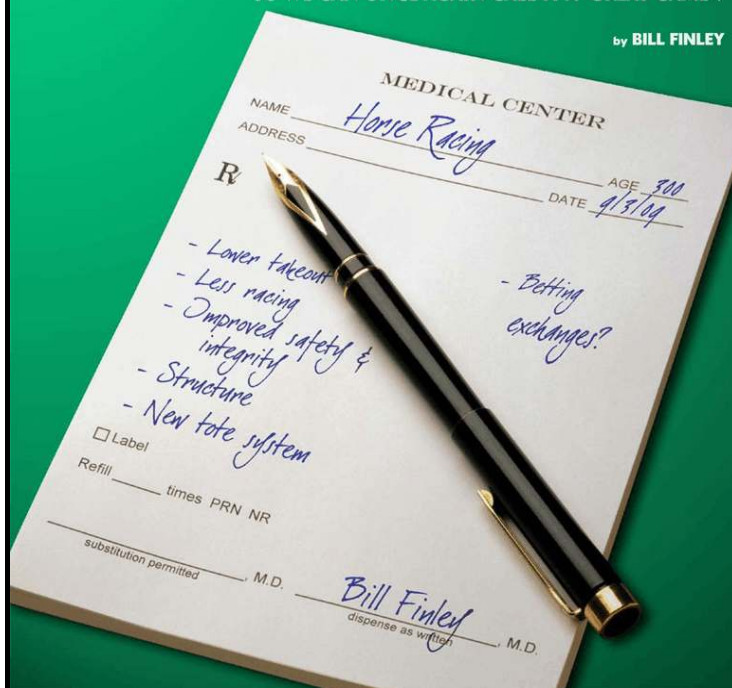

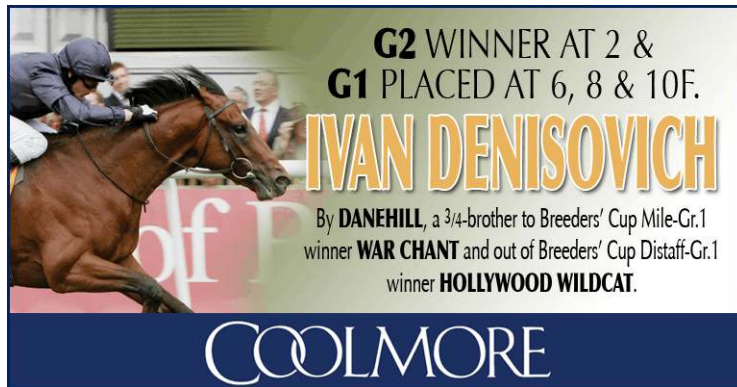
