'DREAM' ENDING TO TATTERSALLS

Tattersalls' Book 1 October Yearling Sale finished in Newmarket last night with figures marginally down on 2008. The final session's 113,907gns average dropped by 6.3 percent and the 80,000gns median fell by 5.9 percent. The day--and sale--were topped by a

700,000gns Oasis Dream (GB) colt out of Maganda (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Marcus Tregoning and Kazakhstani owner Nurlan Bizakov made a bold play for the colt, but it was Coolmore boss John Magnier who signed the buyer's ticket after seeing off Sir Robert Ogden. The colt, selling as hip 545 from John Deer's Oakgrove Stud

in Wales, had been bought in utero by agent Amanda Skiffington for 320,000gns at the 2007 December Sale.

"I'd imagine he'll be going to Ballydoyle and race for the usual partnership," said Magnier. "Paul Shanahan and Demi O'Byrne liked the horse, and that was it really."

Magnier had earlier outbid BBA Ireland agent Eamonn Reilly, standing with Jim Bolger, for a 600,000gns Galileo (Ire) colt sold from Michael O'Flynn's Co Cork-based Rockfield Farm (see 'Big Score for Burgeoning Rockfield' p2). The yearling, hip 499, was out of G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas second Kitza (Ire) (Danehill), who had been bought for 550,000gns at the 2006 December Sale. It was the second-highest price on the day.

ALCIBIADES SHINES ON KEENELAND OPENER

Juvenile fillies take center stage on today's opening day card at Keeneland with the 58th running of the GI Darley Alcibiades. The 12-horse field is headlined by GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie winner **She Be Wild** (Offlee Wild). The Wayne Catalano-trained filly is unbeaten in three lifetime starts, all over Arlington Park's Polytrack surface. A winner for a \$40,000 tag in her May 30 debut, She Be Wild won the Aug. 8 Top Flight S. before her 5 3/4-length victory in the one-mile Lassie. Peter Callahan's **Beautician** (Dehere) has been in against

divisional leader Hot Dixie Chick (Dixie Union) in her last two starts and came away with runner-up efforts in the July 29 GIII Schuylerville S. and Sept. 6 GI Spinaway S. A maiden winner at Churchill June 5, the Ken McPeck trainee will be trying the synthetic for the first time today. Westrock Stables' **Decelerator** (Dehere) won the June 27 GIII Debutante S. at Churchill, but found that success hard to replicate at Saratoga, finishing sixth in the Schuylerville and ninth in the Aug. 19 GII Adirondack S. **Zilva** (Successful Appeal) is the lone entrant in the field to have negotiated the 1 1/16-miles of the Alcibiades. The Augustin Stable's colorbearer broke her maiden over the Saratoga lawn at the distance Sept. 2. **Full Field** p6

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Fast Lane to the Top...

There was no disguising the delight of Oakgrove Stud manager Tim Lane after the farm's sole lot in Book 1, a colt by Oasis Dream (GB), went straight to the top of the charts when sold to Demi O'Byrne for 700,000gns. Hip [545](#) was bought in utero when Maganda (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) went through the December Sales of 2007 and fetched 320,000gns.

"He's been a lovely horse since day one, and we've had a few niggles with him this week which has made it all a bit more stressful," Lane confessed. "Ever since he was a weanling, he's always stood out, but you don't think when they're standing in the paddock that they are going to top Book 1, do you?"

Lane was quick to praise the team at Oakgrove, which is based next door to Chepstow racecourse in Wales and is owned by John Deer, successful owner/breeder of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye-winning half-brothers Patavellian (GB) (Machiavellian) and Avonbridge (GB) (Averti {Ire}).

"He's a joy to have, he has a great temperament and Mark Savage has done a really good job handling him," added Lane, a former point-to-point rider (amateur jump jockey), who still has the odd race ride. "Maganda has a Green Desert colt at foot and is in foal to Green Desert. It would be lovely to go back to Oasis Dream."

Five colts and a filly by Juddmonte's boom sire Oasis Dream returned six-figure prices throughout Book 1. The son of Green Desert is responsible for 11 individual group or graded winners so far in 2009.

Big Score for Burgeoning Rockfield...

County Cork property developer Michael O'Flynn had a good result when a Galileo (Ire) colt (hip [499](#)) sold from his 100-acre Rockfield Farm elicited a bid of 600,000gns from John Magnier. The youngster's dam, 1998 G1 Irish Oaks and G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Kitzu (Ire) (Danehill), was one of the foundation mares bought for O'Flynn by the late Brian Grassick for 550,000gns at the 2006 December Sale.

"He was the most intelligent horse I've worked with, and the more we did with him, the more he enjoyed it," said Rockfield Farm's manager David Burns, who had previously managed Gerrardstown House Stud for Joe Higgins after a spell at Shadwell in America. "Michael bought the family farm at Kilcrea from his parents and decided to up the ante and get some nice bloodstock. We are trying to be commercial, and this is only our second crop and the first that we've bred--the previous foals were being carried by the mares we bought. We've got about 10 mares, and we may look to expand that number."

Good Day for Galileo...

A good day for Galileo (Ire) also included the third-highest price, a colt out of Lila (GB) (Zafonic) sold by Bob Lanigan's Co Tipperary-based Tullamaine Castle Stud. Sir Robert Ogden, standing with advisor John Warren, had more luck this time when seeing off trainer Paul Cole at 550,000gns for hip [523](#).



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"There are only a handful of these types of horses this week, and he fell into that category of above-average individuals," said Warren. "We are looking to build up a portfolio of around eight lovely horses for Sir Robert and also got two at Deauville in August. We bought some earlier sorts of horses yesterday, but this is more of a three-year-old type. He was a big horse, which could come from his dam's sire Zafonic. When you see these Galileos in the ring, they are just a different breed."

Talking about the week's trade, Warren added, "It has been the same old theme here, the market for nice horses has held up really well and buyers will always come out of the woodwork for them. The market is selective, but that is exactly as it should be. These are the best yearlings that will come up for sale in Europe, and if they are not here they will be nowhere else--these will just have the homebreds to compete against. It's very hard to breed a top individual that has the right pedigree who ticks all the boxes on looks. The pyramid is very narrow at the top, and in a way it's like the Olympics--there are not many Usain Bolts around."

Training plans for Ogden's purchases have still to be finalised.

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Sheikh Mohammed Stays Busy...

Sheikh Mohammed was at the sale again, and his new recruits included a 500,000gns Medicean (GB) half-sister to English and Irish 1000 Guineas heroine Finsceal Beo (Ire). Peter Doyle--standing with owner Chris Wood--was underbidder. The American-bred

chestnut, catalogued as hip [600](#), was sold from Liam Cashman's Co Cork-based Rathbarry Stud and was the day's highest price for a filly. It was the fourth-highest price overall yesterday.

Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock agent John Ferguson also paid 425,000gns for hip [516](#), an Elusive Quality

half-brother to 2006 French 2000 Guineas winner Aussie Rules (Ire) who was in the first draft from Prince Faisal Salman's Denford Stud.

The final lot offered completed an excellent sale for Newsells Park Stud. Hip [676](#) was a Galileo (Ire) colt out of Puce (GB) (Darshaan {GB}) for whom Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock--acting for an undisclosed client--outbid trainer Marcus Tregoning at 475,000gns.

Denford Quick Off the Blocks...

At any sale there are always success stories and sob stories, but there has, on the whole, been a distinctly positive feel to the three-day premier sale at Tattersalls this week. For Denford Stud, there was great satisfaction to have sold each of the five colts offered in its inaugural year of consigning after owner Prince Faisal Salman elected to trade independently from Kirtlington Stud, for whom he has been a long-standing patron.

"We always felt that Last Second (Ire)'s colt would be our best horse, but the Galileo (Ire) out of Last Second's daughter was also lovely and we're really pleased with the prices they've made," said stud manager Richard Evans, who was previously at Kirtlington.

Lot [516](#), Last Second's Elusive Quality half-brother to Aussie Rules (Aus) was, as Evans had predicted, the draft's highlight. The bay made 425,000gns when knocked down to John Ferguson on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, who stands the colt's sire in Kentucky. Earlier in the day a Galileo filly out of Intrigued (GB)--Last Second's stakes-placed daughter by Darshaan (GB)-- had been bought by Paul Cole for 260,000gns (hip [466](#)).

"They're not sales-toppers, but they are just good strong prices in this market," said Evans. "We've no complaints, and Prince Faisal is very happy. He's also happy that we're selling horses and not just being seen to buy back. The colts are here to be sold and, so far, we've sold them all."

The draft also included a first-crop colt by the Prince Faisal-bred Poule d'Essai des Poulains winner Aussie Rules (Daneshill) out of Annalina (hip [224](#)) who sold earlier in the sale for 65,000gns.

"It was also a nice price for the Aussie Rules colt," Evans said. "It's early days for the mare, she's got to prove herself and she has a two-year-old in training with John Gosden--her first foal--so 65,000gns was good."

Talking about Denford's inaugural draft, Evans added, "Everyone was excited and looking forward to this sale. Prince Faisal was looking to have his own identity, and it was good to have a nice bunch of horses as our first draft. This was a strong sale, and they've all sold, so it's a job well done."

Luana, barren to Alhaarth (Ire) in 2007, produced this full sister to MGSW & MG1SP Hattan (Ire) and half to SW & MGSP Tastahil (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) last Feb. 12 and the chestnut was knocked down to a successful British-based trainer.

Bidding on behalf of breeders Gary and Lesley Middlebrook, Richard O'Gorman bloodstock purchased Miznah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), the dam of MGSW & MG1SP Zindabad (Fr) (Shirley Heights {GB}), for \$260,000 at KEEJAN in 2005, and made back a sizeable portion of that investment when the Mr. Greeley colt she was carrying at the time sold to Sheikh Mohammed's chief bloodstock advisor for \$200,000 at KEESEP in 2006. A Giant's Causeway colt from the stakes-winning mare sold for a modest 115,000gns at this venue in 2007, and John Ferguson went back to the well again yesterday. Gary Middlebrook is a member of The Jockey Club of England and has owned horses since 1989. He is the breeder of the dual Group 1-winning sprinter Reverence (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) as well as Singhalese (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}), the 2005 GI Del Mar Oaks heroine.

Representatives of the BBA Ireland went to work on behalf of owner Liam Cashman's Rathbarry Stud at the 2003 Keeneland November sale, going to an even \$100,000 for the multiple stakes-placed Musical Treat (Ire) (Royal Academy). The foal she was carrying at the time was a Mr. Greeley filly which would sell for €340,000 at the Goffs Orby sale in 2005. Racing as Finsceal Beo (Ire), she would go on to knock down three Group 1 events and become a five-time champion in Europe. Musical Treat's foal of 2005, Musical Bar (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), realized €150,000 at the 2006 Orby, while John Ferguson bought Frozen Power (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) for 500,000gns at last year's October sale. He has since gone on to take the Listed Prix de la Huderie at Deauville Aug. 28. Yesterday's offering, from the same Mr. Prospector sire line as Finsceal Beo, proved just as popular.

A maiden winner and Group 3-placed at two, Park Romance was off the board in a pair of starts as a three-year-old and was hammered down to Emerald Bloodstock for Seamus Burns' Lodge Park Stud for 200,000gns at the 2006 Tattersalls July Sale. Her Motivator (GB) colt she was carrying at the time sold for 110,000gns as a TATDEC foal in 2007, and this produce got the Lodge Park team squarely into black figures. Lodge Park Stud also bred and sold 2008 G1 Epsom Derby hero New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire})--a €430,000 GOFORB yearling--who covered Park Romance earlier this year.

Mahony Satisfied with Sale Results

After the sale's end, Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "The global economy remains fragile, and we cannot pretend that the bloodstock market is immune from the impact of economic realities. But the vendors have brought some outstanding individuals to Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale, and we are delighted that their faith in the sale has been rewarded. From the moment that this year's Book 1 catalogue was published, we were told that it was probably the strongest we had compiled since moving to this format in 2004, and the results have confirmed that assessment."

He continued, "To achieve a set of figures that compare favourably not only with last year's, but also with those from 2007, demonstrates the enduring demand for quality horses, as well as the reputation of October 1 as Europe's premier yearling sale."

"The top end of the market has been as competitive as ever, with more six-figure transactions than at last year's Book 1, and eight yearlings selling for 500,000 guineas or more."

"The traditional big battalions deserve a special mention for their sustained support of the sale, and it has been particularly encouraging to have seen them joined by a number of new participants from throughout the world."

"It has also been pleasing to see so many trainers active over the past three days and to have received such positive feedback regarding the new Tattersalls Millions. Expanding the series to eight races worth £1.75 million between them, as well as reducing the race entry costs, has clearly caught the imagination of the owners and trainers, and they can now look forward to some competitive and rewarding contests for their Book 1 purchases next year."

"We have two more yearling catalogues to come with Book 2 beginning on Monday, and we will be able to assess the market more fully at the end of next week. But in the meantime the industry can take heart from the returns this week."

DUBLIN EYES CHAMPAGNE VICTORY

Dublin (Afleet Alex) headlines a compact field of six juveniles entered yesterday for Saturday's GI Champagne S. at Belmont Park. The strapping chestnut matched the achievement of his freshman sire with an impressive two-length victory in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga. He'll try to do dad one better in the Champagne, where Afleet Alex was runner-up in 2004, while breaking from post five Saturday. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas continues to be impressed with his charge, who is the 8-5 morning-line favorite. "He's got a really good mind," the Hall of Famer said. "He handles everything in stride." And Lukas thinks Dublin has only gotten better since his Hopeful score. "He's gotten more focused," Lukas said. "He's stronger and tighter than he was." While Dublin is the only stakes winner, the Champagne field also includes the late-closing Hopeful runner-up **Aspire** (Tale of the Cat), who breaks from post three and is 3-1 on the morning line. "He's improved a lot from race to race and hopefully he'll handle the stretchout to a mile," said trainer Eddie Kenneally. "Dublin is a real nice horse and we didn't get beaten too much by him." The Sept. 19 GII Futurity S. runner-up **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft) drew post four and is 7-2 on the morning line. "He stumbled a little on the break [in the Futurity] and it cost him," trainer Stanley Hough said. "It forced him to come inside. It didn't make a difference in the outcome, but he may have been a couple lengths closer. The maiden race, Dublin's first start, he got into a speed duel that hurt him. He's progressed nicely."

Racing Round-Up

Sapling Runner-up Sidelined...

Klaravich Stables' **Not Macho Any More** (Macho Uno), runner-up in the Sept. 5 GIII Sapling S. at Monmouth Park, was injured earlier this week, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The colt had been expected to make his next appearance in Saturday's GI Champagne S. at Belmont Park, but fractured a sesamoid in his left front leg. While the injury is not life threatening, it could end his racing career. "The X-rays are out to the various experts to see what can and can't be done," trainer Rick Violette Jr. told *DRF*. "Certainly, in the near term, we're out of commission. Hopefully, we'll still have a racehorse on the other side of it. Sesamoids are very tricky and not necessarily always the most responsive to surgery or rehab." But, Violette added, "He doesn't know anything's wrong; he's standing in his stall very comfortably." A winner first time out at Belmont in July, Not Macho Any More was making his second start in the Sapling. Another Klaravich juvenile, **Bulls and Bears** (Holy Bull), is unlikely to return until next year. The \$135,000 OBSMAR purchase has been sidelined by illness since finishing fifth after a nightmare trip in the July 30 GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. Violette is optimistic about his sophomore season. "He's a horse that has a real future in front of him," he told *DRF*.

Salve Germania Acquired by IEAH...

Salve Germania (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), who eked out a game head triumph in the Aug. 29 GII Ballston Spa H. at Saratoga for owner Mannfred Hellwig and trainer Waldemar Hickst, has been purchased by IEAH Stables, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The four-year-old filly, who was transferred to trainer Todd Pletcher after arriving at the Spa, will remain with Pletcher and be pointed for the Oct. 17 GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. Fractious prior to making her North American bow, the chestnut came flying late to edge Rutherienne (Pulpit) in the race. "Her first time in America, she was completely out of her mind and she still won," IEAH's Michael lavarone told *DRF*. "If she settles down, she could be a superstar." Group-placed in Germany, Salve Germania has compiled a record of 9-2-0-1, earning \$153,242.

Darrell Yates and his wife Evelyn make the four-hour trek from their Bethalto, Illinois home to Arlington Park nearly every time one of their horses is entered to run at the Chicago track and their juvenile colt Dixie Band hasn't made them regret the trip yet in just three lifetime outings. The colt, a \$60,000 FTFEB purchase earlier this year, debuted with a 3 1/4-length victory sprinting 4 1/2 furlongs at Arlington June 21. He followed that effort with a 1 1/2-length tally in the Aug. 8 Spectacular Bid S. and recorded his biggest win to date with a determined 1 3/4-length triumph in the Sept. 5 GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity.

The trip might be longer, but the reward greater next time out. Dixie Band is expected to make his next start in Saturday's GI Dixiana Futurity at Keeneland.

The Yateses have been involved with horse racing since the 1970s, but Darrell Yates admits they were somewhat forced into the Thoroughbred game.

"I got involved in racing years ago, with Quarter Horses," Yates explained. "Of course the Quarter Horses in our part of the world, we ran out of places to run them. They quit running them at the state fairs and places like that, so Evelyn and I decided to

start into the Thoroughbreds."

The couple, who met while they were growing up in Tennessee, began racing Thoroughbreds in the mid-1980s and enjoyed their greatest success in racing with Crypto Star, who won the 1997 Louisiana and Arkansas Derbies before running fifth in that year's Kentucky Derby. They also campaigned Illinois champion Little Sucker. They have a 30-acre farm near their home, but their broodmare band has dwindled down to one mare.

"We usually have more horses than that, but right now the babies are off being broke and we don't have that many broodmares left," Yates said.

"I'm kind of getting to the age when I'm not looking at broodmares anymore," he continued. "I just want to look at something that is ready to run."

The Yates's racing stable currently includes 8 1/2 horses. "I have one that I'm partners in with someone else," Yates explained. "That's enough. I usually don't have that many horses in training at one time, but we had a good year this year. It seemed like everyone that we picked up was a winner, so we just kind of kept going."

Yates, founder and chief executive officer of RCS Construction, says that he finds new acquisitions in a variety of places. "I buy some at the auctions, some private, just kind of wherever I can find them," he said.

While not focusing on the juvenile sales particularly, Yates said he bought a couple of two-year-olds at public auction this year and he finds there is an advantage in shopping at the two-year-old auctions.

"They are ready to run," Yates said of two-year-old sales horses. "You

can tell a little more about how they are progressing. They are further along, so you can tell a little more about them."

A self-professed "pedigree nut," Yates looks to his advisors for help in the conformation part of the buying process.

"I usually have somebody help me with the conformation," he confirmed. "I never could get enough confidence in myself to

do it by myself. But in the pedigrees, I'm looking for a Classic horse. Something with good breeding top and bottom. I really love to look at the bottom side of a horse and see what kind of family they have."

Yates gives the credit for picking Dixie Band out of Fasig-Tipton's February sale to longtime trainer Wayne Catalano, who conditioned Crypto Star for the couple.

"I was at home in Illinois and Wayne called me and said, 'I've been looking at a little colt that I like and he's going through the sale,'" the 72-year-old explained. "I didn't even see him before I bought him. Wayne looked at him and picked him out and I just gave him the go-ahead that, if he liked him that much, why not go ahead and buy him."

Buying a future graded stakes winner for \$60,000 looks like a bargain now and Yates admitted the price tag was less than he expected to pay for Dixie Band.

"I asked Wayne when he called me what he thought he'd go for and he said maybe \$100,000," Yates recalled. "I said, 'I really don't want to spend that much, but you can go to \$75,000 if you want to.' And we ended up getting him for \$60,000."

Yates is enjoying watching Dixie Band's successes on the racetrack and admits each victory is special, but the Arlington-Washington Futurity was a little extra special.

"I've seen all of his races," Yates said. "I guess I'm always surprised when I win. It's quite a thrill, but the last race, being a graded race, it had a little extra thrill to it."

Another victory by Dixie Band at Keeneland Saturday could send the couple from Illinois to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup, but Yates won't get talked into looking past this weekend.

"I'm kind of scared to look that far," Yates said of a possible Breeders' Cup start for Dixie Band. "We're going to wait until after this race and then decide from there." -Jessica Martini

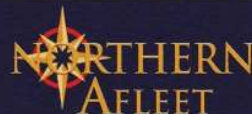
