Zayat Stables went to \$250,000 to acquire Eskendereya at the 2008 Keeneland September sale, and connections initially thought the colt would be best suited to the grass. The chestnut debuted on the Saratoga lawn last September, closing ground late to be the runner-up. He made his second career start in the Oct. 4 Pilgrim S. at Belmont, and saw

his fate changed when that race was taken off the weeds and moved to a good main track. Rated in fourth early, the maiden forged to the lead in the stretch and powered away to a 7 1/4-length triumph. Eskendereya made his next appearance on the synthetic in the Nov. 7 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but was steadied sharply on the first turn and never factored thereafter, finishing ninth. A two-month vacation followed, and he opened his sophomore campaign with a workmanlike wire-to-wire score in a Gulfstream allowance test Jan. 7. But his performance in the Fountain of Youth opened some eyes, as he spanked Jackson Bend and company, and he stamped himself the one to beat in the "Run for the Roses" at the Big A yesterday. "It's amazing," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who will be looking to break an 0-for-24 streak in the Kentucky Derby. "The further he goes, the stronger he gets." Pletcher was pleased that his charge was able to sit just off the slow pace. "He's not at the mercy of anyone's pace--he sets his own pace," he remarked. "We just wanted him in his rhythm. I thought he settled very well today. In the Fountain of Youth, Johnny [Velazquez] thought maybe he could have settled a little more. Today, he couldn't have been more professional." Although Team Pletcher has fielded as many as five starters in a single Derby, the conditioner insisted yesterday, "We've never had a horse we knew could handle the mile and a quarter, and we've never had one put together a couple of preps like this one. We've had some good prep wins, but none as impressive as these two." Eskendereya has a two-year-old half-sister named Wear Red (Henny Hughes) and a yearling half-sister by First Samurai; his dam was bred back to Henny Hughes for 2010. He will now ship back to Palm Meadows, and is expected to head to Churchill Apr. 20.

Derby victory. He up-ended Munnings with a 113 Beyer Speed Figure in a salty Churchill allowance May 1 and looked to be on his way to bigger and better things, but faltered when stretched out as the odds-on choice in both the GIII Northern Dancer S. at Churchill in June and the GII Dwyer S. at Belmont the following month, and was second once more in the

GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Aug. 1. He was a flat fifth in the 10-furlong GI Shadwell Travers S. four weeks later, and trainer Ian Wilkes went to Plan B. "After he couldn't get the distance in the Travers, we decided, let's make him a one-turn horse, seven-eighths or a mile," Wilkes said. "Let's make him a really good horse. He wants to be a good horse."

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However, it took Warrior's Reward a while to make good on his promise. Oct. 17, the handsome bay was second-best at 1-2 in a Churchill allowance heat Nov. 21, and Wilkes regrouped once more. Warrior's Reward made a solid late run to kick off 2010 on a winning note in a Gulfstream optional claimer Feb. 11, and was the third choice here while facing Musket Man and Munnings once more. After breaking from the rail in the fog, the big colt settled at the back of the tightly bunched group led by Digger (Yonaguska), and jockey Julien Leparoux eased him to the outside on the turn. Musket Man fought his way through traffic to hit the front in midstretch, but Warrior's Reward came rolling on the far outside, and bested his rival in the shadow of the wire. "This is a horse that needs to be relaxed, and he relaxed very well today," Leparoux reported. "I moved up on the turn just to get a little position, and he just dragged me all the way to the front. I think one turn will be best." Musket Man's trainer Derek Ryan commented, "I don't want to see another photograph. There was nothing that we could do. It's a tough beat. We'll probably bring him to Churchill Downs, then to Belmont for the Met Mile before we give him a rest for the summer." Blue Grass Runners Tune Up...

The field for next weekend's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. continues to take shape, with several possible starters on the worktab yesterday. **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}), who earned his diploma in Gulfstream's grassy GIII Palm Beach S. Mar. 6, geared up at Keeneland with a five-furlong move in :59.60. He has never raced over a synthetic surface before. "It looked like he did it very easily and galloped out strong," trainer Dale Romans said of the Donegal Racing colorbearer's workout. "I got him in :59 3/5 and out in 1:12 1/5." Trainer Todd Pletcher sent GII San Felipe S. runner-up **Interactif** (Broken Vow) out for a five-furlong move in 1:01 at Churchill Downs, while stablemate and GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. third-place finisher **Aikenite** (Yes It's True) covered the same distance in 1:02.20 at Palm Meadows. "They both went well," Pletcher said. "Interactif was on his 'A' game...Aikenite did it very well." Aikenite, owned by Dogwood Stables, was a close second in last term's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity S. at Keeneland. Wertheimer and Frere's homebred Interactif, a multiple-graded stakes winner on grass, made his all-weather debut in the San Felipe.

Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale Monday, April 5 • 4 p.m.

JUVENILES IN SPOTLIGHT AT KEENELAND

Keeneland's April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the final major juvenile auction of the season, gets underway Monday at 4 p.m. The boutique sale's latest poster boy is **Lookin at Lucky** (Smart Strike), who sold to Mike Pegram last year for \$475,000. With three Grade I victories last term, Lookin at Lucky was named Eclipse champion juvenile, and remains a solid contender for the GI Kentucky Derby despite a troubled third-place finish in yesterday's GI Santa Anita Derby. **Big Brown** (Boundary) is another big-name April graduate, having sold in 2007 for \$190,000 to Hidden Brook, as agent for Paul Pompa, Jr. before winning the 2008 GI Kentucky Derby.

The accomplishments of those two champions provide a ringing endorsement for spending the Easter weekend in Lexington this year, according to Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell.

"Any time you have a sale that has produced two Eclipse Award winners in the previous two years, it has a huge effect," Russell said. "I think Big Brown gave the sale a great boost, and then to follow it up with a champion two-year-old is huge. I think it's a great boost for our catalogue. For these boutique two-year-old sales, you have to have horses like that every year."

Russell is confident this year's April catalogue will live up to expectations.

"I think it's a very good catalogue, a very strong catalogue," Russell said. "I think the individuals have shown that we have a nice group of horses. The next Lookin at Lucky or Big Brown could be right among them."

Thursday's under-tack preview was conducted under sunny skies with temperatures in the high 70s and a favorable breeze. Six juveniles shared the fastest furlong time of :10 flat, while a Pulpit colt from Eddie Woods' consignment turned in the fastest quarter-mile drill of :20.3.

"The breezes went very well," Russell added. "It was a gorgeous day in Lexington. It was a very, very well-attended preview, and the horses presented themselves very well. The times were very consistent from the first group to the last group."

April Juvenile a Horse of a Different Color...

Coming as it does near the end of the major juvenile auctions, the Keeneland April sale often attracts a slightly different group of horses than its earlier counterparts.

"Our consignors have always looked at our sale as being a little stronger pedigree on the female side and having a two-turn kind of Classic type," Geoffrey Russell explained. "Some of the other sales tend to be more speed-oriented. That's why we are fortunate to have two Kentucky Derby winners and two Oaks winners in our alumni. Hopefully, by the first Saturday in May, we'll have three Kentucky Derby winners in our alumni."

Consignor Eddie Woods thinks the later sales date attracts buyers willing to go beyond raw time.

"At the earlier sales, the very obvious ones tend to do very well," Woods commented. "And at the later sales, people are inclined to buy horses that may not work as fast, but are just as nice as the horses that worked very quick. They are probably a better kind of horse at the end of the day."

Niall Brennan acknowledged the importance of the extra weeks to some of the two-year-olds he consigns.

"That's generally the reason that you point to Keeneland," Brennan said. "It's just horses that you figure might need more time. Even if it's just a big, growthy, two-turn kind of horse. You're just trying to give them more time, so that you're not having to push the buttons in February when you can wait until April."

All Good in the Woods...

When it comes to the two-year-old in training and selling game, only a handful of consignors can make the claims that Eddie Woods is able to make. Classic winner? Check. Breeders' Cup winner? Check. Eclipse Award-winning champion? Check. The only accomplishment Woods has not realized to this point is to sell an eventual Horse of the Year. But if his track record is anything to go by, it won't be long.

Woods--whose former April sale grads include top performers Borrego (El Prado {Ire}), Halory Hunter (Jade Hunter) and Pollard's Vision (Carson City)--is not so far removed from his biggest pinhook coup to date. Woods gave \$60,000 for a colt by Boundary out of the Nureyev mare Mien at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton October sale, and resold the bay for \$190,000 at the April sale the following year. Secured by Paul Pompa Jr. and christened Big Brown, the sophomore went on to win four races at the highest level--the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Preakness S., GI Florida Derby and GI Haskell Invitational S.--and was crowned champion three-year-old colt for 2008.

"We do keep a lot of nice horses to come here," stated Woods. "It's been a lucky spot for us, and we've sold some really good horses here."

All Roads Lead to Ocala...

A native of Meath, Ireland, Woods drew much of his early instruction in the world of horses from his father, who was a steeplechase jockey before turning to training. Woods would follow a similar path by also becoming

a steeplechase jockey, but decided to leave the high-risk occupation for something a little safer. After arriving in Southern Florida, he furthered his equine education while working for Tony and Joanne Everard, and later was based at a pair of Ocala-based training centers, Post Time and Classic Mile. Ready to launch his own training center in December of 2000, Woods moved into his new facility, a 240-acre tract of land, which offers 36 paddocks, four barns, over 140 stalls, a mile track, a 7/8-mile turf course and multiple round pens. It didn't take long for the operation to take flight. Woods, who in 2000 led all consignors by number of graded stakes winner sold at two-year-old sales, earned the distinction of consigning the most Grade I winners in North America in 2002.

"We have a great collection of horses," said Woods. "This is probably as good a group of horses that I get to take to a sale anywhere."

Woods, who admits that this year's group is made up of a good mixture of pedigree and athletics, admits he probably doesn't have the star power that he packed last year with Take Control, a colt by A.P. Indy out of Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter), secured by Kaleem Shah for \$1.9 million. In his sole start to date, the chestnut overcame his inexperience and was tabbed as a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ in his victorious bow at Santa Anita Dec. 30.

"I'd love to tell you I am going to get \$1.9 million for something, [but] I just don't foresee it happening," admitted Woods. "We just don't have the horse that has had that kind of publicity and a Horse of the Year on both sides like last year." **Cont. p3**



Can Lightning Strike Twice cont.

Despite the absence of a superstar, the Irishman still packs a serious dose of black-type stud pedigree this time around. Among them is [hip 151](#), a Dynaformer colt who is a half-brother to the ill-fated, graded-stakes winning filly Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song). He worked in [:10 3/5](#). The Mar. 25 foal is out of MGSP Away (Dixieland Band), who reeled in a cool \$2.5 million from Team Darley at Keeneland's November Sale in 2008, the same year his older sister finished a gutsy second behind Big Brown (Boundary) in the GI Kentucky Derby.

"Eight Belles' brother is a really nice horse," said Woods. "He is a big, raw colt; very typical of his sire, Dynaformer. This colt will definitely be a two-turn horse, and these two-turn horses can go on and be a good three-year-old all day."

Also likely to draw plenty of attention is [hip 117](#), a daughter of champion Johannesburg, out of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Spain (Thunder Gulch), who brought \$5.3 million at the Keeneland November sale in 2003. Purchased by Pegasus Holding Group for \$300,000 at Keeneland last September, the dark bay is bred along the same lines as half-brother Plan (Storm Cat), winner of the GIII Keeneland International S. and runner-up in the GI Secretariat S.; and SW and Group 1-placed Dreamthelms (Giant's Causeway). The filly recorded the co-fastest time for an eighth Thursday, covering the distance in [:10](#) flat.

"She was a little, tiny weedy thing in September," recalled Woods. "She was a backward and late foal [May 7]. She has done remarkably well through the winter, and more so through the spring. She is not very big, but she is very well-proportioned, and she goes extremely well."

Trying to take advantage of the hot sire Medaglia d'Oro, Woods offers [hip 114](#), a colt out of Grade II-placed Solar Fire (Stravinsky).

The May 11 foal was purchased by the McKathan Family's All The Rage Partners for \$220,000 at Keeneland last September. The bay is from the extended family of Solar (Halo), dam of champions El Gran Senor (Northern Dancer) and Try My Best (Northern Dancer), and breezed in [:10 1/5](#).

"He is a really lovely horse," stated Woods. "He is out of a Stravinsky mare, so appears to have enough speed to be dangerous, but at the end of the day, I think he will be a horse who will want to go two turns."

Despite the atmosphere of economic uncertainty faced by many horsemen over the past year, Woods outlined his formula to weathering these troubled times.

"I think, in this game, selling good horses is the most important thing, period," affirmed Woods. "We sell to the same people at different venues, so bringing a good horse to any sale is very important."

When asked what type of horse is needed to sell successfully, given the present economic climate, at the juvenile sales, Woods said pragmatically, "The only horse that's any good at any sale is a good one."

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Greathouse Offerings Well-Connected...

The Greathouse family's Glencrest Farm has enjoyed success in every facet of the racing game, from breeding, selling and racing. The Kentucky farm, established 60 years ago by John Greathouse, Sr. and now run by his sons John, David, Allen and Edward, has bred

Grade I winners Dream Empress, Zoftig, Adieu, Flying Snowdrop and Roamin Rachel, and has campaigned graded performers Honey Ryder, Panty Raid and Devil May Care.

"Glencrest Farm does everything you can do with horses," confirmed David Greathouse. "This is all we do-- we don't have any other businesses. We have partners to pinhook with, we have partners to race with, we pinhook weanlings, we pinhook

mares, some to keep, some to re-sell. I've always had a partnership that I pinhook yearlings that I re-sell in partnership with Ciaran Dunne, and Johnny does some on his own, also. I guess we're involved in every aspect of the horse business you can be involved in."

That diversity will be on display in the Keeneland April sales ring with a pair of youngsters with elder siblings on the Triple Crown trail.

Hip 105, consigned by Dunne's Wavertree Stables, is a Glencrest-bred son of Forest Wildcat. The chestnut colt is a half-brother to GII Robert S. Lewis S. runner-up **Dave in Dixie** (Dixie Union), and did his drill in :21 1/5.

Glencrest sold Dave in Dixie for \$140,000 at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton July sale and his younger half-brother was entered to sell at the Saratoga sale last August.

"We kept this horse because of Dave in Dixie," Greathouse said. "[Trainer] John Sadler told me how much Dave in Dixie could run. [The Forest Wildcat colt] was in the Saratoga sale and we withdrew him from there. [We] decided just to hold onto him and go to a two-year-old sale with him. Dave in Dixie

was supposed to run the next week at Del Mar, which he did and he won very impressively, but it wasn't going to help me for the sale."

The Forest Wildcat juvenile is out of Risk (Wavering Monarch), who has also produced the stakes-placed Risky Trick (Clever Trick).

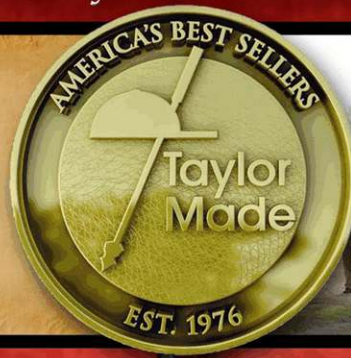

"I don't think we did a very good job breeding that mare after we bred the Clever Trick foal that could run, and you have to breed her right," Greathouse said. "She's big and she needs to have something that refines her a little bit, and that's why we bred her to Dixie Union and came up with Dave in Dixie. The Forest Wildcat again, somewhat of the same cross and more on the same size line, is a more refined sort of horse."

Greathouse has already enjoyed pinhooking success this year. In partnership with Wavertree, he was involved with the Barretts March sale-topping Unbridled's Song colt. The trend could continue with a horse purchased by John Greathouse, Jr. last fall.

Hip 47, a colt by Pleasantly Perfect out of La Paz (Hold Your Peace), was purchased by Greathouse for \$63,000 out of last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale. The juvenile received a timely update when his half-brother Mission Impazible (Unbridled's Song) won the GII Louisiana Derby last week.

By the time Greathouse had purchased the now two-year-old, Mission Impazible had already made two starts, earning ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status with a debut win at Keeneland in April before a third-place effort in the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. But Greathouse admitted those efforts didn't influence his decision to buy the younger sibling.

"He was already a half-brother to a couple of horses that were okay, and I actually knew nothing about Mission Impazible at the time," John Greathouse recalled. "I didn't remember him winning last spring. [The yearling] fit the bill on how he looked and with enough pedigree that you thought you could sell him later on. I

wish that he was a she—I'd be more inclined to hang on to a filly than a colt."

La Paz is also the dam of graded stakes winners Forest Camp (Deputy Minister) and Spanish Empire (Pleasant Colony), but Mission Impazible's

win in the Louisiana Derby will put more focus on his younger half-brother at the April sale.

"Obviously, it brings a lot more attention to the horse," David Greathouse said. "Any sale you go to with a big update is huge. But La Paz is already a fairly top broodmare, and then to come up with another one. Pleasantly Perfect is doing great. Maybe he's not the exact flavor of the day, but his horses are competitive, and the longer they run, the better they are getting. So I think it certainly has to make somebody look a lot harder at him." **Cont. p6**

David Greathouse thinks diversification is key to succeeding in the racing game.

"I think, if you're not going to do anything else, I think you've got to play all the games," he said. "You better have an idea of what you're doing, too, because some of these pinhooking games can get a little tough. I think the toughest is the yearling to two-year-olds, but it has the biggest rewards. When I originally started doing it, I put a group of people together to show them what it took to get a horse to the races and to race. And a lot of people that I've put in it have gone on to keep horses--we buy a group to keep and race like we did with Necessary Evil (Harlan's Holiday) last year. My main goal is obviously to try and make some money with the deal, but also to introduce some new people to racing. So far, in some respects, we've been successful in that endeavor. I thought the pinhooking deal was sort of like Racing 101, and it shows you what it takes to get them to a point where you can find out whether they are racing athletes or not. Some of the people had a lot of fun at the auctions. We had a pretty good year the first year we did this, we lost some money some years, but overall we've made money and we've been able to keep a good horse or two out of the bunch and race them."

In addition to ♀ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♂ Necessary

Evil, who beat the boys in last year's GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S., Glencrest's green-and-yellow silks have been carried by **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon). Purchased by John Greathouse for \$110,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, the filly was bought back at \$400,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton February sale. She has gone on to victories in last year's GI Frizette S. and this term's GII Bonnie Miss S., and has been mentioned as a possible Kentucky Derby starter.

David Greathouse thinks the juvenile market this year is challenging, but that is par for the course.

"I think it's tough as usual," Greathouse commented. "I think the two-year-old market has been tough even in the good years. You have to jump through an awful lot of hoops to get to the right spot, but I do not think that it's too much different than it's been. The only difference is that you're not rewarded as highly for hitting a home run now as you were a few years ago."

Of the two-year-old sales already in the history books this year, Greathouse added, "There was no middle or bottom until Ocala. Ocala was a fairly strong sale in that respect, and there were people who were playing at all levels. I don't think California, for what they had, was too bad a sale. I think a lot of the horses were more sprinter types. There weren't many two-turn types in the sale, which I think some of your two-year-old buyers are starting to lean more towards now."

Greathouse has also seen a slight shift in the emphasis buyers put on pre-sale breezes.

"I don't think you have to go in :10 flat anymore to get a horse sold for a lot of money," he commented. "You have to do it fast enough in a good fashion, the proper way; an exercise rider sitting on a horse that's doing it the right way that wants to do it and is a good-moving horse, a horse that looks like he's athletic and he's got a future. They still have time stuck in their head, but I don't think it's quite as paramount. If your fastest horse goes in :9 4/5, you can't take one over there in :11 and sell it, but if it goes in :10 2/5 and :10 3/5 you can still get a good price for it, if it does it the proper way." -Jessica Martini

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Been There, Dunne That...

There are probably very few in the horse industry that haven't felt the effects, in some way, of the struggling world economy. However, as is the case in any market involving the sale of a luxury commodity, experience proves the great equalizer. And Wavertree Stables' Ciaran Dunne is certainly proof that a proven track record is the soundest insurance policy available these days. After a quiet start to the juvenile sales calendar in 2010, Dunne shipped a solid group to Pomona for last month's Barretts sale, and was duly rewarded when selling the saletopper, an Unbridled's Song colt who realized a \$475,000 final bid from Narvick International.

"We sold the biggest percentage of what we offered at that sale, but we pick through them pretty good before we go out there," said Dunne, explaining his success in California. "We try not to land out there with anything we don't think we will find a home for."

While Dunne is hopeful that trend will continue at Keeneland tomorrow, the Irishman is confident that he has the goods to back up the hype.

"Historically, we always come up here with a strong group," he offered. "However, this is the strongest group we have ever brought here. Pound for pound, this might be the strongest consignment we have ever taken to a sale. I think I have 12 to 14 horses this year that I think could be standouts at any sale. I am not usually like this, but we have a very strong crop here."

Dunne indicated that, although Wavertree generally reserves a few at the top of his two-year-old crop for this sale, he admits that circumstances probably caused him to be a little more loaded at the top end this time.

"We had a lot of later foals, so we tried to give them more time," Dunne explained. "The weather was bad in Ocala [this winter], so we were having a hard time keeping the pace, so we would shuffle them back. Also, we didn't take as many to California this year, because of the way the schedule set up. I looked around one day and realized, 'Oh my God, everything is going to Keeneland.'"

Top of the Crop...

Among those sure to cause a stir is [hip 134](#), a colt by Distorted Humor, out of seven-year-old Whichwaydidshego (Storm Cat). The Jan. 20 foal, who breezed an eighth in [:10 2/5](#) last Thursday, is from the family of Yarn (Mr. Prospector), a full sister to Grade I winner and top producer Preach. Yarn is also the dam of Minardi, Tale of the Cat and Myth, who in turn is responsible for champion Johannesburg. One of six juveniles who set the mark for an eighth of a mile during the breeze show was [hip 9](#), a filly by Speightstown. Stopping the timer in [:10](#) flat, the chestnut is a daughter of Evangelizer (Saint Ballado), dam of GII Matron S. third Worship the Moon (Malibu Moon). The Feb. 25 foal hails from the family of Canadian champion Knights Templar (Exploit). Receiving a serious update last weekend is [hip 47](#), a half-brother to GII Louisiana Derby hero Mission Impazible. By GI Breeders' Cup Classic and G1 Dubai World Cup hero Pleasantly Perfect, the bay is out of La Paz (Hold Your Peace), also the dam of GSWs Forest Camp (Deputy Minister) and Spanish Empire (Pleasant Colony). He went in [:10 2/5](#).

"He's a big, two-turn colt," said Dunne. "He is a really interesting horse, because when people look at him, look at his pedigree and then see him move, they are going to be shocked at how quick he actually is."

One of those who was a victim of circumstance over the winter is [hip 142](#), a Tiznow colt. Out of the unraced mare Zadkiel (Saint Ballado), the colt, who is a half-brother to GISP She's Cheeky (Black Minnaloushe), is from the family of GISW Cheval Volant.

"He was scheduled to go to Miami [Fasig-Tipton Calder], but he drew hip 1 and he just wasn't coming to hand as quickly as we would have wanted," Dunne confirmed. "So we took him out of Miami and brought him [to Keeneland]. He's just a beautiful horse."

According to Dunne, coming in a little under the radar, but nevertheless not to be overlooked are [hip 146](#), a colt by freshman sire First Samurai and [hip 79](#), a filly by Leroidesanimaux (Brz). Both juveniles recorded identical times of [:10 2/5](#) ([79](#) and [146](#)).

"He's a really neat horse," said Dunne of the son of MSW & GSP Alltheway Bertie (Alwuhush).

The May 14 foal is a half-brother to GSW Thunder Bertie (Thunder Gulch).

"He is just lovely and trains like he is a very good horse," added Dunne. "Based on the colt I have, it would make me want and go breed a mare to [Claiborne resident First Samurai]."

Following a good breeze Thursday, Dunne is also hopeful his Leroidesanimaux filly, who is a half-sister to GSW Midnight Cry (Smart Strike), gets some play tomorrow afternoon.

"People might be tempted to overlook her a little bit, but I think she is just a fabulous filly," offered Dunne. "She has a big pedigree, and she just looks like a cheetah. She is a sleek filly with a great hip and shoulder, and has a great walk."--Christina Bossinakis
