with all eyes on morning-line favorite **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision). The chestnut is unbeaten in two dirt attempts, including a dazzling success in Oaklawn's GI Fantasy S. Apr. 2. Trainer Jerry Hollendorfer has won the Oaks two other times--with Lite Light in 1991 and Pike Place Dancer in 1996. "I've won it twice, but you never get tired of adding the Kentucky Oaks to your resume," Hollendorfer said. "It's hard to compare horses over the years. Pike Place Dancer was so much of a bigger horse than the other two, Lite Light and Blind Luck. I'd say Blind Luck has a lot of the same style as Lite

Light." ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Crisp** (El Corredor) tries dirt for the first time after defeating Blind Luck in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 6. "We've got to beat Jerry's filly," trainer John Sadler said of Blind Luck.

"She's tough. But I think all three California fillies in the race [Blind Luck, Crisp and Evening Jewel] could run well."

Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet) also switches to dirt. She made all eight of her previous starts over synthetics, including a wire-to-wire score in Keeneland's GI Ashland S. last time Apr. 3. She completed the exacta behind Crisp in the GIII Santa Ysabel Jan. 10 and came within a nose of defeating Blind Luck in the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 13.

"I feel very confident--everything has gone better than I had hoped," trainer James Cassidy revealed.

The bay suffered a stunning defeat to that rival when second as the 1-20 favorite in her first start of the season in the New Orleans Ladies S. at Fair Grounds Mar. 13. Rachel Alexandra, a 20 1/4-length heroine over this track in last term's GI Kentucky Oaks, has trained forwardly since, posting a trio of bullets beneath the Twin Spires. "We tried to make a race and tried to adjust her schedule to that as opposed to training her and letting her indicate when she's ready," trainer Steve Asmussen said of running Rachel in the New Orleans Ladies. "We were trying to get her ready, and it's just a completely different approach." Regarding her current fitness level he added, "It would be hard to say because I think that there was so much room for improvement from what she was down there to who she is here." Cont. p7

WHEN THE SAINT COMES MARCHING IN

Come tomorrow, British racing could be contemplating another headline horse to fill the void left by Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) if **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) can justify hot favoritism in the G1 2000 Guineas. Forty years ago, Nijinsky was sent here from Ballydoyle to take Newmarket's mile Classic as the 4-7 favorite, and followed the script to the letter en route to Triple Crown glory. While comparisons with that great performer are thin on the ground at present, the sense of excitement that the Derrick Smith colorbearer generated when sprinting clear in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in late October has carried over to this spring. His nearest pursuer that day was **Elusive Pimpernel** (Elusive Quality), and that runner-up underlined the form with a four-length dismissal of his opponents in the G3 Craven S. here last time Apr. 15. St Nicholas Abbey, who is chalked up at around 6-4 at present, faces a swollen field of 18 rivals as he bids to provide Aidan O'Brien with a sixth renewal. "St Nicholas Abbey seems to be in good form, his preparation has gone well and he has thrived through the winter," his trainer commented.

O'Brien added, "Obviously, it is his first run of the season and, like all of our horses, he should improve from the run, but he is naturally a very fit, athletic horse, and we are looking forward to seeing him run." O'Brien also saddles **Fencing Master (GB)** (Oratorio {Ire}), who comes here off the back of a neck second to Beethoven (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. over seven furlongs at this venue in October; and **Viscount Nelson** (Giant's Causeway), most recently second in the Mar. 28 G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S. "Fencing Master seems to be well also, his preparation has also gone very well, he is ready to start back and we hope that he runs well," O'Brien added. "Viscount Nelson has had a run already this year. We think that he has come forward from his run. We are very happy with him and hope that he runs a good race." The latter sees Kieren Fallon renew his old link with Ballydoyle, and the four-time Guineas-winning jockey told *PA Sport* yesterday, "It's exciting to be back riding for Coolmore and Aidan O'Brien. It's a jockey's dream. They have the best horses in the world and are great people to ride for. I never thought about whether I'd ride for them again, all I think about is riding as many winners as I can. We all know what Aidan can do and, on the big day, he is the trainer everyone wants to ride for."

The X Factor...

One of the race's live contenders is Brighthelm Racing's **Xtension**, who followed a second to **Canford Cliffs** in the G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot in June with a win in Goodwood's G2 Vintage S. the following month. Only a nose behind the re-opposing Fencing Master when the pair were inched out by Beethoven (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) in the Dewhurst, he has every right to be in the firing line again. "He has wintered well, looks well and we are happy with his preparation," conditioner Clive Cox commented. "You couldn't be disappointed with his Dewhurst run, and we trained him last year with the idea that he would progress--I'll be very disappointed if he doesn't give a very good account of himself. His style of racing is very laid-back, and he is blessed with a good turn-of-foot."

Making His Move...

France has a rich legacy of success in the Newmarket Classics, but it has been 15 years since Pennekamp prevailed for that nation in this contest. Sole representation this time comes in the form of the unbeaten **Makfi**, who is trained and co-owned by Mikel Delzangles after being purchased from Shadwell for 26,000 guineas at Tattersalls Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale in October. He booked his ticket when winning the seven-furlong G3 Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 8, the prep race used by the last three French-trained winners of this Classic. "He has really improved since his win in the Prix Djebel and it was a very good comeback run--he definitely wasn't 100 percent on that occasion," Delzangles said. "I don't think that he will have a problem with the step up to a mile, as he is a very handy horse. He has only run on soft ground, so I have no concerns if there is any rain, but I can't see that he would have an issue with a faster surface, either."

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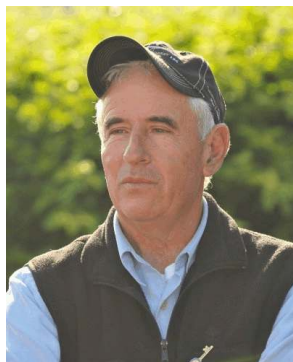
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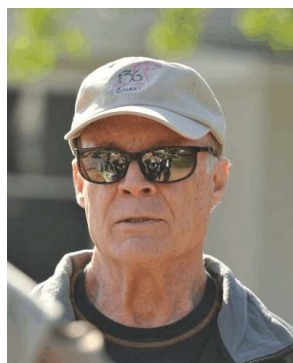
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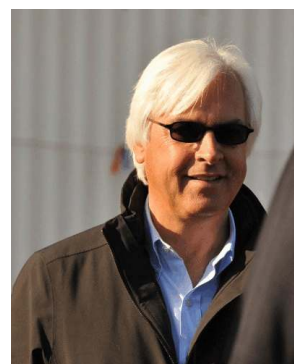
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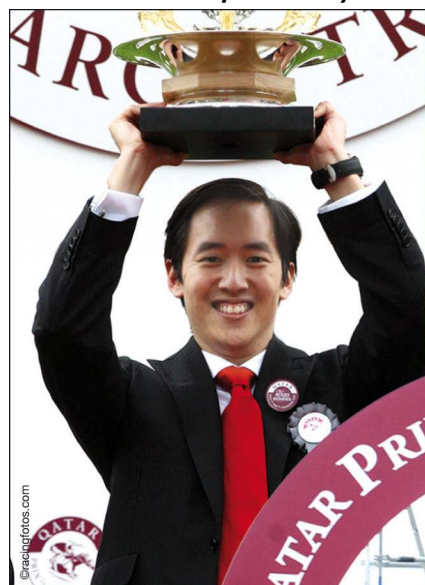

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GUINEAS SALE GETS UNDERWAY A less cosmopolitan crowd than had been at the Craven Sale a fortnight earlier gathered on Newmarket's Rowley Mile yesterday morning to watch the juveniles work ahead of today's Guineas Breeze-Up Sale at Tattersalls, although there was no shortage of would-be buyers around. Sheikh Mohammed, buying through a number of different agents, provided the backbone to the select Craven Sale and his representatives were busy viewing two-year-olds at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks site yesterday. This is the fourth year that Tattersalls is staging its second breeze-up sale and, with 147 lots listed, it is the smallest renewal to date. A selective market is anticipated at a sale that last year saw a clearance rate of just 53 percent, although there looks sure to be strong demand for the better lots.

Among those to impress in the breeze was a late addition to the catalogue, [lot 73A](#) consigned from Willie Slattery's Meadowview Stables. An Invincible Spirit (Ire) full-brother to listed winner Stevie Gee (Ire), he cost €48,000 as a yearling at Goffs and was withdrawn from the Craven Sale. Street Cry (Ire)'s only representative, [lot 49](#), a colt consigned from Ken Condon's Friarstown Stud, was another to go well in the breeze, as did [lot 34](#), a Shamardal filly who should comfortably recoup her €8,000 yearling cost when appearing from John Collins' Brown Island Stables.

Those who have cost rather more on previous sale ring appearances include [lot 62](#), a full-brother to Group 3 winner River Proud (Proud Citizen), who cost \$70,000 as a yearling at Keeneland in September and is offered from Willie Browne's Mocklershill; and [lot 90](#), a Speightstown colt who made \$95,000 at the same sale. [Lot 69](#), a Mr. Greeley colt appearing from Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud, made \$170,000 as a weanling, while [lot 125](#), a Sakhee half-brother to Harbinger (GB) (Dansili {GB}) was bought for 52,000gns at Tattersalls in October. He is reappearing from Ecurie du Grand Mainguet in France.

"This is a sale that has produced a whole host of decent winners, including group scorers, for reasonable prices in the past, and I'm sure that this year's sale will be no different," Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George commented. "The leading G1 StanJames.com 1000 Guineas contender Puff (Ire) (Camacho) and Our Jonathan (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) came out of last year's sale, and both are good examples of the value buyers can expect to find." He added, "The two-year-olds breezed professionally on Thursday morning, and most of those on offer are eligible for some type of bonus, offering buyers a further incentive."

Selling starts at noon. The 2009 sale saw 74 lots sold for 2,819,200gns at an average price of 38,097gns and a 25,000gns median. For catalogues and video replays of the breezes, go to tattersalls.com.

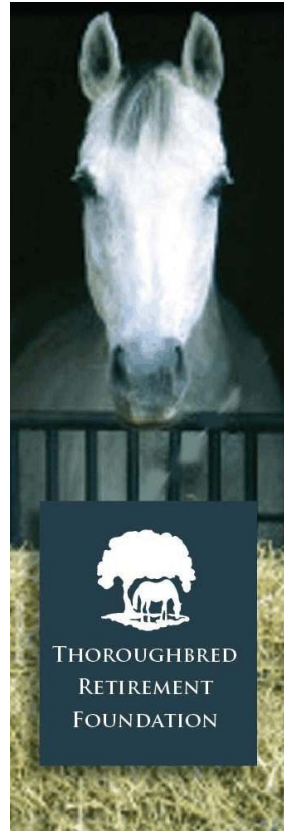

RACING COMPACT GAINING SUPPORT

With the threat of federal regulation looming in the Thoroughbred industry, the National Racing Compact continues to pick up steam. The Compact would allow states and the industry to work together in passing new rules and regulations regarding medication, licensing,

wagering and more; it would *not* serve as a national racing commission or expand the powers of any state regulator.

"The idea behind the National Racing Compact is that we should have more uniformity between the states without having federal regulation," John Sabini, chairman of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, told the *TDN* in a recent interview.

"For the states that are involved in racing, there are fewer resources to draw upon in these tough budget times to do regulatory work. We believe that the Compact will allow states to

work cheaper and faster than we currently do."

The rule-making process in New York is quite drawn out at the moment, Sabini explained.

"It has to go through our Board, the governor's office of regulatory reform and come back to the Board--it's a long-plotting process," he confirmed. "With a Compact, we could move a lot quicker."

The Racing Compact was a hot topic at the recent Association of Racing Commissioners International conference held in Lexington, Kentucky. Along with RCI, others who have shown support for the Compact include The Jockey-Club, National Thoroughbred Racing Association and New York Racing Association.

"The Compact was talked about by a number of speakers at RCI, including Keeneland's Ted Bassett," Sabini offered. "Speaker after speaker endorsed it. There are no silver bullets in the world, but we think this will do a lot to make all of our jobs easier, especially for trainers and owners who navigate through the different jurisdictional rules. It will make things a lot more uniform--we think it's a win-win. As regulators, we have a lot of support from places like The Jockey Club, NTRA and NYRA. In order for all the regulators to do their jobs well, we need to get into this new paradigm of faster and cheaper."

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board could become the first member of the Compact, with several other states soon to follow, Sabini revealed. Rick Goodell, assistant counsel of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, serves as chairman of the National Racing Compact.

"We've had a bill in both houses of our legislature, and we hope it passes this year," Sabini said. "We're hopeful. We believe that if this thing gets off the ground, we'll have between nine and 15 states very quickly."

While many states continue to cut racing commission budgets, Sabini assured that the Compact "would have a very modest budget" and that he "doesn't view this as a big money drain at all." -SS

FIVE IN THE FIGHT

by Lucas Marquardt

It is true that Taylor Made Sales is easily the biggest consignor in the United States by numbers. Last year at Keeneland September alone, Taylor Made catalogued 564 horses. Still, the fact that the Taylor family's operation can boast five runners in the GI Kentucky Derby, or a full 25 percent of the field, is a notable achievement by anyone's standards. Included among the Taylor Made Derby grads is the favorite for tomorrow's "Run for the Roses," **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike), as well as **Backtalk** (Smarty Jones), **Conveyance** (Indian Charlie), **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song) and the filly **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon). The *TDN* asked Taylor Made's Mark Taylor what he remembers about each horse.

BACKTALK (Smarty Jones) (\$250,000 KEESEP yearling. Buyer: Todd Quast, agent for Gold Mark)

The horse was bred by John Sykes's Clover Leaf Farm and is a half-brother to a nice horse in Bsharpsonata (Pulpit). I had seen a lot of Smarty Joneses from his first crop, and then saw this horse (from his second), and he was just a cut above the ones I'd seen. He was very striking, chiseled, with a lot of muscle. He was a man among boys. I'm very happy that Todd Quast and Mr. [Paul] Bulmahn have gotten to the Derby with him. He might have had a bit of a rough start as a three-year-old, but once you get to the Derby, it's anyone's race. As a two-year-old, he looked fast and speedy. I wasn't surprised when he turned out to be a good two-year-old. But I think he could go long; he's out of an Affirmed mare. As a yearling, he was medium-sized, but maybe bigger than what you first thought because he's so well-balanced.

CONVEYANCE (Indian Charlie) (\$240,000 KEESEP yearling. Buyer: Legends Racing)

He was a complete jaw-dropper as yearling. He was originally bought by Legends Racing [the horse is now owned by Zabeel Racing], and I always thought Olin Gentry had a good eye for a horse. He picks out good-looking horse, and, of course, he had Bob Baffert, Nick Zito and D. Wayne Lukas with him, and those are some sharp eyes. When he was walking in the back ring, I knew that he was a horse they were going to have to have. He was just an unbelievable physical. At the time, without him, the pedigree was a little light. But he reminded me a lot of an Indian Charlie we had sold two years before that, a filly named Indyanne. He was the male hunk version of her. He had plenty of leg, a really big forearm and, like a lot of Indian Charlies, looked fast, but like he'd be able to handle two turns. He had all the parts.

DEVIL MAY CARE (Malibu Moon) (\$100,000 KEESEP yearling. Buyer: J.W. Greathouse)

She was bred by Gerald Ford of Diamond A Racing. The dam, Kelli's Ransom (Red Ransom) was a really terrific mare who unfortunately passed away last year. Before Devil May Care, she produced Regal Ransom. It's a great family Mr. Ford has had for a while. She was a great-looking filly, and the Greathouses (including brothers John and David) have great eyes. They are really sharp and know what they're doing. They bought her for \$100,000, but I thought she was better than that. She had a few veterinary issues that set her back some, and kept her from bringing what she could. I've been watching her work, and she looks tremendous. She wants to run all day. She just keeps going, and she fits in this race. It would be great for the Greathouses to win the thing. They're Kentucky guys, a Kentucky family and the epitome of a family-run operation.

LOOKIN AT LUCKY (Smart Strike) (\$35,000 RNA KEESEP yearling)

He failed to meet his reserve--unfortunately, he had some surgery on his stifles, and a few vet problems. It wasn't anything major, but it was enough at the yearling sales that a lot of vets weren't comfortable passing him. I give a lot of credit to Jerry Bailey and Lance Robinson from Gulf Coast, who bred him. They believed in the horse. If they weren't going to get what they felt was a legitimate price, they were fine taking him back and bringing him to a two-year-old sale. Fast forward to Keeneland April, and he brings \$475,000. Jerry and his team did a great job with him. As a yearling, he was a big, angular horse. He didn't have the cut to his muscle like Backtalk or Conveyance, but he had the frame, and you could see that, when he grew into it, he was going to be a mile-and-a-quarter horse. I was actually surprised he breezed as well as he did at the April Sale. But he's just a tremendous horse. With a better trip, he probably would have won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and he was still named champion.

We sold his mother (Private Feeling, by Belong to Me) to Live Oak last year at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale [for \$2 million, the second-highest price of the sale].

MISSION IMPAZIBLE (Unbridled's Song) (\$200,000 KEESEP yearling. Buyer: Twin Creeks Racing Stable)

You know, he's a really special horse. He is owned by good friends and clients of ours, Twin Creeks. Steve Davison has been in the business a long time, and we've worked with him for a long time. He had raced the dam, La Paz (Hold Your Peace). When he retired her, that's when we met. After she produced Forest Camp, and it got to the point where she was just worth too much money, Twin Creeks decided to sell her. We sold her in foal to Storm Cat to another client of ours, Frank and Jane Lyon's Summer Wind Farm [for \$1.6 million]. La Paz was amazing. She was able to act as a conduit for whatever a sire throws best. When you bred her to Deputy Minister, you got Forest Camp, who was arguably the best-looking Deputy Minister you ever saw. He was just a ball of muscle, but had a good, clean neck. When you bred her to Pleasant Colony, who usually got very plain horses, you got Spanish Empire, who was a great-looking, Classic-type horse. She's brought out the best in Unbridled's Song in Mission Impazible. He was medium-sized, very correct and well-balanced, and had a great neck.

Taylor added that what he finds most rewarding about Taylor Made's fearsome fivesome is that they all hail from respected breeding operations. "It's just cool to see people being rewarded for doing a great job," he said. "All of these breeders--John Sykes, Summer Wind, Gulf Coast, the Greathouses--they are very good at what they do. They buy good mares and raise the foals the right way. They are people who work very hard, and it's great to see them at the Derby." Asked about wagering strategy come tomorrow, Taylor laughed and said, "Oh, I've definitely got to go with a five-horse trifecta box. It's a wide open and fun race, but I actually have a good shot at hitting it."

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WRITERS UP

A SLEW OF CHANCES by Vincent D'Angelo

It's hard to believe that 26 years have passed since Swale won the Kentucky Derby. In the five weeks between the Derby and his dominating win in the Belmont S., I imagine many breeders and racing fans thought this would be the first of many wins for Seattle Slew and his sire line in the Kentucky Derby. After all, Bold Ruler, his sire-line ancestor, had dominated the race in the 1970s. Yet surprisingly, Swale remains the only Seattle Slew-sire line winner of the Kentucky Derby. And it's not for lack of opportunity. In examining the charts and pedigrees of the last 25 Kentucky Derbies, 32 Seattle Slew-line descendants have started in the Kentucky Derby, and only three finished in the trifecta. It's an intriguing compilation, but more on that in moment.

The current contenders for the 2010 Kentucky Derby include three Seattle Slew-line potential runners. They are **Ice Box** (Pulpit), **Discreetly Mine** (Mineshaft) and **Devil May Care** (Malibu Moon). Not surprisingly, they all are from the A.P. Indy branch of Seattle Slew.

As for the 32 Seattle Slew-line descendants that started in the Kentucky Derby, here they are in chronological order:

In 1986, California Derby winner Vernon Castle (Seattle Slew) was 15th in Ferdinand's win. In 1987, the 1986 GI BC Juvenile winner Capote was 16th to Alysheba. In 1989, a trio of Slew runners took on Sunday Silence and Easy Goer, including third-place finisher Awe Inspiring (Slew o' Gold), eighth-place finisher Houston (Seattle Slew) and 13th-place finisher Clever Trevor (Slewacide). In 1990, Wood Memorial winner Thirty Six Red (Slew o' Gold) was ninth behind Unbridled.

Surprisingly, the Seattle Slew line was not represented by a Derby runner from 1991-95, although A.P. Indy himself was scratched on the morning of the 1992 Derby with a foot injury. The Seattle Slew line has had at least one runner in every renewal since.

In 1996, Hollywood Futurity winner Matty G (Capote) was 17th behind Grindstone. The following year, Pulpit (A.P. Indy) was fourth and Celtic Warrior (Fast Play) was 10th behind Silver Charm. In 1998, Old Trieste (A.P. Indy) was 15th behind Real Quiet. A year later, the filly Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) was fifth, her stablemate General Challenge (General Meeting) was 11th and Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy) was 14th behind Charismatic.

Aptitude (A.P. Indy) was runner-up behind Fusaichi Pegasus in the millennium edition of the "Run for the Roses." A P Valentine (A.P. Indy) was seventh behind Monarchos in 2001, while Essence of Dubai (Pulpit) was ninth behind War Emblem in the 2002 renewal. In 2003, Atswhatimtaknbout (A.P. Indy) was fourth behind Funny Cide. In 2004, Tapit (Pulpit) was ninth, Friends Lake (A.P. Indy) was 15th, and Minister Eric (Old Trieste) was 16th behind Smarty Jones. In 2005, Don't Get Mad (Stephen Got Even) was fourth and Going Wild (Golden Missile) was 18th behind Giacomo. In 2006, Steppenwolver (Aptitude) was third, Sinister Minister (Old Trieste) was 16th and A.P. Warrior (A.P. Indy) was 18th behind Barbaro. In 2007, Great Hunter (Aptitude) was 13th behind Street Sense.

In 2008, Pyro (Pulpit) was eighth, Cool Coal Man (Mineshaft) was 15th and Adriano (A.P. Indy) was 19th behind Big Brown. Just 12 months ago, General Quarters (Sky Mesa) was 10th, Nowhere to Hide (Vindication) was 17th and post-time favorite Friesan Fire (A.P. Indy) was 18th behind Mine That Bird. And let's not forget I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even) was scratched the morning of the race last year!

So that's 32 starters in 20 of the last 25 Kentucky Derbies, with only a trio of top-three finishes. In fact, the only Derby winner since 1984 with Seattle Slew anywhere in the pedigree is 2003 Kentucky Derby hero Funny Cide, who is out of a Slewacide mare.

In summary, as we approach Kentucky Derby 136, Seattle Slew sire-line descendants will include Ice Box, Discreetly Mine and Devil May Care. And, for added intrigue, since the Seattle Slew broodmare sire-line has one Kentucky Derby winner in Funny Cide, there are two additional runners who are out of Seattle Slew-line mares. They are **Line of David** (Lion Heart)--out of a Capote mare--and **Super Saver**, whose dam is a daughter of A.P. Indy.

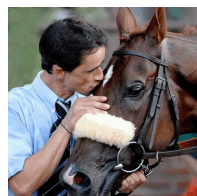
