WHAT'S LUCK GOT TO DO WITH IT?

Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) endured difficult trips this season when third in the GI Santa Anita Derby and sixth last time out in the GI Kentucky Derby. His athleticism and raw talent allowed him to overcome trouble to win the GII Rebel S. in his seasonal debut back in March. In trying to change his luck, trainer Bob Baffert, already a four-time winner of the GI Preakness S., made the audacious decision to sack champion jockey Garrett Gomez in favor of the upstart Martin Garcia. Instructed to keep his mount clear of any possible trouble, the 25-year-old rider settled Lookin At Lucky in centerfield and three wide, rallied four wide into the stretch and outgamed **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) for a well-deserved victory.

ATTA BOY

Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), so impressive when bagging the Apr. 24 G2 Sandown Mile on his seasonal return last time, banished memories of a fourth in the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S. last year by garnering the latest renewal in imperious fashion. Joining issue with the leaders under a tight grip approaching the final furlong, he required just one shake of the reins soon after and produced his trademark burst of acceleration to easily best **Ouqba** (GB) (Red Ransom), hard held, for a third Group 1 score. "I'm delighted for him, he was brilliant and the little horse deserves it," enthused winning jockey Richard Hughes.

Hey, Good Lookin...

All eyes were on WinStar Farms' **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), who was looking to become the eighth horse since 1997 to head to New York with a Triple Crown shot. He was sent off the public's 19-10 favorite to do so, while **Lookin At Lucky**, who endured a nightmarish opening quarter mile in Louisville a fortnight ago and did exceedingly well to finish sixth, was the clear second choice to rebound at \$2.40-1. **First Dude**, coming off a third in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 10, made a favorable impression during his morning trackwork at Pimlico, and won the break to set a strong pace with **Super Saver**, reverting to pace-pressing tactics, close up in second. **Jackson Bend** (Hear No Evil) wasn't far away in third, while California raider **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams) raced in fourth through the early exchanges, just ahead of **Lookin At Lucky**. "I was trying to save as much ground as I could into the first turn," Martin Garcia explained. "After that, [trainer] Bob [Baffert] told me to do what I wanted." Further back in the field were GII Illinois Derby runner-up **Yawanna Twist** (Yonaguska), Kentucky Derby third **Paddy O'Prado** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Schoolyard Dreams** (Stephen Got Even), runner-up earlier this year in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby.

First Dude got his opening quarter mile in a testing :22.91 and was nary allowed to take a deep breath, with the Derby winner hounding him through a half-mile in a strong :46.47. Midway up the backstretch, Garcia had eased **Lookin At Lucky** into about the three path and clear of any potential disaster, then asked his colt to go at the half-mile pole. He shifted out into the four path for the run around the far turn and set his sights on **First Dude**, who was still plugging away and looking dangerous on the front end. With Garcia busy at work, imploring his mount with a right-handed stick to the colt's right shoulder, **Lookin At Lucky** edged past a stubborn **First Dude** just north of the eighth pole and outslugged his rival to the wire. **Jackson Bend** just missed the place spot, while **Yawanna Twist** was a clear fourth.

Baff in the Saddle Again...

Bob Baffert got to know Pimlico's infield winner's circle very well, winning the Preakness four times in the span of six years, but yesterday's score was his first since **War Emblem** (Our Emblem) wore the Black-Eyed Susans in 2002. Winning never loses its luster, the silver-haired conditioner admits. "It's just as exciting," he offered. "I know it's been a few years. I mean, this was a different kind of win--this was more of a redemption win. This horse is such a warrior. He wants to win; he tries so hard. So I wanted to win it for the horse, you know, 'cause he tries so hard every time. I mean,

the Derby, he had that rough trip. Santa Anita Derby, rough trip. But, you know, every time he had those rough trips, he came back. He's got a great mind. He's a cool horse. He's just a really great athlete. I mean, he's one of the best horses I've ever had. It's amazing. He's still a baby. He's so immature. He's not even three years old yet. His birthday is May 27th. He's just starting to grow right now." Baffert indicated that a decision on a run in the GI Belmont S. June 5 would come over the next several days.

Triple Crown Dreams Dashed...

Calvin Borel predicted a Triple Crown winner in the afterglow of **Super Saver**'s Derby win, but, for the 33rd straight year, there will be no series sweep. In the end, it was too much, too soon. "It was an honest pace with **First Dude** hanging in there," trainer Todd Pletcher commented. "Coming off a huge effort in the Derby, the two weeks was too short. When they went to the far turn, you could see that Calvin was squeezing and asking him to go get that horse, and he just couldn't do it. He hung in there. He kept fighting. He tried hard. It was back a little quick for him. Now we've got time to come back for a big summer."

Although he secured the 2008 G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp, doubts remained about Paco Boy's ability to stay one mile, but he dampened the detractors' arguments with a smooth win in the June 16 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot to join the miling elite. Connections made a bold bid for additional luster in the July 10 G1 July Cup at Newmarket, and he lost no caste when fourth in that six-furlong sprint. He earned additional plaudits with a second to Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood in his penultimate start July 29, where he was found to be sore in the aftermath of that one-mile try, before signifying more than just his well-being at Sandown last time. Paco Boy traveled smoothly under cover in midfield from the outset, and jockey Richard Hughes still sat motionless as his rivals came under increasing pressure at the two pole. Outlining future plans, while sounding a cautionary note with regard to racing outside Europe, trainer Richard Hannon told *PA Sport*, "We will go for the [G1] Queen Anne [S. at Royal Ascot June 15] next, then the [G1] Sussex [S. at Goodwood July 28], and the [G1 Prix de la] Foret [at Longchamp Oct. 3] later on, but I doubt that you will ever see him running abroad."

Strike a Deal endured one of the unluckiest seasons back in 2007, missing out by excruciatingly narrow margins on the winner's share in a pair of races with combined purse money of \$1.75 million at Colonial Downs. Continuing his bridesmaid status the following season, he completed the exacta no fewer than four times from his first six starts, including the GIII Knickerbocker H., but closed the season on a high, running off to score by seven lengths in the GII Red Smith H. It was an abbreviated three-race campaign last term, beginning with a sixth in this event, followed by seventh-place efforts to Presious Passion (Royal Anthem) in the June 13 Monmouth S. and in the GI United Nations S. July 4. Making his first start since as a decided longshot, Strike a Deal secured the front and established sedate fractions of :48.23 for the half and 1:12.79 for three-quarters. He cut the corner into the stretch, pinched a break of two lengths entering the final furlong and held sway as Just as Well, runner-up in 2009, found his best stride, but too late. "He was certainly ready to run today," said winning jockey Ramon Dominguez. "Alan Goldberg did a great job with him. He didn't give me any instructions. I saw fit to make the lead and my horse was eager to do it. Besides the 13, there wasn't a lot of speed in the race, so I said, 'Let's go for it.' The betting public made defending champ Seattle Smooth the odds-on favorite, but it was fellow Grade I winner Funny Moon who got the better of that one for a mild upset. An 8 1/2-length allowance winner over the track and trip last July 3, the chestnut sat a wide trip in the GI CCA Oaks over 10 furlongs and was up in the final strides for a neck score. Last of eight in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga Aug. 22, she went missing, returning with a useful runner-up effort in the GIII Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland Apr. 16. A stalking third as Solo Piano (Empire Maker) showed the way through even fractions down the backstretch, Funny Moon came to tackle that won at the three-eighths pole and was soon joined to her outside by Seattle Smooth. Three across at the two-furlong marker, Funny Moon responded when asked by Alan Garcia and went easily clear. Winless since taking an optional claimer on the turf at Del Mar last summer, Acclamation was a deserving longshot here, but scored the upset in impressive fashion. The bay showed he could compete in the graded ranks last season, running third in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GII San Gabriel H. at the end of the term, and he filled out the triple once again in an optional claimer on the Pro-Ride at Santa Anita Jan. 15. Fifth in the Sunshine Millions Classic 15 days later, he was third again in the Feb. 13 GII Strub S. The Cal-bred was back on the weeds for the Mar. 6 GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile H., but could do no better than ninth. He entered this off a fourth in the Apr. 25 Inglewood H. on the Hollywood lawn. Trying new tactics as he stretched out to 12 panels for the first time, Acclamation was hustled out to lead them along through moderate fractions. He had five lengths on the field after the opening quarter, eight after a half and 10 when they had gone a mile. It looked like the dark horse might come back to them in the final half-mile, but he kept on rolling, hitting the line a much-the-best winner. Jockey Christian Santiago Reyes explained through an interpreter, "I wasn't planning to go to the front, but everybody took back so I just inherited the lead. At the half-mile pole, I still hadn't let him run--he was just galloping along."

The streak continues. Comedero entered off three straight runaway victories in Oaklawn's Mountain Valley S. Feb. 27 and Rainbow S. Mar. 28 and the Blue and Gold S. at Charles Town Apr. 17. Pressed early by Quiet Invader through an easy opening quarter of :23.51, Comedero shook free in the stretch and rolled home to an impressive victory while under a hand ride. "They can't keep up with him," trainer Michael Stidham offered. "When I saw the first quarter, it made me feel great. Baffert's horse [Quiet Invader] had to be pushed a little just to keep up with him. This is a really fast horse with a lot of upside." Jockey Robby Albarado added, "He's fast. AGA KHAN DUO FIGURES TOUGH TO BEAT

His Highness The Aga Khan and Alain de Royer-Dupre combined to win this three times from 1996 to 1999 and, with both **TDN Rising Star** **Siyouni (Fr)** (Pivotal {GB}) and **Rajsaman (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) representing the connection this time, they have solid claims for more glory. While the former was expected to kick off his sophomore campaign with a win in the course-and-distance G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, his half-length reversal at the hands of his aggressively ridden stable companion in that Apr. 25 contest suggests there is little between the duo at present. More pace pressure on the front end here may compromise Rajsaman's chances and in turn help last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero Siyouni.

Godolphin's pair of **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) and **Buzzword (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) are strong contenders, and the former bids to supply his sire with a third European Classic here. Successful in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September, he was subsequently fourth when dropped a furlong for the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket the following month. Buzzword deserves respect, having beaten Siyouni in the G3 Prix la Rochette here in September before finishing two lengths behind that rival when third in the Jean-Luc Lagardere on Arc day. Fifth in both the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket in October and GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Santa Anita the next month, he has to improve on his 14th in the G1 2000 Guineas two weeks ago.

"I think that a mile is the right trip for Poet's Voice," trainer Saeed bin Surooor commented. "He is in good form, and I have been pleased with his preparation for the race. He showed a high level of form last season and I am hopeful that he can run well, although the Poule d'Essai des Poulains is always a very tough race to win." Godolphin's new trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni added, "Buzzword is well at the moment, and I think that he will make the frame at Longchamp. He has improved since he ran at Newmarket and his last piece of work went very well." On the afternoon that Rajsaman upset Siyouni in the Fontainebleau, WH Sport International's **Zazou (Ger)** (Shamardal) was taking a more unconventional step towards this Classic at Krefeld. His three-length success in the G3 Dr Busch-Memorial over 8 1/2 furlongs suggests he is close to the standard required, and he has already proven he can hold his own at this level last term when third in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud in November. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum and John Gosden, who are looking for a first Poulains victory, are not inclined to tilt at windmills, and it may be significant that they are prepared to plunge **Meezaan (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) into this company. His smooth success in a seven-furlong handicap at Newbury Apr. 16 was followed with a second to Rodrigo de Torres (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) in a conditions event over the same trip at Doncaster May 1, and he is still unexposed.

While she has suffered two defeats since her G1 Prix Marcel Boussac victory over this track and trip on Arc day, the first was against the colts in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November, and the other came when she was reportedly short of her best in the G3 Prix de la Grotte back over course and distance last time Apr. 25. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Joanna (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was third behind Rosanara in the Marcel Boussac, returned to beat the subsequent G3 Premio Regina Elena winner Evading Tempete (GB) (Dubai Destination) and **Special Duty (GB)** (Hennessy) in the G3 Prix Imprudence at Maisons-Laffitte last time Apr. 8. Francois Rohaut, who saddled Torrestrella (Ire) (Orpen) to collect this trophy six years ago, puts forward **Baine (Fr)** (Country Reel) and **Liliside (Fr)** (American Post {GB}) this time. Baine used the same springboard as Torrestrella that stable flag-flyer when taking the Apr. 11 Listed Prix Finlande over 1 1/8 miles at this venue. Liliside improved off a success in the Listed Prix de la Californie at Cagnes-sur-Mer Feb. 14 to beat the subsequent impressive G3 Prix Vanteaux victress Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) in Saint-Cloud's Listed Prix la Camargo last time Apr. 1, and also warrants respect.

Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) invaded from Hong Kong to best Rocket Man by a neck in 2009, and the country is represented by three runners this year. **Joy and Fun**, perhaps a cut below the very best in Hong Kong, surprised many when he took the G3 Al Quoz Sprint S. on the Dubai World Cup undercard Mar. 27. **Happy Zero**, runner-up in the G1 Hong Kong Mile in December, has since reverted to shorter trips and comes into this off a third in a HK Group 2 May 1. He tries a left-handed course for the first time.

It was a surprisingly quiet scene at the Preakness Stakes barn two hours before post. While there were dozens of backstretch workers and barn personnel milling about before the Derby two weeks ago, it was mainly just immediate connections and media types

who were on hand yesterday on Pimlico's frontstretch (which is what we're calling it, as it sits behind the grandstand; the actual backstretch is, well, where you'd expect it to be).

Just outside Todd Pletcher's portion of the Preakness barn, on a bench, NBC's Bob Costas sat down for

an interview with Olympic gold medalist Lindsay Vonn--who, it can be said, is pretty. Just before, Vonn was introduced to trainer Bob Baffert and his son, Bode, who, of course, is himself named after another Olympic gold medal skier. She told him (Bode) he was very handsome. He didn't seem impressed. He ran over to the shedrow and plunged his hands into the dirt.

As the race drew nearer, all or nearly all of the 11 owners who comprise Donegal Racing looked on nervously as **Paddy O'Prado** poked his head out from his stall and looked about wide-eyed. If we've learned anything this week, it's that the big gray has personality. His stablemate, **First Dude**, belied a forthcoming powerhouse performance while fighting to stay awake in the stall next door.

The big colt's eyes drooped and closed, then shot open when his head next knocked the edge of the stall opening.

Caracortado stood relaxed as he enjoyed a pre-race bath. His trainer, Mike Machowsky, looked just as relaxed despite being on the verge of saddling his first Preakness starter. Later, in the minutes before the race, he made his way over the yellow gangway that spanned from the infield to the clubhouse and smiled as he punched a text into his cell phone.

Looking a lot less relaxed were both **Super Saver** and Todd Pletcher. Which isn't to say the former didn't look good; he looked great, in fact, but was an unsprung coil as he made his way to the indoor paddock (most of the field was saddled out on the turf course, but a handful of runners, including Super Saver, stablemate Aikenite and Lookin At Lucky, were saddled in the regular paddock). That pent-up energy perhaps cost him later as was a bit too eager in the early going.

Trainer Bob Baffert was joined by Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni as they made their way from the barn to the track, then down the outside rail as fans wished them well. Lanni helped select **Lookin At Lucky** at last year's Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

Just before the race, Lanni, Baffert and Baffert's wife Jill stood together along the rail on the second floor of the grandstand. Jill took pictures with her camera of the starting gate, Lanni looked a tad nervous, and Baffert just joked with a security guard standing next to him.

Some other notes:

- As the jockeys made their way down the metal stairs from the jocks room to the track to join their mounts in the infield, nearly all of the riders walked alone. An exception was Baffert, who put his arm around Martin Garcia and escorted him across the gangway to the infield. Whether he was giving him last-minute instructions or just keeping the young jockey relaxed we don't know, but whatever he said or did worked.
- It was great to see Dale Romans--who stands well above six feet--and wife Tammy Fox, who doesn't (she used to be a jockey), share a very cool low-five after First Dude's big runner-up effort;
- A bit of an editorial: it was our first time at the infield at Preakness, and it lived up to expectations, without exceeding them. It was a great party, and one that had nothing at all to do with horse racing. The exceptionally likable Comodoro won the Gill Chick Lang S. in runaway fashion, but you'd never know it on the infield--the race call couldn't even be heard. That could be a bad thing, depending on your perspective, but any time you can but several thousand people together and have that much fun, how bad can it be?
- Big kuddos to the team at Pimlico for putting together a fine event. Everyone seemed to have a good time, and there just a nice energy to the Preakness that began earlier in the week. The sentiment goes doubly for the city of Baltimore. Nearly everyone in town--cabbies, bartenders, etc.--knew the Preakness was happening, and had an opinion on who was going to win. The whole city seemed to rally around the race. We like you, Baltimore.

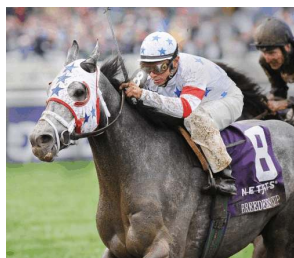

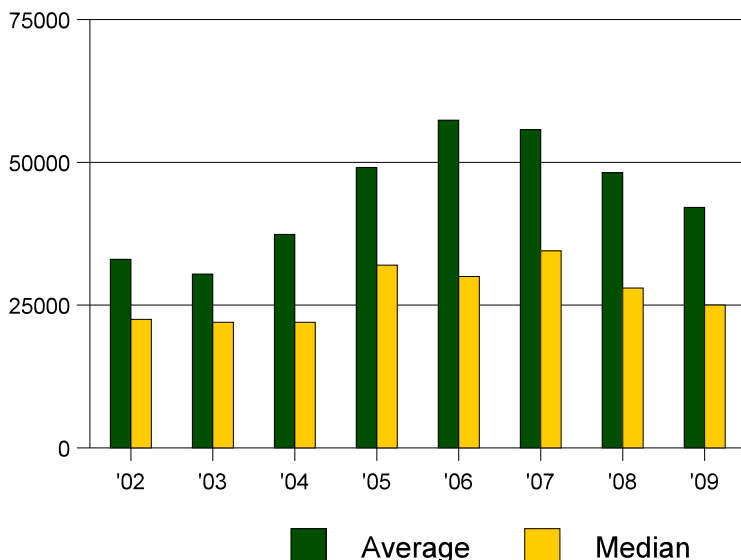

MIDDLE EARTH

Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale will take place Monday in Timonium, Maryland. The event may not have the glamour of the company's Calder sale, but it has produced a pair of Eclipse Award winners in the last six years in **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) and **Informed Decision** (Monarchos). Afleet Alex, who scored an unforgettable victory just a few miles away from the sales grounds in the 2005 GI Preakness S. during his championship season, was a \$75,000 purchase by Chuck Zacney's CJZ Racing Stable from Robert Scanlon's 2004 consignment. Informed Decision was less of a diamond in the rough when she went under the hammer in 2007, going for \$320,000 to Patrice Miller of EQB on behalf of George Strawbridge; she was offered by Off the Hook Partners as agent. A trio of Grade I winners emerged from the 2005 sale: **Kip Deville** (Kipling), **Showing Up** (Strategic Mission) and **Thorn Song** (Unbridled's Song). Multiple graded stakes winner **Musket Man** (Yonaguska), third in both the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. last spring, went through this sale ring in 2008.

"This sale depends more on the success of its graduates than on what's happening in the marketplace, generally," Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier offered. "We've had a sensational couple of years with nice horses coming from this sale at good prices, and I think that's what drags these buyers back--its ability to produce runners at any level; runners that are reasonably priced. Things

that are going on in the market can give you an indication of what's going to happen at this sale. It's not immune to market conditions, but it's certainly a special case: it's the last major chance of the year for people to load up on two-year-olds that are not compromised. These are very special horses that are getting the sort of scrutiny that you'd expect from some top buyers."

Traditionally held over two days, the auction has been condensed to just one session this year, following the trend of other recent juvenile sales.

"The decision to change it from a two-day format to one came fairly soon in the year, when we saw that the number of horses had been reduced fairly dramatically for all of the two-year-old in training sales," Collier said. "We were getting into a situation where we all know what a high number of scratches there are at the two-year-old sales; sometimes, 20 to 25 percent of these horses get scratched." Cont. p2

Collier added, "We couldn't put enough in the book to scratch down to two full days. We could only accept a certain number and, as soon as we saw, given the standard number of scratches, that we could accomodate it in one day, it seemed so much better for the consignors and buyers to get it all done in one single day."

The catalogue went to press with 405 head in the book, with 81 withdrawn thus far, and Fasig-Tipton opted to have the juveniles breeze over the course of two days last week.

"It would have made an overbearing under-tack show, to have it all in a single day," Collier added. "We still don't think it will be a late night--we're going to get underway promptly at 10 a.m., and, with the number of horses that are still left in, we feel that we'll still get done at a reasonable hour on Monday evening."

Though there had been as many as 656 youngsters catalogued in recent years, it's unlikely to see that quantity offered anytime soon.

"I think that, until the foal crop shows a reversal of the current trend, and frankly, until the pinhookers get a lot more comfortable carrying that sort of number forward to a May sale, [you won't see a bigger catalogue]," Collier opined. "I think there's a core of horses that come here that are specifically selected to come to a mid-May sale. They're the later-maturing horses, and sometimes you don't find that out until you begin to train them. They've got this window of opportunity, but, until the pinhookers increase their inventory, we'll be looking at a smaller catalogue for the next several years."

The breeze shows are held during Preakness Week, and Collier noted Friday that the sale attracts attention from trainers in town for the Triple Crown's middle jewel.

"With Lookin At Lucky running, Mr. [Bob] Baffert has shown some interest and, without that, you'd wonder whether he would be here," he said. "Yes, he has been here in the past, but he's also been in the Preakness before. I think everybody recognizes that if you can make an event special and different, it will attract a bigger and more enthusiastic audience. I think all of the sales companies do that and try hard to put these events on, and it's very appropriate that it comes at this time of the year in terms of the two-year-old calendar. With the Preakness going on at the same time, it all works together."

Local Flavor...

Baltimore still comes alive for the Preakness, despite the well-documented woes of live racing in Maryland, and neighboring Pennsylvania has seen boom purses after legislation approved slot machines at racetracks. But the New York Racing Association's funding issues, combined with Monmouth's inaugural \$1-million-a-day purse structure, has forced some breeders to make a change. *Cont. p3*

"Every state breeder around here, not just in Maryland--you take New Jersey and, particularly, New York, and even Kentucky--is concerned," Collier reflected. "People have been foaling mares in Pennsylvania to take advantage of that incentive program. Hopefully, the people that have been brave enough to support that program will be rewarded for it. We'd love to see these other state-bred programs get on a firmer, independent footing; they have basically been the foundation of the Midlantic market. None of us can rely on one big day at Monmouth or one big year in Pennsylvania--we need to have healthy programs throughout this region to really flourish."

In 2009, the Midlantic sale statistics dipped a bit from 2008, but a new record price of \$850,000 was established when a Tapit--Shopping (Private Account) colt consigned by Cary Frommer for Hobeau Farm was purchased by Steve Young on behalf of Mill House. Subsequently named **Trappe Shot**, the chestnut became a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ in his second start this past February ([video](#)), and Collier is confident more can follow in his footsteps.

"I think there are several horses this year that are going to test the depths of this market," he stated. "There are five to 10 horses here that will elevate themselves above the norm, and I think we'll have the buyers to take care of those. Trappe Shot is a lovely horse, and he's shown an enormous amount of talent up to now. It hasn't yet translated into a big stakes win, but he's sitting on it. Steve Young is giving us good reports on how the horse is training." Collier concluded, "What we're looking for this year is a broader band of buyers under the \$50,000 level. We're expecting solid trade there. But there's always a concern for the workaday horse that perhaps is not a star, but is a very useful horse."

Keystone Kids...

This year's Midlantic will feature the usual array of high-profile Florida consignors, but there are a number of offerings from smaller operations, including the inaugural draft from Penn Ridge Farms. Located near Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, the 130-acre operation was established in 2007 by Michael Jester, who brought in leading Keystone State sire Real Quiet (Quiet American) as his flagship stallion. Penn Ridge will offer a six-horse draft Monday.

"This is our first time consigning at a two-year-old in training sale," said Patrick Morell, the farm's general manager. "Some of these horses we did RNA last year at the yearling sale. We thought that they could go on to be good Pennsylvania racehorses--the program is so

lucrative right now. You can do very, very well with a good PA-bred."

Morell is a Pennsylvania-bred himself.

"I came from a little town outside Pittsburgh named Rochester, and all we ever had there were steel mills and high school

football," he quipped.

Having caught the racing bug early, Morell graduated from Wheeling Jesuit University, and did his best to get into the business.

"I kept trying to get into Kentucky, but the doors weren't really open, and I was very fortunate that Tom Ludt, who was the general manager at Vinery at the time, gave me a shot at selling seasons," Morell explained. "I absolutely adored it. I met Mike Jester through a racing partnership at Vinery. We were up at Presque Isle's opening day, and I was sitting with some [Pennsylvania Horse Breeders' Association] people, and we hit it off. We maintained a relationship while I continued selling seasons, and he wound up asking me to come work for him. For me, being from Pennsylvania, I thought it was a perfect fit."

Jester was the CEO of United Sleep Products, a company with a mattress manufacturing factory in Denver, Pennsylvania. He sold the company in January 2006 for an undisclosed sum to Northlight Capital.

"He was as happy as a clam, and I don't blame him," Morell added. "He has a great passion of the horse, which is really nice to have. He enjoys going to the races--he's a great handicapper--and he loves spending time at the farm."

Jester has been purchasing mares to send to the Penn Ridge stallions, and four of his homebreds are selling Monday. The consignment is rounded out by two additional horses for the farm's clients. After being foaled at the western Pennsylvania farm, the youngsters were shipped to Arkansas to receive their early lessons.

"They were broken in Arkansas at Trophy Club Training Center, which was Bob Holthus' old farm," said Morell. "We're going to see how it goes. If it goes well, we'll probably be back--I don't see why we wouldn't. I think that if you have a good product, people are going to buy it, no doubt about it, and that's what we're trying to do. We've done a very good job of upgrading our mares, and the crops that come along after this are really going to be a lot better."

Many stallions have left Kentucky in the last 12 months to take advantage of the revitalized Pennsylvania breeding industry, and Morell hopes that his home state can thrive.

"They're starting to write a lot of PA-bred races, especially at Penn National now, which is very helpful to these breeders," he pointed out. "With them having these races--even some of the cheaper ones, like the maiden \$10,000 claimers--they can get out on these horses and put the money back in, to feed the machine, so to speak. We need more breeders, we need more owners; we need to do everything we can to keep our sport rolling."

"[The breeders] keep us all going, that's where it all starts," Morell continued. "A lot of people don't understand what this involves; it's a lot of work, and I want the breeders to be rewarded. They're the ones going out on a limb. Anyone can go to a sale and buy a horse that's got a \$25,000 stud fee for seven or eight thousand dollars, and think they robbed someone. In this market, it happens. A lot of these horses go cheap; it is what it is. So that's my biggest concern." **Cont. p5**

"I do think the program's going to get stronger," he added. "A lot of the casinos have gone in [at the tracks], and they're going to put more and more money into the system. That's what we need. Do I love the fact that there are casinos at the racetrack? No, I don't, but it's a necessary evil at this time. This is not a sport that's about instant gratification--it takes a lot of time, a lot of patience, and a lot of good luck along the way. It's not like pulling the arm on a slot machine and saying, 'Well, we've got a two-year-old that's ready to go to the track.' It doesn't work that way. Our society is gravitating towards instant gratification, and I don't like that. I like the old times. Sometimes I wish I had grown up in the '40s and '50s, or even the '60s with Buckpasser and Damascus and Dr. Fager, when all of those great horses were around. I wish we could gravitate back to that and make horse racing a wonderful jewel like it should be. You see these majestic horses and what they can do...I hope the powers that be can get together and say, 'Let's make it so fashionable that everyone will want to be there.'"

The affable manager is clearly fond of his horses.

"[Hip] [119](#) I really like a lot because of the mare--a Green Dancer mare named Emphasis, and she is very much a favorite of mine," Morell said of the Real Quiet filly. "The half-sister has already made \$127,000. She won four times last year, has never been in for a tag, and I'm sure she'll get black-type this year. So we're hoping for some good things for this Real Quiet filly."

The aforementioned half-sister is Lovelier (Proud Citizen), a Jester homebred who was acquired in utero when agent Chad Schumer signed a \$22,000 ticket for Emphasis at KEENOV in 2004. Having won four of her 11 career starts--all in 2009--the five-year-old is currently training at Delaware Park toward her seasonal debut.

Another Penn Ridge offering is [264](#), a Grand Reward colt out of One Tall Drink (Lion Cavern). He was acquired by the operation for \$14,000 at KEEJAN.

"It's a funny story with the Grand Reward," said Morell. "I lost the shake on One Tall Drink at Mountain-eer [in 2006]. Then, at Keeneland, I didn't realize that I was bidding against my friend Chuck Simon on the horse when he was a short yearling."

Over the course of two breeze shows, conducted after the Baltimore area was hit with rain, the fastest time for an eighth was :10.1. Penn Ridge's swiftest worker was [160](#), a Whywhywhy colt out of Golden Nekia (Touch Gold).

"The track was a little bit deep and sticky," Morell explained. "I don't think anyone was overly pleased with the times. People's hopes and dreams are in these horses, and you always want to do the best you can, so when you take them up to the ring, you can get the best price. They all came back good, which is the most important thing. These horses are all going to be useful, and they're all going to win. I really believe that. If they stay sound, they're going to win, especially with the PA program."

Though hopeful that the selling will go smoothly, the breeding end is clearly Morell's focus at Penn Ridge.

"Mike Jester has been so good about supporting his stallions," Morell offered. "He does go to Kentucky on occasion, but we really support our stallions. We've got some Cat Thief babies on the ground that we're thrilled with--they're really great-looking horses. We've got some great shareholders

in Monba, and they're supporting him with some very nice mares. The Real Quiets are good, strong, hard-knocking horses, and the great thing about Real Quiet is that he can step up and get you a big horse. You look at Midnight Lute, Wonder Lady Anne L and Pussycat Doll--those are top-level horses."

He was purchased by Fiona Shaw on behalf of Earle Macke. "He was just a beautiful horse," Shaw told *Racing Post*. "He did a very nice breeze and I loved his pedigree. Earle Macke has two horses in France at the moment--one with Jonathan Pease and another with Jean-Claude Rouget--and this one will probably go to Jonathan."

Saubouas Star Again...

Paul Basquin's Haras du Saubouas, who provided the sale topper two years ago and were leading vendor 12 months ago, once more edged out Mocklershill and Bansha House at the top of the tree. Their draft was highlighted by the sale of hip 121, a colt by Shamardal who is the first foal out of the group-placed Samerous (Fr) (Generous {Ire}), a half-sister to the 2004 G2 Prix de Royallieu winner Samando (Fr) (Hernando {Fr}). Led out unsold at €38,000 as a foal at Baden-Baden, the January-foaled bay had been purchased for €22,000 back there a year later, and fetched €210,000 this time as Gerard Larrieu's Chantilly Bloodstock Agency had the final say. Chantilly was acting on behalf of an Abu Dhabi-based client. Saubouas were also responsible for the top-priced filly of the session as the third lot from the finish by Galileo (Ire) sold for €180,000. Samuel Blanchard's Winning Bloodstock Agency was the name on the docket for the full-sister to the smart Martial Law (Ire) out of a half to Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Completing a stellar day for the consignors was the sale of hip 147, a Green Tune full-brother to the 2003 G3 Prix d'Aumale winner and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up Green Noon (Fr), to Maite Dubuc-Grassa for €140,000.

Better Late Than Never...

Despite not making his reserve earlier in the afternoon, Mocklershill's Shamardal half-brother to Obrigado (Fr) (Enrique {GB}) and dual group scorer Coupe de Champe (Fr) (Take Risks {Fr}) was the subject of a private sale later on. Richard O'Gorman offered €200,000 for hip 19 and it was duly accepted by Willie Browne's establishment, who also consigned the Aussie Rules half-brother to last year's Poule d'Essai des Poulisches heroine Elusive Wave (Ire) (Elusive City) sold to the Dubai-based Prime Equestrian for €140,000. Mocklershill's draft also included hip [85](#), a colt by Medicean (GB) from the immediate family of the 2004 Arc hero and sire Bago (Fr) who was knocked down to Jean-Claude Rouget for €110,000. David Redvers Bloodstock paid €135,000 for hip [62](#), a colt by Iffraaj (GB) from Bansha House. Out of the listed-winning and group-placed Jezebel (GB) (Owington {GB}), the March-foaled bay had sold for €55,000 at the showcase August sale. Con Marnane's draft was also responsible for another highlight in hip [103](#), an Oasis Dream (GB) grandson of the champion Forest Flower (Green Forest) who also sold to the Chantilly Bloodstock Agency for €115,000. That price was later matched by Anthony Stroud for hip [140](#), Smart Strike's colt out of the champion Surfside (Seattle Slew) from Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud and also by Bobby O'Ryan for Kilminfoyle House Stud's hip [148](#), an Elusive City half-sister to the listed-placed Paint In Green (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) from the family of sire Charge d'Affaires (Fr).
