DIZZYING HEIGHTS

Long ago labeled the best the Hannons had handled, **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) made light work of yesterday's G1 Abu Dhabi Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh to justify that opinion and land the gamble that saw him start the 9-4 favorite. Runner-up in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 17 and third in Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas May 1, the bay was settled towards

the rear early by Richard Hughes and was always traveling with ease off the fast pace. Cruising to the front at the furlong marker, he drew away under hand-riding to beat **Free Judgement** (Vindication) by a comfortable three-length margin. "He has silenced all the critics," his jockey said. "They should have known that if Richard Hannon says he'll stay a mile after 40 years training horses, he stays. Everything went nicely and he traveled really good--I think I have the key to him now, as at Newmarket I sent him to sleep and, when I woke him up, it was nearly over. He was electric today." **Cont. p2**

FULL TERM

With the English and French Guineas producing bunch finishes, only to be won via disqualification, the search is on for a star filly to make her mark in the Classic division. It is possible at this stage that the unbeaten ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Termagant (Ire)** (Powerscourt {GB}) could yet fill the void, and she is one of the most interesting in the line-up for today's G1 Etihad Airways Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. It was at this venue that Jorge Vasicek's colorbearer sprang to prominence when beating the Ballydoyle pair of **Famous (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Lillie Langtry (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. over seven furlongs in August. Termagant was not rushed into a preparation for Newmarket, and that patient approach could start to pay dividends here. "She's working very well, although she never really shows an awful lot at home," commented trainer Kevin Prendergast, who saddled the winner of this event back in 1972. "She's come now and is very fit. She won on fast [on debut] at Leopardstown, so ground preference is not a factor with her." **Cont. p3-4**

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Canford Cliffs served notice of his potential when getting off the mark by seven lengths in a six-furlong Newbury maiden in May, and rammed the point home with a demolition job in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. the following month. Kept at six furlongs for the G1 Prix Morny, he hung in the closing stages when only third to Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) in that Deauville contest. The colt was jarred in the race and had some time on the shelf. He made his return in the G3 Greenham S. and seemingly had the field at his mercy, but veered left and ended up behind Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) there. One place in arrears of that stable companion once again when asked to wait and close for the first time in the May 1 English 2000 Guineas, he was heavily favored to go one better here. Canford Cliffs always had the front-runners covered with the anchor down early and, when eased out of the pocket, picked up **Xtension (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}) in a matter of strides at the furlong marker before quickly setting his seal on this Classic. "He relaxed a lot more than usual and was able to finish his race today," the trainer's son and assistant Richard Hannon Jr. commented. "He's run straight and didn't hang, and we now have probably three of the best milers in the country in Canford Cliffs, Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and Dick Turpin, despite people saying they are best at seven furlongs." Hannon Jr. added, "Canford Cliffs worked as well as he had before the Coventry last week, and Hughesie was able to sit on him like a jet-ski. He'll go to the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 15] now, and so will Dick Turpin. He's possibly the best we've ever had and has shown it today."

Connections of Free Judgement are also looking at the Royal Ascot race for the runner-up. His jockey, Kevin Manning, said, "I thought a faster-run race would suit, so he hasn't surprised me, but on the day a very smart horse beat him." Viscount Nelson fared best of the Ballydoyle sextet in third, with the returning **Steinbeck (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) a place behind. Aidan O'Brien was quick to name probable targets for the pair. "Viscount Nelson ran a stormer and the even pace suited him," O'Brien said. "He came home very well and a mile and a quarter should suit, so the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 6] looks the race for him. We were delighted with Steinbeck, as Johnny [Murtagh] said he traveled a bit fresh and keen early on and was disorganised which is what you would expect on only his third run. When he relaxed, he came home very well, and if all is well between now and then we'll look at the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 15]." 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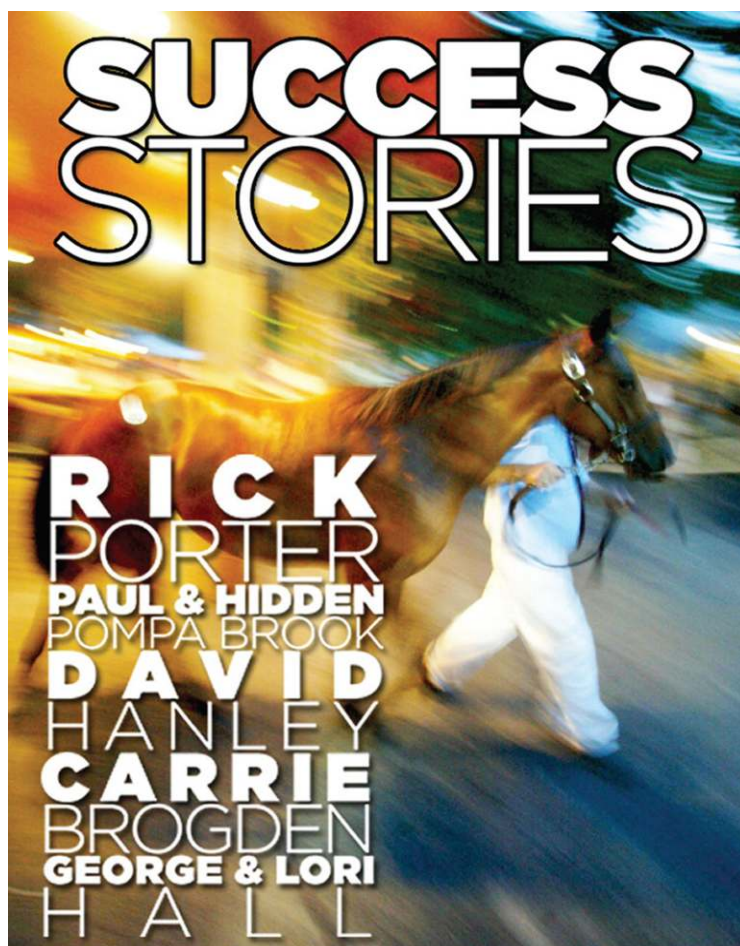

The Show Moves On...

Jaber Abdullah's **Music Show (Ire)** (Noverre) was the first filly home on the disadvantageous far side when sixth in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2, and bids to atone for that piece of bad fortune. Trainer Mick Channon is hoping the dice rolls the right way for the G2 Rockfel S. and G3 Nell Gwyn S. winner. "We're very pleased with her, and she seems to have done very well since the Guineas," the West Ilsley-based conditioner commented. "She's got to turn up and win now, and we don't want to harp about bad draws, but last time made a Classic a mockery." Jim Bolger, who saddled Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) to collect this three years ago, has a live chance in the 1000 Guineas third **Gile Na Greine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). Beaten only a neck by Jacqueline Quest (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy) at Newmarket, the homebred is backed up by stable companion **Atasari (Ire)** (Whipper), who was a neck second to Music Show in the Rockfel at Newmarket in October, and the same distance behind **Bethrah (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) in the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial at Leopardstown last time May 9. **Blue Maiden (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) was runner-up to Music Show in Newmarket's Nell Gwyn S. Apr. 14 before finishing ninth in the Guineas there. Conditioner Philip McBride told *PA Sport*, "Obviously, she was drawn on the wrong side in the Guineas; also, Jamie Spencer thought the ground was a bit soft for her. She has had an easy couple of weeks, but is very well." Another British-based challenger is **Lady Darshaan (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who was a place behind Blue Maiden in the Newmarket Classic, but holds strong claims on her second in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot in September. Kingsgate Native, who was gelded at the end of last season after proving infertile at stud in 2009, was making his 2010 debut here. The winner of the 2007 G1 Nunthorpe S. and 2008 G1 Golden Jubilee S., he finished off the radar in his second go at the Golden Jubilee at Royal Ascot upon his return to racecourse action last June. Rebounding in style to garner the July 30 G3 King George S. at Goodwood, he was last seen running sixth in his third attempt at the Nunthorpe Aug. 21. Kingsgate Native broke alertly in this dash and disputed fifth position through the early strides. Stoked up passing the quarter-mile marker to challenge approaching the final eighth, he quickened through a gap between Equiano and Spin Cycle (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) to lead with 100 yards to go and ran on strongly under whipless urging to register a fourth pattern-race success. "It didn't go the way I'd initially planned, so I had to get some cover at halfway," admitted jockey Ryan Moore. "He picked up nicely and got there easily, so I'm delighted with him. They went a good clip, and I'd like to think he'll improve for the run. He was very relaxed today and he's settled down well. RECORD NON-HASKELL HANDLE FOR MONMOUTH ELITE OPENER

The opening day total handle for Monmouth Park's Elite Summer Meeting was \$9,357,444, a record for a non-Haskell program and up 119 percent from last year's opener. Opening-day attendance was 17,903, up 74 percent over 2009, and on-track handle was \$1,325,737, an increase of 99.3 percent from last year. "We had high expectations, and we exceeded them," said Dennis R. Robinson, president and CEO of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority. "If today's numbers are indicative of what's to come, then we can stamp this experiment a rousing success." Robinson added, "This is an excellent beginning to the racing meet, and an even better start for a new future in New Jersey racing." Total purses for the first card of the million-dollar meet came to \$846,460. Field size average 9.7 horses.

A resident of nearby Rumson, New Jersey, the 62-year-old celebrated one of his finest moments in racing at the Jersey Shore oval in 2007, when his English Channel (Smart Strike) got over a boggy turf course and streaked home to score by seven lengths in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Scatuorchio was one of many familiar faces on hand for opening day of the meet, and is looking forward to a tremendous summer. "They have great attendance, obviously, and the betting pools are better and the fields are full and I am enjoying it very much. I just wish it were a little bit warmer," he explained, adding he has high hopes for the experiment. "I told [Monmouth Vice President and General Manager] Bobby Kulina when I walked in this morning that I was really rooting for him. A lot of people in the industry are watching how it opens and how it goes forward. I think they are on the right track. They did the right thing, and I hope they can sustain it." Scatuorchio had an interest in Let's Go Stable's No Shenanigans (Value Plus), who ran third in yesterday's 10th race. That same operation is set to be represented by Midst (Closing Argument) in the \$100,000 Just Smashing S. May 31.

It's almost like the feel of Haskell Day every day. You want this to be an event that people want to come and see on a daily basis. This is a good indication that we're doing things right."

The Governor was enthused, the legislators are all here, and we needed this in order to get them to support the industry. This far surpasses our dreams." And Drazin, recently sworn in as chairman of the New Jersey Racing Commission, fully expects this to be something more than a flash in the pan. "I think it's sustainable, because if we are successful, they're going to want to repeat it and it will lead to having more money available for purses," he said. "Our future looks very rosy to me right now."

Despite Finley's strongest urgings, he was unable to get West Point's Mr. Fantasy home in front, as Congressional Page got the best of him in the final strides. After the race was made official and the winning connections made their way down to the winner's circle, it didn't take long for Chace to make a B-line for the nearest exit.

Love him or hate him, Governor Chris Christie elicited quite a reaction from the crowd prior to the Decathlon S. In a ceremony located in the winner's circle, the Governor of New Jersey signed off on the funding for

the Monmouth's Elite Meet amid the cheers, and jeers, of the crowd. In fact, the crowd were so riled up that many felt the need to express their extreme displeasure about a host of political issues, including taxes and education. In the end, the Governor--seemingly unfazed by the abuse--was ushered away from the front side, and the rumor floating around later in the day was that an official trophy

presentation, was nixed in an effort to keep the peace.

The day was tough on the men in silks. Garrett Gomez appeared to have every chance in the seventh race until his mount, Shadwell runner Jadal (A.P. Indy), stumbled at the break, sending Gomez tumbling, over his head. There were a few tense moments as the ambulance crew tried swiftly, yet cautiously, to place the fallen rider on a stretcher. Gomez, who appeared not to be moving during the episode, was finally taken away before the field came around the final turn. By the day's conclusion, Gomez was said to be OK, and slated to ride Sunday afternoon.

One race later, Carlos Marquez Jr. was unseated by his mount in the post parade and was quickly collected by the Blue and White Meridian health ambulance. With an ever-growing collection of people hovering around the entrance to First Aid, Marquez was carried into the building, only after he was relieved of his helmet and whip by a valet. "Don't forget his boots," yelled a passing Monmouth Park official. It seemed he wouldn't be needing them the rest of the day. Marquez was sent to Jersey Shore University Medical Center after complaining of pain in his hip and pelvis.

With a total of 20 new trainers at the meet, and a host of returning conditioners on the grounds, this year's GI Kentucky Derby winning trainer Todd Pletcher was on hand to launch Monmouth's big day. Getting the win with Winaholic in the seventh, and awarded with a third in the Elkwood S. with Pleasant Strike, Pletcher was upbeat about the upcoming meet.

"Seems positive," said Pletcher. "Handle appears to be up, and so is attendance. So far, so good."

Trouble getting stalls?

"I was shorted some stalls. I guess it went with the territory, because everybody was, but I was able to make due. As long as you keep having runners in there, we'll just keep turning them over if we have to. We'll just make the best of it. Fortunately, I have 15 stalls over at Philly, so my overflow is there. I've been able to run horses [at Philly] all winter and have been doing OK over there."

Any changes in terms of how Monmouth officials have handled the local horsemen?

"I haven't seen any changes about running or shipping, but they have always been good like that at Monmouth. They expect you to run here, but there is no pressure. Management and horsemen here have a pretty good relationship."

What has been the biggest change for you?

"I have horses at Philly, and I entered one at Monmouth and he was in the also-eligibles in the last race today, but he didn't get in because his papers weren't here. I am going to have to watch that and pay attention where the papers are at, so they can get in the gate."

"We are going to have to keep an eye on racing our horses where they belong. You think your horse is worth one thing, but, unfortunately, with the quality of stock coming in from out of town, you will have to pay attention to what your horses are really worth. So a little reality check is going to set in for a lot of people; after they run once, they are going to see that the \$25,000 horse that they ran is now only really worth \$15,000 around here. But that's not a bad thing. It will make people run their horses where they really belong."

Your thoughts about the races they have been writing and the ones that have been actually going?

"We've had a pretty good turnout with horsemen and entries. I'm a little disappointed to see that the two races on the card with the smallest fields were the stakes. The good horses obviously stayed where they were at, like at Belmont or Delaware, for their races. I guess, in retrospect, the other-thans were \$80,000 and the stakes were \$100,000. So maybe the stakes should have been a little more and maybe they would have enticed more people to send horses. For only \$20,000, it's an easier spot, so why wouldn't I run my horse in there if I have one that fits?"

How do you feel about the horsemen coming in from out of town?

"It was good see those California horsemen coming out. People are trying to claim, and I'm sure those guys are going to get cleaned out. I just hope they are prepared to change their stock over; if they are prepared to go back, they'll have to go back with different horses. People are so hungry for horses everywhere, a fresh horse from California or the Gulfstream horses are just going to be picked on terribly.

"Earlier in the day, they had an eight-horse field and five of them were claimed. It's because you can claim a horse for \$15,000 and wait run him on the 21st day, run him for \$10,000 or \$12,000 or even \$7,500, and the pot is so good and you'll lose money on the claim, but you'll make money. It will be fun for horsemen to claim, but you just have to think that it is a short meet, and what are you going to do with that horse come September? You have to be careful."

What is the local horsemen's perspective?

"It's positive in a lot of ways. A lot of guys are disappointed they got beat up a little bit with not being able to get in, and they've been supporting the meet for years and years, but we needed change. I'm sure some of their feelings were hurt and they couldn't get their usual number of stalls. And there are still some empties here, so people are a little confused about when they're going to fill up, because the meet has started. But I've heard a lot of outfits are still coming in; in fact, I saw a lot come in today. [Nick] Zito shipped in today. I think they just waited to ship in because they are so close."

What was your overall impression of opening day?

"We need to do this, and if every day could be like this, it would be very successful. So far, A +."

Monmouth a Popular Destination...

It is not just at the mutuel windows that business is brisk at Monmouth. Group sales have also been strong at this early stage. "It's a little early to tell, and, because we have fewer days this year, it might be even when all is said and done," commented Carolyn DiDario-Breen of the group sales department. "But what we have so far has been very, very strong. For example, our picnic area is completely sold out on weekends through September already. There are some Fridays with some availability, but those are going fast, too."

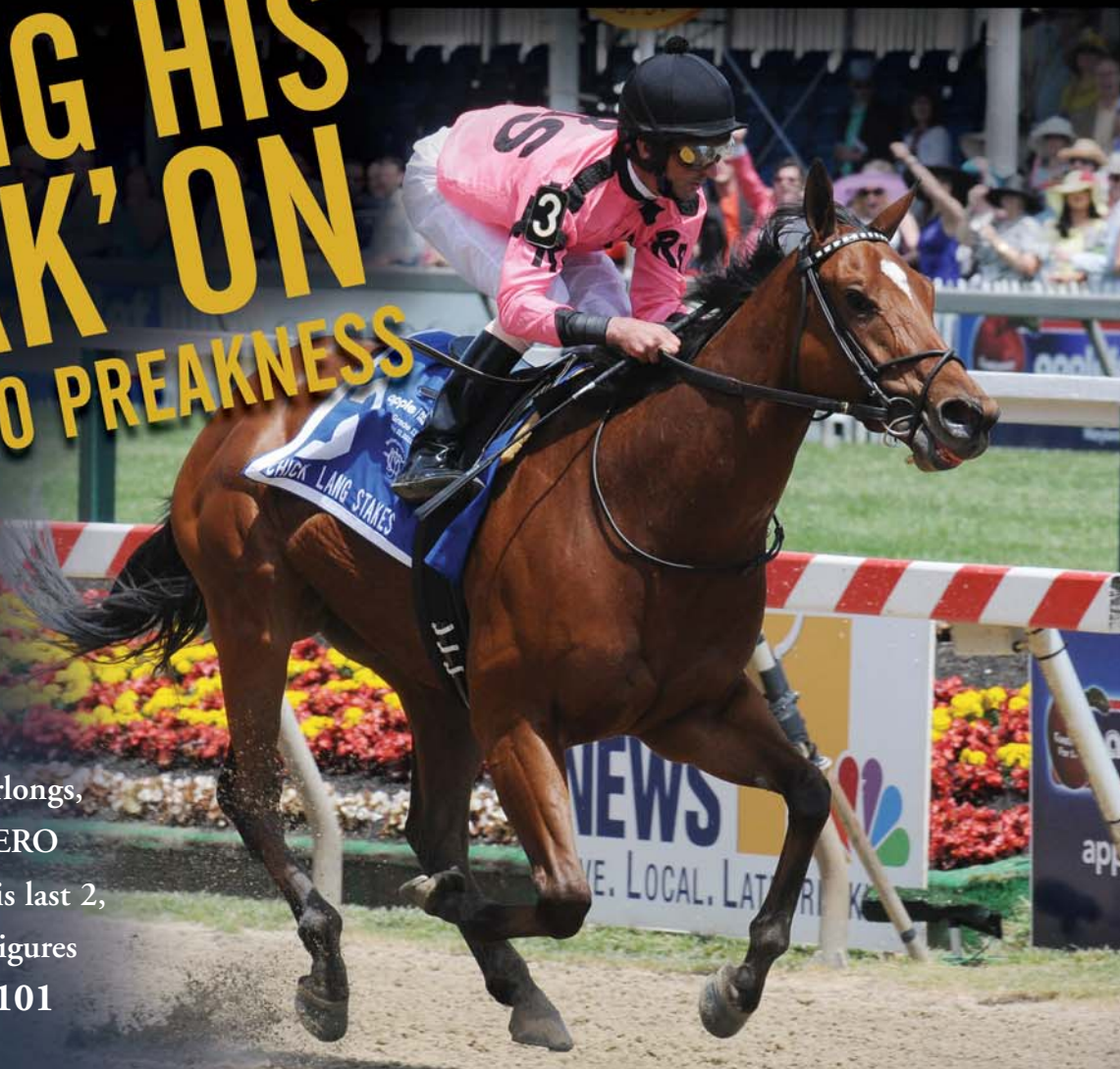

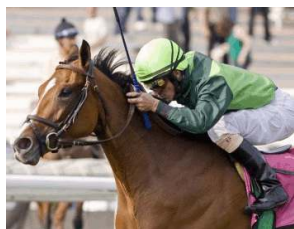

Oak Tree Meeting with MID Set for June 4:

Oak Tree Racing Association officials initially thought they wouldn't be meeting with MI Developments Vice Chairman and CEO Dennis Mills until the middle of next month, but Mills told the California Horse Racing Board Thursday he planned to meet with Oak Tree Vice President Sherwood Chillingworth June 4. MID, which took over the operation of Santa Anita from Magna International at the end of April, opted to cancel its current lease with Oak Tree for their fall meeting at the Arcadia track. A new deal put on the table by MID would have required that Oak Tree, in addition to handing over 75-percent of its profits to Santa Anita, as it has in years past, would also mandated that Oak Tree proffer a \$10-million loan to MID, with no payments on the principal over the first two years, and contribute to the cost of capital improvements at the track. Chillingworth declared that proposal "well beyond our economic capabilities." MID is in the process of crafting a new lease, but, if the terms are not agreeable to Oak Tree, the CHRB voted unanimously Friday to allow the meet to be held at any Thoroughbred track in central or southern California. The CHRB members also expressed their disapproval over the manner in which MID has conducted business since taking control of Santa Anita. "You've got to understand there has been a great deal of concern over what the takeover would mean, and your words and actions have raised the level of concern," Chairman Keith Brackpool said at Thursday's meeting. Added Vice Chairman Jerry Moss, "We need to know what our largest investor is planning to do. Once we get our questions answered, I think you'll find this Board to be more receptive." MID also operates Golden Gate Field, also acquired from Magna, but California Horse Racing Law prohibits a single entity from having a financial stake in more than one track, unless there is a waiver from the CHRB. Magna was granted a waiver, but the CHRB voted Thursday to extend only a short-term license to MID to operate Santa Anita and Golden Gate through July 22. The Board will request a business plan regarding the tracks from MID, to be presented by July 1, and will reexamine the issue at its July 22 meeting.
