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D-DAY FOR DROSSELMAYER

When **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) surged late to post a 13-1 upset over **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) and **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) in the GI Belmont S., a number of milestones were achieved. WinStar Farm became the first owner to win two legs of the Triple Crown with different runners since Overbrook Farm accomplished the feat in 1996 with Grindstone and Editor's Note. Hall of Famer Bill Mott notched his first win in a Triple Crown race, and fellow Hall of Fame member Mike Smith, who teamed up with

Mott earlier on the card to land the GI Just a Game S. with Proviso (GB), rounded out a career Triple Crown following scores in the 2005 GI Kentucky Derby and 1993 GI Preakness S. "People don't know it, but this is the second Belmont winner I've saddled," Mott quipped. "I saddled Victory Gallop [in the 1998 Belmont] for Elliot [Walden, vice president and racing manager of WinStar Farm] when he had a broken leg." **Cont. p2**

FORCE OF NATURE

Khalid Abdullah's **"TDN Rising Star" ☼ Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) had little to recommend him on the form book and entered yesterday's G1 Investec Derby the least experienced in the line-up, but his performance was one for the ages as he surged to a seven-length victory in course-record time. Hanging and workmanlike in the wake of Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in York's G2 Dante S. May 13, the imposing homebred was a different proposition here and, after settling in mid-division, quickened up the stretch to reel in the runaway 100-1 Ballydoyle outsider **At First Sight (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. The 6-1 shot thundered up the hill, providing trainer Sir Michael Stoute with a fifth renewal, and knocked a second off the previous best set by Lammtarra in 1995. "It's always a great thrill and seems to get more thrilling," Stoute commented. "The Dante didn't go as we wanted it, but he was seriously good today. I'm particularly delighted that Ryan won it, as he has put a lot of work into this horse, and I'm also delighted for the Juddmonte team and Prince Khalid, who is a great supporter of the stable and racing all over the world." **Full Field Lines Up in G1 Prix du Jockey-Club.....p5**

The brilliant Best

Workforce, with a stunning seven-length Epsom success, is **the fastest Derby winner of all time**. And he's the second Classic colt this week for his brilliant sire, after Eishin Flash's Japanese Derby victory.

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Drosselmeyer began his career on the grass, finishing third by 3/4 of a length at Saratoga Aug. 16, then ran second at even-money to Exhi (Maria's Mon) on Belmont's sod Sept. 20. Beaten a head on Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 24, the coppery chestnut broke through with six-length triumph in an off-the-turfer at Churchill Nov. 18 ([video](#)). He kicked off 2010 campaign with a sharp allowance tally at Gulfstream Jan. 31 ([video](#)) and looked like he'd be a major player on the Triple Crown trail, but it took a while for him to fulfill that promise. Fourth as the favorite in the GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 20 ([video](#)), he finished third by a length in the GII Louisiana Derby over the same track Mar. 27, which meant he did not amass the requisite earnings to contest the GI Kentucky Derby. WinStar secured the roses with Super Saver (Maria's Mon) May 1 and, a week later, Drosselmeyer resurfaced with a no-excuse

second to Fly Down in the GII Dwyer S. around this sweeping oval ([video](#)). Kent Desormeaux had been the colt's pilot since the Churchill maiden win, but found himself replaced by Smith. Drosselmeyer, who had been training

with bar shoes in front, went postward at 13-1 in the 142nd running of the Belmont.

"Kent has had a lot of confidence in this horse all year," Elliott Walden offered. "Kent's ridden a lot of good horses for us and we had a lot of faith in Kent, but we just felt like in this certain situation that something needed to change a little bit. We went to Mike because Mike was riding Proviso for Bill in the Just a Game. We knew he was going to be in town. He's a great rider and felt like he would get him in that rhythm that this horse is desiring--just :24, :48, 1:12 and keep grinding at them."

When the gates opened, First Dude cleared the field from post 11 and settled into an easy tempo, with Drosselmeyer sitting about five lengths back and in the clear on the outside. The imposing First Dude slowed it down up front with his splits of :24.15, :49.19 and 1:14.94, and hit the half-mile pole in 1:40.25. Smith asked his mount to edged a bit closer heading into the far turn and the pair began a steady advance, ranging up to challenge First Dude in front of the grandstand. The big colt dug in inside, but Drosselmeyer had the momentum. Fly Down launched a late run on the outside to nip First Dude for second.

"It was Elliot [Walden]'s idea to go to the Dwyer," said Mott. "We thought about wheeling back into either the Arkansas Derby or Blue Grass, but we just said we should stick with our original plan. I got a little nervous when he ran in the Dwyer and looked like he needed some racing, but it turned out to be a good plan."

Mike Smith, who called the New York circuit home for much of his career, added, "It was a great trip. It was all about getting into the rhythm and we did it. It worked out. It was incredible. It's great to come home." Smith's other Classic wins came with Prairie Bayou in the 1993 Preakness and Giacomo in the 2005 Kentucky Derby.

The Belmont paddock scene started to heat up prior to the GI True North S. with the arrival of politician Sarah Palin. The former Alaskan Governor, keeping a low-profile sporting a black hat and sunglasses with gold horseshoe emblems, was swarmed by reporters and photographers as the horses made their way to the track. "Let's not talk politics, this is too much fun!" Palin said with a big smile. Meanwhile, just adjacent to the paddock in the grandstand, fans lined up to get autographs from the great Ron Turcotte, rider of 1973 Triple Crown hero Secretariat. The party was still going strong in the picnic area after 5 p.m., as the crowd sang along to classic rock hits *Summer of '69* and *Sweet Home Alabama*. Owners and trainers began to file into the paddock for the main event right after **Winchester** (Theatrical {Ire}) pulled off a 21-1 shocker in the GI Manhattan H. As usual, the statue of Big Red proved most popular, with many taking turns to get their pictures taken in front of it.

Trainer Todd Pletcher was business as usual, confidently walking in, while Fantasy Lane Stable's Bob Hutt waved to fans as he made a flashy entrance. Bob LaPenta, owner of favored **Ice Box** (Pulpit), quickly adjusted his tie while strolling in with a small group, including racing manager Ernie Reichard. WinStar representatives Elliott

Walden and Doug Cauthen arrived moments apart, with owners Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt noticeably absent. Barry K. Schwartz, co-founder of Calvin Klein and prominent horse owner, was styling as usual, wearing a pair of white shoes.

ESPN's Kenny Mayne took a break from his television duties to take a peak at the paddock scene from set, guzzling a bottle of water on the hot and humid day. Owner Larry Roman left his multi-colored blazer from the post position draw at home in favor of a sharp gray suit and purple tie. Youngster Bode Baffert stuck out in the big crowd, rocking a pair of plaid shorts along with a shirt and tie as mom kept a close eye. Hutt and the Fantasy Lane partners posed for pictures as they awaited to do a quick television interview. "Go Charlybrown!" the partners, sporting black and yellow Uptowncharlybrown hats, yelled as they came on air. Shortly after 6 p.m, security guards cleared a lane through the middle of the paddock for the jockeys to find a way to their respective mounts. The popular Calvin Borel received plenty of cheers as he boarded **Dave in Dixie** (Dixie Union). **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) made the Belmont grandstand look small as he strutted his stuff once Ramon Dominguez got a leg up. Trainer Nick Zito carried his sports jacket on his shoulder as the big group slowly exited and track announcer Tom Durkin introduced the field for the 142nd running of the Test of the Champion. -SS

Workforce was electric in a seven-furlong Goodwood maiden in September, when he established a reputation as big as his considerable frame by beating the subsequent Tattersalls Timeform Million winner Oasis Dancer (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) by six lengths. Not risked in the end-of-term pattern-race tests thereafter, the homebred took time to come to himself in the spring and, despite attracting ante-post support for the G1 2000 Guineas, was left alone until the Dante.

His reappearance there raised question marks as he failed to find a rhythm behind the freewheeling Cape Blanco, grinding his way into the runner's-up spot with the bit pulled through his mouth. In the short space of time between that trial and this test, the Stoute stable made the necessary adjustments with a Lingfield race-course spin for extra experience and the fitting of a crossed noseband to aid the steering.

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Surrounded by the hoodoo that no beaten Dante runner had gone on to Epsom glory, Workforce was all professionalism as he put that statistic to bed in the owner/breeder's second colors, which were also carried to glory by Commander In Chief (GB) in 1993.

The big bay broke well, but was reined back to race in mid-pack as Seamus Heffernan set the necessary fractions on At First Sight, and Ryan Moore refused to panic as the front-runner stole a march running down to Tattenham Corner. Engaging top gear in early stretch, he showed an imperious burst to devour the long-time leader passing the quarter pole and carried his rider to a memorable Oaks-Derby double. "I got a clean run and I was happy where I was early," Moore said. "He traveled beautifully and, turning in, he quickened up exceptionally well. Although this ground is fast enough for him, he kept extending, and is a real good horse. This is a really special day. This is the most important race to me, so it's great to ride for the boss and Prince Khalid." That proud owner added, "I am delighted and this was special. He is a wonderful horse and we saw that here." Cont. p5

Heffernan added of At First Sight, "He was very genuine. I was second on the favorite [Fame and Glory (GB)] last year and on a wild outsider this time, so I suppose experience of the track helps and they let me

go. Aidan O'Brien trains him, so you know he is going to be good." There was no shortage of support beforehand for Godolphin's **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}), and the 9-2 second favorite ran on at the end, prompting Frankie Dettori to say, "He stayed on well, and I can see him being a St Leger horse." Aidan O'Brien was delighted with

the effort the shock runner-up and was forgiving of the run of the 9-4 favorite **Jan Vermeer (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who never threatened and stayed on into a distant fourth. "Jan Vermeer lost both his front shoes, but the second horse stays really well," he told *PA Sport*. "The winner looked exceptional."

ICE ICE BABY

Pascal Bary's name, whose name is synonymous with the recent history of the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, lines up a major contender for a sixth edition since 1994 in **Ice Blue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) today. Khalid Abdullah's homebred looked full of potential when recording a first black-type success in the G2 Prix Greffulhe at Saint-Cloud last time May 8, and that trial became a stepping stone for the subsequent Chantilly Classic heroes Suave Dancer, Peintre Celebre, Montjeu (Ire) and Dalakhani (Ire). "We've always been very keen on Ice Blue," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said yesterday. "He's come on and did a wonderful piece of work the other day, and we really like his draw. He's got to put his credentials on the line, but we hope he will have a big shot at it."

Preparing For the Storm...

This year's renewal could be a chaotic affair, with the largest field assembled in over a century and a half due to the abandoning of the safety limit this week, along with the forecast of a vicious thunderstorm. Ecurie Wildenstein's **Planteur (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) at least has a favorable inside draw on his side and took up pole position here when beating Godolphin's G1 Epsom Derby third **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Noailles at Longchamp last time Apr. 11. Trainer Elie Lellouche, who also saddles Frederic Bianco's Greffulhe runner-up **Handsome Devil (GB)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}), told *Racing Post*, "I have prepared Planteur especially for the Jockey Club, and said after he won the Noailles he would go straight for this race. He has had serious work on the Chantilly track and was second on it last year. We have a very nice draw and he is just as I want him. Handsome Devil is probably a little below this level, but is a consistent horse who deserves to take his chance." **Prix du Jockey-Club cont. p6-9**

Like Father, Like Son?

Gestus Ammerland's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Lope de Vega (Ire)** (Shamardal), who has already emulated his sire in winning the May 16 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, attempts to follow further in his steps by adding this prize to the tally. His impressive defeat of the G1 2000 Guineas runner-up Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) and slightly unlucky Czech raider **Shamalgalan (Fr)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in the one-mile Classic was accomplished despite a horror post position, and that will comfort connections as he exits from stall 20 here. "Andre Fabre, who has always thought a lot of the colt since the moment he joined him, is very happy with him," owner Dietrich Von Boetticher told the *Post*. "He then confirmed what we thought of him in the Poulains. It would be wonderful to go one better than Hurricane Run (Ire) in this race in 2005, when we were a bit disappointed. But I am not sure whether he will stay the distance and, unfortunately, his draw is as bad as it can be." Godolphin's **Simon de Montfort (Ire)** (King's Best) recorded a neck defeat of the supplemented **Pain Perdu (Fr)** (Vespone {Ire}) in the Apr. 25 G3 Prix La Force at Longchamp, where **Celtic Celeb (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) was back in fourth. He needs to improve off that form, but connections are hoping the colt has benefitted from his formative period with Andre Fabre. He is now with Mahmood Al Zarooni after the transfer, and that trainer is looking to build on a first Classic success in Germany's G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen and a narrow miss in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas with two of his stable runners. "Simon de Montfort has been working well and looks in good condition at the moment," Al Zarooni explained. "He goes to France in excellent form, and I am hoping to see him run a good race. He is an improving colt, but he is taking a step up in class. He is drawn in stall one, which is far from ideal in a 23-runner race around Chantilly, and he will need a huge amount of luck to win."

AN AMERICAN IN PARIS

They had just seen some of the world's most stunning monuments--the Arc de Triomphe, the Eiffel Tower, the Cathedral of Notre Dame and the Louvre--but none of those inspirational landmarks could compare to a single bay colt dappled with morning sunlight at Chantilly.

A virtual symphony of praise and joy arose from the family members of Runnymede Farm Chairman Catesby W. Clay on Saturday when they were reunited with their G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hopeful Dancing David (Danehill Dancer {Ire}).

"He is so beautiful," exclaimed Amelia Clay, who along with her twin sister, Kitty, is the youngest of the Catesby and Elizabeth "Biz" Clay's eight children, seven of which have traveled with their parents to see Dancing David race on Sunday. Most of the clan had not seen the colt in as long as about two years or more.

"He's turned into a fine, big horse," declared Runnymede Vice President and General Manager Martin O'Dowd in a reverent tone. "He's much more than I even thought he would be."

"It's like seeing your child again, all grown up, after he's been away for a year or two," said farm President Brutus Clay, who joined nearly everyone in the 13-person contingent surrounding the colt in snapping photos with everything from expensive cameras to small mobile phones. Catesby Clay recorded Dancing David's post-exercise bath with his iPhone. **Cont. p8**



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The colt held his head high, scanning the group and then the horizon beyond, gazing toward the racecourse adjoining the picturesque Chateau de Chantilly and the Grand Stables, where the 2100 meters of the French Derby awaits him and 22 rivals. Tall and svelte with an eye-catching physique, Dancing David seemed to enjoy the attention in the quiet stable area, striking several regal poses for his admirers and standing attentively

with the Clays for a group photo.

For anyone who has invested the time, money and passion it takes to breed Classic-caliber horses, this was a magic moment. And yet it almost didn't happen.

Running a bit late leaving their hotel, the Clays boarded two shuttle vans bound for Chantilly with hopes of seeing Dancing David canter on the racecourse.

But, as happens in many locales, the drivers were not familiar with the location of the stable area and did not know where to take their passengers, with the typical French and English language disconnect adding to the confusion.

When they finally pulled up to a gate behind the grandstand, some of the Clays disembarked and Brutus Clay looked through the gaps in a tall metal barrier and sighted a bay colt that he thought was familiar schooling in the paddock. Sprinting to get as close as they could, O'Dowd determined the colt was in fact Dancing David, but a moment of frustration mixed with desperation ensued when an entrance gate to the track proved to be locked.

When a racecourse custodian appeared with a key and unlocked the barrier, the Clays surged in with sighs of relief to get closer to the reason they have all journeyed to France. What they saw was a colt sizzling with energy but also serenely composed. It was the kind of exceptional look every owner hopes to see before a big race.

"This horse is as good as he's ever been," trainer Brian Meehan had related to O'Dowd the previous night as the Clays dined in Paris before a near midnight tour of the City of Light's most well known monuments. "I'm looking for a good performance."

Meehan dismissed any fears about Dancing David drawing post 21. "That suits us fine," he said. "We'll try to break well, find a position and make our run."

The Clays also are not concerned about the prerace odds. Some bookmakers, such as Ireland's Paddy Power, had Dancing David listed at 50-1 on Saturday.

"The reason we are all here is really about mom and dad," said daughter Mary Biz Blee, who paid tribute to her parents' steadfast operation of Runnymede, the oldest Thoroughbred nursery in Kentucky, through both hard times and good.

Dean Lockwood, who rides work for Meehan and who also transported Dancing David to France, steered the colt over to the paddock rail so that the Clays and O'Dowd could reach out and touch him. Just moments earlier, Lockwood had ridden Dancing David out to trot about three furlongs on the Chantilly course and then cantered back.

"He's done fantastic," Lockwood said of both the travel and Dancing David's brief acclimation to Chantilly. "He's gotten bigger and stronger since last year, and he's getting more mature and has more confidence in himself."

Lockwood smiled when asked how Dancing David has been training. "He's quite keen," reported the rider, whose previous assignments have included 2003 European champion sprinter Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert).

Dancing David also was accompanied to France by Peter Hawkins, who cares for the colt he fondly called "very boisterous," and traveling head lad Paul Burns.

In addition to all his supporters cheering him on, Dancing David will race with special advantages.



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Biz Clay plans to give a Sacred Heart badge to be placed somewhere in Dancing David's tack or in jockey Martin Dwyer's boots, to give protection to both horse and rider. It is notable that she also gave one to Smarty Jones's team before his two American classic victories.

Father Chris Clay, one of five sons in the family, left his job at *The Blood-Horse* to become a Roman Catholic priest, and rubbed holy water from Lourdes, France, on Dancing David's back and legs while giving a blessing and asking for divine protection for the colt.

In a moving prayer that brought tears to the eyes of at least one spectator, Father Chris asked that God "give him the race of his life tomorrow" and "keep him sound in bone" and "strong of heart."

While Father Chris absolutely deflects any "credit" and never prays for victory (and indeed also offered blessings and prayers for other competitors), his recent connection with racehorse blessings is extraordinary. After a parishioner was involved with a blessing for Mine That Bird (Birdstone) before the gelding won the 2009 GI Kentucky Derby, Father Chris this year blessed Super Saver (Maria's Mon) and GI Kentucky Oaks winner Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision).

With an impish smile, Father Chris also reported that he told his congregation this year that Super Saver was the horse to watch in the Derby.

"He was just so beautiful," Father Chris recalled of the day he met Super Saver at trainer Todd Pletcher's Churchill Downs barn. He also blessed Pletcher's other runners and noted that during the occasion, Pletcher read scripture that involved honoring one's parents. Following the Derby win, the trainer declared his gratitude to his parents and said he was so proud to win the race while both could enjoy the feat with him.

Dancing David received more holy water, this time on his nose, from Amelia Clay, a resident of San Francisco who occasionally does volunteer work at Lourdes, a site known around the world as a place of healing and miracles. He bowed his head down for her to gently touch his face.

"I'm so glad we were able to keep Dancing David," she said afterward, elated by the moment.

Clearly, the disappointment experienced when Dancing David was listed as RNA at \$475,000 when offered by Runnymede at the 2008 Keeneland September yearling sale has been transformed into what could be a once in a lifetime experience, one that already--regardless of the race outcome--has brought most of a family to Europe on an adventure like none they had ever previously shared.

"You just never know," Brutus Clay said.

Following the success of Workforce (GB) (King's Best) in the G1 Epsom Derby earlier in the day, Proviso completed a big double for owner/breeder Juddmonte Farm with her second straight victory at the top level. The bay was a Group 3 winner in France for trainer Andre Fabre and, sent to the U.S., crossed the line first in the Oct. 11 GI Juddmonte Spinster S. on Keeneland's Polytrack, but her number was taken down and placed second. Fourth in GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic on the Santa Anita Pro-Ride Nov. 6, she was transferred to Bill Mott following the death of Bobby Frankel. Proviso rallied for the runner-up spot going seven furlongs in the GI Santa Monica H. on Santa Anita's main track Jan. 31, then touched off former Frankel inmate Fluke (Brz) (Wild Event) to secure the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile H. on the Arcadia lawn Mar. 6. Mike Smith was aboard for the first time that day, and was back in the irons once more here. Smith kept her in the clear in second as Speak Easy Gal (West Acre) set tepid splits of :24.54 and :48.21 over the firm going. The pair made their move in front of the stands, and Proviso had a narrow advantage at the stretch call. Phola, well back in the early stages, came running late, but the Juddmonte colorbearer had enough left and hit the wire safely in front. "She's probably better when she's running at a target," Smith opined. "The race came up light on the speed part. Bill told me not to change anything; that we were going to be laying second, and to go from there." Mott indicated that the GI Diana S. at Saratoga July 31 would be Proviso's next goal. Winchester came roaring up the center of the course to deny his more celebrated stablemate and defending champion Gio Ponti. The Firestone's homebred began his career for trainer Dermot Weld in Ireland, and announced himself on these shores with a victory in the 2008 GI Secretariat S. However, he faltered in his next two tries that season, finishing off the board in both the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Hollywood Turf Cup, and was turned over to Christophe Clement. Sixth in his first start for the French-born conditioner in a Saratoga heat, the bay was runner-up in both the GII Bowling Green H. and GIII Sycamore S., and closed out the year with a third in the GII W.L. McKnight H. at Calder Dec. 26. He was second in the GII MacDiarmida H. Feb. 28 at Gulfstream, but could only manage fourth as the choice in the GIII Pan American H. at the same track Mar. 27. Clement prescribed a class drop and Winchester got the job done as the 2-5 chalk in a 12-furlong money allowance at Keeneland Apr. 21. He was at the other end of the betting this time, though. The 21-1 shot lingered at the back of the pack as Florida invader Jet Propulsion (Double Honor) showed the way through six furlongs in 1:12.98. Jockey Cornelio Velasquez opted for the overland trip on the far turn as the field began to bunch up, and that proved the right call. With Gio Ponti threading his way through inside, Winchester had clear sailing while six wide and flashed under the wire in front of the favorite. "He ran a great race, and I am delighted," said Clement. "Gio Ponti was pinned inside. I'm very happy with the two horses. The two horses worked remarkably together last Sunday. She left town and officially broke her maiden at Fair Grounds Feb. 20, then finished a stubborn second to Quiet Temper (Quiet American) in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 26. She never flashed her usual early foot in the Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Apr. 30 and wound up finishing 11th at 38-1. Cont. p11

A new jockey, a change of running style and plenty of added ground has change Acclamation into a new horse, it seems. The four-year-old Cal-bred hadn't won in 11 starts before being stretched out to 12 furlongs in his latest, the GII Jim Murray H. at Hollywood May 15. Jockey Christian Santiago Reyes, aboard for the first time, let Acclamation roll on the front end, and after leading by as much as 10 lengths, the pair cruised home to a dominating first black-type win. At 14-1 that day but bet down to 3-1 here, Acclamation bounded out to lead by three or four lengths, hit the quarter pole with a full head of steam and held well. "I rode him the same way I did last time," said Santiago Reyes. "The way the race came up, there wasn't much speed, so I hustled him out of the gate. He's just a good horse and he's real sharp right now." Said trainer Don Warren, "We didn't have a lot of strategy to go ahead and lead the way. I told him that he runs so well on the turn that when you get to the middle of the [far turn], kick and go on. Make a run for it right there." He added, "We'll see how he comes out of this race. There is the GII Sunset H. on the last day of the meet [July 18]." Before his Jim Murray win, Acclamation had been longer than nine furlongs only once, and while he'd been on the lead three or four times, had never enjoyed daylight advantage on the front. The win was the first in a Grade I for Acclamation, Warren and Santiago Reyes.

Bribon captured the 2009 GI Met Mile for owner Marc Keller and trainer Robert Ribaud, and was sold privately to Derrick Smith following his narrow defeat in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 28. Smith was looking for a horse to run in the Sandy Lane Barbados Gold Cup, and Bribon nearly got the job done in that Mar. 6 test when second at the peculiarly configured Garrison Savannah track ([video](#)). The chestnut came back to finish fifth at 4-5 when attempting to defend his title in the GIII Westchester H. over this strip Apr. 30, and trainer Todd Pletcher opted against another tilt at the Met Mile--he had a nice colt named Quality Road (Elusive Quality) all set to go--and decided to shorten the seven-year-old up for this contest. Unhurried early as stablemate Checklist dashed through a :45.60 half while shadowed by Formidable (Sky Mesa), Bribon began to rev his engine on the outside. He came four wide into the lane, moved by the pacesetters and outfinished Snapshot for another graded trophy. "I thought with Quality Road going to the Met Mile, it could open a lot of options for Bribon," Pletcher confirmed. "He's just a very versatile horse." The conditioner added, "I thought Checklist ran huge. I think the track may not be real speed-favoring. The [GI Alfred G.] Vanderbilt [H. Aug. 8 at Saratoga] is a possibility for both [Checklist and Bribon]; we'll play it by ear." Trainer John Sadler, who, like Hollendorfer, is seeking his first Hollywood Oaks win.

This could provide some compensation for the demoted G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches first-past-the-post **Lilaside**, who had an unbeaten record taken away from her by the Longchamp stewards after a head defeat of Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy) in that May 16 mile Classic. Previously, she had beaten the subsequent G3 Prix Vanteaux scorer Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune) in the Listed Prix la Camargo at Saint-Cloud Apr. 1 and sets the standard. **Joanna**, who had the subsequent G3 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) winner Evading Tempete (GB) (Dubai Destination) and Special Duty behind when capturing the G3 Prix Imprudence over seven furlongs at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 8, may not quite have seen out this trip when fourth--before being promoted to third--in the Pouliches last time, but connections are keen to firm up that evidence here. 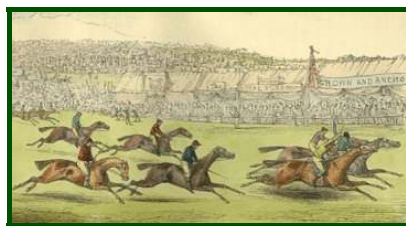

Trainer David Lanigan is looking at the G1 Irish Oaks for **Meeznah** (Dynaformer) following her second-place finish in Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks. Beaten a neck by **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) in the mile-and-a-half Classic, Saif Ali and Saeed Altayer's filly will bid to go one better in the July 18 Curragh equivalent. "She ran a blinder and is a filly to look forward to for the rest of the year," Lanigan said. "We needed the experience, which we were minus going into the Oaks. I would have loved to have to have run her in a maiden and then gone for one of the trials. I think she will improve for the experience and [jockey] Ted [Durcan] said afterwards that she was wandering around a little bit just before the end as she heard the crowd. But she showed that she stays every inch of the trip and it was nice to see that little turn of foot towards the end. We'll discuss it with the owners, but my initial thoughts are that she'd go straight to the Irish Oaks next."

Aviate to Drop in Trip...

Khalid Abdullah's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe reflected on the flops of the operation's G1 Epsom Oaks duo of **Aviate (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) and ♀ **"TDN Rising Star" Timepiece (GB)** (Zamindar) yesterday. While Aviate was sent off the 7-2 favorite, she could only finish seventh. Her stable companion finished two places behind. "We were disappointed with them both and Aviate seemed not to stay, while Timepiece seemed not to handle the track at all," Grimthorpe said. "They are both fine this morning and we'll see how they are, but with Aviate we'll probably plan at a mile-and-a-quarter campaign and we'll see if we can get Timepiece on the right foot again. Maybe a flat galloping track and softer ground will help, but we'll look at everything."

What do you think is the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today and, if voted to the Breeders' Cup board, how would you propose this issue be solved?

Integrity and uniform medication rules are racing's best chance to bring our sport back to prominence.

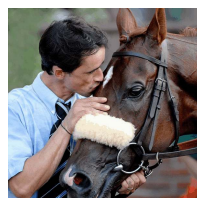
Without integrity and a level playing field, new people are not going to invest in our business or participate as spectators. The Breeders' Cup is the premier U.S. event, and it can bring the rest of racing to the table. With a racing series to the Breeders' Cup that insists that states and race-tracks ensure specific rules on integrity and medication for entire meets to be able to participate in that series changes the perception of our sport.

The rules and the penalties for breaking those rules need to be consistent and harsh.

Other sports, such as baseball, football and basketball, are cleaning house and getting wrongdoers out of their sport. If we follow suit, it will be amazing the people we can attract to racing. If perception is reality, the reality of our sport and the perception is that some people cheat. Most people have integrity and do not want to participate in a business where others are taking advantage of them.

If elected to the Breeders' Cup Board, I will always strive to make Breeders' Cup and the participants whose nomination fees pay for and who have their hard-earned money invested in racing have a level playing field to enjoy the sport, and that we treat our athletes and participants with compassion and integrity.

Joe Seitz:

In my opinion, the biggest issue facing the Breeders' Cup today is the general perception that the average American has of racing. If you venture out of central Kentucky, most people in this country couldn't tell you what the Breeders' Cup actually entails. The Kentucky Derby has successfully branded itself as a sporting tradition that has stood the test of time. Although it would be difficult to match the impact of the Derby, the Breeders' Cup has the potential to increase its market share in the sports world.

Having traveled to various race meetings throughout the world over the past few years, I have had the pleasure of experiencing some fantastic festivals of racing.

Countries like England, Ireland, France, Australia and Argentina have managed to make racing mainstream. Racetracks are packed in those countries; they become the place to socialize and "be seen." Celebrities consistently attend the races. Those racing jurisdictions have found a way to bridge the gap between entertainment and gambling. A good example of this is "Newmarket Nights"

in England, which take place in the evenings during the elite three-day July Cup meeting at Newmarket. The track is busting at the seams during the day and then it transforms into a concert hall/nightclub at night--that's about as mainstream as you can get. Through media and technology, they have found a way to modernize the racing product while preserving the beauty of the event. The core product is the same everywhere (a group of horses and a finish line); how it is packaged makes all the difference.

I believe the Breeders' Cup is the perfect entity to help bring racing into the mainstream again. Even though it is the World Championship for Thoroughbreds, not many people outside of the industry really pay attention to that. Having witnessed successful racing venues throughout the world, I feel that, if elected, I could offer a fresh perspective on attracting new fans and help make racing more appealing to the average American.

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NYC OTB CHAIRMAN RESIGNS Meyer "Sandy" Frucher, chairman of the embattled and bankrupt New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation, has resigned. Frucher tendered his immediate resignation in a letter to New York Gov. David Patterson Friday. In the letter, Frucher, who had been appointed by Patterson just about a year ago, said that in his initial assessment of NYC OTB he concluded the operation was "insolvent," and that "the business model was antiquated and overly labor intensive." He subsequently devised a plan that called for the state to sell \$250-300 million in municipal bonds to help fund the cash-strapped organization, a 60-65 percent reduction in the NYC OTB workforce, the closing 60 percent of the branches, capital investment for five new flagship branches, and the installation of betting terminals at bars and restaurants in New York City. Frucher said the inability to secure the bonds precluded the implementation of his plan, and said the decision by the State Racing and Wagering Board to cut off the signal from out-of-state tracks for a time in May also "complicated" the scenario. NYC OTB filed for bankruptcy last December, and twice this year threatened to shut down the city's parlors. The NYC OTB currently owes the New York Racing Association \$17 million.

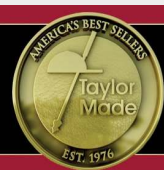

Lone Star Quarantine Lifted Due to Lab Error:

Lone Star Park announced Friday that the stables of three trainers at the track had been quarantined after positive tests for equine piroplasmiasis, but rescinded it 24 hours later because of a mix-up at the testing laboratory. "I was informed by the Texas Racing Commission early [Saturday] morning that the quarantine on the three affected trainers had been lifted," explained Lone Star Park President and General Manager Drew Shubeck. "Apparently, there had been an error made at the lab, and the original tests were actually negative." The three trainers whose charges tested positive for the tick-borne disease were Bret Calhoun, Kevin Favre and Brian House. Calhoun, the meet's leading trainer, had been forced to scratch six horses from Friday's card at Lone Star. "It is unfortunate that several horses had to be scratched from racing at Lone Star Park on Friday night that resulted in economic losses for the racetrack, horsemen and jockeys, but we're relieved that it has been corrected," added Shubeck. "Since we opened our barn area for this meet, we have had procedures in place to make sure that no horses with equine piroplasmiasis or ticks are being allowed into the backstretch at Lone Star Park, and we will continue those throughout the rest of the meet."

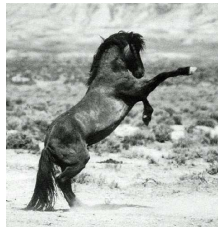

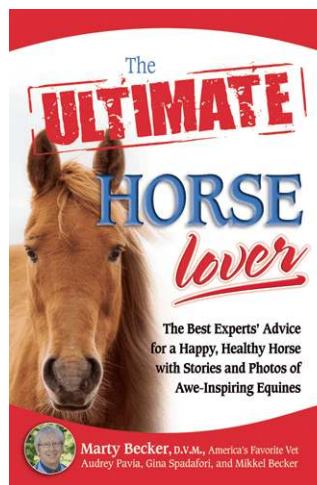
