THE BUZZ AT DEAUVILLE

A buzz returned to the Elie de Brignac sales complex in Deauville Saturday, with buyers from around the world jumping into action after many--in large measure--hung back during the opening select session of the Arqana select yearling sale.

Average price of €122,719 was up about one percent from last year's €121,513 and the median held steady at €100,000, marking a huge improvement following the opening day's declines in all major categories.

"It was a much livelier day than yesterday," said Arqana Managing Director Olivier Delloye. "Yesterday, there was more of a wait-and-see attitude. [On Saturday], there was a lot more activ-

ity."

Buyers crowded into the two main bidding areas, and tickets eventually were signed by agents representing interests in Japan, Qatar and Australia, in addition to a variety of countries across Europe.

For the session, 64 yearlings were sold from 91 offered for a buy-back rate of 29.7 percent, just slightly up from 2009's rate of 27.6 percent. Aggregate reached €7,854,000 (pending possible additional private sales), compared to €9,235,000 last year when more horses were offered (105) and sold (76).

A powerful chestnut filly by Darley's first-year sire Teofilo (Ire) sparked a bid of €400,000 from Sir Robert Ogden to top the session.

"She's a very nice filly," Ogden said while shaking hands with Henri Bozo, stud manager for Lucien Urano's Ecurie des Monceaux, which consigned and bred the session-topper.

"She has a wonderful pedigree, and she's a nice moving filly," added Barry Simpson, Ogden's racing manager, of the half-sister to 2004 G1 French Derby winner Blue Canari (Fr) (Acatenango {Ger}) and multiple stakes winner Blue Ksar (Fr) (Anabaa). "We picked her out two or three days ago."

Simpson said the price was not an issue. "We never talk about money. You're either in or you're out, and we were in." **Cont. p8**

GOLDEN GIRL

Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), arguably the best of an illustrious line of runners to grace the Wertheimer silks, seeks her fifth straight tally at the highest level in today's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay at Deauville. Her domination of her own sex--post-Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar)--was hammered home here last time when she dismissed impressive G1 Falmouth S. winner Music Show (Ire) (Noverre) by three lengths in the Aug. 1 G1 Prix Rothschild without being asked to fully stretch by Olivier Peslier. That was her fourth outing at her beloved seaside venue and her fourth victory, all at Group 1 level. She sets a lofty standard in this race after her display 12 months ago in which she defeated subsequent G1 Prix du Moulin winner Aqlaam (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) by six lengths with a further five back to the 2009 G1 Lockinge S. hero Virtual (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). Trainer Freddy Head has the enviable task of keeping the momentum rolling as she chases an 11th triumph in this sphere. "I was very impressed last time and I think she's as well as she's ever been," he said. "She is extraordinary and is one of the best I've seen and what makes her special is that she runs up to her best all the time. Miesque was a great filly and it's very difficult to compare, but don't forget Goldikova fell upon Zarkava in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane and without her might have won and therefore been in a class of her own. She's an easier horse to train and ride than Miesque." **Cont. p10-11**

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WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

Florida invaders have done well in juvenile stakes races at Saratoga over the past few years, with D' Funnybone (D'wildcat) taking last year's GII Saratoga Special S. in authoritative fashion and Vineyard Haven (Lido Palace {Chi}) winning the 2008 GI Hopeful S. **Miss Sarah Brown** makes her first start for fresh connections off a 1 1/4-length maiden-breaking bow at Calder May 15. New conditioner John Terranova won last term's GI Alcibiades S. at Keeneland with Negligee (Northern Afleet) in her first start after a private purchase. **Because I Like It** remains the property of Sabine Stable, but is now under the tutelage of Steven Standridge, who wins at a 21-percent clip with new acquisitions. The chestnut followed a five-length first-asking maiden breaker with a second, beaten only a half-length, behind Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course) in the JJ's Dream S. at Calder July 10. That rival repeated last Saturday in the Desert Vixen S. **Position Limit** turned in a professional and eye-catching debut at Belmont July 14.

Telling proved that his upset victory in last year's Sword Dancer at 33-1 wasn't a fluke with a successful title defense. Winless in five subsequent trips to post, Telling entered off a fifth-place finish in the GIII Louisville H. at Churchill Downs May 22 and a decent sixth in Monmouth's GI United Nations S. July 3. Placed in midpack through fractions of :24.28 and :48.27, jockey Garrett Gomez began to get busy on the turn for home, guided his charge through an inviting opening along the inside in the stretch and dashed away late. Trainer Steve Hobby said, "It's tremendous to win again--it's something we had aimed at from the last time, and to make it work a year later is really amazing." Gomez added, "He's just one of those horses that stays on really well going a mile and a half. It's a real pleasure for me to win a race for Steve Hobby because the first recognized race I ever rode was for his dad." The GI Santa Anita Derby hero appears to have a very bright future on grass after setting a new course record here. Favored in his infield debut, the chestnut was haunted by Macias (Purge) through a half mile in :45.81, but had plenty left in the tank. He began to draw clear on the turn for home, opened up a double-digit lead in the stretch and had it wrapped up as Kid Edward came running late. "He's a very good horse --a little unlucky in a couple of races, and things didn't go right for him in Kentucky, but he's one of the best three-year-olds around," trainer John Sadler offered. "This was a very fast race today. We'll see how he comes out of it before we go forward with him. We'll have a lot of choices." Jockey Joel Rosario added, "John [Sadler] doesn't want me to fight him. We've got to let him do what he does. He broke so sharp and he just wanted to go--so I let him go. I knew we were going fast, but he's such a good horse that he can do that. When we turned for home, I opened up with him. I didn't want to be caught. He just kept on going and he wasn't that tired at the end." Sidney's Candy, 17th in the GI Kentucky Derby, entered off a narrow defeat as the 1-5 chalk in the GII Swaps S. at Hollywood July 17. Victorious in last semester's G3 Solario S. and Goffs Million, Shakespearean entered winter quarters off the back of a sixth in October's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster. He opened this campaign with a win in the June 4 Listed Surrey S. at Epsom, but slipped off the board when sixth in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot June 16 and when fifth in the G3 Prix Messidor at Maisons-Laffitte last time July 17. Afforded an easy lead from the outset here, Shakespearean came under pressure as the pack threatened at the quarter-mile marker, but jockey Frankie Dettori kept enough reserves in the tank and rode out his mount in the closing stages to register an ultimately cozy success. "When I went through the form [of the race], there didn't seem to be a legitimate frontrunner, so I was able to dominate," claimed Dettori. "Even so, he still had to have the legs to get to the line in that ground. He proved a very good partner and he's got big feet so that helped." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "The ground suited him, and it was a good effort. [Royal] Ascot might have come a bit quick for him after his run at Epsom the time before. Peinture Rare finished runner-up in last year's G3 Prix Minerve at this track and G2 Prix de Royallieu at Longchamp, but could manage only fifth in an Apr. 9 Saint-Cloud conditions heat on seasonal return. She slipped to eighth in the G3 Prix Allez France at Chantilly last time May 3 and skipped through the mud here to register a career high in determined fashion. The eventual winner was positioned second going past the judge first time and slotted into third, in the wake of leader Burn the Breeze, going down the backstraight. Nudged along off the home turn, she took a slender advantage into the final eighth and was ridden out in the closing stages as the game pacesetter Burn the Breeze lost second on the line to the wide bid of High Heeled. "Peinture Rare ran below par twice this year because she didn't run over her correct trip, which is at least 2400 meters," admitted trainer Elie Lellouche. "I also think the soft ground helped her here and we will now go for the [G1] Prix Vermeille [at Longchamp Sept. 12] where we shall hope for the best." Sans Frontieres breathed new life into his career with a fluent success from the subsequent G3 Glorious S. winner Redwood (GB) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Newmarket's G2 Princess of Wales's S. last time July 8 and defied a resulting penalty here to continue the upward trend. Partnered by Johnny Murtagh for the first time since finding only the high-class Delegator (GB) (Dansili {GB}) too strong in last year's G3 Craven S. on Newmarket's Rowley Mile, the chestnut traveled strongly early in the slipstream of the leader Kite Wood (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who was a hot favorite to land consecutive renewals. As that rival started to tread water in early stretch, Sans Frontieres loomed to Laaheb and, after easing past with over two furlongs remaining, asserted despite drifting right and giving the runner-up an inconsequential bump. "Going this distance has helped him, as he was too keen the last time I rode him and did too much on the bridle," his rider explained. "He's settled well now and is more professional, but when he got to the front, he idled and pricked his ears looking at the crowd. He's a good horse with a good engine and got through the ground well, although I think he'd like better ground." Trainer Jeremy Nosedá echoed that sentiment. "I was very worried about the ground, as my own feeling was that he wouldn't go on it, but we had the G1 Irish St Leger [at The Curragh Sept. 11] on our minds and the chances are it will be soft there so we had to find out today," he added. "He is better on faster ground and if all goes well in the Irish Leger, he'll have a tilt at the Melbourne Cup [at Flemington Nov. 2]. He is genuine and straightforward and is coming together now, so it looks like he'll get to where we want him to be."

Barry Simpson also said that while buying offspring by young stallions is taking a chance, the filly out of the Trempolino mare Delicieuse Lady (GB), who was a multiple winner in Scandinavia, was such a strong individual that if she was by "a proven sire, she would have brought a lot more."

A decision on which of Ogden's several trainers would be given the filly will be made after she is evaluated. "I don't think there would be any who wouldn't want to train her," Simpson quipped.

Bozo said he was confident the filly would sell well and added that he was pleased with the price.

"Since day one she's been a standout with a great attitude; she's never had any problems at all," he said, adding that the farm's overall consignment to Deauville fared well and provided a reward for Urano, who continues to invest. The owner purchased a filly by Motivator (GB) on Saturday and a Teofilo filly during the opening session as racehorses and long-term broodmare prospects, he said.

Ferguson Back to Work...

A day after he had been relatively missing in action during the bidding, John Ferguson stepped into the pavilion to bid €360,000--second highest price of the day--for a chestnut colt by young Darley sire Shamardal consigned by Haras des Granges. The price was higher than any of the amounts Ferguson had paid for three yearlings during the first session, which was viewed as holding more horsepower by pedigree, but it marked his only acquisition of the day.

"The great thing about Shamardals is that they are so genuine--they are doers," Ferguson said after signing the ticket for Dubai Ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum, who has bypassed the Arqana sale and stayed in the United Arab Emirates during the beginning of the Islamic holy month of Ramadan. Ferguson pointed out that the Shamardal colt, which he described as a "great individual," was also attractive because his 3/4-brother Shamalgan (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) finished third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas). The Shamardal colt's dam, Genevale (Fr) (Unfuwain), is a half-sister to American Grade II winners Jaunatxo (Lyphard's Wish {Fr}) and Iron Deputy (Silver Deputy). **Cont. p9**

Overall, Ferguson said he is not surprised by the Deauville market, which he compared to conditions at the recent Fasig-Tipton Saratoga select yearling sale just as Arqana officials did at the end of the first session. Buyers at both boutique auctions have been restrained, and, with fewer horses offered, numbers in some categories have fallen significantly. Arqana still has two more days of selling, albeit with less international pedigrees and more horses that will appeal to the domestic French market.

"At the end of the day, it has to be realistic," Ferguson said of the market, noting that stud fees have been adjusted as the market has fallen in the global economic turmoil and that stud managers will have to re-examine fees again after this year's yearling sales season ends.

"I can't see anything different," he said when asked whether the upcoming Keeneland September and Tattersalls October yearling sales, the biggest markets in the United States and Europe, respectively, will follow what has happened at Saratoga and Deauville. "But I have to say when a good horse goes into the ring, they make decent money," he added. "It's not all doom and gloom."

For buyers, particularly, there have been opportunities as economic woes continue to push a downward pressure on the market. Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who was the most active buyer in the first session, struck again early in the second session, landing a Monsoon (Ger) filly out of the unraced Sadler's Wells mare Woman Secret (Ire), a half-sister to European champion Rumpelstiltskin (Ire) (Danehill). Gordon-Watson's bid of €350,000 on behalf of an undisclosed client proved to be the third highest of the day. He pointed out the filly's pedigree is sterling, with international champion Miesque (Nureyev) as the third dam, and said he believed he would have to pay more to obtain her.

Buyers From Near and Not-So Near...

On the positive side for sellers and the sale company, there was a "great diversity" of buyers during the second session, according to Arqana President Eric Hoyer, including the Umm Qarn Farm of Sheikh Abdullah bin Khalifa al-Thani of the ruling family of Qatar. Umm Qarn acquired an Oasis Dream (GB) filly from the female family of Pivotal (GB)'s sire Polar Falcon for €130,000 with plans to eventually race her in France, Hoyer said. With Qatar holding a long-term sponsorship of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, the al-Thanis and their associates could be expected to become more involved in French racing.

British-based agent Michael Goodbody was among other buyers with international connections who were smiling with delight over the prices.

Within about the first half-hour, Goodbody had secured two well-bred colts by Montjeu (Ire) and Danehill Dancer (Ire) for an Australian client who currently races in the United States, England and Australia and who plans to expand into French racing.

"Both these colts were very good value as individuals and they have stallions' pedigrees," Goodbody said.

Consigned by Haras des Sablonnets, the Montjeu colt is out of French listed stakes winner Dancing Lady (Fr) (Dansili {GB}), who is a half-sister to multiple American stakes winner Private Banking (Anabaa). Goodbody secured him on a bid of €300,000. The Danehill Dancer colt, acquired for €200,000 from the Coulonces Consignment of Anna and Etienne Drion, is the first foal of the Sadler's Wells mare Beyond Belief (Ire), who is a half-sister to Irish 2000 Guineas runner-up Adjareli (Nishapour {Fr}) and the dam of G2 South African Oaks winner Front House (Sadler's Wells).

Just before the session ended, Sylvain Vidal paid €300,000 for a filly by Anabaa out of group stakes-placed The Wise Lady (Fr) (Ganges) for Gerard-Augustin Normand, who raced 2009 French Derby winner Le Havre (Ire).

Several Japanese buyers were active, including Koji Maeda, who purchased two on Saturday, paying €120,000 for a colt by Invincible Spirit (Ire) out of the Distant View mare New Largue; and €90,000 for a Dalakhani (Ire) colt out of the Desert Prince (Ire) mare Oliena (Ire). Big Red Farm owner Shigeyuki Okada paid €80,000 for a Teofilo (Ire) half-sister to French G1 winner Marbye (Ire), who is now a broodmare for Teruya Yoshida in Japan. Yoshida himself was active on the first day of the sale, acquiring a Lawman (Fr) filly from the female family of Irish Derby winner Fame and Glory (GB) for €180,000 and a King's Best colt, who is a half-sister to G1 winner Alfred Nobel (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and from the family of champion New Approach (Ire).

Also buying was American-based, but French-born trainer Patrick Biancone, who said he was invited to the sale by Hoyer. During the first session, Biancone signed the €130,000 ticket for a Danehill Dancer (Ire) filly out of Florida Oaks winner Sneaky Quiet (Seeking the Gold) on behalf of client Richard Giacomelli.

"I am looking for fillies for him because he likes to breed and race. She was a really good filly," Biancone said. "I will try to buy more."

By the Numbers...

Despite the uptick in activity during the second session, the opening-day's declines severely depressed the cumulative results for the first two days compared to 2009. Fewer horses offered and sold also have impacted the aggregate, which stands at €18,329,000 compared to €27,650,000, a drop of 33.7 percent. Average price of 147,815 is down 18.2 percent and the median of €112,000 is down by 20 percent from last year's €140,000.

Another factor that could have contributed to the opening session declines is that only 25 percent of the horses on that day were eligible for owners' premiums in France as French-breds. On the second day, 60 percent of the catalogued horses were eligible for the bonuses.

In past years, when major international players were more active at the top end of the market, yearlings with outstanding pedigrees bred in other countries still sold well at Deauville, but current conditions have restrained domestic buyers from seeking these yearlings at the same time major international owners have cut back in spending, Delloye said.

The French premiums are huge--a juvenile earns an extra 75 premium on top of regular prizemoney, and French purses are the best in Europe; a three-year-old earns an extra 63 percent, and four-year-olds and older earn 45 percent.

Hoyeau said Arqana officials are going to study the sale results and contemplate possibly adjusting the Deauville format so that horses with international pedigrees could be more mixed in the catalogue with French-breds.

"The question is to find a format that matches the market and is comfortable for buyers," Hoyeau said.

Tough Sledding for Consignors...

Sellers also are facing the same kinds of challenging issues.

"It has been sticky going," said Michel Zerolo, co-owner of major consignor Haras du Capucines, who offered a number of horses with international pedigrees not eligible for the French premiums, including a handsome American-bred Bernardini colt out of a half-sister to Group 1 winner and sire Peintre Celebre who was not sold on a final bid of €250,000 on the first day.

Zerolo said he "had to tug on the sleeves" of some of his contacts to get a lovely American-bred daughter of Empire Maker out of stakes winner Mysterious Lina (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) sold on the second day. French trainer Jean-Claude Rouget signed the ticket at €85,000, "just barely making the stud fee," Zerolo noted.

"We're still definitely in a market of oversupply," he said. "You have more product than there is appetite for."

Marc de Chambure, owner of leading consignor Haras d'Etreham, said he was glad to see that the second session was more robust than the first session, on which a Galileo (Ire) filly from his consignment topped all sales on a private transaction by agent Charlie Gordon-Watson for €600,000.

However, another filly Haras d'Etreham offered with high expectations, a daughter of Green Desert out of a stakes-winning half-sister to this year's French Derby winner Lope de Vega (Ire) (Shamardal), was led out unsold on a bid of €520,000.

The Green Desert filly will be retained by her owner, who is based in Monaco, and is not upset with the sale result, de Chambure said.

"There is no harm in keeping her," he said. "She will always have value."

Standing in Goldikova's way is the formidable **Paco Boy**, who went so close to getting the better of her in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last time June 15. There was a neck between them on the famed Heath, but Head sees room for even more improvement from his special mare. "At Ascot, she had a very tough race, and I wondered how she would come out of it, but she showed that she was still at her best. It's going to be a different race, it's going to be tough to beat Paco Boy because there will be fewer runners so he will be closer than last time. The only thing is that we are going to be in our garden and he will have to come here. She had to travel to England then and Ascot is a very tough mile, so I think at the end she got a bit tired but she loves it here. Where she runs next all depends on Sunday." Paco Boy was arguably unlucky when third behind her--before subsequently being disqualified for a banned substance--on their previous encounter in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp two years ago, but has made giant strides since and was denied a fourth win at this level at the Royal meeting.

Paco Boy was held back from delivering his potent run by traffic in the Queen Anne and his trainer is hoping for a trouble-free trip in this rematch. "Goldikova got first run on us in the Queen Anne Stakes at Royal Ascot and Hughesie thinks that had he got out of his hole three strides earlier they might have won," he commented. "However, we all realise that Goldikova is a phenomenal mare and she is unbeaten in four races around Deauville and produced what Freddie Head believes was the best performance of her career in this race last year, so we know how tough it will be trying to turn the form around over there. But this race has been one of the prime targets for Paco Boy this year and he has had a nice break since Ascot. We've got a neck to find and we have to do the travelling this time, but when he last went to France he bolted up in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp two years ago so playing away is not a problem for him." This year's shock G1 2000 Guineas hero **Makfi** faces a hard task returning from a layoff since a disappointing no-show in the G1 St. James's Palace S. on the same day that Goldikova and Paco Boy were doing battle at Royal Ascot, but trainer Mikel Delzangles would not chance his talented performer on a whim. Criquelette Head-Maarek puts forward the highly progressive ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Fuisse**. Late to fulfil his potential, the Head homebred comes here on the back of a trio of wins in Longchamp's Listed Prix de Montretout May 6, Chantilly's G3 Prix du Chemin de Fer du Nord June 13 and and Maisons-Laffitte's G3 Prix Messidor July 17.

Last year's winner **Wiener Walzer** returns in a bid to get off the mark for the first time as a four-year-old. He has worked well since, particularly his last piece of work, which went very well. It looks like a tough race but hopefully we will see another good run from him." **Zazou** proved his stamina when annexing the G2 Oppenheim-Union-Rennen here June 13 and when runner-up in the latest renewal of the Deutsches Derby at Hamburg on his latest outing July 18.

He added a highly competitive 10-furlong Newmarket handicap July 8 to his success in Saint-Cloud's 2009 G3 Prix Thomas Bryon, but was only eighth over a mile and a half in Goodwood's G3 Gordon S. when last seen July 27. **Mellon Martini** captured the Listed Prix Matchem at Saint-Cloud June 4 before dead-heating for second with **Wealthy** behind Emerald Commander (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}) in the July 3 G3 Prix Daphnis at Longchamp.

Owner/breeder/trainer Bart Evans sends out speedster **Wasted Tears**, who has won her last six races by narrow margins. She defeated champion turf mare Forever Together (Belong to Me) two-back in the GII Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland Apr. 10, and while that rival has not won in quite some time, she is still very competitive in top-level races. The five-year-old held on by a neck last out in the GIII Ouija Board Distaff H. May 31 and has not been seen since. **Gozzip Girl** will make her first start for Florida-based trainer Marty Wolfson, who does extremely well with new stock. The four-year-old was purchased privately by Myron Miller. The \$800,000 earner was ultra-impressive last year, highlighting her sophomore campaign with an emphatic 3 1/4-length win in the GI American Oaks at Hollywood in July. She has been extremely unlucky since, running into soft ground and extreme traffic trouble when fourth in the GI Garden City H. at Belmont Sept. 12, testing positive for a banned tranquilizer when third and placed last of seven in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland last October and losing her rider at the start in this year's GII New York S. at Belmont June 19. She was fourth last time in the GIII Robert G. Dick Memorial S. at Delaware July 17 in her final start for Tom Albertrani. **Gotta Have Her** is the picture of consistency, hitting the board in 11 of her last 12 starts. She took the GII Royal Heroine Mile at Hollywood July 3, and was second in this race last year when it was a Grade I.

homebred rebounded from an eighth-place finish in the GI Preakness S. with a respectable fourth in the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 1. "We were looking for around 1:01," trainer Todd Pletcher revealed. "Next time, we'll put him in company to make sure he keeps his interest down the lane. He was a little bit idle from the eighth pole to the wire, but he responded with a decent gallop out. I'm pleased with the way he's been training since the Haskell and we feel like he's going to make a move forward." Gainesway Farm's and Martin Cherry's **Afleet Express** (Afleet Alex), third in the the Jim Dandy, breezed five furlongs in 1:01 over the Oklahoma training track.  **"TDN Rising Star"**  **Trappe Shot** (Tapit), second-best in the Haskell, worked four furlongs over the main track in :48.97. The Mill House representative will start in either the Travers or seven-furlong GI King's Bishop S. "It was a very strong workout," conditioner Kiaran McLaughlin offered. "Everything is good, but we're not going to make a decision yet." Multiple Classic-placed **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) tuned up for the Mid-Summer Derby with a five-furlong move in 1:01.40 at Churchill Downs. The Donald Disney homebred completed the trifecta in the Haskell. "He looked great and he worked great," trainer Dale Romans commented. "As for travel plans, we'll see how he comes out of it tomorrow and work off that."

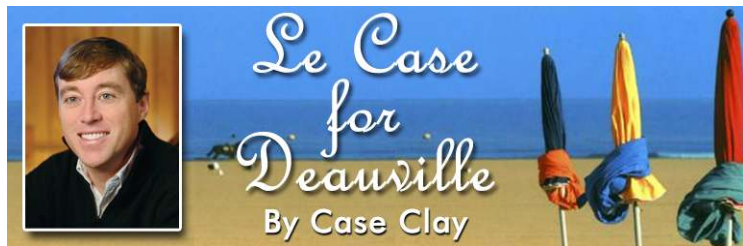
Gio Ponti Headlines Arlington Million Pre-Entries...

Champion **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) seeks to defend his title in next weekend's GI Arlington Million. The Castleton Lyons colorbearer, a last out winner of Belmont's GI Man o' War S. July 10, was among 10 horses pre-entered for Arlington's centerpiece.

Rahystrada (Rahy), **Just as Well** (A.P. Indy), **Tajaaweed** (Dynaformer) and **Marsh Side** (Gone West)--the first four finishers in the GIII Arlington H.--are also pre-entered. **General Quarters** (Sky Mesa), winner of the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S., seeks to make amends for a sixth-place finish in the Arlington H. European invaders include G3 Betfair Huxley S. winner **Debussy (Ire)** (Diesis {GB}); G2 Sky Bet York S. hero **Summit Surge (Ire)** (Noverre); and **Tazeez** (Silver Hawk), third in Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S. Recent Indiana optional claiming winner **Quite a Handful** (Mutakddim) rounds out the bunch.

Baze Reaches Another Milestone...

Jockey Russell Baze reached another milestone Saturday when he guided home his 11,000th career winner. The 52-year-old Hall of Fame jockey rode first-time starter Separate Forest (Forestry) to an 11-length victory in the fourth race at Santa Rosa. Baze told *DRF*, "I'm going to keep chipping away. I don't think 12,000 is out of reach. I thought of all the horsemen that have supported me through the years. If they hadn't put me on the kind of mounts they did, I wouldn't be here. This is a milestone, but it's not the last milestone." Baze surpassed Laffit Pincay Jr. for the all-time record for wins on Dec. 1, 2006 at Bay Meadows. He is the first jockey to ride 11,000 winners.

as a priority, and those who race for purse rewards as a priority--are Hong Kong, Japan and France. All have one governing body, by the way. While I personally think the U.S. should adopt the Japanese model of the JRA and NAR ('A' League and 'B' League), France's model is not too shabby

with regard to Breeders'

Premiums. They redistribute Pari-Mutuel betting turnover directly to purses, breeders' premiums and owners' premiums. For 5,420 foals born in France each year, over €27 million are distributed as breeders' premiums. We saw a handicap today, in which the winner would receive an additional 75 percent of the purse on top of their purse winnings if their horse were a French-bred. That's pretty strong.

Following racing, we took a little walk on Les Planches before visiting with more friends at the sales. Then dinner at Cafe Mirabeau, where we had lots of laughs. I'd like to finish with a section I call 'Internationally Wrong.' It's not a Deauville thing or a French thing or an American thing. These are things that we have seen it in each of our countries, and are just plain wrong no matter where it happens. The reason I am writing about them is because I just so happened to see them in Deauville today.

1) A man in "jorts" (jean shorts) with a bluetooth in his ear. Jorts are bad enough alone, and I understand some people are busy and like hands free, but the combination is unacceptable. Finally, someone from France that I have outdressed.

2) An eight-year-old girl with a pacifier (or a dummy) in her mouth. She's too old. I'm sorry. We have three kids and I learn something new every day about parenting, but when you can do multiplication in your head, you shouldn't have one.

3) Not cleaning up after your dog in public places. This is like the guy in the public restroom who doesn't wash his hands on the way out and looks around to see if anyone notices. Guess what, we notice every time!

David Scanlon operates Robert Scanlon Training Center, named and founded by his late father, in Williston, Florida. In addition to prepping two-year-olds for the sales, Scanlon also breaks young horses for clients including Darley. In 2004, he received a well-bred, good-looking A.P. Indy colt from Sheikh Mohammed's operation. That youngster was Bernardini, who turned out to be a pretty nice horse, winning the GI Preakness S., GI Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup en route to 2006 champion three-year-old colt honors.

Now, as Bernardini's first crop of runners hits the track, Scanlon sees the same type of promise in his progeny.

Scanlon broke, trained and consigned Stay Thirsty, the emphatic 5 1/2-length winner of Saturday's eighth race at Saratoga, a juvenile maiden event loaded with big price tags and nice pedigrees. The colt was a \$160,000 KEESEP yearling purchase for Robert LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables, who pinhooked the colt for \$500,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Florida Select Two-Year-Olds In Training sale earlier this year.

"Nick Zito picked him out due to his pedigree because he is a half to [GSW and MGISP] Andromeda's Hero (Fusaichi Pegasus), [who Zito trained for LaPenta]," Scanlon said. "We were really thrilled with him."

"He was a real solid horse," he added. "He was well put together and a good mover. We expected him to bring a lot, so we weren't surprised [by how much he sold for]."

Scanlon also expected Stay Thirsty to perform on the racetrack, and he has high hopes for Darley's freshman stallion.

"Nick has a couple of other really good Bernardinis that Mr. LaPenta kept, and I broke Bernardini himself," Scanlon said. "So, we're just really big fans of Bernardini, and we think he'll be real successful as a sire."

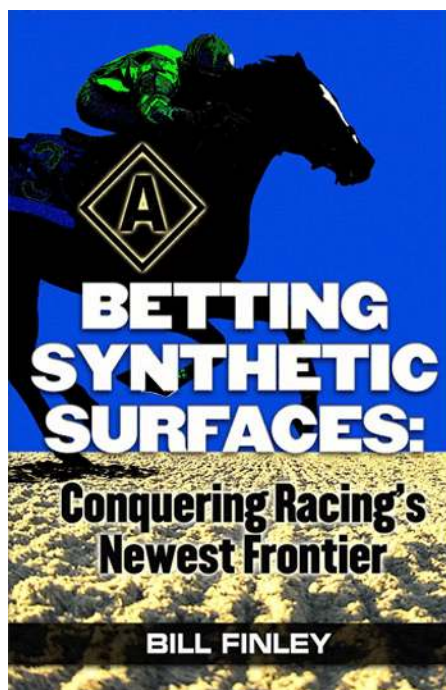

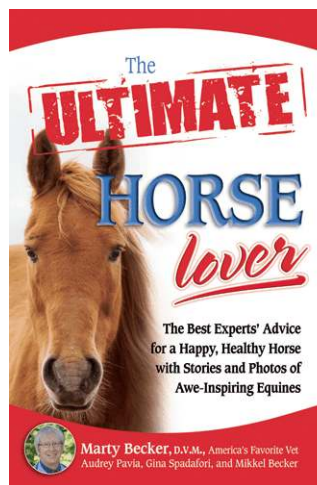
