Defending an unbeaten record entering yesterday's G1 Vincent O'Brien National S., the Silverton Hill Partnership's **Pathfork** (Distorted Humor) had to dig into reserves, but was equal to the challenge when overcoming **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal) in a thrilling finale to The Curragh contest. Slick when successful twice over the course and distance in a

the Aug. 21 G2 Futurity S., the 2-1 second favorite was drawn into battle by the long-time leader Casamento in the final quarter and, after they dominated the race, it was Pathfork who gave most under Fran Berry's drive to score by a head. "Fran said he had to be really tough and that he didn't really like the ground," trainer Jessica Harrington said. "Pure class got him there in the end." **Cont. p2**

NIGHT FALLS ON SEPTEMBER

The 2010 Keeneland September Yearling Sales begins its 14-day stand this evening in Lexington, Kentucky, with the first of two select night sessions. Action gets underway at 7:00 p.m. In a market still struggling to find its footing, Keeneland officials have adopted a new format for the 2010 renewal of the sale in the hopes of injecting energy into the proceedings. Book 1 has been nearly halved--distilled from 418 hips last term to 211 hips--and will take place over two night sessions rather than the traditional afternoon sessions. Keeneland anticipates the change will launch September on a high note and create momentum going forward. Book 2, meanwhile, has been greatly expanded and has grown from two sessions to four. Book 2 runs Tuesday through Friday. Saturday, Sept. 18 will be the sale's lone dark day. "Due to a change in market dynamics, we felt we needed to take a look at the format and talk about the last three or four years here," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "That led to the concentrated Book 1 and selling at night, and moving Book 2 to four days." **Cont. p15**

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Forked Lightning...

Pathfork had shown bountiful speed on his two track-and-trip runs so far, and jockeys Shane Foley and Fran Berry had allowed him to use that pace to race prominently before employing his inherent stamina at the finish. Those tactics had seen him overwhelm rivals when winning by four lengths in his maiden, and when drawing away from Glor Na Mara (Ire) (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) in the Futurity. Breaking quickly again here, he was set no difficult tasks as Berry kept tabs on Casamento and Declan McDonogh, with the keen-running favorite Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) under restraint in behind. In a rare turn of events for a race of this quality, none of the Ballydoyle representatives threatened to take up the pacesetting duties, and it was left to Mick Halford's runner to lead the field to the quarter pole. With Zoffany struggling in their wake, Pathfork edged ahead of the rail-running Casamento there and, after gaining a clear lead, he was all out to prevail from the rallying runner-up. "He is a different horse on better ground, and fast is really his surface," Berry explained. "I knew Declan's horse from working on him and knew he was a smart horse, but I was trying to nurse my horse. I didn't want to get in a battle with him and so stayed wide and, thankfully, it worked." Harrington was concerned afterwards that the winner had endured a hard race and was holding fire on future plans. "I'm going to Keeneland in the morning and I'll make plans with the owners then, but he did have a very hard race there," she said. 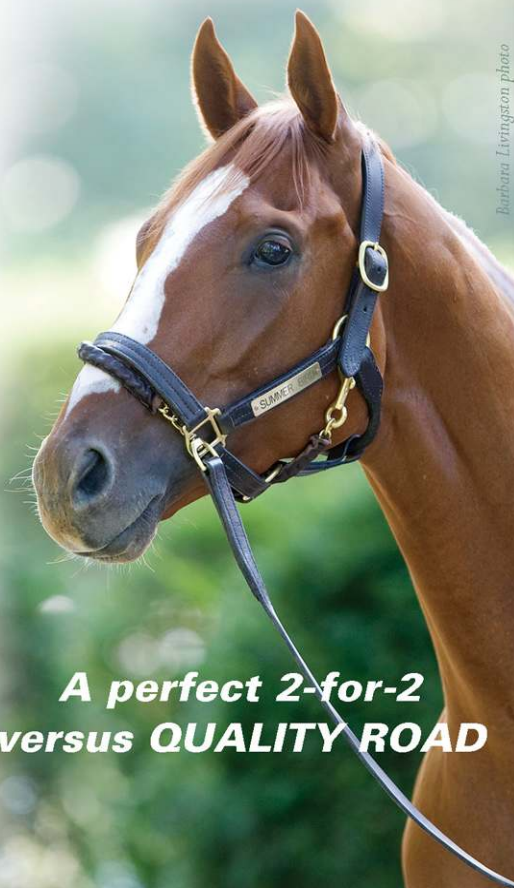

Rachel Hood and Robin Geffen's Arctic Cosmos had climbed the ranks steadily, but hit the heights with the fitting of first-time blinkers to provide John Gosden with a third renewal of Doncaster's oldest Classic. His performances when runner-up in the June 18 G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot and third in Goodwood's G3 Gordon S. July 27 had been marked by laziness, but the headgear worked instantly here as he traveled strongly behind the leading quartet under William Buick. Full of run as he moved onto the heels of the long-time leader Corsica at the quarter pole, he soon had his measure before asserting to best Midas Touch. "He'd worked so lazily, I said I couldn't afford to give this field 10 lengths, so I put an American semi-blinker on and he's done it like a proper horse," Gosden explained. "We always dreamt he was a Leger horse, and that little shower of rain before the race helped him." Godolphin's even-money favorite Rewilding (Tiger Hill {Ire}) proved a major disappointment when laboring from a long way out and eventually finishing sixth. Arctic Cosmos, third over 11 furlongs at Newbury May 14, impressed when returning to winning ways over a panel further back on the all-weather at Kempton June 9. On the face of it, his tilt at the Royal meeting's King Edward VII just nine days later was ambitious, but he was doing all of his best work at the finish behind Monterosso (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), and that was the case again in the Gordon.



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There was no hard work for Buick this time, and it was evident in early stretch that he was the main threat to the pacemaking Corsica and Ballydoyle's Midas Touch. After kicking past Corsica, he stayed in control despite veering right in the run to the line. "It was very straightforward for my horse, as he broke well today and traveled, which he hadn't done previously," Buick commented. "The pace was generous and he liked the ground. In the straight, I just wanted to point him at something that would take me along and he was in front soon enough, but he put the race to bed. He's a very strong horse and we knew he'd stay. He's done nothing wrong this year and ran a nice trial at Goodwood--being easy on him there helped him here." John Gosden added, "William feels he can come back to a mile and a half, especially with that bit of headgear on and we can dream about the Breeders' Cup Turf," "Conduit (Ire) did it two years ago, and we may not be that good, but we could have a go." Connections are eyeing a potential tilt at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf with the winner. Dettori was nonplussed as the below-par effort of Rewilding. "I couldn't bridge the gap early on," he explained. "I thought I would just wait till I got up the straight and ask him again, but he was on his knees. I was never at the races. Tagged "Pegasus" in the stable of Saeed bin Suroor, ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Saamid backed up his seven-length debut success at Newbury Aug. 13 with this facile win. Sent off the hot favorite, the bay was keen while restrained in fifth early as Waiter's Dream led them along against the rail. After Frankie Dettori let out some rein wider out on the track, Saamid responded by cruising past that rival at the quarter pole. He was mainly hand-ridden thereafter to inflict a crushing defeat on the game Approve, who was penalised for his dual Group 2-winning exploits. "He is such a beautiful individual and is very calm," jockey Frankie Dettori explained as he rode back to the winner's enclosure through the raucous Doncaster crowd. "He's got everything--a high cruising speed and a kick--and is something to look forward to. The Pegasus thing is a bit of a joke in the yard, but he has a good physique." Simon Crisford remarked, "He won his maiden easily and, coming here today, we felt he was one of our top colts, and this was the right move to make even though he was short on experience. He put the race to bed very quickly and was professional. We'd like to think he is a 2000 Guineas horse first and foremost, so he'll have his next start in the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 16], and we'll make a plan over the winter."

Final Frontieres...

Runner-up in Newmarket's G3 Craven S. and third in the G2 Dante S. at York last term, Sans Frontieres took time to wind back up after a subsequent injury, but hit the right note when registering a 14-1 upset in Newmarket's G2 Princess of Wales's S. July 8. Buoyed by that win, the chestnut added the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. to his tally at Newbury Aug. 14 despite carrying a penalty, and continued his revival with a comfortable victory here. Settled in rear early by the visiting Olivier Peslier, he still had only one behind at the top of the stretch, and made his move wide out as Profound Beauty arrived on the front end still on the bridle with a quarter mile remaining. Gliding by that formidable rival in the final 150 yards, he was pushed out in a Peslier masterclass to provide owner Sir Robert Ogden with a first Group 1 winner. "Mr. Nosedá had said that if the horse was relaxed he would win," Peslier said. "He was, and it was simple--I didn't want to fight with the front-runners and come late and it worked." The owner's Racing Manager Barry Simpson added, "We've bought flat horses for the last three or four seasons now. This is one of the best we've bought, and we are delighted with what he has done today. Jeremy [Nosedá] told me earlier in the week that he had done the best piece of work he had for him. The rain put us off a little bit, as he's very much a top-of-the-ground horse, but he's coped with it even though I don't think conditions really suited him. They went slow early and then quickened it and that helped us, as he stays well. We will talk it over with Sir Robert, but the plan was to come here and find out if he got the trip, and so Melbourne is very much on the cards. It is a race Sir Robert has been very keen to go to and run well in." Profound Beauty's trainer Dermot Weld told the *Racing Post*, "All the rain we had today didn't help us, as she doesn't pick up on ground as testing as this. She had to survive a jockey's claim of foul, but Wonderlandbynight ran her record to a perfect four-for-four with this decisive tally. The chestnut actually finished second in her career opener at Arlington June 4, but was elevated to first when the original winner failed the post-race drug test. The disqualification had not yet been revealed when the filly went to the gate for a state-bred maiden test June 27, however, and she was gifted a second graduation when taking that event by 4 3/4 lengths. The winner of the Ontario Debutante S. Aug. 14 at Woodbine, she was a slight second choice to prevail here. Wonderlandbynight rated well off a fast pace, then swung wide into the stretch. 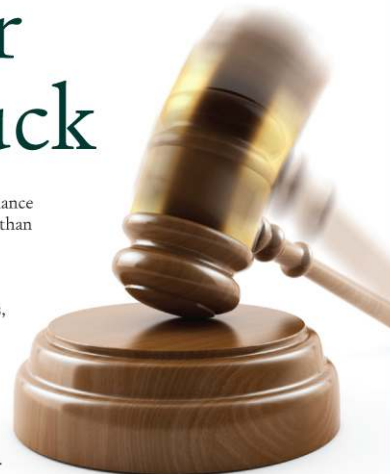

DERBY WINNER SUPER SAVER SIDELINED

WinStar Farm's homebred GI Kentucky Derby hero **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), off the board in his three starts since donning the blanket of roses, has been

diagnosed with condylar bruising.

"After a couple of uncharacteristic post-Derby efforts, we had Super Saver evaluated by Dr. Larry Bramlage at Rood and Riddle," explained Elliott Walden, vice president and racing manager for WinStar Farm. Said Bramlage, "A bone scan was performed on Super Saver, which revealed marked activity in all four cannon bones. The left front fetlock has the most radiographic change, with a major bruise on the cannon bone." He added, "Once these are resolved, the horse should return to his previous form." Trainer Todd Pletcher remarked, "This explains a lot to me--I couldn't understand those last few efforts where Super Saver didn't extend and lay it out there like he had in every other race he ran through the Kentucky Derby victory. He has always been very gutsy and determined in his races, even when he set fast fractions, so this answers a lot of head scratching. When he's right, he's the ultimate racehorse." Three-year-old Super Saver capped off his juvenile campaign with a five-length score in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill in November. He just missed when third in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby in his 2010 bow in March, and entered the Kentucky Derby off a neck second in the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 10. His record stands at 10-3-2-1, with earnings of \$1,889,766. "We have sent Super Saver back to the training barn at WinStar, and will evaluate his progress going forward," concluded Walden.

CHANGE FOR THE GOOD

Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell elaborated on the new format, explaining that the sale wouldn't be offering more than 325 horses a day during Book 2, "just because we didn't want to tire people out." Russell added, "So many buyers said that going through 400 horses a day gets to be very tiring, and that it's hard to keep up. And now, from a buyer's point of view, you can look at the 1,500 horses here the first week and, if you can only stay one week, you can look at another 800 before you leave--and that way you've seen the majority of the horses at the sale."

Buyers and sellers in general seemed in favor of the change in format.

"I commend Keeneland for trying something different," said Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. "I'm not sure I have a real strong opinion, but I think the idea of having two glamorous night sessions is a good idea. So long as the standard is held high, it has the ability to frame up those elite horses, which helps some of the buyers. It might not help the grizzled veteran that's been coming to the sales for 20 years, but for someone who wants to understand values and how they find these horses, it pushes those horses right up front and makes them easy to identify."

"Initially, it could be a bit disruptive, just in terms that people don't have an established pattern of how they do things--when they look at the horses, for instance--and what their expectations are, but I think people adjust quickly. Hopefully, it creates a synergy from night one to night two, and then carries over into those Tuesday through Friday sessions."

KEESEP Preview cont.

Yesterday at Keeneland, a gray, drizzly morning gave way to a hot, sunny afternoon. Consignors reported positive indicators.

"It's obviously a different Book 1 from last year, but we're getting the vetting we like to see," said Warrendale's Kitty Taylor. "We have seven horses, and the vets are starting to move through the barns. The Japanese obviously got here last night, because they all showed up on the grounds today, and I also saw [the Australians] yesterday and today."

Added Hunter Valley Farm's Adrian Regan, "So far this morning, business is hectic. There's plenty of traffic. I know, with the first barn to be looked at for Book 2, we've been very, very busy so far. Hopefully, people have been holding their money for Keeneland. With so many horses, you'd think they want to pick up the nice horses."

Bluewater Sales's Meg Levy said buyers continue to readjust to the new marketplace, and sees a shift in shopping patterns.

"It seems people have really gone back to looking at the pedigree and the established sire, rather than the new sires and the great physicals and less page," said Levy. "But everybody's got value in mind. That's going to be the stamp of the sale."

THE ECOLOGY OF THE SITUATION

David and Marylyn Randal were looking to expand their broodmare band at the Keeneland November sale in 2005 when they were struck by a four-year-old filly named **Ecology** (Unbridled's Song). The couple went to \$120,000 to bring the twice-raced daughter of Irish group-placed Gdansk's Honour (Danzig) home to their Fallbrook Farm in Versailles.

Asked what attracted him to the mare, David Randal immediately responded, "Her looks--she's a magnificent mare." Then he added, "And her sire and her dam--her dam's record."

Ecology was carrying her first foal, a colt by Sky Mesa, when the Randals purchased her. Randal admitted he wasn't initially impressed with the youngster.

"He was a big, gangly yearling," Randal explained. "He had no refinement or maturity to him."

The Randals sold the gray yearling for \$20,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September sale, but the colt, now

named General Quarters, has more than overcome the early negative impressions. Claimed by owner and trainer Tom McCarthy for \$20,000 in 2008, General Quarters earned

a berth in the 2009 GI Kentucky Derby with a victory in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. He proved his versatility and grit with a narrow triumph in this year's GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic S. on Derby day, and now boasts earnings of \$1,165,260. **Cont. p17**

"He certainly has developed, and Tom has done a fantastic job developing him," Randal said.

Ecology's second foal is a three-year-old daughter of the Randal's stallion Wild and Wicked (Wild Again). Although the filly failed to sell at the 2008 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale, she recently won back-to-back starts over the turf racing in the Randals' colors.

The Randals are back at the Keeneland September sale this year with another produce of Ecology--this time a gray filly by Tale of the Cat ([hip 34](#)), and David Randal thinks she is a standout.

"She's incredible," Randal said of the yearling, who is consigned by Paramount Sales. "Absolutely. From day one, she's just been the star of our farm, and still is. She's spectacular. She's a more refined General Quarters. She's big--she's almost 15.3 already. When Keeneland came out to inspect her--it took them about 30 seconds--and they all had smiles on their faces. A lot of times they'll sit and look, and walk back and forth and do all that. But this was an absolute no-brainer. She's that correct and that good-looking."

In addition to the yearling by Tale of the Cat, Ecology also has a weanling colt by the Coolmore stallion. She is currently in foal to Pulpit.

"I go through and do a pedigree analysis," Randal said in explaining the stallion choices. "I use CompuSire and try to have some inbreeding, and I also try to get the dosage index to be between two and three. With the match up of Ecology and Tale of the Cat, you get Mr. Prospector inbreeding from the dam's side of Tale of the Cat to the sire side of Unbridled's Song. And you also get a real nice cross--on the dam's side of Tale of the Cat is a mare called Monarchy, who is a full-sister to Round Table. Gdansk's Honour, who is the dam of Ecology, is out of a Round Table mare. So I kind of go through and do all that analysis."

After all the background work, to come out with a product that makes the Keeneland inspection team smile is especially satisfying, Randal agreed.

"All of the homework, all the time and all the money--you put it all together and out comes something that is really spectacular," he said. "It's just great."

Randal's arrival in the breeding business began innocently enough with his wife's love of horses.

"The way it all started was that my wife bought a mare to ride," Randal chuckled. "She bred that mare and, unfortunately, the mare died and we raised an orphan. From there, we got into the breeding business."

Randal, involved in the construction business in California, eventually decided to relocate.

"We decided to move because it just didn't seem to make sense to be in California and make money in breeding horses," the 67-year-old said. "So we moved to Kentucky and started Fallbrook Farm about 20 years ago."

The Fallbrook broodmare band numbers some 30 head, and the Randals' focus is on selling.


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"We mainly are in the business of selling foals, but we do race some of them," Randal commented. "If they don't bring what we expect them to bring, then we go ahead and race them. Right now, we have 20 or 24 in training."

In addition to General Quarters, the Randals also bred multiple graded stakes winner Mary's Follies (More Than Ready) and group-placed Patrician's Glory (Proud Citizen). The couple bred and campaigned Silverinyourpocket (Silver Deputy), winner of the 2007 GIII La Troienne S.

While its Tale of the Cat filly goes through the Keeneland sales ring during Sunday's opening session of the sale, Fallbrook will also be represented during Monday's second session of the auction. [Hip 110](#) is a colt from the first crop of the hard-knocking Hard Spun (Danzig) out of multiple-graded stakes placed Windsong (Unbridled). Paramount also consigns four Randal-breds in Book 2: [hip 480](#), a half-sister by Good Reward to Mary's Follies; [hip 607](#), a daughter of Grand Slam out of Dixie Dos (Dixieland Band); [hip 1221](#), a colt by Gone West out of Ravnina (Nureyev); and [hip 1357](#), a colt by Elusive Quality out of Silverinyourpocket (Silver Deputy).

After more than two decades breeding horses, Randal acknowledges it's a profession that can be quite a rollercoaster ride.

"The business has tremendous highs and tremendous lows," Randal said. "Some of the lows always have to do with horses getting hurt or dying. But then there are the highs, when you breed a horse like General Quarters and get to go in the winner's circle on Kentucky Derby day. When he won the Woodford Reserve--it was spectacular." --*Jessica Martini*



WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

John Sikura, Hill 'n' Dale Farms:

"It's taken a while for both buyers and sellers to adjust to the depressed market, but I think the opportunity to buy horses for a third or half as much they would have cost two years ago is going to bring some of the wealthy buyers back into the business. They'll either try to reestablish a broodmare band with fillies, or re-enter the racing game with the colts at a level that stretches their dollar a lot further. As a seller, you liked it when the market was more bullish, but I think the value there will help bring some of that sideline money back into the game."

Sikura cont.

"Markets go up and down, and things will be at the bottom until people say, almost simultaneously, 'These are ridiculously low prices and it's great value--I need to buy something.' It happens with commercial real estate, it happens with horses, and once everybody engages at the same time, then you get a bounce effect and an ascending market. I hope we see that this September. We're still in the final stages of the clean-up of our inventory. There's not the demand anymore for seven, eight books of yearlings. So a lot of those mares have come out of production, and I think you'll see a further tightening on the number of yearlings produced and the number of races run, and, hopefully, there will be a higher-quality product. Long term, I think all of that will be positive."

Craig Bendoroff, Denali Stud:

"We've had a good summer--a good Fasig July and a very good Saratoga. Like I keep saying--all assets have been revalued, including horses. Hopefully, there will be good demand. There's been good demand for good horses all year. They're not going to bring what they brought two or three years ago, but we'll sell horses and have trade and roll on from here."

Duncan Taylor, Taylor Made Sales Agency:

"I think that Book 1 is an awesome group of horses. The difference is there's more consistent quality, and I think [Keeneland] has done a good job of selecting them. We've been showing since Thursday, and it's been steady the whole time. I'm not sitting here saying the sale's going to take off and go. Of course, you'd like to see some new people; that's what we've got to be striving for. But I think the right people are here."

Patti Miller, EQB Bloodstock:

"I am pleasantly surprised how much better I think Book 1 is than Book 1 was last year. It seems to appeal more to an American buyer. I think last year's Book 1 was slanted towards turf and European horses. This year they've really tried to get American buyers back to Book 1."

Bill Farish, Lane's End:

"There are a lot of people here, a lot of lookers, which is encouraging. There are more Europeans here than I expected, which is good. Everybody's a little anxious, but we'll see what happens."

Atlantic Voyage, a full-sister to the swift Stormello, GISW, \$700,100, wound up RNA'ing for \$235,000 when offered at KEESEP a year ago. She had a host of sharp morning drills, but they were only good enough to make her the 4-1 second choice to Shadwell's Shaarat (Distorted Humor), a second-time starter that was bet down to 3-5. Atlantic Voyage came away running from her rail post and quickly opened up daylight while speeding through splits of :22.59 and :45.54. Rider Rajiv Maragh threw a cross at her in the stretch and the chestnut kept on going, scoring by five lengths under a hand ride. Truffles (Forestry) won the three-way photo for second, while Shaarat faltered to finish sixth. ATLANTIC VOYAGE (Stormy Atlantic)

Edward A. Cox, Jr. has been involved with many exceptional racehorses and producers during his long-time involvement with Thoroughbreds, breeding European champions Bakharoff (The Minstrel) and Woodman (Mr. Prospector), multiple Grade I winner Jade Hunter (Mr. Prospector), Group 1 winner Shaadi (Danzig) and near-\$3-million earner Marquetry (Conquistador Cielo). He also bred and campaigned multiple Grade I-winning Banker's Lady (Nijinsky II), and was involved in the Claiborne Farm partnership that owned Swale (Seattle Slew), winner of the 1984 Kentucky Derby and champion three-year-old colt that year.

Cox decided to disperse his valuable breeding stock, selling 34 horses for \$11,069,000 at Keeneland November in 1998. He wouldn't be gone for long.

"We dispersed in 1998, but we came back about four years ago," the Illinois native explained. "We have about 10 mares now and the resulting foals, but we try to buy a couple of fillies every year at the Keeneland sale as future broodmare prospects."

Atlantic Voyage was one of those fillies. The full-sister to Grade I-winning juvenile Stormello RNA'd for \$235,000 at Keeneland September last year, and Cox snapped her up right after she passed through the ring.

"[Bloodstock agent] Anthony Stroud picked her out and bought her for me," Cox recalled. "Anthony saw her and came up to me and asked if I would be interested in her, and I said, 'Sure.' So he made a deal and bought her from the consignor. We turned her over to Bill Harrigan to break and he took her to Florida and gave her early training."

The filly's next destination was to the barn of Christophe Clement who, along with Nick Zito and Jimmy DiVito in Chicago, condition Cox's racing stock.

Clement, best known for his success with turf horses, decided to try Atlantic Voyage on the sod first out despite her brother's success on dirt and synthetic.

Cox said, "It was Christophe's idea [to debut her on grass]. He said that this filly seems to like the turf, so I'd like to try her on that. I said, 'Listen, you're the master, so whatever you want to do is fine.'"

Interestingly, despite Clement's high win percentage with turfers in general, before yesterday he had only sent out one debut winner sprinting on the sod from 18 tries in the past five years, according to *Daily Racing Form*. That lone graduate was champion older male and turf horse Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat). Cox didn't anticipate that his filly would buck the trend.

"I wasn't really expecting her to run that well," he offered. "We knew she had ability, but Christophe's horses don't normally show their best first time out, so he said he liked her to improve [with a race under her belt]."

If she's going to improve from there, then Cox may have another future star to add to the list above.

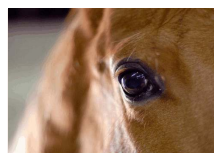
