

ON BALANCE, A STRONG START TO KEESEP

The first-ever evening session at the reformatted Keeneland September, held last night in Lexington, yielded substantial gains in median and average. But the big story on the night was the session-topping A.P. Indy colt out of Zenyatta's half-sister Balance (Thunder Gulch), who made a spectacular \$4.2 million ([video](#)). Besilu Stables won the war for the strapping bay colt,

who was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales for breeders John and Jerry Amerman. With a packed pavilion hanging on every salvo, several parties tried to get in on the action as the price on the board eclipsed the million-dollar mark. Trainer Bob Baffert, in an aisle seat sitting alongside

Kaleem Shah and Donato Lanni, kept up the pressure as Team Coolmore, led by John Magnier, bid intently from its usual position out back. As the price neared \$4 million, Baffert backed out, hiding behind his catalogue as a bidspotter implored for another bid. He emerged with a smile on his face, but Shah quickly covered him back up with his own catalogue. That left two remaining, Coolmore out back and Besilu's Benjamin Leon, sitting dead center out front, and a late arrival among the contenders. Magnier, getting input from Demi O'Byrne and Paul Shanahan, raised his finger at \$3.9 and \$4.1 million, but both of those bids were answered quickly by Leon, and Magnier conceded victory with a shake of the head. *Cont. p2*

As soon as **Sariska (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) had planted herself in the stalls as she had in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks, yesterday's G1 Prix Vermeille became a much more straightforward task for **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), and

Juddmonte's admirable campaigner duly delivered to bring up a fifth Group 1 win. Sent off the 14-5 second favorite, the bay tracked the even tempo in fourth under Tom Queally and, after wear-

ing down **Plumania (GB)** (Anabaa) with 150 meters remaining, asserted to win by 3/4 of a length. "What a lovely filly she is and has won again in good style, despite doing the minimum when in front," conditioner Henry Cecil commented. "Had she been challenged, she would have kicked on again. The plan has always been to miss the Arc and go for a second Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf and that is what we'll do now. She needed the race today, as it would have been too long to wait from the Yorkshire Oaks to Churchill Downs, so that will set her up perfectly."

Amermans Ring Bell on Rare Trip to Ring...

Watching the proceedings surrounding the \$4.2-million A.P. Indy colt out back were John and Jerry Amerman, who raced Balance and bred yesterday's topper. The dapper couple were calm and collected as bidding concluded, and accepted congratulations from several people standing nearby. They quickly headed inside to offer their congratulations to Besilu's Ben Leon.

Afterward, John Amerman, former chairman and CEO of Mattel Inc., talked to reporters in the hallway of the pavilion, and explained that he would have been happy to keep and race the colt. But the lure of the commercial market proved too great.

"Either way we would have won," said Amerman of his colt, who became the highest-priced Thoroughbred to sell at public auction in North America since Meydan City (Kingmambo) sold here for \$11.7 million in 2006. "He's such a wonderful horse, and I'm so glad he's going to a great owner and to a great trainer. He's a very special horse, and that's why we were so hesitant to sell him. We almost never sell. But a lot of people who advise us said, 'Well, it's the first one and it's a colt. You should sell him.'"

One member of the team Amerman singled out was bloodstock agent Bob Feld, who purchased Balance for the Amermans for \$260,000 at the 2004 September sale. Balance went on to become one of the better racemares of her generation, winning the GI Las Virgenes S., GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. while earning over \$1.04 million. This was her first foal.

"Bob's been so helpful over the years, and helps us in so many ways, including giving us a good recommendation on what we should do with this colt," said Amerman.

Balance would have boasted stellar credentials heading to the breeding shed on race record alone, but she also just happens to be a half-sister to one of the all-time greats in Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). Having bought Balance a year earlier, Amerman admitted to looking at and passing on Zenyatta as a yearling. She sold for just \$60,000 to Jerry and Ann Moss at September in 2005.

"To be truthful, we didn't know at the time what Balance would be," said Amerman. "She hadn't run yet, and we said, 'Well, let's just pass.' It was our mistake, but hey, those things happen. I'm glad the Mosses got her for a reasonable price.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.



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"She's been so good for the sport. Zenyatta's just very special, and the Mosses are just marvelous people. They're from California and are very good friends. I'm so delighted they've won 18 in a row and going on 19. And maybe they'll be back at the [GI Breeders' Cup] Classic, and wouldn't it be nice to have a round 20?"

In addition to Feld, Amerman thanked his wife Jerry and consignor Headley Bell and his family's Mill Ridge Sales, home to the Amermans' bloodstock.

"My wife suggested the breeding," said Amerman. "And Mill Ridge helped with the breeding and helped bring this colt along. Every time you'd go there, you'd be more excited about him. Mill Ridge is just the best there is, and they turn out their horses so well, and I think that helped with this colt."

Balance has a Street Cry (Ire) colt on the ground and was bred back to the Darley stallion.

"We love [Street Cry], and the fact that they are three-quarter [siblings] to Zenyatta doesn't hurt," Amerman remarked.

While new to the sale scene, the Amermans have enjoyed great success racing. They have campaigned the winners of no fewer than 22 Grade I races. Horses to carry the Amermans' dark blue colors include Adoration, Lido Palace (Ire), Spoken Fur, Printemps (Chi), Siphonic, Happyannuoit (NZ) and Mash One (Chi). -LM

Leon Full Tilt at Keeneland...

Benjamin Leon, who was making his first appearance at Keeneland September yesterday, certainly marked his debut with plenty of fireworks. No stranger to the spotlight, Leon recently made headlines when purchasing another A.P. Indy colt for \$1.2 million at last month's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select Yearling sale. Not to be denied last night, the debonair Cuban native jumped into the fray to take on Team Coolmore and Kaleem Shah—who was flanked by Bob Baffert and Donato Lanni—soon after the \$3-million mark, lending some spice to the drawn-out battle. And while many in attendance waited in suspense to see who would be left standing, Leon indicated later that there was never any doubt as to the outcome.

"I was going to get the colt," the master of Besilu Stables declared. "I was not leaving without him."

Explaining the decision to wait and jump into the battle late, Leon reasoned, "Why jump in at the beginning? I like to stay low key. I was going to buy the colt anyway, so it didn't matter when I got in."

As for the purchase price, Leon was not surprised by the hefty premium placed on the son of Balance (Thunder Gulch).

"It all boils down to that somebody was willing to bid \$4 million to get this horse, and the way I see it, if you are willing to bid that kind of money, an extra \$100,000 or \$200,000 won't be a deal breaker," he said. "We were hoping he would have been lower than what he brought, but the \$4-million mark was pretty much what [J.J. and Todd] Pletcher thought he would bring. So I was mentally prepared."

Leon was even more encouraged to bid when he saw the caliber of competition that was in the running for the highly prized yearling.

"In my mind, he brought only \$100,000 more than what the other experts in the industry were willing to give for him," explained Leon. "So I made that bid with 100-percent comfort. In my mind, I should not be wrong about the decision to buy him."

While the colt's page offered much to be desired, his physical conformation served up the sizzle as well.

"He is just a beautiful horse," he said. "He is a big boned and attractive horse with a nice walk. In fact, J.J. Pletcher said they couldn't find anything to fault. When you put that together with the caliber of his dam and his second dam [Vertigineux], it's very difficult to not want to have him. All he has to do is perform on the racetrack, and if he does that, he can very easily become a very good sire in the future, so I see it as a very good investment."

Also on a high following the sale was Headley Bell. Bell's Mill Ridge Sales offered the colt on behalf of Jerry Amerman, who campaigned the dam and bred the resulting foal.

"We didn't have any expectations, we really didn't," said Bell in regard to the final price. "All we knew was that he came here in fantastic condition, and everybody really liked him. He jumped through every hoop and checked all the boxes."

Bell was not the least bit surprised, however, that most of the big players on the grounds, were in pursuit of the bay.

"He was a very popular horse," confirmed Bell. "He was a big horse, but he moves like a cat."

Further explaining the colt's appeal, Bell added, "He was just so composed and he is all class. He was always a nice individual, but he really peaked on the day. He was simply exceptional."

In regard to one of the underbidders, Bell said, "Look at Bob Baffert [bidding for Kaleem Shah], he really believed in this horse. It was hard for him to not get him, and I really sympathize with them."

Leon's only other purchase of the evening was [Hip 25](#), a filly by Pulpit out of graded-stakes winner and Grade I stakes placed Chimichurri (Elusive Quality). The Jan. 5 foal was offered by Warrendale Sales on behalf of her breeder, Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings.

"The filly is just gorgeous," enthused Leon. "She is just so feminine with a beautiful neck and a lovely pedigree."

Leon confirmed that both of last night's purchases are headed to J. J. Pletcher's training center in Ocala.-CB

Man on a Mission...

Leon, who arrived in the United States at the age of 16, is a self-made man who has built an empire one brick at a time. Currently a resident of Miami, Florida, Leon started Leon Medical Centers just over 14 years ago, and has developed the company into one of the leading providers of health care services in Florida. A long-time horse enthusiast, Leon entered the equine world almost three decades ago, first through the Paso Fino breed, and only recently made the transition to the world of Thoroughbreds.

"I know what I don't know," said Leon. "I needed to feel a level of comfort before I could get involved in Thoroughbreds. The thing that made me make the decision to the jump [from Paso Finos to Thoroughbreds] was the Pletcher family. I met J.J. Pletcher through my real estate company. Through them, I developed the comfort that I needed, in that I knew I was in good hands, because they are people with integrity, know how and are very knowledgeable in the industry. On the other hand, my plan is to have a limited number of horses and focus on quality."

After purchasing his first Thoroughbred privately last year, Leon added a few select horses to his bloodstock holdings. He currently has a pair of horses on the track, and an additional four broodmares boarded at his farm in Ocala, Florida. Featured among his broodmare band is stakes winner With Flying Colors (A.P. Indy), a daughter of champion My Flag (Easy Goer); and Border Dispute (Boundary), the dam of Group 3 Long Lashes (Rock Hard Ten). According to Leon, he hopes to build his Thoroughbred holdings to about 12 mares and 10 yearlings per season.

"We plan to breed a few, race a few, and hopefully get lucky and have some fun," he said.

And while many are tightening their purse strings and cutting back investments, Leon is moving ahead with greater resolve and determination.

"I think this is a good opportunity to invest in anything that could be considered a luxury item or high risk," he opined. "Horses are high risk, so the degree of success, monetarily speaking, is going to be equal to the degree of risk you are going to take, in business and in life. I'm kind of a calculated risk taker. I love the industry, as I love the health care industry, and I see it as a good investment."

Armed with a fiery passion for the sport and keen business acumen, Leon explained that he has used many of the principals he has collected in his other career endeavors in developing his growing Thoroughbred operation. However, he is quick to point out some of the more intangible factors involved in his success.

"Luck is the point where preparation meets opportunity," offered Leon. "I've worked very hard to get to where I am, but I have been very lucky." -C Bossinakis

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Outbid Early, Shah Lands Two...

Prominent new owner Kaleem Shah currently has the unique distinction of being an underbidder on the two highest-priced Thoroughbreds to sell in 2010. At the Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale earlier in the spring, he fell just short of Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables for the colt Brock (Distorted Humor), who brought a season-topping

\$2.3 million in the juvenile market. Last night, Shah made a game push for the \$4.2 million A.P. Indy--Balance topper, but bowed out around the \$3.5-million mark. Shah didn't walk away empty-handed, though. He came back to purchase [hip 47](#), a colt by Storm Cat out of GISW Halo America (Waquoit), for \$320,000.

Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, the colt is a full-brother to SW & MGISP Marino Marini. Then with session one drawing to a close, Shah secured [hip 96](#), a colt by Giant's Causeway, for \$950,000. That was the second-highest price on the evening. Bred by Richard Santulli's Colts Neck Stables and consigned by Lane's End, the bay is a son of the 14-year-old stakes winner Spunoutacontrol (Wild Again), a half-sister to champion Minardi (Boundary) and Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), and to Myth (Ogygian), dam of champion, GSW and successful sire Johannesburg (Hennessy).

Shah admitted he was disappointed not to get the A.P. Indy topper, but was happy with the pair he purchased.

"The other was a nice horse, but this was a nice horse, too," Shah said after landing the Giant's Causeway colt.

"I bought him right out of the back," Baffert quipped to reporters, inferring it was a last-minute decision based on the colt's appearance in the rear walking ring. "I saw him earlier today, and I liked the way he carried himself. The way his pedigree is, he was light on his feet. I thought he was very balanced. We'll know next year if we did the right thing."

Baffert said he was somewhat surprised that he didn't win the battle for the A.P. Indy colt.

"I really thought we were going to get him," he said. "I thought we'd get him for \$3 million. He was a pretty special."

Shah campaigns ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Take Control (A.P. Indy--Azeri) and this year's GIII West Virginia Derby and GIII Iowa Derby winner Concord Point (Tapit). Both are trained by Baffert. Baffert said that Take Control, sidelined after a debut win at Santa Anita last December, is back in training, but that Concord Point would be given the remainder of the year off. -LM

Opening Session Ends With a Bang for Lane's End...

Lane's End packed a whole lot of bang into a short space of time during yesterday's opening session of the September sale. The consignment was responsible for four of the top five lots, all of which sold with under 30 hips to go in the select session. [Hip 96](#), a son of Giant's Causeway out of Spunoutacontrol (Wild Again), led the way with the night's second highest bid of \$950,000. Purchased by Kaleem Shah, the yearling is from the family of Tale of the Cat and Johannesburg. Lane's End's Will Farish admitted he was pleasantly surprised with the colt's purchase price. "There are a lot of Giant's Causeways, so we didn't know exactly how well he would do," Farish admitted. "But he was an outstanding individual." Cont. p7

[Hip 86](#), a colt by champion Bernardini out of the Farish-bred and raced mare Private Status (Alydar), attracted a final bid of \$800,000 from Shadwell Estate. Group I-placed on the racetrack, Private Status pro-

duced a pair of graded-stakes winners by Lane's End stallion A.P. Indy in GI Kentucky Oaks winner Secret Status and Alumni Hall, so breeding the nine-year-old mare to A.P. Indy's son Bernardini was an easy choice, according to Farish. "Bernardini is one of A.P.'s best sons," Farish commented. "I have loved that horse since the time he went to stud. He was

an absolutely beautiful horse. And he has some good two-year-olds--of course at the time we didn't know it. We've bred a number of mares to Bernardini with the idea and the hope that he would be the kind of sire that it looks like he will be."

Late in Sunday's session, Lane's End also sold [hip 79](#), a son of Distorted Humor out of stakes-placed Oneofacat (Deputy Minister) for \$700,000. The yearling is from the family of Hold That Tiger and Editor's Note and was purchased by Shadwell.

Rounding out Lane's End's powerful four was [Hip 94](#), a filly by Unbridled's Song out of MGISP Soul Search (A.P. Indy). The gray yearling sold for \$685,000 to Flag Lake.

Of Lane's End's session-ending blitzkrieg, Farish admitted, "We were very pleased. We weren't quite expecting them to go that well, particularly the filly. They were outstanding individuals and they lived up to it."

Farish noted that buyers were very discriminating during Sunday's session.

"I think the market is very particular," he observed. "I think it was soft in spots. But the really good individuals with the pedigree sold well."

Santulli and Lane's End Perfect Together...

Two of Lane's End's top four yearlings were bred by the New Jersey-based Colts Neck Stables of Rich Santulli. The Giant's Causeway colt purchased by Kaleem Shah for \$950,000 was a pleasant surprise for Santulli. "We got more than we thought we would for the Giant's Causeway," Santulli admitted last night. "He was a beautiful colt and we knew he would sell well." Colts Neck Stables also bred the Distorted Humor colt out of Oneofacat that sold for \$700,000. "We knew they would both sell well--they were both really nice colts with really nice families, but they both sold well beyond their reserves." Santulli added action was brisker than expected during Sunday's session. "I thought the sale today was stronger than I anticipated," he admitted. "Good horses sold well. I thought the sale was good. I brought three and one was bought back." Santulli also hopes to take advantage of the other side of the market. "We're buyers, too, so we hope we can get some bargains and get ourselves some good horses," he said.

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Lukas Gets Two for Baker and Mack...

Robert Baker and William Mack purchased 2009 GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. winner Dublin (Afleet Alex) for \$525,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland September sale and the two men went back to the September sale to restock last night. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas signed the ticket on behalf of Baker and Mack for a pair of youngsters, going to \$625,000 for a son of Distorted Humor and spending \$300,000 for a son of Empire Maker. The first, [hip 46](#), is a half-brother to champion juvenile filly Halfbridled (Unbridled), while [hip 27](#) is out of graded stakes winner Collect Call (Meadowlake) and is a half-brother to Old Fashioned (Unbridled's Song). "I got two really well-balanced horses that had decent pedigrees," Lukas said of his purchases. "The thing that we want to do is to buy horses that, at the end of the day, when they are done racing, somebody will want to send them to the breeding shed." Of the price tag, Lukas added, "I was a little pleased with the [Empire Maker colt] and a little over on the other one, but the average was good. The first one was \$300,000--I thought he would bring a little bit more and the other one I thought would bring a little bit less. It averaged out all right." Overall, Lukas found much to be optimistic about during the sale's opening session. "I think the market is ok. I think it's fair, it's a good market. I think people on both sides, bidders and consignors, have to be pleased. There is a good active group out here buying."

Soul Music...

A yearling by Unbridled's Song out of the eight-year-old Soul Search (A.P. Indy) was the night's top-priced filly, eliciting a bid of \$685,000 from Flag Lake #2.

Lane's End's Bill Farish signed the ticket. "It's for a new client who doesn't want to be identified," said Farish, who did his bidding sitting along the back wall of the sales pavilion. Farish was plenty familiar with the filly, who was bred by his father Will Farish in partnership with Kilroy Thoroughbred Partnership. Lane's End consigned the Jan. 26-foaled miss as [hip 94](#).

"We knew her very well, and she was one of my favorite fillies," said Farish. "We're very excited about her chances as a racehorse." Asked to describe her physically, Farish commented, "She's a big, strong, athletic filly. [Bloodstock agent] Mike Ryan was just saying to me that she reminds him of Winning Colors. And we sure wouldn't mind if she could run like her."

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Farish said his client would like to purchase one more yearling, a colt, during the September Sale. From the family of champion juvenile Pleasant Stage (Pleasant Colony), hip 94's dam Soul Search ran second in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. here at Keeneland and was also third in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga.

September Becomes an Event...

The action wasn't limited to the sales ring last night as the September sale made its first foray into twilight selling. The sales pavilion was hopping as horse auction melded with social event in a scene reminiscent of Keeneland's old July sale. The majority of the seats inside the pavilion were filled for most of the evening, while intrigued spectators lined the windows surrounding the pavilion three deep, anxious to get a peek at the \$4.2-million sales topper.

Keeneland's redesigned pavilion gave industry insiders and tourists alike a chance to enjoy the unusual evening session, with plenty of places to congregate and enjoy the beautiful fall night. The outside back walking ring attracted a throng of onlookers, while the outside bar was filled with a younger crowd. The inside walking ring was the place to find your trainer of choice, with Steve Asmussen, Christophe Clement, Richard Mandella and Dallas Stewart among the many conditioners exchanging pleasantries. Mandella stopped to chat with WinStar's Bill Casner, who was taking the opportunity to get his cowboy boots shined.

The inside bar was wall to wall, while inside the tucked-away Northern Dancer bar John Ferguson was among the patrons enjoying a moment away from the madding crowd.

The evening session seemed to be a hit with most.

"I like it," Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas said, before chuckling and admitting, "It's a little harder on a horse trainer, but it's all right."

Lane's End's Will Farish was another proponent of the new format. "I think it's going to be tweaked and improved as we go along," Farish said. "But I think it's a good change. Fundamentally, with the [start] time and everything, it worked out well. It did remind me a little bit of the July sale. And that was the whole idea."

Keeneland officials were also pleased with the result of the new evening session.

"The atmosphere here was exactly what we tried to accomplish by this new format," said Keeneland's director of sales Geoffrey Russell. "There was an excitement and there was an electricity."

More excitement and electricity is scheduled for tonight at Keeneland, with the sale's second session beginning at 7 p.m.

Good Portents During Opener...

Keeneland September's new format makes year-to-year comparisons difficult, but most seemed to agree that last night's opening session was a success. In all, 69 of the 93 horses offered brought \$23,965,000. The average--boosted by the \$4.2 million topper--was a very strong \$347,319, while the median was \$250,000. Last year's opener, with roughly twice as many horses going under the hammer, saw 107 horses bring \$24,949,000, an average of \$233,168. The 2009 median was \$200,000. Another positive indicator was sharp decline in the RNA rate. In 2009, the first-session RNA was 41 percent, compared to 25.81 percent last night.

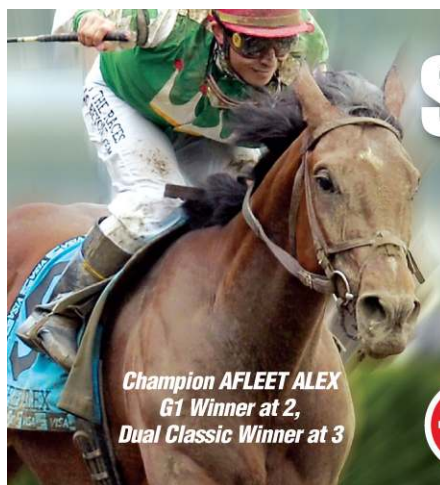
"It's a different format and a different world," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It's a new format, and a new Book 1 and a new Book 2, and in fairness to it all, there is no comparison."

Russell found plenty to be happy about, though. "There is nothing more exciting than to have a sale topper at a level that we haven't matched since 2006. We thought he was one of the top horses on the grounds and he delivered. There was a large group of buyers from all corners of the worlds, and they were buying at all levels, which is positive. The median was up, so that was very positive. The RNA rate was very good [25 percent], especially given this market and especially at this level of the market. The atmosphere here was exactly what we were trying to accomplish by this new format. There was an excitement and an electricity that the buyers got involved in. Having the group of buyers that we did, I think our goal was successful."

There were areas of concern, however. John Ferguson, Sheikh Mohammed's principal bloodstock agent, made but one purchase, landing hip 2--a colt by the Darley stallion Bernardini out of Victory Ride (Seeking the Gold)--for \$450,000. Ferguson signed for 14 yearlings last year on Day 1 for a total outlay of \$4,830,000. Similarly, rival Coolmore made just a single purchase, acquiring hip 40, a colt by A.P. Indy out of GISW Friendly Michelle (Artax), for \$600,000. Coolmore was, however, the direct underbidder on the \$4.2 million topper.

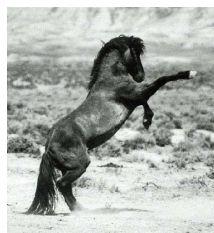

Behkabad was three-for-three after garnering a first piece of black-type in this track's G3 Prix des Chenes over a mile in September, but lost his perfect tag on his seasonal return when only third in the Listed Prix Omnium over that trip in testing ground at Saint-Cloud



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Apr. 1. Stepped up a panel for Chantilly's G3 Prix de Guiche May 10, the dark bay registered a hard-fought win before staying on for fourth in that venue's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) over 1 5/16-mile June 6. Up to this trip for the first time in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris, he got

first run on Planteur there and had 3/4 of a length to spare at the line. Settled behind that rival this time as the pair tracked the Wildenstein pacemaker Vivre Libre (GB) (Sadler's Wells), he had to do the chasing in the straight, as Anthony Crastus sent Planteur into the lead.

Taking time to find top stride, he eventually clicked for Christophe-Patrice Lemaire's urgings and managed to grind his way past his nemesis in the shade of the post. "He is a brave horse and has never run a bad race," winning trainer Jean-Claude Rouget commented. "A mile and a half is his best trip, and when you go back to the Prix du Jockey-Club, you will see he is the only horse finishing well. He didn't have a hard race today, as this wasn't the target, and we'll bring him back for the Arc." Planteur's conditioner Elie Lellouche is looking for some progress in that autumn feature and said of the runner-up, "My horse has run very well again and the last time he was a bit further behind Behkabad and was not 100 percent," he explained. "We will bring him back for the Arc and, as he's still a lightly raced horse, I think there is more improvement to come so we'll hope for the best." Kidnapping was third for Italy, but his representative Alessandro Botti suggested that a return in three weeks was not on the agenda. "He has run a very good race behind France's two top three-year-old colts and, while it would be too much at this stage to ask him to run in the Arc, maybe next year it will be his target," he said.

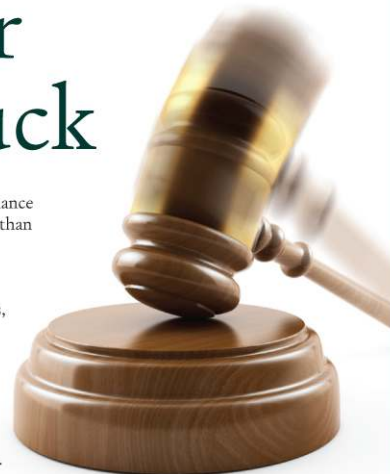

"It has been a great journey, but that is the end of the road," trainer Michael Bell told *PA Sport*. "We've done everything we could and she didn't come out, so enough is enough." As well as her Classic exploits in 2009, Sariska was also the winner of that year's G3 Musidora S. and third in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket. This term, she had returned to add York's G2 Middleton S. to her tally May 13 before finding only Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) too strong in Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup June 4. She retires as the winner of five of her nine starts and over £728,000 in prizemoney.

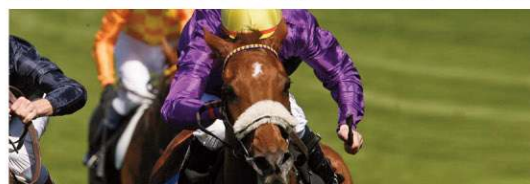

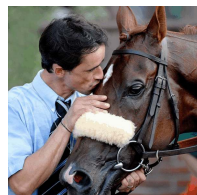
