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GALILEO FILLY SHINES AT TATTS OPENER

A daughter of Galileo (Ire) starred on the opening day of Tattersalls' Book 1 October Yearling Sale in Newmarket yesterday afternoon, selling to Coolmore supremo John Magnier for 1.2 million guineas. Out of Alluring Park (Ire) (Green Desert), a half-sister to Galileo's 2008 G1 Epsom Derby hero New Approach (Ire),

she was, like that colt, bred and consigned from Seamus Burns's Lodge Park Stud. Bidding was kicked off for the filly by Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock, and he soon faced another determined opponent in Charlie Gordon-Watson. Magnier entered the fray at 875,000gns and he eventually relegated Pritchard-Gordon to the role of underbidder. "Her pedigree is there for all to see, it's a great page and her sire needs no introduction," said Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne. "She's for the usual partnership [including Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith], and I'm sure it's likely that she'll be going to [trainer Aidan O'Brien at] Ballydoyle." **Tatts Coverage cont. p2**

Another Success for Lodge Park Stud...

"I thought she was the best filly I ever bred," asserted Seamus Burns after seeing the hammer fall at 1.2 million guineas for the opening session's top lot, a Galileo (Ire) youngster offered from his Lodge Park Stud.

A hush fell around Park Paddocks as bidding for the filly ([hip 59](#)), whose dam, Alluring Park (Ire) (Green Desert), is a winning sister to Japanese Group 1 winner Shinko Forest (Ire) (Green Desert) and a half-sister to G1 Epsom Derby winner New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), moved inevitably towards the seven-figure mark.

John Magnier, whose Coolmore operation stands Galileo, sealed the filly's fate as he saw off Grant Pritchard-Gordon.

Lodge Park Stud, located outside the village of Lisdowney in Co. Kilkenny, Ireland, has a glittering reputation as a producer of top-flight performers, stretching back to Folle Rousse's (GB) victory in the 1968 Prix Robert Papin. The Stud's finest achievements over the past 20 years have been built upon the progeny of Ahonoora (GB)'s two outstanding daughters, Park Express (GB) and Park Appeal (Ire).

Park Express, the Galileo filly's second dam, ended 1986 as Ireland's champion filly with a Group 1 triumph in the Irish Champion S., and this latest offering from her exceptional line was always going to attract attention from the big-hitters.

"Credit must go to my sons and Jennifer Rooney, who looked after the filly," continued Burns. "I had a 300,000 guineas reserve and someone opened at 500,000 guineas--that was a bit of a shock. I have been at it a very long time and it is hard to get it that right."

Turnover for the day fell by 11 percent to 14,921,000gns, while the 66,000gns median was down 18 percent. The average dropped by eight percent to 102,199gns. The three-day sale continues today, with bidding beginning at 10:30 a.m.

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Familiarity Breeds Expense...

Sheikh Hamdan Al Maktoum was at the sale in person and his racing manager Angus Gold was busy adding to Shadwell's 2011 juvenile team. Leading Shadwell's purchases was, [hip 114](#), a Nayef half-brother to G1 Fillies' Mile second Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells), bred by Fittocks Stud and consigned from Highclere Stud.

The colt had a 525,000gns price tag by the time Gold, taking instructions by telephone, won a duel with Magnier. "He's by a horse that is close to Sheikh Hamdan, and we still very much believe in him," Gold said of Nayef. "The mare has bred a top seven-furlong and mile filly by Sadler's Wells,

so hopefully he should bring a bit of speed in the family. To be honest, I didn't think he would make quite that. I thought maybe 250,000gns to 300,000gns, but they valued him that highly, too." **Cont. p3**



Titan Clash a Win for Fittocks Stud...

Sara and Luca Cumani's Fittocks Stud benefited from the unlikely Shadwell versus Coolmore head to head, as the two behemoths skirmished over the handsome bay colt by Hamdan Al Maktoum's Shadwell stallion Nayef (Gulch).

Angus Gold, racing manager of Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company, proved determined to ensure the colt will join his sire under the Shadwell banner. Nayef won four Group 1 races in the blue and white Hamdan silks, before retiring to his owner's Nunnery Stud.

The Nayef colt, consigned by Highclere Stud, is a half-brother to Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells), twice a Group 3 winner and runner-up in the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile when sporting the Fittocks Stud colours for her breeder and trainer Luca Cumani. George Strawbridge purchased Fantasia privately from the Cumanis in February 2009, and the filly, racing out of Jonathan Sheppard's barn, finished fifth to Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the G1 Just a Game S. at Belmont in June.

"We are absolutely thrilled," said Sara Cumani. "He's a lovely, lovely horse, but in your wildest dreams you don't think those two [Shadwell and Coolmore] are going to get together. I'm surprised Coolmore was interested, but he's a really good horse."

The colt's immediate family is one that the Maktoums know well. His dam, Blue Symphony (GB) (Darshaan {GB}), raced for her late breeder Maktoum Al Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud, while Darley bred her second dam, the champion two-year-old Blue Duster (Danzig), who raced for Sheikh Mohammed and his Godolphin operation.

"We bought the dam privately in foal to Montjeu (Ire) when Fantasia was a yearling," continued Cumani. "She has just been amazing for us. She has a Galileo foal who we will keep, and she is in foal to Pivotal (GB) again. We sent her to Nayef because she had a lot of money spent on her and Nayef's nomination was £10,000 at the time. He was a stallion doing well at a reasonable price, and a lot of money had gone into her, so if she wasn't going to prove successful, it was a good mating for the money."

Sara Cumani added, "Highclere has done a great job preparing him. We would have been happy with 200,000gns to 250,000gns, so it is great because we have a large nomination bill looking at us. If we were in a position where we kept everything, it would be fantastic, but unfortunately certain ones have got to go. Luca complains that the nice ones have got to go and he is left to train the also-rans. You never know, because sometimes the ones that aren't obvious are the ones that go on to be racehorses. We have 14 mares and we are still developing the stud, so this is great for us. The most important thing of all is that he is a racehorse, and the best of luck to Sheikh Hamdan."

Landing a Hay-Maker...

Dubai-based Scotsman Dr. Jim Hay, who won Saturday's GII Hawthorne Gold Cup with the Kiaran McLaughlin-trained Redding Colliery (Mineshaft), saw off Sir Robert Ogden for a 410,000gns Galileo (Ire) colt sold from John and Lady Carolyn Warren's Highclere Stud. "We got seven last week at Goffs and this is the third we've got today," said Hay. "There are a lot of nice horses here and I've not seen a catalogue like this for a while. This was lovely colt with a great walk to him and he will go to Paul Cole." Hay has 35 horses in training. His business interests include a lifestyle company in England. "The racing is part of that business. A lot of our clients are involved in racing," he added.

Ogden had earlier outbid Hay's racing manager Alex Cole for a Dansili (GB) colt out of Group 2 winner All My Loving (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) at 375,000gns. "Sir Robert thought this was a really good individual with a great pedigree," said racing manager Barry Simpson. Ogden also spent 350,000gns on a Galileo (Ire) half-sister to G2 Ribblesdale S. winner Fairy Queen (Ire) (Fairy King) sold from Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud.

Parks Farm Enjoys Success...

A Galileo (Ire) half-brother to this season's Group 2-placed juvenile The Paddyman (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) made an early splash at the Tattersalls October Sale Book 1 yesterday when selling to Demi O'Byrne for 380,000 guineas. The sale marks a notable success for Bob and Pauline Scott's Parks Farm Stud. The colt ([hip 22](#)) is the second produce of their four-time winner Winds of Time (Ire) (Danehill).

"We bought the mare as a racehorse here in the Houghton Sale seven years ago, and she was pretty expensive. We paid 350,000 guineas for her," said Bob Scott. "We put her into training with Amanda Perrett, and she won a Newmarket maiden on her only start at two. Her three-year-old season was a bit of a

disaster, so we sent her to the States and she won three races over there at Woodbine and Fair Grounds. She would have been pretty close to favouritism for a graded race in New Orleans one New Year's Day, so we flew over there to see her, but she did a leg and that was it. The good news being, as she was in the States, we sent her to Giant's Causeway, and her first foal was The Paddyman, who races in our colours."

Scott, the retired former chief executive of major UK bookmaking chain Coral, established Parks Farm Stud with his wife in 2006.

"We converted the farm and set it up as a stud," he revealed. "It started off as a hobby, but having bought a couple of nice fillies, it has become more of a business in the past few years, and we are trying to do it more seriously. We have eight mares now, and that is about where we want it. What we perhaps do need to do now is upgrade as the opportunity arises. This is easily our best result at the sales. We have only consigned at two or three others, and they did not do too well, so I am very pleased with this result."

Scott's faith in Winds of Time was the main reason for the mare's covering to Galileo, the other being the breeder's boyish enthusiasm for a stallion that captured his imagination as a champion racehorse.

"My two favourite racehorses, of those that were about, were Giant's Causeway and Galileo. We went to Giant's Causeway in the U.S., so we had to send her to Galileo next. I'm a big believer in breeding to stallions I liked as racehorses. I tend not to go to stallions I did not like as racehorses. I love stallions like Selkirk and Singspiel (Ire), which aren't particularly commercial, but they were serious racehorses. We also wanted to give the mare a proper chance, because she is a really good horse, and I believe she had more ability than her page says. I think her career was just taking off when she suffered that injury. We invested in expensive coverings to give her the chance to make that impact, and I would not be surprised if she went back to Galileo now. Unfortunately, we didn't get her in foal this year, so that's a blow, but the advantage is that we can travel her if we want to. She could not have got a much better start with those two stallions, and this Galileo yearling in particular is a lovely, athletic sort of horse. He has been out of his box over 100 times. You know you've got a decent horse when that many people come looking, so I would have been disappointed if he did not sell well. He is a nice-looking Galileo, and the mare has shown with The Paddyman that she can produce a good horse. If you go back in the pedigree, you've got quality in there with Gull Nook (GB) (Mill Reef) and Pentire (GB) (Be My Guest), among others."

Parks Farm Stud offers two more lots on Thursday, a Singspiel colt ([hip 534](#)) and an Excellent Art filly ([hip 625](#)), although Scott's expectations are more grounded. "We have a gorgeous Singspiel, who is not in the Galileo colt's league in terms of pedigree, but I would say that he is actually a nicer horse," Scott offered. "I am excited about him as a horse, and he is out of the first mare we bought, Rainbow Queen (Fr) (Spectrum {Ire})."

"His owners wanted to see him race again, but he has been on the go non-stop for more than a year, and it's been a long season competing in top-class races," Redvers commented.

Redvers added, "He had his first race this year in April before he won the Guineas. He now has a dose of ringworm and, while it will clear up quickly, there is no guarantee he will be 100 percent for his next race. At that level, you have to be at the top of your game. The form of his Prix Jacques le Marois victory, when he beat Goldikova and Paco Boy, was brilliantly upheld in the G1 Qatar Prix de la Foret on Sunday. On balance, this was the right time to retire him--he will arrive at Tweenhills Stud in November."

Trained by Mikel Delzangles for Mathieu Offenstadt, Makfi was a winner in his lone racecourse appearance at two, then kicked off 2010 with a score in the G3 Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte prior to his 33-1 upset of Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) and Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) in Newmarket's spring centerpiece May 1 ([video](#)). Faced with the seemingly thankless task of facing the likes of Goldikova and British raider Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) in the Marois, he proved more than equal to the task, handing the two-time defending Breeders' Cup Mile heroine a 2 1/2-length defeat ([video](#)). Makfi will stand at a fee of £25,000.

"We have been besieged with applications by mare owners who want to use him next year, and it is likely his book will be closed by the final day of the December Sales [Dec. 3]," Redvers continued. Offenstadt said, "He's been the horse of a lifetime--a dream come true. He had everything a champion needs, including pedigree, a turn of foot and personality. Now I want to find him a wonderful mare, well-bred and beautiful, so I can breed my own Makfi's and continue the story."

Delzangles added, "Being involved with Makfi has been a great pleasure and wonderful for a young trainer. He was very easy for a jockey in races, because he could go any pace and he has everything a horse needs to be a top stallion. He has a fine physique, good temperament, a great pedigree and he was a top-class racehorse. It will be sad to say goodbye to him, but he has an exciting future." Makfi was bred by Shadwell Estate Company and is out of a half-sister to champion Alhaarth (Ire). He retires with a record of 6-4-0-0 and earnings of \$867,457.

Gulf Coast to Disperse at KEENOV...

Jerry Bailey and Lance Robinson's Gulf Coast Farms, the breeder of last year's champion two-year-old colt and Classic winner **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike),

announced Tuesday it begin to disperse its bloodstock holdings at the upcoming Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. Taylor Made Sales Agency will consign for the Florida-based operation.

"Mare Leasing Programs are just not a viable option in this economy," said Bailey. "This doesn't mean, however, that anything else will change: our operation in Florida will continue to conduct business as usual, we will continue to train horses at our training center, and we will

still be very much involved in the Thoroughbred business."

The Gulf Coast Farm consignment is comprised of 91 horses—49 broodmares, 36 weanlings and six racing or broodmare prospects. Gulf Coast Farms has bred no fewer than 27 stakes winners since its inception, including this year's graded stakes winner and leading two-year-old Lou Brissie (Limehouse), multiple graded

stakes winner Grand Adventure (Grand Slam), and Grade 3 winner and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Conveyance (Indian Charlie), as well as winners Distorted Passion (Distorted Humor), Greeley's Rocket (Mr. Greeley), and Road Ready (More Than Ready). Gulf Coast

has also bred, campaigned and/or purchased the likes of Thunder Gulch, Henny Hughes, Yes It's True, Honour and Glory, Kensei, Cowtown Cat and Salute The Sarge, and is currently the second-leading breeder of graded stakes winners in 2010. Last year, at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, Gulf Coast sold Lookin At Lucky's dam Private Feeling (Belong to Me), for \$2 million. Live Oak Stud purchased the then-10-year-old. Gulf Coast had previously acquired her as a broodmare for \$130,000.

gave the green light for the four-time Group 1-winning five-year-old to contest the 10-furlong event. "The plan is for Vision d'Etat to come over to Newmarket for

the Emirates Airline Champion S.," Libaud explained. "He is well at the moment and has come on since his victory [in the G3 Prix Gontaut-Biron] at Deauville in August. We had considered running him in the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, but his distance is 10 furlongs, and a mile and a half at Longchamp is a true test for a horse, especially on soft ground. His best form has always been at around 10 furlongs, and the main objective was always to go to Newmarket with him. He has won four Group 1 races at around 10 furlongs, so we hope that he would go to Newmarket with a good chance. We will see how he gets on there, but the aim is for him to then go to Hong Kong to defend his title in the [Dec. 12 G1] Hong Kong Cup. Then, he is heading off to stud."

Vega to Return next Year...

Gestut Ammerland's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Lope de Vega (Ire)** (Shamardal) will race on at four, connections announced yesterday. Only 12th, before later being promoted to 11th, after being the worst-affected by the interference which caused the enquiry in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, the Andre Fabre trainee will get the chance to add to his tally in 2010. Owner Dietrich von Boetticher told the *Racing Post*, "That was Lope de Vega's best run since the Prix du Jockey Club, and he seemed to get the trip--he was still going well with two furlongs remaining. He received one bump--that didn't help his cause--and then he received another and that was too much. But that's racing. He will not race again this season, but will stay in training for next year. He will have a break, and I will leave it to Andre to plan his programme."

Look for the (K) throughout the TDN graded stakes entries, denoting Keeneland sales graduates.



St Nick Poised for Sunday Return...

Derrick Smith's **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) looks set to make his eagerly awaited return in Sunday's Listed Finale S. at The Curragh. Not seen since finishing sixth in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas, last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner and champion two-year-old will be pointed at the 12-furlong contest, which was used to reintroduce Scorpion (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in 2006 prior to his GI Breeders' Cup Turf bid. "We're still looking at starting him back in the Finale S. at The Curragh on Sunday, if we are happy with him later in the week," Aidan O'Brien told the *Racing Post*.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT RACING

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GRADE 1 WEEKEND

What a weekend--21 Grade I or Group 1 races in Britain, France, and the U.S. last Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, leading me to two observations: the first is, to crucify Voltaire, if there weren't a Breeders' Cup, it would be necessary to invent one. There were so many interesting results that it may take until next month to digest them all. Fourteen of the Group or Grade I races were run on turf--12 of them on soft ground--in Newmarket, Belmont Park, and Longchamp. Only the two grass Grade Is in California were run on firm turf.

Among any number of impressive performances, three stood out on the soft turf: the unbeaten English two-year-old Dream Ahead (Diktat) won the six-furlong G1 Middle Park S. last Friday at Newmarket by nine lengths. He needs cut in the ground, so whether it keeps on raining will determine whether he will take on the likes of Frankel (Galileo), Saamid (Street Cry), and Native Khan (Azamour) in what could be a vintage renewal of the G1 Dewhurst S. in 10 days' time. At Longchamp, the mighty Goldikova (Anabaa) tuned up for her attempt at a third win in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile with a cheeky victory over Paco Boy (Desert Style) and Dick Turpin (Arakan) in the seven-furlong G1 Prix de la Foret. And, of course, Workforce (King's Best) returned to his G1 Epsom Derby-winning form with a battling win in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe over the Japanese-trained four-year-old Nakayama Festa (by Stay Gold, a son of Sunday Silence), followed home by the Aga Khan's pair of Sarafina (Refuse to Bend) and Bekhabad (Cape Cross), with Fame and Glory (Montjeu) fifth.

Paco Boy (Desert Style), a Group 1 winner at three, four, and five, has won 10 of his 20 starts for his syndicate of enthusiastic owners, and will likely close out his career, before retiring to Britain's Highclere Stud, by attempting to beat Goldikova for the first time in five tries in the Mile. The one-two finishers in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth S. 10 days ago, Godolphin's Poet's Voice (Dubawi) and Coolmore's Rip Van Winkle (Galileo), are also due to line up. Unfortunately, the amazing Dubawi's previous best three-year-old miler Makfi--G1 English 2000 Guineas and G1 Prix de Jacques le Marois winner, defeating Goldikova and Paco Boy--ran a poor race at Ascot (for the second time, his only two defeats), and has subsequently been retired. But Poet's Voice will ensure the newest sire sensation will still be represented among what looks like a very salty European contingent for the Breeders' Cup Mile.

At this writing, there was even a possibility that Canford Cliffs (Tagula), whose last three starts have brought Group 1 wins in the Irish 2000 Guineas, St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, and the Sussex S. at Goodwood (defeating Rip Van Winkle), but who's not been out since July, could join the field. Now part-owned by Coolmore, and, like Paco Boy and Dick Turpin, trained by Richard Hannon, he could be the real joker in the pack if he ran.

Workforce, owned by Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farm and a first Arc winner for 10-time British champion trainer Sir Michael Stoute, is a possibility, it seems, for the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf, but as he hadn't run since his tame fifth behind Harbinger (Dansili) in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot at the end of July, it's likely that Sunday's race was the only target connections had in mind for Workforce. But he's

clearly a really talented colt, and would be another star addition to what's looking like a Breeders' Cup with some real star quality.

None more so, of course, than the great Zenyatta (Street Cry), who will surely close out her career by attempting to win her 20th race (and 14th Grade I) without defeat when she tries to repeat her 2009 win over the colts at Santa Anita in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic. Last year, in her first race at 10 furlongs, she improved her previous best Beyer for the year by eight points to defeat Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat). This year, the field may include him, but will also include dual 2010 Grade I winner Blame (Arch); his conqueror last weekend, Haynesfield (Speightstown); Quality Road (Elusive Quality); and this year's top three-year-old colt, Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike), who tuned up with a 'penalty kick' at 2-5 in the GII Indiana Derby. This year's Classic does look like being a vintage renewal. **Cont. p13**



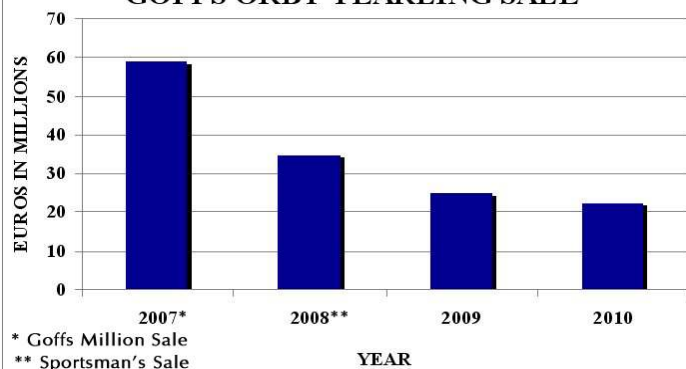

"Goffs' three-day 'middle-market' sale last week was down 10 percent in gross and four percent in average. The opening day of Tattersalls' premier October 1 yearling sale yesterday was down 10 percent in average, and 15 percent in median, compared to the entire three-day October 1 sale last year. Still, they are on course to sell something over 400 horses this week for an average of around \$160,000. Keeneland September had good stability for at least the upper half of that market, and that theme is continuing, so far, at the major European sales."

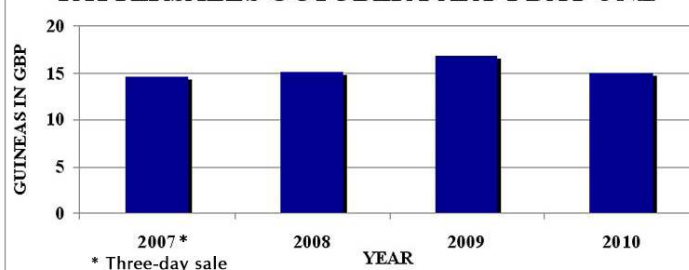

Darley Stallions On a Roll...

My second observation has to do with the development of the Darley stallion operation, which really came into focus when Sheikh Mohammed spent an estimated \$200 million buying most of the best three-year-olds in North America and Europe during the 2007 season. In America, that included Street Sense, Hard Spun, and Any Given Saturday; in Europe, Teofilo, Authorized, and the then five-year-old Manduro. All have their first yearlings selling this year, but don't come on line as actual sires until next year. The expectation was that Darley wouldn't achieve any kind of parity with the long-established Coolmore operation for some time yet. But all of a sudden Darley had more sires of more Group/Grade I winners over the weekend than Coolmore. Just counting the European and North American results, Darley had five different sires hit the target last weekend (Diktat, Sinngpiel, Iffraaj, King's Best, and Street Cry); Coolmore had three sires of four Group/Grade I races (Galileo x 2, Danehill Dancer, and Fusaichi Pegasus). They Darley has Dubawi (and maybe Shamardal) following the development of Cape Cross, Elusive Quality, and Street Cry (and Medaglia D'Oro, who kind of fell into its lap). One weekend does not a trend make, but it is striking how much the Darley breeding operations have progressed in the last couple of years. The pace of progress has been much faster than I think even they expected.

Meanwhile, at the Sales...

Dozens if not scores of sales professionals watched some or all of last weekend's 21 Group/Grade I races at Newmarket, where Europe's most important yearling sale, Tattersalls' October 1, got underway yesterday. Following last week, when Europe's middle-market yearlings definitely held their own at Goffs (*see the*

Weekly Sales Ticker), Tattersalls' opening day was down about 10 percent on average and 15 percent on median from last year's entire sale (three-day) figures. In both cases, the sale is three days, alphabetical by dam for the entire book, so this is probably the most accurate comparison

(we have shown first day to first day in the Sales Ticker). John Ferguson, Shadwell, Rabbah, and Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne bought 24 yearlings totaling over 4.7 million guineas among them on the sale's opening day--just under a third of the nearly 15 million guineas traded yesterday. With Alex Cole (for Mrs. Fitri Hay), Dwayne Woods (Andrew Tinkler), and Sir Robert Ogden also on the scoresheets, yesterday's session saw 146 yearlings average over 102,000gns. At that rate, the entire sale will see well over 400 horses average somewhere right around 100,000gns. That may be down from last year, and profitability may well be at record lows given 2008 stud fees. Nonetheless, in today's world, to sell over 400 yearlings for around 100,000 gns each by the end of this week would seem a pretty good achievement. Plenty of agents were in action yesterday, too. The BBA Ireland and Peter Doyle signed for seven horses each, and Blandford Bloodstock and Kern/Lillingston signed for six each. As at all of the major sales so far this year, plenty of trade is taking place.

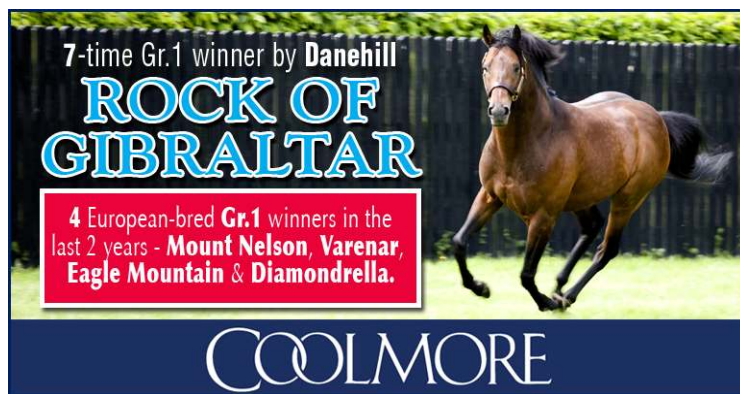

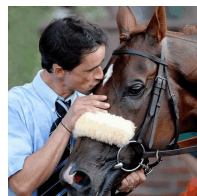
