CARLTON HOUSE CLOSER TO DERBY START

Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}) took a step closer to being in the line-up for tomorrow's 232nd edition of the "Blue Riband" after coming through a crucial canter in Newmarket yesterday morning. The Queen's G2 Dante S. winner received the widest draw of 13, but that should not be a major impediment as two of the last five winners emerged from double-figure stalls. The Queen's Racing Manager John Warren issued a statement to *PA Sport* yesterday evening that read, "We are pleased to report that Carlton House did a good exercise this morning and he is very much still on target for Saturday's Investec Derby."

Those drawn low yesterday included the Ballydoyle pair of **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Recital (Fr)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who will break from stalls two and four, respectively. While stablemate **Memphis Tennessee (Ire)** (Hurricane Run {Ire})--who was 1 1/2 lengths behind Recital when runner-up in the G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown May 8--is in six, the May 5 G3 Chester Vase winner **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) will exit from the 12 hole. "The Derby is unbelievably special--it is the ultimate test of a Thoroughbred," trainer Aidan O'Brien said yesterday, before heaping praise on last year's G1 Criterion de Saint-Cloud hero Recital. "He is a brilliant horse with a very instant turn of foot, and we were happy with him last time. [Jockey] Kieren [Fallon] hadn't ridden him before, and he surprised him by how well he traveled. When he asked him to go, he went there and he was by himself. Off a strong pace, with a big headwind, he started looking around, and Kieren was very good on him. We've been happy with him since and he has that kick of brilliance that suggests he will definitely get a mile and a quarter, but we're taking the rest on trust. He has plenty of class and horses who travel like he does usually don't have any problems with the track." Last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy runner-up Seville bids to emulate last year's winner Workforce (GB) (King's Best) by improving off a well-beaten second in York's Dante May 12 "We were very happy with Seville at York, as he was only just ready to start and it was a slowly run race," said O'Brien. "That didn't suit any horse in the race and he ran a real nice race and has been well since. We felt going there that he would improve as most of ours have this year and we are hoping that trend continues. We haven't worked him at home to find out if he has, so we're taking it on trust. Seville was always a very solid horse who you'd have thought would have no problem getting a mile and a half." *Cont. p4*

FOUR UP FOR BALLYDOYLE?

Ever-present on the European Classic scene, Aidan O'Brien is looking for a fourth win in today's G1 Investec Oaks at Epsom. Kieren Fallon, who

partnered O'Brien's 2006 heroine Alexandrova (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), is booked for the May 4 Listed Cheshire Oaks winner **Wonder of Wonders** (Kingmambo), with Ballydoyle stalwart Seamie Heffernan on G1 Irish 1000 Guineas heroine **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). The latter was unplaced in the May 1 G1 1000 Guineas. "We always thought

Misty For Me could be an Oaks filly and the plan was always to go to the two Guineas and step her up after that," O'Brien said yesterday. "She'll definitely get a mile and a quarter, but you can't be sure about the mile and a half until you run. We feel it would be wrong not to let Wonder of Wonders take her chance, as she's bred to do it and she won well at Chester. We are sure she'll stay." O'Brien added, "We always felt that **Why (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) is better than she had showed and has a great pedigree. We always liked **Eirnin (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) as well, and expect plenty of improvement from her. We feel that they could be good enough at home, so it's wrong not to let them take their chance."

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'Hav' Faith...

The 1978 edition of this Classic was one of the very first signs that Sir Michael Stoute was a burgeoning talent in the training ranks, but only one other success has followed the initial win of Fair Salinia (Ire) back then. In **Havant (GB)** (Halling), the master of Freemason Lodge appears to possess the raw material to taste glory for a third time, but she was only sixth in the Newmarket Guineas for which she had attracted notable support all spring.

She needs to prove that easy ground is not a pre-requisite, having excelled in those conditions when two-for-two as a juvenile. Her comprehensive defeat of Ballydoyle's Look At Me (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) and Khawlah (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in the G3 Oh So Sharp S. at Newmarket in October received mixed signals from the formbook subsequently, and owner James Wigan feels that the ground may be a significant factor here. "She ran very well at Newmarket on quick ground and it will probably be quick enough tomorrow, too," Stoute told *PA Sport*. "I think on pedigree she should get the trip, but she would probably prefer a bit more cut in the ground. She ran well enough in the Guineas to give one some sort of hope, but this is a different trip and a different track." **Cont. p3**

Mick Channon, one of the maverick members of his profession, has a talent for unearthing gems from his team of relatively inexpensive acquisitions and usually pitches a live contender into the mix in these contests. The man at the helm of West Ilsley, which housed the late Major Dick Hern's trio of Oaks heroines, has a solid representative this time in Jaber Abdullah's unbeaten May 7 Lingfield Oaks Trial winner **Zain Al Boldan (GB)** (Poliglote {GB}). She stepped up from a previous Folkestone handicap success to win that prep by six lengths, which was won by subsequent Oaks heroines Lady Carla (GB) (Caerleon) in 1996 and Ramrumba (Diesis {GB}) three years later. "It's a great opportunity for [jockey] Sam [Hitchcott] and the horse seems to be in good form," Channon said. "We go there with what we believe is a live chance. I'd be lying if I said I wasn't surprised by her progress, but we always liked her. She showed an awful lot of speed as a 2-year-old, but this year she's been crying out for a trip. She stays well, acts on any sort of ground and the contours in the track won't be a problem. She's a tough little filly and I just hope she's got the class to take that step further." Channon also has **Fork Handles (GB)** (Doyen {Ire}), who needs to improve on a latest third in the Cheshire Oaks. "She's a good filly in her own right, so it's exciting times," her trainer added.

Take a Chance On Me...

While tomorrow's Derby has added spice due to the presence of The Queen's Carlton House, the Oaks has its own sub-plot with ABBA's Benny Andersson represented by his first Classic runner in **Beatrice Aurore (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). She gained a late entry to this party when annexing Goodwood's Listed Height of Fashion S. May 18. Jessica Harrington saddles the twice-raced **Siren's Song (Ire)** (Azamour {Ire}), who booked her ticket with a win in the Listed Salsabil S. last time Apr. 17. "It's another Classic runner and while they seem to have run all right in the Classics in Ireland, they haven't done as well in England, so let's hope that changes," Harrington told *PA Sport*. "I'm very happy with the filly and the plan after Navan was always to come here. She's only had two runs and is quite inexperienced, but we like her a lot and are looking forward to the race." The Oaks is still absent on Barry Hills' honor roll, but it would take a leap of the imagination to see John Deer's maiden **Blaise Chorus (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) providing that watershed. Beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Wonder of Wonders when enjoying the run of the race in the Cheshire Oaks, she needs to improve markedly to feature. "This will only be her fourth run, so she is fairly unexposed and has improved every time she's run," Hills said. "She's working well with good standard older horses and, hopefully, she will give her owner John Deer a run for his money."

Speaking of his Derby outsiders, trainer Aidan O'Brien added, "Hopefully, Memphis Tennessee has come on and should have a good chance of getting a mile and a half. He ran a lovely race first time and is a straightforward horse, so we're hoping he runs well. Treasure Beach is a solid horse as well."

Stall 10 has a fabled history here, with the recent winners Sir Percy (GB) and Galileo (Ire) breaking from

that post position to add to a list which includes Shahrastani, Reference Point (GB), Nashwan, Quest For Fame (GB) and Generous (Ire). This time, it will be Godolphin's **Ocean War (GB)** (Dalakhani {Ire}) who has been handed that "lucky" draw. Unbeaten in two starts this year, the grey has supplanted his stable companion Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal) as the operation's number one here and that may be significant, as that Racing Post Trophy winner would have been the

top-rated colt had he lined up. His win in the Apr. 30 Listed Newmarket S. over 10 furlongs does not inspire maximum confidence, but in an open year he must be respected. "Ocean War is in very good form at the moment," trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni commented. "He is improving all of the time and we don't know how good he could be." **Cont. p5**



The going remained officially "good" yesterday, with watering continuing. Andrew Cooper, Director of Racing and Clerk of the Course, commented, "There is plenty of moisture in the ground and, though the course will dry in the good weather, we hope to start Saturday on going that is no worse than good, good-to-firm in places. The course is in great shape and it walks quite even and consistent. The grass cover is good and the going is slightly better than for the start of the meeting last year."

Fallon May Be Forced to Miss Recital Ride...

Kieren Fallon could be forced onto the sidelines for tomorrow's G1 Investec Derby after an injunction has been requested by the owner of Native Khan (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}). Booked to ride Recital (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) by Aidan O'Brien this week, the triple Derby-winning jockey is alleged by Ibrahim Araci to have previously promised to partner his colt in the "Blue Riband." Fallon has denied breach of contract, claiming that there has been an "innocent misunderstanding", but lawyers for Araci put forward the case that he had been "badly let down" by the jockey. High Court judge Mr Justice MacDuff, will give his ruling this morning.

With Godolphin and Ballydoyle making the expected withdrawals of Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal), Genius Beast (Kingmambo) and Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) yesterday, the only surprise was the scratching of Lady Rothschild's G3 Chester Vase runner-up Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on account of the likely fast ground.

TAKING ANOTHER CRACK AT EPSOM

Bjorn Nielsen will be returning to Epsom in more ways than one come Saturday. The owner's black-and-yellow colors have left the gate twice in Europe's most prestigious Classic, first in 1992, aboard Assessor (Ire) (Niniksi), then on Redenham (Sir Ivor) a year later. After an 18-year absence, those silks will once again fly from the barrier on Derby day, this time on **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}). John Gosden trains the lightly raced 3-year-old, who has won two of four starts, including a last-out victory in the Listed IBA Cocked Hat S. at Goodwood May 18 ([video](#)).

Nielsen's roots at Epsom run deeper than that, however. Born in Cape Town, South Africa, he moved to the United Kingdom during his grammar school years.

"I lived and went to school in a little place called Epsom, where they run a little race called the Epsom Derby--otherwise known as the "Blue Riband" of the turf," said the 53-year-old Nielsen.

And while he didn't stay in Epsom--he eventually landed in America--he looks forward to returning to his boyhood home to root on a horse who, though currently pegged at 25-1 by William Hill, could figure in the exotics if he takes a step forward off his latest.

"Masked Marvel is an improving horse who is trained by a great trainer," said Nielsen. "He'll love the ground, should act on the track, and will stay the trip."

Today, Nielsen calls Greenwich, Connecticut, home, where he is a partner at a successful hedge fund.

"I trade the markets; it's what I have done my whole working life," he said.

He also owns race horses. Before he even arrived on British soil, he was cultivating an interest in the sport as a child.

"Growing up in South Africa, I would always listen to the races on the radio like the Durban July H.," he said. "I will never forget the commentary of that race when Sea Cottage dead-heated with Jollify back in 1965."

And though his family had little interest in racing, he said living in Epsom fueled his interest in the sport.

Nielsen bought his first horse some two decades ago, and, as sometimes happens, enjoyed immediate success. One of his first runners was Assessor, a Richard Hannon-trained colt who would ultimately win the G1 Prix Royal Oak and G1 Prix du Cadran. Prior to that, though, Assessor finished third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at two, won the G3 Derby Trial S. at Lingfield at three, and went off co-third choice in the Epsom Derby. Assessor never really got going, though, and came home 13th of 18 in a race won by Sidney Craig's Dr Devious (Ire) (Ahonoora {GB}).

"Assessor was one of the favorites, but because of his style of running, I had reservations about how he would perform," Nielsen admitted. "He was also one of my first horses and, at the time, I thought getting to the Derby way easy. Eighteen years later, I've learned that this definitely is not the case."

Eighteen years--not 19--because just a year later, in 1993, Nielsen was back at Epsom with Redenham. Another trained by Hannon, Redenham ran seventh of 16, soundly beaten by Commander In Chief (GB) (Dancing Brave).

If Nielsen learned trips to the Derby don't come easily, he at least enjoyed another top runner in the form of the top sprint filly Tante Rose (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}).

"I bought Tante Rose at the end of her 3-year-old year, partially because I already owned her dam and was quite familiar with her," said Nielsen.

A daughter of the G1 1000 Irish Guineas third My Branch (GB) (Distant Relative {Ire}), Tante Rose won all three of her starts for Nielsen in 2004, including the G3 Summer S. and, in her career finale, took the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup against males.

"Roger Charlton trained her brilliantly," said Nielsen. "She wound up being champion older sprint mare [in England]. Sadly, she died leaving just one filly foal."

That foal was Rose Diamond (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}), who was second in the G3 Prestige S. as a 2-year-old in 2008 for Nielsen. She's currently in foal to Smart Strike. It's interesting to note that Tante Rose is a half-sister to Rosie's Posy (Ire), dam of Monday's GI Gamely S. heroine Dubawi Heights (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}).

Despite the fact that he lives in the U.S., Nielsen said he prefers to racing in Europe.

"I grew up on it," he explained. "The big difference between European and American racing, apart from the surfaces, is the variety of racetracks and race distances. American tracks tend to be uniform, and everything is speed based. In Europe, all racetracks are out in the countryside, vary in conformation, and races are run anywhere from five furlongs up to 2 1/2 miles."

In 2009, a few months after he purchased Masked Marvel as a yearling, Nielsen made a sizable commitment to British racing by purchasing the training yard Kingsdown Stables in Lambourn.

"Kingsdown came on the market during the financial crisis," said Nielsen. "I thought it was a good opportunity to acquire some land in England, which was something I always wanted to do. Currently, it's under complete refurbishment. I'm hopeful that a top trainer will be installed in the not too distant future, but that's undecided. Lambourn is one of the most beautiful places in the country. It has a fantastic array of gallops--not just at Kingsdown, but at Neardown and Mandown, as well. Lambourn is situated very close to several major racecourses, including Newbury, Ascot, Epsom and Sandown. It's just an hour from London's West End and 45 minutes from Heathrow."

Nielsen, who has about 20 flat horses in training, purchased Masked Marvel for €260,000 at the ARQ AUG sale. Bloodstock agent Jeremy Brummitt signed the ticket.

"Jeremy is one of the guys who helps me, along with Tom Goff and Charlie Gordon-Watson," said Nielsen.

Explaining their buying strategy, he added, "With fillies, I tend to look for a bit more speed. When it comes to colts, I am always looking at Derby-type pedigrees, and Masked Marvel definitely fit that bill. To Jeremy's credit, he loved the horse, and John Gosden was pretty keen on him from the get-go."

Asked if he breeds, as well, Nielsen said, "Yes, I have three daughters! Joking aside, I have between 12 and 16 mares that are boarded at Watership Down in England and Kiltinan Castle in Ireland. Simon Marsh and his staff do a fantastic job for me."

Nielsen has been gearing up for his Epsom experience with a visit to Roland Garros in Paris to watch the ongoing French Open, and while the men's bracket there wound up being the model of form--the first four seeds made the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam tournament for just the 12th time in the Open era--Nielsen is hoping the weekend holds a bit of luck for some longshots.

"I am not expecting to win, but I'm hopeful Masked Marvel will run a good race," said Nielsen.

The Aga Khan

H H THE AGA KHAN - Vadamar

Born in Geneva, Prince Karim Aga Khan spent much of his childhood in Kenya before continuing his education in Switzerland. He succeeded his grandfather in 1956 as the Imam of the Shia Imami Nizari Ismaili Muslims, a hereditary title, and is officially titled H.R.H. Shah Karim al-Hussayni, The Aga Khan IV. He skied for Iran in the 1964 Winter Olympics. After graduating from Harvard, he founded the Aga Khan Development Network, which strives to further social and economic development. *Forbes Magazine* once described the Aga Khan as the "venture capitalist of the Third World." Involved in horse racing from his youth, the Aga Khan acquired the bloodstock holdings of Francois Dupre and Marcel Boussac in the 1970s. His first Epsom Derby win came via the ill-fated Shergar (GB) in 1981, and the famed green-and-red colors were also carried to victory in the "Blue Riband" with Shahrastani in 1986, Kahyasi (Ire) in 1988 and Sinndar (Ire) in 2000. In 2005, he acquired the bloodstock of Jean-Luc Lagardere. The Aga Khan, who is the majority shareholder of the French auction house Arqana, also bred and campaigned the unbeaten Zarkava (Ire), Europe's Horse of the Year in 2008. He has breeding farms in France and Ireland.



Ahmad Al Shaikh

AHMAD AL SHAIKH - Marhaba

Malyoon (Ire) Managing director of Dubai Media Incorporated, Ahmad Al Shaikh began his career as a journalist before moving on to visual media. As the Media Escort for His Highness Sheikh Mohammed, Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, Ahmad Al Shaikh tracks the media coverage for the Sheikh. One of the first sports commentators

for horse racing in Dubai, he also helped found the Dubai Sports Channel. The first UAE national to join the General Union of Foreign Journalists in the UK, Ahmad Al Shaikh is also on the Board of Directors of Dubai Equestrian Club, as well as the Board of Directors of Dubai Sports Council.



Ibrahim & Pinar Araci

VEFA IBRAHIM ARACI - Native Khan (Fr)

The 52-year-old Turkish businessman is president of the Koruma Group, which was a chemical company when Araci bought it in 1994, but now includes subsidiaries involved in, among other things, construction, transportation and tourism. The family was introduced to racing by daughter Pinar, who rode as a child and got involved in the sport while at university in England. Araci bought his first bloodstock--three mares--at TATDEC in 2007, and the following year purchased Vefa Stud in Turkey. Managed by Pinar, the farm is home to 60 horses. Native Khan was named for Araci's father.



Sheikh Mohammed

GODOLPHIN - Ocean War

Godolphin is the Thoroughbred racing operation of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, who became the ruler of Dubai in 2006. He is also prime minister and vice president of the UAE. Sheikh Mohammed rode as a child, and visited his first racecourse while studying in England in 1967. Ten years later, he celebrated his first win as an owner. Godolphin, headquartered in Dubai, was established in 1992. Four years later, at the Sheikh's Nad Al Sheba Racecourse, the first running of the world's richest race, the G1 Dubai World Cup, was held. The event was moved to the state-of-the-art Meydan racecourse in 2010. Godolphin has won 174 Group/Grade I races in 12 countries.

MICHAEL KERR-DINEEN - Pisco

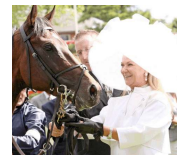
Sour Kerr-Dineen began his financial career with the Bank of England's Economic Intelligence Department, then joined the investment firm Guinness Peat Group, rising to the post of chief executive after growing the company's U.S. interests. After a stint in the U.S., he returned to England and was appointed chief executive of Credit Lyonnais Laing & Cruickshank in 1989, a post he held for 15 years. He now serves as CE of the investment group Cheviot Asset Management Limited.

A daughter of the legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien, Susan Magnier is married to John Magnier, who heads up the global Coolmore empire alongside various property interests, including the Sandy Lane Hotel in Barbados. Tabor, born in London and currently based in Monaco, founded the bookmaker Arthur Prince before selling it for £28 million in 1995. Having gotten involved as an owner in the early 1990s, Tabor tasted early success when his Thunder Gulch (Gulch) captured the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. in 1995. He has been a partner in many Coolmore horses since that time. Smith, a former director of Ladbrokes and successful currency trader, is presently based in Barbados. He came into the Coolmore fold in 2004. Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), owned by Magnier and Tabor, carried Sue Magnier's navy blue silks to Epsom glory in 2001. Tabor was the sole owner of High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who emulated that feat the following year.

A native of South Africa who moved to Epsom as a child, the 53-year-old has owned horses for more than two decades, and purchased Lambourn's Kingsdown Stables in 2009.



CHARLES O'CONNELL - Castlemorris

King (GB) O'Connell's Derby runner has been tabbed at 500-1, but the owner is undeterred.

"Everyone has a dream," he told *dailymail.co.uk*. "Mine has always been to have a runner in the Derby. I've been in racing since I was a kid, this is my first horse and I am enjoying the buzz."



The Queen

THE QUEEN - Carlton House (GB)

A horse enthusiast from an early age, The Queen has won four of the five British Classics, most recently in 1977, when her homebred Dunfermline (GB) (Royal Palace {GB}) won both the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 St. Leger S. The 85-year-old monarch has yet to win the "Blue Riband," coming closest in 1953, when Aureole (GB) (Hyperion {GB}) ran second

shortly after her coronation. Her colors were most recently carried in the Epsom Derby by Church Parade (GB) (Queen's Hussar {GB}), who finished fifth in 1981. She traditionally leads the annual procession at Royal Ascot.

Breaking sharply from an outside box to quickly assert for the lead, Alianthus had his rivals on the stretch turning for home and kept on strongly inside the final quarter mile to easily hold all at bay. "It was amazing how [jockey] Adrie de Vries could make to the lead from this [outside] starting stall," commented Gestut Schlenderhan's Gebhard Apelt. "He did everything just right and the horse responded in excellent style." Trainer Jens Hirschberger added, "Alianthus is definitely better on softer going than today, and I wouldn't want to take unnecessary risks with him on unsuitable ground. For all the talk of Triple Crowns last spring, time may prove that **St Nicholas Abbey** put up a very smart effort to be less than four lengths behind star milers when sixth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Aidan O'Brien views running the juvenile highweight in that mile Classic as a mistake, with his speed used to better effect over middle distances, as he showed when romping to a nine-length success in G3 Ormonde S. over an extended 13-furlong trip when last seen May 6. That scintillating display revived the initial excitement felt watching him as a 2-year-old and buried the memory of a poor comeback show when third at 4-11 in the Listed Alleged S. Apr. 3. "We were happy with his first run at The Curragh, which was his first in a long time and the ground was very soft," O'Brien explained yesterday. "Seamus [Heffernan] got him relaxed, which was the most important thing and it was a messy race. He came home really well and we were delighted with him at Chester, where everyone saw what he did. He was always very special and probably the mistake I made with him was training him for the Guineas. Originally, we had Cape Blanco (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) earmarked for the Guineas and he had a little bit of a problem, so we switched St Nicholas Abbey into it. It was a rushed preparation and all happened too quick. It was a chance we took and I shouldn't have done it--we should have gone the Derby route with him, but it was one of those things, and we don't think it left a scar on him.

"He paid the penalty for it and we did too, as he had a hard race before he was ready for it and it set him back," O'Brien continued. "We put a line through that whole season and we had to be very careful and take our time bringing him back. It's his first step back into Group 1 company and it will be a good test for him--he got the trip well at Chester and you are never sure until they do it, so we're looking forward to it. We have been happy with him since Chester and he's straightforward. Ryan [Moore] knows him well now and it's a big advantage he got a feel of him last time." **Midday** boasts four more Group 1 wins than her chief rival here. She bids to better the record of recent distaffers who tried and failed here, including Valle Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), Pride (Fr) (Peintre Celebre), Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) and Sariska (GB) (Pivotal {GB}). Her return win under a penalty in York's G2 Middleton S. May 12 suggested she has lost none of her spark, and she will prove a tough nut to crack back at the venue in which she was second in the 2009 Oaks. "Midday seems in very good order and has come on for her first run of the season at York," Henry Cecil said of the 5-year-old, who would not only be providing her legendary trainer with a first win in this race but also become his most successful representative in terms of top-level victories. "The ground at Epsom should be safe and I will be very disappointed if she does not give a very good account of herself," Cecil commented. "She hasn't taken on the colts for a long time and, obviously, St Nicholas Abbey must be respected, but physically Midday looks better than she ever has, and we are very hopeful." **Dandino** prevailed by a nose from Midday's stable companion Native Ruler (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) in Newmarket's G2 Jockey Club S. Apr. 30, when stable companion **Indian Days** was back in third. Their trainer James Given is aware of the task in hand. "I don't think I could have them any better, it's just a question of whether they are good enough now," Given said. "Dandino is very progressive and going to Japan last year really helped him grow up, while the form of Indian Days is good. It's very exciting to have two in a Group 1 and I don't think an awful lot will split them."

In recognition of the contributions breeders make to the Breeders' Cup program, the foal nominators of offspring who win Breeders' Cup Challenge races this year will receive a \$10,000 award, as well as a custom Steuben crystal trophy. "It's very appreciative to get this kind of money back and makes you more enthusiastic to keep nominating," commented Pope. "Grade I races are hard to come by [in a pedigree], so these financial incentives are the right way to do it." Pope added that Tizway has a weanling full-brother at Timber Town Farm in Lexington and his dam, Bethany (Dayjur) is back in foal to Street Cry (Ire).

DUTROW HEARING TO CONCLUDE TODAY

By Mike Kane The New York State Racing and Wagering Board's hearing on trainer Rick Dutrow's appeal of two separate drug-related suspensions is set to wrap up today, but a decision is not expected until the middle of July. Testimony began before hearing officer Clem Parente Tuesday at the board's offices in Schenectady. After the transcripts of the hearing and briefs from the attorneys are delivered to Parente--a process that could take two weeks--he will have 30 days to write his report to the board. Dutrow, 51, is appealing suspensions totaling 90 days handed down for alleged violations in November at Aqueduct. The stakes were raised when Ed Martin, the president of the Association of

Racing Commissioners International, sent a letter to New York regulators in February asking to show cause why Dutrow's license should not be revoked for, Martin said, "What appears to be a lifetime pattern of disregard for the rules of racing." According to RCI records, since 1979, Dutrow has been sanctioned at least 64 times in nine states. Martin is the former executive director of New York's regulatory board. Dutrow was denied a license by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission in April, and he has not applied for a license in New Jersey, where he has raced for many years.

Dutrow, scheduled to take the stand today, sat quietly during the hearing Thursday as Joel Leveson, the board's director of investigations, explained how he discovered three syringes in a box in a desk drawer in the office of Dutrow's barn at Aqueduct Nov. 3. Dutrow was not in the state at the time.

Leveson, who was named acting director of the NYSRWB in 1997, explained during three hours of testimony that the discovery was made while two inexperienced New York Racing Association investigators were being instructed on how to conduct searches. Leveson said he had been asked by Sidney Anthony, NYRA's new chief of investigations, to teach procedures.

During his cross examination, Dutrow's attorney, Michael Koenig, questioned a break in the chain of control of the evidence, and pointed to inconsistencies in Leveson's written report and testimony at the hearing. Koenig focused on three areas: whether there was a break in the chain of control of the syringes; that Levenson's report stated the liquid in the seized syringes was "opaque," but he later described it as "clear;" and that he wrote in his report the syringes were six CCs, but that they were actually half that size.

Leveson testified that he turned the syringes over to investigator Louis Gonzalez for shipment to an approved New York State laboratory, but that Gonzalez never signed the evidence bag, which was in his possession for two days.

"The chain of custody is important, as their witnesses testified, because the integrity of the evidence cannot be compromised," Koenig said. "And there is the indication from the witnesses who have testified that the chain of custody was broken."

During the afternoon session, Dr. George Maylin, the director of the New York Drug Testing and Research Program, said that tests at the state laboratory at Morrisville showed the syringes contained xyzaline. He also testified that the medication butrophanol was found in the urine of the gelding Fastus Cactus, who competed at Aqueduct Nov. 20. Butrophanol, a powerful painkiller and sedative, is legal for use in racehorses, but may not be administered within 96 hours of a race in New York. Maylin, who has run New York's drug testing program since 1971, could not recall another butrophanol positive with Thoroughbreds in the state, and noted the drug is 10 times more powerful than heroin.

The board's attorney Rick Goodell completed his case Thursday. Friday's hearing will begin at 9 a.m., with testimony from Dutrow and, via videoconference, by Dr. Steven Barker, an expert witness, a professor at the Louisiana State University.
