POETIC JUSTICE

Having failed to load for the 1000 Guineas, Richard Strauss' homebred **Immortal Verse (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}) made amends on her return visit to Britain when claiming victory for France in Friday's G1 Coronation S.

Coming here on the back of an impressive success in the G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly 12 days previously, the bay produced the same dramatic turn of acceleration from last to first under Gerald Mosse to decisively beat compatriot Nova Hawk (GB) (Hawk Wing) by 2 1/4 lengths. In

the process, the 8-1 shot led home a one-two for the famed Collet clan of trainers, with Robert beating his son Rodolphe for the ultimate family album moment. "She won easily and is the best filly I have trained," the winning conditioner stated. **Cont. p2**

GRANTED, FOSTER A DEEP AFFAIR

It's not every day that horses from California, Florida and New York venture away from their home bases for a mid-year Grade I, but such is the case for today's G1 Stephen Foster H. beneath the Twin Spires. A field of 11 was drawn

Wednesday, and any one of a half-dozen of the entrants can stake a legitimate claim to the winner's circle this afternoon. The 122-pound highweight and tepid 7-2 favorite on Mike Battaglia's morning line is the Virginia Tarra Trust's **Giant Oak**

(Giant's Causeway), but the

Illinois-bred is a far cry from a sure thing. Put up to the victory in this track's G1 Clark H. in November, the chestnut earned a Grade I on the track in the Donn H.

in early February. Giant Oak's career has been characterized by inconsistency more than brilliance, and that has been the case in his last two, a third to **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song) in the GII New Orleans H. in late March and a close fifth in the GIII Alysheba S. against many of today's rivals May 6. "Just knowing how he is, he seems to be really focused right now," trainer Chris Block told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's moving well. With the campaign he's had, he's held his weight well." **Stephen Foster H. cont. p12**

Immortal Verse spent her juvenile days under the radar, with a debut win at Deauville in August before finishing second to Helleborine (GB) (Observatory) in Longchamp's G3 Prix d'Aumale the following month. Robert Collet later explained that he felt he had her undercooked when she finished a length fourth behind her supposed pacemaker--and subsequent dual Classic-

placed--Glorious Sight (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}) in a mile conditions race back on the Bois de Boulogne Apr. 4. After Newmarket's stalls handlers failed to coax her in for the start of the May 1 Classic, she produced a moderate effort when 11th in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches back at Longchamp a fortnight later, and heads started to be scratched. The bay filly was given the Olivier Peslier treatment in the Prix de Sandringham and finally showed the world what her veteran trainer had long seen at home, blowing by a smart field to record a facile success over Mixed Intention (Ire) (Elusive City) and book a return voyage across the channel. Settled in last early by the ever-cool Gerald Mosse here, she had dead aim on her compatriot Nova Hawk, who was anchored just ahead as Claiomh Solais (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) set out to make it a grueling test. Delivered clear and wide at the quarter pole as Nova Hawk squeezed between rivals, Immortal Verse had the race in safe keeping when hitting the front a furlong later, and was beyond recall as the runner-up ground on to fill the father-son exacta. The 7-2 favorite Together (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) had no excuses and could finish only fifth for Ballydoyle. Though he needed a translator in the winner's enclosure, the message from Robert Collet was clear. "At Newmarket, she had a blind on to go into the stalls, but there was a lot of wind and it irritated her," he explained. "In the French Guineas, things didn't go to plan, so we have to forget that. You have to be really stubborn to come back and prove that she is a Group 1 filly, but she has that turn of foot." Mosse added, "The pace was good enough on that ground, but not that fast, so she was a bit keen. I decided to drop her behind to make sure she was totally relaxed and, when I started to pull her out, she reacted quicker than I expected. It's the first time I've been on board and she was going to get there too soon, but I had the race in hand with 500 meters to go, and it was easy. The last good filly I rode here was Gold Splash in the [1993] Coronation and, although they are all different, this filly has a fantastic turn of foot, too, and only top horses can do what they do."

PEDIGREE NOTES - IMMORTAL VERSE (IRE)

Her breeders Kilfrush Stud made a wise decision to purchase the winning Mill Reef mare Mill Princess (Ire) as a foundation broodmare in the early 1980s. Mill Princess produced 11 winners, including brilliant sprinter-miler Last Tycoon (Ire) (Try My Best), as well as stakes scorers Astronef (Ire) (Be My Guess), The Perfect Life (Ire) (Try My Best), Flowerdrum (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Side Of Paradise (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). She is also the ancestress of G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winners Tie Black (Ire) (Machiavellian) and Valentine Waltz (Ire) (Be My Guest), Prix Robert Papin winner Zipping (Ire) (Zafonic) and group scorers Fantastic Love (Peintre Celebre) and Steele Tango (Okawango). Immortal Verse is out of Mill Princess's daughter by Sadler's Wells, Side Of Paradise (Ire), winner of the Listed Prix La Camargo over one mile. Immortal Verse is another feather in the cap for her Cheveley Park Stud-based sire Pivotal (GB). The stallion has proven most versatile, getting sprinters such as Kyllachy (GB), plenty of top milers including Excellent Art (GB), Falco, Peeress (GB) and Virtual (GB), and also middle-distance winners of the calibre of Sariska (GB).

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Nathaniel met Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) on debut at Newmarket in August, finishing second by a half-length, then ran that luminary's stable companion Picture Editor (GB) (Dansili {GB}) to a short head next time at Doncaster in September before being put away for the winter. From a family of high-class middle-distance performers, the bay was sent straight over 12 furlongs on his sophomore bow, scoring by nine lengths at Haydock Apr. 16. He was a head behind another heavyweight in Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G3 Chester Vase May 5. Left out of the Derby equation due to the prevalent fast going despite pleasing in his training up to the June 4 Classic, he showed the benefit of that decision with a commanding performance in these rain-softened conditions. Sweating and on his toes in the paddock, he was also keen throughout the early stages before settling for a lead while ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ World Domination (Empire Maker) attempted to live up to his name at the head of affairs. William Buick had plenty of horse under him as his rivals started to pay for their exuberance approaching the final turn, and he let him coast to the lead with three furlongs remaining. Soon clear, Nathaniel was kept up to his work to grind out the authoritative win from the eye-catching Fiorente, whose rider Ryan Moore had forfeited early ground by racing wide in search of livelier ground. "He's a nice horse who loved the ground and stayed well," trainer John Gosden commented. "He's a legitimate favorite for the G1 St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 10], along with Michael Owen's horse Brown Panther (GB) (Shirocco {Ger}). He gets very fizzy and warm, but that's his nature, along with all three of the family I've trained. The G2 Great Voltigeur S. [at York Aug. 17] is a strong possibility now and he would have a penalty there, but I also like the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. [at Newbury Aug. 13]. he will have one run before the Leger if the owners want to go there. I hope they do." Sir Michael Stoute said of the runner-up, "He acquitted himself well and I'm very pleased with him. Ryan [Moore] and I had a chat and because of where he was drawn, we thought we might go wide, but he was too babyish and wanted to join the pack again."

NATHANIEL (GB): A MAGNIFICENT PEDIGREE

With his victory in the G2 King Edward VII S., Nathaniel became the latest black-type winner for the brilliant broodmare Magnificent Style, now 18 years of age. The daughter of Silver Hawk now has seven stake winners to her credit, five at the group level. She's been

bred only to Northern Dancer-line stallions, and it's the Canadian's greatest stallion son Sadler's Wells who has provided Magnificent Style three of those group winners.

They are led by Playful Act (Ire), co-highweighted juvenile filly in England in 2004 after her win in the G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies Mile S. at Ascot. Playful Act later

made headlines by selling from the Sangster family's Swettenham Stud dispersal for a then world record \$10.5 million at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale. Sheikh Mohammed purchased Playful Act, now dam of the Swettenham-bred Giants Play (Giant's Causeway), runner-up in last year's GII Sheepshead S. at Belmont. Playful Act is also the dam of a 2-year-old Street Cry (Ire) filly named Anjaz and had another filly by the Darley stallion in 2010. She did not produce a foal this year.

To Sadler's Wells, Magnificent Style also produced the Group 2 winner Percussionist (Ire), as well as the good Changing Skies (Ire), a multiple graded stakes winner in the U.S. The mares visits to other Northern Dancer-line stallions have been similarly productive. Her first foal was the Storm Cat filly Styleistick, a dual stakes winner at Keeneland who later sold for \$1.3 million at auction. To the cover of Peintre Celebre, Magnificent Style produced SW & GSP Petara Bay (Ire), and to Spinning World she produced the Group 2 winner Echoes In Eternity (Ire) (Spinning World), herself now the dam of GSW Whispering Gallery (GB) (Daylami {Ire}).

Magnificent Style hardly hinted at what was to come in the breeding shed during an abbreviated--though nonetheless solid--race career that culminated with a win in the G3 Tattersalls Musidora S. at York in May of 1996 for owner/breeder Mamoud Fustok. Retired with two wins from four starts, Magnificent Style was sent through the following year's Keeneland November sale and purchased by Hugo Lascelles, agent for Swettenham, for \$410,000.

In 2007, Lady Serena Rothschild acquired the mare privately. Nathaniel was the first foal produced for her Kincorth Investments. Magnificent Style has a 2-year-old Galileo (Ire) filly named Great Heavens (GB), did not have a foal in 2010, but came back to have an Oasis Dream (GB) colt named Throne Room (GB) on Feb. 21.

Lady Rothschild may be familiar to North American racing fans as the owner/breeder of the 2009 GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf S. winner Pounced (Rahy). In 2006, she bought Group 1 winner Magical Romance (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) for 4.6 million guineas (about \$9.35 million) at Tattersalls December, then a world record. Unfortunately for her connections, the foal she was carrying at the time, a filly by Pivotal (GB), was foaled less than a month later and was just 11 days old when she became a yearling.--LM

Samitar, one of six maidens in the line-up here, showed marked improvement off a debut third at Newmarket May 27 to emulate her half-sister Nijoom Dubai (GB) (Noverre) in capturing this prize in impressive style. Whereas Jamie Spencer made plenty of use of her on her racecourse bow, he opted to employ hold-up tactics here, and in the early stages the bay had only the slow-starting and ultimately disappointing 5-4 favorite Teolane (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) behind. Quickening between rivals inside the final quarter, she picked up Inetrobil with 150 yards remaining and was in no danger in

the run to the line. "We've had our fair share of bad luck this week and they are all running consistently, but just needed to win," trainer Mick Channon commented. "I believed in this filly, and this was the plan. She's a nice filly, but is just a shell of a horse at the moment, so I'll give her a bit of a break now and bring her back in the autumn." Spencer added, "She gets the trip well and is bred to stay. She's a rangy filly and I'm sure she'll get better as the year goes on." Connections of the runner-up and third were both pointing at the July 8 G2 Cherry Hinton S. at Newmarket afterwards.

PEDIGREE NOTES - SAMITAR (IRE)

History repeats itself as Samitar wins the six-furlong race for 2-year-old fillies four years after her half-sister Nijoom Dubai (GB) (Noverre). Both fillies were trained by Mick Channon, had the assistance of Jamie Spencer in the saddle, and went into the race as maidens. The half-sisters are out of the unraced Rainbow Quest mare Aileen's Gift (Ire), a half-sister to Roker Park (Ire) (Choir {GB}), a quite useful sprinter, and to Cooden Beach (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), the dam of Gimcrack Stakes winner Shaweel (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Aileen's Gift is a granddaughter of Nassau and Musidora S. winner Optimistic Lass (Mr. Prospector), also the dam of Coronation S. winner Golden Opinion (Slew O' Gold). Samitar was bred by Norman Court Stud--an operation Channon has a close association with--and sold to Channon's regular talent scout Gill Richardson for 39,000gns at Book 1 of last year's Tattersalls October yearling sale. Samitar is by Coolmore sire Rock Of Gibraltar, also sire of Hong Kong Cup winner Eagle Mountain (GB), Eclipse winner Mount Nelson (GB) and Prix de la Foret winner Varenar (Fr).

Namibian, victorious in a Goodwood maiden in one of three freshman attempts, came back this term to run fourth in the Apr. 14 £250,000 Tattersalls Million 3YO Trophy at Newmarket before slipping one spot in the Listed Newmarket S. Apr. 30. The handsome bay finished second in the May 18 Listed Cocked Hat S. back at Goodwood next time, then ran fourth in the May 28 Listed Fairway S., at Newmarket once more, and was a last-out third to stablemate Eternal Heart in the Edinburgh Cup H. at Musselburgh June 4. He was positioned at the back of midfield until inching closer after halfway in this marathon. Roused along at the top of the straight to lead at the quarter-mile marker, Namibian looked vulnerable when Solar Sky challenged wide approaching the final eighth, but found extra under a power drive in the latter stages to gamely repel that rival. He also survived a subsequent stewards' enquiry, having drifted left inside the closing panel. "I thought we were cooked when Solar Sky came at Namibian with a furlong or so to go," admitted trainer Mark Johnston in the immediate aftermath. "I suspect both horses have come across the track, but I don't know exactly what happened in the closing stages, as I haven't seen the head-on film. It was very hard to know if he'd get the trip coming into the race, and turning for home everything was perfect, as I had three in the first four. At that point, I thought Eternal Heart was going to win, but with a furlong to go, I could clearly see he wasn't going to [win], and then Namibian burst onto the scene. He has got plenty of options, and the [G1] St Leger [at Doncaster Sept. 10] is one of them, but we'll keep an open mind." Jockey Silvestre de Sousa, who received a three-day ban for causing interference, added, "The stewards said I caused interference to the other horse, but he went ahead of me. It's one of those things that happen in racing, but it's an amazing feeling to ride my first Royal Ascot winner. They gave me a three-day suspension, but it is worth it for the win." Sir Henry Cecil, trainer of the runner-up, also added, "It would have been lovely if he could have won for the stud, but he has run a great race, and is an improving horse."

PEDIGREE NOTES - NAMIBIAN (IRE)

Namibian's ability to pull out reserves of stamina for a battling win over two miles may be one to chalk up to trainer Mark Johnston's nurture rather than nature. He is by Group 1-winning miler Cape Cross (Ire)--who admittedly is able to get top middle-distance performers, as Ouija Board (GB) and Sea The Stars (Ire) demonstrated--and his dam Disco Volante (GB), by Sadler's Wells, won over one mile and was placed in listed company over 10 furlongs. Disco Volante is out of Divine Danse (Fr) (Kris {GB}), winner of the Group 3 Prix du Gros-Chene over five furlongs, and is a three-parts sister to Valentino (GB) (Nureyev), a winner over six furlongs to a mile, and one-mile winner Divin Danseur (Nureyev). Divine Danse is a granddaughter of another Gros-Chene winner, Polyponder (Barbizon), and a half-sister to Pursuit Of Love (GB) (Groom Dancer), winner of the Prix Maurice de Gheest and placed in the July Cup and 2000 Guineas. This is also the family of Oaks heroine Look Here (GB), by stamina influence Hernando (Fr). Namibian is the second Hascombe and Valiant Stud-bred winner at Royal Ascot this year, after Tercentenary S. scorer Pisco Sour (Lemon Drop Kid).

Beachfire, unraced as a juvenile, bagged four of five sophomore starts--mainly in handicap company--and opened this campaign with a fifth in the City and Suburban H. at Epsom Apr. 20. The chestnut ran second in a May 5 Chester handicap, and hit the board again in another handicap at Goodwood last time May 21. He slipped in as the bottom weight for this black-type bow and, like his sire (by Indian Ridge {Ire}), revelled in the mud to register a career high in decisive style. Settled in rear until coming under pressure on the home turn, he was last into the straight, but weaved a passage through toiling rivals to go third passing the eighth pole, and was driven out thereafter to win a shade comfortably. "He's a talented horse and it's fantastic to ride a Royal Ascot winner for Princess Haya," said winning jockey William Buick. "He was finishing fast and they were all coming back at him quickly, so it was like dodging bullets." Trainer John Gosden added, "We've put the headgear on him and it's worked very well. He came through them like a [hot] knife through butter. The wife has beaten the husband in this case, and the husband is delighted, so we are not in big trouble." Princess Haya also added, "He's a lovely horse, John's a wonderful trainer and it was so much fun seeing Sheikh Mohammed's [Godolphin] horse come second. 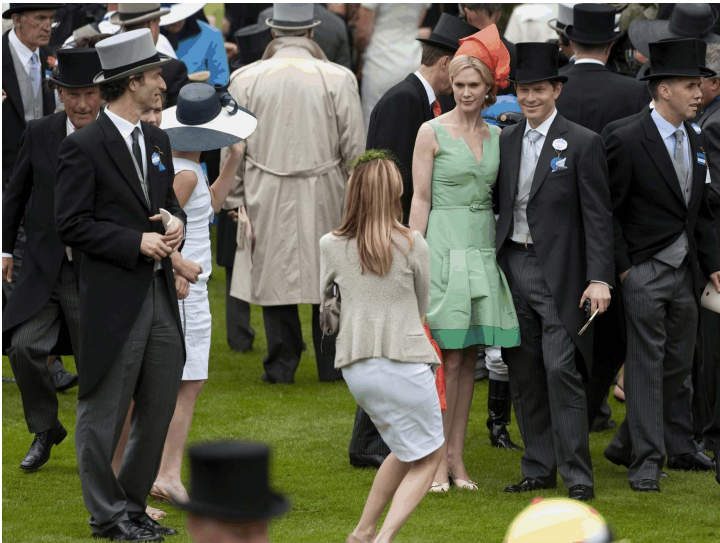


BOBBY FLAY AT ROYAL ASCOT

Bobby Flay traveled to Ascot with More Than Real (More Than Ready) to compete in the G1 Coronation S. The filly finished 11th, but Flay was still kind enough to blog about his experience for the TDN.

My day at Royal Ascot was an extraordinary one, but started with a pedestrian task...trying to figure out how to put my morning suit together. It was a little hard to work out what went where. I actually even had a hard time opening the case to my hat, but my wife and I finally figured that out. My wife (actress Stephanie March) didn't have as hard a time with her own outfit; she wore the most beautiful mint green dress, and looked particularly spectacular, so I felt like a winner even before we left the hotel.

We had hired an eight-passenger van to take us to Ascot, and were grateful for the space, and the fact that someone else was driving; the journey to get there took 2 1/2 hours. Traffic was outrageous as we got close to Ascot.

Our first stop was something called the Royal Ascot Lodge, which felt like it was somebody's house, and I believe the gentleman who runs Ascot stays there. There was a very small crowd on hand, maybe only 40 or 50 people who had been invited to a private lunch. A big sign on our table said, "More Than Real," so we knew where to sit. The food was customarily British—poached salmon, smoked salmon, chicken curry, roast beef, some salad.

Before we knew it, we had to go, since one of the highlights of the day for us was going to see The Queen arrive. We went to the parade ring to observe the ceremony. In keeping with tradition, she came down the stretch in her carriage and into the parade ring, where the procession ends. We got a good, up-close look. We had been playing a little game, and had been trying to decide what color she was going to wear, and hoping for orange or yellow, because those are my colors. She got out and she was actually wearing yellow, so we were like, 'Uh, oh. This could be a good omen.'

After that, we went up to our box, number 422, which was terrific. The thing about Ascot is it has all this old-world style and charm, but because the building is so new, it also has all the new technology and amenities. Our box overlooked the racetrack, and the view was spectacular—exactly the way you want to watch racing.

The champagne started popping immediately in the box, and we had already had some at lunch as well. Actually...we had started drinking champagne in the car, as Barry (Weisbord) had brought a couple of bottles. He was wondering why we weren't drinking quicker, but I told him that since we were going to be drinking champagne all day, I actually wanted to be able to see the race come racetime. I had my daughter with me, and had a lot of fun teaching her how to bet (which her mother's not going to be happy with. Hope she doesn't read the *TDN*!) The very interesting thing about betting in the U.K. is that you have two different ways to bet—on the tote like in the U.S., or in the bookie village, as I call it.

There were dozens of bookmakers with their odds up, and it was like shopping for a price. I got 14-1 on my horse, and I bought that each way, which means I had a bet on her to win and to come in the top three. It's like across the board, plus an extra win bet, which is a little weird to Americans.

We went back up to the box to watch the first two races, which educated all of us on exactly how it was going to work. Our race was the third race. Before the second race, we went down to the ring they go into before the parade ring, where the horses are walking around by their stalls. We watched More Than Real come out, walk around a bunch of times, and get used to her surroundings. We saw a lot of familiar faces; Sheikh Mohammed and Princess Haya; and James Delahooke, who buys horses for me, like Super Espresso. We ran into Andrew Rosen, who had Theyskens' Theory, and saw Bill Farish.

Walking into the parade ring, we met up with our trainer Todd Pletcher, and our jockey. I was interviewed by the BBC and a couple of radio stations, and had done an interview with TVG earlier on. I got to meet Olivier Peslier, who I had personally selected to be More Than Real's jockey because I loved the way he rides Goldikova. I think More than Real and Goldikova have some things in common—both won the Breeders' Cup, and they're fillies of the same stature, and Peslier has had a lot of success at Ascot and had come over from France to ride her.

I listened to Todd give directions, Olivier got on the horse and went up to the box and before you know it, they were in the gate.

We obviously were concerned about the going because she hadn't run on that kind of ground before. Even though it was her first race since November, she had been working really well and seemed terrific. She got off well and he had her on the rail, she started moving up and I think she even got as close as third...and then she just stopped. The going got to her. That's just the way it is.

I was obviously disappointed in the outcome, because I wanted her to run better for all the people who had come over to see her, and, because in a certain way, we were representing the U.S.A. But she came back totally fine and Todd said she'll fire back at Saratoga.

I'm so happy we went. I love the idea of dressing up like it's 200 years ago. I think that the pageantry of it and the tradition of it is unbeatable, and to be able to participate not just as a spectator, but as a *participant* in the racing is something very few people from America do. I'm happy to be sporting about it; I love the sport of it, and love the challenges of it. I know she's fast enough; she has beaten a few of these horses already. I just wish the going had been a little bit better.



CHINTA IS THREAVE'S 'MAIN' MAN

Third-generation horseman Eric Buckley, whose family has owned and operated Threave Main Stud for nearly 70 years, thought so much of the mare Suena Cay (Maria's Mon) that he had her halter framed after she died in a freak accident earlier this year. That she had so endeared herself to Buckley had, at that point, little to do with the racetrack success of foals he had bred out of her. He did, however, have some success at the sales with her offspring, and moreover just liked a pleasant, classy mare who had become a farm favorite.

Which made the victory of Bapak Chinta, Suena Cay's 2-year-old colt by Speightstown, in Thursday's G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot that much sweeter. "I got up and watched the race with my mother on TVG and, yeah, it was pretty exciting," said Buckley, 31.

Buckley co-bred Bapak Chinta along with Sebastian Varney and Anthony O'Donnell, businessmen based in New York and Boston, respectively. He and Varney had found Suena Cay, a half-sister to GISW Celtic Melody (Mr. Greeley), at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale, and purchased her for a modest \$26,000 while in foal to El Corredor. The unraced 6-year-old mare had produced three previous foals, including Good Citizen (Proud Citizen), who would go on to be Jamaica's champion imported 3-year-old filly in 2008 and champion imported stayer in 2009. At the time for Buckley and Varney, though, it was a case of gut instinct trumping studious research.

"We were standing around the ring watching horses sell, and she came up and had enough pedigree and really wasn't bringing very much money, so we decided to take a chance on her," explained Buckley. "Sometimes it's better to be lucky than smart."

The men looked both lucky and smart when, a year later, they sold the resulting El Corredor weanling, a colt named Spanish Island, for \$100,000 at Keeneland. That sale easily got them out on the mare. Things didn't go as well for Suena Cay's next two foals—a now 3-year-old gelding named Waronthehomefront (War Front), sold for \$1,500 at FTKOCT; and Bapak Chinta sold for \$20,000 as a Keeneland September yearling.

Waronthehomefront may not have set the sales ring on fire, but has proven a useful sort, winning two of seven starts and finishing fourth in a pair of minor stakes events in Western Canada. And Bapak Chinta could be termed well more than useful, as his victory in the Norfolk stamped him as one of the early leaders in the 2-year-old division in Europe. Buckley said it isn't a big surprise that Bapak Chinta has developed into a fine prospect, regardless of what the sales board read.

"We really did have a lot of faith in the horse," he said. "The mare herself was small and muscular, and all of her foals were like that. He just had a lot of presence

about him, and I told people, in 15 or 20 years of prepping yearlings, he was hands-down the strongest yearling I've ever been around. I'm 6'5" and 220 pounds, but he was a bull. But he was smart about it; it wasn't like he was

malicious or aggressive.

He just knew what he

wanted to do, and he was very powerful. But for being so strong and well-put-together, he was always a gentleman. He had a lot of sense."

Sense, particularly of the horse variety, is something Buckley has plenty of himself. That's no surprise given his pedigree. His grandparents, the late A. Carter and Peggy Thornton, worked Threave Main's 330 acres for over six decades and built up a respected operation that had a hand in the success of horses like Kentucky Derby winner Canonero II and Grade I winner and GI Preakness runner-up Linkage. They passed on the farm to their children, Tim Thornton and Meg Buckley, who now co-own the Paris, KY nursery. Like his father, Tim Thornton served as a president of the Kentucky Farm Managers' Club, and is the long-time general manager of Airdrie Stud. Meg and her husband Mike, along with Eric, conduct the day-to-day business at Threave Main, which is home to between 30 and 40 mares, most of which are owned by the farm. Buckley himself owns two mares by himself and another three in partnership.

Things took a sad turn early this year when Suena Cay died unexpectedly. "We bred her to Quiet American last year, and about two weeks before she was set to foal this past winter, the foal put his foot through her rectum," said Buckley. "Not during foaling--it just happened--and we lost both of them. That was tough to deal with. So I framed the halter she was wearing the night she died in a shadowbox. She was one of mare favorite mares. She was just really nice and easy to be around. Now that she's gone, I'm glad that her legacy will go on with this horse. Hopefully, he'll continue to be a real nice racehorse. She deserves it; she was a classy mare."

With Strong Suit (Rahy) already successful at this week's meeting, **Elzaam** could add further weight to last year's G2 Coventry S. if he prevails over the older generation here. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's 3-year-old, who was denied by a nose in the main juvenile contest here 12 months ago, showed smart form when

recording a six-length success in the Listed Carnarvon S. over this trip at Newbury last time May 13, and connections are keen on his chances. "It is a big step up, but this is an open race and he was impressive last time and showed a good turn of foot," Shadwell's Racing Manager Angus Gold said. "He's one of those horses for whom things haven't always gone according to

plan--last year in the Coventry he was green and Richard [Hills] had to get after him, so he ended up getting there too soon, and got caught by Richard Hannon's very good horse. Things worked out much better when we dropped him out at Newbury, and we'll be riding him that way again. Richard said the thing that impressed him was the sheer speed he showed passing horses, and maybe he needs holding onto." Roger Varian, who has succeeded the now-retired Michael Jarvis, added, "Perhaps we've got the key to him now, and we are very much looking forward to running him, but we are concerned about the weather coming in, as he has a quick, flat action and likes fast ground." Khalid Abdullah's **Bated Breath** is a colt who has always been held in high regard and is starting to show why this term, with six-furlong wins in a conditions race at Haydock May 7 and Listed Leisure S. at Windsor May 23 evidence to support his case. Trainer Roger Charlton, who also saddles the Apr. 14 Listed Abernant S. scorer **Genki** and last year's G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise winner **Definightly**, is another watching the skies. "Definightly needs rain, Bated Breath doesn't want too much and nor does Genki, but they are in very good order," he commented. "A lot of these sprinters have been around a long time and Bated Breath has yet to run in a group race, but he is an improving horse who has a terrific cruising speed. Unlike most sprinters, he seems very relaxed and there is potential there but he needs to find two or three lengths." Two fillies worthy of respect here are Susan Magnier and Jacqueline O'Brien's **Bewitched** and Cheveley Park Stud's **Hooray**.

The former, who beat Genki in the G3 Bengough S. over course and distance in October, left the subsequent G1 St James's Palace S. runner-up Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) trailing in her wake when returning to annex Leopardstown's G3 Ballycorus S. over seven furlongs May 29. Her come-from-behind style is in contrast to last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Hooray, who was again aggressively ridden to successfully defy a penalty in Epsom's Listed Surrey S. also over seven last time June 3. Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport*, "The program for three-year-old sprinters is difficult, but we know Hooray likes a bit of cut in the ground and, hopefully, she might get that on Saturday. We were thrilled with the way she ran last time, having to give a lot of weight away. She's in good form, and we'll learn a bit more by running her against the top sprinters." **Star Witness** and the 2008 Golden Jubilee hero **Kingsgate Native** (Mujadil) were second and sixth, respectively, in Tuesday's G1 King's Stand S. and try again, with the latter also representing David and Patricia Thompson's Cheveley Park Stud. "I thought five furlongs was Kingsgate Native's best trip, but, after Tuesday, I think it's probably six," Chris Richardson added. "He was just taken off his feet throughout the whole race and never got into a rhythm. He did this a few years ago. He ran down the field in the King's Stand and won the Jubilee. I'm sure he won't do it again, but we'll give it a whirl." There are doubts surrounding the participation of Godolphin's May 11 G2 Duke of York S. winner **Delegator**; he could be pulled out if the ground is unsuitable. Simon Crisford, racing manager, told *Racing Post* yesterday morning, "There is unlikely to be an update until Saturday and several things will dictate whether he runs. We have to wait on the weather, and I have to discuss it with Sheikh Mohammed."

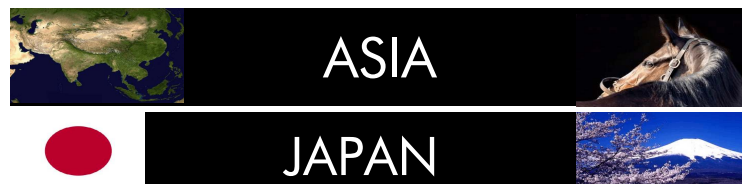

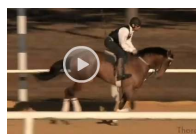
