HITTING OVERDRIVE

Following an impressive debut win at Belmont July 1 by Repole Stable's **Overdriven** (Tale of the Cat), comparisons to last year's juvenile champion--stablemate Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie)--were inevitable.

However, the up-and-coming colt made good on earlier claims of grandeur with a decisive victory in yesterday's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. The start was delayed because of the pre-race antics of **Bless the Soldier** (Belong

to Me), who was scratched at the gate as the other juveniles were led back out of the stalls. Once everyone was back in line, Overdriven broke on par with **Black Rhino** (El Corredor) as **Moonrush** (Malibu Moon) spotted the field a couple of lengths. The 1-5 favorite was allowed to settle just off his rival through a crisp opening quarter in :22.40. Ready to pounce approaching the turn, the bay collared the leader at the head of the lane and strode home a much-the-best four-length winner over closer **Power World** (Distorted Humor). "We felt like we had the best horse going in, but when you're in situations like this, everyone knows what can happen in Saratoga and the history of upsets, so you don't take anything for granted," said winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "I'm just happy he broke cleanly and put himself in a good spot. [Jockey] Johnny [Velazquez] said he idled a little bit, kind of waiting on horses when he made the lead, but it was a very professional performance." **Cont. p2**

SOUR IS SWEET IN PRIX EUGENE ADAM

Pisco Sour (Lemon Drop Kid), with Jimmy Fortune at the helm, seized immediate control and never looked back as he safely held off late closer **Glaswegian** (GB) (Selkirk) by 3/4 of a length in Sunday's G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte. Allowed to set a steady pace in the early going, Pisco Sour responded when asked to for more at the quarter pole and had enough in reserve to hold off his nearest rival by 3/4 of a length. "I think he is better coming from behind, but Jimmy persuaded me in the event there was no early pace that we should make the running, so he deserves a lot of the credit," commented winning trainer Hugh Morrison. **Cont. 4**

LIVING THE DREAM IN BERLIN

The decision to supplement **Danedream** (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) at a cost of €17,500 to Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Berlin paid dividends when the filly ran off to a five-length victory. Held up in mid-division as **Dandino** (GB) (Dansili {GB}) led the field on sufferance through the modest early fractions, then **Night Magic** (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}) set a more upbeat tempo from halfway, Danedream was asked by jockey Andrasch Starke rounding the home turn. She powered down the outside in the stretch to hit the front with 1 1/2 furlongs to race and kept rolling all the way to the line for a commanding victory. **Cont. p3**

Heading into Saratoga's opening weekend, the Repole camp had reason for optimism with stable star Uncle Mo's return to the training track Friday, in addition to a strong group of horse slated to go postward the initial three days of the meeting. While the team appeared poised for a strong showing, everything didn't exactly go as plan--at least initially. "I was 0-for-8 this weekend," said Mike Repole. "I had nine in this weekend, but if I was going to be 1-for-9, this is the one I would have chosen, so it worked out good. Todd's done an amazing job with this horse."

Addressing the inevitable comparisons to last year's juvenile champ, Repole said, "Here we go again, man. Pretty nice horse last year, and pretty nice horse so far this year. There's only one Uncle Mo. And there's one Overdriven. It feels good to get the first graded stakes win at Saratoga. Great win, great win, great win. Great weekend. This is the race I wanted to win. I'm pretty happy right now. Last year, Uncle Mo was the best 2-year-old in the country and as of July 24, Overdriven is the best 2-year-old in the country." Looking ahead to possibly a repeat championship, Pletcher confirmed that Overdriven would likely make one more appearance at the Spa this summer. "I'm sure the [GI Three Chimneys] Hopeful [S. at seven furlongs, Sept. 5] is the logical next goal," he said. "It's good spacing, and we ran him back a little quicker than we normally would after his maiden win, because we wanted to get this race in and we'd get better spacing to, hopefully, the Hopeful. Hopefully, the [GI] Champagne S. [Belmont] after that would be what we're thinking long term."

Danedream, who was third in the Listed Oppenheim-Rennen at Cologne on this day last year, opened her sophomore campaign with a fourth in the Apr. 10 Listed Premio Seregno at Milan's San Siro and confirmed she was on an upward curve when third in the G2 Derby Italiano at Rome May 7. She built on that Classic boost by winning the May 29 G2 Oaks d'Italia by daylight back at Milan May 29, but slipped to fifth in the G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud last time June 26. "Danedream was bought for just €9,000 and has given us so much pleasure," said winning conditioner Peter Schiergen. "Who would have thought that she would win a Group 1 race? We have entered her in the [GI] Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf, so that would be her main target at the end of the season." Rueing the lack of a sufficient tempo, the runner-up's jockey, Maxime Guyon, added, "The fact that there was no early pace didn't help us, and we were giving the winner 15 pounds, which is a lot." Trainer James Given reasoned a combination of factors contributed to Dandino finishing only seventh, but was fulsome in his praise of the winner, "The filly took six lengths out of the field in seconds, and she is a class act. I think if we would have been able to ride the way we wanted to, we would have been placed, but the way it unfolded it cost us. I think this race will prove much better than we thought."

Pisco Sour closed a five-start juvenile campaign with an eighth in the Oct. 31 G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud--in his only previous visit to France--and hit the board in the G2 Dante S. at York on sophomore return May 12. He pulled hard, but was eased once defeat was inevitable, when ninth in the June 4

G1 Epsom Derby, and recorded a personal best next time when taking out the June 16 G3 Tercentenary S. by five lengths at Royal Ascot. "I feel the Royal Ascot race may have

The easy winner of a newcomers' event at Saint-Cloud Mar 28, Family One went on to take a conditions race at Longchamp Apr. 19 before failing by just a neck giving six pounds to the smart Ruby's Day (GB) (Vital Equine {Ire}) in a similar contest at Chantilly May 20. Returning there for an easy win the G3 Prix du Bois July 3, he colt broke well to stalk Bear Behind (Ire) (Kodiac {GB}) in second. Family One cruised to the front inside the eighth pole, and a backhander saw him quicken away from the field to win impressively. "He traveled so well that, to me, he appeared the likeliest winner throughout the race," said trainer Yann Barberot. "[Jockey] Ioritz [Mendizabal] didn't have to move on him, and he really showed his class at the finish. He is clearly a top horse now, and will return in the [G1] Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 21]."

Windward Islands, winner of the Toronto Cup at three, collected his first graded stakes score in this event before finishing second in the 10-furlong GII Sky Classic S. in August. Third in the GI Northern Dancer S. over 12 furlongs in September, the grey was sent to the sidelines for the rest of the season. Third in his seasonal return in the GII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland Apr. 29, the gelding failed to fire when seventh in the GI Manhattan H. over a soggy Belmont turf course, but came back to be a much-improved third in his most recent start in Woodbine's 12-panel GIII Singspiel S. June 26. Sent off the third choice for this drop back in trip, Windward Islands settled off a poky opening quarter set by Fifty Proof, remained within contact through a half in :49.39 and three-quarters in 1:13.23, angled out for the drive and was up in time to successfully defend his title.

Breaking through with a win when moving to Hollywood for a six-furlong test May 19, the English-bred had to settle for fifth--beaten only a length--in the nine-furlong GII Honeymoon H. June 11. "This filly has always had a lot of ability," said winning trainer Simon Callaghan, who was collecting his first stakes victory. "When she ran first time out in the country [China Doll], I thought she would take a lot of beating in that listed stake and I was really disappointed. She's just improved every day and now she's completely happy. I know she was [11-1], but we've always thought this filly is very, very powerful and for the first time she got relaxed today."

Embur's Song graduated by 13 1/4 lengths going seven panels over Keeneland's main track in the spring of her 3-year-old season, and earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status in an allowance on the synthetic at Woodbine in her second career starts. The bay closed out the year with a pair of in-the-money finishes in Ontario-bred stakes, including a runner-up effort in the Bison City S. in July. Off the board at Gulfstream in her first two starts this term, Embur's Song returned to her winning ways in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland Apr. 22. She posted a career-high Beyer of 101 when winning the 6 1/2-furlong GIII Hendrie S. May 14 and added the Windward S. at Presque Isle Downs July 5. Awkward at the break here, Embur's Song quickly strode to the front and was comfortably in hand as she reeled off early splits of :23.59, :47.63 and 1:12.01. Clear at the head of the lane, the Todd Pletcher trainee's lead dwindled as Ariana D. and last year's Canadian Horse of the Year Biofuel caught up in the final yards. Despite the narrow margin, the result never appeared to be in doubt as Embur's Song was under a steady if not pressured drive.

Sidney's Candy Gets a Taste of the Spa Spinach...

WinStar Farm's **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) worked on the grass for the first time for his new connections Sunday morning, going five panels in a bullet :57.60 over Saratoga's Oklahoma track turf course. Last year's GI Santa Anita Derby winner was

accompanied by jockey John Velazquez, who was also aboard the 4-year-old for a move on the dirt at Belmont after the chestnut's arrival from California in June. Sidney's Candy galloped out six furlongs in 1:09 2/5. "It was great," said Velazquez. "They told me just to let him do it, so I did." Acquired privately by WinStar in June, the colt was beaten only a nose in his most recent start in the May 28 GII American H. "Everything's an option with this horse," said trainer

Todd Pletcher, when asked about the colt's next possible start. "He's obviously proven on all three surfaces. We hadn't had an opportunity to breeze him on the turf yet. We just figured we would, to see how he handles it compared to the dirt. He handles everything pretty well." While Sidney's Candy remains under consideration for the Aug. 6 GI Whitney S., WinStar President and Racing Manager Elliott Walden indicated after the work that he was not sold on a start in the 1 1/8-mile race for the colt. "The nice thing about him is you have so many options," said Walden. "We are leaning against the Whitney, because of the mile and an eighth [distance]. I think he's a true miler. The surface doesn't matter as much as the distance. We're still figuring him out." As for alternatives to the Spa handicap fixture, Pletcher included the 1 1/16-mile GII Fourstardave S. on the turf July 31; the six-panel GI Alfred G Vanderbilt S. on the main track Aug. 7; the Aug. 13 GI Arlington Million at 10 furlongs on the turf; the Sept. 3 GI Forego H. at seven furlongs.

Also on the worktab for Pletcher Sunday morning was Mike Repole's **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini). The bay negotiated five furlongs in a comfortable 1:01.64 in advance of Saturday's GII Jim Dandy S. Under jockey Javier Castellano, the 3-year-old colt most recently finished runner-up behind Ruler on Ice (Roman Ruler) in the GI Belmont S. "Excellent--really good," confirmed Pletcher. "He went 1:01 and change the right way. He finished up and galloped out really well. It was a nice, comfortable breeze for him, and I'm happy with him. He's a pretty straightforward horse, low-key, very professional. He had a nice little freshening since the Belmont, and yet he's still pretty fit. So I think it's right where we'd want him to be." Winner of the Mar. 5 GIII Gotham S., the \$500,000 FTFEB purchase hit the board in both prior starts at Saratoga--a 5 1/2-length maiden victory last August and a second behind Boys At Tosconova (Officer) in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. "He's just coming into his own right now," said owner Mike Repole, who was on hand for the work. "I think the one big advantage he has his two races over this track, winning his maiden by [almost] six lengths and then finishing second to Boys At Tosconova by 1 1/2 lengths, which is nothing to be ashamed of."

Pletcher also confirmed that **Buster's Ready** (More Than Ready), fourth in Saturday's GI Coaching Club American Oaks, exited the nine-furlong fillies' Classic in good shape, and that plans for her next start remain up in the air. Previously, the filly--campaigned under the banner of the Estate of Edward Evans--won in the GI Mother Goose S. June 25.

It's Tricky Fine; Tapit Colts Have Spa Targets...

Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin reported Sunday that Godolphin's **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) came out of her gutsy win over Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) in Saturday's GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks in good order and confirmed she will next attempt the 1 1/4-mile GI TVG Alabama S. Aug. 20. "She ate up well, not everything, but ate up well," said McLaughlin. "She was tired, but she's in good shape. It was a great win. I spoke to Simon Crisford from Godolphin this morning, and he said point for the Alabama, as long as you're happy and she's happy. She's a day-by-day, hour-by-hour, minute-by-minute filly when it comes to how she's doing, and what's going on." McLaughlin underscored his point by admitting his staff had trouble even catching her to put her halter on Saturday morning. And the adventure continued. "We had a pony lead her from Greentree to the assembly barn, and then the pony that goes with her in the race came and met her there to get her over to the paddock," said McLaughlin. "And then you saw her drop Eddie Castro! She's extra work, but she's worth it. Whoever named her, named her very well."

McLaughlin also detailed the respective targets for **Rattlesnake Bridge** (Tapit), winner of the Long Branch S. at Monmouth July 9; and **Trappe Shot** (Tapit), a dazzling winner of the GII True North H. in his most recent Belmont June 11. Both colts are owned by the Brady family, which campaigns under the name Mill House. Rattlesnake Bridge will train up to the GI Travers S. at the Spa Aug. 27, said McLaughlin, while Trappe Shot is aiming to the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt Aug. 7. "The Bradys are from New Jersey, and we all love Monmouth Park, but back in 22 days [for Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational] didn't feel like the right thing to do off his lifetime-best effort," said McLaughlin, speaking of Rattlesnake Bridge. "We made that mistake last year, or maybe tried the same thing with Trappe Shot, who [won the Long Branch and] was second in the Haskell, but then in the Travers, he didn't show up. Distance was a question mark, but three races in a short time was also tough. We want to give ourselves the best chance to win the Travers, so we decided to skip the Jim Dandy and the Haskell. And [Rattlesnake Bridge] is improving all the time, so we think we're giving ourselves the best chance." Rattlesnake Bridge is expected to breeze for the first time since the Long Branch on Saturday. Trappe Shot, meanwhile, tuned up yesterday for the Vanderbilt with a four-furlong work on the main track in :48.65. "Trappe Shot is great," McLaughlin said. "The nice thing would be to win a Grade I, because he has not won a Grade I."

'Ruler' & 'Fire' Work at Monmouth...

Trainer Kelly Breen sent GI Belmont S. winner **Ruler On Ice** (Roman Ruler) and GIII Pegasus S. hero **Pants On Fire** (Jump Star) to the track shortly after Monmouth

park's fifth race Sunday for a four-furlong work in preparation for Sunday's GI Resorts Casino & Hotel Haskell Invitational. The duo began their works at the half-mile pole with Pants On Fire (Jose Valdivia Jr. on board) along the rail, while Ruler On

Ice (Elvis Trujillo in the irons) shadowed him from the outside. The pair negotiated the opening quarter in :23 3/5 and hit the wire in :47 3/5. "Absolutely perfect," said Breen. "I wanted them to go just under :48. They're both coming off wins, and I just want to keep them sharp. They looked good coming back, both had lots of energy. They'll gallop up to the race now--Just take it easy."

Twirling Candy Works; Target Still Undecided...

Trainer John Sadler sent out **Twirling Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) to a sharp four-furlong drill yesterday at Del Mar as connections mull the next start for the 4-year-old Grade I winner. Working with stablemate Domonation (Maria's Mon), Twirling Candy broke off a length behind, powered up alongside in upper stretch and finished on even terms while under the guidance of jockey Joel Rosario. The official clocker timed him in :47 4/5; Sadler caught him a tick slower. He galloped out five furlongs in 1:00 2/5. Domonation's official time was :48.00. Sadler is scheduled to consult owners Jenny Craig, Will Farish and Marty Wygod regarding Twirling Candy's participation in the GI Pacific Classic on Sunday, Aug. 28. Twirling Candy was third as the even-money chalk in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in his most recent start July 9.

Bold Warrior Back on Track...

Bold Warrior (Bernardini), who dropped his rider during a workout on the Saratoga main track Friday morning, was back on the tab just two days later. The 3-year-old had completed three furlongs in :36.50 Friday when jockey Jose Lezcano was unshipped. "Around the turn, one of the irons slipped out and the rider fell down," explained Fernando Abreu, assistant to Allen Jerkens. "The horse stopped on his own, and the outrider caught him." Unfazed by that experience, Bold Warrior was out for a seven-furlong breeze yesterday, getting the distance in 1:27.86. "He was good today, and he came back well," said Abreu. The Irving Cowan colorbearer broke his maiden in his second career start May 21 at Belmont, and came back June 29 to take an optional-claiming test going seven panels. He has been nominated to the GII Jim Dandy S. July 30, but connections indicated they are more likely to target the Curlin S. July 29. Both stakes are at 1 1/8 miles.

Game On Dude Breezes for Pac Classic...

GI Hollywood Gold Cup runner-up **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) took to the track at Del Mar yesterday morning just around the 9 o'clock hour. Under jockey Chantal Sutherland--who was aboard for that heartbreaking nose defeat and his win in the GI Santa Anita H. earlier in the year--Game On Dude went five furlongs in 1:00 3/5 in company with stablemate Awesome Patriot (Awesome Again). Game On Dude gave Awesome Patriot a four-length headstart before rallying past in the stretch. Clockers caught him through internal splits of :26 and :48 4/5. Awesome Patriot's official clocking was 1:01.40 for five furlongs. "He worked very nice," Baffert said of Game On Dude. "He's going in the Pacific Classic." Baffert said that First Dude (Stephen Got Even), winner of the Gold Cup, is still stabled at Hollywood Park.



Classic Still The Target for Caracortado...

Mike Machowsky wasn't too dismayed by **Caracortado** (Cat Dreams)'s third-place finish in Saturday's GI Eddie Read H. The conditioner said the 4-year-old colt, the 3-2 crowd's choice, came out of the race in fine fettle and is still being pointed to the

1 1/4-mile GI Pacific Classic Aug. 28. "He looks great this morning," Machowsky said of his charge, who finished 4 1/4 lengths behind winner Acclamation (Unusual Heat). "I don't know why the [Eddie Read] turned out the way it did. The other horse [Acclamation] ran awful good, and my horse may have come

back a little too quick off the race at Hollywood Park." Machowsky was referring to Caracortado's game second-place finish to Courageous Cat (Storm Cat) in the GI Shoemaker Mile July 2. Though he hasn't raced on a synthetic track since finishing fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby over a year ago, Caracortado registered his biggest win on the all-weather, taking the GII Robert B. Lewis in March of 2010. Machowsky is anxious to see how he'll do over Del Mar's Polytrack surface. "I really want to try him on the main track here," Machowsky said. "He has trained better on this surface here than on any surface we've ever had. If he trains good and remains healthy, I'll run him in the Pacific Classic. He really loves it down here, and it seems that horses that like it do well. Maybe we can make him the next Richard's Kid for the next couple of years." Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) won the 2009 and 2010 renewals of the Pacific Classic.

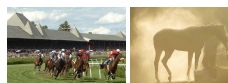

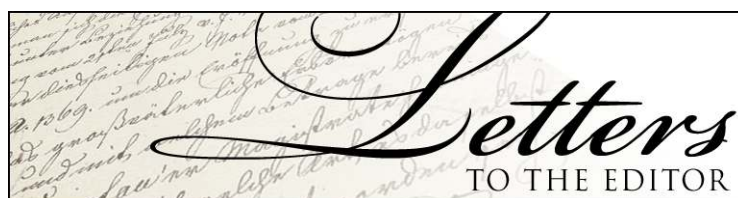

The issue of race-day medication is red hot. By just reading the trade publications, you would be led to believe the issue is black and white. You are either for it or against it. Usually, the truth is somewhere in between.

I have more than 40 years of breeding and racing Thoroughbreds all around the world. I have served as chairman of the New York Racing Commission, on the Board of NYRA, and as advisor on racing policy to three New York governors. What I have learned is for our centuries-old sport to transition to a modern world requires a sensible approach.

I advised Governor Pataki to end the NYRA ban on furosemide because it was destroying jobs in New York and tearing our industry apart. It was common sense. No state can stand as an island in North American racing, and we had to level the playing field.

As a breeder and racehorse owner, I personally favor a ban on race-day medication. On the issue of furosemide, North America has become an island in the world of racing, which effectively means we are a dumping ground for horses that bleed. That is a failed policy with severe consequences for the breed.

A sensible approach is to stage a transition, perhaps over four years, which will eliminate the use of race-day medication and not damage our industry that supports more than 100,000 jobs.

We didn't get into this situation overnight, and abrupt change could be damaging to jobs and investments. I call on our leaders who will decide policy to use a rational and sensible approach. We have a long history of making the right decisions at the right time, and I am sure that will continue.
