IMPAZIBLE TO OVERLOOK

With trainer Todd Pletcher firing on all cylinders this summer, it's impossible to ignore **Mission Impazible** (Unbridled's Song) in today's GI Whitney Invitational H. at Saratoga. On the board in nine of his 11 career starts, the 4-year-old captured the GI New Orleans H. in March before a disappointing seventh-place effort as the favorite in the May 6 GI Alysheba S. at Churchill Downs. The grey just missed in his latest, finishing a neck adrift of Pool Play (Silver Deputy) when runner-up in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 18,

and he has posted a couple of solid works at the Spa since, including a bullet five-eighths in :59 1/5 back on July 17, and a half in :47 4/5 two weeks later. "He seems to be coming up to the race in good order," said Pletcher, who is winning at a 31% clip at the meet, and leads the standings with 17 wins (through Friday), more than double the number of second-placed Chad Brown. His horses have already accumulated more than \$1.1 million at Saratoga this season. **Cont. p2**

NO SMOOTH SAILING FOR TURBULENT DESCENT

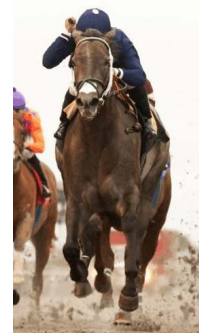
Two-time Grade I winner **Turbulent Descent** (Congrats), installed as the 6-5 favorite in today's GI Test S. for sophomore fillies, is an imposing presence, but that hasn't done much to deter her rivals' connections. The GI Hollywood Starlet S. and GI Santa Anita Oaks victress faces 10 tough foes in this prestigious seven-furlong event. The chalk, who was successful in both of her tries at this distance over synthetic surfaces in last year's Mocassin S. at Hollywood and the GI Beaumont S. at Keeneland in April, exits a very good second-place run in the GI TVG Acorn S. at Belmont June 11. She was upended as the odds-on choice by It's Tricky (Mineshaft) that day, but that runner returned to score in a thrilling renewal of the GI Coaching Club American Oaks on opening weekend at the Spa. **Cont. p3**

A MIGHTY WIND

John Liviakis's homebred **Mighty Caroline** (Stormy Atlantic) hadn't shown much willingness to relax in her first two outings, but the 4-1 second-choice rated beautifully in Friday evening's GI Sorrento S. at Del Mar en route to a handy 1 1/4-length score from **River Kiss** (Awesome Gambler). A debut winner by a nose at Hollywood June 12, Mighty Caroline was coming off a half-length second behind Sorrento favorite **Killer Graces** (Congaree) in the July 16 Landaluce S. back in Inglewood. The grey broke alertly in this 6 1/2-furlong contest, but when River Kiss proved intent on early control directly to her inside, pilot Joel Rosario positioned his mount off of that one's right hip. The reformed speedball did not object, and stalked River Kiss intently through splits of :22.94 and :46.40. She confronted the pacesetter in upper-stretch and, after a brief battle, wrestled command away and drew clear. Late-running Cal-bred stakes winner **Heleanor Rugby** (Tribal Rule) fell a head short of stealing the place money from River Kiss, while Killer Graces never got involved and checked in sixth. "[It was] a golden trip--right where I wanted to be," said Rosario. "She was a little nervous at the beginning, but then she relaxed. That's the key with her. She's a nice filly. I think she can run on, too." **Cont. p8**

Duke of Mischief is another that has worked well over the local surface, recording a bullet half in :46 4/5 July 31. Beaten two lengths when fourth in the Foster last time, he cruised by 2 1/4 lengths after an eye-catching rally in his previous outing, the Apr. 16 GIII Charles Town Classic. "With the quarter-mile stretch at Churchill Downs, I think he moved a little early," said trainer David Fawkes. "He made the lead around the eighth pole and flattened out. He still ran a good race." Fawkes added, "I think his numbers are good enough to win this race." The horse for the course is **Rodman**, perfect in two prior tries at Saratoga. The 6-year-old won twice here during the 2009 meeting, albeit facing \$35,000 claimers and starter-allowance foes. But he has climbed the ladder with success for owner Barry K. Schwartz and trainer Mike Hushion, running second to **Tizway** in the May 30 GI Metropolitan H. and third behind **Flat Out** in the July 2 GII Suburban H. Tizway and Flat Out are both formidable favorites, but have questions that need answering. The former was an ultra-impressive winner of the Met Mile, earning a 113 Beyer Speed Figure for his effort, but owns just one win from eight starts at the distance. Trainer Jimmy Bond believes his charge is doing better than ever, however, and doesn't seem worried about the extra furlong. "He's sound now, and I'm able to train him every day. [Rider] Rajiv [Maragh] and I both believe he'll get the distance," Bond offered. Flat Out also earned a 113 Beyer for his 6 1/2-length romp in the Suburban, but that performance was a drastic step up from anything he had run previously. If he does repeat that monster effort, however, the race might be for second.

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No Smooth Sailing for Turbulent Descent cont...

"When I saw [It's Tricky] in the paddock for the Acorn, I knew we were in for a big race from her," said Turbulent Descent's conditioner Mike Puype. "She moved up like we were going to follow her and that other filly had something left when we got up to her. We're going back to our optimal distance for this race...and I don't see why we can't come out with a good chance to win."

Her Smile gave celebrity chef Bobby Flay his first Grade I winner with a last-to-first run in the July 4 Prioress at Belmont. The pace in the Prioress was hot and set the table for Her Smile's late kick, but Flay is hopeful that a full field of quality sprinters can get things cooking up front again here. "The pace is always strong in the Test," Flay told the *TDN*. "The difference is that the quality of the fillies in the Test always have the ability to go gate to wire even if they run :21 and change for the first quarter. We're hoping the pace is extra hot and Javier [Castellano] will be looking for a seam in the lane." Flay added, "Her Smile will always be special to me because she's my first Grade I winner. Winning any race at Saratoga is an amazing feeling, but to win a Grade I would be a life long dream. We ran second last week with Super Espresso (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GI Ruffian H., so hopefully she was setting the table for her stablemate to take it one notch higher." **Salty Strike** looks like a live longshot turning back off a fourth in the GI Mother Goose S. June 25. She was a handy winner of the one-turn mile GIII Dogwood S. at Churchill previously and has won at seven panels.

FOUR MORE?

Jerry and Ann Moss have stood in the Clement L. Hirsch winner's circle for the last three years courtesy of their champion Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). That big mare is now enjoying retirement in Kentucky, but the Mosses supplemented **Zazu** this week, and she will be the lone 3-year-old in the field. Winner of the GI Las Virgenes S. earlier this year, the grey ran third in the GI Kentucky Oaks May 6, but turned the tables on her Churchill Downs conqueror Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro) with a game effort in the GII Hollywood Oaks June 25. The stretch-running grey would appreciate a solid pace up front. "It's the time of year that you need to test the waters," trainer John Sadler told *Daily Racing Form*. "That's the great thing about Zazu, she's got plenty of quality. We have two good shots in there." That second shot is **Switch**, a Grade I winner at seven furlongs, but runner-up in each of her last three starts, all at two turns. In her last pair, the bay has been edged by division heavyweights Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) and Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the GI Apple Blossom H. and GI Vanity H., respectively. She's expected to keep tabs on likely pacesetter **Freedom Star** here. "We want more of a stalking trip than we've had before," Sadler told *DRF*. Freedom Star, winner of the 2010 GIII Azeri BC H., returned from a 15-month hiatus to post a front-running success in the Iowa Distaff H. at Prairie Meadows June 24.

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RELIEF PITCHER

Fresh from taking the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational last week with Coil (Point Given), trainer Bob Baffert will look to add this valuable pot with **Prayer for Relief**. The Zayat colorbearer was benched after finishing second to Comma to the Top (Bwana Charlie) in the Real Quiet S. at Hollywood last November, but is perfect in two outings since returning. After taking an allowance at the Inglewood oval May 29, the dark bay jumped up to defeat **Sheriff Cogburn** in the GIII Iowa Derby at Prairie Meadows June 25. "He's really become a different horse since we brought him back after he had a little ankle surgery," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. Should the colt run to expectations here, he may test Coil in a few weeks. "We'll take him straight to Saratoga after this," Baffert added. "I'd love to see him jump again and maybe join the big boys. I don't know about the [GI] Travers [Aug. 27], but I never say never."

"Discourse has improved since her win at Newmarket and that race taught her a lot," Al Zarooni said. "The form has worked out well with Gamilati going on to win the Cherry Hinton S. and I think that Discourse can run another nice race--she is certainly a filly for the future." Bin Suroor said of Desert Gazelle, "I was very pleased with Desert Gazelle on her debut and she has improved since that run. She worked very well on Tuesday morning and I am looking forward too seeing how she gets on against some very good fillies." Heading the opposition is **Kinetica**, who beat the re-opposing **Arsaadi** by 2 1/2 lengths in the Listed Star S. at Sandown last time July 21.

GULFSTREAM RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE

Gulfstream Park's 2011-12 stakes schedule was released Friday and, for the first time since it was renovated six years ago, the track will offer 1 1/16-mile races. In order to accommodate the distance, a new finish line has been added further down the stretch on the main track. The \$400,000 GII Fountain of Youth S., set for Feb. 26, will return to the shorter distance after being run at nine panels since 2005. The Feb. 25 \$250,000 GII Davona Dale S. will also be at 1 1/16 miles, as will the newly added \$100,000 Gulfstream Park Derby, to be run Jan. 1. A total of 53 stakes races, worth a total of \$9 million, will be offered at the meet, which will run Dec. 3-Apr. 8, opening a month early this winter. The highlight of the meeting will be the Mar. 31 \$1 million GI Florida Derby, which will be the featured event on a card that also includes an additional six stakes events that offer purses of \$1.86 million. "We are very excited and looking forward to our upcoming season and building off last year's success," said Gulfstream President and General Manager Timothy Ritvo. "We believe the stakes schedule offers the perfect program for 3-year-olds pointing toward the spring classics, and there are numerous opportunities for older horses on both the dirt and turf." Ritvo added, "While running the Florida Derby last season on the first Sunday in April was a huge success, a similar schedule this year would have resulted in running the Florida Derby on Palm Sunday. Because we don't want to exclude our customers and fans in New York from one of our biggest days, we decided to run the Florida Derby this season on the last Saturday in March." The Feb. 1 program will feature the GI Donn H. and GI Gulfstream Park Turf H., and the 10th annual Sunshine Millions is set for Jan. 28. For the complete schedule, go to www.gulfstreampark.com.

"I am very interested in the Evans dispersal," she revealed when asked if she intended to expand her broodmare population. "I am hoping, but who knows--there are probably a lot of people hoping--to get something from him. So I am looking to expand this fall, but I am really not interested in anything more than half a dozen mares. I try to keep it at that level and then its fun."

Dillman has had a long association with Mill Ridge Farm, where her mares are bred and foaled and where the foals are sent for sales preparation before heading to the ring as yearlings. Mill Ridge's Headley Bell helps Dillman plan her matings, and it was Alice Chandler who encouraged her to acquire Havre de Grace's dam, Easter Bunnette (Carson City), in 2003. Dillman purchased the now 13-year-old mare for \$450,000 out of the Keeneland November sale.

"I bought her from the Mill Ridge consignment," Dillman recalled. "I was actually talking to Alice Chandler and she said she thought the mare was worth taking a risk on. [The mare's] family is just wonderful. She is a Carson City mare, so it's not like she's a great big strapping mare, but she also had a certain presence that appealed to me and she throws it on a occasion."

A Dynaformer colt out of Easter Bunnette brought \$450,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September sale and Havre de Grace went through the same sales ring a year later, selling to Rick Porter's Fox Hill Farm for \$380,000. Last September, her Hard Spun filly sold for \$350,000. The mare is now in foal to Tiznow.

Havre de Grace was always special, according to her breeder.

"As a foal, she was out with two other fillies," Dillman recalled. "I had the three of them romping together out in the field and I spent a lot of time watching them. And, I knew which one to sell, let's put it that way. She had a lot of personality and was very smart, very alert and very friendly. She was the leader of the pack."

Dillman is hoping Havre de Grace's younger brother has those same qualities.

"He's a lovely colt and I have my fingers crossed," she said.

Dillman is clearly a woman enjoying what she is doing.

"The mares and foals come back from Mill Ridge and then I have a lovely nursery all summer," she said. "I get to play with the foals. I feed a lot of carrots around here and we give lots of attention. I spoil them a little, I do. I keep telling my husband, if he notices the way I treat my horses, that is the way I would like to be treated."

Does he take the hint?

"He makes sure I have lots of carrots," she laughed.

A JEWEL OF A FILLY

[Hip 57](#), a bay filly by leading sire Tapit from the Denali Stud consignment, will enter the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sales ring Monday night with some big shoes to fill. The yearling, out of **Sweet and Careless** (Hennessy), is a full-sister to 2009 GI Alabama S. winner **Careless Jewel** (Tapit). And, while her older sister may be the main draw, potential buyers will not be disappointed when they get to barn 7, according to Denali's Craig Bendoroff.

"She is one of those types that I say, 'If you don't like her, you don't like horses,'" Bendoroff stated. "She is a lovely filly with a lot of quality.

Some of them show their hands kind of early and she's been that way from the get-go; one that we always thought would grow up and be nice."

Bendoroff added, "She is very correct. She is not the biggest thing in the world, but I think she is big enough. I've noticed that with Tapits--not all of them are real big."

Careless Jewel, who sold for just \$40,000 as a Keeneland September yearling in 2007, won five of seven starts and over \$1 million racing for Donver Stable. In addition to her scintillating 11-length victory in the Alabama, she won the GII Fitz Dixon Cotillion S. and GII Delaware Oaks. She sold for \$1.95 million at last year's Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Bendoroff purchased Sweet and Careless, with her now-yearling filly in utero, for \$900,000 on behalf of breeder Bryant H. Prentice, III out of the 2009 Keeneland November sale.

"He came in about three or four years ago and decided to increase his presence with a commercial broodmare band and play at a pretty high level," Bendoroff said of Prentice. "He's bought four or five very nice mares."

Other recent high-priced mares to join the broodmare band are MSW and GISP **Bon Jovi Girl** (Malibu Moon), a half-sister to champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat), who sold for \$950,000 at last year's Keeneland January sale; and **Flock of Doves** (Kingmambo), a half-sister to Irish champion juvenile Pathfork (Distorted Humor), who was a \$700,000 purchase at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. -JM

With Tax Benefits Set to Expire, Now is the Time for Yearling Buyers...

"Taxation *with* representation ain't so hot, either," said the humorist Gerald Barzan, an opinion many horse owners share. But the federal government, in an effort to stimulate the economy, passed several bills at the end of last year that made things easier, not harder, for those buying Thoroughbreds. More specifically, Congress and the president were hoping to incentivize business owners to invest in their businesses, and that includes horse owners. Those incentives are set to expire in 2012, though, and so folks selling horses are eager to get the word out that it's a fine time to attend a yearling sale...and maybe buy a horse or two. As Thomas A. "Tad" Davis wrote for the NTRA recently, "The write-offs for horses in 2011 are better than they have ever been."

The most significant provision of the Tax Relief Act passed in December, as it relates to buying horses, was the boosting of "bonus depreciation" to 100% for business property purchased and placed in service in 2011. For our purposes, 'equipment' means yearlings, but can also apply to farm equipment, too. For many years, yearling buyers had to depreciate their purchases over a period of seven years. Later, that number was reduced to three years. But the current law allows for the entire cost of a yearling bought in 2011 to be written off. What's best, especially for big buyers, is that there's no price ceiling on bonus depreciation for an individual, there's no limit on the number of yearlings the depreciation can be applied to, nor is there a limit on the aggregate cost of those yearlings. For instance, if you buy a yearling for \$100,000 at Fasig-Tipton Saratoga or Keeneland September this year, every penny of that can be written off on your 2011 return. Likewise, if you buy five yearlings for \$100,000 each, the entire \$500,000 is immediately depreciable. But again, the yearlings must be put in service in 2011--which essentially means they must be put into training.

Why are we talking yearlings, primarily? Because the law restricts this bonus depreciation to "new" business property, and stipulates use must commence with the original buyer. That means that horses that have already been put into use--for example, claiming horses--aren't eligible for this write-off.

But what about 2-year-olds in training who haven't started in a race? For the most part, even though you might not consider them to have been "put in use," the IRS could say it does. There are exceptions, so always talk with a tax advisor before making any decisions. Next year, in 2012, the depreciation rate goes down to 50%. The regular three-year depreciation rules will apply to the rest of the cost.

Now, buyers of juveniles in training, or claiming horses, or those acquiring used farm equipment, have their incentives, too, though nothing as attractive as 100% bonus depreciation. The government also boosted the expense allowance for depreciable property to \$500,000, and unlike the bonus depreciation, the expense allowance can be applied to new *or* used property. Similarly, the property must be placed into service in 2011. Also note that the expense deduction must be reduced as purchases of all business property during the year, including horses, exceed \$2 million. Of course, if you've bought a yearling in 2011, there's no reason not to take the bonus depreciation, but if you acquired a 2-year-old in training earlier this year, the elevated expense allowance can make a big difference in your 2011 tax return. Expense allowance drops to \$125,000 for 2012.

Talk of the debt ceiling and the 11th-hour bill that passed earlier this week has dominated the news, and Congress's decision to form a bipartisan "super committee" to explore the best ways of reducing the national debt will be closely watched by tax analysts. We asked Davis, a tax lawyer based in Washington who works closely with the NTRA, what ramifications the deal could have on racing, and what we can expect going forward. "The bill that just passed didn't have anything that directly, or indirectly, affects horse racing," he said. "It is likely that changes to the tax code will be considered by this new super committee after it begins its work. Assuming that is the case, they could be looking at tax loopholes, and maybe some tax expenditures. They probably do not have time to do a complete reform to the tax code, as was suggested by the Federal Debt Commission. While I don't think there will be any major changes targeted at those in the business of breeding and racing Thoroughbreds,

predicting what is going to happen in the Congress is, at best, only a guess, even by those who are members of the body. Needless to say, those of us in Washington will be keeping a close watch on developments."

There appears to be an abundance of speed in this race, which features the stateside debut of Deluxe (Storm Cat), a near-Group 1 winner in France out of the great producer Hasili. I'll use her, but I like **#3 Prize Catch** a lot more. She's 2-for-2 at this distance with a stakes win going a sixteenth longer, but was stretched out to 1 1/4 miles last time to contest the GII New York S. The pace was absolutely glacial that day, and there wasn't much change in the order of finish late, so Prize Catch was very much up against it, finishing fifth of six. Runner-up Zagora returned to take the GI Diana S. last weekend, and I expect Prize Catch to relish the shorter trip in similar fashion. While she has the type of pedigree (A.P. Indy out of a Seattle Dancer mare) and running style that would lead one to believe that more distance would be to her liking, Prize Catch performs like a closing miler. She's best when far off the pace with something to run at, rather than crawling around closer to a soft pace, and she'll get her preferred trip this time. **Yesterday's Results:** Sanagas was bet down to just under 6-1, but came through with an easy 2 1/4-length score to get the ball rolling. A colt from the first crop of Kentucky-bred Notable Guest, the only son of Kingmambo at stud in Brazil, topped the traditional sale of 2-year-olds at Thursday's Brazilian Jockey Club Tattersall in Rio de Janeiro. Consigned as hip 21, the Brazilian-bred son of Lua Soberana (Brz) (Pleasant Variety) was hammered down for R\$150,000 (US\$94,500) to top the session. Named Amazing Guest, the half-brother to Brazilian MG1SP Vasuveda (Brz) and MGSP Silly Girl (Brz) was consigned by Haras Pirassununga, breeder of last year's G1 Carlos Pellegrini winner Xin Xu Lin (Brz) and the evening's top consignor. The sale brought gross receipts of R\$1,229,500 (US\$773,614) for 39 hips, with an average of R\$31,500 (US\$19,836).

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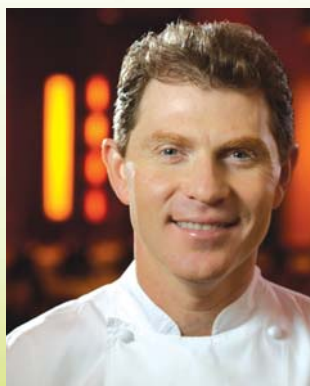
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
