'WAY' TO GO

Well, maybe we do have a leader in the handicap division. William Clifton Jr.'s **Tizway** (Tiznow), resurgent at age six, followed up his GI Metropolitan H. victory with a convincing win in the GI Whitney H. Saturday at Saratoga. "He loves it here," confirmed winning trainer Jim Bond. "He's the best miler in the country, and he is the best older horse in the country." Tizway will make his next start in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Oct. 1--a race he was third in two years ago--before going for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Nov. 5. **Cont. p3-4**

NOT MUCH OF A TEST FOR TURBULENT DESCENT

Turbulent Descent (Congrats) was hammered down to 4-5 for the GI Test S. at Saratoga and ran to those odds. Under tender handling late by jockey David Flores, she scored by 3 3/4 lengths from **Pomeroy's Pistol** (Pomeroy). "She'll take on any horse out there at this distance," said winning trainer Mike Puype. "It puts her right to the top of the division." Puype indicated that Turbulent Descent would head back to California Monday, and that her long-term goal is the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint at Churchill Nov. 4. No decision has been made yet about her next start. **Cont. p2-3**

BIG SHOT

Mill House's **Trappe Shot** (Tapit) will look to solidify his credentials as one of the nation's top sprinters this afternoon in the GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. After edging a tough group in an overnight stakes at Belmont May 11, the chestnut cruised through the slop to take the GI True North H. by 8 1/2 lengths a month later, earning a 111 Beyer Speed Figure. "It's important to win a Grade I for him as a stallion and maybe be champion sprinter," said trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "We don't want to get ahead of ourselves, but he's doing very well." **Cont. p8-9**

HE'S GOT THE POWER

Aidan O'Brien has missed out only twice since he started his winning spree in the G1 Keeneland Phoenix S. back in 1998 and saddles a strong contingent as he bids to continue that sequence. ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) built on a defeat of **Tough As Nails (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) in the Listed Marble Hill S. over five furlongs here May 21 when maintaining his unbeaten run in Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. last time June 14. Seamus Heffernan takes the mount. "He's one of our smartest 2-year-olds, and it seems like he has been improving the whole time," Heffernan told *PA Sport*. "He's a tough horse with a big heart, and he responds when you really need him. There are a lot of strong, mature 2-year-olds in there and, hopefully, the luck is with us. This race is always a good trial, and whatever wins it normally goes on and wins a second Group 1 and runs well in the Classics next year." **Cont. p9**

Turbulent Descent broke alertly and secured a stalking spot while in the three path as Roman Treasure showed the way through relatively soft splits of :23.02 and :45.85 over a Saratoga strip that was playing on the slow side. David Flores gave the favorite her cue approaching the stretch and the powerfully built bay responded smoothly. She quickly opened up daylight approaching the eighth pole, and Flores barely broke a sweat in the final furlong. Her Smile (Include), last for the opening half-mile, mounted a late bid to finish fourth.

The winner has an accomplished resume, taking the GI Hollywood Starlet S. in her juvenile finale. Second to Zazu (Tapit) in the GI Las Virgenes S. in her 2011 opener, Turbulent Descent turned the tables on that grey in the GI Santa Anita Oaks. She romped in the GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland before finishing second to It's Tricky (Mineshaft) in a sloppy renewal of the GI Acorn S. at Belmont June 6 in her most recent outing. **Cont. p3**

"We took her out early at 5:30 [Saturday morning] and jogged her a mile," Puype added. "I usually don't send her out the day of races, but we wanted her to get used to her surroundings. I trained her a little harder for the race. I wanted to make sure she was ready for a deeper track. She put herself in a new financial category today, and she's in line to win an Eclipse Award."

Turbulent Descent has a 2-year-old half-brother by Trippi named Perfect Trippi that was purchased by Hidden Brook as agent for \$150,000 at OBSAPR. Her dam produced an In Summation colt this past February, and was later covered by both A.P. The filly's owners include Scott Sherwood and William Strauss, both of California, and Robert Butler of Colorado Springs. Sherwood, a childhood racing fan, owned and operated a retail sporting goods company, and now heads the Blinkers On Racing syndicate. Tizway was sent off as the tepid 4-1 favorite against this competitive group, and came away smoothly to secure the catbird seat in third while three wide. Friend or Foe (Friends Lake) and Morning Line (Tiznow) sparred through a :49.11 opening half and continued through six furlongs in 1:13.85. Morning Line began to retreat on the far turn as Tizway began to loom menacingly on the outside. Rider Rajiv Maragh pressed the button and the 6-year-old revved his engine, galloping relentlessly to the line for his second straight top-level success. Flat Out came off the rail to complete the exacta, while Giant Oak rallied from last to nab the photo from third. "Rajiv rode him just tremendously," said trainer Jim Bond. "I thought, 'Let them fall out of there, don't take back, let him do his thing,' and Rajiv knows him like a book. He will go 1 1/8 miles, he will go 1 1/4 miles.

The first three-eighths of a mile, I knew [the others] were in trouble. We were in good shape. He was in his rockin' mode. He's got a high cruising speed and he's got an endless supply of oxygen. This horse just keeps cruising. The way he carries his head--he just gets down, and look out." Tizway is the first horse to complete the Met Mile/Whitney double since In Excess (Ire) 20 years ago.

Tizway, fourth in the 2009 Whitney prior to rounding out the trifecta behind star sophomores Summer Bird (Birdstone) and Quality Road (Elusive Quality) in the Jockey Club Gold Cup. He filled the same spot to Quality Road last May in the Met Mile and, five months later, aired in the GII Kelso H. at Belmont. Fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in November, the dark bay began 2011 with a narrow defeat in the GII Gulfstream Park H. Mar. 12. He finished third to Duke of Mischief (Graeme Hall) under the lights in the GIII Charles Town Classic Apr. 16 before galloping his rivals into the ground in the Met Mile on Memorial Day. After stopping the clock in 1:32.90 that day, Tizway earned a 113 Beyer Speed Figure.

Tizway was bred by Mandy Pope's Whisper Hill Farm, based in Citra, Florida. A native of North Carolina, Pope grew up showing hunters and jumpers, and traveled to Florida in 1980 with her show horses. Introduced to racing at that time, she decided to make the Ocala area her home. She bought Whisper Hill two years later, and the commercial breeding operation now includes about 50 horses. Tizway's dam, unraced Bethany (Dayjur), in foal to Pleasant Tap, was bought by Pope for \$135,000 at KEEJAN 2002. She slipped that foal, but produced the stakes-winning and graded-placed filly Ticket to Seattle (Capote) in 2004. The filly brought \$260,000 as an OBSAPR juvenile in 2006. Bethany has a yearling filly by Elusive Quality, and produced a full-brother to Tizway this spring. The mare is a half-sister to 1997 Whitney winner Will's Way (Easy Goer), who was also trained by Jim Bond.

Spendthrift Secures Stud Services...

Shortly after Tizway's Whitney victory, Spendthrift announced that it had acquired the breeding rights to the son of Tiznow, and that he would enter stud there in 2012. "Tizway is a huge addition to the Spendthrift stallion ranks and we could not be more excited to be able to stand a horse of his caliber," said Ned Toffey, Spendthrift's general manager. "For him to follow up his stellar Met Mile victory with a win today over another great field in the Whitney, one would have to say there is no finer older horse in the country."

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Put up to first after crossing the line second to the wayward St Trinians (Piccolo {GB}) in the GII Milady H. in Inglewood May 21, she came charging hard in the seven-furlong GII A Gleam H. July 16, but was a nose shy of Irish Gypsy (Hennessy).

Ultra Blend brought up the rear as Freedom Star (Street Cry {Ire}) went up to set the pace while shadowed by odds-on Switch. The chalk turned up the pressure on the far turn, with Zazu and rider Garrett Gomez waiting to decide whether to go inside or out of the tiring pacesetter. Ultra Blend took the overland route entering the stretch, kicked into gear down the center of the track and hit the wire a whisker in front of Zazu, who made a rail run. "At Hollywood Park, that was a tough beat," said winning trainer Art Sherman. "I had to go home and have two martinis after that photo. She's just one of those game, tryin' fillies. She doesn't get a lot of respect being a Cal-bred running against open company. But she should get some Cal-bred award this year, don't you think?" The victory earned Ultra Blend an automatic berth in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Churchill Nov. 4, but her connections will keep the GI BC F/M Sprint in mind as well.

Prayer for Relief got up in the final jump to stay perfect on the year. It's been quite a turnaround for the dark bay, who began his career with a pair of sixth-place finishes at Del Mar last summer. He was dropped in for a confidence-boosting score against \$50,000 maidens at Oak Tree in October, and concluded 2010 with a second behind GISW Comma to the Top (Bwana Charlie) in the Real Quiet S. at Hollywood Nov. 6. The Zayat colorbearer's sophomore bow was delayed by ankle surgery, but he's been worth the wait.

West Virginia Derby cont.

After capturing a May 29 entry-level allowance at Hollywood, he secured the GIII Iowa Derby at Prairie Meadows June 25. Trainer Bob Baffert paired up last year's Iowa and West Virginia Derbies with Concord Point (Tapit), and Prayer for Relief was able to follow in his former stablemate's hoofprints. After breaking from the rail, rider Rafael Bejarano positioned the favorite into a drafting spot behind pacesetter Rush Now, who was racing several paths out. A semi could have driven through the hole on the inside turning for home, but Bejarano sat chilly on his mount, and finally got after him late. Prayer for Relief hit the gas late and edged past Rush Now in the shadow of the wire.

Having earned ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status when nailing her favored stable companion and subsequent G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner Gamilati (GB) (Bernardini) late on in a six-furlong maiden here June 24, Discourse added further luster to Godolphin's record with 2-year-old fillies in 2011 with a decisive win here. Keen early without cover under Frankie Dettori, the bay eventually settled behind the leading trio before looming upsides Kinetica traveling strongly passing the quarter pole. In front as soon as her rider asked the question a few strides later, she needed only to be pushed out to open up lengths on the tiring long-time leader and staying-on Lily's Angel, with Godolphin's other ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Desert Gazelle (Smart Strike) closing from rear without ever threatening to be fourth. "She's got a lovely attitude and today she was quite impressive," Godolphin representative Charlie Appleby said. "Frankie said she was always traveling exceptionally well, and going into the dip there was only one winner. There are no plans, but she is entered in the G1 Fillies' Mile [on Newmarket's Rowley Mile Sept. 23]." He continued, "She knew her job first time out, and she should get a mile no problem. Before her first run we thought she was a nice filly, but since then she has improved physically. Winning this well as a 2-year-old is a bonus. Hopefully, she has 3-year-old written all over her." Discourse is a half-sister to GI Blue Grass S. hero Bandini (Fusaichi Pegasus) and was produced by a half-sister to successful sire Stormy Atlantic (Storm Cat). Her dam, Divine Dixie, was acquired by Stonerside Stable for \$2 million at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton November Sale while carrying a full-sibling to Bandini, and was part of the Sheikh Mohammed's purchase of Stonerside's stock back in 2008. Divine Dixie had a colt by Street Cry (Ire) in 2010 and did not have a foal this spring.

Joining Power from Ballydoyle are **Reply**, who looked a colt with a future when registering a four-length maiden win over this track and trip when last seen May 22; and the filly **After**, who was runner-up in this venue's G3 Anglesey S. over slightly farther last time July 17. Reply's rider Joseph O'Brien told *PA Sport*, "Power won the Coventry, and he is going to be the one they all have to beat, but my horse won his maiden nicely and, hopefully, he can step up from that." Each year, a British challenger emerges to take on the home guard, but it's been 14 years since they were successful. Looking to snap that trend are **Frederick Engels** and **Lilbourne Lad**, who are more than worthy of their places here. The former beat the Coventry runner-up Roman Soldier (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) by a length in Newmarket's G2 July S. last time July 7, and trainer David Brown is hopeful he can hold his own. "We think he's come on again from Newmarket, and Power has us to beat," Brown said.

Lilbourne Lad has already been to these shores twice and was successful on both occasions, with a six-length verdict in the Listed Rochestown S. at Naas June 6 followed by a defeat of Tough As Nails in the course-and-distance G2 Railway S. June 26. "He keeps on surprising us and seems to be getting better and better," trainer Richard Hannon said. "His Railway S. form looks solid and, while it is a hot race, he deserves to have a shot at the big boys."

WELCOME RAIN

Dancing Rain breaks new ground here as the first G1 Epsom Oaks winner to take part in a contest that is customarily dominated by the domestic runners. Following her defeat of Wonder of Wonders (Kingmambo) in the June 3 Epsom Classic, she was only fifth behind Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) in the Curragh's G1 Irish Oaks July 17 but that form remains a notch above the best that her rivals can offer. "According to the official handicapper, she has seven pounds in hand and, while that doesn't always work out, she'd have a favourite's chance," trainer William Haggas told the *Racing Post*. "I think she's better on quicker ground, but it was soft in Ireland and she ran satisfactorily. However, I'm very wary of the German horses if the ground is very soft--they tend to grow a leg when conditions are testing. That said, it looks the right race for her and she's in very good form."

Peter Schiergen has four representatives, and chief among them is **Navarra Queen**, who is unbeaten this term and was supplemented this week on the back of her performance in the G3 Premio Mario Incisa at the San Siro June 26. **Djumama** is another home-trained adversary of note. She beat **Dalarna** in the G3 Schwarzgold-Rennen at Cologne May 22 before finishing fifth in the G2 German 1000 Guineas here June 19. Back to winning ways in the Listed Diana-Trial over this track and trip last time July 17, she holds strong claims alongside another supplementary in **Karsabruni**, who bested **Labrice** by a neck in the July 2 G3 Hamburger Stutenpreis. "She is in excellent form, and the fact that she has won here is a plus, although I think she would be better suited by a more conventional track," Djumama's trainer Andreas Lowe told the *Post*.

DREAM DREAM DREAM

With everything in his favor, **Dream Ahead** looks certain to provide a bold show in following his hugely impressive win in Newmarket's G1 July Cup here. Unbeaten at shorter than seven furlongs, last year's joint top-rated juvenile has already won at this meeting when plundering the G1 Prix Morny last term and is proven in the soft, having beaten Strong Suit (Rahy) by nine lengths in the G1 Middle Park S. on Newmarket's Rowley Mile course in October. "He's in good order and has trained very well from the July Cup--everything has gone very smoothly, and I'm really looking forward to running him," trainer David Simcock said. "He's always been a horse with lots of ability and, physically, he looks fantastic. That's where the improvement has been over the winter and up to now. We'll get Sunday and the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup out of the way, and then we'll make a plan for one last run at the end of the season." A French success looks a longshot here, with so many talented British and Irish-trained sprinters in the line-up, but one who could get involved is the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆ Moonlight Cloud**. She bounced back from a 1 1/2-length defeat by Sahpresa (Sahm) in the G3 Prix du Palais-Royal over seven furlongs at Longchamp June 4 to win over that same track and trip in the G3 Prix de la Porte Maillot last time July 2. Trainer Freddy Head told *Paris-Turf*, "She has a lot of speed, a sharp turn of foot and this will be her distance." Last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere hero **Wootton Bassett** would be a strong candidate if he can regain that form, having finished off the board in two attempts at a mile this term in the May 15 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at Longchamp and June 14 G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot. "We were delighted with how things were going before Goodwood, but he scoped dirty on the Sunday before the meeting," trainer Richard Fahey said, referring to the colt's late scratching from Tuesday's G2 Lennox S. "But all is back in order now."





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"He traveled over on Thursday night and we just hope he can bounce back and run a race." Adding further weight to the cross-channel raid is the June 18 G1 Golden Jubilee S. winner **Society Rock**, who is back from a foot injury which ruled him out of the July Cup. "He had a corn in his foot, which took him a while to get over after Ascot, but he seems in good form now," trainer James Fanshawe told *PA Sport*. "He's a difficult horse to judge at home because he's not a fancy worker, but he seems well, and it's a very interesting race."

Having annexed the June 16 G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot, she was a short-head second to Blue Bunting (Dynaformer) in the July 17 G1 Irish Oaks over 12 furlongs here. She showed she has not stopped improving, and she sets a high standard here, despite carrying a penalty. **Dunboyne Express** has always threatened to win at this level and comes here on the back of a second to the Leopardstown specialist Famous Name (GB) (Dansili {GB}) in the July 21 G3 Meld S. over nine furlongs. It is interesting that of a strong six-day contingent Aidan O'Brien has opted to run only the filly **Gemstone**. She was just over five-lengths sixth behind Banimpire in the Irish Oaks last time and warrants respect from the stable successful on six of the last 10 occasions.

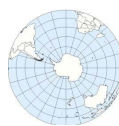

It's Tricky will start next in the GI TVG Alabama S. Aug. 20. McLaughlin also sent out Mill House's GI Travers S.-bound **Rattlesnake Bridge** (Tapit) for a five-furlong move in 1:02.87. The \$450,000 FTMMAY graduate was last seen posting a narrow victory in Monmouth's Long Branch S. July 9.

"He continues to train well, and he'll have a couple more works the next few Saturdays," McLaughlin commented. "We're happy to have the time. It's hard to run every three or four weeks these days, so it's nice to be able to have a little time."

Time a 'Factor' for King's Bishop Start...

Fog City Stable and George Bolton's **The Factor** (War Front), sidelined by a hairline ankle fracture since finishing seventh as the chalk in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 16, remains possible for the prestigious GI King's Bishop S. at Saratoga Aug. 27. The GII San Vicente S. and GII Rebel S. hero breezed five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 at Del Mar Aug. 1. "We have a couple of works to go before [we'll consider taking him to Saratoga]," trainer Bob Baffert commented. "It's going to be tight. Getting ready for seven-eighths is not like three-quarters. I'm in the exact same boat as [Todd Pletcher with Uncle Mo].

"I'm just getting him ready. If he makes it, he makes it. I just have to worry about the ones I have here now." The Hall of Fame trainer made his first appearance at the Spa this summer to watch GI Haskell Invitational S. winner **Coil** (Point Given) and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) gallop Saturday. Plum Pretty, a game second in the GI TVG Coaching Club American Oaks July 23, is under consideration for the GI TVG Alabama S. Aug. 20. The Peachtree colorbearer worked four furlongs in :48 at Saratoga Aug. 4. "Plum Pretty looked great," Baffert said. "She came out of her work really well. She got tired in her race. She was at a little disadvantage because the track is a little deeper. I haven't made the call yet for the Alabama. She looks fantastic right now." Karl Watson, Mike Pegram and Paul Weitman's Coil is targeting the GI Travers S. Aug. 27. "Coil came out of that race really well," Baffert said. "He was amped coming off [the track Saturday morning] with his tail in the air. I thought he was going to get loose." Baffert continued, "[Coil] is getting better with every race. For as hard as he ran, I thought it'd knock him out. The groom, Roberto, who took care of Point Given, said he's like his daddy, and is going to get stronger with more racing. It was an impressive race. He even 'wowed' me."

Fractured Shoulder for Bearpath...

Graded stakes winner **Bearpath** (Dynaformer--Song 'n Silk, by Unbridled's Song) fractured his left front shoulder when stumbling and unseating his rider in Friday's John's Call S. at Saratoga. "He's doing okay," trainer Ian Wilkes said of the 5-year-old. "He's resting and we're taking it day by day. We're watching him very carefully. I don't want the horse to suffer, but I'd like to save him if we can." The Lothenbach Stables colorbearer won the 2010 GIII Pan American S. at Gulfstream and also placed second in last term's GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. at Saratoga. Jockey Frederic Lenclud was unhurt in the mishap. Bearpath has a record 25-4-4-3 and earnings of \$380,969.

GLENCREST CHANGING WITH THE TIMES

Glencrest Farm has been breeding and racing Thoroughbreds for over six decades, earning plenty of respect in its tenure under founder John W. Greathouse through to its current management by brothers John, David, Allen and Edward. Well steeped in history and tradition, the Midway, Kentucky nursery is responsible for champions Lady Pitt and Wavering Girl; 11 Grade I winners, including Kentucky Derby hero Venetian Way,

GI Kentucky Oaks winner Pike Place Dancer and three-time Grade I victress Devil May Care (Malibu Moon); and over 120 stakes winners. The operation hopes to add to its legacy with a contingent of six yearlings at this week's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Select sale in Saratoga Springs.

"This is probably as many as I've brought here in a number of years," said Glencrest Farm's David Greathouse. "We normally bring three or four, but this year we had a couple

of extra to bring over."

A pair of Glencrest homebreds by hot sire Candy Ride (Arg) represent the farm on Monday; [Hip 30](#) and [Hip 95](#). The former--out of Risk (Wavering Monarch)--is a half-sister to GSP Dave in Dixie (Dixie Union), while the latter is a son of Christina Lake (Meadowlake). During Tuesday's session, Glencrest offers a trio of colts--[Hip 127](#), by Pulpit; [Hip 129](#), by Mineshaft; and [Hip 145](#), by Harlan's Holiday. Glencrest also is represented by [Hip 112](#)--a filly by Rockport Harbor--who is out of Dynabunny (Dynaformer), who is herself a half-sister to GISW Havre de Grace (Saint Liam).

"I bought her as a weanling, because I loved the family," said Greathouse of Glencrest's sole female representative on Day 2. "You can definitely see more of her female family in there than the Rockport Harbor side of her. She's a big, great-walking filly. There's definitely more Dynaformer in her. Rockport Harbor was on the bubble when I bought her, but he has shown that he is a useful sire. I've always had very good luck selling fillies with very good families at Saratoga, and I don't think they get much better than her family."

While last year's catalog was comprised of just over 200 horses, this year's slimmed down version provides 160 yearlings offered over two days.

"I think people are a little scared of bringing horses to Saratoga," said Greathouse. "Maybe it's because they don't think they have enough horses to bring here, and prefer to wait until Keeneland September to save themselves the extra expense. I really don't know why, because I think there is a very good market at Saratoga for the right horse."

No stranger to the Saratoga sales' scene, Greathouse outlined his criteria for selecting the 'right' horse for the boutique auction in upstate New York.

"Really, I just try to place horses where I think they belong," he said. "Most of these horses have some northeastern connection, the pinhooks especially, and they are by proven sires. I think having ties to Eastern racing doesn't hurt."

With many present-day sales offering generously populated catalogs, Saratoga remains atop a very short list of venues that offers a small but select group that are split over two generally popular evening sessions. While the format can be advantageous to the buyer, Greathouse contends that it can sometimes be a disadvantage to the seller.

"The number one problem is we have way too long to look at them," offered Greathouse. "If you look at a horse enough times you will find something about him you don't like. When you have three or four days to look at 160 horses, it works against you as a seller. Normally, buyers might knock out the same number in a half a day, and with this sale, they have four days to look at them. It's just the nature of the beast. The real professionals in our business, who do this as a living, do not need to come back multiple times to have a look. But you'll still get a lot of that up here."

It's All Business...

Predominantly breeding to race in the early years, Glencrest branched off into pinhooking several years ago, and according to Greathouse, the decision to play in all ends of the market has never been as vital as it is given the current economic climate.

"The business dictated it; it's almost impossible to just do one thing in this business now," said Greathouse, who partnered with John T.L. Jones Jr., Dan Kenny and Kerry Cauthen in 2002 to form Four Star Sales, the sales arm of Glencrest's breeding and racing operation. "We've been breeders for years, and we've always raced. And if you're going to race, you have to be able to look at it from the other side to be able to support your broodmare band and serve some of your other clients. Four Star was able to help me keep my standards of selling horses. It would be nice if just the farm name was on the [catalogue] page, but our name is there with Four Star on everything we sell, so I can't worry about everybody's perception of it. Glencrest is a farm that races, and the horses are still raced the same way, it's just marketed a little differently." Cont. p16



A pair of Glencrest homebred yearlings are slated to go under the hammer on Day 1 of the sale, while in contrast, Tuesday's session highlights a quartet of weanling purchases from last year's Keeneland November sale. Hip 112 (Rockport Harbor filly) brought \$20,000; Hip 127 (Pulpit colt) sold for \$110,000; Hip 129 (Mineshaft colt) realized \$105,000; and Hip 145 (Harlan's Holiday colt) went for \$90,000.

"Every year, we spend somewhere between \$700,000 and \$1 million pinhooking, and that's really stayed about the same the last seven or eight years," he said. "With the weanlings, we try to stay in the medium price range— \$75,000-125,000. We bought one as much as \$170,000 and another as little as \$20,000. With the yearlings, we generally remain in the \$50,000-\$150,000 range. Basically, we look for value where ever we think we can find it."

Listed among earlier successes for Greathouse and Four Star Sales are Adieu (El Corredor), who brought \$140,000 at this sale in 2004; and Rapport (Songandaprayer), who realized \$475,000 in 2008. While those final prices were not the stuff of legends, Greathouse points out that it is not necessarily the out-of-the-park homeruns that dictate longevity in this business.

"I didn't pay a lot for the mare Irene's Talkin [dam of Adieu], and on a \$20,000 stud fee [Songandaprayer 2002 fee], I sold her for \$140,000," recalled Greathouse. "They weren't huge scores, but they were among a number of really solid singles and doubles that we had to have to remain profitable."

As the world market, and by extension the Thoroughbred market, began to sour, Glencrest continued to fine-tune its program to withstand the demands of the present day economy.

"We have taken some partners in where we used to just do it ourselves," explained Greathouse. "But I couldn't buy enough stock, doing it on our own, so I formed a pinhooking syndicate that Glencrest is a big part of, probably close to 50%, and partners make up the rest. Four Stars is involved in that as well."

Further underscoring the commitment to prosperity through diversity, Glencrest is also involved in the yearling/juvenile pinhooking market. And according to Greathouse, the venture adds yet another way to attract the new player into the racing game.

"I do have a number of people in my yearling to 2-year-old pinhooking syndicate," he said. "They are new people that I brought in, and our intention is to sell them, but not mind racing them if we have to. That way we are not forced to make a sale, we will sell them when the horses are ready, and if we end up with them, we race them. When you go over to the sales and buy something [to pinhook], you have to stand by your convictions. It is a little bit of a luxury of not being forced to sell. That is our main goal, but the group of people I have are mostly new, and it was a thought I had to get new people into racing. It's worked out very well for us."

Despite the overall success of Glencrest's pinhooking endeavors, Greathouse explains that even the best-laid plans don't always yield positive results.

"Pinhooking money is sort of luxury money, and the last couple of years, with the way the economy has been, things haven't been easy," admitted Greathouse. "The new people I brought in have stayed in. Some other people that had been around and did it a little bit, have gone in their own direction. That's just the nature of the business."--C Bossinakis

There isn't much speed in this race for a Grade I sprint, and there seems to be the potential for a loose leader to steal it. **#3 Atta Boy Roy** draws inside, and will definitely be sent to the front. The well-traveled 6-year-old first showed up on the national scene when he stole the GII Churchill Downs S. on the Kentucky Derby undercard last May, and he validated that effort with a second-place finish in the GIII Aristides S. (105 Beyer); a runner-up performance behind last year's monster winner of the Vanderbilt, Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday), in the Iowa Sprint H. (104 Beyer); and a 5 1/2-length tally in the Remington Park Sprint Cup (103 Beyer). He hasn't been quite as good this year, but he's been up against it. Two back in this year's Aristides, Atta Boy Roy battled outside of the very fast Cash Refund (Petionville), dueled that one into submission (Cash Refund finished last) and dug in gamely until late stretch when he finally succumbed to Noble's Promise (Cuvee) late ([TDN Video](#)). He had no chance to make the lead last time in the Iowa Sprint, as horses to his inside dashed off to a :21 1/5 opening quarter while Atta Boy Roy was hung wide--he finished third with a low 87 Beyer, but that's not overly pertinent in this case ([TDN Video](#)). TEAM IRELAND REGISTER SHERGAR CUP

THREE-PEAT Reigning champions Ireland left it late, but a final-race exacta saw the three-rider squad climb to the top of the leaderboard and claim a third straight edition of the Dubai Duty Free-sponsored Shergar Cup in front of a crowd of over 30,000 at Ascot yesterday. Captained again by Richard Hughes, Ireland's other representatives were last year's Silver Saddle winner Fran Berry and newcomer Colm O'Donoghue. It was the latter pair who sealed a last-to-first victory to take their team's tally to 70 points, besting Britain's 63, the Rest of the World's 57 and Europe's 50. The six-race event became a four-team competition in 2007 and, now in its 13th year, is restricted to 10 runners per race--handicaps over a variety of trips from five furlongs to two miles. Points are awarded to the first five finishers in each heat. "That was a good way to end the day," commented Berry, who won the closing Dubai Duty Free Shergar Cup Sprint on **Morache Music (GB)** (Sleeping Indian {GB}). "I think Richard [Hughes] was fifth and Colm [O'Donoghue] was second, so when we were pulling up we were doing our sums and we thought we'd got it. I had a great day here last year, and I'd like to thank Ascot for the opportunity to come back. If we could work it out we'd love to do something similar in Ireland, as it seems a great way to get new people into racing." Ireland's other success came courtesy of O'Donoghue aboard **Parlour Games (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) in the Titanic Belfast Shergar Cup Classic. It was the Ballydoyle jockey's first victory for Godolphin, albeit in the green silks allocated to his team. "There are great jockeys from around the world competing today, and it's really nice to be part of it," revealed O'Donoghue. "I spoke to Frankie [Dettori] about Parlour Games this morning, and his advice worked well. It's about getting in there, getting the job done, and I'm happy to ride a winner for the connections." **Cont. p7**

Britain's reigning champion jockey Paul Hanagan claimed this year's Silver Saddle, the award given to the rider accumulating most points. Making his debut in the competition, he opened the meeting with victory on Godolphin's **Sarsar (GB)** (Shamardal) in the Les Ambassadeurs Casino Shergar Cup Mile before a third-place finish on **Firebeam (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in the closing Sprint rubber-stamped the win. "I was a bit gutted I couldn't have won the last race for the [Great Britain] team, but I really enjoyed the day and would love to come back," said Hanagan. "It's a privilege to represent your country, and the atmosphere was great."

ROMAN SOLDIER SOLD TO HONG KONG

INTERESTS Roman Soldier (Ire) (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}), who finished runner-up in the June 14 G2 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot and the July 7 G2 July S. at Newmarket, has been sold out of Jeremy Nosedá's Newmarket yard--in a deal brokered by Hubie de Burgh--and will continue his career in Hong Kong, according to *Racing Post*. The bay juvenile raced in the colors of Susan Roy four times this term, improving off an Apr. 30 debut sixth at Goodwood to graduate at Leicester May 31, before registering his pair of Group 2 seconds. "Roman Soldier has been sold to race in Hong Kong, but who will train him is yet to be determined," de Burgh told the trade daily. "He's a very talented horse, and the idea now is to give him a break to allow him time to develop. He won't run again this year and, hopefully, should make a smart 3-year-old."
