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ALABAMA SLAMMA

This year's GI TVG Alabama S. at Saratoga features a stellar six-horse line-up. GI Acorn winner **It's Tricky** (Mineshaft) faces GI Kentucky Oaks victress **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro) again after their thrilling battle in the GI CCA Oaks July 24, while **Inglorious** (Hennessy), the best 3-year-old in Canada of either sex, will attempt to transfer her outstanding Polytrack form

in a return to conventional dirt. There are no slouches in the supporting cast, either. **TDN Rising Star** **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) confirmed her early promise with a sharp win in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico in May, but missed an intended start in the GI Mother Goose S. the following month with a

foot bruise. She was a bit too fresh in the CCA Oaks and wound up third. "She didn't settle well, she didn't rate well," said trainer Bill Mott. "She was a little strong with the rider [Jose Lezcano] early on and I think it compromised her finish." Well-bred for today's 10-furlong distance, the dark bay will go on the block in November as part of the Prince Saud bin Khaled dispersal, and a Grade I victory would add just that little bit to an already strong catalogue page. "She's a very nice filly and whoever buys her is going to be very lucky," Mott said. "She's from a good family. I would think she's not only a good racing prospect, but a good broodmare prospect." **Cont. p5**

SHOWDOWN AT THE SHORE

An well-matched field will line up for today's GI Del Mar Oaks, with Team Valor International's **Summer Soiree** (War Front) getting the narrow nod on the morning line as she invades from the East. The Brereton and Bret Jones-bred bay took the GIII Bourbonette Oaks over Turfway's Polytrack Mar. 26 by 10 3/4 lengths for her breeders and Wahoo Partners, prompting Barry Irwin's outfit to purchase her privately and turn her over to Graham Motion. Summer Soiree was a well-beaten 10th in the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks, but relished the sod in her first try on it, romping by 8 1/2 lengths in Monmouth's GIII Boiling Spring S. June 25. Show horse Hessonite (Freud) beat the boys in a New York-bred stake at the Spa Aug. 11, and fourth-place finisher Salary Drive (Mizzen Mast) looked good scoring in the Dauphin Miss S. at Penn National July 29. **Cont. p6**

STAR TURN

Having made waves when capturing the G1 July Cup on Dream Ahead (Diktat {GB}), Britain's flagship female jockey Hayley Turner followed up with a major sprint double in York's G1 Coolmore Nunthorpe S. on the 3-year-old filly **Margot Did** (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) yesterday. Ignored at 20-1 after a latest fourth in the July 2 G3 Sandown Sprint, the bay was drawn on the right side as the stand's-rail runners dominated the closing stages of this renewal. Grabbing **Hamish McGonagall** (GB) (Namid {GB}) with a furlong remaining, she asserted to beat that rival by 3/4 of a length. Her rider was still reeling from the achievement afterwards. "I can't believe it--I'm overwhelmed by it all," she said. "People ask me if it was more difficult getting where I am being a girl, but I think it was more difficult for [trainer] Michael Bell to push the owners to put me on the horses. It's brilliant that I can pay him back." **Cont. p2-3**

For much of last term, it was a case of Margot Didn't, as the consistent hold-up performer kept producing visually impressive efforts from behind, but continued to find one or two too good at the business end. She played the bridesmaid in the G3 Albany S. at Royal Ascot in June and the G3 Princess Margaret S. back there in July. The bay also looked unlucky in the G2 Lowther S. at this meeting when failing by 3/4 of a length to reel in **Hooray (GB)** (**Invincible Spirit {Ire}**). After a third in the Listed Dick Poole Fillies' S. at Salisbury the following month, Margot Did was again behind **Hooray** when fifth on her final juvenile outing in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October. Not tempted by a Guineas bid, connections opted to continue down the sprinting route which has proved so difficult for fillies of her age group in the past, and her return third in the Apr. 27 Listed Pavilion S. at Ascot suggested she would also struggle this term.

Margot Did, who had excuses when her saddle slipped as she stayed on for fourth in a conditions race over this track and trip May 12, finally broke through under more aggressive tactics when recording a five-length verdict in the Listed Scurry S. over this trip at Sandown June 11. Following up a week later in the Listed Land o'Burns Fillies' S. at Ayr, she was unable to land a blow from an unfavorable draw in the Sandown Sprint when last seen July 2. This time, her post position proved the key as the pack racing near the stand's side appeared to hold the call throughout the frantic early stages. Always traveling strongly as she tracked Hamish McGonagall, she took on that rival inside the final quarter as Captain Dunne (Ire) (Captain Rio {GB}) briefly threatened against the fence. With her rivals racing up the centre and far side already dead in the water by the furlong marker, she was given the command there, and quickly wrapped up the contest to scamper clear. "I thought a Group 1 would be stretching her, ability-wise, but obviously not," Turner explained. "At the start of the year, I thought I'd stick with her, as she might take me places and she has. It hasn't always gone her way and I've only just figured out that she likes a lot of daylight. We were holding her up before and she has loads of speed, so we decided to keep it simple. She's got one gear at the end, so you just have to save it for as long as you can. She's probably the smallest filly in the field, but she's very tough and just blasted." Michael Bell added, "Last year, she was unlucky, especially in the Lowther, and in hindsight she may well have been. This year she won the Listed at Sandown by five lengths and not many sprints are won like that, so she looked good then. In that race, because we wanted to take advantage of a good draw, we made the running and in doing so found the key to her by default. We found that she was happy bowling along and today, from a long way out, she was one of the few on the bridle. I thought it was going to be tough for a 3-year-old filly only getting two pounds from the older horses, but she delivered. She is owned by non-owner-breeders who one day will probably sell her, but they both love their racing, so I would have thought it would be almost impossible to pry her off them at this stage. The [Oct. 2] G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp is definitely the plan."

Bell went on to pay tribute to Turner. "I think her strength is how she gets horses balanced so they run for her," the Newmarket-based conditioner commented. "If you get horses in a rhythm, they can compete properly and that is her main attribute. She's always been dedicated and hard-working, and I'm pleased that she's won a Group 1 for me because we've been together a long time now. There was once a bit of a stigma, but there are more and more trainers using lady riders now and Hayley winning two Group 1s is some achievement--this has broken down the barriers."

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Trainer Tim Easterby was delighted with the career-best effort from Hamish McGonagall. "I thought we'd got there, but the winner was always with us," he told *PA Sport*. We couldn't have asked any more from him to do what he's just done. We'll go for the Abbaye." Hoof It (GB) (Monsieur Bond {Ire}), who was sent off the 11-4 favorite, failed to provide his veteran trainer Mick Easterby with a fairytale win. After being out of his ground a few lengths off the pace in the centre, he closed to a respectable sixth at the line.

Caspar Netscher, who had finished in the money in all four prior black-type starts, outshone those achievements with a deserved first pattern-race score in this prestigious event. Successful at Beverley on debut May 10, he slipped to second in a May 27 Pontefract conditions heat before running fourth in the Listed Woodcote S. at Epsom on stakes debut June 4. The bay then ran third in a hot renewal of the June 14 Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot, was second in the July 15 Listed Rose Bowl S. at Newbury and hit the board once more in the G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood last time July 29. Caspar Netscher chased solid early fractions in seventh here and inched into contention soon after halfway. Urged to the front approaching the final eighth, he edged right almost immediately, but lost little momentum and drew clear once corrected in the closing stages to claim a career high in decisive fashion. "Caspar Netscher is a late foal, but he's very tough and is only just starting to strengthen up," said rider Robert Winston. "He takes a little bit of getting to know and he traveled strongly, but when he got there he thought he'd done enough and that's why he veered to the right. I gave him a couple of reminders to keep him going forward and he responded. He's just getting better as the year goes by. He's been very consistent and it's great for [owner] Charles [Wentworth], who has put plenty of money into racing." Wentworth added, "This horse was bought for me as a birthday present for me by my wife, so it's a dream come true. He is in the [G2] Champagne [S. at Doncaster Sept. 10] so that's an option. He'll definitely get seven furlongs."

Green Destiny shut down last term with an Oct. 25 handicap score at Leicester and opened this campaign in similar vein at Newmarket Apr. 30. Dropping to seventh in the Listed Wolferton H. at Royal Ascot next time June 17, he regained the winning thread in the valuable John Smith's Cup H. at this track July 9, but was never a factor when off the radar chasing another big pot at Goodwood last time July 29. Green Destiny recovered from missing a beat at the kick to sit slightly worse than midfield and maintained his position until turning for home. Making relentless progress in the long straight to challenge approaching the final furlong, the gelded bay kept on strongly under late Kieren Fallon urging to easily hold the late flourish of Tazahum for a first pattern-race success. "Maybe going this way round [left-handed] is the only credible reason for the two defeats [going right-handed] this season," mused trainer William Haggas. "This trip is too short for him, as he really wants a mile and a quarter. He's taken the next step up, but now we'll have to take another one and the [Oct. 1 G2] Prix Dollar at Longchamp on Arc weekend could be an option, but that's also the wrong way round. He is also entered in the [Oct. 15 G1] Champion S., but it's the same situation at Ascot. [Co-owner] Mr. [Saleh Al] Homaizi might also like to go to Dubai with him."

Nereid, Cambina, Star Billing, Entrustment, and Bizzy Caroline were separated by less than a length when Nereid and Cambina dead-heated for the top spot in the 10-furlong GI American Oaks at Hollywood July 16. Nereid is three-for-three on the sod, with her only loss coming at the hands of Zazu (Tapit) in a sprint debut in Inglewood last October. She set the pace last time, but may be forced to relinquish the early advantage to Summer Soiree. Cambina, thrice a stakes winner stateside before sharing the spotlight last time, endured an awful trip in the American Oaks. Dead last in the early going, she was steadied and stymied in traffic when putting in a late rally and probably would have been the sole victress with a cleaner journey. "I think I've got the best horse," trainer Jeff Bonde told *Daily Racing Form*. "When she's had a chance to run, she's beaten them all. She's on top of her game." **Up In Time** upset the GII San Clemente H. here July 24 while displaying an impressive turn of foot, and Three Chimneys Racing has since purchased a significant interest in the British-bred. "I think these are a good group of 3-year-old fillies," her conditioner, Simon Callaghan, told *DRF*. "There won't be much between the first three or four. There is no standout. Our filly is going forward and there are proven fillies such as Cambina."

Havre de Grace Going for Woodward...

It's official. After weeks of speculation, Rick Porter told *Daily Racing Form* that his star filly **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) will take on the boys in the \$750,000 GI Woodward S. at Saratoga Sept. 2. The 4-year-old just failed to hold off longtime rival Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in her latest start, the 10-furlong GII Delaware H. July 16. She is trained by Larry Jones. "Larry and I both agreed we're

definitely going in the Woodward," Porter told the publication.

Fairy Misses Out Again...

Trainer Ed Dunlop expressed his bemusement yesterday after the French authorities refused to allow **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) to run in tomorrow's G1 Darley Prix Jean Romanet at Deauville. Having withdrawn Cristina Patino's four-time Group 1 winner from Thursday's G1 Yorkshire Oaks, the Newmarket-based conditioner yesterday learned that a ruling prohibiting horses that had been declared to run within eight days had been enforced. "It's extremely annoying," Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "We weren't made aware of the rule. Having watched the Yorkshire Oaks on Thursday, I was thrilled I didn't run her because of the ground. It was a real stamina slog. This race on Sunday was over a mile and a quarter for fillies and has been recently upgraded to a Group 1. There are no other races like that left in the calendar, and I'm very disappointed for the filly. We believe a French trainer has complained about what we have done. The law is there, but we weren't aware of it, and weren't told of it at declaration time. We didn't know anything about it until yesterday afternoon."

Dawn Improves....

Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway) is responding well to treatment after being found to have a temperature following his third-place finish in Wednesday's G1 Juddmonte International at York. Aidan O'Brien's wife Anne-Marie was on twitter yesterday to provide the update. "Await The Dawn's condition has improved this morning, his temperature and bloods are improving, hopefully he will continue to make progress," she tweeted.

Tuning Up for the Travers...

Mill House's **Rattlesnake Bridge** (Tapit) breezed five-eighths at Saratoga yesterday in 1:00.68 in preparation for the GI Travers S. next weekend. The grey had been slated to work this morning, but trainer Kiaran McLaughlin didn't like what he saw on the Weather Channel. "We've been watching the weather the last couple of days, and I'm not sleeping great at night worrying about rain, rain, rain, scattered thundershowers," said McLaughlin. "So we decided to work this morning at 8:45. He galloped out strong, and we're very pleased. It was a great work, and we can sleep tonight." Winner of Monmouth's Long Branch S. last time July 9, Rattlesnake Bridge galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.

Arthur's Tale (Bernardini), who hasn't faced the starter since finishing second in the GI Wood Memorial S. in April, is under consideration for the Travers after working five panels in 1:01.63 Friday morning. "It's kind of day by day," trainer Tom Albertrani said of the Darley colorbearer. "The distance would suit him; it's an ideal distance for him. It's just a matter if he's up to it. He's only had a few works leading up to the race. But he's doing well and, if I get all the right signs he's doing well, I'd be encouraged to run him."

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KING OF THE HALL (Part 2) *By Christina Bossinakis*

Blueprint of a Champion--D. Wayne Lukas...

Born on Sept. 2, 1935, Darrell Wayne Lukas grew up on his family's 10-acre farm, located just outside of Antigo, Wisconsin. Lukas didn't appear to be poised for

a career in the horse racing industry, much less a place in racing's Hall of Fame. Lukas, who admitted he had no ties to the horse industry within at least five generations of his family tree, is the second of three children. His father, Ted, a son of Czechoslovakian immigrants, drove heavy construction equipment and delivered milk, while

his mother Bea, is descended from English and Irish ancestors who had migrated to Wisconsin from Lexington.

Antigo, a small dairy and farming town, didn't offer much in the way of the horse racing industry, however, the young Lukas drew upon an unlikely source to fuel his passion for horses.

"I was crazy about horses from a very young age," Lukas said. "Every day, when they would deliver milk, with the draft horse pulling the milk cart, I would follow that milk cart for blocks and blocks, and the horse would stop at all the right houses. It really fascinated me that the horse knew where to stop every day. And I just wanted to be around them."

Although not directly involved in the industry himself, Ted Lukas helped foster his son's passion in horses throughout his youth.

"I saved my money, and my dad had the foresight to help me get a little pony, she was about 13 hands [Queenie]. I got her when she was three and she died when she was 32."

While other kids of Lukas' age were content to go to the park, Lukas chose to spend his time in less conventional ways for his age. He delivered papers aboard his white pony, sold rabbits on Antigo's Main Street and planted (and harvested) string beans on land leased from his uncle. But his passion for the four-legged creatures grew, and by the time Lukas was nine years old, he was buying and selling horses at auction.

Totally consumed by horses and ponies, Lukas began racing his pony at the nearby Antigo County fairgrounds before branching out to fairs as far north as Eagle River and Rhinelander, near Michigan's Upper Peninsula.

"The Rice family [trainer Clyde Rice] and my family lived about a half-mile apart, and we started racing them up and down the side roads," explained Lukas. "Of course, when you're a little kid, there is a thrill in going fast with them. In that area, they had a fair with little pony races, and we started winning those."

As teenagers, Lukas and Rice continued to hone their skills in sales' ring, buying wild horses brought in from the Dakotas that were destined for the slaughter house, cleaning them up and reselling them for a profit.

"Next thing you knew, the die was cast and [Clyde and I] were both bitten by the bug," he said.

During his tenure at the University of Wisconsin, Lukas became a serious student of basketball, spending weekdays studying toward a degree in physical education, while hitting the road on weekends in search of more horses to buy.

Following his graduation from college, he taught for two years before back to University of Wisconsin to get his master's degree in education, where he served as an assistant to Johnny Orr. He later became the full-time basketball coach at Logan High in La Crosse, but he continued to trade and train Quarter Horses in the meantime. During his summer break, Lukas would pack up and head off to Park Jefferson racetrack outside Sioux City. He quickly dominated the Quarter Horse industry, developing 23 Quarter Horse champions, but Lukas began training Thoroughbreds in the early '70s, and he decided to make a complete transition in 1978.

"I came over from Los Alamitos with four horses," said the trainer. "Two were maiden claimers, one of which I made into a stakes winner--Effervescing, whose career was supposedly over and was sold as a stud--and I had a 2-year-old filly named Terlingua."

Effervescing, who had his issues when Lukas took him over, won the grassy GII American H. on July 4 in 1978, and came back five days later to win the

GI Citation H. on the dirt. Terlingua went on to collect three graded stakes, including the GII Del Mar Debutante S. and GII Hollywood Lassie S. Lukas's early success on the competitive Southern California circuit drew the attention--both positive and negative--from many horsemen.

"When I started winning races, there was always some animosity from some of the trainers, but Laz Barrera, Willard Proctor and Charlie Whittingham totally accepted me," said Lukas.

Whittingham was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1974, and Barrera joined the elite fraternity in 1979.

"They were so secure in their own careers, that they were always supportive," Lukas continued. "Charlie befriended me, and Laz and I became dear friends before he died. When I came to New York, it was amazing, because Allen Jerkens was the same way.

Often, the younger guys wouldn't even speak to me, but those guys were solid and secure in their own careers, and they knew I was going to be around and we'd probably beat up on each other. There was never feelings of animosity from them. I always appreciated how gracious and wonderful Laz and Charlie were with me early on."

According to Lukas, several people played significant roles in shaping his future success in the game, including a Nebraska-born horseman who would ultimately provide him with his first taste of Classic glory.

"One day, this grey-haired guy was walking down the road, and he stopped me as I was going by on my saddle horse," recalled Lukas. "He said, 'Hey cowboy, I'm going to send you some horses. I replied, 'Thank you sir,' and he just kept right on walking.

Lukas continued, "As I got a little further down the road, I bumped into Jerry Fanning [trainer of Desert Wine]. I asked him, 'Who is that grey-haired guy?' He told me it was John Nerud, the general manager, racing manager and trainer for Tartan Stables. I thought he must be kidding, but he assured me that was in fact him. So about an hour later, John came by the barn and told me he would give me 10 to 12 2-year-olds."

Lukas trained several top performers for Tartan, including SW Open Gate, GSW Dr. Patches and GI Preakness S. winner Codex, responsible for giving Lukas his first Classic win. Lukas admitted that Nerud, who himself was an inductee of 1972, gave the young, Midwestern horseman the opportunity that would prove to be a major turning point in his career.

"Years later, when I asked him why he gave me the chance, he simply said, 'I knew you'd be OK.'"

Keeping Good Company..

Several other owners helped Lukas scale the heights of success over the years, including W.T. Young's Overbrook Farm, Bob and Beverly Lewis, and Michael Tabor (campaigned GI Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch). For Overbrook, Lukas campaigned champion juveniles Timber Country (1994), Flanders (1994), Golden Attraction (1995) and Boston Harbor (1996). He was also responsible for Eclipse Award-winning sophomore filly Surfside and Classic winners Tabasco Cat (owned in partnership with David Reynolds), Timber Country (owned in partnership with the Lewises and Gainesway), Grindstone and Editor's Note.

Among the standouts conditioned by Lukas on behalf of the Lewises were Hall of Famer Serena's Song, Derby and Preakness hero Charismatic and GI Belmont S. winner Commendable. For the couple he also trained Breeders' Cup winners Folklore and Orientate.

Arguably the most colorful character involved in Lukas' ascension was Eugene Klein, former owner of the San Diego Chargers. For Klein, Lukas conditioned Hall of Fame starlets Lady's Secret, Open Mind and Winning Colors.

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"Gene Klein was a very New York, street-wise kind of guy," said Lukas. "He could be obnoxious, but he truly was a great friend. He was hard to be around in some ways, but great to be around in a lot of other ways. I met him at Del Mar one morning with his wife. I was friends with Dick Butkus [Hall of Fame linebacker for the Chicago Bears], who happened to come by that morning, and Klein asked what he was doing there. Dick told him we were good friends, and mentioned that I had a super filly by the name of Landaluce. Klein wanted to see the filly, and to meet me, so they came back to the barn. After that, he said that he wanted to have a meeting."

Lukas continued, "I had just bought a brand new Rolls Royce, it had 33 miles on it, and I drove down to his home in Rancho Santa Fe to meet with Klein. He had a courtyard with a few parking spots. It was all full, so I parked outside the walled courtyard. We had lunch and talked a little bit."

"After lunch, he wanted to show me a piece of property where Pete Roselle [former NFL Commissioner] was going to build his house, so we walked out to take my car, and as we walked around the corner, he stopped dead in his tracks. There's my brand new Rolls Royce parked there, and he said, 'Damn, I don't know many trainers that drive Rolls Royce's.' I replied, 'Gene, I said I wouldn't cheat you, I didn't say I'd work for *nothing*.'"

Soon after their initial meeting, the duo jumped in with both feet, developing one of the most memorable--and productive--partnerships in contemporary racing history.

"He was an action guy, so he wanted to get something that was already running," offered Lukas. "I told him I wouldn't claim a horse for him, but we'd find something suitable. We started with one horse, then the next thing you knew we had 12 horses, then we had 20, and later we became partners."

Klein, a founding partner of the NBA's Seattle SuperSonics and one-time chairman of the insurance and entertainment company National General Corp., owned the San Diego Chargers from 1966 through 1984. After enjoying success in the world of business, Klein took on the racing world with equal gusto, offering Lukas a very long rein when it came to signing tickets on sale day.

"He was aggressive at the sales," said Lukas, adding, "He had the best mentality for horse racing. He knew how to lose, he knew how to win, even though he often got a little carried away on both ends. Because of his NFL background, he knew not everyone was going to play if they had injuries and that some of the drafts choices were not going to be good enough--just like some of the yearlings were not going to be good enough. He had a great mindset for the game."

NOTEWORTHY RETURN

An August day at Saratoga typically means a Grade I race--this time the Alabama--accompanied by a raft of maiden special weights for juveniles, but perhaps the most intriguing test carded today is the first race, a NW1X for New York-breds. On tap is a six-furlong affair on the main track that features the return of **Cribnote** (Read the Footnotes--Totebook, by Notebook), who will face the starter for the first time since 2008 ([click for brisnet.com PPs](#)).

Three years ago, the chestnut romped by 13 1/2 lengths in his second start at Saratoga, earning a 90 Beyer Speed Figure, as well as a spot in the GI Hopeful S. for owner Red Diamond Stable ([click here for TDN profile](#)). It was, forgive the expression, a heart-attack special. In the midst of making a bold move, Cribnote blew the turn badly and nearly made it to the outside rail, but responded to Rajiv Maragh's right-handed stick and managed to get second behind Vineyard Haven ([video replay](#)).

"Oh, it was unbelievable," recalled Dana Reis, whose late husband Alan established the Red Diamond partnership. "To see him finish like that...we had so many offers coming in for the horse--seven figures--and even our insurance guy tried to buy him. But we said, 'Oh no, we want to be there for the dream.'"

A month later--with blinkers added--Cribnote finished third as the 7-2 favorite to that colt in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont in what would be his final afternoon appearance. He had surgery for a knee chip and returned to trainer Rick Violette's barn as a sophomore in 2009, but, despite getting back on the worktab with some regularity, never truly approached race-readiness.

"It wasn't like he was chronically in pain; it was something that would come and go," Reis related. "He also had the knee issue, so it was one thing or the other all the time. Finally, it had been almost two years, so it was time to draw a line in the sand."

"The economy being what it is made it difficult to find a safe adoption for him," she added. "He was a special 2-year-old that was our first homebred. I felt a real responsibility to him--there was no way I was going to let him slip through the cracks. So I took him to the barn where I ride, Beautiful Day Farm in Sagaponack, New York, to have him retrained as a pleasure horse with Phyllis Kane with the goal to make him more adoptable."

Gelded, Cribnote began to be retrained as a riding horse, and was started over jumps. But a turning point was just around the corner.

North Shore Equine Clinic's Dr. Bob Perry, who came to the farm to administer the fall shots to the horses, observed the 4-year-old's somewhat awkward stance and asked whether he had ever been tested for Equine Polysaccharide Storage Myopathy (EPSM). Most often found in heavier types of horses such as the draft breeds or warmbloods, EPSM is a condition in which excess glycogen is stored in muscles, and can lead to atrophy.

According to understanding-horse-nutrition.com, the symptoms include:

- exertional rhabdomyolysis
- exercise intolerance
- muscle stiffness
- shifting lameness
- back pain
- camped-out stance
- muscle atrophy
- colic-like symptoms

Treatment involves a change in diet--one that is high in fat, and relatively low in starches and sugars--as well as plenty of exercise. A muscle biopsy from Cribnote was sent to the Oregon State University Veterinary Diagnostic Lab, but, in the meantime, he began his new diet. The diagnosis was confirmed by Dr. Beth Valentine in November.

"It takes about three or four months of the diet to make the transition in a positive way," Reis said. "Luckily he didn't have an irreversible muscle damage. If it gets along too far, the muscles will atrophy and die."

During Cribnote's time on the farm, Reis had the occasion to test drive him--sort of.

"I didn't *really* ride him," Reis said with a laugh. "Phyllis only let me up on him after his lesson, when he was ready to get cooled out."

Cribnote rejoined Violette's string Aqueduct in the spring, and recorded his first breeze June 20. Reis, who had shouldered the expenses during his recess, reoffered the original Red Diamond partners their shares. She currently has 76% of Cribnote, with John Held, Brad Kaufman and Jeff LaGueux splitting the remainder.

A high-fat equine diet--typically accomplished with alfalfa hay and supplements such as corn oil--combined with regular exercise may be fine for the average horse, but may pose a problem for one under a training regimen at the racetrack. **Cont. p2**

However, Dr. Valentine thinks the diet can work.

"The racing aspect of this type of diet is interesting, and I know there is 'buzz' out there that high-fat diets cause slow racing speed," she said in an e-mail. "That is actually not true at all. Fat-supplemented diets have been shown to have a glycogen-sparing effect. This is how I think of it: early in the race the horse can burn fat rather than glycogen, while their bodies are working aerobically. In the homestretch, the lung capacity maxes out, and the horse must burn glycogen anaerobically to fuel muscles. A horse that has burned fat early on has more glycogen left for the homestretch."

She continued, "There are other hints out there that equine muscle prefers fatty acids, or at least is designed to burn fatty acids. This makes sense to me when I think that horses evolved on high fiber and low starch and sugar diets. They ferment fiber to volatile fatty acids that are absorbed into the blood. The horse's body must convert some of those fatty acids to glucose, as certain tissues such as brain rely on glucose for energy. But, if the majority of the diet is processed to fatty acids, it makes sense to me that the horses' muscle may have evolved to use those fatty acids. We now have selectively bred for horses with better muscling and performance (we are a long way from the ancestral horse these days!), but we have not changed how their digestive system processes feed. So, perhaps they can't get enough fatty acids fast enough. This is where dietary fat supplementation can make up the difference."

Reis hopes her experience can help others.

"I just think it's important to get the word out about this," she said. "Who knows how many horses have it? It's possible that there are horses out there that just haven't been diagnosed. Everybody thinks racehorses can't get it, but they do. The track vets aren't looking for it, because it's not on their radar."

"The word that keeps coming to mind is serendipity," she continued. "If I hadn't taken him under my own wing and taken him to that barn, and there hadn't happened to be a vet who knew straight away what that was."

Reis admits to sneaking some carrots to Cribnote occasionally, despite their high sugar content, but is thrilled that her pride and joy might yet get a chance to live up to his early potential.

"I'm so emotionally invested in him right now, I'm going to be a mess Saturday," she said. "He has such a great personality, and I've really gotten to know him well. If he wins, I told my friend Robin [Cardoza], that I hope she's been working out, because I'll probably faint dead away, and she'll have to help me walk." --MK

If statistical records were kept for owners like they are for trainers, Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence would boast some incredible numbers with their 2-year-old firsters. Klaravich/Lawrence debuters win at an inordinate rate and often at nice prices, seemingly regardless of conditioner. They successfully unveiled two babies just last Saturday--Clip the Coupons (Congrats) here at 6.5-1 with Chad Brown and Managed Account (Malibu Moon) at 6.8-1 at Monmouth with Terri Pompay. Pompay also shipped Currency Swap (High Cotton) up to Saratoga for a jaw-dropping, 98 Beyer-earning debut two weeks ago for the Klaravich/Lawrence team at 9.9-1. Dale Romans, a capable enough debut conditioner, sends out News Pending (Harlan's Holiday) here for the connections in question. The \$250,000 Timonium grad shows just five published works for this demanding seven-furlong test, but being a 2-year-old sales grad who worked fairly quickly (:10 3/5) means he's probably more seasoned than just the drills would lead one to believe. NY Supreme Court Rules Against Out of Competition Rules:

A New York Supreme Court judge has struck down the New York State Racing and Wagering Board's (NYSRWB) Out of Competition Testing Rules after a three-year legal battle between a group of Standardbred owners, breeders and trainers and the NYSRWB. The rules were enacted in December of 2009 and scheduled to take effect in January, but a temporary restraining order issued by the court postponed their application until the court had made a decision. In his Aug. 15 ruling, Justice Mark L. Powers deemed the proposed regulations "so lacking in reason as to require nullification in their entirety." The rules would have allowed for testing of horses 180 days out from competition and would have made any horse within a 100 mile radius of a New York track subject to testing, even if they were located in another state.

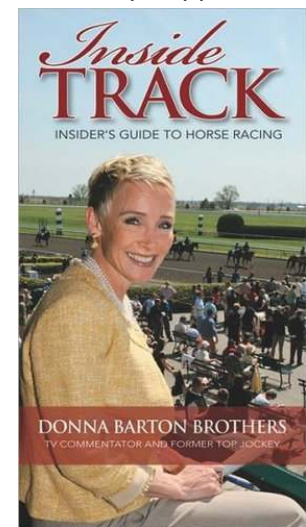
TDN Book Review

Inside Track: Insider's Guide to Horse Racing, by Donna Barton Brothers

Lately there's been a lot of talk of the many "fix-its" the Thoroughbred industry has ahead of itself along with a laundry list of suggestions that may mend the sport. Mainly comprised of an older generation of fans and handicappers, racing is losing some 4% of fans each year and one reason cited is that the industry's marketing experts simply can't seem to find innovative ways to promote the sport or attract new fans. Our beloved sport of horse racing has been labeled as complicated and difficult for the newcomer to break-into. Enter Donna Barton Brothers.

Former jockey and current racing reporter for NBC Sports and select TVG racing events, Donna Barton Brothers brings us *Inside Track: Insider's Guide to Horse Racing* (Blood-Horse Publications, 111 pages, \$16.95). As a true racing insider, Brothers is well aware of the looming intimidation factor that those who are unfamiliar with horse racing are confronted with after passing through the racetrack turnstiles. Where do I go first? Who do I bet on? Wait, *how* do I bet? Or even the questions people have *before* arriving at the racetrack; am I really supposed to wear an imposing fancy hat?



For starters, no, there is no prerequisite to wear a large fancy hat for a day at the races, unless it's Derby Day, of course, to which Brothers devotes an entire chapter to conquering the prestigious event, mint juleps and all. Writing with a friendly no-nonsense attitude, Brothers gives the horse racing freshman a tour of the track and its diverse environment (from grandstand to Turf Club, and everywhere in between), a glimpse at the type of atmosphere you're likely to find (\$1 Sundays and Family Fun Days, anyone?), and enough

insider lingo to give the novice racetracker a more confident swagger.

While racetracks generally lack an information kiosk with free race information and guidance, aside from the daily program and past performances, Brothers's book provides readers with a hand-held primer of the essentials of the horse racing world.

Exactas, trifecta boxes, the \$.10 superfecta, Brothers covers the common betting terminology with simplicity and the accompanying disclaimer that "you can beat the race, but you can't beat the races" so bet accordingly. And which horse to bet? The former jockey points out key markers when judging horse flesh to help narrow your selection, then even provides you with a list of reasonable excuses to tell your friends when your carefully chosen horse turns in a disappointing effort ("Did you see how badly my horse got away from the gate?!")

Two insider tips that Brothers strongly advocates are quite simple and tremendously overlooked: 1) if you don't know, ask; and 2) you've got to see it/try it/hear it/bet it/etc. in person; nothing can beat the personal racing experience. While racetracks may currently lack the amusement park-like booths with self-guiding maps and "must see" attractions, making a phone call to the appropriate department at the track never hurts. If you were lucky enough to obtain a pair of tickets to the Kentucky Derby, but you are clueless if you're sitting indoors or out and thus are left unprepared to shop for that critical Derby outfit, why not call Churchill? A quick answer will end your Derby outfit doubts and will allow for a much more enjoyable racing experience. The horse racing industry is making efforts to be more transparent and is encouraging fans to reach out to them.

What may be a marketing team's most imposing challenge when promoting the racing product is that Thoroughbred horse racing is one of those events you have to experience first-hand; attempting to re-create the thrill of watching "your" horse thread its way through traffic en route to a victory by a nose is a hard-sell in writing. Even hearing the race call alone still lacks true color, by and large. For this, Brothers can't offer much more advice than "you just have to be there", the very crux of the sport. Nothing can beat the first-hand horse racing experience and Donna Barton Brothers helps acclimate new racetrackers to the thrill. So get out there. As they say, "Go baby, go!"
