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SUPER SATURDAY, WONDERFUL WEEKEND

By any measure, it is a Super Saturday today, as no fewer than 13 graded events, each with varying degrees of impact on Breeders' Cup weekend Nov. 4 and 5, will be contested from 'sea to shining sea.' The races have attracted 3 reigning Eclipse Award winners, a quartet of others who were among finalists for championship honors and a Classic-winning 3-year-old of this season. For good measure, two-time Eclipse Award winner and 2010 Horse of the Year finalist **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) will prep for a fourth consecutive victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile when she goes postward in the G1 Prix

de la Foret on the Arc undercard. Back on this side of the big pond, horses will line up in nine Grade I events--five at Belmont Park and the balance at Santa Anita. The biggest prize in New York is the Jockey Club Gold Cup, whose field does not include Horse of the Year aspirant Tizway (Tiznow), but does get **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini), pro-tem leader of this year's sophomore set, but who faces a challenge from **Flat Out** (Flatter). A bit earlier on the program, **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) will continue his comeback in the GII Kelso H., a race which is said to be a prep for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The scratch of **Big Drama** (Montbrook), last year's GI BC Sprint hero and champion sprinter, leaves **Trappe Shot** (Tapit) the one to beat in the GI Vosburgh S., and all eyes will be on **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam), who likely uses the GI Beldame S. as a springboard to the BC Classic. On the West Coast, **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) comes off a rare 10-week absence in the GI Lady's Secret S., which will be won for the first time in three years by something not called Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}).

Super Saturday even makes a stop in the nation's heartland, where GI Preakness S. hero **Shackleford** (Forestry) looks to remain in the discussion for year-end honors when he faces upstart **Caleb's Posse** (Posse) in the GII Indiana Derby, a race won in 2010 by subsequent Eclipse Award winner Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike).

DRAW BLOW FOR ARC FAVORITES

Ante-post favorites **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) and **Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse To Bend {Ire}) will be forced to overcome wide post positions in tomorrow's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Only Dalakhani (Ire) and Sakhee have managed to win from double-figure stalls since 1993, and both Sarafina (13) and So You Think (14) face an instant disadvantage as they bid to crown successful campaigns. So You Think, who will be partnered once again by Seamus Heffernan after the pair were successful in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown and G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 3, was not the only Ballydoyle raider to fare badly with the draw, as stable companion **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) will exit from the 12 hole under Colm O'Donoghue. **Arc Preview cont. p4**

LOOKIN AT LUCKY

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THE UNQUENCHABLE THIRST

Repole Stable's **Stay Thirsty** has lived in the shadow of stablemate Uncle Mo for most of his career, but beginning with his strong runner-up effort in the GI Belmont S., the sophomore has begun to create a reputation of his own. Some may have attributed that breakthrough performance to the off track at Big Sandy on the second Saturday in June, but he proved the effort to be no fluke when running off to score by four lengths in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 30. He followed up impressively, defeating Rattlesnake Bridge (Tapit) by 1 1/4 lengths in the GI Travers S. He looks to join Bernardini and Summer Bird as recent winners of the Midsummer Derby to successfully add the Gold Cup. Trainer Todd Pletcher is happy to give Stay Thirsty his just due. "You're talking about a horse that's won the Gotham, was a very, very good second in the Belmont and then has gone on to win the Jim Dandy and the Travers both impressively by lengths. He's established himself right now as a 3-year-old leader," he commented. Should **Flat Out** run back to his impressive victory in the GII Suburban H. July 2, he will be difficult to handle. Even his two most recent efforts, which

resulted in a second to Tizway (Tiznow) in the GI Whitney H. Aug. 6 and to Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in the GI Woodward S. Sept. 3, may be good enough this afternoon. Trainer Scooter Dickey thinks a return to Belmont and some added real estate will work in favor of his charge. "He was still coming on at the end of the

race against Havre de Grace, so the distance won't be an issue with him," said Dickey. "I think he'll appreciate coming back to Belmont, too; he ran a nice race there last time, and I hope it turns out the same way."

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'Abbey' Makes it Three Chances for Coolmore...

Joseph O'Brien's booking for **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) completes the trio of homegrown talent employed for the Rosegreen contenders. The 4-year-old has drawn six, which has proved lucky in recent years as the stall from which Hurricane Run (Ire), Dylan Thomas (Ire) and Sea the Stars (Ire) broke. This is So You Think's biggest test to date despite his tally of eight Group 1 wins, and Aidan O'Brien is approaching the race with relish. "The Arc is an important race, we are delighted he's going there and are looking forward to it," O'Brien said. "This is the boys' decision and it's very exciting, as he's a mile-and-a-quarter specialist who quickens very well. We were delighted with him in the Irish Champion, as it was his first run back from a break. He's a very straightforward horse and was a natural when he came to us--he's a great traveller who is getting a little lazy when he gets to the front now."

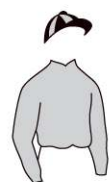
Let It Snow...

Also drawn high is Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), but trainer Ed Dunlop was not panicking yesterday. "It is not an ideal draw, but I don't consider it makes too much difference to us in view of Snow Fairy's style of racing," he said. "You can't have everything and we have our ground. Good-to-soft in France is totally different to what it is in Britain and with 29 degrees forecast for the weekend the going will definitely ride on the fast side." Success for Snow Fairy would be the first for an older filly or mare since Urban Sea 18 years ago, but last year's G1 English and Irish Oaks heroine loves traveling abroad for the big occasions.

Improving for the change of scenery when capturing the ultra-competitive Nov. 14 G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup and Dec. 12 G1 Hong Kong Cup, she ruffled So You Think's feathers on her latest excursion for the Irish Champion. "Our filly has had a trouble-free preparation and, while we are under no illusions that she faces a very tough task, she looks to have improved again since the Irish Champion S. and we will give it our best shot," Dunlop continued. "The Arc is a hard race to win, but we go there with a sporting chance."

One who enjoyed greater fortune with the post position was Khalid Abdullah's **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best), who will race from the same stall eight from which he was successful 12 months ago. Connections are happy with the state of the ground, having walked the track. The owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*, "I hope the draw is as lucky as last year and he's fared better than some of the other fancied runners. We walked the track this morning and it is on the easy side of good--they put 10 millimeters on--so from that point of view we are fairly happy. Obviously, depending on what the weather does, they will consider putting more on and review the situation on Saturday night and I'm hopeful of a happy outcome. He's had a few problems but you can't say he's an unlucky horse, as he's won an Arc and a Derby so he's had things go right for him as well and that's racing."

He continued, "It's obviously great to have Ryan [Moore] back, for all the best reasons. He knows him, he's the only one to have ridden him, he knows what to expect. We don't feel pressure, that's not the right word. We look forward to these races--it is what you are involved in the game for. There have not been many dual Arc winners and we've got a bit of work to do to join them."

BLANC SHOOTING FOR THIRD U.S. GRADE I

Flawless in a pair of starts on American soil this season, **Cape Blanco (Ire)** shoots for a third consecutive win at the highest level in today's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational. The 2010 G1 Irish Derby hero, the chestnut was unplaced in a trio of overseas starts after an interest in the colt was purchased by Mrs. Fitri Hay earlier this season, but handled his first stateside start with aplomb, defeating champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) on the square in the July 9 GI Man O'War S. over 11 furlongs of this turf course. He made the trans-Atlantic journey to Chicago for the GI Arlington Million Aug. 13 and took care of that field with equal panache, besting Gio Ponti by a clear 2 1/2 lengths. **Winchester** took last year's renewal of this event over ground with plenty of ease in it and will get those underfoot conditions this afternoon. WHAT BC RACE FOR 'GRACE'?

With a victory in today's GI Beldame S. at Belmont, Fox Hill Farm's **Havre de Grace** (Saint Liam) will put herself squarely in the driver's seat for Horse of the Year honors and could set up another showdown against the boys on Breeders' Cup Saturday. The 4-year-old miss, a winner of four of five starts this term, rebounded from her nose loss to Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) in the GII Delaware H. July 16 to defeat males in the GI Woodward S. at Saratoga Sept. 3. She's been pegged at 3-5 in the morning line, and trainer Larry Jones said earlier in the week a big effort might punch her ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "We feel like we need to win it if we're going into the Classic," he said. "We don't need to win it by 10 [lengths] or set a big mark for her. We need to get a lighter prep and not a 110% effort from her." Anything less than a big effort, however, could leave the 3-year-old **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) poised for an upset. The GII Black-Eyed Susan winner relished the 10-furlong distance of the GI Alabama S., winning by 5 1/2 lengths at the Spa Aug. 20, and showed her readiness for this with a sharp four-furlong drill in :47 2/5 at Belmont Sept. 26. "She could make us run hard for it," admitted Jones. Last year's winner **Life at Ten** (Malibu Moon) seems a different mare this year, but trainer Todd Pletcher said this week, "I know we don't have a horse in the barn who looks better."

The Fipke homebred finished second in the Teddy Drone S. at Monmouth July 31 and the GI Forego S. at Saratoga behind **Jackson Bend** at Saratoga Sept. 3. Bob LaPenta and Fred Brei's Jackson Bend has found new life since turning back to seven furlongs--he took the very deep James Marvin S. on opening day at the Spa July 22 before besting Jersey Town by 3 1/4 lengths in the Forego. He'll have to navigate an extra furlong, but the millionaire has won and garnered Grade I placings going longer.

TWO CHANCES FOR BAFFERT IN GOODWOOD

He conceded the early edge to **Acclamation**--who is cross-entered in Sunday's GII Clement L. Hirsch Turf Championship S. and reportedly more likely to run there--but Bob Baffert is adamant that Game on Dude will be sent hard to the front this time regardless of who else is present. "My horse needs to be on the lead. He's just gotta go," he told *Daily Racing Form*. "We didn't want him to get into a speed duel last time, but I think you've just got to let him roll. He's just one high-cruising dude." Game On Dude's 3-year-old barnmate **Coil** looks to rebound from an desultory last-place run in the GI Travers S. Aug. 27 after suffering from an eye injury during his preparation for that event. A fast-finishing winner of the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth July 31 before that, the chestnut has trained forwardly since returning to the West Coast. "I should have sat the [Travers] out and gone to the Pennsylvania Derby," Baffert admitted to *DRF*. "I think when the dirt hit him, it was stinging him. After the race, after we got him back here, we got it all cleared up. He's good now. He's trained really well."

GETTING CIRRUS

Last year's G2 Prix Dollar winner **Cirrus des Aigles** returns to defend his crown and looks to extend his total dominance of these contests in 2011. Beaten three times at the top level so far this term, he has racked up three consecutive Pattern-race successes, bringing his career total to eight. While his most recent trio have all come on vastly contrasting ground conditions to the slick surface he will encounter here, he had accounted for the subsequent G1 Prix Jean Romanet winner Announce (GB) (Selkirk) and G1 Beverly D. S. heroine Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) on good-to-soft in this venue's 10-furlong G3 La Coupe June 13. "He won this very easily last year and so we'll try to do that again before going to Ascot," trainer Corine Barande-Barbe said of the 5-year-old, who is bound for the Oct. 15 G1 Champion S. after this assignment. This is as strong a renewal as has been witnessed in recent times, and among his opponents are the July 31 G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis first and second **Durban Thunder** and **Famous Name**. The former, who was registering a career-best as well as a 10-1 upset in that Munich highlight run on soft ground, has to concede six pounds to the runner-up who was third in this two years ago. Also third in the G1 Irish Champion S. at his beloved Leopardstown last time Sept. 3, Juddmonte's 13-time stakes-winning evergreen is joined by the operation's 2010 G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero **Byword**, who recorded a welcome return to winning ways for the Andre Fabre barn in the G3 Prix du Chemin de Fer du Nord over a mile at Chantilly June 12. Godolphin put forward **French Navy**, who under the auspices of Fabre last year when annexing the G3 Prix des Chenes here. He comes into this test on the back of a smooth win in the G3 Select S. at Goodwood Sept. 10. Trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said, "I thought that French Navy ran a really good race at Goodwood and he came out of that race in good order. He won on good-to-firm ground on his seasonal return at Newmarket and I don't see him having a problem with the forecast fast conditions at Longchamp. Ahmed Ajtebi gave him a good ride at Goodwood and he knows the horse well, so he will be in the saddle again."

Europe's most valuable 2-year-old race has attracted two of the best home-trained juveniles of their generation in **Entifaadha** and **Talwar**. The former beat a clutch of smart types in the G3 Acomb S. at York Aug. 17 before finishing third--and a place ahead of Saturday's G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Daddy Long Legs (Scat Daddy)--in Doncaster's G2 Champagne S. over this trip Sep. 10. Talwar beat the subsequent Champagne winner Trumpet Major (Ire) (Arakan) in Ascot's Listed Winkfield S. over this trip July 23 before relishing testing ground to win Sandown's G3 Solario S. by five lengths Aug. 20. On the premise that he was getting similar conditions in The Curragh's G1 National S., he was supplemented for that Sept. 10 seven-furlong contest, but the gamble backfired as he trailed in last. On likely fast ground here, he is not a definite starter. "Talwar seems in very good order," trainer Jeremy Nosedata commented. "We were a little bit mystified as to why he performed like he did in Ireland and we couldn't find a reason to explain his below-par performance. But he appears in great shape now and we are very happy with him. He has a good chance. In an ideal world he would prefer good ground and I will be keeping an eye on it, as I am a little concerned that it might be faster than ideal for him."

"I can't believe that I have not managed to win a nursery with Glee, but she produced her best run yet when beaten only a neck in the big fillies sale race here two weeks ago and she'll give [owner] Julie [Wood] a good run."

"It's a shame, as Harbour Watch has been flying at home but he has had a hiccup and, with nothing left for him this season, we will draw stumps and leave him until next season," trainer Richard Hannon commented. "He has had the three runs, so the experience is in the bag, and if he comes back as good as new next spring, we can look to the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury to give him his pre-run for the Guineas."

Moore Arc Warm-Up Goes Smoothly...

Ryan Moore reported himself satisfied after making his return to the saddle following an injury-enforced absence with two rides at Ascot yesterday. Finishing fourth on Tuscania (GB) (King's Best) in the opening handicap and third on Kinyras (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) in the third race on the card, the three-time champion jockey was warming up for his mount on Workforce (GB) (King's Best) at Longchamp tomorrow. "I was very happy with that," he commented after coming back from a broken humerus and thumb. "A lot of people have worked hard for me and hopefully all that has paid off. I've been riding out for a couple of weeks now and we just wanted to give it as long as possible--I've come back for a very good horse in the most important race."

MAKING RACING VIABLE

About 140 representatives of racing in 27 countries were challenged on September 30 to make the sport more appealing and more available, both in their own jurisdictions and through simulcasting of the world's biggest events internationally.

"The key question for us is how to secure our future success," said Philippe Germond, president of France's Pari Mutuel Urbain while opening the European Pari Mutuel Association's fourth Racing and Betting Business Forum in Paris.

"There is no single way," noted Germond, who also serves as EPMA chairman. "But if we do not change, if we do not move fast, we are going to suffer in this changing world. If we are static, we are going to be in danger in the next five to 10 years."

Germond suggested the creation of new bets and the use of technology such as Trakus as just two of many paths racing can take in moving forward. He said that he favors the installation of Trakus at some French racecourses.

Michael Ciacciarelli, chief operating officer of the Wakefield, Massachusetts-based Trakus, spoke during a session focusing on attracting "a new generation" to racing. He said the company's technology, which produces visual representations of all runners' positions in races that are generated by tracking devices attached to tack, enhances the experiences of fans.

"Trakus is the answer," Ciacciarelli said of the need for racing to supply the detailed kind of data that other sports provide to fans.

While offering a moving depiction of how horses are changing position during a race, Trakus also provides data about how far each horse traveled, giving handicappers specific information previously not available.

Trakus also has generated virtual scenarios, such as showing fans animated jockeys' views for races. Such presentations were streamed online for Churchill Downs this spring and were launched with the Singapore Turf Club on high definition digital video boards.

Trakus can also drive television graphics for racing as well as be personalized for mobile devices, Ciacciarelli said.

Racing around the globe can benefit from Trakus, he suggested while noting that the same immediate data can be collected at all racecourses that use the technology, with current customers including Woodbine in Toronto and Veliefendi in Istanbul. The data can then be customized depending on market preferences.

"We welcome the opportunity to become the common language for horse racing worldwide," Ciacciarelli said.

Other speakers at the EPMA forum included Kim Heng Teo, Singapore Turf Club vice president, who was one of several executives who underlined a need to connect fans, from the youngest up, to horses. The modern world offers people fewer chances to become attached to horses and naturally progress on to racing, he noted.

"Where there is passion, the money will follow," said Kim, adding that the Singapore Turf Club created a riding school as one step.

Remy Nilson, chief executive officer of Sweden's ATG racing and betting organization, urged his colleagues to "start in the head of the customer, not what you want to do yourself." ATG has relied on focus group research while trying to meet public expectations.

"We are trying to give people as much as they want," said Nilson, adding that ATG's website offers free replays of racing going back several years and other detailed information.

Rod Street, chief executive of Racing Enterprises Ltd. in Britain as well as of Racing for Change and the new British Champions Series, reported encouraging growth for racing in some major categories, including racecourse attendance, television viewership and sponsorship and broadcast income, following the launch of Racing for Change in 2009.

The initiative has included a staff charged with placing racing stories in mainstream media, the formation of racing clubs for young people at universities and the promotion of specific horses via social media.

"Racing for Change isn't about changing the core product. All we've got to do is present ourselves, be more relevant, simplify the language," Street said. "The critical thing is to engage with stakeholders and customers and keep customers at the heart of your business."

When it comes to the exchange of major international events through simulcasting, William Nader, the former New York Racing Association executive who now is executive director of racing with the Hong Kong Jockey Club, said the key ingredients for success are quality races, large fields, big betting pools, integrity and extensive information.

"You must make sure the product is right to make a really compelling experience for the customer," Nader said.

Alex Waldrop, president of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, said the "bad news" for racing organizations in other countries that wish to simulcast to the United States is the complex nature of the sport in America, with differing regulatory systems in 38 jurisdictions. The "good news," he said, is that "the U.S. market is open for business."

"Find the right partner (to distribute information and connect with American wagering outlets)," Waldrop advised, "and you will find a ready and willing betting public."

Trainer Tom Proctor, jockey Garrett Gomez and owner Leonard Lavin's Glen Hill Farm teamed to win the GII Del Mar Derby with Banned (Kitten's Joy) four weeks ago, and were back at it on opening day of Santa Anita's 24-day autumn meet with the 5-year-old mare Broken Dreams. Third in the six-furlong Great Lady M. S. at Hollywood in late May, the homebred chestnut upended the always-tough Unzip Me (City Zip) in a valuable, salty allowance over the same course and distance July 14. Unzip Me regained the winning thread in the five-furlong Daisycutter H. at Del Mar 12, with Broken Dreams' late rally getting her no closer than fourth, beaten 1 1/4 lengths, and the pair once again lined up against each other here. The crowd expected a repeat of the Daisycutter, but backers of the 4-5 Unzip Me had to be at least a little concerned as she fought Rafael Bejarano's hold racing down the hillside course in second. Frontrunner Separate Forest posted a half in :43 1/5 before being joined by Unzip Me and second choice Tanda crossing over the main track, but the fast fractions set it up for a closer, and the rallying Broken Dreams, flying up the inside, outfinished Givine for her initial black-type badge. "Rock and roll is all I can say," said Proctor. "She actually ran good last time in the Daisycutter. The stretch at Del Mar is a little short for her. It was really one of her better races, and I thought if she could run that way today, maybe she'd win. It's nice to see her win a stakes. This was a good bunch of fillies." Tanda got the better of Unzip Me for show honors, but the latter's trainer took the loss in stride. "She was kind of on the muscle down the backstretch," said Marty Jones. "It might have caught up with her the last part of it, but she ran hard."

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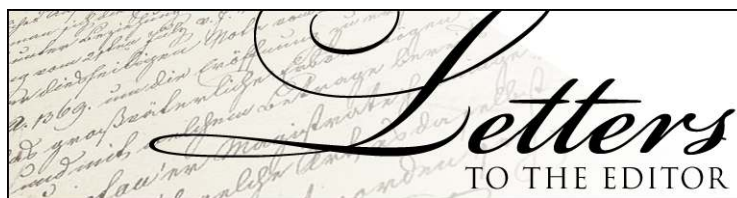

Arqana hosts its Arc Sale at Saint-Cloud today, and if it avoids the raft of withdrawals, it is certain to attract some substantial international players gathered for the Arc meeting. This is the auction that **Urban Sea** (Miswaki) was sold, as well as **Megahertz (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Elmhurst** (Wild Again) and **Aube Indienne (Fr)** (Bluebird). In recent times, the likes of **Elusive Wave (Ire)** (Elusive City), **Racinger (Fr)** (Spectrum {Ire}) and **Eclair de Lune (Ger)** (Marchand de Sable) have passed through the ring, and 12 months ago **Rajsaman (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}) was purchased here before he added the G2 Prix du Muguet to his tally during this season. Among the 58-strong catalogue this time, there are offerings from His Highness The Aga Khan, Wertheimer et Frere and a host of trainers including Andre Fabre, Alain de Royer-Dupre, Elie Lellouche, Jean-Claude Rouget, Pascal Bary, Robert Collet, Freddy Head and his sister Criquelette, as well as Mario Hofer, Andreas Wohler and Bruno Grizzetti. With the Dubai Carnival now an established draw, all will have in mind the various pots of gold offered at glittering Meydan. Only one entry in the book fails to meet the official rating of 90, which is the minimum level required to participate in that jamboree as well as Hong Kong's International races. Much has been written lately regarding the genetics of the horse and the horse matching up to the performance of his genetic heritage.

This premise, although sound in theory, has an entire area that has not been considered as part of the analysis, yet is in fact a large influence and in some cases total cause of the performance of the horse.

The success and performance is no longer about whether that equine has the most prolific dosage genetic nick, the grander black type champion family, the ultimate number of chefs-d-race or whether the trainer is astute in his training regime. The facts of the heritage of the families relating to the equine simply cannot, on their own, overcome the inherent miasmatic conditions that "come with the territory" of the side effects of all the horse has had administered to him, the feed he has eaten, the environmental toxins he has been exposed to, the chemicals such as chlorine and flouride in his drinking and bath water, every biogenetically engineered grain he's been fed, the pesticides, fungicides, and herbicides, sprayed on his hay, and the pharmaceutical drugs. All play a cumulative and significant part of the miasms, and altered DNA of the ravaged metabolic system and the health of the horse.

The Russians have completed a study on cattle showing the effects of Bio-genetically farmed crops fed over three generations of a family [mother cows]. By the third generation--the GMO fed cattle were completely sterile.

All of the accumulation of toxins create a tendency to lower immune function, and promote chronic disease.

The miasms from the parentage and ancestors of the horse play a large role in the exhibition of the symptomology and the way the cumulative effect manifests. The performance of the horse is also influenced in this way, as is the overall health and soundness of the horse.

It is no coincidence that back in the middle of the last century of horse racing that many performers had as many as an astounding fifty starts and some great champions emerged from that era. Presently, trainers are extremely fortunate to get a lifetime career of a half a dozen starts. Some horses are coming through with one, two, or at their best effort, maybe three races and showing blazing brilliance, only to be immediately sidelined or completely end their career.

Everyone is left with thoughts of what they could have been, but never proved it. Much of this scarcity of consistence is due to the lack of nutrients to support the extreme rigors of training and racing. It would be good and prudent, if we could replace the nutrients that are being used up and taken out. With all of the daily minimum requirements we need to fortify the supply to meet the demand of their depleted bodies. Not only is the earth, because of lack of topsoil producing nutritionally deficient feedstuffs, but the assimilation and uptake of whatever is being fed is blocked through the extermination of hydrochloric acid by drugs. So, either way, the horse is not receiving his uptake of intended nutrients. It's hard to have strong bones and flexible muscles when the nutrients are not available.

If the Thoroughbred breed is going to survive, and I use the word survive because of the inevitable outcome of too many GMO feeds, combined with drug abuse, and dirty tainted water sources, it is going to take a complete re-think of our entire raising, feeding, monitoring exposures, training and care process of the industry.

If all of these health concerns could be cleaned up, then performance could once again be a product of pedigree. The assumption that shiny coat means good health might make a comeback. Presently, it doesn't matter who the sire and dam are--we have simply let too many things that are influencing the outcome of their performance slip by unaccounted for and unnoticed.

Can't we do a little better at protecting our breed than this???? Breeders, owners, trainers--take charge of the health of your horse. If you give them what they need and their bodies are crying out for, they will give you what you want in performance on the track and in the breeding shed.

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Following his fourth straight Horse of the Year title in '63, Kelso, having turned 7, got off to an inauspicious start that year. He was winless in a trip to California, returned to capture an Aqueduct handicap in June, then lost his next three. But late summer saw Kelso round into form. After a grassy allowance win at the Spa, he went off as the second choice to Gun Bow in the \$107,000 Aqueduct S. Gun Bow was red-hot at the time, boasting 12- and 10-length wins in the Brooklyn and Whitney handicaps, respectively, but Kelso lowered his colors by 3/4 lengths. A month later, Gun Bow got his revenge by nosing out Kelso in the Woodward S., and while the rubber match would have to wait--Kelso would ultimately take the series with a spectacular win in the 1 1/2-mile DC International at Laurel in 2:23 4/5--a fifth Gold Cup awaited Kelso. A win or a second in the then 2-mile race would push Kelso past Round Table as the sport's all-time leading money earner, and help cement a fifth Horse of the Year title. In his way was the stand-out 3-year-old Quadrangle, winner of the Belmont, Dwyers and Travers S., the progressive sophomore Roman Brother, a tiny horse whom the DRF called "870 pounds of sheer grit"; and the top French mare Monade. **Tomorrow: the results of the '64 Gold Cup!**

BERTONE TO SPEAK AT TEDXLEX

Equine orthopedic surgeon Dr. Alicia Bertone will be one of the featured speakers at the TEDx event Oct. 21 at the Kentucky Theatre in Lexington. TED is a non-profit organization bringing together people from the worlds of technology, entertainment and design (hence the acronym) and staging events where "the world's leading thinkers and doers are invited to share what they are most passionate about." TEDx is a program of local, self-organized events that bring people together to share a TED-like experience. This October's event will be the second such annual gathering in Lexington and will feature 'playful innovation' as its theme. Dr. Bertone, who has been with the Ohio State University Galbreath Equine Center for over 20 years, said her talk would focus on "the one-medicine concept--how animals and humans are alike in the field of regenerative medicine. How we can harness natural biology, using horses as an example? How do we take our cells, how do we take our genes and make them work for us when we're sick?" Dr. Bertone's clinical focus is orthopedic surgery and her research focus is in the study of comparative orthopedic medicine, regenerative medicine, and gene therapy for the treatment of cartilage injury and bone repair. Her talk, she said, "will be geared toward an upper-level audience in terms of education and desire to understand, but it's not a science lesson. Hopefully, people will leave saying, 'I get it now.' In broad strokes, what my goal is going to be is to excite the audience and give them some insight into how we can capture the natural biology of our cells and our DNA and hopefully use that for not only a better understanding of disease, but also to regenerate our tissues. The one-medicine concept is that we all have similar diseases, animals and humans. Horses have been the leader; horses were the first ones to use regenerative medicines for arthritis. We have been capturing stem cells from horses for years; they have been reinjected back into horses to treat tendon injuries. That's not yet approved for people, but is the matter of much interest and focus right now." Dr. Bertone said that the demands that humans make on horses has forced innovation. "Within veterinary medicine, the equine world has been the leader," she said. "We have a demanding clientele, and high expectations of our sports horses." Dr. Bertone will also unveil the equine gene chip--a snapshot of what a horse's genes are doing at that particular moment, and which will differ in different stages of the animal's life. "They've been out there in humans and mice for quite some time," Bertone added. "We developed and designed the first equine gene chip here in my lab." 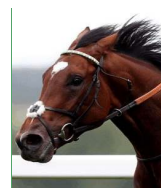
