



FRIZETTE SHOWDOWN

Repole Stable's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Stopshoppingmaria** (More Than Ready) gets another crack at the unbeaten GII Adirondack S. heroine **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike) in today's GI Frizette S. at Belmont Park. Stopshoppingmaria stumbled badly at the start in her unveiling at the Spa July 22 ([video](#)), and reported home a valiant third, three lengths behind My Miss Aurelia. She was away cleanly in her next start going six furlongs upstate Aug. 14 ([video](#)), and streaked under the line an eye-catching 9 3/4-length wire-to-wire winner, good for a division-leading 101 Beyer Speed Figure. The \$100,000 OBSMAR juvenile graduate has worked five times since her maiden score, capped by a four-furlong move in :48 1/5 over the Belmont Park training track Oct. 3. "With the way she breezes and the way she gallops out, [the extra distance] should not be an issue for her," Todd Pletcher's assistant trainer Whit Beckman said of Stopshoppingmaria stretching to a mile here. "She has a great pedigree to go forward." **Cont. p8-9**

CHAMPAGNE ON ICE

Belmont's GI Champagne S. took a hit with the early withdrawal of the sidelined Fire On Ice (Unbridled's Song), but it still boasts a solid nine-horse line-up, led by the unbeaten GII Three Chimneys Saratoga Special S. hero **Union Rags** (Dixie Union). The Chadds Ford Stable colorbearer has been training smartly since that 7 1/4-length romp in the Saratoga slop Aug. 15 ([video](#)), most recently working a bullet four furlongs in :48 1/5 at Fair Hill Oct. 1. "He's growing up, and each race he will continue to mature more and hopefully progress," trainer Michael Matz offered of Union Rags, who graduated at first asking at Delaware July 12. BOOK 1 ENDS WITH A BANG

A sensational renewal of Book 1 of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale finished on a fittingly lively note in Newmarket last night when a Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) filly fetched 1.7-million gns (**US\$2.779 million**). Charlie Gordon-Watson, acting on behalf of Kazakhstan-based Nurlan Bizakov, was the man who bid the dearest price achieved by a yearling at auction in Europe or America during 2011. Out of Brigid (Irish River {Fr}), the filly is a 3/4-sister to the Group 1 winners Listen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells)--the dam of Henrythenavigator, and was bred by Peter Magnier's Brittas House Stud at Cashel in County Tipperary. She was consigned through Mark Dwyer's Yorkshire-based Oaks Farm Stables. **Cont. p2-8**

Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony kicked the bidding off at 200,000gns for the filly, with the early players including Authorized's Kuwaiti owner Saleh Al Homaizi and Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock, who has bought this week for Abu Dhabi royal family member Sheikh Sultan bin Khalifa Al Nahyan. Hong Kong-based Paul Makin threw in a solitary bid of a million guineas when Gordon-Watson had already entered the fray, but it was Brown, taking instructions by phone, who ended up as underbidder.

Bizakov, who stood with Gordon-Watson while bidding, bought Hesmonds Stud in Sussex from Peter Goulondris last year and has bought four fillies this week. He now has 11 mares on his farm, including First (GB) (Highest Honor {Fr}), who was purchased for 1.1 million gns at Tattersalls in December.

"You don't get the chance to buy a filly like that very often and it was more than we were expecting to pay," said Gordon-Watson. "But less and less good fillies become available and, when you are starting a new stud and want foundation blood, you go for the best. I know the family well and I think Galileo is the best stallion in my lifetime, because of what he has achieved with 2-year-olds as well as older horses." He added, "It is up to [Mr. Bizakov] where she goes into training, but he currently has horses with Sir Michael Stoute, Ed Dunlop and Jeremy Nosedá."

A prolific week for Gordon-Watson also saw him pay 400,000gns for a Danehill Dancer (Ire) (Danehill) colt out of a half-sister to Group 1 winner Eagle Mountain (GB) (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) sold from Tim Hyde's Camas Park Stud. The colt, on whom representatives of Qatari-owned Al Shahania Stud were underbidders, had cost just 75,000gns as a foal at Tattersalls.

Newmarket trainer Roger Varian is set to train the colt. He commented, "He's for an existing owner in the yard and was a lovely colt with the scope to go on."

Galileo fillies accounted for six of the week's seven highest prices. At number two in the pecking order was a full-sister to last year's G3 Athasi S. winner Cabaret (Ire) offered from Croom House Stud. Yorkshire-born owner Sir Robert Ogden, who had kept his powder dry during the week, saw off John Magnier for the filly at 850,000gns, although she was bought as a racing, rather than breeding prospect.

"It's not significant that she is a filly--I've been just looking for racehorses and the fact we could breed from her didn't come into the decision to buy her," said Ogden. "What we have looked for this year is quality, and my brief [to my advisors] was to look for proven stock with top pedigrees; nothing by first-season sires and no first foals out of mares."

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"This filly was our pick of the whole sale," Ogden continued. "We knew there would be a battle for her and we knew Coolmore were interested. I've sat on the sidelines all week, which is unusual for me, but this was the one I wanted. There's no decision on a trainer, but

she will go to one of our existing people." Ogden explained, "We have bought less this year because we have such a large amount still in training, and we have a few 2-year-olds who are injured and have not got on a racecourse. We also have a few home-bred yearlings."

Chris Richardson of Cheveley Park Stud, accompanied by the farm's joint owner Patricia Thompson, saw off colourful soccer player Joey Barton--bidding through Johnny McKeever--for another Galileo filly, a 410,000gns 3/4-sister to MGSW Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells). She was bred by Luca and Sara Cumanì's Fittocks Stud and sold by Highclere Stud.

Coolmore's purchases included a 370,000gns Acclamation (GB) colt offered from Paddy Twomey's County Tipperary-based Hawthorn Villa Stud. The colt had cost €80,000 as a weanling at Goffs.

Stuart Boman of Blandford Bloodstock saw off John Ferguson to get a Shamardal colt offered from Luke Lillingston's Mount Coote Stud for 350,000gns. "I have bought him for an undisclosed, existing client, and he'll go into training in this country," said Boman. His Blandford Bloodstock colleague Tom Goff earlier paid 340,000gns for a Danehill Dancer colt on behalf of 30-year-old London city trader Lawrie Inman. The full-brother to G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein winner Tamazirte (Ire) (Danehill Dancer), sold by Tom Gaffney's Churchtown House Stud, is set to join Michael Bell. "He was an exceptionally high quality model of a Danehill Dancer," said Goff.

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Excellent Book 1 Catalogue Breaks Records...

Despite a catalogue a quarter smaller than in 2010, turnover rose by 7% to 51,634,000gns. The 100,000gns median and 141,852gns average, both records for Book 1, were up respectively by 43% and 32%, respectively. The clearance rate of 82% compared with 75% in 2010.

"We knew that we had a superb catalogue for Book 1 of the October Yearling Sale, but not even the most incurable optimist would have predicted the level of trade we have experienced at Park Paddocks this week," Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony beamed.

He continued, "A record average and median as well as the highest-priced yearling sold in Europe or America this year are impressive statistics. In addition, the outstanding clearance rate demonstrates the extraordinary strength and depth to the sale. Equally telling has been the turnover this week, which has surpassed last year's level, and there have been a greater number of lots sold for 200,000gns or more despite cataloguing 181 fewer yearlings than last year.

"To stage a record-breaking sale is always something to celebrate, but to do this in the current economic climate is truly remarkable and a welcome boost for the bloodstock industry. Our vendors have sent us some magnificent yearlings and it is wonderful to see their confidence in the sale so richly rewarded. **Cont. p6**

"There are plenty of challenges facing the British racing industry, and it would be wrong to pretend that the success of this sale means all in the garden is rosy, but Book 1 of the 2011 Tattersalls October Yearling Sale has been a wonderful advertisement for British and Irish bloodstock and we can look forward to Books 2 and 3 next week with a degree of cautious optimism."

Croom House Stud proprietor Denis Brosnan was suitably delighted after consigning the 850,000gns second-dearest lot in Book 1, lot 420, a fine Galileo filly out of the consistent producer Witch Of Fife (Lear Fan).

But the County Limerick breeder is already looking forward to next year with the news that the mare has a full-sister on the ground.

"Witch Of Fife has this one's full-sister and she is in foal to New Approach," revealed Brosnan, shortly after Sir Robert Ogden had outbid Coolmore's John Magnier to secure the youngster. "It was a great price. We were expecting 500,000 to 600,000 guineas, but we saw lots of action--Charlie Gordon-Watson got in there and all the right people got involved."

Witch Of Fife has proven a shrewd purchase. Brosnan paid 130,000 guineas for the then 8-year-old at Tattersalls in December of 2001. Among her previous auction successes is the Group 3 winner Cabaret (Ire) (Galileo), who sold for €300,000 at Goffs in September 2008.

"It's one of the great families," stated Brosnan, who owns the stud with his wife Joan and built up the Kerry Group in Ireland. Brosnan is also a longstanding chairman of Horseracing Ireland. "I bought Witch Of Fife at Tattersalls a long time ago, at the December sale, so we bred virtually everything that she has produced, and she is still going strong."

Brosnan acknowledged the role played by the staff behind the scenes at his County Limerick farm, breeder of leading juvenile filly Maybe (Ire) (Galileo), and by his own admission has enjoyed a profitable 2011.

"We have sold 28 yearlings so far this year, all homebred, and we have five to go," he added. "We have kept two fillies to race; we keep two or three every year. I would have loved to have kept this filly but that is where it comes down to a commercial decision."

"The team at home takes a lot of credit; [manager] Paul McCartan and Peter O'Riordan, who led her around the ring. Peter has been with us from the start, his whole family are involved in horses."



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Chevely Park Active on Both Ends...

Chevely Park Stud wrapped up its interest as a consignor at this year's Book 1 with the 210,000gns sale of lot 445, a Nayef (Gulch) colt out of Group 1 heroine Allegretto (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who had been bought at this sale for 415,000gns in 2004.

The Nayef colt's sale came only seven offerings after David and Patricia Thompson's Newmarket operation had completed the 340,000gns purchase of lot 438, a Dalakhani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) filly out of Albastine (GB) (Green Desert). She hails from a strand of the same outstanding Alruccaba (GB) (Crystal Palace {Fr}) family as Allegretto. That venture preceded its late 410,000gns swoop for lot 494, a well-related Galileo filly.

This year's October Yearling Sale has seen Chevely Park Stud follow a policy of offering most of its yearling colts, while investing in fillies that will introduce new bloodlines into its impressive broodmare band. A total of 11 Chevely Park yearlings were offered during Book 1--all colts. Nine of those sold to new owners. In tandem with that trend, the farm selectively purchased six individuals, exclusively fillies. Contrast that with last year's edition of this sale, when Chevely Park secured 11 yearlings, five of which were colts.

"Things have gone well for us this week and I think everyone has understood our policy," opined Chris Richardson, Chevely Park Stud's managing director. "We have tried to be up front and the horses have made their value in what has been a good market. We have supported the industry by selling the colts and, at the same time, by buying from new families, and different branches of families we already have."

Richardson continued, "It has all come full circle, really. Over the years we have sold the likes of Entrepreneur (GB), who won the G1 2000 Guineas, and other good colts, but the policy has undergone a bit of a change."

And that policy is open to flexibility, as Richardson pointed out. "There will be a review next year, but the current policy is to offer all our colts that are considered sound prospects for sale. We obviously wouldn't bring any horse that wasn't quite acceptable to the market, one that had injuries or might need a breathing operation, for example."

Among the well-bred fillies heading across Newmarket from Park Paddocks to Chevely Park Stud is lot 232, a 350,000gns Galileo filly out of Mrs Lindsay (Theatrical {Ire}), who landed the G1 Prix Vermeille and G1 E. P. Taylor S. in the fall of 2007. But the most expensive of the bunch was that late acquisition, a close relative to group winners Fantasia (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Pink Symphony (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), being by Galileo out of Blue Symphony (GB) (Darshaan {GB}).

Explaining the strategy that also brought in a pair of six-figure recruits by Invincible Spirit (Ire) and Exceed and Excel (Aus), Richardson commented, "We have invested in some lovely fillies, because we have a lot of Pivotal (GB) and Polar Falcon blood in our broodmares and we need some new families. Mrs Thompson was very pleased to get the Dalakhani filly. We have got some very nice fillies with lovely pedigrees and all by proven sires."

Like *"the Rock,"* ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Power showed his prowess in early spring before being shipped to Royal Ascot for the G2 Coventry S. While his Rosegreen predecessor was desperately unlucky in that contest, Power managed to come out on top before meeting with defeat when second in The Curragh's G1 Phoenix S. Aug. 7. Rock of Gibraltar was also runner-up in the Champagne before recording a first win at the top level in the Grand Criterium 10 years ago, and Power put his own reversal behind him when bagging his Group 1 in the National S. back in Kildare Sept. 10. That form has been boosted by the G2 Beresford S. success of the third David Livingston (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Seamie Heffernan, who rode Power that day and who has been replaced with Ryan Moore this afternoon, was effusive in his praise for him at the time. "He is strong and genuine and shouldn't have been beaten in the Phoenix--there is a chance he could be at his best when eventually going a mile," he said. Richard Hannon has had another campaign to remember, and his current 2-year-old brigade appears as strong as any the master of Marlborough has looked after. Michael Pescod's unbeaten **Bronterre (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) looked one of the best of them when beating the smart Justineo (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) by five lengths in the Listed Stardom S. over this trip at Goodwood last time Sept. 10, and the third Nayarra (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) has since finished in the same spot in the G3 Oh So Sharp S. Also bidding to provide Hannon with a first renewal is **Trumpet Major (Ire)** (Arakan), who beat **Red Duke** (Hard Spun) by

1 1/4 lengths when in receipt of three pounds in the seven-furlong G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster on the same afternoon that Bronterre was strutting his stuff. "Although it looks a hot renewal, I could not be happier with them," Hannon said. "This is a big jump up in class for Bronterre, but he could not have been more impressive when winning his listed race at Goodwood by five lengths, and though he is just starting to go in his coat, he moved beautifully for Hughesie in a spin up the all-weather at Herridge on Tuesday, and seems at the top of his game." **Cont. p13**

Hannon continued, "We had Trumpet Major entered in what looked a soft Group 1 in Italy on Sunday, but his owner John Manley was keen to run here. With the 'Major' rated a pound above Bronterre, he is fully entitled to take his chance." Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Ektihaam (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) beat the smart Harvard N Yale (Smart Strike) in a maiden over this trip at Newbury July 15 before earning ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status in the same conditions event won by Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) 12 months ago at Doncaster last time Sept. 9. "He's done very well so far, and we'll see whether he's good enough," Shadwell's Racing Manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport*. "It's the same situation for a lot of them, and there is no better race to find out. He's potentially a very nice horse and a big, scopey individual who is very much one for next year. But he's got plenty of talent, and if he could run well in the Dewhurst, it would be a bonus. Power is a Group 1 winner and an established horse, and Bronterre has won a listed race. They are all potentially nice horses, and we'll see who makes the leap forward." Brian Meehan, who saddled Fast Company (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) to be second in this in 2007, relies on Iraj Parvizi's **Most Improved (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}). He looked a colt with a big future when winning by five lengths on the July Course when last seen Aug. 26. "He has worked very well in preparation for this challenge and we believe he has the class to make a big statement," Meehan said. "He is one of the dark ones in a championship race."

AN ARTIST AT WORK

Caspar Netscher (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) has already made history by becoming the first to win the G2 Gimcrack S. and G2 Mill Reef S., and he holds strong claims of adding further glory in today's G1 Emaar Middle Park S. at Newmarket. Charles Wentworth's slow-burner took seven starts to really hit full stride, but has turned his fortunes in his last two and holds several of today's opponents as a result. At York, he had **Lilbourne Lad (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}) 2 1/4 lengths back in second and **Burwaaz (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) a further head behind with **Justineo (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), **B Fifty Two (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) and **Reply (Ire)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) filling the next places in that Aug. 19 contest. In Newbury's Mill Reef, he comfortably defied a penalty with **Saigon (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) trailing in his wake in third, and trainer Alan McCabe is justifiably confident. "We have him as well as we can have him--we haven't changed anything, just kept him to his routine and he's the same, if not better than he has been all year," McCabe said. "We were a bit concerned about the rain before the Gimcrack, but Robert [Winston] said he did it very easily that day, and he held his form in the Mill Reef. We're taking on the usual suspects, and we're still learning about the horse. We're going for the Breeders' Cup after this; he'll be entered in both the dirt and turf races."

Andrew Russell's Lilbourne Lad was supplemented for this prize, and his best piece of form came when besting **Tough As Nails (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) in the G2 Railway S. over this trip at The Curragh June 26. Only fourth in that track's G1 Phoenix S. Aug. 7 and Doncaster's G2 Flying Childers S. Sept. 9 either side of his second in the Gimcrack, the battle-hardened campaigner meets rivals on level terms here. Trainer Richard Hannon said, "He is actually rated 111, so is officially our second best 2-year-old colt at the moment, behind only Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}) and, though Caspar Netscher beat us fair and square in the Gimcrack, we have a three-pound pull, so he deserves another shot at a Group 1." One who has no direct form links with this field is Ecurie Ascot's July 3 G3 Prix du Bois and July 24 G2 Prix Robert Papin hero **Family One (Fr)** (Dubai Destination), who comes here off a break, having met his match when three-lengths second to Dabirsim (Fr) (Hat Trick {Jpn}) in Deauville's G1 Prix Morny Aug. 21. Also coming here fresh is the unbeaten **Bapak Chinta** (Speightstown), who was forced to miss the G1 Nunthorpe S. due to an 11th-hour setback. After beating the subsequent G2 July S. winner Frederick Engels (GB) (Iceman {GB}) in a five-furlong Hamilton maiden May 13, he added the G2 Norfolk S. to his tally at Royal Ascot June 16, and trainer Kevin Ryan is expecting a big effort. "From the first day we did anything with him, he was very good, and he won really well as Ascot on ground that was too loose for him," Ryan said. "Missing the Nunthorpe was a blessing with the way the ground was there, and he's in very good order now. He is getting stronger, as he is maturing and, hopefully, he will get six. He has a real high cruising speed and can quicken off it as well. He's only a handy horse, but is very strong and has a wonderful temperament to go with it."

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A SUITABLE STEPPING STONE

Strong Suit makes his first appearance in the Qatar Bloodstock silks in today's G2 Challenge S. at Newmarket, which connections are using as a springboard to a tilt at Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in four weeks' time. While the triple pattern scorer has nothing of that caliber to contend with here, his four-pound penalty earned as a result of his latest win in Goodwood's G2 Lennox S. could make life tougher. His authoritative 1 1/2-length defeat of last year's Challenge winner Red Jazz (Johannesburg) in that July 26 seven-furlong contest confirmed the impression he had created when successful both last year and this at Royal Ascot in the G2 Coventry S. and G3 Jersey S., respectively. Trainer Richard Hannon is full of confidence he can defy the penalty. "Strong Suit is a worthy favourite for the Challenge S.," Hannon said. "He seems a different horse since that wind operation and worked very well at Everleigh on Sunday. There is not a lot of rain forecast, so we should get our favoured fast ground, and this seven furlongs is his ideal trip. He has the penalty for winning the Lennox S. at Goodwood, but he has thrived for his break, and his new owners are keen to take him to the Breeders' Cup, so he would need to be winning this to justify the trip." **Chachamaidee** will be no push-over, having also flaunted her talent over this trip at the Glorious Goodwood meeting when recording a 2 3/4-length success in the July 29 G3 Oak Tree S. There is no obvious reason why that race's fourth and fifth, **Rimth** and **Maqaasid**, respectively, should reverse form, and the winner has subsequently progressed again to be a length second to Sahpresa (Sahm) in the G1 Sun Chariot S. over a mile here Sept. 24. Jockey Tom Queally commented, "I would give Chachamaidee a big chance. She ran another fantastic race to come second in the Sun Chariot S. and drops in grade here as well as distance, and I think the seven furlongs will suit. Strong Suit looks the one to beat, but I wouldn't swap mine for him or any other horse in the race." Maqaasid was third in this venue's G1 Cheveley Park S. 12 months ago 2010 and G1 1000 Guineas May 1 and, despite being below that level on three subsequent outings, trainer John Gosden is hopeful she can regain some lost ground. "She has been working very nicely at home, and I think seven furlongs is her optimum trip," he said. "She had a good spring, things went off a bit in the summer, but hopefully, she will have a good autumn."

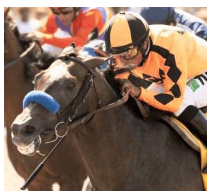

"At about the half-mile mark she was ready to run, but [the gate] had already taken too much out of her. You didn't get to see what she can do yet, but you will some day."

Second Chance Gives Volzes 'Dream' Win in Arc...

How much is a second chance worth? For the father-and-son team of Helmut and Heiko Volz, who race under the banner Gestut Burg Eberstein, about €3,991,000. That's the purse of last Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, minus the €9,000 the Germans

paid for the race's winner, the 3-year-old filly Danedream (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}).

It was in early June of 2010 when the Volzes received a call from BBA Germany's Dirk Eisele, who was attending the nearby Baden-Baden Spring Horses in Training Sale. The Volzes' primary bloodstock agent had scouted the breeze show, and

came away with a favorable impression of a medium-sized, nondescript Lomitas (GB) filly whom he thought would fit their budget: Danedream.

"For him, she had the best gallop at the breeze-up, and had nice action," remembered Heiko Volz, who with his father helps run the family's furniture store near Baden-Baden. "He said to us she was the best filly there. But the market was very, very weak at that sale. Nobody was interesting in buying horses."

That was true--the sale topper brought just €52,000. But Danedream attracted little attention, even by the sale's modest standards, and when she went through the ring for breeder Gestut Brummerhof as hip 119, she failed to reach her reserve.

"We had bid on her, but I think we stopped at €8,000 or €9,000, and originally she was a buy-back," said Heiko. "Afterward the trainer, Peter Schiergen, who was selling her for the breeder, called me and asked if we wanted to buy her. But even then we didn't do anything."

That could have been the end of the story for the Volzes and Danedream. But Schiergen made one last attempt a little while later, explaining that the breeder had another buyer lined up. The second time was the charm for the Volzes, who said they would buy her and leave her in Schiergen's care. "I spoke to the breeder, and we agreed to a price of €9,000," said

Heiko.

At that price, he admits expectations weren't especially high. "We don't look for a superstar; we look for normal horses we can run at the local tracks, and that's all," he explained. "And for that kind of horse, we didn't want to spend too much money, because if it does not work, you can sell it later in a claiming race and be okay. But when you spend €60,000 or €70,000 on a horse and it doesn't work out, then you lose a lot."

Helmut Volz has owned horses for 35 years, and the family has four or five mares in France and Germany, as well as four horses in training. Though they typically don't play in the sport's upper echelon, they've campaigned a number of listed winners and group runners, including German highweight Tryphosa (Ire) (Be My Guest), who in 1995 won the G2 German 1000 Guineas in 1995 and ran third in the G1 Prix de Diane. But original the original plan for Danedream didn't include anything that lofty.

"[Dirk Eisele] said she'd be able to run quickly, and would definitely be able to win a couple of races," said Heiko. "But how good she'd be, he did not know. That was his comment to us."

Danedream, who saw 13 horses bring more money at the Baden-Baden sale, may not have exploded onto the scene as a juvenile, but she quickly made clear she was well

worth the €9,000 investment.

After running third in maiden in Cologne about a month and a half after the auction, she shipped to Deauville and broke her maiden by a half-length. Not embarrassed when sixth, beaten 5 1/2 lengths, in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac-Criterium des Pouliches on the Arc card in early October 2010, she nonetheless hardly looked like a filly who would take the Arc itself in a year's time. Danedream then returned to Germany and concluded her season with a third in the G3 Preis der Winterkonigin at Baden-Baden in late October.

Danedream didn't blossom into an imposing specimen over the winter months, but she did improve greatly, and after a pair of tighteners in April and May in Italy this season, she enjoyed a breakout race in the G2 Italian Oaks at Milan May 29, romping clear by 6 1/2 lengths ([video](#)). The race opened Heiko Volz's eyes. "After than, I was quite sure she was something special," he said yesterday. "To win an Oaks or Guineas by six lengths, you have to be a nice horse. People say, 'Oh, it's Italy,' but in the end, the Italian horses are not bad."

Andreas Starke was aboard for the Oaks win, but it was Maxime Guyon who was partnered with Danedream in her next, the G2 Prix de Malleret at Saint-Cloud June 26, where Danedream had to settle for fifth despite being beaten just 1 1/4 lengths. "It was, tactically, probably not a very good race," said Heiko.

Despite the regression, Danedream's connections felt confident enough to enter her against older males in the 1 1/2-mile G1 Grosser Preis Von Berlin Deutschland Preis at Hoppegarten in Berlin, an important race won by the likes of Acatenango (Ger), Lando (Ger) and Danedream's own sire Lomitas. On firm ground, Danedream thrashed the competition, winning by five lengths over Germany's 2010 champion 3-year-old colt Scalo (Ger) (Lando {Ger}), and with the country's reigning champion older female Night Magic (Ger) (Sholokov {Ire}) in fourth ([video](#)).

"For us, it was a surprise she won so easily," admitted Heiko. "We thought we had a chance to get in the money, but for Germany, it was a very tough race, because the best older male and female horses were in the race. One was second, one was fourth, so we knew the performance must be good."

The victory garnered Danedream her first Group 1. It also set her owners to thinking. "I think the Arc was born in our minds after Berlin," Heiko said. "But we didn't tell anybody. Even the trainer. We talked about it, my father and I, in our office. But then when she won the way she did at Baden-Baden, we thought, 'Well, there's only one race to go to.'"

The Baden-Baden win, in the G1 Grosser Preis Von Baden ([video](#)), was a carbon copy of her previous victory, with the exception being the ground.

"It was very soft, and everybody was thinking she could only handle the good ground after Berlin, but then she won again easily," said Heiko.

Consecutive victories over older males did little to impress the betting public when Danedream made her return to Longchamp last Sunday, and even the Volzes were a little wary when they saw the competition.

"Danedream looks very normal," said Heiko. "You don't look at her and say, 'Wow, *that's* an Arc horse.' She looks like a horse. Before the race, we looked at her and everything was fine and she was calm. Then we saw So You Think (NZ)! He was 10cm bigger and looked like a bull."

But the filly belied her huge 26-1 price tag, defeating So You Think and 14 others and sailing home clear by five lengths in a track-record 2:24.49 for the 2400 meters ([video](#)).

"Early in the straight, I thought we'd at least get in the placings," said Heiko. "Then when she went in front 300 meters from the finish, and she kept on going, you think, 'If nothing bad happens now, she will *win* the race!' It's a feeling you will never forget in this life."

Starke, firmly established as her regular rider, is the first German jockey to win the Arc, and Danedream became just the second German-trained horse to win, after Star Appeal (Ire) in 1975.

Just three days before the Arc, it was announced that Japan's Teruya Yoshida had purchased a half-interest in Danedream, and that connection will likely influence where the superfilly appears next. The Volzes supplemented her to the Breeders' Cup in June with the GI Filly & Mare Turf in mind, but her Arc victory made that race something of an afterthought. With Yoshida on board, Danedream could start next in the G1 Japan Cup in December, or just be given the remainder of the year off.

"We'd only go to Japan if she's 100%," said Heiko. "She will stay in training next year. That is definitely the plan, if she is sound. Afterward, I think she may go to Japan to be a broodmare."

Whatever Danedream does or doesn't do in 2011, Heiko is just enjoying the journey his rags-to-riches filly has taken his family on. "When we buy horses, we are happy when we break even," he said. "When we bought her, that was all our intention was--nothing more."

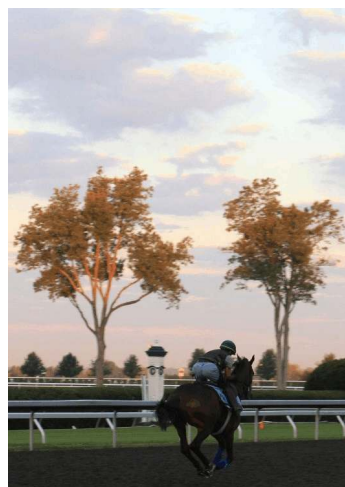
