OH MY! DROSSELMeyer FIRST IN CLASSIC

Twelve months ago, there were tears in Mike Smith's eyes after his desperate charge aboard Zenyatta (Ire) (Street Cry {Ire}) fell short in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The Hall of Fame reinsman was breathless last night after his relentless ride got **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor) up in time to deny the valiant **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) in the \$5-million finale. "The key to this horse is to keep him moving," said

Smith, who hadn't been in Drosselmeyer's irons since the pair won the 2010 GI Belmont S. "If you put on the brakes, it messes him up. I knew I was going to wheel out, so I just kept him going. And I was able to save ground on both turns." **Cont. p2-4**

NO ONE SAW THIS COMING

All eyes were on **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) in her bid for an unprecedented fourth victory in the GI TVG

Breeders' Cup Mile, but **Court Vision** (Gulch) had other ideas. Dismissed at 64-1, the 2010 GI Woodbine Mile hero dashed past the popular bay mare, then held off a strong surge from **Turallure** (Wando) to win by a whisker. "I was far back early, but I knew they were

going quick, and I figured that gave me a chance," said winning rider Robby Albarado. "[Trainer] Dale [Romans] told me to be sure to keep him running at the end." **Cont. p7-8**

HANSEN HOLDS OFF UNION RAGS

When they turned for home in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile, even-money **Union Rags** (Dixie Union) ranged up on the



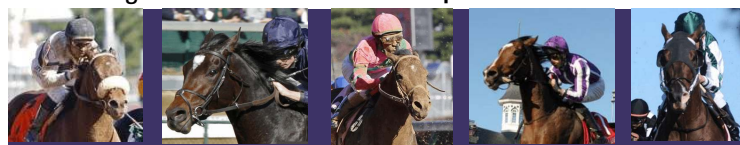

outside and looked to have pacesetter **Hansen** (Tapit) at his mercy. But the free-running grey had other ideas. He dug in gamely down the stretch and defied announcer Trevor Denman's conviction in Union Rags, flashing home a determined head in front. "We

pointed to the Breeders' Cup before he ever ran," said winning trainer Mike Maker. "I only told that to the owners, and they're as crazy as I am." **Cont. p5-6**

STARS GATHER AT FASIG-TIPTON

With the racing world still fired up over a fantastic two days of the Breeders' Cup World Championships, Fasig-Tipton aims to continue the momentum with its November Sale beginning this afternoon at 4 p.m. As usual, the event can claim perhaps the world's highest concentration of top-quality horseflesh over the span of just three or four hours. No fewer than 23 individual lots at the sale either produced a 2011 Breeders' Cup starter, were siblings of, or raced under the Twin Spires on Friday or Saturday themselves. "I'm fired up--I'm very excited," Fasig-Tipton President Boyd Browning Jr. said when asked about the 2011 book. "A consignor and I were talking the other day, and they talked about how busy it [has] been over the last 10 days. And I said, 'Hey, if you and are aren't fired up over [that], we need to go find something different to do.'" **Cont. p26**

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Keep 'Em Coming...

When the gates opened, leading Californian **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) assumed his usual spot on the front end, with **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) shadowing him through splits of :47.84 and 1:12.82. Overseas raider **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) was surprisingly close in the early stages, while Drosselmeyer was well behind. Uncle Mo never seemed to be traveling all that well, and Game on Dude was swamped with challengers as they entered the stretch. **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) loomed boldly for a few strides, but packed it in, and it was left to his less-fancied stablemate to deliver the best and final salvo. Drosselmeyer, who had been the subject of rave morning reviews, kept on coming and would not be denied by the ultra-game "Dude."

Lisa Troutt, wife of WinStar owner Kenny Troutt, was on hand to accept the Classic trophy. "Kenny has so believed in this horse the whole way through," she said. "When we went to the Belmont, and he couldn't make it there either. He was with our boys at a basketball tournament. He knew that morning. He said, 'This horse has a great chance,' and he pulled it off... But he has so believed in this horse, and he just has a way of pulling it out. So we are very thankful, but very sad that Kenny is not here for this one."

"He ran a super race," said trainer Bill Mott. "He was
mowing them down the last eighth of a mile. I guess
his biggest attribute is his stamina, and he showed it
today. When they were wearing down, he was coming.
It's great. Maybe they'll want to run him another year."
WinStar previously announced that the chestnut would
retire for 2012 to New York's Keane Stud as part of a
venture between the two operations.

Drosselmeyer, who completed a memorable Classic
bookend for WinStar Farm in the 2010 GI Belmont S.,
traded decisions with stablemate Birdrun (Birdstone) in
the One Count S. and GI Brooklyn H. at Belmont this
spring. A turf experiment went awry in the GI Sword
Dancer at Saratoga, and the 4-year-old rebounded with
a rallying second to Classic favorite Flat Out (Flatter) in
the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Oct. 1. "After
we ran him in the Sword Dancer, it was kind of like
somebody had flipped a switch, and he just turned
around," Mott added. "He was moving great--he was
into his training."

he donated \$30,000 to
Disabled Riders, and just for

that is pretty amazing. Thank

having piloted **Zenyatta** in
2009 and **Skip Away** in 1997.

SAY WHAT?

Trainer Bob Baffert, Game On Dude, 2nd:

"He ran a great race. Chantal came back clean; that's a great race. She should be proud of herself. That horse (Drosselmeyer) came down the middle. What a shame that we missed, but what a horse (Game On Dude is). He's run some big races. He just didn't see that horse."

Trainer Kelly Breen, Ruler On Ice, 3rd:

"I think he's a top-class 3-year-old. I don't know where this puts him with the others, but I have to say, after this race, because he was the only 3-year-old to hit the board, he'd certainly have to be under consideration [for the Eclipse Award]."

Trainer Larry Jones, Havre de Grace, 4th:

We didn't get the trip we wanted. The 11-horse [Headache] leaned on us pretty good from the start, but she ran well. Rick [Porter] likes to run where the gusto is. No regrets about running here. She didn't do anything to tarnish herself. She has another year ahead of her."

Trainer Scooter Dickey, Flat Out, 5th:

"No excuse, he just got outrun. That's it."

Jockey Ryan Moore, So You Think, 6th:

"I was closer than what I had planned to be, but he jumped well, and there's no point taking him back on this dirt. The pace was strong, but he stayed in sweetly behind them. He just ran out of petrol toward the end. It was his first run on the dirt, in the toughest race in North America. He ran a very creditable race."

Trainer Bill Mott, To Honor and Serve, 7th:

"He was a little rank on the first turn. He kind of threw his head in the air, but he finally settled. I'm sure next year he will be much better."

Jockey John Velazquez, Uncle Mo, 10th:

"You're always disappointed when they don't run as good as you expect them to. He was pretty strong going to the first turn. When he went up the back, the track started breaking underneath him a little bit and he kind of lost it. He was struggling with the track for whatever reason. I tried to give him his head where he would feel comfortable, but he never really got into a good rhythm to get a good grip of the track. I didn't want to beat him up in the stretch when everybody started going by me."

MMM BOP...HANSEN HANGS ON

Dr. Kendall Hansen and Sky Chai Racing Stable's **Hansen** (Tapit) looked like a potential star in two starts over the Turfway Polytrack, but went postward at longish odds in deference to even-money **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), whose New York appearances had garnered significant praise. But the Blue Grass state representative took command soon after the start and held on to the very last note. "He's a natural," said trainer Mike Maker, who was saddling his second Breeders' Cup winner, following Furthest Land's success in the 2009 Dirt Mile. "Obviously, his performance speaks for itself. That's the way he wants to run, and we weren't going to change a thing. It's just that natural ability. Obviously he's got a lot of speed, and he's always shown it."

PACHATTACK

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The word was out on Hansen when he debuted deep on a Friday night Sept. 9 at Turfway and he ran to those 4-5 odds, airing by 12 1/4 lengths in a 5 1/2-furlong test ([video](#)). Bet down to 1-2 while stretching out 15 days later in the Bluegrass Cat Kentucky Cup Juvenile, the nearly white youngster zoomed away impressively to score by 13 1/4 lengths ([video](#)). His Beyer Speed Figures of 80 and 89 suggested he fit with this company, but a pair of runaway wins on all-weather didn't draw enough attention. Cont. p6

Hansen broke well from post five and, with not much speed to his inside, jumped out and settled into an easy rhythm. Union Rags, on the other hand came out of the 10 hole and was unable to tuck in while racing in sixth. Hansen got his opening half in :47.39 and six furlongs in 1:12.24, with California star Creative Cause poised just behind him approaching the stretch. Union Rags ranged up four wide as they straightened for home and looked like he would go on to win, but began to drift out a bit, and was unable to get by the determined Hansen. "He ran superb for me," said winning rider Ramon Dominguez. "Going into the first turn, he was a little aggressive--that made me a little concerned. When we got to the backside, he switched to his right [lead], and he came back to me and relaxed beautifully."

Union Rags, stuck outside throughout, was valiant in defeat. "They were wide on the first turn, they were wide on the second turn," said trainer Michael Matz. "[Javier Castellano] said the other horse had it his own way, and [Union Rags] galloped out good and strong. What are you going to do? It's one of those things. I wish I had an answer for you. It's disappointing, that's for sure, but I guess that's horse racing."

Homebred for Hansen...

Dr. Kendall Hansen, who practices pain medicine and anesthesiology in Crestview Hills, Kentucky, claimed a Sir Cat filly named Stormy Sunday for \$5,000 out of her winning debut at Turfway Park in February 2005. The bay filly won twice more for her owner before heading to the breeding shed. Her first foal, the Tapit gelding Tapanna graduated for Hansen and Maker on the Kentucky Cup undercard. Hansen--the owner/breeder--reportedly sold Stormy Sunday privately, but bought her back shortly before Hansen--the horse--scored his second big win at Turfway. "She cost me \$10,000 and a watch--I had to give the man a watch to get her back," Hansen said after the Kentucky Cup. The mare has a yearling Corinthian colt. She did not have a foal this year, but was bred to Act of War. Sky Chai Racing's Harvey Diamond, David Koenig and Jim Shircliff acquired an interest in the colt after the Kentucky Cup. "We had a really nice 2-year-old that we bought in May, and Mike worked him with Hansen, and Hansen just blew him away, beat him by about 15 lengths," said Diamond. "We thought we had a really nice 2-year-old, and I said, 'Hey, I want to own that horse.' So we were very fortunate Kendall was receptive to our offer, and we feel very lucky to be sitting here today as part of this team."

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VISION QUEST

A year ago, **Court Vision** (Gulch) went postward at 13-1 in the GI TVG Breeders' Cup Mile while coming off a win in the GI Woodbine Mile and finished fifth, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by the great **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa). Purchased privately by Spendthrift Farm and turned over to trainer Dale Romans during the summer, the dark bay ran seventh to **Turallure** (Wando) at Woodbine Sept. 18, but belied his 64-1 odds with this determined effort. "I've been saying all week how good this horse was doing," said Romans, who also saddled Shackelford to a second-place finish in the GI Dirt Mile earlier on the card. "When I saw how easy he was running down the backside, I thought if they just back up a little, we've got a hell of a shot. It's just been an incredible year. All my best horses have been running well."

Goldikova, who caused a chain reaction of bumping when she shifted out to make her challenge, struck the front in midstretch, but couldn't sustain her usual dash. "I'm very proud of her," said trainer Freddy Head. "Today, she just got beat by a better horse." A claim of foul by Pat Valenzuela on Courageous Cat (Storm Cat) was disallowed. "I'm fine with her race," said regular rider Olivier Peslier. "No regrets. When we came on the turn [for home], there was no place to go. But she got through with good acceleration. I heard the other rider [Valenzuela] yell, but I was already past. She's been a wonderful mare to ride. I am very lucky. Right now [knowing it is her last race], I am full of emotion. I hope she does well, and that someday I will ride her baby."

Get Stormy (Stormy Atlantic) jumped away well and had the clear lead by the time he turned onto the backstretch, with Goldikova securing a great spot on the hedge just behind. Court Vision and Turallure were the back markers, but began to edge closer while traveling strongly on the outside. The favorite was looking for running room approaching the lane and angled out sharply, causing Courageous Cat (Storm Cat) to take up abruptly and the horses to her outside to go even further out. Though she went clear once she hit daylight, it was clear that her usual punch was lacking, and Court Vision and Turallure came storming by in the final 100 yards. **Cont. p8**

Court Vision began his career for WinStar Farm and trainer Bill Mott, winning the GII Remsen S. and GIII Iroquois S. in 2007. IEAH Stables acquired a major interest in the dark bay at the beginning of his sophomore season, and the colt completed the trifecta in both the GII Fountain of Youth S. and GI Wood Memorial S. However, he improved his form when switched to the turf, defeating Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the GII Jamaica H. at Belmont before capping 2008 with a win in the GI Hollywood Derby. Following an indifferent start in 2009, he was turned over to trainer Rick Dutrow Jr., who saddled him to victory in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland and a close fourth in Goldikova's second BC Mile score at Santa Anita. Court Vision was put up to first in the 2010 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H., then endured some tough beats before getting back on top in the \$1-million GI Woodbine Mile. He was unplaced in his first three appearances this season, and was moved to Romans following a fourth in the Colonial Turf Cup June 18. "When I worked him last week, I told the guys, 'This is the best he's done since I've been getting on him for two years now,'" said rider Robby Albarado. "I attribute that to Dale giving him that undivided attention and treating him like the great run horse he is."

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ALL IN THE FAMILY IN THE TURF

For the sixth time in the last seven years and for the 11th time in the last 13, the GI Breeders' Cup Turf has gone to Europe after **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) did what his sire could not, taking the 12-furlong event from fellow European raider **Sea Moon (GB)** (Beat Hollow). It was the third winner saddled by trainer Aidan O'Brien, but this one carried some added significance, as he gave his 18-year-old son Joseph a leg up on the 4-year-old.

"This is very special. Unbelievable," said O'Brien, whose had his fair share of big moments in the game, but perhaps none of this

magnitude. "It was a wonderful race. He is an amazing rider. It's been a great day. It's been a great day. Thank you very much." At 18 years and five months, the junior O'Brien became the youngest to ever win a Breeders' Cup event, surpassing Fernando Jara, who was two months shy of his 19th birthday when he won the 2006 Classic aboard Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes).

An Auspicious Start, A Bump in the Road...

St Nicholas Abbey put together an unblemished 2-year-old campaign in 2009, with wins in the G2 Beresford S. and in the G1 Racing Post Trophy, but faced the starter just one time in 2010 for a sixth-place finish in the G1 2000 Guineas last May. A first-up third at The Curragh this past April, the bay rediscovered his best form with a nine-length score in Chester's G3 Ormonde S. May 6 ahead of a one-length defeat of **Midday (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) in the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom June 3. Third in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot July 23, he filled the same spot behind **Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse to Bend {Ire}) in the G2 Prix Foy Sept. 11 and a respectable fifth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, where he led three furlongs out. Though no winners of the Longchamp fixture have gone on to double up in the Turf, no fewer than seven Arc also-rans had succeeded on Breeders' Cup Saturday.

Smooth Sailing...

Dean's Kitten (Kitten's Joy) won the break, but was headed off by St Nicholas Abbey's stablemate **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway), who took the field past the stands for the first time as the eventual winner settled on the rails in midpack. Brilliant Speed did it the toughest, racing three wide, while favored Sarafina was a bit tough to handle, but gradually settled for Christophe Lemaire. By the time they'd reached the

backstretch for the final time, St Nicholas Abbey had been guided off the inside and raced between rivals and remained in a pocket, set to pounce, as the field rounded the final bend. Sea Moon was getting underway and actually got first run on St Nicholas Abbey, but the latter was doing the better work and, once steered off the heels of Sea Moon, accelerated smartly and went on to the easy victory. Brilliant Speed, who came to the final 3/16ths of a mile with a clear advantage, boxed on well and finished third in an effort sure to give connections much to

look forward to in 2012.

"We had a nice pace and he picked up where it mattered," Joseph O'Brien explained. "It wasn't a mad pace, and he was comfortable and relaxed great. Obviously today it's an easier track for him [than Longchamp]. I think he was a little better going left-handed here than right-handed in the Arc. The Arc was a rough race, and sometimes the best horse doesn't always win. He traveled well today and looked great and picked up great."

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MONSTER PERFORMANCE IN SPRINT

California-based horses have fared well in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint when the race has been contested at Churchill Downs, with Kona Gold striking for the Golden State in 2000 and Thor's Echo back in 2006. **Amazombie** (Northern Afleet), who was basically

given away in a package deal (for additional background about the acquisition of Amazombie, click [here](#)), has been consistent as the Churchill stretch is long, but lacked the sexy credentials of GI Forego S. hero

Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil) and **Big Drama**

(Montbrook), who was back looking to become just the second two-time winner of the Sprint. Sent off at odds of 7-1, the California-bred settled in midpack into and around the far turn. He charged through between the tiring pair of Big Drama and GI Vosburgh S. victor **Giant Ryan** (Freud) and outraced **Force Freeze** (Forest Camp) to the wire to give Mike Smith his 14th win in a Breeders' Cup race, but just his second in the Sprint (Cherokee Run, Churchill, 1994).

Never Misses a Beat...

Amazombie belied odds of 11-1 to defeat Apriority (Grand Slam) in the Sunshine Millions Sprint and, two starts later, earned his first graded-stakes success in the GII Potrero Grande S. at Santa Anita Apr. 3. He added a popular win in the Tiznow S. on California Gold Rush Day, but was controversially disqualified from the win in the May 30 GIII Los Angeles H. and placed third. Only third as the 3-2 favorite to Smiling Tiger (Hold That Tiger) in the GI Triple Bend S. July 2 at Hollypark, he couldn't get to loose-on-the-lead **Euroears** (Langfuhr) in the GI Bing Crosby S. at Del Mar July 31 and rounded out the triple yet again. Push came to shove for Amazombie in the GI Ancient Title S. at Santa Anita Oct. 8. A win translated to an all-expenses paid trip to Churchill; a loss would have equaled a berth on Cal Cup Day. His 3/4-length win earned him a crack at the big one, and he'd take full advantage.

Little Margin for Error....

The fate of Euroears hinged greatly on just how well he left from the inside stall. He broke a half-step slow, but was rushed up inside to contest the pace, with Giant Ryan, Force Freeze and Big Drama stacked up to his outside. Amazombie raced in splendid isolation smack dab in centerfield, while favored Jackson Bend would do his running

from the tail. They raced four abreast through an opening quarter in :21.12, and Force Freeze slid to the front under little encouragement from John Velazquez with about three-eighths of a mile to come. He was under a hold as he

turned for home and was traveling ominously well, but by now, Amazombie was finding his best stride four wide into the stretch. He joined Force Freeze for the final furlong and looked on his way to a clear-cut victory, but had to dig for every single yard, as the eventual runner-up was gaining inches back at the wire.

"When I got on him in the paddock, he took a big, deep breath and was cool, calm and collected," Smith explained. "I think he actually out-broke the field, but then he settled. I cut the corner with him and then got out. The thing I worry about with this horse is hitting the front too soon; he tends to wait [on horses]." And for Spawr, a perennial leading claiming trainer in Southern California, the view from the top is just fine. "I feel very fortunate and very lucky," he commented. "There are no words to describe the feeling."

No Disgrace in Finishing Second...

For the connections of Force Freeze, yesterday's performance was gratifying. "The owners are happy, and hopefully we can come back [to the Breeders' Cup] next year," said trainer Peter Walder. "He's just an unbelievable horse. He inherited the lead too early. The speed stopped in front of him and he took the lead under a hold. I was just worried he got it too soon. But I'm happy. With the way he ran, you've got to be ecstatic." Force Freeze began his career in Florida, with three wins from five starts before being sold to race in Dubai. A three-time winner and Group 3-placed in the desert for trainer Doug Watson, the dark bay won Monmouth's Teddy Drone S. and was runner-up in the Vosburgh prior to yesterday's effort.

Roll of the Dice Doesn't Pan Out...

The humans surrounding Jackson Bend were faced with something of a dilemma. Off a career-best 112 Beyer when second to Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) in the GII Kelso H. Oct. 1, it would have been easy to enter the 4-year-old in the Dirt Mile. Instead, a decision was made to try the Sprint at a distance they feared might be too sharp. "He ran great," trainer Nick Zito offered. "I think we just ran out of real estate. It was for all the marbles [Eclipse Award for champion sprinter], so that's why we took the shot. I see the fans like him too, and the handicappers made him 5-2." And jockey Corey Nakatani, having an outstanding Breeders' Cup, wasn't immediately ready to concede that the six furlongs weren't a good fit. "That remains to be seen [if six furlongs is too short for this horse]," he stated. "That's hindsight, you know. He's such a nice horse with a big heart. He deserves to be champion sprinter. The track is a little faster. The horses that were one-two stayed one-two. [Jackson Bend] is the only one who made up any ground. Our trip couldn't have been any better. We lost a little bit of ground, but I put him where I thought was the best part of the racetrack. He ran really big. I think running against Uncle Mo last time might have taken a little starch out of him. He seemed to have a little more energy last time."

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CALL YOUR POSSE

Don McNeill and Cheyenne Stables's **Caleb's Posse** (Posse) turned in one of the most visually impressive performances of the Championship weekend, charging down the center of the Churchill Downs stretch to post an authoritative victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. Settled nicely in eighth as **The Factor** (War Front) and **Shackleford** (Forestry) kept the pace honest through fractions of :22.49 and :45.36, the sophomore still had plenty to do at the head of affairs, but exploded when it mattered most to blow past the game GI Preakness S. hero. "If my chest could swell any bigger, it probably wouldn't fit here," trainer Donnie Von Hemel commented. "I'm so proud of him, he's such a neat little horse, and he comes to run on those one-turn races, man." Caleb's Posse, hero of the two-turn GIII Ohio Derby in June, has elevated his game since focusing his attention to sprints. The bay earned a career high 105 Beyer when scoring in the GII Amsterdam S. at Saratoga Aug. 1, then spoiled champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie)'s return with a game victory in the GI King's Bishop S. Aug. 27. He prepped for the Dirt Mile with a disappointing third in the GII Indiana Derby Oct. 1. "You guys will have to decide, but I think you can probably make a case for champion sprinter this year," Von Hemel continued. "I look at this one-turn mile as a sprint. He's got three great wins this year sprinting, in my opinion." Jockey Rajiv Maragh is a perfect three-for-three aboard Caleb's Posse. "When it came time for him, he fired really big," Maragh said. "We've had luck taking this horse back and making one late run with him."

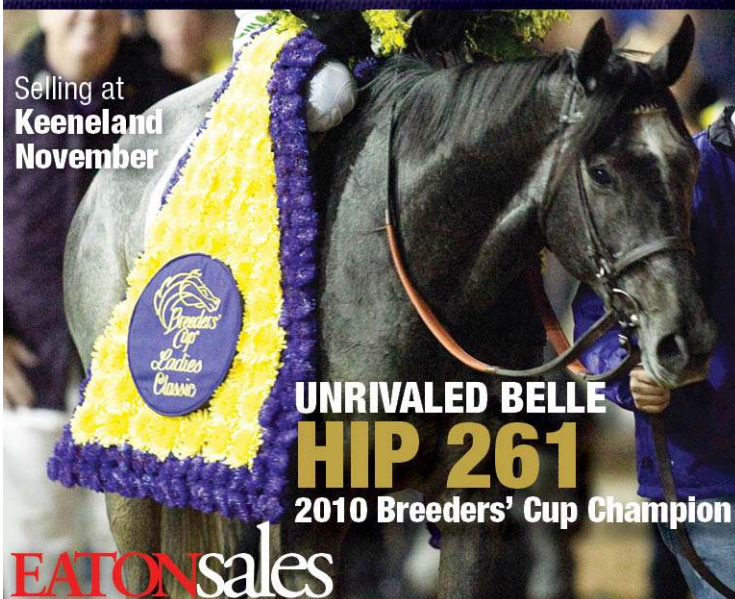

I don't know if it cost him a placing, but we're proud of his effort." **Trappe Shot** (Tapit), co-favored at 5-2, never threatened while a well-beaten fourth. He got checked a little bit going into the turn, but he just flattened out the last part. The winner was very impressive."

Why did he choose Caleb's Posse?

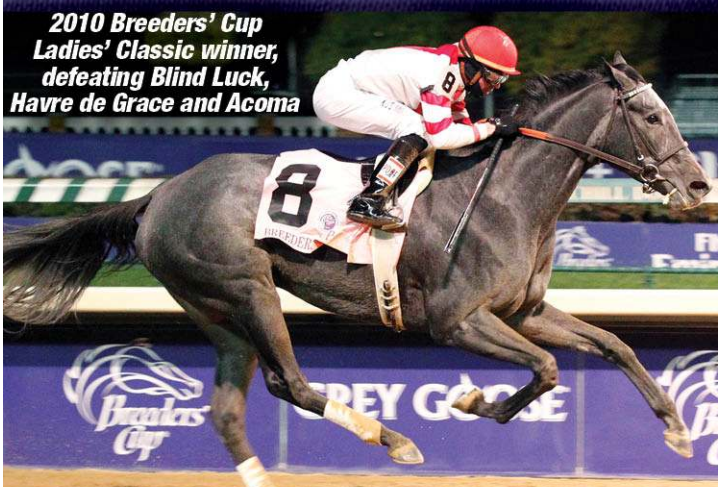

"Rob said we had to have this horse," Magnier recalled yesterday, also giving credit to the Coolmore team for picking the youngster out. "Luckily we ended up buying him thanks to Rob and Eddie and Paul and the lot. So just lucky."

Wrote campaigns in the name of the Mangier/Tabor/Smith axis, and Derrick Smith admitted the victory was sweeter when celebrated with friends. "The three of us have been friends for a long time and have the horses together," Smith said. "When you win, it's great to have people to share it with. And it's also great to have them around when it doesn't go so well. It's a great relationship we have. We're just lucky to be here and lucky to have such good horses."

Finale Falters as Favorite

Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith were also represented in the Juvenile Turf by favored **Finale** (Scat Daddy). Unbeaten in three starts on the turf, including a 10 1/2-length romp in Monmouth's Continental Mile and a 3/4-length triumph in the Sept. 17 GIII Summer S., the dark bay colt was sent off the tepid 4-1 crowd's choice. Breaking from the outside, Finale was floated wide on the turn and was bumped and jostled in traffic before coming home seventh. "The post [12] kind of hurt him," admitted Finale's jockey John Velazquez. "I tried to find a place to tuck in going to the first turn, but it was too crowded and he wanted to run. We were five wide into the turn and we probably lost the race right there."

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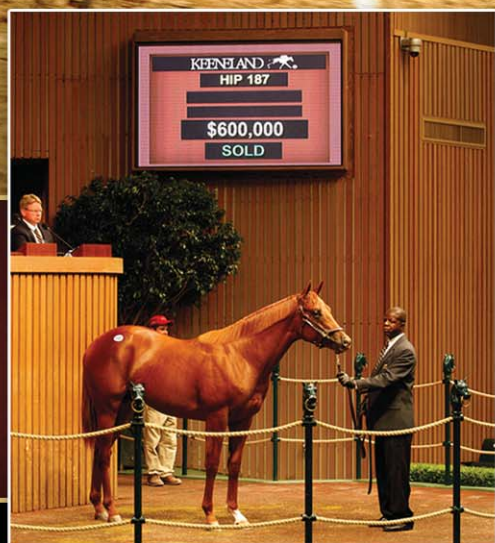
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COMEBACK KING

Vinery Stables' **Regally Ready** (More Than Ready) stamped himself as the early favorite for this race when stringing together four impressive victories in the late winter and spring, but after a pair of losses in August and September, it appeared the chestnut had tailed off a bit. He regained his early season form, however, when taking the GI Nearctic S. up at Woodbine Oct. 16, and completed his return to the North American turf sprint throne with a comfortable 1 1/2-length pace-attending success in the GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. **Country Day** (Speightstown), a 33-1 outsider was second, while **Perfect Officer** (Officer) rounded out the trifecta. Defending champ **Chamberlain Bridge** (War Chant) could not overcome his far-outside post, checking in eighth, while well-regarded **Havelock** (Great Notion) was forced to check out on the turn by Hoofit (NZ) (Mossman {Aus}) and reported home last.

Regally Ready spent most of the early part of his career last year with Steve Asmussen's string up at Woodbine, posting two open-length victories over the Polytrack, but never competing in stakes company. He came southward to run in a second-level allowance over this course and distance last November, and clearly relished the trip, romping by 7 3/4 lengths. Joining many of Asmussen's first stringers out west at Santa Anita over the winter, the bay was a close-up third down the hill in the GIII Daytona S. Jan. 1--that was the last time he'd lose for a while. After dropping back down to annex an allowance race in February, Regally Ready earned his first black-type victory in the Joe Hernandez S. Mar. 18 before getting a graded win by a nose from **Camp Victory** (Forest Camp) in the Apr. 16 GIII San Simeon H. He returned to this same trip on Kentucky Derby Day May 7, and again made a trip into the winner's circle for a 1 1/2-length defeat of Bridgetown (Speightstown) in the GIII GIII Twin Spires Turf Sprint. He earned a gaudy 105 Beyer Speed Figure for that one. Off until the Aug. 6 My Frenchman S. at Monmouth, Regally Ready was a close-up third, but had no apparent excuse when 10th as the favorite in the GIII Turf Monster H. at Parx Sept. 5.

"What you don't know if you don't know the horse, he needs a race or two to get going," Vinery president Tom Ludt said of Regally Ready's brief cold spell. "I was upset after the Monmouth race. [Steve] said, 'relax, after a couple of races this horse will be back.'" He was, annexing the only Grade I race for turf sprinters in North America by a neck over European invader Bated Breath (GB) (Dansili {GB}), and regaining the support of the bettors for this. Dueling inside of longshot filly **Rapport** (Songandaprayer) through splits of :22.45 and :44.81, Regally Ready hugged the hedge as they turned for home. He strode out handily and no worse for the wear of his earlier exertions, and was never seriously threatened in the waning stages. "We got away in good shape and had a perfect trip," said pilot Corey Nakatani. "He was composed and focused. When he started pulling away down the stretch it just showed how good a horse he is." Tom Simon, owner of Vinery, who bred Regally Ready and stands his sire, added, "More Than Ready was one of, I think, the first stallions [I purchased] after I purchased the farm. I would say half of it is just luck...It's special winning a Breeders' Cup race, but having your homebred, by your own stallion, it's really very special."



RIGHT ON TIME

Time, goes the old saying, only matters in jail. But as the relatively fast early fractions flashed up on board during yesterday's GII Marathon, time was on the side of a deep closer, and it was rank outsider **Afleet Again** who picked up the pieces with a determined late run. It was the first Breeders' Cup win for Robert "Butch" Reid, Jr. and the 4-year-old's owner, Kasey K Racing Stable. Said Reid, "He ran fabulously. It's so rare to get this kind of distance, so we decided to take a shot. We always thought he could go this far. There's no limit to how far he can run. He's kind of the ultimate plodder, is what you'd call him."

While there was nothing to compare to last year's post-race fireworks, the race didn't go off without incident. Favored **A.U. Miner** (Mineshaft) fractured sesamoids in his left front ankle and was vanned off the track, while the European filly **Meeznah** (Dynaformer) seemed to not handle the dirt and was eased due to fatigue. A.U. Miner was transported to Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington and is scheduled to have surgery Monday or Tuesday.

Early Promise...

Afleet Again showed he was a horse with some talent when winning the GIII Withers S. back in April of 2010, but he never really took the necessary step forward, placing in the GIII Pegasus S. and then missing the board in the GI Haskell Invitational and GI Travers S. before concluding his campaign with a fifth in the GII Pennsylvania Derby in September. Connections made the decision to aim the nearly white colt toward the long-distance races this season, but he could do no better than fifth in both the 1 1/4-mile One Count S. at Belmont May 15 and 1 1/2-mile GII Brooklyn H. He showed signs of life with a third in the 1/2-mile Greenwood Cup at Parx in July. A regressing 10th when tried on the sod in the restricted John's Call S. at Saratoga Aug. 5, he finished fourth in a smart main-track allowance won by To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) at the Spa Aug. 26, then returned to the green to finish sixth in the nine-furlong PTHA President's Cup S. at Parx Sept. 17. Shortened to 1 1/16 miles in a Monmouth optional claimer Oct. 9, Afleet Again closed to be second, and was easily the longest shot on the Churchill tote here at 40-1 odds.

Biding His Time...

The race began with an eager **Pleasant Prince** (Indy King) jumping out to lead the way as Birdrun pressed from the inside. Together, they clicked off :23.47 and :48.05 splits, sensible for nine furlongs but testing at 14. Afleet Again cabooseed the main body of the field as they raced in compact form, with **Brigantin** (Cozzene) and A.U. Miner another six or seven lengths back. **Baryshnikov** (Empire Maker) moved to challenge Pleasant Price on the backstretch, with Birdrun tucking back in fourth, and into the far turn, the tracking Cease made a strong move to lead at the quarter pole. He was able to only sustain that bid for another furlong, however, before Afleet Alex, moving widest, swooped to win going away. Birdrun ran a big race to hold for second over Giant Oak.

"This horse is a real Jekyll and Hyde," said trainer Butch Reid. "Sometimes he shows up and sometimes he doesn't really. I saw the fractions they were going, :48 in the first half, and he was only six or seven lengths out. I thought we were in pretty good shape."

Worth the Price of Admission...

Starting a horse in the Breeders' Cup isn't an insignificant financial burden, but owner Bob Krangel was confident Afleet Again would, at very least, put his best hoof forward in the 1 3/4-mile Marathon. "In the Philadelphia race [Greenwood Cup], where he ran a mile and a half, [he] lost second by a neck to Birdrun. A couple of steps to the wire, we were past him. And [with] the extra quarter mile, it seemed like a logical thing to do. A.U. Miner won the race, but we thought [Afleet Again] ran a good race. The extra quarter mile, we thought, played to our advantage."

Bill Mott, who trains runner-up Birdrun, was philosophical in defeat. "He ran well. He tried hard," said Mott. "Funny enough, the horse that won it, we'd been beating him all year long, every time. Hey, it was his turn today. I'm glad for those people; he's been chasing us around there all year long." Giant Oak's trainer Chris Block didn't offer any excuses for his charge, either. "I thought he got a good trip. [Jockey] Shaun [Bridgmohan] did a good job getting him settled in there. He was a little keener than you'd want going a mile and three quarters, but that's going to happen with a horse coming off a mile-and-a-quarter and a mile-and-an-eighth race. Shaun did a real good job getting him settled. We took our shot at the head of the stretch. The horse ran hard, he just ran out of gas the last sixteenth."



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Casner Hosts Classic Winners Post-Race...

Following a victory in a Breeders' Cup event, those affiliated with the winning horses were treated to post-race hospitality by members of the Breeders' Cup in a special balcony area overlooking the Churchill paddock. Breeders' Cup member Bill Casner, a long-time associate and friend of Kenny Trout and a partner in WinStar Farm until October 2010, chose to host the winning connections of the Classic, and, ironically, it was the team that gave Casner wins in such prestigious events such as the G1 Dubai World Cup, the G1 Kentucky Derby and G1 Belmont S. that joined him for a champagne toast and petit fours. Casner was humbled and moved by the opportunity to host people so dear to him. "I was absolutely thrilled to be able to do that, and I chose the Classic to be a part of the celebration," he said. "It was absolutely a wonderful experience. The Breeders' Cup has really elevated their whole program, and we are trying to create an outstanding experience for owners. It's something we're trying really hard to do." He continued, "Kenny and I have been friends for, let's see, 38 years now. We were brought together by a common interest--racing. We met at Ak-Sar-Ben and we were both 25 years old, and it's just a thrilling to be able to share these moments with someone you've known for so long. It's something very, very special."

Attendance, Handle Second-Largest in History...

Two-day attendance for the 2011 Breeders' Cup championships was 105,280, 7% lower than last year's record-setting total of 114,353, which was bolstered in part by Zenyatta's attempt to close out an undefeated career. The two-day common-pool total was \$155,525,947, a decrease of 4.9% from 2010, while the Saturday common pool handle (12 races) was \$105,472,442, a decrease of 4.5% from the corresponding figure last year (11 races). For the Breeders' Cup races only, the two-day common-pool handle was \$140,070,365, a decrease of 5.1% percent from what was bet last year. On-track handle at Churchill Downs for the two days was \$21,475,916, down 4.9% from the 2010 figure of \$22,586,311. Saturday's on-track handle was \$13,710,734, off 4.8 percent from \$14,405,874 wagered on-site in 2010.

The 3-year-old will be vanned over to Keeneland and will sell as part of the Palides Investments dispersal Tuesday. "It's always tough to lose one like her," said trainer Bill Mott. "We'd love to have her, but I guess that's up to whoever buys her. I'd love to have her back. She's been a really good one."
- Unbeaten GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine **My Miss Aurelia** (Smart Strike) will winter in the Los Angeles area. "She came [out of the race] absolutely super," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "She'll go to California Dec. 1 with the Stonestreet horses."

- Owner/breeder/trainer C.R. Trout said that his Grade I winner **Shotgun Gulch** (Thunder Gulch) tied up prior to being a late scratch from Friday's GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint, but was doing well the next day. "She tied up, and I'm not sure why," Trout said. "She's never done that before, but galloped fine this morning. We'll get her back to Oklahoma and give her some time off. I'll have to see if I race her again or breed her. She's been really good to me." A winner of seven of 21 starts, Shotgun Gulch captured the GI Vinery Madison S., and finished 3/4 of a length behind eventual F/M Sprint winner Musical Romance (Concorde's Tune) in the GII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. Sept. 10. She has earned \$528,976.

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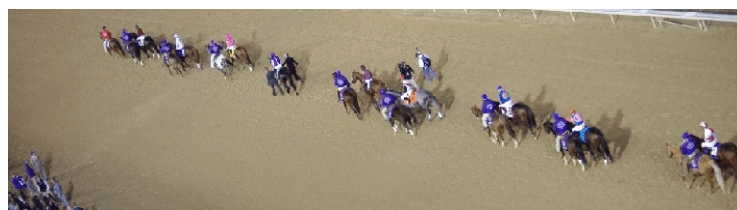

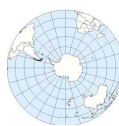

Trainer Peter Moody warned that world champion Black Caviar would be at her very best on the six-furlong straight course at Flemington. Suffice to say he was spot on in that assessment, as the 5-year-old ran her record to a perfect 16 wins from as many starts, taking the G1 Patinack Farm Classic for the second year in a row. Away without incident, Black Caviar raced off the inside and chased from second early on. She came calling for the lead under no encouragement whatsoever at the 400-meter mark and the cheers began soon after, as she strode confidently past the clock tower and scored with condescending ease. "It's great that she has been able to put on a show for the big crowd that has come out to witness her today," winning trainer Peter Moody said. "She can only race what's there and they were all good horses behind her, but, once again, she has toyed with them." Moody indicated that Black Caviar could travel to Perth for the G1 Winterbottom S. over 1200 meters Nov. 19. She is set to get a rest thereafter and will resurface in the New Year, with the Royal Ascot meeting next summer the ultimate goal.

At least three horses selling at the sale hit the board--or had produce that hit the board--at the Breeders' Cup, including GI Ladies' Classic third **Pachattack** (Pulpit) ([hip 6](#)); Starinthemeadow (Meadowlake), dam of GI Juvenile Fillies third **Weemissfrankie** (Sunriver) ([hip 29](#)); and the GI F/M Sprint third **Her Smile** (Include) ([hip 114](#)). Further, GI Jockey Club hero and Breeders' Cup Classic fifth Flat Out (Flatter)'s 3/4-sister Lil Indy (Anasheed) sells as [hip 124](#).

"It's an honor, truthfully, to have people give us the opportunity to sell some horses like we've got in November," said Browning. "That's the most gratifying thing about what we do. It sounds like I'm patronizing, but it's really an honor to sell the very best of what they have--a filly or mare that's maybe been the best they've ever had. That's pretty neat stuff, and it gets us revved up."

Fasig-Tipton continues to use new marketing tools to push their November horses. In addition to the usual high-gloss catalogue page with photos, each horse now has its own interactive online catalogue page on Fasig's site. And the curious little square at the bottom of each catalogue page? It's a QR code--scan with your smart device and it brings you to the horse's online page.

Browning said there are a few reasons Fasig embraces these moves. "It demonstrates to the people who are selling with us that we're trying to be innovative and creative when selling their horses," he said. "And hopefully it appeals to the buyers--and not all of them, maybe 5 or 10% will appreciate it--but if it sparks one person to bid on a horse, or bid an extra time--we've done our job. We're just trying to deliver more and better information."

Last year's November Sale was topped by GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course), who sold to Frank Stronach's Adena Springs for \$2.3 million. Despite nine horses bringing seven figures in 2010, the average for the event--\$314,567--was down 12.9%, while the median of \$130,000 was down 23.5%. 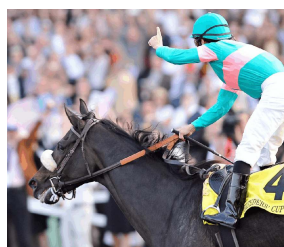

Having more than justified his early ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ tag down the years, Godolphin's admirable flagbearer proved he is still capable of mixing it up with the best this term. After finishing 7 1/2 lengths behind Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the July 27 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, the stalwart was runner-up in Longchamp's G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp for the second consecutive year Sept. 11. He was probably facing a tough task attempting to defy weight-for-age against Excelebration (Ire) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) on that occasion and put up his usual solid effort when subsequently second to arch-rival Rajsaman (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) in that track's G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein Oct. 2. "I was pleased with Rio de la Plata on his latest start, and he looks to be in good form at the moment," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He is a very tough horse, who always tries his hardest in his races and he won this contest last year, so the step back up to a mile and a quarter will be no problem. He heads to Italy in good heart and he has the class to run another big race." Successful here in 2009, **Voila Ici** was 2 1/2 lengths in arrears of Rio de la Plata 12 months ago and has held his form this season with a second in the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica over this track and trip May 15 and a win in the June 12 G1 Gran Premio di Milano over 12 furlongs of the San Siro circuit. Former Steward Anderson Dies:

Joseph L. Anderson, a former state steward at Monmouth Park, passed away at his home in Miami, Florida Oct. 30, at age 91. Born in 1919 in Washington, DC, Anderson developed his life-long love of horses working as a groom in his native city. At age 16, he headed for Kentucky, where he became an exercise rider and broke yearlings. He rode in six races as a jockey before being drafted into the Army during World War II. Following the War, Anderson returned to Kentucky where he began a career as a trainer, owner and breeder. Notable runners conditioned by Anderson include Guy, Junaluska and Wedlock, with whom he captured the 1947 Kentucky Oaks. Throughout the years, Anderson worked in many capacities at various racetracks, including horse identifier, paddock judge, placing judge and eventually steward, which earned him the nickname "Judge Anderson." When he retired in 1998, Anderson was the oldest working steward in America. Married for 66 years, Anderson is survived by his wife Evelyn; daughter Ginger Tatum; granddaughter Maryann Tobin and her husband Nathaniel of Miami, Florida; sister-in-law Madeleine Anderson of Silver Spring, Maryland.; sister-in-law Ann Tatum and her husband Bob of Birmingham, Ala.; and, 12 nieces and nephews. 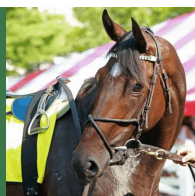
