



DERBY MEISTER?

Today's 138th running of the GI Kentucky Derby promises to be a fascinating renewal. For months, the discussion centered around the progression of last year's leading juveniles--**Hansen** (Tapit), **Union Rags** (Dixie Union), **Creative Cause** (Giant's Causeway) and **Gemologist** (Tiznow)--but when **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) stormed home in the GI Arkansas Derby, the chatter changed to whether a colt unraced at two could overcome the drought since Apollo in 1882. Though the **TDN**

Rising Star lacks experience, his connections certainly don't. Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert has saddled three Kentucky Derby winners and will give a leg up to Hall of Fame rider Mike Smith, who brought longshot Giacomo (Holy Bull) home in 2005. Zayat Stables has come agonizingly close in the "Run for the Roses," with two runners-up since 2009. "I've brought some really good horses here, and they were the best horse, but they got beat," said Baffert. "I don't want to get myself too pumped up. Even my son, Bode, doesn't want to talk about it." **Cont. p5**

FROM MYTH TO REALITY

Those associated with **Camelot** (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) have found it hard to contain their enthusiasm for the unbeaten colt, but today's G1 QIPCO 2000 Guineas offers the first true test of his powers as the prospect of a first Triple Crown winner since Nijinsky becomes more realistic. Having flaunted his raw ability with a cruise at Doncaster in the G1 Racing Post Trophy in October, Derrick Smith's colorbearer enters the latest edition of Newmarket's

Classic with a weight of expectation to bear. Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who is looking for a sixth renewal since 1998, has been keen to stress that Camelot has not been pushed at home in an effort to avoid a similar scenario to that faced by the stable's Guineas flop St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) two years ago. "If the horse wasn't going to be ready for the Guineas, we didn't want to be forcing him, so we were letting him tell us really," the Ballydoyle conditioner explained. "He's been coming along nicely and everything has gone smoothly so far--we're using this as a start-off race." **Cont. p7**

LILIES FOR ROSIE AND BELIEVE YOU CAN

Owner/breeder Brereton Jones, trainer Larry Jones and rider Rosie Napravnik missed out on having a G I Kentucky Derby entrant when Mark Valeski (Proud Citizen) was taken out of consideration earlier this week, but they instead teamed up to annex the \$1-million GI Kentucky Oaks with a daughter of the same Airdrie

stallion. Napravnik and **Believe You Can** outslugged a game **Broadway's Alibi** (Vindication) the length of the stretch and took home the trophy. "It's unbelievable," said Napravnik. "I'm just so happy and so grateful to be here. There's a lot of people that are a big part of me getting to this and winning this race, and I just can't thank everybody enough." Napravnik rode St. John's River (Include) to a runner-up finish in the Oaks 12 months ago. "Last year was kind of a tease, I was so close but not there," Napravnik added. "This year I was determined to be the one in the winner's circle, and I had the right horse to do it."

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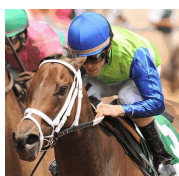
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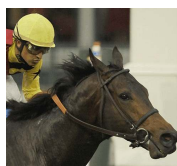

Believe You Can broke alertly and settled nicely in second beneath regular rider Rosie Napravnik. Keeping plenty of pressure on Broadway's Alibi from the outside through fractions of :23.12 and :47.47, the Brereton C. Jones homebred reached even terms on the turn for home while Napravnik remained motionless. She began to go right-handed in the stretch and,

following a prolonged battle, Believe You Can edged clear late for a hard-fought victory.

The winner signaled her readiness with a bullet five-eighths in :58 2/5 last Sunday.

"This filly gave us that 'wow' factor," said winning trainer Larry Jones. "When we blew her out the other day, we knew this filly was going to give us her performance, and we feel like you need that 'wow' coming here, because you're facing top horses, and we just got another 'wow' this afternoon." 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Rise Through the Ranks...

Believe You Can was a modest fourth when unveiled at Monmouth June 26, but donned cap and gown next time at Delaware July 12. She drew off by 4 1/4 lengths in an optional claimer at that track Aug. 16 and continued her progression by annexing the Gill Tempted S. at Belmont Oct. 2. In her first trip to Churchill Downs, the bay filly was a non-threatening sixth behind On Fire Baby (Smoke Glacken) in the Gill Pocahontas S. Oct. 30. Sent to Fair Grounds for the winter, Believe You Can was introduced to Rosie Napravnik, and the two wired the Silverbulletday S. Jan. 21, holding Summer Applause (Harlan's Holiday) at bay. Believe You Can never saw the lead next out in the Gill Rachel Alexandra S. Feb. 25 and wound up fourth to Summer Applause, but turned the tables on that filly with a game effort in the Gill Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 31.

All in the Family...

Believe You Can is the second Kentucky Oaks heroine campaigned by the Joneses following champion Proud Spell (Proud Citizen), who took home the lilies in 2008 during her Eclipse Award-winning campaign. Brereton Jones privately acquired Believe You Can's second dam Taegu (Halo) in 1999. Her first foal was El Fasto, who never made it to the races due to a fractured pelvis, but her next one was Classic Elegance (Carson City), a \$650,000 KEESEP yearling who went on to become a multiple graded stakes winner. Taegu was offered in foal to A.P. Indy at KEENOV in 2006, but RNA'd for \$975,000 before being sold privately to Mt. Brilliant Farm. El Fasto has a 2-year-old Stevie Wonderboy colt named Smoky Four. She produced an Istan filly last May 20 and was bred back to Canadian Frontier. ([Click here](#) for a Jan. 25 TDN feature).

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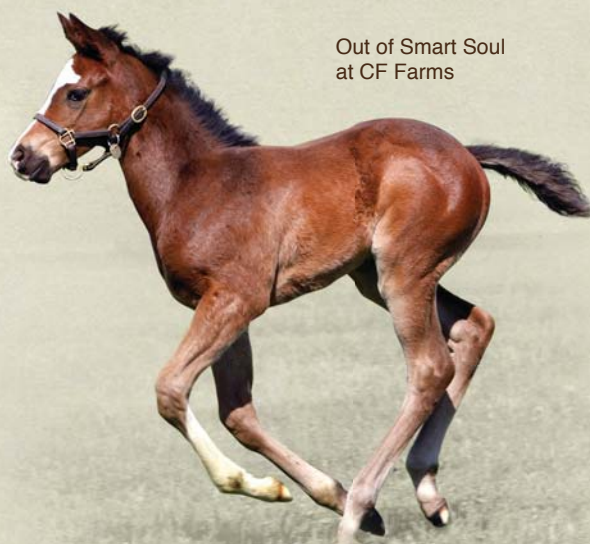


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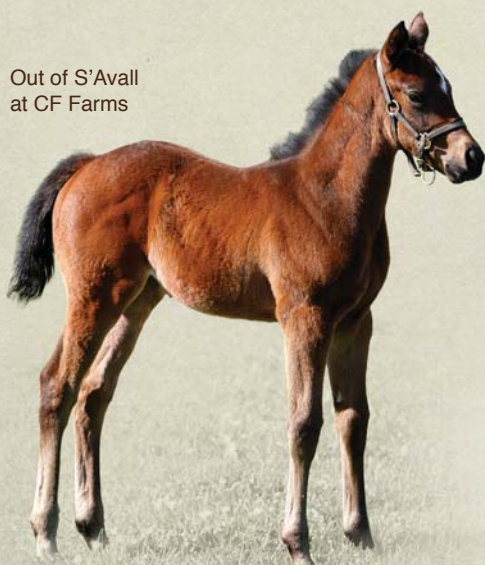

Bodemeister was installed as the 4-1 favorite on the morning line, but, as of 8 p.m. EST Friday night, he had drifted up to 8-1. Chadds Ford Stable's Union Rags was trading as the 5-1 favorite, while his GI Florida Derby conqueror **Take Charge Indy** (A.P. Indy) had come down to 8-1 from 15-1. The speedy Bodemeister indeed has history to overcome, but has the confidence of his rider.

"We'll play it off the break and see what happens," said Mike Smith. "I think that if he gets away well, like I've been saying all along, if he's given the opportunity, he's going to run extremely well."

Not many horses have made it to the Kentucky Derby without having run at two. Recent attempts have been made by the likes of Curlin (Smart Strike), whose unbeaten record came to an end when third to Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) and Hard Spun (Danzig) in 2007; and Summer Bird (Birdstone), who ran sixth in the sloppy renewal upset by Mine That Bird in 2009. Both of those colts went on to be champions by the end of the season, however, and Bodemeister's speed figures are far superior to his peers.

Among Mike Smith's other Derby mounts was Holy Bull (Great Above), who faded to 12th as the 2-1 choice in 1994; he did win Horse of the Year honors.

"Some of them get discouraged, and they just quit running," Smith told *Daily Racing Form*. "But some of them get over the track extremely well, and that's what you're hoping for. Bob said he likes the way [Bodemeister] has been handling the track, which is great to hear. I'll find out pretty quick on Saturday."

QIPCO GUINEAS FESTIVAL Newmarket May 5-6, 2012

Aidan O'Brien also saddles ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Power (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who was last seen finishing runner-up in the G1 Dewhurst S. over seven furlongs here in October. "He hasn't run over a mile yet, so he's a little bit different to Camelot," O'Brien explained. "He's well and he's a big, hardy horse. I don't think a mile will be a problem, but he's a horse who shows plenty of early speed in his work, so I'm not sure how much further than a mile he'll get. In his races he has a lazy way of racing and comes home well, so it will be interesting." In charge of steering Camelot is Joseph O'Brien, who showed he was impervious to pressure when steering St Nicholas Abbey to Breeders' Cup glory at Churchill Downs in November. "He has a high cruising speed, plenty of 'boot' and class and ticks the right boxes," he said, before warning that the rain-softened ground is a concern. "I have to have a question mark over the ground, as he's a very good-moving horse who won both starts last year on good or quick ground. There are a lot of top-of-the-ground horses in his pedigree and I think he'll be much better on fast ground, so we won't know until he goes on soft."

A French Foray...

Two years ago, Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) registered the first French success since Pennekamp in 1995 and the recent surge of Gallic interest in the Newmarket Guineas has seen a trio of smart prospects ship over for this edition. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Abtaal** (Rock Hard Ten) beat the subsequent G1 Criterium International winner **French Fifteen (Fr)** (Turtle Bowl {Ire}) by three lengths in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon at Saint-Cloud in October, but was a neck behind that rival in the G3 Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte on his return Apr. 5. Pau-based trainer Jean-Claude Rouget, whose only 2000 Guineas runner--US Ranger (Danzig)--flopped in 2007, expects Abtaal to hold his own. "He was not fit enough to win the Djebel and the seven-furlong trip was a bit short for him, but he has improved a lot from the race," Rouget said. "I think he has improved enough to be in the shake-up, but it is never easy to win the Guineas. I think he will be competitive and in the first four, and Christophe Soumillon told me he would like this track." Makfi's trainer Mikel Delzangles supplies the fascinating **Hermival (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who was only 1 3/4 lengths behind French Fifteen in the Djebel having only his second start and who would provide a fitting winner of the first race in the British Champions' Series for His Highness Sheikh Abdullah bin Khalifa Al Thani. **Cont. p8**

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"Hermival has only one likeness to Makfi and that is his sire Dubawi--the resemblance stops there," Delzangles explained. "He ran very well in the Djebel to be third, as it was a good race and it was only his second start.

"He has progressed since then and seems to have improved from it. The Guineas is a difficult race and there is a journey involved, but I am confident about the form of the horse."

DETTORI SEES THE LIGHT

Frankie Dettori has opted to ride **Lyric of Light (GB)** (Street Cry {Ire}) over 🍀 **"TDN Rising Star" 🍀 Discourse** (Street Cry {Ire}) in tomorrow's G1 QIPCO 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Both unbeaten, the former completed a hat-trick in the course-and-distance G1 Fillies' Mile when last seen in September while Discourse has been out of action since winning the G3 Sweet Solera S. on the July Course here in August. "I'm very happy with Lyric of Light and she is a very nice mover," their trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni said yesterday. "She's professional and has a good kick and turn of foot. Discourse had a knee problem. I think she's more of an Oaks filly, but we're going to run her in the Guineas and she showed a good turn of foot when winning her Group Three well." One of the race's unknown quantities is Raymond Mould's **Gray Pearl (GB)** (Excellent Art {GB}), who was third on only her second start in the G2 Rockfel S. over seven furlongs here in October. Trainer Charlie Hills commented, "She's a fine, scopey filly who has a lovely strong action and she seemed to relish soft ground when we worked her on it, so I don't think that will be a problem." Ralph Beckett is another trainer who is happy with conditions for Lady Marchwood's unbeaten G3 Fred Darling S. winner **Moonstone Magic (GB)** (Trade Fair {GB}). "I'm glad we supplemented her, as the ground has come for us," he said yesterday. "She was a very big and backward 2-year-old and I never thought we'd end up here, but I'm confident we are doing the right thing." Connections of last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner **Lightening Pearl (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) will leave the decision as to whether to run late and trainer Ger Lyons told *PA Sport*, "The intention at this stage is for her to travel over to Newmarket tonight, but I'll speak to David Redvers and if he tells me the ground is soft and not drying out she won't go. The one question mark we have with her is whether she'll stay the seven furlongs to a mile. She has a lot of quality and cruises through her races, but we don't want to run her over a mile first time on proper soft ground and then not have an answer about whether she stays."

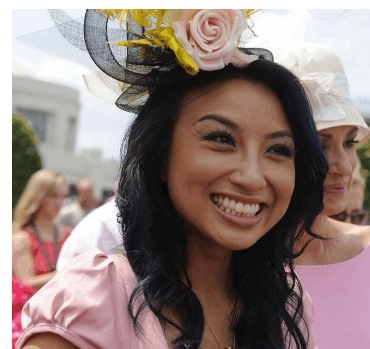

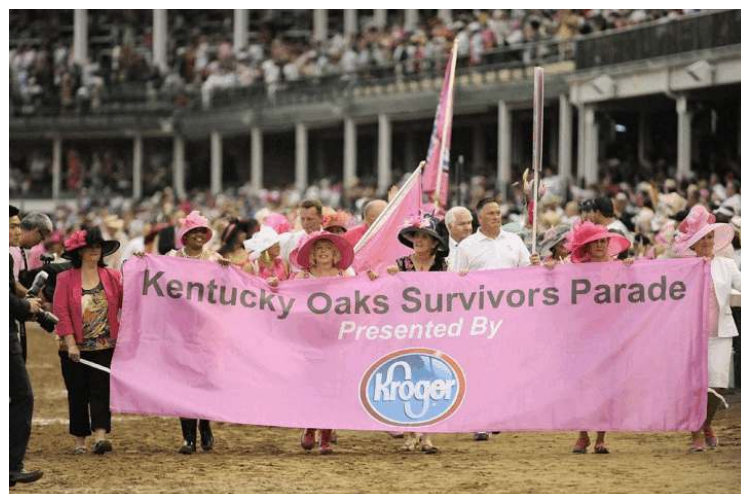

AWESOME OAKS, DERBY THOUGHTS

The weather cooperated until it didn't. Friday was a beautiful day at Churchill until about 4:45 p.m., when the skies opened and sent a pink-hued crowd of 112,552--second-highest in Oaks Day history--scurrying for cover. Really, the skies only opened up for a minute or two, with a few flashes of nearby lightning, then threatened more without delivering right up through the Kentucky Oaks. The maintenance crew did a fine job getting the track back into shape and, though there definitely was plenty of moisture in the surface, it was labeled 'fast' for the Oaks.

Of course, Rosie Napravnik became the first female rider to win the Oaks aboard Believe You Can, which was fitting on a day honoring the ladies and recognizing breast cancer. "It's great for the all the women in the industry and the world, and I'm just happy to represent that," Napravnik said. The now-traditional breast cancer survivors walk on Churchill's track, held just prior to the Oaks, produced a number of poignant moments. It was obvious that the enthusiastic acknowledgment by the crowd meant a lot to some of the participants. Trainer Larry Jones later said, "What better name for a horse for these cancer survivors than Believe You Can?" It was, incidentally, interesting to watch the stream of participants move alongside a few of the Oaks runners, who, because of time constraints, were making their way to the paddock at the same time.

At the post-race press conference, Napravnik was initially absent because she was riding another Jones-trained filly in the final race on the card, the maiden Totally Tucker (Elusive Quality). In fact, the press conference was paused for a couple minutes while Jones watched the race from the auxiliary press box. With the mic still hot, the lively conditioner provided some in-race commentary ("I think we're looking all right there on the outside!"), and sure enough, Totally Tucker got up for the win under Napravnik. "Oh man, I'm going to miss the damn photo," Jones laughed. When Napravnik made it back to the press conference, she was given a big round of applause and a hug from Jones.

The winning owner and breeder, Airdrie Stud's Brereton Jones, was asked about Believe You Can's name. He explained that when he was a youngster, his father had crafted a wall hanging with the word "Can't" x'd out. "I wish you all could have met my father, he was one of the great positive thinkers," Jones said. Yesterday, there certainly was plenty to be positive about.

'Go' El Padrino, Go...

Last year's Kentucky Derby was a productive day at Churchill for Let's Go Racing's Kevin Scatuorchio. He crafted a series of bets around a handful of horses, including Animal Kingdom, Nehro, Mucho Macho Man and Shackleford. "Believe it or not, I had the super but didn't bet it," Scatuorchio said from just outside Todd Fletcher's barn on Thursday. "But I had exactas and tris and a big bet on Animal Kingdom." When the dust settled, he cleared round \$10,000.

Scatuorchio and his partner in Let's Go, Bryan Sullivan, will look for an even bigger payday this year on Derby Day when the stable's **El Padrino** lines up for the Run for the Roses. El Padrino looked like the real deal late last year and early this year, but turned some people off with a lackluster fourth in the GI Florida Derby. Scatuorchio said it wasn't as lackluster as people might think. "Speed was crazy that day, and you couldn't be more than, say, 1 1/2 lengths off the lead at the half-mile pole and have a chance to win the race," Scatuorchio said. "I think we were three back or something like that. But Calvin [Borel] did a great job on [winner] Take Charge Indy to get him in the position he was in, and it was just one of those things."

The general consensus is that there will be a hot pace in this year's Derby. "Sometimes you see these races on paper where there's a ton of speed and then no one goes, or vice versa," he said. "But I think we'll probably see a very quick first quarter and a solid half-mile. From there, it's anyone's guess."

Over at this barn, Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas was among those predicting lively splits. "There will be pace this year, and it will be solid," he said. "What happens when that gate opens is that you have 40,000 drunks over there by the starting gates and they're hollering, the adrenaline gets pumping in the horses just like it does in the jockeys. Horses that would normally break and settle when that roar goes up will grab the bit and do a little more than, as trainers, we'd like them to. I think you'll see six or seven horses up on the pace." **Cont. p12**

Lukas was blunt when asked where he thought his horse, Bluegrass Hall homebred **Optimizer**, would be. "He doesn't have the speed to keep up with them," said Lukas, who added that meant his horse would have to negotiate a 20-horse field the hard way. "I was over in the paddock with Jerry Bailey and I asked him how much he weighed. If I could get a Grindstone ride I'd feel a lot better."

It's been a relatively drama-free week at Churchill, though there were whispers on the backstretch that something was amiss with **Creative Cause**. Much of the innuendo had to do with the fact that he walked consecutive days after working Monday, though trainer Mike Harrington insists that's his usual routine. Others speculated the horse wasn't warming up well once on the track, but again, yesterday Harrington told members of the press the horse was fine. Tough to gauge.

Now, on to the Derby picks. As I've been saying all week, no horse has been more physically impressive than **Union Rags**. Each morning, you'd watch the Derby runners gallop by, and quite a few caught the eye. Then you'd see Union Rags, and it was different class. But I like his progression on paper, too. Last year, he was running big pace figures in the early and mid-stages of races. When he won the GII Saratoga Special, his mid-race pace figure was a 107, while he finished up with a 90. In the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, when he was second, the same figs were 109 and 93. But this year, he's been settling more and running massive late figs. In the GII Fountain of Youth S., he ran an 87 mid-race fig, then came home in a huge 115. In the GI Florida Derby, it was 87 and 110. Moreover, I like that Michael Matz has really knuckled down on him in the mornings. His three works before the Florida Derby came in :50 3/5, 1:04 1/5 and :49. His last three works have come in :48 2/5, :47 2/5 and :59 4/5. Looking for a big effort.

El Padrino is flying a bit under the radar following his fourth in the Florida Derby, but is another who's been running huge late pace figs. Moreover, he enters the Derby with the best BRIS Speed Figure, a 111 earned in that Gulfstream optional claimer back in January (over a sealed track). He is big and strong, and jockey Rafael Bejarano, aboard for the first time, fits the horse well.

In third I'll go with **Bodemeister**. He's another who has just looked awesome in the mornings, and his GI Arkansas Derby win was, I thought, the most exciting Derby prep this year. I'm a bit worried about the pace scenario, however. He's never run a half slower than :46 4/5, and it's possible he's going to get sucked into a pace a few ticks faster than that today. But he was cruising at a good clip in the Arkansas Derby (:46 2/5) and still finished up with a 105 late pace fig, so maybe he's just that awesome.

Horses I'll be using underneath in the tris and supers include **Rousing Sermon**, who should be running late and looked good in the mornings, and **Went the Day Well**, who has been moving superb over the Churchill surface. Again, best of luck to all...

Successful Dan, winner of the GIII Northern Dancer S. over this track and trip in 2009, added the GII Fayette S. on Keeneland's synthetic as a 4-year-old, and looked to secure a career high when he crossed the wire first in the 2010 GI Clark H. However, the Morton Fink homebred was disqualified to third, and he wound up being sidelined for 17 months with a suspensory injury. He returned to defeat a solid allowance group going seven panels at Keeneland Apr. 6, and attracted plenty of attention in this competitive renewal of the Alysheba. Successful Dan was unhurried early and settled well off the pace contested by Plutonium (Monarchos) with Fort Larned sitting second. He made a sweeping move on the far turn to reach contention as Fort Larned assumed control and had Mucho Macho Man looming boldly at the head of the lane. Mucho Macho Man couldn't quite kick between rivals, and Fort Larned fought on gamely, but couldn't quite withstand the Twin Spires aficionado. "I didn't know if he could duplicate his race at Keeneland," said winning trainer Charles Lopresti. "This field worried me, but this race shows me that he's come back as the horse he was. You always worry when they come back from an injury like this. It's not so much about the win, it's seeing him come back ok. He's a great horse." Juanita, a \$25,000 claim from Padua last March who went on to capture the GII Indiana Oaks in October, spent the winter at Fair Grounds, where she kicked off 2012 with a second in the grassy Marie Krantz Memorial H. Jan. 14. After tiring to third behind Joyful Victory (Tapit) in the Tiffany Lass S. on the main track Feb. 11, the dark bay gave an honest account of herself when runner-up to Horse of the Year Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in the New Orleans Ladies S. on St. Patrick's Day. That effort didn't garner her much respect here, however, as she faced the top-two finishers from the 2011 GI Kentucky Oaks. Emboldened by her Big Easy effort, Juanita settled into second as 2-5 Plum Pretty traveled ominously well through a :48.36 opening half. The longshot collared the chalk turning for home and put her away in midstretch en route to an Oaks Days surprise. St. John's River closed from fifth to best her nemesis for second. "I have to give all the credit for claiming her to the owner, Mr. [Graydon] Patterson," said winning trainer Mike Maker. "He picked her out. It was all him. It sure has worked out well." Maker confirmed that the absence of Havre de Grace led to Juanita's presence at Churchill. "She ran just behind Havre de Grace last time so we gave it a shot. We were going to run in Chicago, but when they retired Havre de Grace, it made the decision easy."

There were tougher foes here, but the Dana Wells/Mark Bacon colorbearer was relentless once more. Silver Max bounced away alertly and assumed his usual spot on the front end. He had some daylight turning for home, opened up a bit more in the lane and was safely clear as the late challengers closed in. "This is a really super turf horse," asserted winning trainer Dale Romans. "I didn't care about the jockey situation on a business level or on a jockey level." Romans added, "I don't think he understood competing early in his career. When he figured it out, though, he figured it out."

DUN DEAL

Last year's G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase winner **Dunaden (Fr)** (Nicobar {GB}) bids to add a British Pattern-race success to his growing tally in today's G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket. Vastly improved last term since being switched to the Mikel Delzangles stable, the 6-year-old has to defy a penalty here but four of the last six winners were successful in doing so. "We're trying to discover whether or not he's going to be as effective over a mile and a half in Europe as he was in Hong Kong," commented David Redvers on behalf of owners Pearl Bloodstock. "Mikel can't believe that a 6-year-old can improve so much over the winter, so we're all very excited about him." One of those he has to surrender a weight advantage to is the Rothschild Family's **Meandre (Fr)** (Slickly {Fr}), who burst onto the scene when scoring impressively in Longchamp's G1 Grand Prix de Paris in July. Subsequently second after a troubled preparation for the G2 Prix Niel back there in September, he was a respectable sixth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and hails from the Andre Fabre barn, successful twice since 2006. Also in the Arc was Bjorn Nielsen's G1 St Leger hero **Masked Marvel (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), but he fared less well when trailing in last and connections are keeping watch on ground conditions as they ponder whether to let him take his chance.

NYRA CUTS TIES TO HAYWARD, KEHOE

The Board of Directors of the New York Racing Association announced Friday that it has terminated the employment of its President and CEO Charles Hayward, as well as Senior VP and General Counsel Patrick Kehoe, effective immediately. Hayward and Kehoe had been placed on administrative leave Monday in the wake of a report from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board alleging NYRA officials knew about an illegal takeout rate, but did nothing to correct it. A statement from NYRA said that the decision "was based on a determination that these executives failed to perform their duties at a level required by the board." C. Steven Duncker, chairman of the board of directors, said that NYRA is cooperating with on-going governmental inquiries into the takeout issue.

In response to his dismissal, Hayward sent out the following statement:

"I am extremely disappointed in the New York Racing Association's Board of Directors' action. Both the interim report and the investigation on which the report is based are flawed and admittedly incomplete. The interim report badly misinterprets documents and was prepared without interviewing me or any other individuals relevant to their investigation.

"I have been fully cooperating, and will continue to fully cooperate with the NYRA board. I look forward to the Racing and Wagering Board and the New York Inspector General completing their investigations as expeditiously as possible. I expect to be fully exonerated when all the facts come out."

ANOTHER SHAMARDAL TOPPER AT TATTS

Just as at its earlier Craven Breeze-Up Sale, Tattersalls' lower-key Guineas Breeze-Up Sale was topped by a son of Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) yesterday afternoon. But yesterday's sale topper could not come close to matching the 500,000gns price tag of its predecessor when realising a more modest 115,000gns.

Lot 105, a half-brother to the smart 3-year-old Accession (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), was offered from Willie Browne's Mocklershill

and bought by agent David Redvers after winning a duel with German trainer Wolfgang Figge. Redvers' purchase is set to race in the colours of Qatar Racing, a partnership of Pearl Bloodstock's Sheikh Fahad Al Thani and his brothers, who are behind the QIPCO sponsorship of Britain's champion series. Redvers' personal assistant Hannah Wall, again acting for Qatar Racing, later bought an 87,000gns Acclamation (GB) colt, 75,000gns son of Danroad (Aus) and an 80,000gns Bernstein filly.

"I haven't discussed trainers with Sheikh Fahad yet," said Redvers. "We'll probably try for a couple more at Arqana's breeze-up in France next weekend and then sort trainers for all of them." He noted, "The Shamardal was not hard ridden in his breeze, but did a very fast time. He was a proper horse who was all speed."

An Acclamation (GB) colt who had missed his date at the Craven Breeze-Up Sale made 95,000gns when appearing from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud. Agent Peter Doyle saw off trainer Paul D'Arcy for the juvenile, who is set to race in the same colours as Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula) and Harbour Watch (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}).

"He's going to Richard Hannon and is for Robin Heffer, who has got him as a birthday present for his wife Judy," said Doyle. "He was a lovely horse with plenty of size and there will be no rush with him. He handled the ground well on Thursday - it wasn't easy for them to breeze on that going."

The final lot on offer, an Invincible Spirit (Ire) half-brother to GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Whatsthescript (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}), is set to join Newmarket handler Marco Botti after being bought for 90,000gns by agent Gill Richardson.

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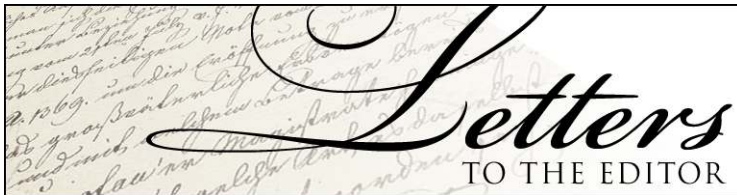
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ALBARADO ARRESTED ON ASSAULT

CHARGES Jockey Robby Albarado was arrested Friday morning on fourth-degree assault charges after a domestic dispute with a woman he was living with, according to published reports. The embattled rider, who faced a similar charge a year ago, was forced off his mounts Friday, including an expected engagement with Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun) in the GI Kentucky Oaks. Albarado was replaced by Rafael Bejarano. Albarado does not have a mount in today's GI Kentucky Derby. According to an arrest warrant, Albarado threw Carolina C. Martinez to the ground during an argument. Martinez allegedly suffered an injury to her shoulder and bruising to her legs and arms. She went to the hospital two days after the incident, which occurred earlier this week, and was diagnosed with a possible torn ligament in her shoulder. According to the warrant, Martinez was in the process of breaking up with Albarado, with whom she had lived for a year, she said. Albarado was released on his own recognizance. His arraignment is scheduled for Tuesday. Last spring, Albarado was charged with domestic assault after an altercation with his wife Kimber Albarado. Charges were later dismissed after Albarado pleaded guilty to interfering with a witness. His wife has filed for divorce. Albarado had six scheduled mounts Friday. He was named on eight mounts today.



I just read about the latest black mark against the TRF, which I have supported since its inception in 1982.

This gives more evidence to owners that they must take responsibility for the aftercare of their own horses if they are to be involved in racing with any clear conscience.

The people who should be under the microscope should be the owners and trainers whose specialty are claimers. The stables who say, "Oh yes, I claimed a horse for thirty thousand, ran him back for thirty-five, he won, got claimed, and I've never looked back and we've operated in the black ever since."

Regardless of what is being said about the staff of organizations such as the TRF, some of these people have made it their life's work trying to help these old horses, unlike the owners and trainers who perpetuate the flow into the overpopulated facilities not to mention slaughterhouses.

My name is Valerie Buck. I have worked as an exercise rider/assistant trainer in the thoroughbred industry for more than 28 years, in the top racing stables in the country and have ridden many champions along the way. Recent injuries have caused me to give up exercising horses. Over the years, I have been hard at work developing new careers for many Thoroughbreds, as well as helping humans and horses create better relationships through natural horsemanship.

In February 2012, I traveled to Oklahoma on behalf of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation to photograph special-needs horses for their website. What I found at Dr. Sam Crosby's farm were over 200 happy, healthy horses living in a natural and safe environment.

At Rafter G Ranch down the road a ways, there were over 150 horses, in the same condition, happy, healthy, and safe. In the paddock in front of the residence there was a smaller herd of horses, and they were under special care, closely monitored by the farm owner and their veterinarian. Two of the horses in there were at the end of their lives, and their quality of life was being evaluated daily.

So when a stranger comes in and sees a horse in this condition, they can quickly make assumptions, which has been done in the past, and horses were removed from facilities where they were being loved and cared for in their stages of ailing health, but closely watched by farm owners and veterinarians. After being removed from these farms, in delicate condition, the stress they suffered from the move ended in the horses having to be euthanized. Bad press towards the TRF was completely out of line in these situations.

I am tired of these attacks on the TRF, they are struggling to do their job through charitable donations. They are taking on the financial responsibility for these horses that were bred and bought and raced, and then discarded when there was no more need for them. When is the racing industry going to stand up and become responsible for the care of these horses? The TRF shouldn't even exist, the breeders and owners of these horses should be directly responsible for long term care for every horse that is ever registered with the Jockey Club, and then we wouldn't have to worry about who is and isn't being cared for.

Shame on anyone who attacks people who are trying to do the right thing, everything the TRF has done has been done with good intentions. That's much more than I can say for a very large percentage of people who breed, own and train these horses.

Irish Derby Supplementary Fees Reduced:

Officials at The Curragh, in association with Horse Racing Ireland, have launched plans to encourage the best horses to participate in the June 30 G1 Irish Derby by reducing the fee for making supplementary entries. Group 1 winners will pay €50,000, down from a flat rate of €125,000 in 2011, while Group 2 winners and Group 1 place-getters will have to pay €75,000 to take part in the €1.25-million contest. Additionally, the cost of supplementing fillies will be €50,000, while all other candidates can be added for €100,000. "Our objective is to ensure that the very best horses compete in the Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby this year," commented Curragh General Manager Paul Hensey. "The reduction for supplementing a runner into the race, who has not been entered at the 1st and 2nd entry stages, will hopefully ensure we maximise our potential to attract winners of the top races, in particular the Epsom and French Derby, who were always traditionally aimed at our race in the past."
