J. Paul Reddam's **I'll Have Another** (Flower Alley) sat the trip in seventh for most of the way beneath Mario Gutierrez, and came streaking down the Churchill Downs stretch to reel in the game-as-can-be pacesetter and 4-1 favorite **Bodemeister** (Empire Maker) in the 138th GI Kentucky Derby. "I don't know how at this point anything could be bigger than the Kentucky Derby," Reddam responded when asked to place the win in perspective with his other accomplishments as an owner. "If you hear of something, let me know."

{Ire}) 2 1/4 lengths back in third. "He has a lot of class and speed and I was always happy," commented jockey Joseph O'Brien after showing panache beyond his years when steering his first English Classic winner. "He was nice and relaxed and, although I didn't get the best of runs through and was very far back, I always felt like I was getting there. He might have got a bit tired in the last 100 yards, but it was his first start of the season, and he will be a lot better going further." **Cont. p7**

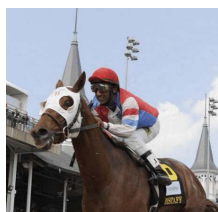

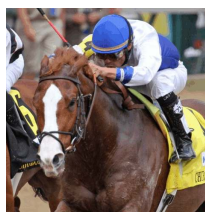

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How the Race Was Won...

C'mon, was this really Mario Gutierrez's first mount in the Derby? The former Hastings Park leading rider settled his charge brilliantly in seventh after breaking from post 19 as Bodemeister whistled through fractions of :22.32 and :45.39 with Trinniberg (Teuflesberg) right on his heels. I'll Have Another began to launch his bid on the turn for home, and came rolling off the bend four wide as Bodemeister kicked clear by three. Gutierrez kept plugging away right-handed and I'll Have Another continued to respond, reeling in the pacesetter late to pull off the upset. "He broke sharp, as he usually does," Gutierrez, a native of Mexico City, said. "He's such a professional horse. I know he was going to help me 100% through the first part. In the end, he just give 100% all the time. As soon as you ask him, he throws everything on the race, and he didn't disappoint today."

PROS: Outside of a well-beaten sixth following a cross-country ship for a sloppy renewal of the GI Hopeful S., he cannot be faulted on form. Set an apparently tall task for his sophomore debut, he belied 43-1 odds to take the GII R. B. Lewis S. and, in a do-or-die situation, outgamed Creative Cause to win the GI Santa Anita Derby. **CONS:** Wants to race prominently, which means either that he'll be (too) close to an expected hot pace or that he'll be further off the speed than is his custom... Trainer Doug O'Neill has shown tremendous allegiance to and confidence in jockey Mario Gutierrez, but how will the young rider fare in the Kentucky Derby hoopla? **PEDIGREE:** Flower Alley, by a sire who has already produced a Kentucky Derby winner, has made a successful start at stud, having sired another Grade I winner in the form of Ashland S. victress Lilacs and Lace. Racing in the colors of Eugene Melnyk, Flower Alley was proficient over 10 furlongs, recording a big-figure win in the GI Travers S. ahead of a runner-up effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic....Should get some added stamina from his broodmare sire, who was responsible for BC Classic hero Blame. **VERDICT:** Hard to knock what he's done this season, but wonder if the shape of this race could result in having others on the ticket. **Did you know?** Owner J. Paul Reddam, owner of the CashCall loan company in Anaheim, invited each of his 1,300 employees to the Santa Anita Derby, offering a bus ride, free admission and a \$24 voucher for betting and concessions. There were about 40 acceptors.

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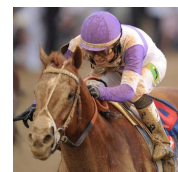
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Hard to Knock Derby Winner's Form...

Minus a disappointing sixth in the Saratoga slop in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S., I'll Have Another has done everything his connections have asked. The chestnut, a wire-to-wire debut winner at Hollywood Park in July, gave Creative Cause (Giant's Causeway) a good run for his money when holding on for second in the GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar Aug. 7. He clearly wasn't the same horse in upstate New York when the rains arrived, racing toward the back of the pack and finishing 19 lengths behind Currency Swap (High Cotton). Given the rest of the term off, I'll Have Another kicked off his sophomore campaign in style, upsetting the GII Robert B. Lewis S. Feb. 4, and proved he was for real with a game nose tally in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 7. Despite his solid form, I'll Have Another was sent off at 15-1 yesterday. "I think he was such a price because of me training it and Mario riding it," trainer Doug O'Neill revealed. "If it would have been Pletcher or Velazquez, I bet you it would have been 9-2. How do you win the Santa Anita Derby and not be one of the top five choices? I know the Beyer numbers. When they win the way he did, we were super confident in this colt." O'Neill added, "When you tell people you're in the horse racing game, they ask you, Have you won the Kentucky Derby? Now I can say, Yes, I have, 2012."

Reddam Philosophical in Derby Victory...

J. Paul Reddam, whose white-and-purple colors have been carried to Breeders' Cup victories by Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and Wilko (Awesome Again), was surprisingly composed in the winner's circle. The one-

time philosophy professor was asked by NBC's Bob Costas to sum up his emotions and Reddam, without missing a beat, opted to paraphrase Ludwig Wittgenstein. "After all the philosophical problems have been solved,

nothing will have

been accomplished, so we decided to get into horse racing," Reddam, president of the financial lending company CashCall, said on national television. "I'm kind of numb. This one is for the whole team: Doug, Dennis, and Mario, and to all those people behind the scenes." What keeps Reddam going to stay involved in the Sport of Kings? "Well, horse racing is the most dangerous kind of addiction because it has intermittent reinforcements, right," he replied. "Every once in a while something good happens, and that keeps you gambling or buying horses, what have you. I never really dreamed that I would be in a position to own racehorses, but I got very lucky in my life and it happened. I guess I'm still pretty lucky." It's on to Baltimore for the Derby winner. "We gave the horse only two preps this year," Reddam offered. "Part of the idea was we knew we had a good horse, and we wanted to make sure he was fresh because the Triple Crown is a gamble and it looks like it paid off. We've only run three times this year, so Preakness, here we come."

Another Look at the Bottom Line...

I'll Have Another was bred in Kentucky by Harvey Clarke, who purchased Arch's Gal Edith (Arch) for \$80,000 at OBS March in 2004. She captured her belated career debut in September of her 3-year-old season for Clarke and trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, but never ran again. Her first two foals were winners by Thunder Gulch and Soto, and I'll Have Another was her third foal. Sold to the account of Victor Davila for \$11,000 as a yearling at KEESEP, the chestnut was consigned by Eisaman Equine last year at OBS April, and was snapped up by Dennis O'Neill for \$35,000. Arch's Gal Edith has a 2-year-old Tapit filly named Gloria S. She was reportedly booked to Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) this season.

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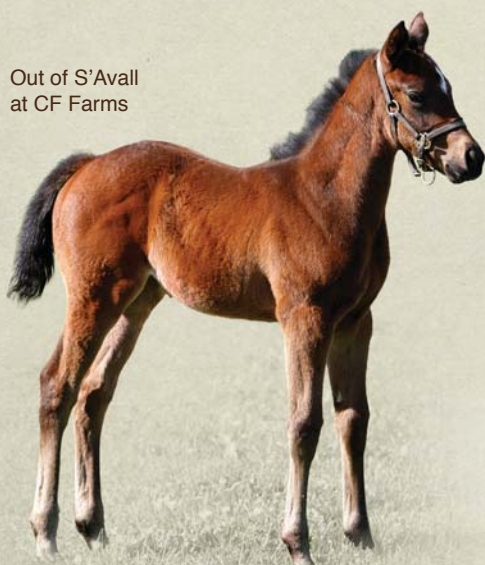

'ANOTHER' DERBY DREAM

There maybe was no more touching moment at the 2012 Kentucky Derby than when, at the post-race press conference, the winning connections of Derby hero **I'll Have Another** invited a young girl named Hope up to the dais to take part in the question-and-answer session. Hope visited trainer Doug O'Neill's barn earlier in the week with the Make-A-Wish Foundation and met with the conditioner and his crew. O'Neill and his team even put her up on the most famous stable pony in the nation, MGISW Lava Man. Standing next to winning jockey Mario Gutierrez, Hope beamed in front of the gathered media. "Mario, if he knew this, might have been a little nervous: we put Hope and Lava Man and she was an absolute natural," O'Neill said.

The race itself didn't disappoint. In one of the finest losing efforts in recent memory, Zayat Stable's **Bodemeister** cut out unreasonable :22.32 and :45.39 splits, and was defeated just 1 1/2 lengths. It was a particularly strong effort given the fact the horse seemed to get pretty worked up on the walk over to the paddock, where two handlers had their hands full with the pumped-up colt. How strong? The next five horses behind him at the half ran 17th, 9th, eased, 16th and 19th.

But big kudos to I'll Have Another. His virtually unknown jockey, a 25-year-old from Mexico who came to his current California base by way of Hastings Park, simply outrode a number of big-name riders. He had his charge perfectly placed: far enough off the sizzling splits, but not so far back on a track playing to speed.

Also big ups to bloodstock agent Dennis O'Neill, the winning trainer's brother, who waged a valiant battle against cancer in recent years. O'Neill purchased I'll Have Another for \$35,000 as a juvenile in training, which made the \$100,000 he paid for Breeders' Cup champion Stevie Wonderboy look splashy. A nice guy with a great eye for a horse. "I've been through a lot," O'Neill admitted after the race. "Going through what I went through, I guess makes me appreciate this a little more; makes you appreciate your family. You can say whatever you want about Doug, but he's the nicest, most caring person I know in the world. I never would have made it through what I went through without him. It's great to go through something like this with him and celebrate with him."

The Undercard...

Owner and breeder Emory Hamilton was on hand to root homebred **Hungry Island** to victory in the GII Churchill Distaff Turf Mile S., where the 4-year-old filly doubled her graded stakes tally after winning last year's GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga. Hungry Island is from the same family as another Hamilton-bred horse on the card, the GI Kentucky Derby's El Padrino, who ran 11th. The pair was produced by half-sisters, Hungry Island being a daughter of Flying Passage (A.P. Indy) and El Padrino a son of Enchanted Rock (Giant's Causeway). Both mares are themselves daughters of the Grade I winner Chic Shirine (Mr. Prospector), the D. Wayne Lukas-trained filly who won the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland in 1987. Chic Shirine was produced by another Grade I winner, the blue hen producer Too Chic (Blushing Groom {Fr}).

It was actually quite a day for homebreds at Churchill, with eight of the 13 races and four of the six graded races going to homebreds. That included the winner of the GI Humana Distaff. The eminently likeable Bradley family (trainer William 'Buff' Bradley, his father Fred Bradley, et al) scored a huge win with **Groupie Doll** in the GI Humana Distaff. How huge? A track-record-setting 1:20.44 huge. (By way of comparison, Mike Lauffer and Bill Cubbedge's homebred **Shackleford** won the GII Churchill Downs S. in 1:21.06.) "This means a lot," said Buff Bradley. "It's a family horse, and breeding and raising her makes it special." Groupie Doll was produced by Deputy Doll (Silver Deputy), who won two races--both at Mountaineer--for Fred Bradley. The Bradleys purchased Deputy Doll at the 1997 Keeneland September Sale for \$25,000. "She could run a little bit," said Bradley. "Unfortunately, she's not with us any more."

The Florida-based couple of Priscilla and Carlo Vaccarezza led their homebred **Little Mike** into the winner's circle following his first Grade I tally in the Turf Classic S. The Vaccarezzas own a restaurant called Frank and Dino's in Deerfield Beach, and named their first winner at the highest level after their young son. Little Mike was produced by Hay Jude, who has another colt named after another of the Vaccarezzas' boys, Little Nick (Tiger Ridge), a SW & GSP earner of nearly \$460,000. Hay Jude has an unraced 2-year-old filly by Bustin Stones named Priscilla Marie. Little Mike, the person, was expecting a big performance from his namesake. "People were asking me if he was gonna win, and I said, '100% he's gonna win.'"

Overall, an awesome day of racing. On to Maryland...

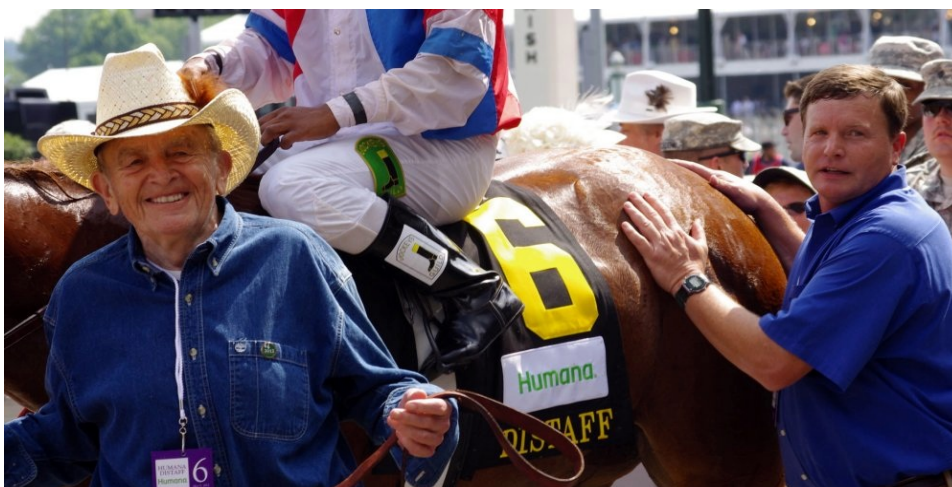

Camelot produced a striking debut over a mile at Leopardstown in mid-July, despite a lack of strength in the opposition both in terms of numbers and quality, and was then left alone by his intuitive trainer until the Racing Post Trophy Oct. 22. His dashing display on the back of a heavy gamble for that contest was

confirmation of his above-average ability and, as a result, earned him champion juvenile status. Having earned rave reviews from his trainer in the immediate aftermath of his Doncaster rout, Ballydoyle had turned eerily quiet about him this spring, and the public had only a brief sighting of his dash in a racecourse workout at The Curragh in March to satisfy curiosity. While his obvious talent was in no doubt, to win here, the impressive-looking bay would have to bury two hoodoos. The first was the record of Racing Post Trophy winners, with none having doubled up since High Top (Ire) 40 years ago, although since Doncaster's track was relaid in 2007, it has begun to favor the speedier types. **Cont. p8**

Secondly, and more importantly for Aidan O'Brien, of the small section of Montjeu's progeny to have been tried in the major mile tests only to fail was St Nicholas Abbey (Ire), who flopped off the hot favorite here two years ago. On top of that, the colt with the fast-ground action would have to show he could handle a slow surface and was a high-pressure ride for his precocious, but inexperienced jockey.

As can happen at Newmarket when the rain has come and there is a large field, the field split into three groups racing wide apart, but the favorite appeared to be in the right bunch led along by Trumpet Major (Ire) (Arakan) towards the stands. Joseph O'Brien was riding with maximum confidence and was still at the tail-end by halfway, before setting him alight three furlongs out and pushing him between G3 Greenham S. hero Caspar Netscher (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}) and Trumpet Major passing the furlong marker. French Fifteen and Olivier Peslier covered his move and while it looked for a few yards as if he might upset the favorite, Camelot dug in to prevail as they drew clear of the far-side's clear-best Hermival. Qipco's Champion Series is accompanied by sectional timing in most of the races this season, and it was announced afterwards that Camelot had clocked furlong splits of 12.01 and 12.11 from three out to one out. The June 2 G1 Epsom Derby now beckons, but the master of Ballydoyle was keeping his counsel on a possible Triple Crown bid.

"We knew that Camelot had a lot against him statistically, but we always thought he was very special," Aidan O'Brien said after greeting his sixth winner of the Classic. "He's out of a Kingmambo mare who is out of a Danehill mare and has strong crosses of both of those in him as well as Montjeu, so that's why we were worried about the soft ground. I had a view of what Joseph should do on him, as I was worried about him riding a horse for pace like that in that ground, but I'm glad I didn't say anything now. He said he'd be closer to last than first at halfway, and I'm glad I bit my tongue. I felt I destroyed St Nicholas Abbey in this race two years ago, and it's only now that he's starting to get his brilliance back now, so I learnt a lot from that."

O'Brien continued, "The way it always is we go home and the lads will speak about it, but the Derby will be something to talk about. You'd imagine, the Derby would be a very suitable race for him." Without Camelot, it would have been a French one-two yesterday, but neither French Fifteen's nor Hermival's trainers were downcast. Nicolas Clement, who handles the runner-up, told *PA Sport*, "I'm delighted with that and the winner was exceptional. It's possible we could go for the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 3] or G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 19] next." Mikel Delzangles said of Hermival, who was forced to race away from the main action against the far-side rail, "It's a pity he was on his own on that side and he was in front very early. I can't complain, he ran a great race and the two in front of him are definitely good horses. It was only his third-ever run, so I hope he can improve. He's in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas [at The Curragh May 26] and we will see about that." It was clear that Camelot was a popular winner of the inaugural race of the 2012 British Champions Series. The organisation's Chief Executive Rod Street said, "Just like Frankel last year, I don't think there's any doubting that we've had another superstar to launch the QIPCO British Champions for 2012 to a big Newmarket crowd. He may have won by a much smaller margin than Frankel, but his class was there for all to see over a trip that's likely to be a bare minimum for him this year. All eyes will be on the Investec Derby now, when Camelot should come into his own over the mile-and-a-half trip, but before then we have a top-class QIPCO 1000 Guineas to look forward to tomorrow and Frankel's seasonal debut in the JLT Lockinge S. at Newbury in a fortnight. We look like having an awesome opening month to the 2012 Series."



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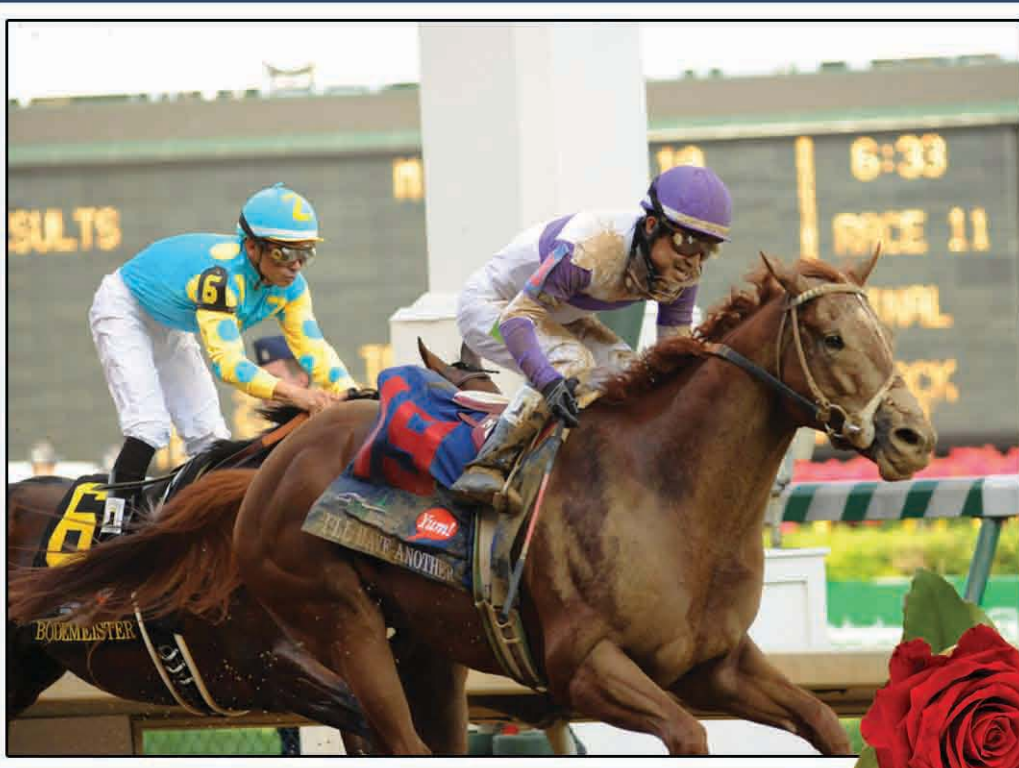
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A CERTAINTY? MAYBE...

Unbeaten through the various juvenile staging posts at Royal Ascot and The Curragh, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ makes a straightforward case for herself ahead of her first Classic test. Having beaten subsequent G1 Phoenix S. winner **La Collina (Ire)** (Strategic Prince {GB}) in the G3 Silver Flash S. at Leopardstown July 14, she had eventual G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine **Lightening Pearl (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) back in third in The Curragh's G2 Debutante S. in early August before returning to Kildare three weeks later to claim an initial top-level success in the Moyglare Stud S. She even proved she handles the soft ground when ploughing a lone furrow in the Listed Chesham S., so any further deterioration in conditions will prove no hindrance.

"We were very happy with her last year, and we've been watching this race for a long time now," trainer Aidan O'Brien commented. "She had five races in a short enough space of time, so we didn't want to over-push her. We wanted to give her an early break for her winter, so we could start early this year and, so far, everything has worked well. I don't think she has a big preference for ground. She's by Galileo and they seem to go on anything. She always was a very exciting filly." Son Joseph, whose spectacular weekend is the stuff of dreams, is one of the no-nonsense performer's biggest fans. "She was flawless last year and never really looked like beaten," he added. "She's uncomplicated, relaxed, has a great attitude and plenty of class. You'd imagine she'll get the mile and maybe a bit further in time."

Pearl Bloodstock's Lightening Pearl had been a doubt due to the incessant rain, but was yesterday given the green light by connections. Al Kazeem showed his liking for easy conditions when breaking his maiden at Newbury in October 2010, and was sent back there on his first two starts at three. Second in a 10-furlong conditions event in April before taking a handicap over that trip on a lively surface, he went to York for the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at an Ebor meeting run on unseasonably testing ground in August. Meeting a clear superior there in Sea Moon (GB) (Beat Hollow {GB}), he was eight-lengths second to Juddmonte's talented colt before again running second on his final outings in the G3 Arc Trial and G3 St Simon S. back at Newbury in the autumn. If those efforts seemed to suggest he was just shy of top-class, the homebred bay remained lightly raced entering this test and therefore still relatively unexposed. Not without his supporters on his favored rain-softened ground, he broke well and showed prominently early before being restrained to race in rear. Making a bold mid-race move traveling strongly in the hands of James Doyle, he rolled by Quest For Peace passing the quarter pole and quickly asserted. Despite drifting markedly left traveling downhill, he kept powering clear of that rival and the penalised G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Hong Kong Vase winner Dunaden, who had over-raced early before plugging into a respectable third. "That was a good performance and we'll be looking at Group 1 races such as the Coronation Cup [at Epsom June 2]," winning trainer Roger Charlton told *PA Sport*. Quest For Peace's trainer Luca Cumani may re-oppose the winner there, while Dunaden may be aimed at the G1 Gold Cup at Royal Ascot June 21.

Winter Memories spent a lot of time in 2011 emulating Harry Houdini, often extricating herself from heavy traffic en route to victory. Fourth to Hungry Island (More Than Ready) over unsuitably easy ground in Saratoga's GII Lake Placid S. in August, she passed all seven fillies in the final furlong for a neck success in the GI Garden City S. here Sept. 17. She had no real excuses when a last-out fourth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 15, but was odds-on for this seasonal return. A ground-saving fourth down the backstretch as Federation (GB) (Motivator {GB}) cut out an easy pace, she crept a bit closer on the turn, but was pinned in, first by Gitchee Goomie and then Check the Label, at the quarter pole. She audaciously bulled her way through, brushing with Check the Label in the process, but found the daylight she needed and accelerated away. Winter Memories will start next in the GI Just a Game S. at Belmont June 9.

This race took a tragic turn when unbeaten Bobina, battling tooth and nail with My Gi Gi in deep stretch, put her foot down wrong and fell crossing the wire. Believe You Can's next start is still undecided. "We have been focusing on the

Oaks all winter long," Jones explained. "This was the game plan and thank goodness we were able to follow our steps. We didn't know that there was life after the Kentucky Oaks; we've got to go back and think now. I do know we could do like with [1998 Kentucky Oaks winner] Proud Spell and go back to the [June 21 GI] Mother Goose, and the [Aug. 18 GI] Alabama will be our primary goal for the summer. But we're going to have to do something with her between now and then and we'll let her tell us. We're not going to get in a big hurry with her because she's shown she races well fresh and distance isn't a problem. But I would say the Mother Goose would be a primary target."

With Believe You Can's victory at Churchill Friday, five of the last eight winners of the GII Fair Grounds Oaks have gone on to win the Kentucky Oaks.

Connections also reported that Kentucky Oaks runner-up **Broadway's Alibi** (Vindication) and third-place finisher **Grace Hall** (Empire Maker) came out of the race in good order.



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OAKS WAGERING SETS RECORD

Wagering from all-sources on Friday's Kentucky Oaks card from Churchill Downs totaled a record \$39.9 million--an increase of 6.5% from a year ago. All-sources wagering on the Kentucky Oaks itself rose 3.4% to \$11.8 million. On-track wagering on the Oaks program fell 3.7% to \$11.6 million and betting on the Oaks fell 12.8% to \$2.6 million. On-track attendance was 112,552--second highest in Oaks history. The race day was interrupted by a mid-afternoon thunderstorm which prompted the temporary evacuation of the track's infield. "We had a successful and historic Kentucky Oaks Day with record total wagering, near-record on-track attendance and the historic victory by jockey Rosie Napravnik, who is truly one of our sport's rising stars," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs Racetrack. "We congratulate Ms. Napravnik and thank racing fans across North America for their support of the Kentucky Oaks program. We also appreciate the calm response by our infield fans when they were asked to temporarily leave that area of our track as a precaution because of the threat of strong weather."

Partnered by Tom Queally in company with fellow Juddmonte stable companions Bullet Train (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Jet Away (GB) (Dansili {GB}) over 7 1/2 furlongs, the brilliant 4-year-old firmly put his recent injury scare behind him with a familiar surge to wow the Newmarket faithful. 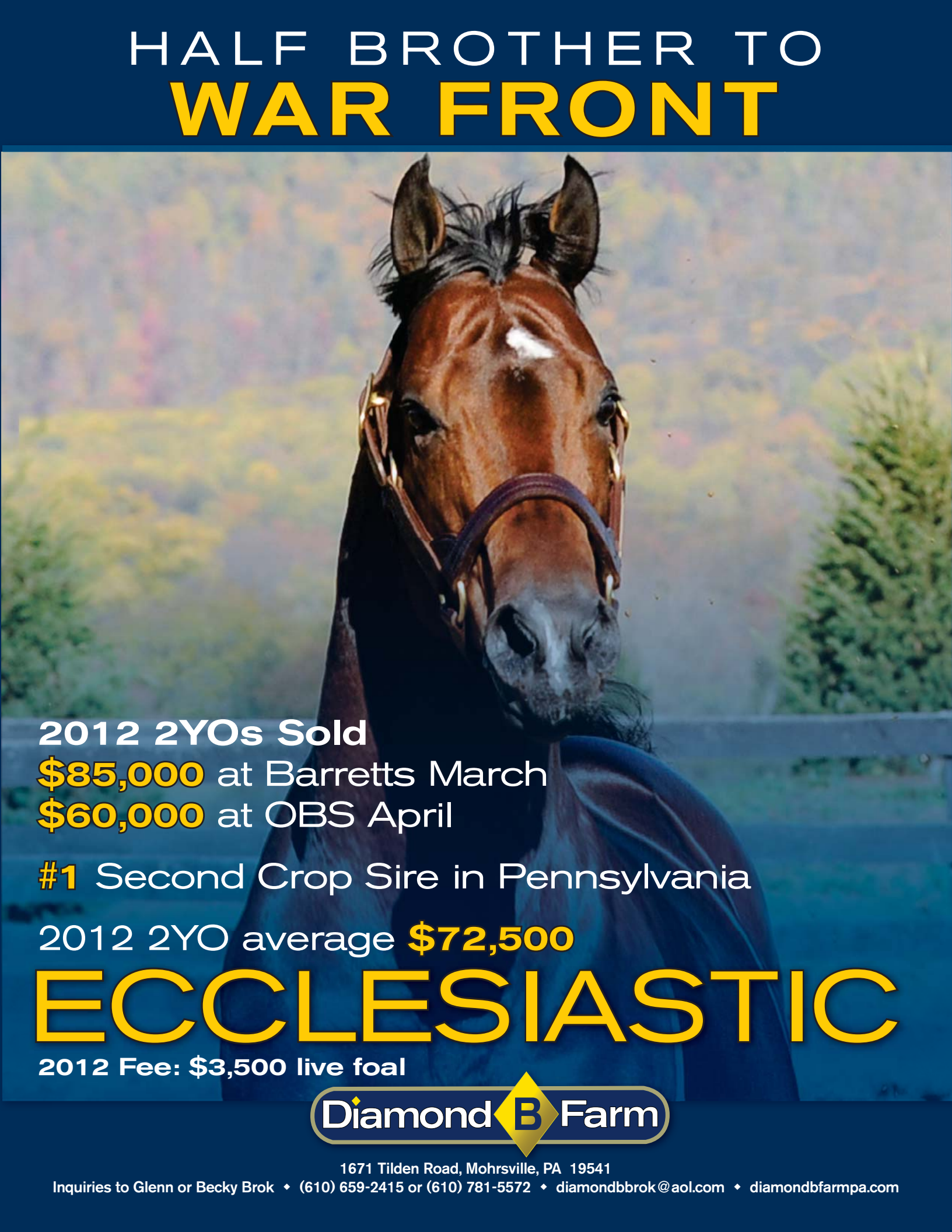
