He may get another chance at the division's best next time. "We're sure going to look [at the GI Belmont S. June 9] because it sure looked like he handled this track well, and slowing the fractions down a little bit he's going to carry that speed a lot farther," said winning trainer Larry Jones. "He'll probably be a forward factor in the Belmont, especially if Bodemeister and them rip each other apart in the Preakness. We'll see how the Preakness turns out and who's left available. CAN POULAINS PROVIDE VENGEANCE?

Simon Springer's **Dabirsim (Fr)** (Hat Trick {Jpn}) was voted France's 2011 Horse of the Year after an unbeaten season capped by success in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, but he lost his perfect record when edged by Dragon Pulse (Ire) (Kyllachy {GB}) in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau at Longchamp Apr. 15. He will bid to reassert his dominance this afternoon in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. "Everything has gone well since Dabirsim's comeback, we've had no problems at all and he seems to be in good form," trainer Christophe Ferland told *PA Sport*. "He looks like he has improved for that race, but he only does what we ask in the morning and no more. He looks like he has progressed physically since his first run of the year, and I think Christophe will have learnt a lot about the horse from riding him last time. He is out for revenge and I am happy with stall one. It's a Group 1 race, and it would be fantastic if he can get back to winning ways. Then everybody will forget him finishing second on his first run of the season." Earlier on the Longchamp card is the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulaches for sophomore fillies. **Cont. p3-4**

ADIEU ADELAIDE, HELLO ASCOT

For the second time in the last 14 days, **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) treated a packed house of 30,000 racegoers at Adelaide's Morphettville Racetrack to another overwhelming performance, as she prepped for the June 23 G1 Diamond Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot with her 21st career victory in the G1 Goodwood S. The winning margin of 1 1/4 lengths belies the ease with which it was accomplished. Away faster than usual from the eight hole, the 5-year-old tugged Luke Nolen to the early lead and the duo were happy to make the running, as nothing was willing to take them on. 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Dabirsim, successful in the G3 Prix de Cabourg and G1 Prix Morny during last year's Deauville festival, added the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere to his tally over seven furlongs here on Arc day. On that occasion, Frankie Dettori left it uncomfortably late, but escaped unscathed due to his mount's electric acceleration. However, on the colt's return in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau, it was another rider who was left red-faced. Christophe Soumillon's natural confidence is nearly always a plus in the saddle, but, in that Apr. 15 trial over this track and trip, it was his showmanship that contributed to a first reversal for Dabirsim when short-headed by **Dragon Pulse**.

"I would prefer to be in the middle, but stall one is better than stall 12 of 12," Ferland added. "I can't complain, as we are next to our lead horse, and we'll make a plan with Christophe about which tactics to use."

Dragon Pulse was having his first start for the Mikel Delzangles stable in the Fontainebleau, having started out with Jessie Harrington last term.

He beat the subsequent G1 Dewhurst S. winner Parish Hall (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and Friday's impressive G3 Dee S. scorer Astrology (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. over seven furlongs in August before finishing runner-up in the G1 National S. back over that track and trip the following month and looks the main danger to Dabirsim again.

The Poulains has gone to overseas raiders on three of the last seven occasions, and this renewal features some progressive types from Britain and Germany. Gestut Winterhauch's **Amaron (GB)** (Shamardal) beat the subsequent G1 Criterium International runner-up Pakal (Ger) (Lord of England {Ger}) in the G3 Zukunfts-Rennen at Baden-Baden in August before finishing third behind Tai Chi (Ger) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in Cologne's G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten in October. Back with a win in the G3 Dr Busch-Memorial over 1 1/16 miles at Krefeld Apr. 22, his stamina will come into force if this is run at a genuine pace.

Richard Hannon relies on last Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas fifth **Coupe de Ville (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) and he offers the first test of that form, having been just under four lengths behind Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}).

"It might be a bit quick, but Coupe de Ville came back bouncing and he looked in good order when Steve Knight gave him a breeze up at Everleigh midweek, so we are rolling the dice again," Hannon commented. "What swayed us is that the French race has cut up. Obviously Dabirsim is a decent horse, as is Dragon Pulse, but Coupe de Ville finished right on top of their challengers at Newmarket and we know that he will love the ground." **Cont. p4**

"The horse is in good form and this has been the plan all along, but he's got a lousy draw," Gosden told *PA Sport*. "Longchamp is a great track, but it has one major flaw and that is the mile start. If you have eight runners, it's fine, but when you are getting into double figures, it really is a terrible draw."

PETITE ETOILE

She may be one of the lesser-exposed contenders for today's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulaches at Longchamp, but **Petite Noblesse (Fr)** (Galileo {Ire}) looks to possess a fair share of star quality and warrants maximum respect from the Andre Fabre stable. Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's filly was having her first start since a winning debut over six furlongs last July when a strong-finishing runner-up over a mile at Saint-Cloud Apr. 1 and built on that when registering a six-length success in a course-and-distance conditions event 22 days later. Coolmore are also represented by one of last year's leading members of the juvenile fillies category in **Fire Lily (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}). Showing plentiful pace when successful in the G3 Anglesey S. over an extended six-furlong trip at The Curragh in July, the David Wachman trainee ended up with seconds in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. back there over seven in August and the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac over this track and trip on Arc day.

Well-positioned by Rosie Napravnik as Right to Vote sizzled through a :45.35 half, Mark Valeski made a sweeping move on the outside to reach contention. The pacesetter dug in admirably, but the favorite was confidently handled through the final furlong. Street Life made a bold rally to cut the margin nearing the wire. "I was a little worried about all the ground we were losing, but at the same time with the fast pace I didn't want to tuck in and get stuck behind, because I knew I was on the best horse," Napravnik explained. "When I pressed the button, even with all the ground we lost, he was much the best and ran great today."

Main Sequence's light was hidden under a bushel on debut at Yarmouth in September, but the homebred belied his odds of 50-1 to score there and was favored when following up in a nursery over nine furlongs at Newmarket the following month. Returning to that track for the 10-furlong Craven meeting handicap Apr. 19 won by the likes of Papal Bull (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Wigmore Hall (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in recent years, he made it three-for-three when displaying the same dash and earned a place in this established prep for the June 2 Epsom Derby. Lambourn-based trainer David Lanigan indicated that Main Sequence will stay at home for his next appearance. "I've just spoken to Alan Cooper and although he is in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club [at Chantilly June 3], he sees no reason to drop him back in trip now that he's won over a mile and a half and Epsom will be the plan as long as he's okay tomorrow," he explained. "Obviously Camelot is a very nice horse and is the one to beat, but our horse has answered every question put in front of him."

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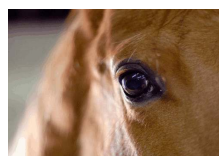
Unbeaten in his native Italy, Scuderia Effeve's **Crackerjack King (Ire)** (Sharamdal) faces some stern opposition as he defends that status in today's G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica at the Capannelle. Successful in the G2 Derby Italiano over 11 furlongs here last May, the bay was never a factor when tried in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly in June, but looked sharp on his winning return over this trip at the San Siro Apr. 8. His trainer Stefano Botti told *Racing Post*, "Crackerjack King is very well and has come on for his winning return at San Siro. **Douce Vie (Ire)** (Desert Prince {Ire}) will make the pace and we hope he will run well in what looks a competitive race." Third behind Stall Italy's **Estejo (Ger)** (Johan Cruyff {GB}) in this 12 months ago, Riccardo Cantoni's **Quiza Quiza (GB)** (Golden Snake) has not stopped improving despite her advancing years and earned a first top-level success in the San Siro's Premio Lydia Tesio in October. Second by a length attempting to give Crackerjack King six pounds on her return in the aforementioned conditions race, that effort should have her tightly tuned for this rematch on far more favorable weight terms. Roger Varian's predecessor Michael Jarvis was always to be feared when saddling runners in Italy, and the stable sends across Sultan Ahmad Shah's **Sri Putra (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}), who is looking for a first success in this grade. Third in last year's G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot and G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown, the 6-year-old warmed up for this with a win in Kempton's Listed Paradise S. May 2. "Sri Putra has come out of his Kempton win in good form," Varian said. "It looks a hot race, but on the pick of his form he should have a very good chance."

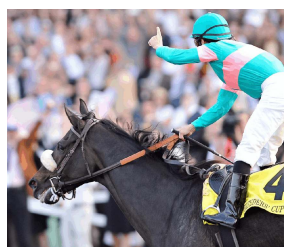

GALILEO FILLY TOPS ARQANA BREEZE-UP

Europe's Breeze-Up carnival rolled into Saint-Cloud yesterday, and it was hip [129](#), a daughter of Galileo (Ire), who topped the day's proceedings when selling to Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International for €420,000 (US\$542,600). Offered by Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables, the February-foaled bay hails from

the family of the 1994 G1 Irish Derby and G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Balanchine (Storm Bird) and a swathe of black-type performers. The deal sealed a threefold increase on the €140,000 she cost as a yearling at this venue last August. The Co. Tipperary nursery enjoyed a stellar session and was also responsible for the fourth-

highest price of the day when hip [36](#), a bay daughter of fellow Coolmore sire High Chaparral (Ire), went the way of the Niarchos Family's Course Investment Corporation for €160,000. She too yielded a significant return for Browne, jumping up from the bargain €42,000 she cost at the October Sale here. Didier Genin, who was responsible for the winning bid, told *Racing Post*, "It is a family that we know well, and she looks a very nice filly, but we were just a bit above our limit." **Cont. p12**

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Al Kazeem Has Cup Date...

John Deer's **Al Kazeem** (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) will be supplemented for the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom, trainer Roger Charlton announced yesterday. Successful in last Saturday's G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket, the homebred will tackle the June 2 feature. "It was a really good performance and he now has a Timeform rating of 125, which puts him right up there with most of the horses entered in the Coronation Cup," Charlton said. "At the moment, I'd be keen to run him at Epsom and supplementing him but is on the agenda--I think it makes sense. We'll be taking on horses like St Nicholas Abbey, Masked Marvel and Sea Moon, but if Timeform are correct we're right up there with them."

There was cause for further celebration when a son of Any Given Saturday, a \$55,000 KEESEP yearling, produced another pinhooking success for Mocklershill, selling to Didier Prod'homme's Agence Caballis for €110,000. The May foal, presented as hip 146, is a half-brother to dual G1 Preis von Europa runner-up Posiedon Adventure (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The session's silver medal award also arrived late in the day when Dick O'Gorman bagged a Shamardal filly, offered as hip 158 by Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables, at €190,000. Purchased for €80,000 at last year's August Sale, the March-foaled bay is a half-sister to 2006 Listed Land o'Burns Fillies' S. victress Free Roses (Ire) (Fasliyev), and comes from the family of GI Kentucky Derby hero Winning Colors (Caro {Ire}). Brown Island Stables took third place on the podium when its Medaglia d'Oro colt, from the family of 2003 champion juvenile filly and MGISW Halfbridled (Unbridled), was knocked down to Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International Agency. Johnny Collins' \$10,000 Keeneland September investment, selling as hip 82, realised a monster dividend following a final bid of €170,000.

"He is a lovely colt and will join [trainer] Mikel Delzangles," de Watrigant, acting on behalf of a Qatari client, told *Racing Post*. "The owner has several pure-bred Arabians, but this is his first time buying at the breeze-ups."

Overall, the day's 12 six-figure transactions couldn't match last term's tally of 19, which was reflected in a downturn across the board. The sale aggregate dropped 12%, although increased private sales favorably assisted the adjusted gross, and the average slipped just under 9% to €56,776. The median fared worse and was down 16% to €42,000.

At the conclusion of trade, Arqana President Eric Hoyer commented, "After constant progression in the sale's results since 2005, today's Breeze Up has confirmed itself as the second most important sale of its kind in Europe having set a new French record at €420,000 for a daughter of Galileo offered from Mocklershill. The market was strongly supported by a very international clientele, notably Hong Kong, Saudi Arabia, Qatar, Japan, Malaysia and Scandinavia, with the majority of horses staying to be trained in France."

with the first of three sessions. Once again, Keeneland's Tom Thornbury was tapped to help select the yearlings that comprise the 210-horse catalogue, which includes youngsters by Giant's

Causeway, Speightstown, Tapit, Tiznow and other internationally known stallions.

The Copa Bullrich Sale, begun in 2006, is emerging as a fixture on the international sales calendar, and local horsemen are embracing its affect on the nation's horse industry. "The yearling market in Argentina has changed a lot in the past years," said Haras Rodeo Chico's Matias Villamil, who also works at Bullrich. "Ten years ago, the best yearlings were sold privately, and just a few farms sold their horses in their own sales, most of them in the Southern Hemisphere spring. Small farms would sell their horses after the sales of the big farms. Copa Bullrich has changed the market. It gives an opportunity to all breeders, both big and small, to sell in a big and well-promoted sale."

Villamil credited Thornbury, who has assisted the selection team for the past three years, with helping bring the sale along. "It's amazing not only the good prices these 'selected' horses made, but the good results they had on the racetracks," said Villamil. Graduates include Pataques (Arg) (Catcher in the Rye {Ire}), who won the Copa Bullrich Sales Race in April before going on to capture G1 Gran Premio de Montevideo May 1.

The sale's growing prominence parallels that of Argentina's racing industry in general. Ten years ago, there were roughly 5,000 foals born each year in the country. Last year, the number reached 9,500. "The main reason for this change is that the cost of breeding horses in Argentina has been really very cheap, and the whole country enjoyed an economic surge from 2003 through 2008," said Villamil. He added that the import of international stock has helped the country gain recognition. "Many of the best stallions in the U.S. and Europe have been shuttled to Argentina, and Argentina's breeders have been active buyers at the breeding stock sales of America and Europe," said Villamil.

"This probably is the main reason why Argentina has entered the international market. I don't know if these horses are better than the horses Argentina used to breed 10 years ago, because we have to know that Argentine families are still very strong not only in Argentina and South America, but around the world. Invasor (Arg), Rio de la Plata and Candy Ride (Arg), just to mention some, were out of very old Argentine families. But the truth is that many international buyers may feel much comfortable when seeing an American or an European pedigree."

Another factor in Argentina's success: revenue from slots that supplements purses. Palermo Racetrack in near Buenos Aires installed slots in 2003 and currently is one of the world's biggest racinos, with some 5,000 machines located beneath the track itself. "It's amazing how the track has changed in nine years," said Villamil. "The other two big race tracks in Argentina, San Isidro and La Plata, don't have slot machines, but they receive a subsidy from the government that helps them to have competitive purses."

CHARLIE BUDGETT, ANTONIO BULLRICH'S INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATIVE IN ARGENTINA

What kind of growth has Argentina's racing industry undergone in the past few decades?

"Argentine racing is growing rapidly. Before 1980, there was only weekend racing. Since then, San Isidro has re-opened, and now there is racing almost every day of the year, with the labor force involved in racing, directly or indirectly, having grown from 400,000 in 2002 to 1 million at the present day."

In line with that, Argentina's foal crop has nearly doubled in the past five years, reaching roughly 9,500 in 2011. What are Argentine racing authorities planning for the future? More racecourses in the interior? How would they fund themselves?

"At present only four racecourses are recognized by the Argentine Stud book: Palermo, La Plata and San Isidro in the Buenos Aires province; and San Luis, in the province of San Luis. **Cont. p14**



The idea is to re-open three or four racecourses that were closed in the past, and they would be able to take a lot of the pressure off the existing four registered racecourses. New/re-opened racecourses that are planned include one in Rosario, Mendoza, and a couple more in the province of Buenos Aires. The plan is that these courses will be funded by the state, through slots, and also privately. The aim for gambling in the future is to follow the parimutuel method of gambling in France. These new courses will all be registered so that races will all be logged in the stud book."

The racing leadership in the U.S. has been criticized for being too fractious. How is it set up in Argentina?

"There is a racing commission for each province, ruled by the province called the Loteria Provincial, and the National Lottery (Loteria Nacional) is the governing body that all provincial tracks need to report to. All need same rules to be registered with stud book Argentino, and this will have to be enforced in the new racetracks if and when they are up and running."

Where do they see the export opportunities in the future and new investment coming from? South Africa and Australasia seem obvious targets for sale; what is being done to get potential investors to Argentina?

"The main buyers for Argentine-bred horses are for horses in training, and they are from the U.S. and Dubai. The market for yearlings is limited to South America. The main barrier to exporting horses to South Africa and Australasia is the shipping costs, and their lack of knowledge of the Argentine Thoroughbred."

ACTION ON DRUGS

On February 29, I published a column in *TDN* ([click here](#)) expressing my disappointment in the action of TOBA's Graded Stakes Committee in delaying implementation of their decision to run North American graded stakes for 2-year-olds free of raceday medication in 2012, and explaining why I was therefore resigning my membership in TOBA. We had a tremendous response from readers, of which over 60 sent emails to TOBA, state regulators and racetracks in New York, California, and Kentucky, which combined run 40 of the 45 scheduled graded races for 2-year-olds before the Breeders' Cup; 95% of those emails were for the elimination of raceday medication in graded stakes for 2-year-olds. Though no immediate action took place which has resulted in a reversal of the delay, there was a lot going on behind the scenes which is now entering the public domain. To those readers who felt then or feel now this is a critical issue which demands action by those who support the ban on raceday medication, it is time now for you to again take action.

The Jockey Club has created and launched a website: www.cleanhorseracing.org. If you go to this website, you'll see a section entitled 'Take Action'. If you click on this icon, you will see three separate forms which you can fill out and send to the relevant authorities. One signs the TOBA petition against raceday meds. A second provides a form which you can fill out and send to state regulators expressing your views. The third is of immediate importance, and requires immediate action: this is the icon inviting you to send an email to the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. The NYSRWB is soliciting comments from ALL interested parties on this issue of raceday meds, and these comments must be submitted by 5pm EDT tomorrow, Monday, May 14. Even if you sent them a message earlier, it is vitally important that you send them another now. New York is acting as though they now really want to listen; ok, let's make the effort to state again what we think, and why. There has to be a chance this can make a difference, so it's of critical importance that those who believe raceday meds should be banned, whether you want to argue for a ban for graded 2-year-old races, or all races in New York state, participate in this process. Please act now.

Everything we've asked him to do, he does. Today was a big test, and he passed with flying colors." Added Vella, "With him sitting that close, I knew he had to be doing it quite easy. We talked about settling him, and trying to get him off the bridle, because we want to go a mile and a quarter. Obviously, he did that. SANGSTER KEEPS THE FAITH

Thoroughbred racing never conforms to arithmetic or even fashion.

As Black Caviar (Aus) limbered up for her highly paid exhibition gallop and 21st straight win Saturday, two daughters of the recently castoff sire Keep The Faith (Aus) won coveted stakes races. In doing so they displayed the Thoroughbred's capacity to prove that two and two never make four--often it's five, or one.

In the autumnal sunshine of Morphettville, Adelaide, and before 31,000 fans awaiting the world record-breaking black mare, we saw Dinkum Diamond (Aus) run away with the G3 Janz S. for 2-year-olds, increase her value to De Beers proportions and set the tongues talking about the failure of her father.

He probably deserved it.

Before Dinkum Diamond, the U.S. six-furlong record holder and son of the legendary Sunday Silence, had not sired a stakes horse in six seasons and recently suffered the ignominy of being moved from his home at Adam Sangster's Swettenham Stud outside Melbourne to a nearby, but lesser-profile farm. Last season just 13 mares attended Keep The Faith's sensual soirees, an appalling commercial result from one who had promised so much.

This is a horse who in his day had the black mare's electric speed and ripped off six furlongs in 1:06.82 on Belmont's turf- and before the eyes of stud masters around the world. Adam Sangster, son of Robert, was one of them. He negotiated with owner Sheikh Mohammed and returned the stallion to his famously named farm, the Sangster birthright, about an hour from Melbourne.

On Saturday, Adam was displaying a lot of charm, bemused by the second stakes winner on the day for Keep The Faith, a filly called Lucky Penny (Aus), who remained unbeaten by winning the Listed Laelia S. for 3-year-olds over a mile. While this win raised the hopes of a hot Queensland winter and a G1 Guineas, her owners realize that her three wins began at Wodonga, a country track of modest pretension and not all that long ago. Still here was a 3-year-old filly threatening big things with lots of blue sky, enough to give Adam a grin, but not enough to cause remorse at his actions of moving the stallion on. **Cont. p11**



A British expatriate who lives in Melbourne and runs the stud who incidentally prepared and sold Black Caviar as a yearling, Adam is a son of his father. His reaction to Saturday's stakes success from his commercial failure was typically laid back and generous.

'We always leave a few puffs in the cigar' was how he described the relocation of his once pride and joy, 'that is the Sangster way.'

It was a nice way of telling the stallion's new owners that the only way was to persevere. Not that two stakes winners in a sixth year would turn around his fortunes. The die is cast and everyone knows it for Keep The Faith, a living example of the global stable.

Bred to southern time by an agreement between breeding juggernauts Australia's Arrowfield and Japan's Shadai Farm, Keep the Faith is a 2000 foal by Sunday Silence from Dayjur mare Duelling Girl. Shipped back to Arrowfield the colt was bought by Sheikh Mohammed for a lofty A\$1.2 million at Easter's 2002 yearling sale and sent to Lindsay Park in South Australia then run by trainer Tony McEvoy in the absence of his boss David Hayes who had relocated to Hong Kong. McEvoy got him to win a listed race at Caulfield and a couple of races at Morphettville before Sheikh Mohammed decided a U.S. foray was what the expensive, exotically bred colt needed.

Then, running in Godolphin's colors, came the New York run that stunned the world. Perhaps by searing the grass Keep The Faith sowed the seeds of his own destruction, because nothing destroys a stallion more than expectation.
