HIS FINAL FLOURISH?

Whether Ascot's G1 QIPCO Champion S. is the farewell venture of Khalid Abdullah's remarkable **Frankel**

(GB) (Galileo {Ire}) remains to be seen, but the race with an eye on becoming the world's greatest takes on a gravity all its own today. Reams have been written about Juddmonte's peerless talent, with hardened judges in no doubt as to his standing in a historical perspective,

and it all seems to lead to an experience that will last just over two minutes in Berkshire this afternoon. Set against the backdrop of legendary trainer Sir Henry Cecil's ongoing health concerns, the story of the colt who was named in honor of another who helped to set the gold standard for the training profession reaches an almost-unbearable high-pressure climax here. Cecil is left in no doubt as to the significance of the colt's presence in his own life story. "I am so lucky to have been allocated Frankel to train," he said. "He has been an inspiration and challenge, which I really needed so badly. Through my illness, I feel that the help from my wife Jane and the determination to be there for Frankel has helped me so much to get through the season."

BLESSED RELIEF

Bar Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) being asked to run twice in just over half an hour, today's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. was always going to be a refuge for the downtrodden, and there are few horses that need it more than **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). Beaten on five occasions by the wonder of Warren Place, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's acquisition has previously had to venture overseas for sanctuary. In last year's G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and on his latest outing in the Aug. 12 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville, the 4-year-old has boosted his own credentials as a leading miler, as well as underlining the brilliance of his revered opponent. There would be a sense of justice if Ballydoyle can guide him to a deserved top-level victory in Britain today, and Aidan O'Brien is happy that he can avoid more Frankel-bashing. "He had a busy-enough campaign early on and met Frankel twice, but we were delighted with him in France and he seems well since," he said. "He's been in good form since his last run, and the QEII was the race we were looking at. He's a very good horse--he was a very good horse last year and the year before." Cont. p8

MANDELLA GEARING UP FOR BREEDERS' CUP

Hall of Fame trainer Richard Mandella, who saddled an unprecedented four winners at the 2003 Breeders'

Cup at Santa Anita, has a pair of live contenders for this year's edition of the championships. Both **Beholder** (Henny Hughes) and **Jimmy Creed** (Distorted Humor) are owned by Spendthrift Farm; Beholder is expected to be cross-entered in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, while Jimmy Creed, third in the GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship last out, will go for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. "They both worked an easy three-eighths the other day and they'll get a serious work next week," Mandella said. "They came out in great shape." Beholder, who missed by a lip in the GI Del Mar Debutante, came back with a tour de force in a six-furlong Santa Anita allowance Oct. 4 ([video](#)). "Beholder is intended most likely for the [Juvenile] Sprint," Mandella offered. "I think she wants to sprint more than anything right now, and that's what we're looking at. There's a small chance of changing our mind and going for the Juvenile Fillies, but right now it would be the Sprint." As for the 3-year-old Jimmy Creed, Mandella added, "[He] is doing well. He ran a good race here, but it looked like with a little luck he could have had a better position, so I've got to give him another try at it." **Breeders' Cup notes p13**

Miz Ida paired up wins on the Fair Grounds turf over the winter, including the Allen Lacombe Memorial S. Mar. 10, but had a wide trip and wound up seventh in the Edgewood S. at Churchill May 4. She resurfaced in Shelbyville to take the Indiana Distaff S. July 11, and came into this contest off a victory against her elders in the Kentucky Downs Ladies Turf S. Sept. 8. Sent off as the second choice to 4-5 Pianist (More Than Ready), the Klein homebred settled into a ground-saving spot in midpack. Jockey Shaun Bridgmohan angled her off the

fence turning for home and the pair set their sights on English Class, who took the lead in midstretch. That longshot dug in gamely, but Miz Ida pinned her ears and hit the wire first. "I thought I had a phenomenal trip," Bridgmohan opined. "I'm getting to know this filly a little better every time I've ridden her. She's matured mentally and physically. You couldn't ask her to be doing any better. [Trainer Steve

against open company at the Erie oval July 4, then ran a close fourth--beaten 1 1/2 lengths--behind Alaura Michele (Arch) in the restricted Nani

Rose S. on the Saratoga sod July 29. That seemed promising enough, but her subsequent inactivity against a competitive group here saw her dismissed at 27-1. The chestnut strolled out of the gate and cabooseed the field as Volcat (After Market) took the field through splits of :48.49 and 1:14.24. Jockey James Graham committed to weaving through traffic as they entered the stretch and Angel Terrace was more than up for the challenge, knifing between rivals to hit the wire in tandem with Miss Cato, who had been charging down the center of the course. "It looked like a pretty tough spot, but she is a nice filly," said winning trainer Jonathan Sheppard. "I thought if she settled nicely and if the speed backed up, she had a shot to get a piece of it. In fact, I wasn't really looking for the win. It was great."

As for today's challenge, Cecil added, "It will be a far-from-easy race with **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) and **Nathaniel (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in the line-up.

"They are two good horses who will go in the ground and get the trip really well. They have to be really respected." He then served notice that Frankel may even be at a peak on Saturday, saying, "I was very pleased with Frankel's final piece of work. He gives the impression that he is better than ever and still improving. I could not be happier with him. He seems full of himself and, considering the time of year, he is really good and healthy in his coat. He eats everything put in front of him." Though Frankel enters in top form, there are some concerns as it relates to the underfoot conditions. "We'd have to look at it if it was heavy or bottomless, as we have to do what we think is right for him, but he should handle soft," commented Racing Manager Lord Teddy Grimthorpe. **cont. p7**

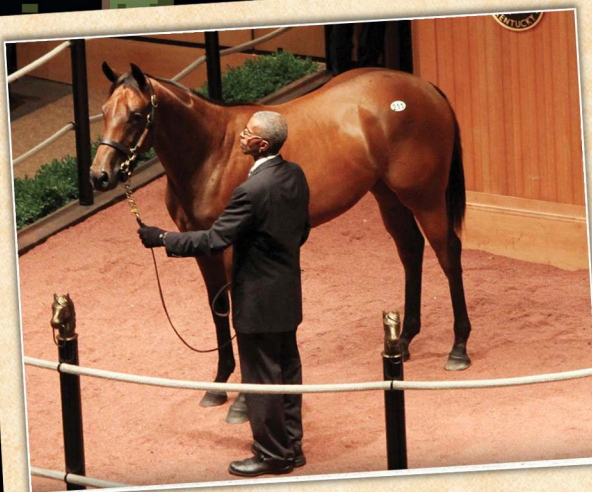

Grimthorpe added, "He's going to be a tough nut to crack, but we've always taken every race extremely seriously." There have been mutterings this week that retirement may not be as certain as was expected. "We've had three fantastic years with him, and this time, Prince Khalid will make the final decision [on retirement]," Grimthorpe explained. "He's more than aware that he shares him with the wider public now and has been hugely overwhelmed by the support of and interest in him, but it's a very personal thing, and he's aware of all the opportunities for him, both on the racecourse and at stud."

The Cloud On the Horizon...

There is always another side to every story, and an extra dimension is added by the presence of the unfashionably bred gelding Cirrus des Aigles. His rise to prominence from humble beginnings has been dramatic in its own way, and, at the age of six, the apple of trainer Corine Barande-Barbe's eye still looks to be on the upgrade if three of his seasonal performances are to be believed. After winning the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, he spread-eagled the fields assembled for the Apr. 29 G1 Prix Ganay and Oct. 6 G2 Prix Dollar on soft ground at Longchamp. While Frankel poses a greater test than the So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) he defeated in this 12 months ago, he at least has the testing conditions in his favor. "It's a great experience and we are very happy to be lucky enough to have a horse to meet Frankel with a chance," his conditioner said. "The better the field, the better Cirrus is, but Frankel is 'extraterrestre.' His latest performance might mean that he has progressed, but it might also mean that he had plenty of energy after his break. He knows how to swim--he loves deep ground, and Frankel has never really run on it, but Frankel is like him, in that every time he has a new challenge he is better. Deep ground disturbs other horses more than Cirrus, but he doesn't need it. This is the magic of racing--let's see how the King-bred and the peasant get on against each other."

On any other day, the connections of Lady Rothschild's Nathaniel would have every right to be confident entering Group 1 territory, with two successes at that level already in the locker in last year's G1 King George S. and this term's G1 Eclipse S. Ruled out of the Arc due to a temperature, the John Gosden trainee meets Frankel for the first time since their debut on Newmarket's July Course in 2010. Jockey William Buick is under no illusions as to the task he faces today. "Frankel needs to be savored, but from a professional point of view, I'm out there to beat him, and Nathaniel is a very good horse," he commented. "He's had a magnificent season, is in good form and this is his last race before he goes to stud. I'm not saying he can beat Frankel, but I think he'll give him a race."

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Stall Antanando's **Pastorius (Ger)** (Soldier Hollow {GB}) is among Europe's leading middle-distance colts, but wins in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 1 and Munich's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis four weeks later need to be bettered to even figure against the older generation. "Frankel is in another world compared to our horse and I would be delighted if we made the first three," summarised trainer Mario Hofer. "I am very happy with Pastorius and, without risk, there is no reward."

Khalid Abdullah's day could be bolstered by a win for **Cityscape**, who has 1 1/4 lengths to make up on Excelebration from Deauville. Subsequently third behind Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) on unsuitably fast ground in the Sept. 16 GI Woodbine Mile, the homebred has conditions much more in his favor here. Trainer Roger Charlton said, "He has had a busy season, having travelled well over 50,000 miles in the last 12 months, running in five different countries and in the process earning £2.5 million. He has been a fantastic servant to Beckhampton and, like his half-brother Bated Breath (GB) (Dansili {GB}), he has been very consistent. [Today's] race comes at the end of a demanding schedule and it is possible that this will be his last race. It would be wonderful if he could run another brave race at the highest level." Third in the Jacques le Marois, Teruya Yoshida's **Elusive Kate** may have had excuses when runner-up to Siyouma (Ire) (Medicean {GB}) in Newmarket's G1 Sun Chariot S. Sept. 29, and jockey William Buick is expecting her to make amends for that effort. "She would have won the Sun Chariot if it hadn't been for her shoe hanging off, and the winner went on to win the [GI] E. P. Taylor [S. Oct. 14], so she could be a worry for the leading players," he said. "She's had a magnificent season and I can't remember the last time she ran a bad race. She ran well on soft in the Falmouth, but this ground might be different and I'm not sure if she'll handle it."

UNWELCOME RAIN

Today's G2 British Champions Fillies & Mares S. at Ascot sees the belated return of last year's winner **Dancing Rain (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), but connections fear that ground conditions might play against her on her comeback from injury. Despite handling soft ground when successful in last year's G1 Preis der Diana at Dusseldorf, trainer William Haggas was unhappy to see the recent deluges in Berkshire and issued a note of caution yesterday. "It will be mightily difficult for her on her first run of the season, especially because we feel she is better on the top of the ground," he told *PA Sport*. "It's been a long year with her, but she seems in good form. We'll hopefully be taking her for some of the races abroad again, but we'll just take it one step at a time." Giving seven pounds to the 3-year-old generation further stacks the odds against her, but Lady Rothschild's G1 Irish Oaks heroine **Great Heavens (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) has the disadvantage of having run in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe 13 days earlier. A respectable sixth there, the John Gosden trainee has to prove that the effort has not taken the edge off.

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"I thought she ran great in the Arc. I was proud of her and she takes on lesser company here, so if she didn't do too much in Paris, she'll be fine," jockey William Buick said. "The ground is fine for her and I'm really looking forward to riding her." Another from the Classic crop is Ballydoyle's **Was (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who has become something of a forgotten horse after her G1 Epsom Oaks success June 1. Derrick Smith's colorbearer may have been flattered by that performance and looked to have her limitations exposed when third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks last time Aug. 23, but she has been freshened for this test by Aidan O'Brien, and he is keeping the faith. "She ran a very good race in York, the ground got slow enough for her, as she wants nice ground," he said. "She's a hardy lady and we still think she's progressing. I think she gets a mile and a half well--a mile and a quarter is fine, but she wants it strongly-run."

Maeve Mahony's **Wizz Kid (Ire)** (Whipper) has already garnered the prestigious home prize of the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp 13 days ago and, providing she can bounce back from that effort, holds a leading chance in this dash. "She is great and we hope she can run as good a race as last year, when she went very close and was second," trainer Robert Collet's wife Micheline told *PA Sport*. "The filly is in good condition after the Abbaye, and the ground is perfect for her. The unique point always with her is travel. Sometimes, she does not travel well. If she travels well, she will run well. She is due in Ascot on Friday evening." Boosting the French raid is Guy Pariente's **Restiadargent (Fr)** (Kendargent {Fr}), who was beaten just a head and a neck by Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}) and compatriot Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the June 23 G1 Diamond Jubilee S. over this track and trip. She has failed to fire on two occasions subsequently, but excels on testing ground as she showed when winning last year's G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte in stellar fashion. Heading the home defence is Simon Gibson's **Society Rock (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who bounced back to his best last time when successful in the Sept. 8 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Also successful in last year's G1 Golden Jubilee S. over this course and distance, the 5-year-old represents the James Fanshawe stable which was responsible for last year's winner Deacon Blues (GB) (Compton Place {GB}). "He seems nice and bright and came out of the Sprint Cup in good form," his trainer explained.

Runner-up last year, Godolphin's **Opinion Poll (Ire)** (Halling) tries again on his first outing since being upstaged by stable companion **Colour Vision (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest) in the June 21 Gold Cup. Colour Vision was only a nose behind in third in this race last year and there is very little between the Godolphin duo.

Defections, Additions to Championship Races

- Michael Dubb's **My Happy Face** (Tiz Wonderful), a gut-wrenching second to Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy) last out in the GI Frizette S. at Belmont Oct. 6, will remain as expected in New York instead of flying west for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "I don't think it's in her best interest to put her on a plane and ship her to California and run in a race like that," Dubb told *Daily Racing Form*. Dubb was recently named to the New York Racing Association Reorganization Board. "It does bother me that the Breeders' Cup hasn't been in New York since '05," he added. "I don't think it's giving people on the East Coast a level playing field. I'm a New York guy, I want to support New York racing."
- The Niarchos family's **Duntle (Ire)** (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}), disqualified from first in the G1 Matron S. at Leopardstown Sept. 8, has been removed from consideration from the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. According to *Daily Racing Form*, the only confirmed overseas runner for that \$2-million event is George Strawbridge's Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}).

RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Presvis Succumbs to Colic

Leonidas Marinopoulos' globetrotting **Presvis (GB)** (Sakhee--Forest Fire {Swe}, by Never So Bold {Ire}), who was retired to Normandy in France after competing at Meydan's Mar. 31 Dubai World Cup card, has died after a bout of colic. Successful in the 2009 G1 Audemars Piguet QEI Cup at Sha Tin for trainer Luca Cumani, the renowned hold-up performer registered a second top-level score in last year's G1 Dubai Duty Free at Meydan. He retired as the all-time leading British-trained money earner with £4,318,943, and a career record of 28-8-6-3. "He was a great favourite over the years, both here and abroad with a big fan club," read a statement on *lucacumani.com*. "Though ever more eccentric as he got older, and not the force he was this year that he was last, he still ended his career having won the most amount of prizemoney ever by a British-trained racehorse, which is a record that seems sure to stand for many years."



WRITERS UP

JERRY FRANKEL STEALS THE SHOW

Racehorse owner and Broadway play producer Jerry Frankel has spent many years working towards the highest echelons of his two favorite industries. He has achieved success in both endeavors along the way, but his journey reached a climax when he won his most

important race and unveiled perhaps his best acclaimed play, all in the space of a half hour last Saturday night.

When Dayatthespa (City Zip) stormed to a wire-to-wire victory to earn her first Grade I win in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, Frankel was in New York, preparing for the opening of his Broadway play revival, "Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf."

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That didn't stop him from watching the race and cheering on his filly just before curtain went up on his show, and he recalled fondly the electric environment of what was perhaps his greatest win as an owner.

"I watched the race on the internet in the office of our advertising agency," Frankel explained. "There were about 20 people in the room, some who aren't horse people, and some that have never been to the races, and everyone was really excited. She ran the kind of race that you're never quiet about, because she was on the front end the whole time. I yell when my horses run, I get very excited, especially for a race like this, but I stopped for a second to listen to everyone, and they were all yelling and cheering. That made it even more exciting."

Frankel is no stranger to success in both Thoroughbred ownership and Broadway production. In 2003, he campaigned Grade I winner and California Horse of the Year Joey Franco, and he ran a horse called Esops Foibles in the 1978 Kentucky Derby to finish fifth behind Affirmed. His homebred filly Spring Awakening was named the top 2-year-old filly in California after winning the Mocassin S. and the California Breeders' Champion S. in 2007.

Frankel has earned seven Tony Awards, the highest praise on Broadway, as a producer since 1999. Some of his most acclaimed hits include the musical Spring Awakening, the namesake of his filly; Pulitzer Prize-winning August: Osage County, a drama featuring an Oklahoma family, and November, a David Mamet comedy about an anxious presidential election candidate. **Cont. p15**



On Saturday, Frankel experienced the pinnacle of both his fields in the same evening.

"A half hour after the race, the curtain went up on 'Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf,'" Frankel said. "It was the 50th anniversary of when it was first presented on Broadway, to the date. It was an exciting night. There were a lot of celebrities there and all the critics were there."

While Dayatthespa staked her claim as one of the leading turf fillies in the country, 'Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf' announced itself as one of the most successful plays in recent years.

"We had about 40 reviews on it, and every one of them was super," Frankel said with enthusiasm. "Arguably I could say it's the best review a Broadway play has gotten in the last five years. So my horse became very valuable that day, and so did the play. It was supposed to run until Jan. 10, and we announced an extension already to the end of February. I have a feeling that it's going to keep on doing business. I wouldn't be surprised if we have a very good chance to win the Tony for this."

Frankel's pair of successes have more in common than the man behind the scenes. Both 'Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf', as a revival, and Dayatthespa, as a twice-raced graded stakes placed filly, were identified by Frankel as attractive business propositions to buy into. In fact, Frankel has had success with both tried and original products both on Broadway and in racing: he has won Tonys for both original and revival shows, and has experienced success as an owner with horses he has bred, untried prospects and horses he has purchased in training.

Growing up in New York, Frankel was exposed to both racing and theatre from a young age. The 82-year-old has dabbled in both for most of his life, but was able to begin exploring his passions on a larger scale when he sold his Dallas-based women's apparel company, Jerell Inc., in 1999 for an undisclosed sum.

While he raced most of his horses solely in his name in the beginning, Frankel has become more involved in partnerships in recent years.

"I enjoy sharing the experience with people," he explained. "It's just like producing shows. My partner and myself are the lead producers, but we have a lot of other partners who invest with us in shows and we've done quite well."

One of Frankel's longtime partners in both Broadway and racehorse ownership has been his brother Ronald. They bought into the Dayatthespa partnership, which also includes Steve Laymon and Bradley Thoroughbreds, after the filly finished second in last year's GIII Natalma S. The New York-bred finished ninth, beaten five lengths, next out in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, but has not lost in five starts since.

The Frankel brothers have focused for the past few years on buying at the 2-year-old in training sales, and this November they plan to purchase a small handful of broodmares. Frankel has been involved in pinhooking partnerships with Bradley Thoroughbreds' Pete Bradley for the past two years, and has recently begun investing in stallion shares.

His most recent acquisition was an interest in City Zip, the sire of Dayatthespa. He said it was his confidence in his filly leading into the QEII that prompted him to seek out a share in the Lane's End stallion.

"I was never so sure of a horse winning a race as I was about Dayatthespa [winning the QEII]," Frankel explained. "[Trainer] Chad Brown had this race in his sights five months ago, after we won the [GIII] Appalachian S. at Keeneland. She ran such a great race that I think he couldn't wait to get her back there again. I bought a share in City Zip because I was so sure she was going to win and become his first Grade I winner. It cleared the syndicate about three days before the race."

Despite the distinct differences in his two worlds of horse racing and Broadway, Frankel is quick to draw parallels between the two businesses he loves.

"It's all the same, it's just a different product," he explained. "When people ask which I like better, I like to joke and say I like to do the thing that's easy to make money at, producing Broadway shows and being in the racing business. We all know that's a joke of course. Broadway shows are just as big a gamble as racing, but we've been lucky. I've won seven Tony Awards in the last eight years, so I've done pretty well."

With plans to run Dayatthespa next year as a 4-year-old, Frankel is hoping he may be able to add an Eclipse Award to his collection of Tonys in the near future. The filly will skip the Breeders' Cup and target the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park Nov. 25.

"If she keeps on winning, who knows what she could do," he said.

The Frankel brothers have another promising New York-bred filly in The Lady Says Yes (Scat Daddy), who is entered as an also eligible for a maiden race today at Belmont. The 2-year-old filly, which they purchased for \$180,000 at Fasig-Tipton March, was second in her lone start for trainer Chad Brown on the Saratoga lawn Aug. 22.

Frankel also has two more Broadway shows set to debut this year: Glengarry Glen Ross, a Tony-winning drama revival starring Al Pacino, on Nov. 11, and David Mamet's The Anarchist, an original two-actor drama featuring Patti LuPone and Debra Winger, on Dec. 2.

And if his horses continue to produce winning performances, he may want to tell his trainers to stay away from the entry box those days. --by Kelsey Riley

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OCTOBER TEST

The 2012 racing season is building to a crescendo. Two weeks ago the Arc meeting was run on soft ground--the prevailing surface in Europe this year--with a few shock results, including the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe itself, won by the Wertheimers' 40-1 shot Solemia, a 4-year-old filly by Poliglote. Surely the most impressive winner of the weekend, though, was Cirrus des Aigles (Even Top)'s nine-length rout of his field in the G2 Prix Dollar. The 6-year-old gelding revels in soft ground--the heavier the better--and gets his ground today when he meets the unbeaten Frankel (Galileo) in the G1 Champion S. at Ascot. Pretty universally considered the best horse any of us has ever seen, Frankel was 1-4 on Betfair yesterday to make it '14 and (maybe) out,' with Cirrus des Aigles at 13-2 and Nathaniel (Galileo), winner of a G1 King George and G1 Eclipse and a top-class horse himself, at 20-1.

We say 'maybe' 14 and out because all indications have been that no announcement about Frankel's future would be made until after today's race. All along, the betting has been prohibitive that he will stand at Prince Khalid's Banstead Manor Stud near Newmarket, though the Prince also has a beautiful farm with lots of mares near Lexington, and his American team has made it pretty clear they would love to have Frankel stand there. Then, at the sales at Newmarket earlier this week, rumors circulated that he might remain in training (he does add at least 20,000 to the gate every time he runs, which is 100,000 racegoers over a 5-race campaign, plus he is now a media star); the odds on that have shortened from 100-1 to 10-1. First, though, as his connections themselves have said, he has to contend with Cirrus des Aigles on ground that favors the challenger; no easy task.

Then, on Monday, pre-entries will be taken for the two-day Breeders' Cup meet, at Santa Anita two weeks from now, Nov. 2-3. One of the two best races at this point looks like the GI BC Ladies' Classic on Friday, in which defending champ Royal Delta (Empire Maker) encounters a much deeper field than last year, including two unbeaten fillies, 4-year-old Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course) and 3-year-old My Miss Aurelia (Smart Strike), as well as dual Grade I winners Love and Pride (A.P. Indy) and Questing (Hard Spun). Since the announcement that the recently devastating turf miler Wise Dan, a 5-year-old gelding by Wiseman's Folly (son of Hennessy), will stick to the turf, the GI BC Mile on Saturday also looks a very hot contest, as he could clash with Coolmore's Excelebration (Exceed and Excel) and the top-class French filly Moonlight Cloud (Invincible Spirit), who stretched out to win her first Group 1 at a mile last time out, in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. **Cont. p15**

And Team Valor and Graham Motion throw a real curve ball with 2011 GI Kentucky Derby winner Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux); the hint is he's ready to do this now as the beginning of his campaign to try and win the 2013 G1 Dubai World Cup. I call him an intriguing contender in this spot.

YEARLING SALES CONTINUE

Somewhere around 6,000 yearlings have sold for something in the neighborhood of \$500-million in the North American and European yearling sales since July, but we're not done yet. Monday sees two three-day stands opening: Arqana October in Deauville (509 catalogued, mostly French-breds); while Fasig October has a daunting 1,254 catalogued over the same three days in Lexington. Tattersalls' four-day October 2 catalogue finished on Thursday with 788 yearlings sold for over 31 million guineas, which was a 24% rise in number sold, and a 23% gain in gross, over last year; but Thursday was markedly off from the previous three days as sale exhaustion pretty much caught up with everybody. Many British and Irish agents will be recovering this week while the French and Americans finish what is really the final round of yearling sales.

A look at the table of leading sires of yearlings in TDN's *Instatistics* section ([click here](#) to see the leading sires table as of yesterday, at the finish of October Book 2) is particularly informative. There have been 19 sires which averaged \$200,000 or more (or the equivalent), so we'll throw in Dubawi (60 sold of 64 offered, after all, for a \$194,353 average) to make up the top 20. They are split 10-10 Europe and North America, though, significantly, four of the top five are European, the only American sire in the top five being the now-retired A.P. Indy (9 sold, average \$466,111). Galileo is of course number one, with 53 sold, of 65 offered, for an average of \$640,917. Sea The Stars is third, with 33 sold (of 41 offered), for an average of \$414,893. Oasis Dream, at £65,000 (about \$104,000, at today's rates) in 2010, and with a much better book of mares than previously as a result of his early successes, averaged \$403,600, with 19 sold of 23 offered; and Montjeu had 26 sell, of 28 offered, for an average of \$379,574. Sobering factoid: 131 of 140 yearlings sold by the five sires that averaged over \$350,000 were by European sires. Balance of Power.

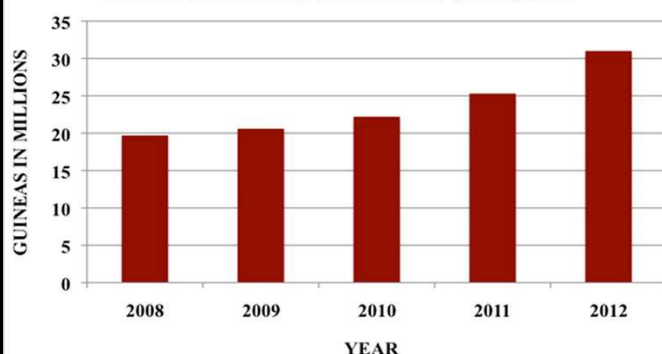

"There were complaints that Tattersalls' Book 1 and Book 2 formats (7 days of selling total) puts too much pressure on lookers, who are having difficulty seeing everything (solution: hire more 'scouts'). However, it's difficult to argue with the results: adding a fourth day to Book 2, they catalogued 25% more, sold 24% more; the gross increased by 23%, and the average was down by less than £500 (-1%). That sounds like a pretty good win all around. At close of business Thursday, the European yearling sales were up 12.5% in gross and 7% in average from last year." — Bill Oppenheim

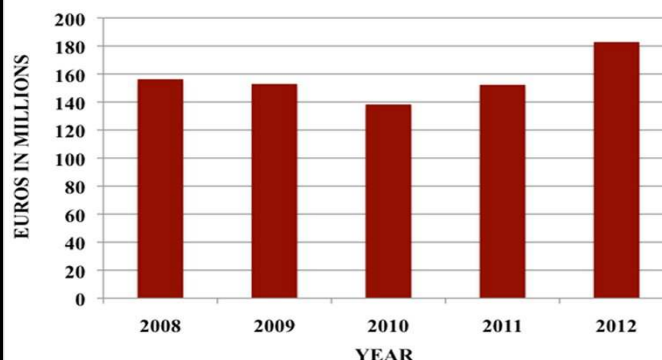

The Difference Between 'Bench Dogs & Field Dogs'

For the most part, gone are the days of sportsmen/women whose sole intent was to try to breed and race a champion on the racecourse, at least in this country. So many great American races that were patterned on the European classics and shaped the domestic Thoroughbred into the envy of the world not so long ago, have been reduced in distance to such an extent they are irrelevant as a test of future breeding stock, especially pertaining to classic races here and abroad.

It was my great privilege and pleasure to do the mare matings for the late Allen Paulson for some eight years during the era of Cigar and three other homebred Eclipse Award winners. The intention was always to try to make a great racehorse from a broodmare band that numbered close to 180 at the peak. We tried our best to overcome conformation flaws. Sometimes Mr. Paulson would decide to sell some at auction, but that was usually after they were already yearlings, so we didn't plan the matings for potential sale horses.

There are very few American breeders left today who are breeding primarily to race the resulting progeny on any sizable scale. Even those who do, often will offer some of them for sale at auction, such as the late Ned Evans did. This creates a problem in that the breeder must take into consideration whether the mating will produce an animal attractive enough to sell commercially.

Most of the other breeders are now commercial, doing so expressly to sell the resulting progeny, so the same dynamic of looks rules and they aren't dependent on what the horse can earn racing.

We have sold off or shunned so many good sires because of 'flaws.' Others are perceived to be 'turf' or, heaven forbid, 'stayers.' Now, I love a beautiful, correct horse as much as anyone, but it seems to me the 'perfect' ones seldom make great racehorses and/or sires and it takes people far too long to realize just how ordinary they are. Inevitably we end up with fillies by them that become broodmares and it perpetuates.

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Today's American market is completely intolerant of small (Northern Dancer, Lyphard, Candy Stripes), light framed (Sunday Silence, Sadler's Wells), long pasterns (Smart Strike, Sadler's Wells, Distorted Humor), offset knee (Giant's Causeway, despite his sire having a pair of those), turned out in front (City Zip), plain (Dynaformer, Strawberry Road {Aus}) horses, until they force you to acknowledge them and accept that often the ability may not come in a perfect, beautiful package.

The point is, when I'll Have Another beat Bodemeister hands down both times they met in our Classics and the horse that lost stays here while his conqueror is snapped up by Japan, it tells you where American breeders' priorities are.

As long as producing Thoroughbreds more for their marketable conformation takes precedence over their ability to run, we will not have the world knocking on our door to buy our horses. Do we want the American Thoroughbred to be a racehorse or a show horse? An owner who is not a breeder can only buy from what the breeders supply, so if the selection is pretty bodies without an airtight, battle-tested pedigree, can we blame them for looking elsewhere?

The Poodle was originally developed as a hunting dog. Few are today. A loving, athletic companion or high fashion show dog is how they're most known now.

I would love to see the importation of world-class sires again, but until we get over the obsession with looks and expecting horses built like sprinters to run 10 furlongs, it probably would be futile, especially with so few races beyond 8.5 furlongs at most American tracks. I think it's doubtful there are enough people still breeding to race here to support one and the commercial breeders can't chance it, either.

The world came knocking on our door for racehorses, especially potential Classic winners, but now we no longer have the structure to produce them.

In my case, Rob, you are preaching to the choir. I have done my best in my breeding program to infuse stamina and soundness. Usually, I end up with, "not much speed from the gate, long on the turf, large cardio." Fine with me, but try getting a long on the turf race for young horses in my state of New York. Also, not being Europe, where they race on turf, even if it has rained a bit, or threatened to rain, (in which case the race is run on the main track), the opportunities to run here are so limited. They also are able when abroad to train on turf, which makes sense for a horse that is bred for that surface.

So when I bring this yearling to market, the horse is shunned. Pinhookers don't want it, end-users want an early return, and so I end up running them, or they are sold to Japan, Korea, or Turkey, where they do very well and are appreciated. A Grade I winner and a favorite for the Turkish Derby for my New York-breds, for example. What I want to say is that I am trying and I agree with every word in your most recent article. Know of a nice Monsun filly I can snatch?

Rob makes a good point regarding those visionaries who went back across the Atlantic to acquire bloodstock for American breeding and racing. Two of those left out of the piece were Leslie Combs II and his son, Brownell Combs II. LC2 brought in Beau Pere, Alibi and Royal Charger. BC2 imported successful sire, Caro. I would imagine that those folks who now own quality European bloodstock (mares and stallions both) really don't have the need to sell irrespective of price. Tough to enter into negotiations with them, wouldn't you say? Nevertheless, I hope it happens again. We could use the blood, that's for sure.

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Rapid Redux Sis On Offer at October...

Rapid Redux (Pleasantly Perfect) captured the imaginations of race fans when he went on a record-setting 22-race winning tear over the span of 13 months from December of 2010 through January of this year. Clark Shepherd and Bert Welker are hoping his half-sister can similarly capture the imaginations of buyers when she goes through the ring Tuesday during the second session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings Sale in Lexington. The three-day auction runs from Monday through Wednesday with sessions beginning daily at 10:00 a.m.

Through their Allied Bloodstock, Shepherd and Welker offer the filly, from the second crop of two-time Horse

of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike), as [hip 574](#). The well-made chestnut was produced by the Storm Cat mare Thiscatsforcaryl.

This will be the second time the filly has been through the ring. Last year at Keeneland November, she sold as a weanling for \$57,000. Shepherd and

Welker purchased her on behalf of a group of unnamed partners operating under the banner Beaumont Ventures.

"When we saw her, she just had a beautiful frame and a great walk, but we knew time was going to help her," Shepherd said yesterday from the Fasig sales grounds just as the filly was arriving at Barn 11. "We immediately thought of this sale for her. She's come along the way we wanted her to, and she should be a star over here. She's done her part. We're excited."

Ultimately a winner of 28 races from 42 starts for \$361,609 in earnings, Rapid Redux set a new North American record by winning 22 straight races. In 2011, he received the Eclipse Special Award for his accomplishments, and also was named winner of the Secretariat Vox Populi ("Voice of the People") Award. Other siblings include Be Like Mike (Unbridled's Song), a stakes-winning track record setter; and Sacred Journey (Unbridled's Song), placed in the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn.

In addition to this Curlin filly, Beaumont Ventures purchase two other weanlings last year, both of whom were successfully resold as yearlings this year at Fasig's July Sale. A Tale of the Cat--Throw to Home filly brought \$100,000, and a Colonel John--Good and Hot filly brought \$90,000.

"We got out on those two, so this is all gravy," added Shepherd. "And as much as we liked those two, I don't think they really compare to this filly."

Curlin has gotten off to a fine start stud. In addition to Watrugonnadorosie, a daylight winner in maiden special company yesterday at Belmont, the Lane's End stallion has no fewer than 11 winners from his first crop to race. They include the European stakes performer Savanna La Mar and the good-looking Saratoga maiden winner Palace Malice. He has eight catalogued at FTKOCT.

"Curlin's doing well," said Shepherd. "He had a winner Thursday and another winner [yesterday]. Curlin was an iron horse who got better as he got older, and you wouldn't expect his 2-year-olds to be poppin' wheelies out there, so it's nice they're running."

Shepherd said the Allied consignment also includes a Street Sense colt buyers should keep an eye on. [Hip 436](#)

is a son of the 10-year-old mare She's the Queen (Lasting Approval), a winning half to Lotta Kim (Roar), dam of Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro).

"He's pretty special," said Shepherd. "Bert bought the mare [for \$200,000 at '09 KEENOV] in foal to Medaglia d'Oro] and we sold the foal [for \$150,000 at '10 KEENOV]. This is another horse who needed some time, and another one we pointed for this sale."

Shepherd said he hopes the October sale can match the strength of last year's renewal. "Sure the top end was good last year, but even the bottom was good," he said. "You worry sometimes that you won't get a bid for some, and we were getting, \$8,000, \$10,000 for those horses. Nobody became millionaires, but everybody was happy. I'm optimistic about this year. I had two people today say they had orders to fill and haven't been able to buy horses."

Jockey Club Releases '12 Report of Mares Bred Stats:

Edited press release

The Jockey Club has released Report of Mares Bred statistics for the 2012 breeding season. Based on RMBs received through Oct. 14, The Jockey Club reports that 1,861 stallions covered 35,391 mares in North America during 2012. The annual statistics include the number of mares reported bred to each stallion and represent approximately 90% of the mares that eventually will be reported as bred in 2012. According to historical trends, The Jockey Club expects to receive RMBs representing an additional 3,500 to 4,500 mares bred during the 2012 breeding season. The number of stallions declined 3.8% from the 1,935 reported at this time in 2011, and the number of mares bred fell 3.0% from the 36,504 reported at this time last year. RMB statistics for all reported stallions in 2012 are available through the Publications & Resources section of The Jockey Club's website at jockeyclub.com.

The number of stallions covering 100 or more mares increased from 84 in 2011 to 87 in 2012. These stallions accounted for a greater percentage of the total mares reported bred this year--31.9% of all mares bred in 2012 versus 30.6% of all mares bred in 2011 as reported at this time last year. Further book size analysis shows a 1.1% increase in the number of mares bred to stallions with a book size of 100 or more in 2012 when compared to 2011 as reported at this time last year; a 14.4% increase in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 75 and 99; a 4.1% decline in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 50 and 74; an 10.6% decrease in mares bred to stallions with a book size between 25 and 49; and an 6.3% decline in mares bred to stallions with a book size fewer than 25.

In 2012, Cape Blanco (Ire) led all stallions with 220 mares bred. Rounding out the top five were Scat Daddy, 217; Kitten's Joy, 213; Uncle Mo, 211; and Wilburn, 169. Thoroughbred breeding activity in Kentucky traditionally leads North America. During 2012, Kentucky's 224 reported stallions covered 15,361 mares, or 43.4% of all of the mares reported bred in North America. The number of mares bred to Kentucky stallions declined 2.2% percent against the 15,714 reported at this time last year.

Of the top 10 states and provinces by number of mares reported bred in 2012, only Florida and New York stallions covered more mares in 2012 than in 2011, as reported at this time last year. "The Grinder" to Play in BC Challenge:

Star poker player Michael "The Grinder" Mizrachi has confirmed that he will play in the \$10,000 Breeders' Cup Betting Challenge (BCBC) taking place at Santa Anita Nov. 2-3 during the World Championships. "The BCBC is the mother of all horse racing betting events and its format similarly resembles the World Series of Poker Main Event," Mizrachi said. "My betting style with horse racing is similar to poker: loose on the lead and always ready to press." The tournament format for the BCBC is that the \$10,000 entry fee is split between the live money bankroll (\$7,500) and the overall prize pool (\$2,500). The tournament winner must accumulate the highest live-money bankroll over the two-day event, plus the winning share of the prize pool, which in 2011 represented over \$270,000. Mizrachi will also host the Breeders' Cup Celebrity Poker Invitational at the Commerce Casino Oct. 30, which will feature a mix of poker pros, trainers, jockeys and horsemen competing on the felt to raise funds for the charity California Retirement Management Account (CARMA). "I am honored to be hosting this second annual event raising money for retired Thoroughbreds," Mizrachi added. "I'm glad my fellow poker pros will be in attendance supporting the event and this great cause. It's going to be an exciting event and one tough tournament."

OCTOBER SALE SETS A NEW BENCHMARK

By Emma Berry

A buoyant Book 3 brought to a close a frenetic fortnight of trading at Park Paddocks and helped Tattersalls to reach a landmark in passing the 100 million-guineas mark for the October Sale for the first time. An 87% clearance rate was a particularly pleasing feature of the last day of the auction, which brought another 1,669,600gns in turnover, down 10% on last year, but from 24 fewer horses sold. The October Sale as a whole attracted a bumper cast of international buyers from start to finish, with the aggregate for all three books settling at 100,811,100gns--a rise of 27 per cent.

"In the current economic climate it seems remarkable to be reflecting on Tattersalls October Yearling Sales which have reached unprecedented levels of turnover, but that is the reality and it is a welcome one," said a delighted Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The two weeks of the October Yearling Sales are long and sometimes arduous, but to have exceeded all expectations for the second consecutive year is a marvellous achievement for all concerned and a tribute to the vendors who have placed so much faith in the market at Tattersalls."

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Good to the Last...

While some agents had deserted Tattersalls by Friday, there were still plenty of trainers and breeze-up pinhookers in action on the final day, which meant there was strong competition for a number of lots. Willie Browne signed for the day's bestseller (lot 1830), the first foal of four-time winner Crystal Moments (GB) (Haafhd {GB}) by Exceed And Excel (Aus) (Danahill), but the colt will not be joining the Mocklershill breeze-up team for 2013 as he was bought for trainer David Barron.

"The colt's going into training. David's off at a party for QIPCO Champions' Day so I've been left minding the shop," Browne explained. "He looks a very sharp horse to me and I wish I could breeze him."

Browne did, however, pick up another three yearlings for himself during Book 3 after buying five earlier in the week.

"We didn't do too badly but we had to spend quite a bit of money," he added.

David and Trish Brown's Furnace Mill Stud presented lot 1715, a Clodovil half-sister to seven winners who had been bought as a foal for just 4,500gns but returned a decent profit when selling for 35,000gns. Anthony Stroud made the winning bid and indicated that the filly is to go into training with Jamie Osborne.

Mark Crossman gave 33,000gns for a well made Jeremy colt (lot 1847) consigned by Peter Kavanagh of Kildaragh Stud. Out of a Dalakhani half-sister to G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Mons (GB) (Deploy {GB}), he was bought for Dream Ahead's owner Khalifa Dasmal.

"Khalifa came up to see the colt and really liked him," said Crossman. "There are proper horses in the family and the sire has a decent strike rate."

Walsh Breezes In...

Amateur jump jockey Katie Walsh, who has developed a successful sideline as a consignor of ready-to-run two-year-olds, has been at Tattersalls all week and secured the final member of her 2013 consignment on Friday when signing for a daughter of Dutch Art at 22,000gns (lot 1777). It is a sire with whom Walsh has enjoyed particular success--she bought subsequent G2 German 2000 Guineas winner Caspar Netscher (GB) for 25,000gns as a yearling and resold him at two for 65,000gns. The first-crop son of Dutch Art will stand at Morristown Lattin Stud in Ireland next season.

"Book 2 was really strong but I managed to get a couple and I'm done now," said Walsh, who finished third on Seabass in last season's Grand National and was heading straight back to Ireland to ride in a point-to-point [Sunday].

"I tried for a couple of Dutch Arts earlier in the week and failed so it's nice to have this filly. She's lovely and has a really nice action."

A Near Century for Rabbah...

Rabbah Bloodstock was a dominant force through Books 1 and 2 and bought another two in Book 3 to bring their October purchases to 99. One of the final-day strikes was for a colt by Moss Vale (Ire) (lot 1645), whose half-sister El Manati (Ire) Iffraaj {GB} is already in training with James Tate for Rabbah partner Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum. The April-foaled colt, who fetched 30,000gns and was bred and consigned by Michael Downey, will also be heading to Tate's yard.

"We think his half-sister is a really decent filly," said Rabbah representative Jono Mills. "He's a nice horse and let's hope he as good as his sister."

Gill Richardson snared a strong son of Shamardal (lot 1752) for 30,000gns while standing alongside Paul Deegan, who will train the colt for Jaber Abdullah.

"He's a lovely horse. The market has held up well today so I'm pleased to get him," said Richardson.

Happy Vendors...

Soggy after being rained on for most of the day but smiling brightly was Ed Player of Whatton Manor Stud, who is still reeling from shock at being described as his father Peter's assistant in the *TDN* earlier this week. Of course father and son work side by side and did a great job in the last fortnight to manage a 100% clearance rate for 19 horses sold across all three books. They set a highly respectable Book 2 average of 56,633gns for their 15-strong draft as well as selling the second top lot, a colt by Teofilo, for 220,000gns.

Wearing equally big smiles throughout the fortnight was the well-organised team behind The Castlebridge Consignment, which is headed by Bill Dwan and Andrew Mead. They swept the board as leading consignor in each of the books, selling 62 horses for a total of 7,347,800gns. The highlight of their very strong draft was of course Hydrogen, the Galileo colt who stole the show at Book 1 when selling for 2.5 million gns to Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani.
