Grade I winner **Nereid** (Rock Hard Ten) has been taken out of Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. "She is off in her right hind," reported trainer John Shirreffs said. "She had already come over [Tuesday from Betfair Hollywood Park]. She must have kicked the wall or something. The injury is very minor but came at the worst possible time." Winner of last year's GI American Oaks, Nereid is coming off a runner-up effort behind

O'BRIEN OPINES ON BALLYDOYLE CHANCES

His horses won't make their first visit to the Santa Anita main track until this morning, but trainer Aidan O'Brien held court at the quarantine barn Wednesday morning, assessing the chances of several of his runners. **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) was pegged the 2-1 second choice on Jon White's morning line behind the slight 9-5 chalk **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Mile, and the Ballydoyle maestro expressed at least some concern that the 4-year-old will have just two weeks between this test and his last-out victory in the G1 QIPCO Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Oct. 20. "It was always the plan to come on to the Breeders' Cup after Ascot, and I suppose there is always the chance that two Group 1 races in two weeks is asking too much of the horse, but he seems in very good form," O'Brien

commented. Excelebration seems to act on all ground, having won the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois over Deauville's straight mile in 1:34 3/5 Aug. 12, but also handled the much easier going in the QE II. "As he's got older he appears to have got stronger and faster," O'Brien commented. "When he won at Ascot, the ground was obviously a lot softer than he'll meet on Saturday, but hopefully he'll handle that OK." Excelebration will race left-handed for the first time Saturday. **Cont. p3**

COOLMORE BUYS 50% OF 'SHANGHAI'

Coolmore Stud has secured a 50% share of Grade I winner **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday--Steelin', by Orientate) from Starlight Racing. All management decisions will be divided between Starlight and Coolmore, according to Starlight managing partner Jack Wolf.

"We will manage the horse together, but the horse will continue to run in our silks," confirmed Wolf.

Todd Pletcher, the regular trainer for Starlight, is also the principal conditioner for Coolmore's American string.

"They showed a real interest in the horse," said Wolf. "We've known them, through Todd, for a number of years. It was a good deal for them and a good deal for us."

Shanghai Bobby, victorious in Belmont's June 27 Track Barron S., was an easy 3 3/4-length winner of the Sept. 3 GII Hopeful S. In his latest trip to post, he ran away to a five-length score in the Oct. 6 GI Champagne S. at Belmont. Undefeated in four starts, the \$105,000 Keeneland September sale purchase has earned \$607,000.

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O'Brien Opines on Ballydoyle Chances (cont. from p1)

St Nicholas Abbey (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) will attempt to join former Coolmore runner High Chaparral (Ire) as back-to-back winners of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, and

O'Brien is willing to draw a line through his 11th-place effort in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7. "[Jockey] Joseph [O'Brien] knew after a furlong or so that the horse was in trouble on that [deep] ground, and did his best to look after the horse as well as he could. Hopefully it will be a different story on quicker ground here," O'Brien explained.

Fame and Glory (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) is in uncharted territory in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Marathon as he tries a dirt surface for the first time. "He's been a great horse and a great servant to the yard--he owes us nothing," O'Brien stated. "This is a bit of an experiment, I suppose. He stays well, and it's really a question of whether, being a Montjeu, he handles the surface or not. As he's gotten older he's maybe just started to keep a little for himself; started to think a little, so we might try things a little differently. We'll put a pair of blinkers on him. Jamie [Spencer] might just try and jump him out and let him roll along and we'll see how he goes from there." Winner of the G1 Ascot Gold Cup last season, the bay was fifth in defense of his title in the G3 QIPCO British Champions Long Distance Cup at Ascot Oct. 20.

THE FUTURE'S SO BRIGHT

Anyone familiar with Timbuk 3's post-punk classic of 1986 knows how to complete that line....I gotta wear shades. There's no evidence that **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg) has that particular song on his iPod, but the sophomore colt will be equipped with a set of blinkers for Saturday's GI Xpressbet Breeders' Cup Sprint, the first time since setting a wicked pace in last year's inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile Sprint. The winner of a trio of graded events for 3-year-old short-trackers earlier this year, Trinniberg is looking to snap a three-race skid in Saturday's race. He exits a runner-up effort, beaten only a half-length, in the Gallant Bob S. at Parx Sept. 22. "After the race, the first question I had for [jockey] Willie [Martinez] was whether he saw the horse on the outside," trainer Shivananda Parbhoo said. "And he said 'no.' I said 'that's ok; that's fine.' After Willie took the lead at the eighth pole, he didn't see anyone behind him. That considered, I thought it was a great race." Though his best results thus far have come from on or near the pace, Trinniberg can come from a little bit out of it, Parbhoo believes. "I think we're going to try and avoid going to the lead in this race if we can," Parbhoo said. "We drew the perfect post [9], and from there we can settle in a good spot up close, but not on the lead. Then again, maybe he just goes. We'll find out on race day what happens."

'SHANGHAI' POISED FOR LIFTOFF

Since its inception in 2000, the Starlight Racing partnership has campaigned its share of top-class horses, including illustrious alums 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Ashado (Saint Ballado), in addition to Grade I winners Purge (Pulpit) and Hilda's Passion (Canadian Frontier). This

Saturday, the partnership's latest star, **Shanghai Bobby** (Harlan's Holiday), will try and give Starlight its second Breeders' Cup victory when he lines up in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Trained by Todd Pletcher, the dark bay comes into this season's championship-defining test for 2-year-old colts undefeated in four lifetime starts, including his latest, a tour-de-force score in the Oct. 6 GI Champagne S.

"He's doing great," said Starlight's founding partner Jack Wolf. "The horse just does what he needs to do in the morning. I don't know what's gotten into him lately, but he's really turned around nicely of late."

As is the case for all of this year's Breeders' Cup races for 2-year-olds, this year's Juvenile will fall under the new, Lasix-free guidelines.

"He's just gotten better and better with each race," confirmed Wolf. "In his four races, he's run over three different surfaces. We've kept everything pretty much the same, whether it be Lasix or a change in location. Whatever changes you encounter along the way could certainly be a concern, but he just seems to handle everything so easily. He's such a laid back horse and I think he'll do just fine on Saturday."

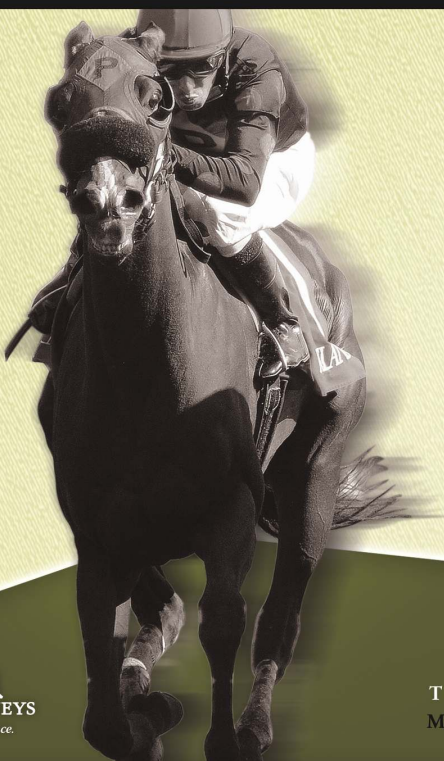
Shanghai Bobby, who also won Saratoga's Sept. 2 GI Hopeful S., will be making his first start outside the state of New York in the Juvenile.

"The surface seems to be sandy, which reminds Todd of the Belmont or Palm Meadows surface, so that shouldn't give him trouble," explained Wolf. "Historically, though, horses shipping East to West isn't the best of things. But that's where the Breeders' Cup is, so, if you want to play, you got to go."

It's All in the Name...

With the help of a Typhoon Muifa in China in August of 2011, Shanghai Bobby was granted his lofty name courtesy of Bob Burton, a longtime friend of Wolf. The men played football together at Kentucky's Murray State University during their college days. In fact, it was Burton who introduced Wolf to his principal partner in Starlight, Don Lucarelli. **Cont. p5**

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"The colt was named for Bob, who is a pilot for Delta," explained Wolf. "He flies internationally, and occasionally, flies to Shanghai. Last summer, his flight to Shanghai was cancelled, so he decided to come up to visit us in Saratoga. He came to the sale, where he met Clint Glasscock, who is one of my partners. They hit it off, so Clint thought it would be a good idea to name a horse after Bob."

Wolf continued, "We bought this horse a month later [for \$105,000] at Keeneland [September], and we felt given the pedigree, Harlan's Holiday out of Steelin' (Orientate), it would be a good fit. We later found out that the colt's foaling date, Feb. 27, is also Bob's father's birthday. So, it was sort of a weird coincidence."

Possibly hoping lightning might strike twice, Burton made return visit at the Spa this past summer.

"Bob's not a partner at all, but he's the one getting all the publicity," laughed Wolf.

Double Take...

This Saturday, Shanghai Bobby will try and add to an already enviable record of four on-the-board finishes in five prior starts for the Starlight team in Breeders' Cup competition.

"Ashado stands out for us, because she gave us our first Breeders' Cup win, but she also gave Todd his first Breeders' Cup win, too," recalled Wolf. "Even her runner-up finish to Halfbridled [in the 2003 GI Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita] was memorable. Halfbridled was stuck out there in the outside post, and [Halfbridled's jockey] Julie Krone gave that horse a fantastic ride. Our filly was a very game second to a very good horse. She came back and won the Kentucky Oaks the next year for us, so she was really important to us."

In addition to Ashado, who also finished third in the 2005 GI Distaff, Starlight was represented by Octave, runner-up in the 2006 GI Juvenile Fillies and third in 2007 the GI Distaff; Harlan's Holiday, who finished ninth in the 2002 Classic.

Of Starlight's high percentage Breeders' Cup record, Wolf explained, "Whether it's the Breeders' Cup or not, we'll only take them over there if we have a real chance, especially if it's a big stakes race." He added with a laugh, "Generally speaking, if you've got Todd taking them over there, and they are more than 3-1 or 4-1, you're probably in the wrong spot."

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So far this year, Shanghai Bobby has proven unbeatable with the help of one of the nation's top jockeys, Rosie Napravnik. Napravnik accounted for her first Classic earlier this spring when she partnered with Believe You Can in the GI Kentucky Oaks.

"This horse has taken to Rosie and she's taken to him," said Wolf. "She knows how to ride him, that's for sure."

As is custom, the Starlight ladies can always be counted on being front and center while leading in the team's victorious runners into the winner's enclosure following its most important wins. And with Napravnik scheduled to be back on board Shanghai Bobby, Wolf hopes Starlight's 'girl power' will be out in force come Saturday.

"It's always been that way," said Wolf. "Laurie likes to go out there and, as we get additional partners, the ladies like to go out there, too. Yes, we like to win races, but we also want everyone to be involved, to have fun and really enjoy it."

Let the games begin.

To Shanghai and Beyond...

Wolf, who campaigned under the Starlight banner with his wife Laurie since 2000, first brought on his first partners in 2002.

"[Starlight's first partners] were luckier than I was, because I was buying all these others horses, but with them, we bought three yearlings at auction in 2002, including Ashado and Purge," recalled Wolf. "That was a pretty good partnership to start with."

Ashado, a \$170,000 KEESEP purchase, accounted for seven Grade I wins, including the 2004 GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Distaff before calling it a day with earnings of \$3.9 million. Retired following her 2005 campaign, the mare sold for \$9-million at Keeneland later that November. Also a member of the 2002 squad, Purge, a \$180,000 KEESEP buy, went on to win three graded stakes, including the 2005 GI Cigar Mile H.

A regular at the yearling sales since its inception, the Starlight partnership went to \$105,000 to secure the Shanghai Bobby at last year's Keeneland September sale. Starlight, which also acquired the colt's sire, MGSW Harlan's Holiday for \$97,000 Fasig-Tipton July in 2001, upped the ante in 2012, buying a career-high 13 yearlings at public auction, up from eight in 2011.

"The last group we purchased averaged \$207,000 per yearling," explained Wolf. "That's more than we have in the past."

Wolf indicated that it was always part of the plan to expand the racing partnership, but the economy over the past few years caused the team to rethink matters.

"We tried [to expand] the previous couple of years, but because of the way the market was, especially if you got lucky to have a good horse, it became very difficult to even sell it in the aftermarket," explained Wolf. "So, we cut back a little. The market appears to be getting a little bit better, so we decided to try and open [the partnership] up a little more and raise a little more capital."

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"We hired Donna Brothers [earlier this year] to help expand the partnership, and she added four new partners for us," Wolf said. "It was always part of the plan to expand, but we hadn't done a very good job of promoting ourselves in the past. In fact, a lot of people didn't even think we took new partners. So, the goal was to try and raise some more capital in order to get the kind of yearlings we bought this year."

Wolf indicated approximately 90 of Starlight's racing stock are purchased as yearlings. Occasionally, however, the partners will branch out and secure a racing prospect directly from the track.

Purchased privately by Starlight in the spring of 2010, Hilda's Passion was turned over to Pletcher, and for her new connections, she won five graded stakes, including her career finale, the 2011 GI Ballerina S. She sold to Katsumi Yoshida later that fall for \$1.225 million at the Fasig-Tipton November sale.

"Our best success with buying them privately was Hilda's Passion," said Wolf. "We don't do it all that often, but that turned out to be a very good deal for us."

DUBAI PURCHASES HEAD TATTS WEDNESDAY

Having signed for Monday's top lot Firebeam (GB), Anthony Stroud and David Loder waded back in to claim Wednesday's most expensive offering, the Royal Applause (GB) colt Saigon (GB), who fetched 340,000gns and is heading to Dubai. The 3-year-old has been a stalwart for James Toller's Newmarket stable, winning last season's Listed Rose Bowl S. and earning four group placings, including a runner-up effort in the G3 Darley S. just over a fortnight ago.

"He should be a nice horse for the Carnival," said Stroud, who outlasted underbidder Alex Elliott. "He fits the bill, and James Toller's done a very good job with him. We were delighted to be able to buy him."

Stroud struck again twice within the next 10 lots for a pair from Andrew Balding's draft, first going to 150,000gns for Jeff Smith's homebred 4-year-old Desert Law (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}), a 104-rated multiple-winning sprinter. Next in his sights was Expense Claim (Ire), a 3-year-old son of Intikhab, who was knocked down for 170,000gns and became one of 38 horses sold in the last three days to realize a six-figure price tag.

Seolan Tops the Fillies...

Just less than a year after she sold for only €2,200 at Tattersalls Ireland, the Staffordstown Stud S. winner Seolan (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) sky-rocketed in value to 320,000gns and will next be seen racing in America. The 2-year-old filly is yet another to join the party which will be flown to Jim Cassidy's California stable and will carry the colors of owner Deron Pearson. Unbeaten in two starts--the first for trainer Paul Deegan and second for Patrick Prendergast--Seolan was one of three late entries for the sale and is the third bought by Gordian Troeller for Cassidy this week with very recent stakes form. Having been sold privately from Deegan's Curragh stable, she recorded her listed success Oct. 14, just a month after her eye-catching debut at Listowel.

"What really sold her to us was when we watched the video of her listed win," said Troeller. "She was always going to win, but when another filly came up to her quarters, you could see Seolan almost say 'No way,' and she just went away to win. She is very game. We might look to run her in the [GIII] Miesque S. [at Hollywood Park Nov. 24]. We had chatted about whether any of our purchases could run off the plane, and she would be the one. However, with Thanksgiving it is difficult to get the shipping plans sorted, so we will see if it will work in."

Gold On the Cup Trail...

Sold just two lots ahead of Seolan, and another late entry, was the Epsom Derby Trial winner Goldoni (Ire). As a gelding, the first-crop son of Dylan Thomas (Ire) was ineligible to return to Epsom to take his chance in the Derby itself, but he has added a win and two places in Listed company since the spring and arrived at Tattersalls from Andrew Balding's stable with a rating of 100. Goldoni joins Motivado en route to David Hayes' stable in Australia, with agent Stuart Boman of Blandford Bloodstock going to 210,000gns.

Boman, a native Australian who is based in Newmarket, was in action again later in the day with the arrival of the strong Juddmonte draft. Progressive 3-year-old Wrotham Heath (GB) (Dansili {GB}), also a winner at Epsom, was added to the list of purchases for Hayes at 135,000gns.

Juddmonte's six-time winner Jet Away (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) was also knocked down to Blandford Bloodstock and he too heads to Australia for a "long-established Irish client".

"He is one for the [Melbourne] Cup and his form means that he is definitely qualified," Boman said. "He is lightly raced for a 6-year-old, likes fast ground and should be a lot of fun for some years. He also has a stallion's pedigree."

Bought for 200,000gns, Jet Away hails from one of Juddmonte's most celebrated families. His dam Kalima is a full-sister to Hasili (GB) (Kahyasi {GB}), the dam of Banstead Manor Stud's flagship stallion Dansili and the Group/Grade 1 winners Intercontinental, Banks Hill, Champs Elysees and Cacique.

Fielding More Dreams...

Newmarket-based Armando Duarte bought two lots for young owner Ken Gundlach, including the 2-year-old New Approach (Ire) colt Dalgig (GB), who has raced just once from Henry Candy's stable after being bought as a yearling for 70,000gns. The hint of promise shown in his third-place finish in a seven-furlong Newbury maiden in September boosted his price to 165,000gns on Wednesday morning.

"Ken owns Field Of Dream (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), who is going to Dubai for the Carnival, and he wanted another horse to join him," said Duarte. "We tried on some for Dubai earlier this week, but they have been too expensive for us. We would like to try and win a maiden with him in a month, then put him on a plane to go to Dubai. If we can win a conditions race, then we would like to try and run in the UAE Guineas."

Dalgig is to join Field Of Dream at Jamie Osborne's Lambourn stable.

Speightstown Colt for Ingordo...

David Ingordo was in Newmarket a fortnight ago for the October Sale and, though not present for the horses-in-training auction, he made his presence felt when bidding 135,000gns through Charlie Gordon-Watson's assistant Will Douglass for another member of the Juddmonte draft, Razorbill. The son of Speightstown will be returning to the country of his birth. Douglass, who saw off interested parties from Australia to buy the 3-year-old colt at the top of his budget, said, "He's been bought by Lane's End Bloodstock and is going to America but I don't know who will train him. He was the only one David wanted in the sale and he phoned me this morning to ask if I'd seen him. He has the right profile for the U.S.--he is by Speightstown, will be a two-turn horse, wants fast ground. Then he also has a stallion's pedigree." Razorbill is a son of SW & MGSP High Walden (El Gran Senor) and hails from the extended female family of champion Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}).

Shadow Jumping...

The Newsells Park Stud-bred Last Shadow (GB) cost just 25,000gns as a yearling but two years later he was valued at almost 10 times that amount by Frank Berry, the racing manager for prominent Irish jumps owner JP McManus, who pushed the bidding to 210,000gns in fending off interest from other National Hunt parties. Jonjo O'Neill will take over the training of the son of Notnowcato, who was also on the shortlist of Highflyer Bloodstock's Anthony Bromley, the underbidder when acting for Nicky Henderson. McManus has a huge string of jumpers in training spread across yards in Britain and Ireland and arguably the best horse he ever owned, Istabraq (Ire), was bought in the same ring as a 4-year-old at the 1996 July Sale. Sold by Shadwell for 38,000gns, the son of Sadler's Wells went on to win 23 hurdle races for trainer Aidan O'Brien, including three Champion Hurdles and four Irish Champion Hurdles.

With 84 withdrawals already listed for tomorrow's abridged and final session, there are only 159 lots still to sell. The three-day aggregate, for 772 sold, of 19,909,200gns has already passed last year's sale total, which was 16,584,600gns for 848 horses. The third-session median rose by 41%, from 9,250gns for the equivalent session in 2011 to 13,000gns, while the average was also up by 12% to 26,548gns.

BLACK-TYPE PREVIEWS

THE CRITERIUM CAUSE

Inaugurated in 2001, the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud has quickly taken on the mantle of one of Europe's leading juvenile contests, with the likes of Act One (GB), Dalakhani (Ire), Bago (Fr), Mount Nelson (GB) and Roderic O'Connor (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) on its honor roll. Today's renewal appears a select and wide-open affair, with the home defence in the hands of a quartet headed by **Pearl Flute (Ire)** (Piccolo {GB}) and **US Law (Ire)** (Lawman {Fr}). They met in the G3 Prix des Chenes over a mile at Longchamp Sept. 22, where the former was 3/4 of a length ahead when they were first and second respectively. Jean-Louis Bouchard's US Law has since won the main stepping-stone to this race, the course-and-distance Oct. 11 G3 Prix Thomas Bryon, where he registered a comfortable two-length defeat of the re-opposing **Kenhope (Fr)** (Kendargent {Fr}). Pearl Bloodstock's Pearl Flute was subsequently third in the G1 Gran Criterium at the San Siro Oct. 13, where he may have been given too much to do. Of the unexposed pretenders, Team Valor's **Triple Threat (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}) and Jim Bolger's **Loch Garman (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) are respected and the former looked a true Andre Fabre work in progress when winning by four lengths over this track and trip last time Oct. 5. Loch Garman has the shape of some of the recent Irish-trained winners of this, as he reappears quickly after a debut win in deep ground in a Navan maiden eight days ago.

Welcome to the Revolution

When the Breeders' Cup debuted in 1984 it was a revolutionary concept. The fertile mind of the late John R. Gaines combined the idea of extraordinary purses of \$1-million or more with the idea of running seven championship events on the same day, funded by a variation on the funding mechanism of Futurity races that depended on breeders' contributions to build the huge purses.

With all revolutions though, time corrupts the purity of the original concept and what was once revolutionary becomes conventional as others co-opt the innovations and make them their own. While the Breeders' Cup has expanded from seven races on one day for total purses of \$10-million to 15 races over two days for \$25.5-million in purses, other countries have devised their own days of championship racing.

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As shown in the accompanying box, other major racing nations around the world have created racing festivals of their own that at least attempt to emulate the Breeders' Cup concept of clustering championship races all on one day. Although only G1 Dubai World Cup (G1) day truly rivals the Breeders' Cup meeting in prize money, the imitative meetings in England and France, usually held about two weeks and a month, respectively, before the Breeders' Cup have had a deleterious effect on European entries in the American equivalent.

While imitation may be the sincerest form of flattery, flattery is seldom good for your health. It has not been good for international competition at the Breeders' Cup.

No winner of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe (G1) has run at the same year's Breeders' Cup meeting since Sakhee (GB) just failed to hold off a resurgent Tiznow in the 2001 Breeders' Cup Classic(G1). (2004 Arc winner Bago (Fr) ran fourth in the 2005 GI John Deere Breeders' Cup Turf [G1]). In the last decade only one G1 Champion S. winner, the remarkably tough Twice Over (GB), has run at the Breeders' Cup meeting. The other international festivals exert a less potent effect on the Breeders' Cup, although European trainers will often choose the Hong Kong races as easier targets than the Breeders' Cup.

From a historical perspective, the inauguration of the Breeders' Cup in 1984 anticipated a transformative trend in the wider sporting world. Gaines and his cohorts were consciously emulating the National Football League's Super Bowl in attempting to create a championship, season-ending event. Since then, partly fueled by the contemporaneous rise of ESPN, other sports have markedly increased their emphasis on the spectacular big event, and the sporting public has responded to the hype. People who otherwise pay little or no attention to the quotidian events in any sport pay big money to attend Major League Baseball's World Series, the NCAA Final Four, or the NBA Finals.

In Thoroughbred racing, that trend has made the GI Kentucky Derby a huge event, the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S. important only if the Derby winner is going for the Triple Crown, and the Breeders' Cup a viable (so far) event on television and an overall money maker for the sport.

The question now, though, is how do we not just hang on to but grow that audience. The Breeders' Cup has, more or less successfully, doubled the number of races and race days, but what else can they do to make their event more significant? What would make the Breeders' Cup—and horse racing in general—more appealing to the average American?

A NEW ERA DAWNS

In July 2011, Breeders' Cup officials announced plans to develop protocols that would eliminate race-day medications in horses competing at the Breeders' Cup World Championships by 2013. The shift in policy will begin with this year's five events for juveniles.

"The objective of the policy is to ensure that our championship races, the culmination of the racing season, are run without the influence of race-day medication," said Jim Gluckson of the Breeders' Cup. "Our board and members feel pretty strongly about it, and that's why we enacted this policy. We don't feel that the 2012 Breeders' Cup is an experiment, but rather the first step in extending the policy to all of our championship races in 2013."

"This is about the championships, and the way the rest of the world conducts championship events on the highest level is without race-day medication," he continued. "It is not a statement on how the rest of the industry should conduct itself."

Breeders' Cup officials also stressed the global growth of its nominations program, and the "Win and You're In" initiative expanded to include 73 races in 10 countries worldwide in 2012. There were 11 opportunities to earn a fees-paid berth in the \$3-million GI Breeders' Cup Turf, six of which were contested outside of North America. With the pre-eminence of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, as well as the continued growth of Britain's Champions Day in mid-October and the lucrative late-autumn contests in Japan and Hong Kong, it has been a challenge to attract the best overseas runners.

Still, a total of 13 foreign-based 2-year-olds were pre-entered for this year's championships at Santa Anita-- seven in the GI Juvenile Turf, five in the GI Juvenile Fillies Turf, and one in the Juvenile Sprint. Ben Keswick's Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}) wasn't nominated to the Breeders' Cup when she captured the G1 Moyglare Stud S. Sept. 9, a race that was part of the "Win and You're In" program for the Juvenile Fillies Turf. However, the lack of race-day medication was one of the reasons her connections made her eligible and put her name in the entry box.

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"We have to think that [Sky Lantern] has a serious chance, especially as there is no Lasix permitted in all the 2-year-old races out there, which makes it a level playing field for everyone," said assistant trainer Richard Hannon Jr.

Of the U.S.-based youngsters entered for this weekend's races, only Kitten's Point (Kitten's Joy) and Fortify (Distorted Humor) have been competing without Lasix. They are respectively contenders for the Juvenile Fillies Turf and Juvenile. The \$2-million GI BC Juvenile Fillies had just nine pre-enter, and five of them were also cross-entered in either the Juvenile Fillies Turf or the Juvenile Sprint. It's uncertain as to whether the dearth of entries was due to the looming presence of a pair of highly regarded, unbeaten Grade I winners in Dreaming of Julia (A.P. Indy) and Executiveprivilege (First Samurai) or to race-day medication ban.

"I think if that's an effect of Lasix, I think that's pretty shortsighted of people [to not enter their horses], and I have no idea if that's why that's happened," said Graham Motion, who trains Kitten's Point. "I don't think it's that big of hurdle to overcome, let's put it that way. Certainly, if I had a filly that was a bad bleeder, I would have reservations about running her in the Breeders' Cup without Lasix."



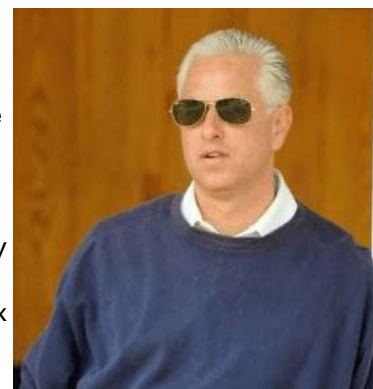

Motion, who grew up in England, had his first Breeders' Cup winner when Better Talk Now pulled off a minor upset in the 2004 Turf. In addition to Kitten's Point, he has 2010 GI Kentucky Derby hero Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) coming off a layoff in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Saturday.

"I think a very large percent of them end up bleeding at some point, and I don't get the argument that I hear from Europe and such that horses don't bleed over there," Motion added. "I don't believe that. I mean probably 80-90% of my horses at some point bleed. Whether or not they need to be treated with Lasix to run, that's a different story."

Todd Pletcher conditions Dreaming of Julia, and will also have Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) as a serious contender in the Juvenile. He described himself as "pro-Lasix," but was taking a wait-and-see approach about the new medication policy at the Breeders' Cup.

"We're doing it in juvenile races, so I'm hoping that, because they're younger horses, [they've] perhaps had less stressful campaigns, and perhaps they're less likely to bleed," Pletcher offered. "I don't anticipate that it's going to be any problem, and I certainly hope it's not, but, I suppose there's really only one way we'll know, and that's to run without Lasix and see how the horses perform and scope them afterwards."

"We haven't done anything different, and I think the most important thing is to have them healthy going into the race," he added. "Hopefully, if they haven't bled prior to the race, then I think the chances of them bleeding during the race will be diminished."

Pletcher also feels that racing on these shores places a different type of stress on horses.

"I don't know if there's science to back it up, but I think that as a rule, dirt racing is more demanding, and perhaps we see some more bleeders over here because of that," he said. "But it's uncharted territory for me as a trainer with some of these horses, and one of my concerns about removing the Lasix from racing in general is that I think it can be disadvantageous for the betting public. They have the added security that Lasix might prevent one of the horses that they're wagering on from bleeding. I think that's something that as an industry we must look very, very closely at, and try to do whatever we can not only to protect the horses, but the owners, the trainers, the jockeys, and the bettors, and that's why I've been fairly vocal about my stand."

The California Horse Racing Board granted approval for the Breeders' Cup to run the 2-year-old races at Santa Anita without allowing for race-day medication, and, with the championships slated to return to the Arcadia oval in 2013, all of the races will be run under that condition.

"Obviously, we always evaluate all of the races and the way that they are conducted after every Breeders' Cup," Gluckson stressed. "As far as the results of the 2012 races are concerned, that would be far too small a sample size to make any reliable scientific conclusion, but it will have to be analyzed."

"We want this event to be about the championships, not about the discussion of medication."

BREEDERS' CUP LADIES' CLASSIC

If Besilu Stables's **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker) is to defend her GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic title, she'll have to beat one of the most accomplished fields ever assembled for this race. After a decisive 2 1/2-length success under the Churchill Downs lights a year ago, the slam dunk champion 3-year-old filly went through the ring at Keeneland November as part of the dispersal of her late breeder Prince Saud bin Khaled's stock, commanding a whopping \$8.5 million from Ben Leon.

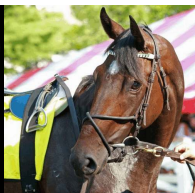

She was a troubled-trip ninth in her early season target, the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup, but reemerged stateside no worse for wear with a jaw-dropping eight-length romp in Churchill's GII Fleur de Lis H. in June under new pilot Mike Smith. Royal Delta moved early into a hot pace, just holding on in the GII Delaware H. July 21, and seemed to have an off day when beaten a half-length by subsequent GI Zenyatta S. heroine **Love and Pride** (A.P. Indy) in Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign H. Aug. 26. The elegant filly would quickly silence any hypotheses that her best days might be behind her when she handed recently retired MGISW It's Tricky (Mineshaft) an effortless 8 1/2-length defeat in Belmont's GI Beldame Invitational S. last time Sept. 29. Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott is confident in his charge's ability, but knows nothing is guaranteed in a field like this. He singled out one foe that he fears the most during a national teleconference last week. "I think that with **Awesome Feather** (Awesome Again), who is a very good horse, coming into the race we're going to have to have a repeat performance of one of her better efforts to win it," Mott said.

Awesome Feather shares some similarities with the expected favorite. She too commanded a serious price tag after sealing 2010 champion 2-year-old filly honors when completing an undefeated six-race campaign in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Stronach Stables went to went to \$2.3 million at Fasig-Tipton November, and new trainer Chad Brown picked up right where Stan Gold left off. The bay made only two starts in 2011 and two in 2012, but she's returned to the winner's circle each time. Awesome Feather comes off a head-turning 11 1/4-length route in Belmont's Nasty Storm S. Sept. 20, earning a 108 Beyer Speed Figure versus Royal Delta's last-out 106. **Cont. p4**

Bred in Ontario by Sean Fitzhenry, Marketing Mix did not race at two, but got off to a quick start as a sophomore, breaking her maiden in her second start on the Keeneland Polytrack before shipping

north of the border to compete in the Canadian fillies' classics. The Roger Varian charge finished second in this race last year, and was a winner in her lone start on a firm course, which she is likely to catch here, in last year's G1 Qatar Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp. **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) has established herself as one of the leading 3-year-old fillies in Europe. Unraced as a juvenile, she won the G1 Nassau S. going this distance against older foes at Goodwood Aug. 4. The John Gosden charge finished second, beaten a neck by Shareta (Ire) (Sinndar {Ire}), last out in the G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks at York Aug. 23.

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Ridasiyna (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) is likely to attract attention off her 3 1/2-length win last out in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp Oct. 7. The lightly raced 3-year-old will make her first start outside France here, and will catch a break in the weights from her older rivals. Beverly D heroine I'm A Dreamer finished an encouraging fourth in the Flower Bowl after chasing slow fractions and encountering traffic trouble at the quarter pole.

After finishing sixth, beaten 3 1/4 lengths, in the Beverly D., the Aidan O'Brien charge returned to her native Ireland to win two in a row: the G3 Dance Design S. Aug. 26 and the G2 Blandford S. Sept. 9, where she defeated Nahrain going 1 1/4 miles. Up finished sixth in the G1 Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket Sept. 29 in her third race in four weeks, and should enjoy the freshening.

Locally based Executiveprivilege, perfect in five starts, comes off a 6 1/4-length score in the GI Chandelier S. (nee Oak Leaf)

over this track and trip. Hometown fillies have had a distinct edge in this event, but if Dreaming of Julia brings her best to game day, it will be quite a horse race. Stonestreet's homebred is the first foal from Dream Rush (Wild Rush), who collected the GI Test S. and GI Prioress S. in 2007. The big bay filly won her first two starts by a total of 26 3/4 lengths before coming out best in a battle royal with My Happy Face (Tiz Wonderful) in the GI Frizette S. Oct. 6.

"She's what I would consider to have a perfect blend of her sire and dam," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "She's by A.P. Indy and out of a mare that was very good at sprints and middle distances, so she's got a combination of speed and stamina. She's handled the stretch out to a mile twice now, and I would anticipate that two turns will be even better for her." Pletcher also noted, however, "There's no doubt that it's an advantage if Santa Anita's your home track and you're training there on a daily basis."

Spring in the Air (Spring At Last) switches to conventional dirt for the first time, but her form on Polytrack and turf is compelling. John Oxley's filly came on strongly while four wide to take the GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland Oct. 5. Since arriving at Santa Anita, the bay has been showing off to onlookers. "Sometimes she'll do it in the paddock and in the post parade," said trainer Mark Casse. "[Jockey] Patrick [Husbands] even calls her his 'Little Zenyatta.'"

"When we came up here after Del Mar, she was all cranked up. I wanted to get her to settle down, but I wasn't sure she would. But she's come around, and nicely so. I talked it over with Mr. Hughes, and we decided to go for the two-turn race. I think she'll handle it. The money is better, and there are championship implications if you win the Juvenile Fillies."

have, and this year's invaders appear, on paper, to be quite formidable. Ben Keswick's **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}), a late supplement into the field, figures to go favored off her strong Irish and British form. The Richard Hannon trainee has been no worse than second in her five-race career, and enters off a victory in The Curragh's G1 Moyglare Stud S. last time Sept. 9. She was second in both the G3 Sweet Solera S. at Newmarket Aug. 11 and the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood two weeks later, and was recently flattered when Sweet Solera winner Certify

(Elusive Quality) annexed Newmarket's G1 Shadwell Fillies' Mile in authoritative fashion Sept. 28.

Sheikh Mohammed Al Thani's **Flotilla (Fr)** (Mizzen Mast) has just a maiden win to her credit from four French starts, but the late runner fits the profile of the type of invaders who do well switching from a European style turf course to a firmer, flatter American one. She was fourth, beaten just 1 1/2 lengths, last time in Lonchamp's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac Oct. 7, and may have had more of a say in the outcome if not for some traffic trouble. The bay's dam Louvain (Ire) took the GIII Miesque S. over the Hollywood turf as a juvenile in 2004 and also produced Louvakhova (Fr) (Maria's Mon), who took a stakes race over the Calder sod a year ago in her first try outside of France.

INVESTMENT INCENTIVE FOR BREEDING STOCK SALES

Buyers at this year's breeding stock sales may be able to benefit from the \$125,000 Expense Allowance investment incentive that is effective through 2012. This incentive permits taxpayers to expense or write off up to \$125,000 worth of qualified depreciable property on their 2012 tax return. Below are additional details:

- Property must be purchased and placed in service prior to 1/1/2013
- Property may be new or used
- Expense allowance is reduced by \$1 for each dollar of eligible property purchased that exceeds \$500,000
- Can be used to reduce taxable income derived from any business of taxpayer

In-foal and barren broodmares and racing prospects are examples of used property that may be eligible for this allowance. Weanlings, although defined as "new" property because they have not had a prior use, are not eligible because they cannot be placed in service this year.

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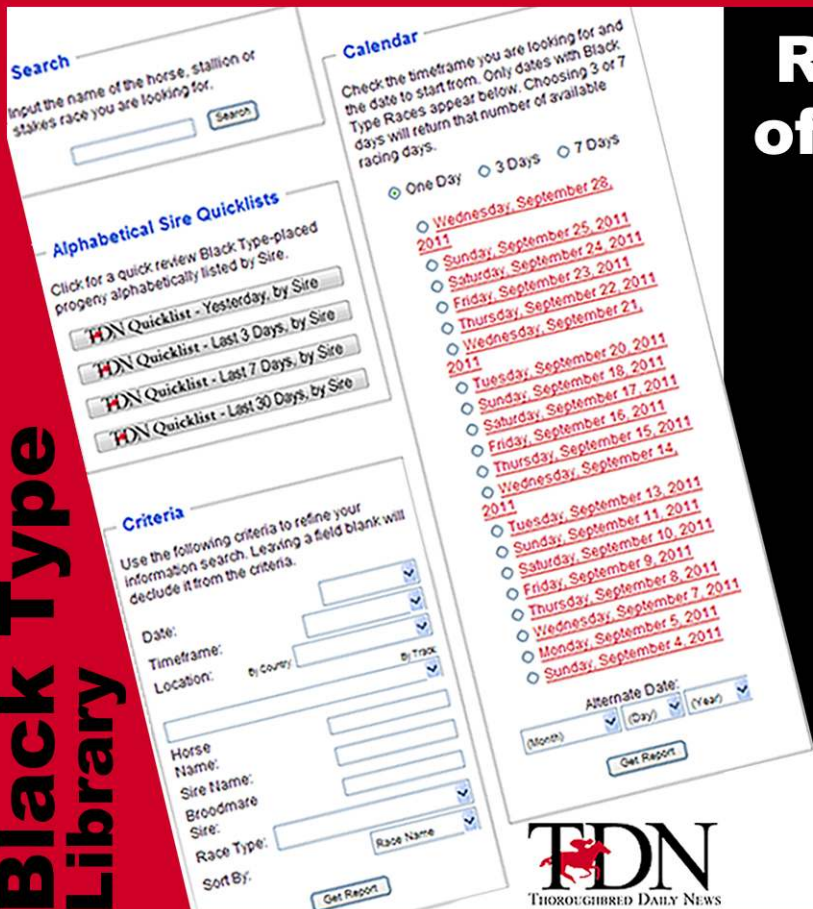
