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AVERAGE, MEDIAN UP AT KEENELAND

Propelled by a \$350,000 racing prospect by Tapit who sold as the last horse of the day, the sixth session of the Keeneland November Sale realized significant gains from a year ago. In all, 265 head sold for \$10,740,300, good for an average of \$40,529 that was up 24.1%. The median of \$32,000 saw a similar gain, up 28% from 2011's corresponding session. The RNA rate was 22.1%.

Topping the session was the Hill 'n' Dale Sales-consigned **Moro Tap** (Tapit), who book-ended Sunday's trading as [hip 2053](#). The 2-year-old gray or roan colt, who finished second in his debut at Calder a month ago, touched off a bidding duel between trainer Mike Maker, representing Sky Chai Racing and Terry Raymond, and bloodstock agent Ben McElroy, with the former team coming out on top. The final price on the colt was a full \$100,000 more than last year's \$250,000 session topper. Moro Tap was being sold on behalf of Joe

Appelbaum and Carlos Morales's Off the Hook operation and partner Grupo 7 C (*for more, see p5*).

"We liked everything about him," Maker, who did his bidding out back while Raymond stood alongside, said of Moro Tap. "We are obviously a big fan of Tapits, and he's a 2-year-old going into this 3-year-old season."

Maker trained one of Tapit's biggest stars to date, last year's champion juvenile Hansen. Sky Chai co-owned Hansen with the horse's breeder, Dr. Kendall Hansen. **Cont. p4**

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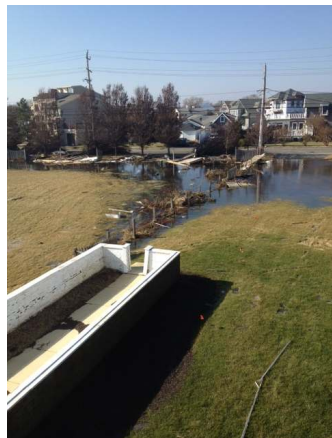

state of my community, and what happened here. With that, only now can I add my own heartfelt thank you to my amazing staff for what they accomplished.

My town, Monmouth Beach, is a small town of fewer than 4,000 residents located on a strip of land between the ocean and the Shrewsbury River. Its elevation is 20 feet above sea level. For many of us in this area, life is defined by summer months spent at our beach clubs, most of which no longer exist. We enjoy living in the kind of place people liked to come on

vacation, and we considered ourselves lucky to live here.

I'm one of the lucky ones. A lifetime of belongings was, for the most part, undamaged. But as I drove the six miles yesterday from my highway exit to my home, all I saw were ancient trees uprooted and lying on their sides,

mountains of debris in front of people's yards that had been dragged to the curb, mounds of fallen branches, and hundreds of utility trucks from as far

away as Arizona and Wyoming. As I approached my little beach town, I found my ocean view was now comprised of a 30-foot wall of people's former belongings; parts of homes, refrigerators and boats.

Along with that, there is an additional 30 foot wall of sand that has been reclaimed from people's yards, which will ultimately end up back on the beach.

Everybody in New Jersey was compromised by loss of power. In my town, virtually everybody was also compromised by the loss of their belongings; most people, the least fortunate, have lost the use of their homes. We all have been compromised by the loss of use of our community, and it's hard to imagine that life here will ever be the same again.

Today, as I look out my window, the ocean and the river are flat, keeping within their traditional boundaries. It's hard to understand that two weeks ago, with Sandy's help, the very things that we loved so much about living here left those boundaries, and forever changed everyone's lives for the worse.

Mike Maker said that the Hansen and Moro Tap had little in common, aside for their sire. "They're complete opposites," said Maker, adding of their temperaments, "Hansen would have cleared out this ring a couple times, and this guy handled everything with ease."

Maker said the horse will join his Kentucky string before being shipped to Florida for the winter.

Terry Raymond has varied business interests, including real estate, but had his biggest financial success selling a t-shirt company he founded, Sunrise Sportswear, in the mid-1990s.

The company had upwards of 300 employees at its height. Raymond currently resides in the Louisville area.

The top price for a mare Sunday was the \$190,000 Margaux Farm, agent, paid for **Magnetic Miss** (Artax). The 8-year-old was consigned by Hidden Brook as [hip 1734](#), and was offered as part of a mare-share agreement between Stonestreet Thoroughbreds and partners Richard Rudolph and Michael Vranich. Stonestreet contributed the Curlin season that produced the foal Magnetic Miss is currently carrying. It will be her second foal. She also has a First Samurai yearling filly who was bred by Rudolph and Vranich. The Illinois-bred Magnetic Miss, who was bred by Rudolph, was an admirably tough mare on the Chicago circuit who won six black-type events and earned nearly \$460,000. She was trained by Spanky Broussard.

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A Great Idea Meets Great White Hope

This past July, Joe Appelbaum had a novel idea. He knew he had a good horse on his hands in the form of an unraced juvenile colt named **Moro Tap** (Tapit--Ghost Dancing, by Silver Ghost)--yesterday's \$350,000 session topper. He also knew that, given the horse's pedigree, his phone would light up with calls from interested bloodstock agents following what Appelbaum hoped, and expected, would be an auspicious debut. So he and Carlos Morales, his partner in the pinhooking and racing operation Off the Hook, took the unusual step of entering Moro Tap in the Keeneland November Sale.

"We're in the business of selling horses, and the best place to sell, after all, is at a sale," Appelbaum reasoned.

But yesterday wasn't the first time Appelbaum and company offered the Moro Tap at auction. They acquired the gray from the Evans dispersal at the 2011 Keeneland September Sale for a modest \$10,000, and put him through the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale in March. Despite a solid enough [:10 3/5](#) breeze for an eighth, bidding for Moro Tap stalled out at \$100,000, and Off the Hook decided to buy him back and put him into training.

"We're a somewhat unique operation in that we both race and sell, and so we weren't afraid to go to the race track," said Appelbaum. "He was a little immature at the time. He was skinny, he had a little fever, but he still worked nice, and we thought he had some talent. So we turned him out for 60 days and started him back in early June. He really started to pick it up over the summer, and in late July we decided to nominate [to Keeneland November]."

The idea was to race the colt once, then sell him at November. As it so rarely does in horse racing, all went to plan.

"We sent him to Calder on Sept. 1 [with trainer Gilberto Zerpá], and he just kept developing," said Appelbaum. "His body really blossomed in the last 60 to 90 days. He's really nice-sized now, but he wasn't back in March when we tried to sell him. He was a little meatball then--not a bad horse, but just a horse. I think that extra time made all the difference."

Unveiled in a six-furlong maiden special at Calder Oct. 12, Moro Tap ran a good second, getting beat 2 1/2 lengths while earning a 79 Beyer Speed Figure ([video](#)). "His first race was real good for a 2-year-old, and being by Tapit, he's got a right to go longer," said Appelbaum.

Moro Tap recently helped the cause by coming back and working a bullet :47 4/5 from the gate Nov. 1, an exceptionally strong work at Calder. "I think it was two seconds faster than the next work," said Appelbaum.

Heading into the November Sale, Appelbaum said he wasn't quite sure what to expect, but figured of the game plan, "What could it hurt us, other than an entry fee and a van ride?"

It also saved him some haggling with bloodstock agents. "I did get a number of calls after his debut," said Appelbaum. "I said 'Keeneland November, Book 3. He's there, you can vet him, you can look at him, you can do whatever you want.'"

Appelbaum said the result was everything he hoped for, adding, "We wish tremendous luck and good fortune to the owners and new trainer, Mike Maker, who's obviously had success with Tapits before. We also want to thank John Sikura and his team at Hill 'n' Dale--they did a great job."

Appelbaum and Morales are already planning a return engagement to Keeneland with a promising young colt. Appelbaum said the current 2-year-old **Falling Sky** (Lion Heart), a four-length, first-out winner at Calder Nov. 1 ([video](#)), could be pointed to Keeneland's January Sale.

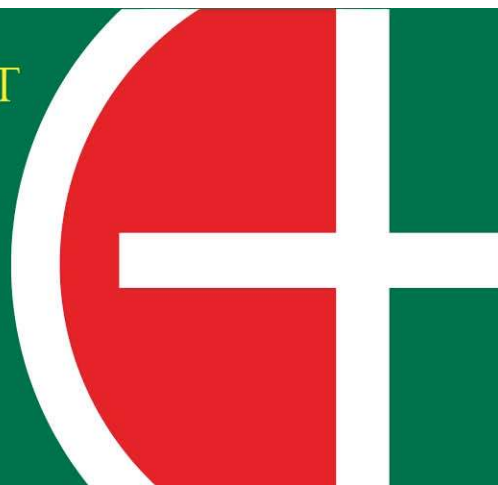

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Majesticperfection Filly Top Weanling Sunday

Brereton C. Jones' Airdrie Stud has had success selling the progeny of its first-season sire Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday) at Keeneland November, and that pattern continued yesterday when [hip 1717](#), a bay filly by the Grade I-winning sprinter, brought the top price for a weanling during the sale's sixth session.

Out of the Indian Charlie mare Listen to Libby, the February-foaled filly represents a family that has performed for Airdrie in both the sales ring and on the racetrack. Jones purchased the filly's graded stakes-winning second dam, You'renotlistening (Kennedy Road), for \$42,000 at Keeneland January in 2002 in foal to Belong to Me, and later that year put her in foal to Airdrie's Forest Camp (Deputy Minister).

That mating resulted in the filly Yachats, who Jones sold for \$125,000 later that year at Fasig-Tipton November to Aaron and Marie Jones. Yachats went on to become stakes placed and a graded stakes producer, being responsible for this year's GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie runner-up La Song (Unbridled's Song).

The following year, You'renotlistening produced Lady in Command (Deputy Commander), a winner who sold as a weanling at Keeneland November for \$170,000. Two years later came Nacho Friend (Friends Lake), who Airdrie parted with for \$62,000 as a weanling at Keeneland November to the bid of Donnay Farm. Later purchased by George and Lori Hall, he went on to place in the GII West Virginia Derby and the GIII Gotham S., earning almost \$400,000. You'renotlistening's 2010 colt, Brother Bob (Brother Derek), made \$60,000 as a Keeneland September yearling, but it appears Airdrie made the correct decision in retaining Listen to Libby, bringing her home unsold for \$170,000 from Keeneland September in 2009.

"Listen to Libby is a beautiful Indian Charlie mare that, unfortunately, we didn't get sold as a yearling," Brereton Jones' son Bret Jones, said. "She had talent, but unfortunately she had an injury and we had to retire her. We've had the family for a long time, and it's a family we've had a lot of success with. This mare gives every indication she's going to continue that success."

Hip 1717, the first foal out of Listen to Libby, was purchased by Nat Rea's Regis Farm, a Canadian-based operation that made its first bloodstock acquisition a few months ago at Keeneland September, and has been very active at this sale. (For more on Regis Farm, see [Saturday's TDN](#).) Regis Farm purchased another weanling by Majesticperfection, [hip 977](#), for \$145,000 during the sale's fourth session Friday. **Cont. p7**

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"She was a beautiful filly, and she looked the part," Jones noted. "She was just a beautifully balanced filly. She's correct, she's leggy, and she was the type that everybody liked. All the best people were following her into the back ring. It's a good-looking family, but more importantly, it's a family of runners, and I think this filly has every chance to improve on that."

Airdrie has offered four weanlings by Majesticperfection thus far at Keeneland November, with all four selling and three bringing six-figure prices. The stallion began his stud career in 2011 at a fee of \$10,000.

"We're thrilled with Majesticperfection," Jones noted. "He is as good a looking horse as you could put in the stallion barn and thankfully she's passing on those good looks as well. This filly looks like him, and if she's half as fast as he was they're going to do awfully well."

Schumer Remains Active at November

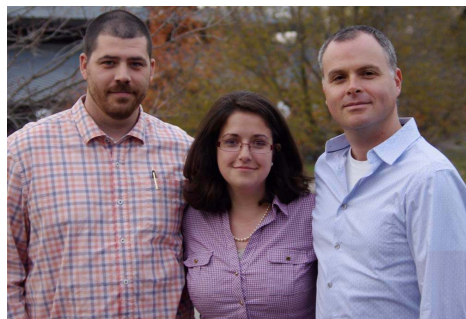
Bloodstock agent Chad Schumer hasn't spent the most money at Keeneland November, but he has bought the most. Not including horses purchased by Brandywine Farm to buy out longtime partner Rob Whiteley, no one has signed more tickets at Keeneland November than the 30 slips Schumer has put his name to.

Based in Louisville, Schumer has bought all over the spectrum, from the \$2,000 Kendall Hill (Theatrical {Ire}) ([hip 458](#)) through the \$210,000 Lynnette (Johannesburg) ([hip 246](#)). His 30 buys have averaged \$40,950, which puts his total expenditures at \$1,228,500.

Sunday was typically busy for the 42-year-old. He purchased five horses, led by the \$52,000 **Reflect the Music** (A.P. Indy) ([hip 1810](#)), the stakes-winning dam of GSP Racecar Rhapsody (Tale of the Cat) who sold from the Hill 'n' Dale consignment in foal to Stormy Atlantic.

How busy is Schumer? During the course of a roughly 10-minute interview for this article, he bid on three horses--two mares and a foal--all the while keeping up an impressive juggling act of cell phones, catalogues and buyers guides. (He didn't land any of the horses.)

Schumer says this is all he's wanted to do since he was 10, and it shows. Born and raised in Louisville, Schumer was introduced to the sport by his grandmother, who would take him to nearby Churchill Downs. "She loved to gamble," he said, adding the aside, "She was a real chalk player to, which is weird, because I go the other way."

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He hadn't reached his teens when he started getting *The Blood-Horse* by mail, and later, after graduating from the University of Louisville's equine program, he didn't waste much time setting up his own bloodstock agency.

Despite operating largely in the lower and mid-levels of the market, Schumer has put together an impressive resume. In 2004, he purchased the mare Gift of Dance (Trepolino) on behalf of a client for \$20,000. A year later, the mare's daughter Round Pond (Awesome Again) won the GI Acorn S. and later added a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

Gift of Dance wasn't the only mare Schumer purchased who would go on to produce a Breeders' Cup winner. In 2001, he acquired the stakes winner Klondike Kaytie (Encino) for \$6,000 at OBS. The next live foal the mare produced was Kip Deville (Kipling), who would go on to victory in the GI BC Mile.

Prior to them becoming stakes performers, Schumer also purchased the dams of Grade I winners Rahy's Attorney (Crown Attorney) (Schumer purchased his dam Rahy's Hope for \$8,000 in 2005) and Thorn Song (Unbridled's Song) (dam purchased for \$26,000 in 2006).

Sure, Schumer has numbers on his side, but that's a pretty nice honor roll no matter how you slice it.

Schumer has a varied client list that includes a number of overseas interests. In addition to those from his North American clients, he's had orders at Keeneland November from Chile, Panama and Jamaica. But by far, his biggest orders have come from Saudi Arabia. **Cont. p8**



For an unnamed client (or clients) there, he has an order for 36 broodmares.

"I'd say about two thirds of our purchases will go overseas, and one third will stay here," Schumer explained.

We asked what he's looking for in prospects. "Well, in Saudi Arabia, for instance, they like a mare whose had foals--they don't want maiden mares," he explained. "They race only on dirt, so we typically avoid mares with European or grass pedigrees. They don't mind some age. We bought a Seattle Slew mare who was older, but she is a stakes producer. They love a stakes producer--there's quality there. I like a very solid, good-sized mare, who is correct. Conformation is very important for them--they might be a little forgiving on some things, but they want a good set of knees. As far as pedigree goes, the obvious--A.P. Indy, Awesome Again, Unbridled's Song mares. All your premier broodmare sires."

Schumer doesn't work the sales alone, and is quick to credit those around him. He brings in the indefatigable Nancy Sexton of the *Racing Post* to assist, and has full-time help from Sean Nix. "Nancy is great, and Sean, who has been my assistant for about a year, is an absolutely essential part of the program," said Schumer.

Given the range in which he participates, Schumer is uniquely qualified to weigh in on the current market from a buyer's perspective. "I think the market's been very odd," he says bluntly.

"On some horses, I've been blown away on the prices, but on some of the mares--and I know this drives the consignors crazy--I've gotten mares for half of what I was willing to pay," Schumer continued. "I really don't have an explanation for it, but that can be typical at mixed sales. I think the foal market could be better. We sold a few that did reasonably well, and others that didn't."

Schumer is also in an interesting position to comment on the number of American mares being sent overseas, and admits that, even though many of his clients are foreign, he's encouraged when a Mandy Pope comes away with sought-after prospects like Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) and Plum Pretty (Medaglia d'Oro).

"We're not buying the million-dollar mares--yet--but it's nice to see an American buyer step up like that," he said. "So many of these top mares have left America. Obviously, I'm happy to be representing overseas interests and buying for them, and I think it's wonderful for the market, but I think it is a concern."

"It's the same even at my range. I've gotten several mares in the \$100,000 range, which is a pretty nice mare, and those are headed overseas. I'd like to see some American breeders step up and target some European or Japanese mares and bring some new blood into the game."

Given his track record, maybe Schumer will wind up being the guy who leads that charge someday. -Lucas Marquardt

Ready to roll the dice?

Breeding Stock Sale 8-11 December, Deauville

Once again this year, the catalogue is bursting with opportunities for those wishing to upgrade their broodmare band or to dig out a nice foal. And with just a bit of success you might also land on the **"BONUS"** square, just as **SIYOUMA** buyer did when he bought her last year before winning two **Gr.1. ALPINE ROSE** had already shown the way earlier and her first foal was sold for €1,2 million in August this year...

So, ready to roll the dice ?

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Blame, Quality Road Off to Fast Start At Sales

Blame (Arch) and **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) did some pretty special things on the track, so it's no surprise their foals have been well received at the November sales this year. According to the *TDN's* [Insta-Tistics](#), Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilschneider's GI BC Classic winner **Blame** is the leading freshman sire by average, with 13 offered and 13 sold for an average of \$136,153. **Quality Road** checks in second, with 14 of his 24 weanlings (coming into yesterday's session) selling for an average of \$122,857. Both horses stood their initial year at stud for fees of \$35,000.

Blame's top-priced weanling is a Lakland Sales-consigned half-brother to the fast GSW Eightyfiveinafifty (Forest Camp) who made \$320,000 at Keeneland November. Bloodstock agent Steve Young made the buy.

The Ned Evans-campaigned **Quality Road**, whose victories including the GI Met Mile, can boast of a \$410,000 colt from the family of Rule of Law (Kingmambo).

Mike McMahon, of McMahon & Hill Bloodstock, purchased one of the eight **Blame** weanlings to reach the six-figure mark, a half-brother to MSW One Smokin' Lady (Smoke Glacken) who sold at Keeneland for \$160,000.

McMahon said he's been impressed with **Blame's** weanlings as a group, a position bolstered by the fact that **Blame's** leading median figure of \$150,000 is higher than his average. "His weanlings have been very consistent," said McMahon. "They're more refined than [Blame's sire] Arch; they very much remind me of **Blame** himself. Our guy in particular reminds me of **Blame**."

McMahon added that it's a sire line he's particularly fond of. "We're big fans of Arch," he said. "I remember him as a yearling and loved him then, and followed his career closely. We're really happy to support a son of Arch as a stallion."

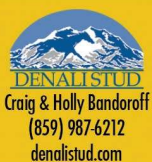

HUGHES CROWNED CHAMPION

Richard Hughes, who had secured his first British champion jockey title weeks prior to Saturday's turf finale at Doncaster, spoke of his delight at the honor. After stretching his lead over chief adversaries Silvestre de Sousa and William Buick to an unassailable one well in advance of the closing meeting of the current season, he said, "It's a great feeling and I don't think I have been lucky--I think I've earned it."

Among his 172 winners, which put him 41 clear of de Sousa, was the seven-timer he registered at Windsor last month. "If I had to single out one day, it would have to be at Windsor when I had those seven winners," he added. "I had the title tied up by then. It's a privilege to be champion and I'll go for it again next year."

Amy Ryan also became the first female jockey to land the champion apprentice title outright. "The apprentice title was at the back of mind, as it was my last season to go for it, but I never imagined I'd be in this position," she said. "I've ridden some good horses and been very lucky." Hayley Turner was handed the inaugural champion lady rider award, which is based on a winners-to-runners ratio, while John Gosden ended the year as champion for the first time and Godolphin were champion owners.
