



EBLOUISSANTE EFFERVESCENT IN DEBUT

The Friday before Thanksgiving is usually a quiet time on the U.S. racing front, but all eyes were on

Eblouissante (Bernardini) as the 3-year-old half-sister to Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) was set to make her debut in Betfair Hollywood's fourth race. Equipped with blinkers, the nearly black filly emulated her star sibling with a sweeping move to take the 8 1/2-furlong maiden.

Owner/breeder Eric Kronfeld, who described himself as "a kid looking forward to Christmas," was

on hand for the ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ performance.

"Knowing how special Zenyatta was, and then you think there's a chance she's special and it's, like, 'wow!'" Kronfeld summed up. "It's just an amazing feeling to watch her do what she did."

The New Yorker admitted to being cautiously optimistic as the horses made their way to the post.

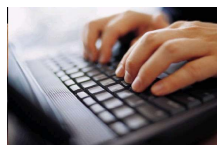
"I think anybody that expects that kind of a race would be an absolute fool," he stated. "I would have liked to believe that she could do it, but I did not think that she would win as easily as she did. It's a horse's first race, you never know what might happen. All you can do is hope for the best, and I couldn't be more pleased."

Eblouissante is trained by John Shirreffs, who guided Zenyatta through a 19-for-20 career that included victories in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

"I thought she handled everything well," Shirreffs reported. "As a first-time starter, she didn't really know what was going on. Going a mile and a sixteenth the first time, that was really something. It's like something clicked and she knew she was supposed to catch the horses in front of her."

Kronfeld was full of praise for Shirreffs' cautious approach.

"He is a breathtakingly great trainer," Kronfeld offered. "When he's entrusted with a large animal--and Eblouissante and Zenyatta are obviously large animals--he takes his time; he doesn't put too much stress on their frames, so they don't break down. He was given carte blanche to train her as long as he needed to and until she was mentally and physically ready to run, and really that's just happened over the last three or four weeks." 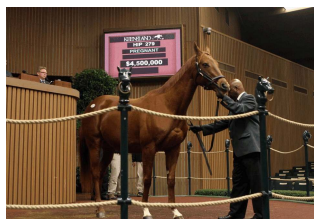

THE NOVEMBER NUMBERS KEEP IMPROVING:

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JACKPOT RIVALS FACING IDENTITY CRISIS

Trainer Kelly Breen has a 'bern'-ing suspicion that his streak of bad luck in the \$1-million GIII Delta Downs Jackpot S. could change this afternoon. And in the form of George and Lori Hall's **Bern Identity** (Bernstein), he could just be right. After finishing second to Big

Drama (Montbrook) with West Side Bernie (Bernstein) in 2008, Breen sent out Sweet Ducky (Pulpit) to a fourth-place effort behind Gourmet Dinner (Trippi) in 2010 and was no better than ninth with last year's Jean Laffitte S. winner My Adonis (Pleasantly

Perfect). But this year could be a different story, as Bern Identity has already accomplished more than any of Breen's other runners. A 13 3/4-length maiden winner at second asking at Belmont June 1, Bern Identity rattled home to land Saratoga's GII Sanford S. July 22 and was third to likely champion Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday) in the GII Three Chimneys Hopeful S. Sept. 3. Sent down to Delta for the Oct. 20 Laffitte, he raced away to a three-length score from **Mylute** (Midnight Lute) and has a best-of-65 four-furlong move in the interim. Trainer Doug O'Neill, who sent out Basmati (Borrego) to a runner-up effort in last year's Jackpot, is double-barreled this time, including morning-line choice **Goldencents** (Into Mischief). Dubbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ following an impressive 7 1/4-length maiden win at Del Mar Sept. 2, the bay was the main market rival to Shanghai Bobby in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Oct. 6 and set the pace for the opening half-mile before staying on for a runner-up effort. He has trained well since and is bred nicely for this trip. **Know More** (Lion Heart) broke his maiden for O'Neill and owner Paul Reddam in the GII Best Pal S. Aug. 5. Runner-up in the Sept. 5 GI Del Mar Futurity and GI FrontRunner S. Sept. 29, he exits a 13th in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 3. **Field** p4

Humphrey Jr. homebred, heroine of the GIII Regret S. over this course in June, came up a half-length short in the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga Aug. 19, then was a clear-cut second to the streaking Dayatthespa (City Zip) in Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. Oct. 13. "We were very happy with her in the QEII," trainer

Rusty Arnold offered. "I think we had her as good as she could be for that race. She still has room for improvement. She's only a 3-year-old." **Peace Preserver** (War Front) continues to show improvement with racing experience since joining the Todd Pletcher barn. A troubled second behind Dayatthespa in Saratoga's Riskaverse S. Aug. 31, she earned a career-high 96 Beyer while annexing Belmont's Pebbles S. by 6 1/2 lengths Oct. 8. **Miz Ida** (Proud Citizen) enters riding a three-race winning streak, including a narrow victory over **English Class** (English Channel) and **Leading Astray** (Belong to Me) in the split-division GIII Pin Oak Valley View S. at Keeneland Oct. 19.

'GOLD' LOOKS GOOD IN PRINCESS

While Floridian raiders have had their fair share of success in the GIII Delta Jackpot S., the same cannot be said for the GIII Delta Downs Princess S., but the Sunshine State will be represented by a pair of capable fillies in this year's renewal. **Rose to Gold** (Friends Lake) kicked off her career in spectacular fashion, drilling a field of maidens in the Calder slop by some 13 lengths Aug. 25 before turning in an equally dominating 13 1/2-length tour-de-force in the Sept. 15 Brave Raj S. Those two efforts earned her the chance to prove she was perhaps Breeders' Cup material and was a 6-1 gamble for the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Oct. 5, but she failed badly in 12th and returns to conventional dirt this afternoon.

Salamera (Successful Appeal) is pegged as the morning-line favorite, and won the J J's Dream S. at Calder June 30 ahead of a runner-up effort to **"TDN Rising Star"** **Kauai Katie** (Malibu Moon) in the GII Adirondack S. Aug. 12. She too was a flop in a potential Breeders' Cup prep when a distant fifth in the GI Chandelier S. at Santa Anita Sept. 29. Should she opt for this spot, **Sittin At the Bar** (Into Mischief) could offer serious longshot value. The bay easily handled fellow Louisiana-breds by nearly eight lengths in her Aug. 16 bow at Evangeline and sat a nightmarish trip in the Oct. 19 My Trust Cat S., finishing two lengths adrift of **Madame Cactus** (Cactus Ridge) after looming a final-furlong factor. Sittin At the Bar is also entered for restricted Louisiana Jewel S. later on the card for which she is the 7-5 morning-line selection.

KING FOR A DAY?

King David (Hat Trick {Jpn}), a 28-1 upset winner of the GI Jamaica H. at Belmont Oct. 6, puts a five-race winning streak on the line against a full field in today's GIII Commonwealth Turf S. at Churchill Downs. The dark bay was halted by Scarlet Stable and trainer Mike Maker for \$35,000 out of a winning effort at Belmont two starts back Sept. 13. **Finnegans Wake** (Powerscourt {GB}), a strong second in the GI Secretariat S. at Arlington Aug. 18, didn't seem to care for the yielding going at Belmont when a dull fourth in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. last time Sept. 29. **Lockout** (Limehouse) continues to step up his game since moving to grass, most recently delivering by a head in the Remington Green S. Sept. 30. The John Oxley colorbearer was also second-best to Summer Front (War Front) in Saratoga's Duluth S. in July. The top three finishers from the GIII Hawthorne Derby square off again. Contested in a driving rain storm over a very soft going, **Two Months Rent** (Purim) defeated **Film Shot** (Distorted Humor) by a head at odds of 20-1. It was another 3 3/4 lengths back to **Lea** (First Samurai) in third that day.

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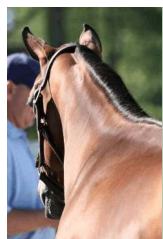
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KEENELAND NOVEMBER Breeding Stock Sale

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TOP END HELPS KEEP KEENOV ON TRACK

The Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, which concluded an 11-day run yesterday in Lexington, was always going to have a hard time matching up with a 2011 predecessor bolstered by two major dispersals. So when the last horse went through the ring Friday and final numbers were calculated, sale officials declared themselves satisfied with the overall performance of the world's biggest bloodstock auction. In all, 2,414 horses sold for \$143,025,600. The resulting average of \$59,248 was down 27.4%, while the median of \$22,000 was down a modest 8.3%. The RNA rate was 23.3%.

"It was a very good sale from start to finish," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I'd say it's been a very true market. The top end was stronger than anticipated, and there were a lot more players at the top end than people anticipated. [International participation was] strong, and all the usual players and all the usual countries were here. I think the foundations we've laid down, both here and at [Keeneland] September, bodes very well for horse racing."

Topping the sale at \$4.5 million was **Pure Clan** (Pure Clan), who sold in foal to Bernardini to Borges Torrealba Holdings's Goncalo Torrealba. Pure Clan was consigned by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales, which enjoyed a very successful November run. Hill 'n' Dale also sold the auction's co-second-highest-priced horse, the \$4.2-million **Changing Skies (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), a brilliantly bred graded winner who was offered in foal to Street Cry (Ire). Matching that price was the Taylor Made-consigned **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro). Whisper Hill Farm's Mandy Pope signed for last year's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine a day after securing Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) at Fasig-Tipton for \$10 million, a record for a broodmare prospect at public auction. It was the first time since 2007 that Keeneland November saw three horses bring in excess of \$4 million. **Cont. p7**

"We knew those mares would bring a premium, but they brought even a bigger premium than we thought they would," admitted Russell.

Prices at the very top of the market indeed exceeded almost every prediction, and the strength at that level helped offset, at least partly, those audacious 2011 figures. Last year, the late Ned Evans's Spring Hill Farm dispersal, ultimately the highest-grossing dispersal in North American history, saw 170 head bring over \$55.8 million, while Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments dispersal grossed over \$17.9 million and accounted for the sale-topping, \$8.5 million Royal Delta (Empire Maker). In total, there were 23 horses who made \$1 million or more in 2011, 16 of which were from the dispersals.

When the dispersal figures are removed from last the totals, year-over-year figures, predictably, match up much more favorably. In 2012, 2,414 horses grossed \$143,025,600, up 5.4% percent from last year when 2,354 horses brought \$135,752,200. The average price of \$59,248 rose 2.7% percent from 2011's \$57,669, while the median increased 10% from \$20,000 to \$22,000.

Keeneland November Wrap-Up cont.

One of the most encouraging aspects of the 2012 Keeneland November Sale was that the buyers of the top lots, while not necessarily new, were new to playing at that level of the market. Goncalo Torrealba has been a longtime international participant, but hadn't been known to battle for the top-dollar lots. The same can be said for Pope, a regular on the sales scene for the past few years who nonetheless had rarely paid seven figures for a horse, much less eight. Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International was representing an unnamed international client who may or may not have

established ties in racing, but Mandore as an entity is certainly new to buying at the top.

Pope's participation and determination, in particular, were commended. That an American was going after and securing premier breeding prospects was viewed as a good thing for the long-term health of the breeding industry here. "She's been great," said Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni. "It's good for the sport, and it's nice to see those mares staying in North America."

A Stratified Market...

The top was strong, but if we've been reminded of anything over the past two weeks, be it presidential politics or Thoroughbred breeding, it's that we live in a stratified world, and things were less rosy in other areas of the market at November.

"My assumption coming into the sale was that the middle and the upper-middle was going to be strong, and I had a question about the top end of the market," said Mark Taylor of Taylor Made Sales, Keeneland November's leading consignor. "What we actually saw was that the top end and the upper middle was extremely strong, and the middle had some question marks. We're hearing about the fiscal cliff now, and there was a quality cliff. Somewhere between the \$100,000 to \$50,000 range, it just dropped off. Especially with the lower-end broodmare prospects."

Taylor explained the reasons for that. "At this point, people don't want to get tied up with a year of getting a mare pregnant and getting the baby out, then waiting another year [to sell]," he said. "I think it's a very impatient market. People wanted mares they could get a quick return on, or at least get some money back very soon. I think the top end of the market was great, and everything else held its own, but it was dicey in spots."

Select Sales's Carrie Brogden agreed with Taylor. "It's a very polarized market," she said. "I think it's very strong on the upper-end mares and the top 30% of foals. But I don't know how anyone breeds middle-market mares anymore. We sold a young Pulpit mare who was a \$310,000 weanling, who was carrying her third foal to Warrior's Reward, and she brought \$8,000.

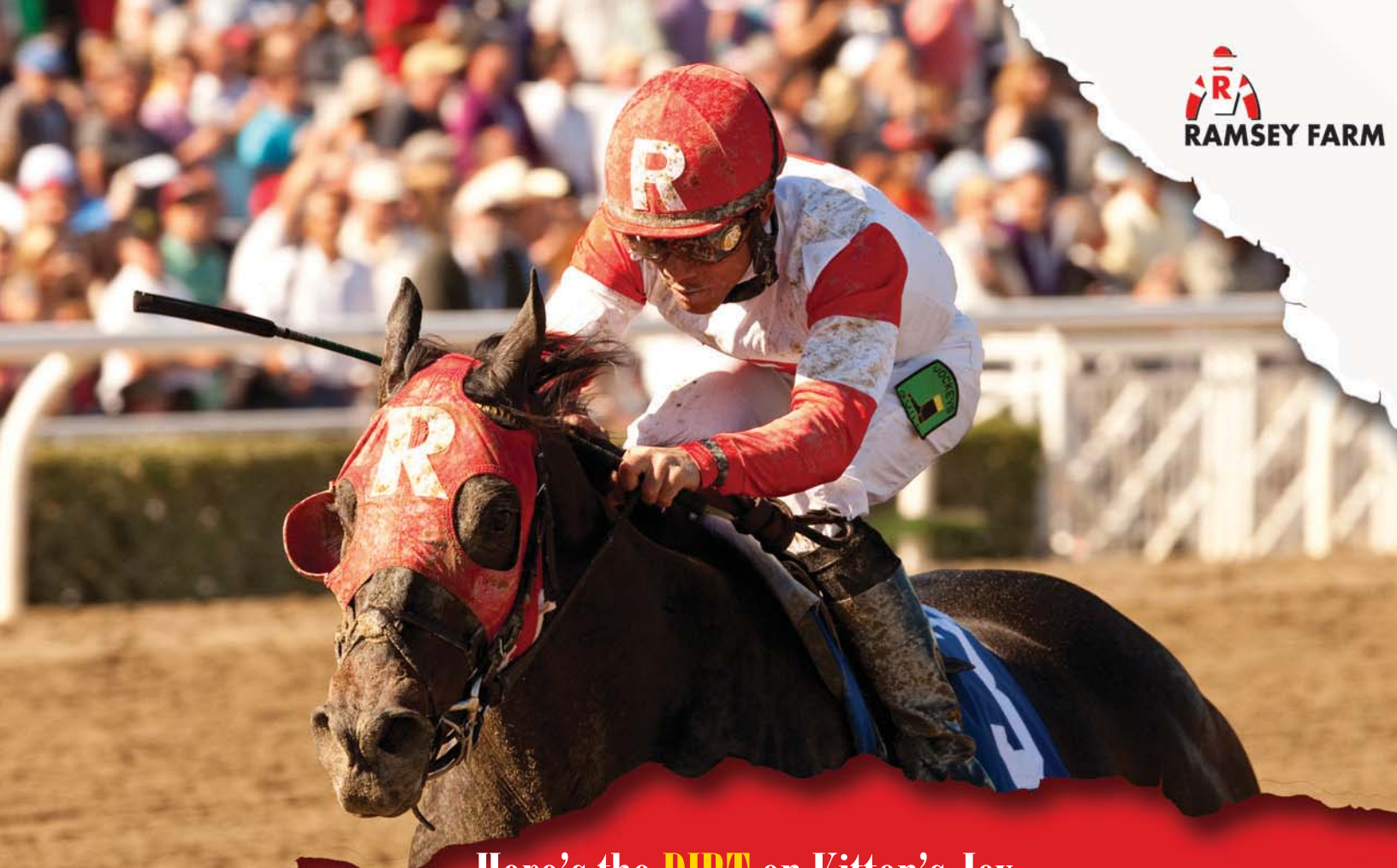

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We paid the \$12,500 stud fee a week before she brought that, and you think, what's the point? I told anyone who brought in a middle-aged mare, or a mare not carrying her first or second foal, to be prepared to put in no reserve or a little reserve, and be prepared to take a hit on the stud fee. You better have what they want. If you do, they're willing to fight over it and it's very strong. If you don't, you're just kind of trading dollars. It's funny, though, because you can get a \$100,000 foal out of a \$5,000 mare, but you can also have a \$5,000 foal out of a \$100,000 mare."

Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell admitted "it was tight" in the middle of the market. "Mares are interesting," he said. "People have a certain criteria they're looking for, and if they're unsuccessful in finding it, they don't change their criteria--they just don't buy. With yearlings, when you don't buy one, you'll go buy another one, because you're looking for a racehorse. Mares are long-term investments."

Weanling Market Softens...

One notable soft spot in the market came with weanlings. Despite their being roughly 200 more weanlings in the 2012 November catalogue than a year ago, only 35 weanlings made \$200,000 or more in 2012. In 2011, 60 weanlings hit or exceeded that mark, and four made in excess of \$1 million, led by a \$2.6 million Medaglia d'Oro half-sister to Horse of the Year Saint Liam from the Evans dispersal. The top-priced weanling in 2012 was an \$800,000 War Front three-parts brother to Pomeroy (Boundary) who sold to John McCormack Bloodstock.

"I expected the babies at all levels to be stronger than they were," admitted Mark Taylor. "I think a lot of the weanling-to-yearling pinhookers have gotten hammered the last couple years, and they pulled their horns in a little bit, and I don't blame them."

Geoffrey Russell echoed the sentiment. "I think the main weanling buyers are pinhookers, and I think they did drop their sites," he said. "They pulled back. That's just a reflection of where the market is. There's a comfort level there, and when you start paying six figures for a weanling, it's a very precise target you're aiming at. I think they wanted to go after weanlings that had broader appeal."

For at least one weanling buyer, however, the prices might have reflected the quality of weanling on offer. "I thought the weanling market was strong, but it didn't look like there were a lot of really good ones out there," said Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni, whose purchases included a \$270,000 Quality Road--Flashy Frolic weanling colt and a \$150,000 Distorted Humor--True Legacy (GB) weanling colt.

"And I thought mares were tough to buy at spots--all over. There were some in Books 4 and 5 where, when you went up, you had to give more than you had to in the last couple of years, for sure." Ultimately, most everyone agreed that it's getting tougher and tougher to breed for the market unless you have a horse by a hot sire who vets well, and that many breeders have responded by continuing to cull--or simply not purchase--lower- and middle-market mares. "Production costs have just kept going up," said Taylor. "Vet costs, boarding costs, fuel costs, insurance costs--everything's going up, and you have to have a pretty nice horse to make it worthwhile. It's squeezing the little guy out of the market."

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Going Out With a Bang...

Six-figure horses are not the order of the day at the tail end of any sale, but Friday's final session of the November Sale was topped by hip [3783](#), Royal Irish Lass (Saint Ballado), on a final bid of \$210,000. The mare, a daughter of millionaire Irish Linnet (Seattle Song), was acquired by Liberation Farm for \$20,000 carrying a foal by Leroidesanimaux (Brz) at this event in 2010 and her page was enhanced greatly this year by the on-track exploits by her current 2-year-old, Tara From the Cape, also by the Stonewall stallion. A four-length maiden winner at first asking at Woodbine June 9, she was acquired privately by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Gary Barber and made an immediate impression, taking the Thomas Greene Memorial S. at Delaware Park Aug. 2. Third in Saratoga's P.G. Johnson S. Aug. 29, the chestnut was a creditable fourth in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Oct. 5 and was most recently fourth, beaten less than three lengths, after setting the pace in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 2. Jim and Pam Robinson, who operate the Brandywine Farm agency and offered the mare on behalf of Rob Whiteley's Liberation Farm, signed the winning ticket.

The winner of last year's GI Stephen Foster H. over the Clark track and trip, Pool Play worked in company with John Oxley's **Stealcas** (Lawyer Ron), who is under consideration for both the Clark and the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 24. Both horses are trained by Mark Casse, whose assistant trainer and son Norman Casse was on hand to oversee the works. "They went off [the first eighth of a mile] in 13 seconds, and then did 12s the rest of the way around," Casse noted. "It was perfect. I asked them to go 1:02 and they went 1:01 and change. We like working our good horses with each other and both of these horses appreciate working in company. They're two professional horses and it was nice to let them go out and do it together." Prior to the Breeders' Cup, Pool Play won the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Oct. 6. The 3-year-old Stealcas broke through with his first graded victory in the GIII Ontario Derby at Woodbine Sept. 16, and was most recently third in the GIII Ack Ack H. at Churchill Nov. 2.

Guillermo Berrios' Puerto Rican import **My Wandy's Girl** (Flower Alley), winner of Thursday's six-furlong Pentelis S. at Aqueduct, could be headed to the GI Gazelle S., trainer Mike Hushion revealed yesterday. A four-time stakes winner in Puerto Rico, the 3-year-old filly, who was picked up by her owner for \$15,000 at OBS March last year, was making her mainland debut on Thursday. The Pentelis marked her ninth straight win. "The last week she really got to looking good, and she was training well," Hushion commented. "I liked the [Pentelis], and I'm going to look into running back in the Gazelle. I want to go back to a mile and an eighth. I told [Ramon] Dominguez in the paddock, 'save as much as you can,' and he hit her only three times." Other probables for the Gazelle include stakes winners **Book Review** (Giant's Causeway), **Dance Card** (Tapit), and graded-placed **Jemima's Pearl** (Distorted Humor).

CHRB APPROVES EXCHANGE WAGERING

The California Horse Racing Board approved rules that would permit exchange wagering at its meeting Thursday at Betfair Hollywood Park. However, these rules must still be approved by California's Office of Administrative Law, and there may be further legal challenges ahead, according to published reports.

Earlier this year, the Thoroughbred Owners of California deferred a vote on exchange wagering until 2013.

"We expected them to approve these regulations, but we have no position at this time," TOC President Lou Raffetto commented yesterday. "We've encouraged the tracks and companies to experiment and move forward so we can get some data from that to see what happens with exchange wagering. But we don't expect to take an official position until next spring."

If the rules are approved, it would be a landmark victory for exchange wagering pioneer Betfair, which acquired the California-based Television Games Network (TVG) in 2009, and secured the naming rights for Betfair Hollywood Park earlier this year. Betfair's application to conduct exchange wagering in the Golden State was approved by the CHRB at Thursday's meeting, but the license would not become effective until final approval, which is at least two months away. Betfair would be required to cover the costs of implementing exchange wagering, including computer hardware, software, and staff training. Those costs are estimated to be at least \$500,000.

Exchange wagering was part of a bill that was signed into law in New Jersey in 2011, but it is not yet in practice.

Unfortunately, cheating is part of the sport; even if that means only the perception that some trainers break the rules to win. This year, more so than ever, officials from the Breeders' Cup, Santa Anita and the CHRB worked to ensure that no trainer cheated. And with so many safeguards in place, they very well may have had an event where the strongest drug in any horse's system was Lasix.

"The issue on raceday medication was important and all in all we feel like it was very worthwhile," Breeders' Cup President and CEO Craig Fravel said. "Equally important was the level of security, surveillance, testing and other measures that really made sure that the Breeders' Cup in 2012 was conducted at the highest level of sportsmanship and integrity."

The Jockey Club President and COO Jim Gagliano echoed those sentiments. "I thought it was a great two days of racing and I am not aware of two days of racing in North America that were conducted under such stringent policies in regards to medication and the safety and integrity of the races," Gagliano said. "Any time we can have a very level playing field based on the horse's natural ability only, that is the sort of fair competition we all want to have."

While the ban on Lasix in the 2-year-old events has gotten by far the most publicity, it was just one of many steps taken to run an event where a horse's natural ability was meant to be the key factor when it came to who hit the wire first. Every Breeders' Cup starter was under constant surveillance for at least 72 hours prior to their racing and over a fourth of the starters were subject to out-of-competition testing that took place in five countries. Lasix shots could only be administered by Breeders' Cup-affiliated veterinarians who did not work for the trainers and no horses were allowed to race with adjunct bleeding medications. And under rules that went into effect in California this summer, clenbuterol could not be given to the horses within 21 days of the Breeders' Cup.

"As things stand today, this was a tremendous step," said Gagliano. "There will always be a new synthetic drug developed that no one has a test for and we'll be forever chasing. That seems to be the case in all American sports. But what took place a few Fridays and Saturdays ago was the best set up we ever had and I would like to see it replicated for all our major events."

Said Rick Arthur, the equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board: "We had a very robust program and worked with a very good testing laboratory. I am quite confident we had very clean racing."

In fact, none of the samples came back positive.

It is possible, maybe even likely, that what took place at this year's Breeders' Cup is about to become the new normal in North American horse racing, where the trends are starting to get turned upside down. The same industry where it once seemed that there was no limit to how far the envelope might be pushed when it came to drugs is now taking steps toward severe restrictions on what medications can be used. It is also taking its problem with illegal drugs far more seriously.

The most obvious change has been to control the use of Lasix, once a medication given only to certified bleeders but now used by about 95% of all horses that race. The Breeders' Cup did not allow it in this year's 2-year-old races and it will not be permitted in any of the races next year. Predictably, the Lasix ban has been the source of great controversy and just as many people seem to love the idea as hate the idea. Finding someone who is impartial is next to impossible.

With only five Breeders' Cup races that included 50 starters, the sample size is too small to draw any meaningful conclusions, but here's what we do know:

--Under the definition of bleeding recognized by the California Horse Racing Board, which is blood coming from the nostrils, no horse bled in any Breeders' Cup event, whether in the 2-year-old races or all other races.

But not everyone uses that definition to define

bleeding. The vast majority of horses, when scoped, show some signs of having bled after racing. It is not known which horses or how many horses bled to that extent or whether their performances were affected by them having to run without Lasix.

At least one trainer, Mark Casse, has been adamant that his chances were compromised by his horses having to run without Lasix. He said that his Juvenile Fillies starter Spring in the Air bled significantly.

"There's no question it would have been different had she had Lasix," Casse said. "Before this she had never had any bleeding problems [with Lasix]."

--There were no indications that the lack of Lasix threw form out of whack. Shanghai Bobby, the Juvenile winner, paid just \$4.60 and ran pretty much the same race he had been running when on Lasix in the Hopeful and Champagne. Juvenile Fillies winner Beholder, also coming off Lasix, was a logical winner who appears to have a bright future.

"The bottom line is horses will run without medication," said Richard Mandella, Beholder's trainer. "They're not as desperate as we think they are and there's no reason to think we can't have racing without it. People who say that, well, that's kind of shocking to me."

--The fields for the 2-year-old dirt races were alarmingly small. There were seven entered in the Juvenile Sprint, of which five started; eight in the Juvenile Fillies; and nine in the Juvenile. At least one owner, Mike Repole, refused to run any 2-year-olds in the Breeders' Cup because of the Lasix ban.

"I have to think the reason we saw diminished fields in the Breeders' Cup juvenile dirt races was because of the Lasix situation," Todd Pletcher said.

Pletcher is among those who was firmly opposed to the Lasix ban, which will include all Breeders' Cup races next year. Among trainers, he is far from alone. There was constant grumbling on the backstretch about having to compete without Lasix and some trainers were quite vocal. None was more incensed than Casse.

"I've calmed down a little bit," he said. "I would say that I went into the Breeders' Cup disappointed and that I came out of it downright mad and now I am at a point where I am not going to sit around and do nothing, nor is [owner] Mr. [John] Oxley. Mr. Oxley was very, very upset after the race. I'd rather not go into details, but I have talked to some major, major owners who say if something isn't done, not only will they not run in the Breeders' Cup but they may get out of business. It's not about the money. You're talking about people like John and Debby Oxley, and they love their horses. Here they have a filly that is a Grade I winner and when we buy or breed horses, one of the biggest goals is to win the Breeders' Cup. Then they throw something like this at you. It's just not fair. It's not fair to the horse. It's inhumane."

What happens next year, when no one can use Lasix, will be interesting. Repole is the only who came out and said he was boycotting the Breeders' Cup, but none of his horses had the sort of stature where their absence mattered. Will there be other Repoles or will the lure of Breeders' Cup victories and the millions they put into one's bank account be enough to sway even Lasix's biggest fans?

"I think they'll dig their heels in and, if anything, you'll probably see even more strident comments," Arthur said. "It's certainly something that is an emotional issue for trainers. Having practiced at the racetrack for 30 years, I know how frustrating it can be to try to manage bleeding. There are other ways to do it, but we have raised multiple generations of horsemen who can't see racing without Lasix. It's not a black and white issue. Lasix really does reduce bleeding and you can't deny that. The real issue is whether it is necessary or whether horses have to have it or not."

For the most part, Lasix isn't about cheating. Horsemen use it because they believe it controls bleeding and they certainly don't complain when the diuretic aspects of the drugs causes horses to lose 30 or 40 pounds of weight after it is administered. Even the people like Mandella, who are not necessarily Lasix fans, use it because they don't want their competitors to have an edge.

The policies may have been annoying to the trainers, and the rumor mill has been buzzing since the Breeders' Cup about which trainers may have been impacted most by the measures and why some top horses ran so poorly. But it's hard for anyone to argue against policies that discourage cheating.

"I think in this level of competition what they did is a necessity," Mandella said. "If nothing else, it assured the public that things were on the up and up and done correctly. If you had \$1 million in cash sitting out on a table, you wouldn't just have one guy who is constantly falling asleep guarding it. You would have proper security. With the kind of money that was available over the weekend it was responsible thing to do to create the sort of measures that were created."

Whether it's Lasix, security measures, withdrawal times for therapeutic medications, none of these issues are going to go away overnight. Change never comes easily in the sport, yet something dramatic is going on here. A sport has done things one way for a long time when it comes to drugs and now the tide has been reversed.

"The mega trend is definitely toward fewer drugs in sports," Arthur said. "That's true in human sport and it's going to be true in equine sport as well. The mega trend will more conservative and that's what the public is going to demand."

That's fine with Craig Fravel. He admits he'd prefer that all of racing were less complicated, less overwhelmed by drugs and the related controversies. Better yet, he wants a sport where none of this is even an issue anymore.

"I can only tell you what I hope," he said. "It would be wonderful for horse racing if five, six years from now when we come to championship events, whether it's the Kentucky Derby or the Breeders' Cup or the Arc de Triomphe or any other major race, that none of the conversation is about medication or drugs or anything else other than the quality of the horses, the sportsmanship of the connections and the overall competitiveness of the events. From the perspective of the sport, all this conversation about medication and drugs is counterproductive."

2012 BREEDERS' CUP MEDICATION REGULATIONS

*25 percent of all horses pre-entered in the Breeders' Cup were randomly selected for out-of-competition testing. The out-of-competition samples were drawn and analyzed with the cooperation of national and international racing jurisdictions and laboratories.

*Horses were secured 72 hours prior to their races.

*Two-year-old entrants in Breeders' Cup races were not allowed medications or any other substances to be administered within 24 hours of post time, including Lasix or other bleeding medications otherwise permitted by state regulations.

*Lasix injections to older horses were administered by outside veterinarians working for Breeders' Cup employed by, rather than the trainer's private practitioner.

*Lasix was the only bleeder medication allowed. Adjunct bleeder medications were not permitted.

*Class 1 and 2 anabolic steroids were prohibited, with trainers facing a one-year suspension for the first positive test, and a lifetime ban for violating the policy three times.

*Horses testing positive for a Class 1 or Class 2 substance or anabolic steroids would be disqualified to last, and the horse's trainer and all horses directly or indirectly in his care would be ineligible to participate in the Breeders' Cup the following year. A second such violation extends the ban to two years, and a third, a lifetime ban.

*The "Convicted Trainer Rule" was revised, and now imposes a minimum one-year suspension from the Breeders' Cup on any trainer with a Class 2, Category A, violation during the 12 months preceding the races. Trainers who are repeat offenders will face up to a lifetime ban.

*The first four finishers and other starters at random were selected for post-race testing of more than 100 PEDs.

*The Breeders' Cup was conducted under the CHRB's regulations where there is no longer a regulatory threshold for clenbuterol. The CHRB recommended a 21-day withdrawal period from Clenbuterol to avoid a positive test.

*Beginning in 2013, all Breeders' Cup World Championship races including any sponsored undercard stakes will also be conducted under conditions that prohibit the use of medications or other substances administered within 24 hours of post time including authorized bleeder medications otherwise permitted by state regulation.

The wild popularity of Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire})--retired after earning the 2010 Horse of the Year title--ensured that her little sister Eblouissante would attract attention, and the nearly black filly had over 3,000 Facebook fans before trainer John Shirreffs finally deemed her ready to face the starter. She was 4-1 on the morning-line, and though the money came fast and early enough to make her 1-2 at one point, the toteboard read 7-5 when the gates sprang open. Jockey Corey Nakatani secured a ground-saving spot as the rangy Eblouissante settled into stride. Saturday Nite Ride (Flower Alley) was eager to get things underway up front through splits of :23.87 and :45.07.

Eblouissante still had plenty to do approaching the half-mile pole, but, guided to the outside, made a sweeping move on the far turn to reach contention. Though it took her a while to put away the persistent pacesetter, Eblouissante drew off smartly under a hand ride once she shifted gears to score by 4 1/4 lengths. Chestnut Moon (Corinthian) rallied to nip Saturday Nite Ride for second.

"She has so many mannerisms like Zenyatta, so when she left and Eblouissante came in, it was like she was still there," said a relieved Shirreffs. "It's a thrill, it really is. We're very excited about her. She's such a beautiful racehorse."

Shirreffs didn't unveil Zenyatta until Thanksgiving of her 3-year-old season, so Eblouissante beat her sister to the punch by a week.

"Each succeeding workout was a little better than the prior one and we saw that turn of foot in the mornings," Shirreffs added. "We've been waiting for this day a long time." Nakatani was equally thrilled. "It felt so easy it was scary," he said. "She did everything I asked. Anytime you get to ride a sister of a champion like Zenyatta, it's a pleasure, especially at this stage in my career. I'm excited right now, and that's an understatement."

In addition to three-time champion older mare Zenyatta, MGISW, \$7,304,580, Eblouissante is a half-sister to Balance (Thunder Gulch), MGISW, \$1,048,491; and Where's Bailey (Aljabr), SW, \$116,313. Owner/breeder Eric Kronfeld ([click here for an in-depth TDN feature](#)) campaigned Vertigineux before selling her offspring. Balance was a \$260,000 KEESEP yearling before Zenyatta made \$60,000 at the same venue. Their exploits saw later offspring Treasure Trail (Pulpit) and Souper Spectacular (Giant's Causeway) sell for \$550,000 and \$1.15 million, respectively. Kronfeld retained Eblouissante before selling Vertigineux privately to Coolmore, and the mare has 2-year-old and yearling fillies by Henrythenavigator; those fillies were in turn sold privately to Australian Ric Jamieson, best known as the breeder of Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}). The 2011 filly, offered as a weanling at KEENOV, was bought by Adena Springs for \$1.5 million. Vertigineux was covered by Street Cry this past spring.

Zenyatta made a successful debut on Thanksgiving in 2007, and captured a first-level allowance in December before making her presence felt on the stakes stage. Kronfeld and Shirreffs plan on a similar approach with Eblouissante.

"Let's see how she comes out of the race and make sure that she's a happy filly," Kronfeld said yesterday. "We'll give it about a week and then start looking for an allowance race at the same distance or a bit further. If she does well, she would follow the same series that Zenyatta did, with the first goal the [GII] La Canada S. [at Santa Anita Jan. 20]."

Betfair Hollywood has Cushion Track as its main racing surface, while Santa Anita has since returned to conventional dirt.

"It's nothing you can know about until she runs on it," Kronfeld added. "Knowing John, if her next race is at Santa Anita, he'll probably take her to Santa Anita and give her a workout. If she handles it, we press on, and if not, we focus more on Hollywood and Del Mar." Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, \$27,000.
