

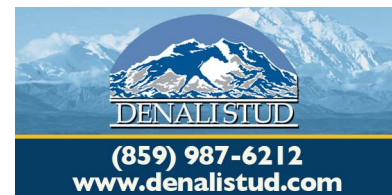

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TOP CHOICE ON THE GOLD COAST

It took just two bids to get lot 399, a son of Redoute's Choice (Aus), sold at the top of the leaderboard during Friday's session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale. After trainer Gai Waterhouse made a bold A\$750,000 salvo to start the proceedings, conditioner John O'Shea fired back with the winning A\$800,000 (US\$845,688) bid.

"Gai does that a lot," O'Shea said after signing the ticket. "I thought he was the best-looking Redoute's colt I'd seen in a long time." The colt was consigned by Newgate Farm on behalf of breeders Edmund and Belinda Bateman, who are expected to retain a share in the colt when he reaches the races.

The bay colt was one of four youngsters to sell for over A\$500,000 during the course of the day. A total of 417 yearlings have sold through three sessions for a gross of A\$55,782,500. The average climbed to A\$133,771, while the median continues to be A\$105,000. The clearance rate is 81%, compared to 84% at this stage 12 months ago.

"The sale is going well," said Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox. "There's strong demand for quality yearlings and we've still got plenty more of those to sell tomorrow night. We'd love to see the clearance rate continue to grow--at the end of session four last year it was 84%, and we'd love to get near that again."

Friday's session topper is the second foal from Apercu (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), herself a A\$470,000 Easter yearling who captured the G1 TJ Smith Classic in 2007 for the Batemans. Buyer John O'Shea indicated that a syndicate would be put together to race the colt, with his breeders likely retaining a share.

"I thought he was the best-looking Redoute's colt I'd seen in a long time, maybe since Fast 'n'

Famous (Aus)," said O'Shea.

The colt was raised and consigned by Newgate Farm in Scone, which was established by Henry Field in 2010.

"He was an outstanding colt, I'm not surprised he made that kind of money," said Field. "He's an exceptional horse."

Apercu foaled a Fastnet Rock filly Sept. 7.

MINOR GAINS AS KEEJAN CONCLUDES

Spurred by the dispersal of Fares Farm, a pair of hard-knocking mares from the late Barbara Hunter's breeding operation and a smartly bred Street Sense short yearling who made a sale-topping \$1.45 million, the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale concluded its five-day run yesterday with a modest increase in average. When all was said and done, 1,105 horses sold for \$45,207,300. The resulting average of \$40,912 was 8% above last year's of \$37,878. The median of \$15,000 was unchanged, while the RNA rate was 25.2%. Considerably more horses were offered this year than last--1,477 vs. 1,250, or a near 20% jump--giving the 2013 numbers added luster.

"With [20%] more horses and one more day than last year, I'm happy we had the same median as last year, and certainly happy the average was up," said Keeneland Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson.

Robertson said the lower end of the market remains a tough play, however. "Quality sold well, even today, but there were a lot of horses out there that were tough to sell," he said Friday, noting a justified impatience for an investment to yield dividends. "If you get a mare off the track and breed her this year, have the foal next year, and sell the yearling the next year, the game's not willing to wait. That's a long time between checks, and with the expenses incurred getting to that point, it's still hurting the lower end of the market."

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New Faces at Keeneland January...

If the final numbers at January were respectable if not cause for celebration, a pair of new faces playing at the upper end of the market offered a welcome infusion of energy into the proceedings. Canadian businessman Nat Rea's Regis Farm came away with the second-highest-priced yearling ever to sell at January, the \$1.45-million Street Sense topper. The filly is a half-sister to the Grade/Group I winners Cry and Catch Me (Street Cry {Ire}) and Certify (Elusive Quality), Europe's champion juvenile filly in 2012. Alfred Nuckols, Jr.'s Hurstland Farm consigned the miss, and co-bred her along with William Kartozián and Darley.

Rea and his bloodstock advisor Richard Hogan only recently started acquiring Thoroughbreds in earnest, but it wasn't until the January Sale that Rea indicated he was willing to step out among the big spenders.

It was a similar story with the Texas-based Lane Seliger of Baumann Stables. Seliger, who has dabbled in the claiming game, was a virtual unknown to the industry when he went to \$1.3 million for the Grade I winner Nereid (Rock Hard Ten). That was the top price paid for a mare/horse-in-training at January, and was a feather in the cap of owner Eric Kronfeld and Don Robinson, whose Winter Quarter Farm consigned the mare.

Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury commented about the new faces. "What I think we can take away from this sale is that there was a stronger influence from domestic buyers than we've seen in the past few years, particularly at the top end," he said. "We saw a new buyer by the name of Lane Seliger, who brought Nereid from Donny Robinson. He obviously was buying at the top, not to say, 'Here I am!,' but because he's been waiting awhile to get involved in the business. He's being advised by veterinarian Naoya Yoshida and his wife Marie, and they suggested he go in at the top and get serious. And Nat Rea, a Canadian who's bought a farm here in Bourbon County, is going to be a serious player, too. Those are good things." **Cont. p4**

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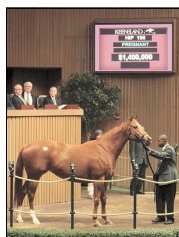

"He came in with expectations for less than half that, and it's wonderful to see that happen to a family who's been in the business for generations, to be touched by the fickle finger of fate."

Kitten's Joy Short Yearling Tops KEEJAN Friday...

A New York-bred son of Kitten's Joy topped Friday's finale at Keeneland January, bringing a bid of \$100,000 from Greendale Bloodstock. Hill 'n' Dale Sale consigned the handsome chestnut, who sold late in the day as [hip 1850](#). The colt is the second produce from the winning Esther Got Even (Stephen Got Even), a full-sister to MSP Debbie Got Even. The colt was bred by N.Y. Kitten Foals.

The second-highest price of the session was the \$70,000 that Jane Buchanan paid for the racing prospect **Pulpitarian** (Pulpit), a 5-year-old gelding out of the classy MGSW Bedanken (Geri). Included among a group of horses from Pin Oak Stud being offered by Craig and Holly Bendoroff's Denali Stud, the gelding sold as [hip 1880](#). A solid allowance type for the Graham Motion barn, Pulpitarian most recently won off by two lengths in a Laurel optional claimer Nov. 24. He has a record of 13-3-4-1, \$103,895.

Red Gables Stud achieved the session's third-highest price with a short yearling colt by Proud Citizen that elicited a bid of \$53,000 from Hidden Springs Farm. Catalogued as [hip 1583](#), the colt was produced by the winning 8-year-old mare Leinster Lady (E Dubai), a half-sister to GSW Lakota Brave (Northern Prospect) and GSP Silverdale (Silver Hawk), as well as to the dam of MSW & MGSP My Adonis (Pleasantly Perfect). The colt was bred in Kentucky by Mr. and Mrs. Michael Banahan.

Sun Shines on 'Soleil' Filly

On a hot summer Friday, all onlookers generally agreed that lot 473 was a "cracking" filly, and had the catalogue page to back up her looks. Sired by Lonhro (Aus), the bay is out of Cirque du Soleil (Aus) (Danehill), who happens to be a full-sister to Group 1 winner and leading young sire Fastnet Rock (Aus). There was a A\$300,000 offer to begin the action, and the bidding climbed until agent James Harron, out near the walking ring, had the final A\$675,000 answer. U.S.-based agent David Ingordo was the underbidder.

"She was a magnificent filly--very, very athletic and had a fantastic pedigree," said Harron, who bought her for Edmund and Belinda Bateman. "I rated her as the best filly in the sale. I loved her, and to have the pedigree to go with her looks is a bonus."

The filly was bred by Evergreen Rich and prepared for the sale by Evergreen Stud Farm near Heatherbrae in the Hunter Valley. The operation is managed by Tony Bott for owners based in Hong Kong. In addition to boarding mares, Evergreen also offers pre-training. At the height of the season, the farm has about 80 mares.

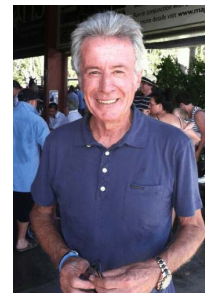
"She was always very nice never gave us any trouble with her growth and preparation," Bott noted. "We vacillated many times as to whether to sell or to keep her, but we thought it might be the last chance to buy into the family, so she's gone, but obviously to a good home."

"The owners kept hoping for a colt to send to Hong Kong," Bott added. "I bought the mare privately out of the paddock from Coolmore when she was in foal to Giants Causeway a few years ago. At the time, Fastnet Rock was just on his way up."

Cirque du Soleil didn't produce a foal in 2012, but is now carrying a full-sibling to lot 473.

Bott spent a number of years at Segenhoe--the property now known as Vinery Australia--before making his way to Evergreen.

"I thought I'd retired, but I guess I've been unretired," he quipped.

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'Moore' to Come

The Moore racing family is continuing on strongly to the next generation. Gary Moore enjoyed a glittering career on the international stage as a jockey, winning the 1981 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with Gold River (Fr) and seven Hong Kong riding titles before hanging up his tack to become a successful trainer. Now based in Macau, Moore was on hand at Magic Millions as

his sons Nicholas and James teamed up to purchase three yearlings during Friday's session. Nicholas now serves as his father's assistant in Macau, while James is currently pursuing an honors degree in equine therapy and rehabilitation at Bishop Burton College in Yorkshire.

Nicholas had been singing the praises of lot 492, a Tale of the Cat colt, all week, and the brothers celebrated after successfully bidding A\$380,000 for the handsome bay. Standing in the back of the pavilion, James conferred on the phone with Hong Kong-based clients Francis and Catherine Yip during the bidding. Francis Yip is the CEO of Designer Group Company, which is the main distributor of Apple products in Asia.

"We thought he was the best colt in the sale," said James. "We knew Gai [Waterhouse] was on him, but we had been beaten by her a couple of times already, so we were all out on this colt. We're very pleased to get him."

The colt is out of listed winner Creative Plan (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), who in turn is a 3/4-sister to Hong Kong star Jeune King Prawn (Aus) (Danehill). He will be trained by Rick Hore-Lacy with hopes of making it to the A\$2-million Magic Millions 2YO Classic in 12 months' time, according to James Moore.

"He will race for Catherine Yip to support the Magic Millions Racing Women initiative," James added.

The younger Moores also signed a A\$130,000 ticket for lot 413, a Choisir (Aus) colt from the Murrulla Stud draft. The flashy chestnut is a half-brother to Singapore standout Given Vision (Belong to Me), and will race for Mrs. Tam. Their trio of purchases was rounded out by a A\$175,000 colt from the first crop of Denman (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}). Bought on behalf of Alice Ming, lot 534 was consigned by Emirates Park.

This winter-as-summer vacation will soon be over for James Moore, but he will be back in Australia after graduating.

"I hope to further my knowledge with Rick Hore-Lacy," said James. "Hopefully, I will train one day with my brother Nicholas, because there's nothing better than sharing success with family."

Daralara Colt a Fine 'Choice'

Arrowfield Stud's lot 507, a son of Redoute's Choice out of Daralara (Fr) (Barathea {Ire}), lived up to the billing by selling for A\$575,000 to bloodstock agent James Bester. Bester was full of praise for the elegant bay.

"I thought he was as nice a Redoute's Choice as I'd ever seen," Bester offered. "I bought one at Easter for \$600,000 that [trainer] David Hayes thinks is the best of his 75 2-year-olds, and I think this one is just as nice. I thought he had the most wonderful action, very fluid, and he just floats along."

"He's from a European family, and I think it gives him a bit more quality than the average Redoute's Choice," Bester added. "It's a great Aga Khan family. He has a really classic look about him, and I see him as a Guineas or Derby horse."

David Hayes will also train this colt for an ownership group.

Lot 507 hails from the family of Darjina (Ire) (Zamindar), who carried Princess Zahra's colors to victory in the 2007 G1 Prix du Moulin.

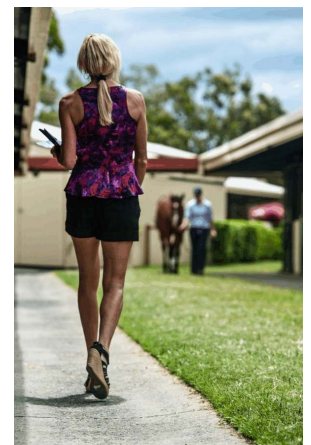

The GII Pennsylvania Derby upsetter gets the blinkers back on for this. "We might have been a little overconfident leading up to the Breeders' Cup Classic," trainer Doug O'Neill admitted. "The horse wasn't completely ready and that race zapped him a little bit. Then he kind of bounced in the Hollywood Derby."

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Casse Looking to the Future With Hal's Hope Duo...

Trainer Mark Casse knows it will take a strong performance from either **Delegation** (Speightstown) or **Pool Play** (Silver Deputy) to upset favored Csaba (Kitten's Joy) in Sunday's GIII Hal's Hope S. at Gulfstream Park. The conditioner has nonetheless expressed confidence in both his charges. He expects Delegation to improve off his second-place effort to Csaba in the Dec. 16 Harlan's Holiday S. over this strip, an effort which followed a third-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 3.

"[Delegation] trained on synthetic his entire career," Casse said. "When we brought him to Santa Anita, we thought it was as close as you can get to running on

synthetic, because it's faster and horses seem to skip over it. I thought he ran really well. He came out of the race a little tired, as most horses would. But when we ran him at Gulfstream, he was exhausted. That is a much more trying surface."

Casse also noted the 4-year-old gelding contracted an illness after leaving Santa Anita, which set him back slightly in his preparation for the Harlan's Holiday.

"I think he should be a better horse than he was three weeks ago," Casse said. "But he's going to have to be a lot better horse, because [Csaba] was impressive. I'm not sure we can beat him, but we're going to give it one more try."

Casse said he has high expectations for the Gary Barber colorbearer in 2013.

"I think if Delegation continues to improve, he will be one of the best older horses in North America this year."

Casse sends out Bill Farish's Grade I winner Pool Play with the knowledge that the one mile distance is too short for the 8-year-old, but he had no other prep options for the Feb. 9 GI Donn H. going 1 1/8 miles.

"We don't have any other spots," Casse explained. "He isn't eligible for any allowance races. The mile is definitely too short for him. Initially, we weren't going to go there, but after much discussion, Bill Farish and I decided that it was the best of the worst scenarios. Bill and I thought the best chance for him to have any chance of making the Donn was to run here, and that's why we supplemented him."

ILLINOIS ADW LAW FAILS TO PASS LEGISLATURE

An Illinois legislative session concluded earlier this week without renewing a law to allow advanced deposit wagering in the state, which expired Jan. 1. As a result, the Illinois Racing Board has declined licenses to the four companies that previously conducted advanced deposit wagering in the state.

"The position of the board has been clear since the board denied the licenses sought by the ADW providers at a December meeting," said Marc Laino, executive director of the Illinois Racing Board. "It is the board's position that advanced deposit wagering is illegal going forward."

While TVG and BetZotic--a website affiliated with harness racing--have stopped taking ADW bets on Illinois racing, TwinSpires and Xpressbet have continued operations as normal.

"As it stands today, we have no authorization to conduct advanced deposit wagering in Illinois, and we have two of the four previously licensed operators continuing to take wagers," Laino confirmed. "Upon learning of the continuation of advanced deposit wagering, we referred this to the attorney general's office, and we've had two preliminary meetings [regarding] enforcement."

Advanced deposit wagering was written into law in Illinois in 2009, and was set to expire July 1, 2012, before it was extended by six months. The law expired Jan. 1, and legislation was introduced in last week's lame-duck session to extend the law, including a provision to make the law retroactive to Jan. 1. The legislation, however, did not get the required number of votes, and therefore stalled. Laino said there are indications that the issue will be taken up again by the legislature in February, but he is unsure whether it will be tied to another gambling bill or whether retroactivity will be involved.

Advanced deposit wagering has been an important source of revenue for the racing industry, the state, and the Illinois Racing Board. Last year, \$122 million was wagered through ADWs, one-fifth of the total in-state handle.

The absence of advanced deposit wagering will have a "significant negative impact" on Illinois's racing industry, Laino said. "Advanced deposit wagering is one of the only growth components of our industry. It's been wildly successful here. In 2012 we generated \$122 million in handle, and the state of Illinois generated about \$1.75 million in revenue. It made up about 30% of [the board's] overall operating budget, so the absence of advanced deposit wagering will have a significant impact not only on the agency, but on the industry and the sport here going forward, and our ability to regulate based on the resources available to us." --by Kelsey Riley

LOOSE HORSE AT LAUREL HITS THE HIGHWAY

Around 9 o'clock Friday morning, commuters traveling on U.S. Route 1 in North Laurel saw something they will never forget, a loose horse heading south without its rider. **Bullet Catcher** (Strong Hope), a 4-year-old gelding from the Jerry Robb stable, tossed jockey Jeremy Rose while heading back to the barn after a morning workout and got loose. He then made his way out of the stable gate, made a left on Whiskey Bottom Road and another left onto Route 1 before being caught, un-injured, after a 1.6-mile journey. The trip included parts of Anne Arundel, Howard and Prince George's Counties.

"You think you've seen it all," said former rider Mark Rosenthal, who co-owns the gelding.

Jockey Abel Castellano captured part of the adventure down Route 1 on his mobile phone ([video](#)).

"I had finished working a horse and was coming to the jocks room when I saw a horse run by heading out of the stable gate," Castellano said. "I decided to follow the horse and maybe when he stopped I could catch him. All of a sudden we got to Route 1 and there was a red light. I saw the cars driving by and I said 'Oh my God, we're going to have an accident,' but at that moment it changed to a green light to make a left and the horse just made a left. I went, 'Oh, we're so lucky so far,' then we got the point where the road splits, you go right so that horse he keeps to the right, so we follow him. The horse is still running 30 miles an hour. Finally he slowed down in front of the Chrysler dealership almost to Main Street and we were able to catch him. The story had a happy ending but it was scary."

Trainer Charles "Snake" Frock was also part of the group that caught the Maryland-bred, who has one win and three on-the-board finishes in six lifetime starts.

"I have never seen anything like it and I have been at the racetrack for more than 50 years," Frock added. "I was coming from the farm in Westminster and saw him on Whiskey Bottom Road and did a U-turn to try to help. My trailer was full with hay and I had another horse in the van. When we finally caught him we were able to bring him back to the track in my van. I told Robb later, 'It's unreal the horse galloped out the gate and all the way to Main Street on the blacktop and never shredded a shoe.' God was on his side."

Robb added that Bullet Catcher had some abrasions on his feet, but he would not know the full extent of any injuries for a few days.

TAKE2, the program created in 2012 to promote second careers for retired Thoroughbred racehorses, has unveiled an expanded schedule for its 2013 season. Thirty-two horse shows in 17 different states have signed on to offer TAKE2 hunter and jumper classes, which are restricted to registered Thoroughbreds.
