According to the President of the 'White Turf,' Switzerland's most famous race meet on the frozen lake of St Moritz, is an occasion where the "peasants mix



with the billionaires" and one can "enjoy a little sausage or glass of champagne" at this all-welcoming event. While I'm not sure how many peasants

frequent this uber chic skiing resort, and a little sausage will set you back half a day's wages, he can be excused for things being lost in translation while talking to us not in his native tongue.

He did, however, have a point. Entry to the races is only 15 Swiss francs, or \$16, and once inside you can pretty much go anywhere. The highlight is being able to get so close to the action. From our CNN point of view, it was ideal because we were allowed to film anywhere and everywhere, and for the racegoers who experienced fully the rumble and groaning of the 35cm thick ice as the horses roared past in a cloud of white kickback.

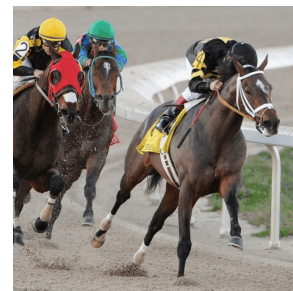

HOPING TO CATCH A RISING STAR

The next portion of the Road to the Kentucky Derby Challenge kicks off Saturday with a pair of \$400,000 events for 3-year-olds. Gulfstream will stage the GII Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth S. at 5:35 p.m. and, about 20 minutes later, a full field is expected for the GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds. J. Paul Reddam's California-based runner **He's Had Enough** (Tapit) was entered in both races, but is expected to contest the Fountain of Youth.

"We drew post nine in the Fountain of Youth and 12 of 15 in the Risen Star," said trainer Doug O'Neill. "I'd say we're leaning towards the Fountain of Youth."

Trainer Al Stall Jr. entered a pair of promising colts in the Risen Star, but didn't have much luck when post positions were drawn. Claiborne and Adele Dilschneider's unbeaten **Departing** (War Front), winner of both of his starts at the New Orleans oval, was saddled with the 14 hole, while Brittlyn Stable's **Sunbean** (Brahms) was left out in the cold as an also-eligible. Both colts were listed at 12-1 on the morning-line. Sunbean was cross-entered in the Gentilly S. at a mile on turf for Louisiana-breds earlier on Saturday's card. **Cont. p4**

What makes the White Turf so unique is the variety of the action. Flat races on snow are spectacle enough, but throw in trotting with iron-blade sulkies and the local speciality Skijoring, and it is a veritable feast for the eyes. While racing and trotting on ice at 1800m up present their own challenges, such as acclimatization and special shoeing, the Skijoring is in another league as far as perils and adaptability are concerned.

The most interesting person I interviewed in the mountains was the charming German vet Annina Widmer. She explained that the most common cause of injury came from the specially adapted racing plates, which have large grips at the front and the sides. While they help the horse to grip on the compacted snow surface of the lake, they can also do considerable damage if one horse clip another whether in a race or in transit.

On the subject of acclimatization, she said there are many theories, but generally it is thought that horses should arrive either over 72 hours prior to the race or within 24 hours of the race in order to cope best with the high altitude. Interestingly, she said that in her experience horses that spend longer in the mountains perform worse later on in the season than horses that are brought up and down from the mountains in between races over the three-week period.

Unlike human athletes who can improve their performance by training at high altitude, Annina said that in horses, "it has been shown in studies that speed at a defined heart rate on a treadmill (thus performance) decreased the longer the horse stayed at high altitude." Horses



have naturally large spleens and are able to store huge amounts of red blood cells and produce them when needed, suggesting altitude training is counter-productive.

Even more interesting is that she said horses tend to bleed less at altitude, which is surprising given the higher pulmonary arterial pressure when in the mountains. She told me that in a study in South Africa they scoped horses at sea level and at 1400m altitude after the race, and the same horses bled significantly less at altitude.

But back to Skijoring. What I can't believe is that the horses used to race in this unashamedly dangerous event are normal Thoroughbred racehorses. What's more, they often only experience towing a man (or woman) on skis behind them one or two days before the race. Normally for their first experience they will have a rider on board as well as the skier behind, but the rider comes off for the race and it is down to the skier to control the horse over a tight 2700m course.

Come race day, one is scratched in the paddock when it tries to jump over the rails and breaks the harness in the process. Another gets a fright before the start and spins and tramples a handler. You may well wonder how they start a race of this nature, but just like any other race, it's in stalls, only the jockey is less than 2 metres behind the horses' hindquarters, thankfully with a, slightly token, padded gate that swings forwards as the horse jumps.

The start is crucial as the place to be is near the lead on the rail, but with 12 horses gunning for the box seat, it's a miracle there are not more incidents. Colored skis are an obligatory safety precaution, but the reality is a horse could tread on the skis in front of him at any time or swing wide into a competitor, and it's not unusual to have a severely depleted field cross the line. In fact, in 1965, not one horse and skier finished! This time they all came through unscathed, but it was noticable how strung out and tired they finished.

With the possible exception of the Palio di Siena and the Omak Suicide Race, Skijoring has to be one of the most perilous events combining man and horse still in existence, but then again, danger and excitement often go hand in hand, and I can't help thinking that the longer this incredible spectacle continues the better.

GoldMark Farm and Whisper Hill Farm's **Mylute** (Midnight Lute) will kick off his 3-year-old campaign after a busy juvenile season. The grey colt faced the starter seven times in 2012 and showed his best in the last two. After finishing third behind Goldencents (Into Mischief) in the GIII Delta Jackpot S. Nov. 17, he ran off and hid from optional-claiming foes going a mile and 70 yards over this strip Dec. 26 ([video](#)). He is listed at 6-1 on the morning line.

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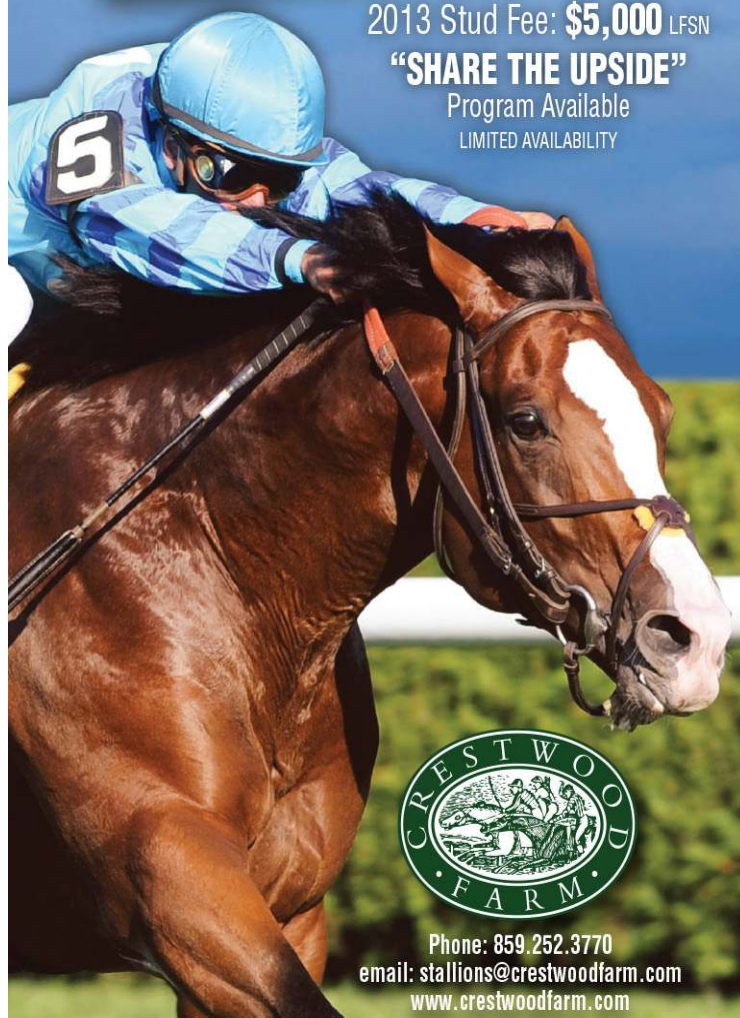

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PURSE INCREASE FOR BLACK-EYED SUSAN

The Maryland Racing Commission approved the 2013 Pimlico Race Course spring stakes schedule at its monthly meeting Tuesday, and also announced a purse hike for the May 17 GII Black-Eyed Susan S. for 3-year-old fillies to \$500,000. The headline event of the 10-week meeting is the 138th running of the \$1-million GI Preakness S., the middle jewel of the Triple Crown May 18. The meet will feature 21 open stakes races for purses of \$3.775 million, an increase of \$625,000.

There will be additional Maryland-bred stakes races and Maryland-bred bonuses to some of the existing stakes added to the lineup, which will boost the final figure to more than \$4 million for the stand. The Preakness undercard features seven other stakes races, including four graded races. Purses for the GIII Maryland Sprint H. and the GIII Allaire duPont S. have been increased from \$100,000 to \$150,000. The May 17 Preakness eve card features seven stakes races, including the \$300,000 GIII Pimlico Special S.

"Having a strong stakes schedule on Preakness weekend is important," Maryland Jockey Club President Tom Chuckas commented. "We are working hard to increase the profile of the Preakness eve card. Increasing the purse of the Black-Eyed Susan by \$200,000 is the first step in that direction. In addition, purses on overnight races during the meet will be raised 10-15% across the board, which should lead to larger fields and more wagering."

The Pimlico spring stand will begin Apr. 4 with live racing taking place four days a week on a Thursday-through-Sunday schedule prior to Preakness and then Friday, Saturday and Sunday (plus Memorial Day). The 36-day meet will end June 8.

"It is essential to continue a live racing schedule through the Triple Crown," Chuckas continued. "We feel this will help sustain the momentum built during Preakness. The last three years racing ended on Preakness day and didn't start back up until after Labor Day. This decision will allow fans who enjoyed themselves on Preakness weekend to come back sooner."

BREEDING - LEAVE IT TO CHANCE

I always thought that as one of the world's most astute breeders, the Aga Khan's matings would have been the result of forensic research, rigorous debate and endless tactical meetings. Therefore, I was startled to read in Philip Jodidio's splendid 'A Racing and Breeding Tradition--The Horses of the Aga Khan' that The Aga mainly 'leaves it to chance.'

I am certain this was a throwaway line, akin to the old maxim 'put the best to the best and hope for the best,' but I am also heartened by the honesty inherent in such a phrase that make us all a little more relaxed wrestling with the inexact science of breeding thoroughbreds.



Redoute's Choice

The Aga also lets slip his keenness to 'play chess with nature,' which again disguises the deep thought that goes into the making of his racehorses, a planning process that sometimes take years to manifest itself.

Take the recent arrival in France of the two-time Australian champion sire Redoute's Choice to The Aga's Haras de Bonneval and the completion this week of the son of Danehill's list of 100 European partners.

This shuttling of the highly prized sire of 98 stakes winners, getting them at the elite level of 11.4% to runners, was not left to chance. In fact, it was a deal 13 years in the making and the result of much discussion between Redoute's owners Arrowfield Stud and its principal John Messara, The Aga Khan and his breeding manager, Georges Rimaud. Georges, who is a familiar figure around the offices of Arrowfield in Sydney, explains the deal and its history as being a bit like a long chess game with all its complexities.

"I think it was in the summer of 2000 that John came to Deauville to talk to us about a possible venture with Arrowfield," he stated. "At the time, we weren't quite sure that this was something we would get into, and as often with us, it took time to see how this would fit into our organization."

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He continued, "After a couple of years and several further visits to Australia, we started seeing how we could work together and decided to give it a go. At the time, there was what appeared to be strong interest for our horses and families in Australia. We were selling a fair number of 'stayers' with a view to running in Cup races and [of course] the Melbourne Cup. Six mares were sent in 2008, then subsequently three more. We will be sending more mares now that we have achieved some success, though it should not exceed a dozen."

The agreement between Arrowfield and The Aga Khan has produced seven yearlings. A Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Daralara (Fr) (Barathea {Ire}) colt, was sold on the Gold Coast at the Magic Millions for A\$575,000 to recognized judge James Bester.

Though the overall project is still in its infancy, Rimaud seems encouraged by the early results and spoke enthusiastically about the arrival of Redoute's Choice to New Zealand journalists this week.

"The idea of shuttling each other's stallions often came up for discussion, and last [Northern Hemisphere] autumn, JM offered to give it a go with Redoute's Choice," he commented. "We did not really think of sending the horse to Ireland, as we already have a number of classy stallions there, with Azamour and Dalakhani standing alongside Sea the Stars. It seemed natural that we would stand Redoute's Choice in France. The French stallion situation is also very different to that of the UK and Ireland. Upgrading the French stallion market is very important to us. This looked like the right opportunity."

He added, "Redoute's Choice has been very well-received by European breeders, and it has been reasonably easy to fill his book, despite a very competitive market at this level. One of the most important things for us is also to produce some nice fillies by him. We have had very good success with Danehill mares. The prospect of having mares by Redoute's Choice, Danehill's best son, is very exciting for a breeding operation like ours."

Redoute's Choice, who has sired 21 Group 1 winners, including 10 Classic horses and seven 2-year-old winners at the highest level, has been a dominant stallion in Australia since going to stud in 2000 after a distinguished 2- and 3-year-old career.

The four-time Group 1 winner will stand in France at €70,000. In Australia his fee has moved around, reaching a high of A\$300,000 for two years and in these more competitive days, he is available at A\$137,500. **Zachariah cont.**

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Hoofnote...

The story of how Redoute's Choice was bred is an amazing tale better left to another column, but suffice to say the super sire is ironically a result of The Aga Khan's 'leave it to chance' mentality and definitely of the 'best to the best' philosophy.

He was bred by the Singapore-domiciled, Sri Lankan-born retired businessman Muzaffer Yaseen, who continues to hold a half-share in the horse. The private Yaseen, who has seen his colt turn into a money machine, putting an estimated A\$100 million into his bank account, didn't really know what a stallion was when he sent his mare Shantha's Choice (Aus) to Danehill.

This amazing fact was confirmed this week by his Australian manager Iris O'Farrell, who described the entry of she and her boss into breeding their first horse in 1995 as 'the blind leading the blind.'

"Mr. Yaseen had bought Shantha's Choice because he wanted a racehorse, not with any intention of breeding from her," she recollected. "It was an area he had no knowledge of, but when she broke down I decided to go to stud. That is when Mr. Yaseen asked me what a stallion was?"

The rest, as they say is history, but the Redoute's story (he was named by Yaseen after the French mail order company La Redoute) has one more ironic twist--the losing bidder on Shantha's Choice at the Melbourne yearling sale was John Messara.

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TOP DAMSIREs

I had planned to finish up this cycle of APEX and A Runner analysis with some detail about broodmare sires, historical as well as current, and that is still the plan. In the meantime, in doing some further research last week, we discovered a group of 651 A Runners from 2010 who had unaccountably disappeared from the year-end 2012 cumulative file of A Runners. They were there at the end of 2011, but sometime along the way, they went for a walk, and we lost them. They have now been found and restored, but it does mean a lot of the information on sires of 'Uniq A' Runners which we ran last week needs to be corrected. Fortunately, the G1-G2 winners among them didn't disappear from that file, so that data is exactly as you saw. Also fortunately, no sires look worse; the sires of the 651 lost A Runners just look better. This discovery does mean the correct percentage of A Runners to Named Foals of Racing Age is 3.62%, rather than 3.42%--one out of every 27.5 instead of one out of every 29. The percentage of G1-G2 winners remains the same--0.715% (1 in 140), but the proportion of G1-G2 winners from Uniq A Runners drops slightly to 19.75%, still just about one in five. There are two main problems with trying to identify leading living broodmare sires: first, it's a little bit like jumps sires--by the time you know how good they are, half of them are dead; and, second, there is a perceived randomness in American pedigrees now--nobody knows quite what they're looking at when they see a lot of the names. Accordingly, since we're usually focused so intently on sire performance statistics, we thought it might be useful to have a brief look at broodmare sires.

First, we have a list of contemporary broodmare sires, with the number of Uniq A Runners their daughters have produced, organized by their year of first foals, from sires with first foals 1994 through sires with first foals 2003. There are a few standout performers we can identify:

- **First foals 1994:** A.P. Indy hasn't been eight times champion APEX sire for nothing, sire of 158 (corrected) Uniq A Runners and 54 G1-G2 winners. He's equally impressive as a broodmare sire, with 96 Uniq A

Runners as a broodmare sire by the end of 2012, and with crops still to run for him, he's a long way from finished in that sphere. If you race in North America, anyways, surely an A.P. Indy mare would be the number one target for any broodmare buyer. Historically,

all-American sires are fine as

broodmare sires in Europe: Halo, for example, never worked a yard in Europe as a sire, yet was the broodmare sire of Machiavellian. So, even though 90% of A.P. Indy's A runners as a broodmare sire so far are in North America, class usually trumps regional differences when it comes to the broodmare sire. Whether that works out or not, A.P. Indy is just as good a broodmare sire as he's been a sire.

- **First foals 1995:** Kingmambo, another real class act who stood, as did A.P. Indy, at Lane's End, Kingmambo is now the damsire of 64 Uniq A Runners and counting. It's not a huge surprise: his own damsire, Nureyev, was

a great broodmare sire before him. From our studies, the interesting thing about Kingmambo as a broodmare sire is that a fair few of the dams of at least his early good horses as a broodmare sire were unraced--quite a bit higher proportion than normal. I'm a big believer

that 'class trumps all,' and I reckon Kingmambo is a great example of that. He crosses well with just about anything, too, though both as a sire and damsire he doesn't much seem to like another dose of Mr. Prospector as the sire or damsire when he is in the other slot.

- **First foals 1996:** Here's a surprise--Dehere, who only sired five crops in North America before he was

sold to Australia (and also stood in Japan, where he has a few A Runners as a broodmare sire), before coming back to the U.S., then finally being sold on to Turkey in the Coolmore package deal which also included Lion Heart and Powerscourt. He's now the damsire of 43 A

Runners, much the best among F1996 sires. Barathea (31) has also done well in that department. Cont. p12

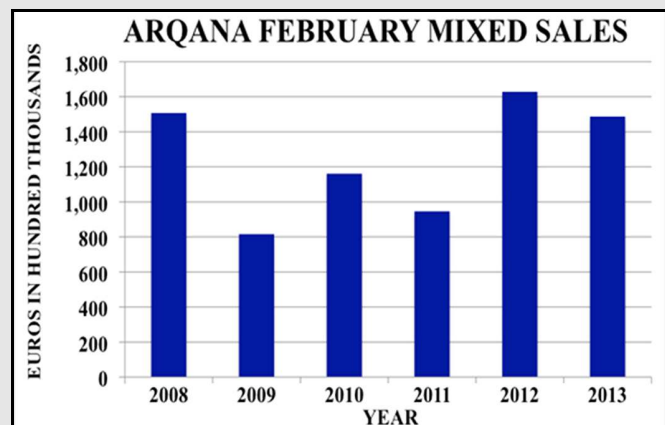

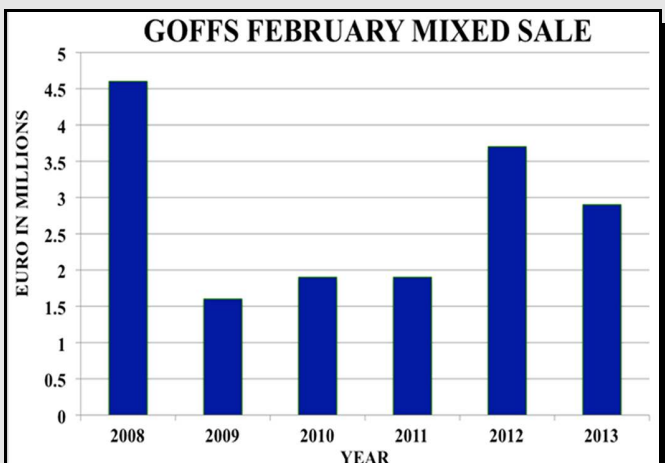

- **First foals 1997:** French Deputy, like Dehere a son of Deputy Minister (himself among the top 10 broodmare sires of A Runners with 169) leads this group with 37. He was sold to Japan, but still, like Dehere, the majority of his A Runners as a broodmare sire are in North America. Thunder Gulch (26) has also done well as a broodmare sire.

- **First foals 1998:** Two standouts here--Unbridled's Song, with 39 A Runners as a broodmare sire, and Smart Strike, with 36. Both may ultimately turn out to be better as broodmare sires than as sires of sires, though both are still active, and will have more sons to go to stud (and Unbridled's Song has First Defence, and Smart Strike none other than Curlin, with their first 3-year-olds this year). However, you'd be very happy to have daughters of either one to be breeding from; both are clearly very good in this sphere.

- **First foals 1999-2003:** Early days still, for most of these; after all, the oldest foals even by F1999 sires have just turned 14. The one who does seem to be taking off as a broodmare sire is F2002 Giant's Causeway, whose 11 A Runners as a broodmare sire so far, with his first foals just turned 11, looks very promising.

Cumulative Broodmare Sires...

The APEX database begins with racing of 1983; in the last 30 years, there have been 132 stallions who have sired 50 or more A Runners as broodmare sires. Given that Northern Dancer's first crop was foaled in 1966 and were already 17 by 1983, no doubt his career totals will be considerably more than the 159 A Runners of which he was the broodmare sire from 1983 on. But for most of the sires, these will be career totals as broodmare sires, and how amazing was Mr. Prospector, with an incredible 323 A Runners as a broodmare sire! Northern Dancer's hoofprints are all over this list, as you'd expect, with sons Sadler's Wells (226), Nijinsky (205), Nureyev (174), Lyphard (169), and Danzig (158), and grandsons Deputy Minister (169) and Storm Cat (167), and Northern Dancer himself (159) filling eight of the top 11 places--so much for avoiding inbreeding to Northern Dancer! Sunday Silence (180) and Seattle Slew (168) are the only non Northern Dancer-line horses with more than 150 A Runners as broodmare sires at the end of 2012. I know lists like these are of primarily historical significance, but they're still pretty interesting to look at every once in a while.

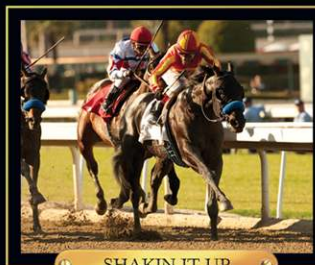

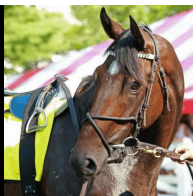
BETFAIR HOLLYWOOD SPRING STAKES SCHEDULE WORTH OVER \$6.8 MILLION

Betfair Hollywood Park has unveiled a stakes schedule worth over \$8.8 million for the 2013 spring/summer meeting. This is the 75th anniversary season for the Inglewood oval, which will kick off Apr. 25 and will run through July 14. Considering the prices for quality fillies at other sales around Australasia, I think she is great value as well," Chalmers summed up.

The daughter of MSW Most Secret (Aus) (Bletchley Park {Ire}), one of 18 to achieve a six-figure pricetag during the session, is a half-sister to three full stakes winners, including Covertly (Aus) (Metal Storm {Aus}), winner at nearby Ascot Racecourse of the G1 Railway S. She is also kin to Group 3 winner So Secret (Aus) (Danetime {Ire}) and SW & GSP Secret Link (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}).

A pair of colts were knocked down for A\$190,000 to be the joint-second dearest offerings on the day. One of those was the first horse through the ring and was also consigned by Dawson Stud. A son of Testa Rossa (Aus) out of SP Tantra Dancer (Aus) (Hideyoshi), the Aug. 27 foal was purchased by Damien Wyer and will be trained by Jim Taylor.

"For mine he is the best horse to have come off Dawson Stud since Famous Roman (Aus) (Danetime {Ire})," Wyer said, referring to the Group 2 winner. "His conformation is perfect, his x-rays were perfect and Jim wanted us to buy him."

Wyer signed for last year's sales-topper Petrol Power (Aus) (Snitzel {Aus}), third in the Magic Millions Perth 2YO Classic over the past weekend. The other \$190,000 offering was a son of Choisir (Aus)--Flight Path (Aus) (Bletchley Park {Ire}). Consigned by Anita Vale Stud, the brown colt was purchased by Mt Hallowell Stud and will be conditioned by Trevor Andrews.

Sales officials were please with the results.

"The clearance rate rounded out to 76%, which was very good considering there were some very soft patches during the day," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said. "While not comparing apples to apples because of a new sale format, the market felt very similar to last year. Once we take everything into account with sales to come, I think we'll see the WA industry will be in good health."

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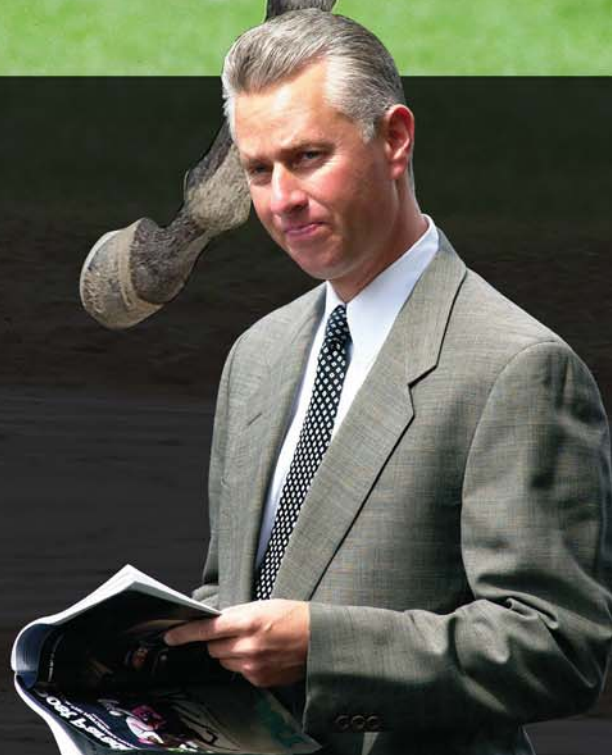
