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HAVOC REIGNS IN SWAPS

Chief Havoc (Giant's Causeway) looked to have all the speed in a four-horse renewal of the GII Swaps S. Thursday at Betfair Hollywood Park and the 2-5 favorite duly delivered an easy wire-to-wire victory. The chestnut colt, coming off a decisive allowance win over the same track and nine-furlong trip May 30, broke sharply and went right to the lead where he was

tracked by an eager **Dice Flavor** (Scat Daddy) through moderate fractions. **Java's War** (War Pass) surged up between rivals at the top of the lane and looked likely to make a race of it, but the GI Toyota Blue Grass winner flattened out in upper stretch, leaving **Tiz a Minister** (Ministers Wild Cat) to chase the favorite down the lane. Chief Havoc shrugged off that foe and pulled clear to win by 2 1/2 lengths.

"It was a lot harder than I thought it would be," admitted winning trainer Peter Miller. "I thought we'd be five in front. Next thing I know [Dice Flavor] is right inside us. [Rafael Bejarano] let him out a notch and then they all took runs at him. When I saw :48.65 and 1:13.19, I felt pretty confident, but it was still a horse race at the quarter pole." **Cont. p3**

A PERFECT SHORE DAY

The speedy **Rainbow Heir** (Wildcat Heir) made it a perfect four-for-four with a front-running five-length victory in Thursday's GIII Jersey Shore S. at Monmouth Park. The New Farm homebred quickly assumed control of the six-furlong contest, zipping through fractions of :21.89 and :44.76. He skipped clear on the turn, completed the five furlongs in :56.77 and romped home to win unchallenged as the 6-5 favorite. The final time was 1:09.43.

"He's an excellent horse and he has a similar body and has the same disposition as Wildcat Heir, both are really relaxed and lightning fast," said winning trainer Ben Perkins, Jr., who also conditioned the Grade I-winning sire for New Farm.

As for what is next for his speedy charge, Perkins added, "The [Aug. 24 GI] King's Bishop is a little farther at 7/8ths, but we're considering the [July 28 GIII] Amsterdam [at 6 1/2 furlongs] up at Saratoga, or he's also eligible for the two other than Jersey-bred."

Rainbow Heir debuted with a front-running 5 3/4-length win at Laurel Feb. 1. He added a Mar. 21 optional claimer at Laurel before besting fellow Jersey-breds at Monmouth May 12.

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Chief Havoc Wins Swaps (cont. from p1)

Out of graded stakes winner La Reina (A.P. Indy), Chief Havoc was a \$325,000 Keeneland September Yearling purchase for Australian Paul Makin. He began his career with a pair of efforts in England for trainer Jeremy Nosedo and was sixth in his stateside debut in the GI Champagne S. last October. Shipped west to the barn of trainer Peter Miller for his sophomore season, Chief Havoc graduated with a 7 1/4-length romp at Santa Anita in April and was second in a May 3 optional claimer at Hollywood before his May 30 allowance score last time out. La Reina, a half-sister to Grade I winner Brahms (Danzig), has a yearling colt by Blame and a Tiznow weanling filly.

Trainer Peter Miller said options are open for Chief Havoc's next start. "I'll have to talk to Mr. Makin and see if we want to look at some 3-year-old stakes or possibly the [Aug. 25 GI] Pacific Classic."

King Kreesa, second in last year's GI Jamaica H., opened 2013 with third-place efforts in the Mar. 30 GIII Appleton S. at Gulfstream and May 4 GIII Ft. Marcy S. at Belmont and was coming off a front-running 2 1/4-length victory against fellow New York-breds in the June 1 Kingston S. over this same course and trip. The bay gelding broke on top and quickly opened a clear lead while setting pedestrian splits. He had plenty left to hold off Howe Great and Big Screen. Favored Data Link (War Front) rated in the second tier while three wide. He moved closer on the turn, but was outfooted to the wire and finished fourth. "We were hoping for a repeat of the Kingston, with nice easy fractions, and that's what we got," commented winning owner/breeder Gerald Kresa. "It's a thrill for [King Kreesa] to get his first graded stakes win; he'd been close several times. We'll probably look next at the [Aug. 10 GII] Fourstardave. We'll see how he comes out of this one."

CHINA EQUINE CULTURAL FESTIVAL

The China Horse Club and Desert Star Holdings have announced the country's first internationally endorsed Thoroughbred meeting will be held Sept. 20-21 in Hohhot, Inner Mongolia. Coolmore is among the international sponsors of the China Equine Cultural Festival, which will feature stakes winners from Australia, France and Ireland. France Galop, which co-sponsors scholarship programs for Chinese students working in the French Thoroughbred industry, will be among the race sponsors. Warran Brown, who previously served as CEO of the Melbourne Racing Club, has been appointed COO of the China Horse Club and Australian trainer John Thompson will head the team overseeing preparation of international horses for the event. The festival will include a VIP gala dinner, an international symposium, an auction co-hosted by Arqana China, and a Thoroughbred race day. The announcement of the festival comes as plans are being revealed for construction of an international standard racecourse and world-class breeding farm, to be managed by international partners, in the region.

HONG KONG TO OFFER COMMINGLED POOLS

Hong Kong Jockey Club CEO Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges announced on his blog yesterday that an amendment has been passed that will allow the Hong Kong Jockey Club to establish commingled pools for its races with other international racing jurisdictions. "Yesterday was a special day for the Club and an important milestone for racing development in Hong Kong," wrote Engelbrecht-Bresges Thursday. "The Legislative Council passed a law amendment bill on the Betting Duty Ordinance, which has given us the green light to set up two-way commingled pools with our partner jurisdictions overseas." Engelbrecht-Bresges cited a desire for Hong Kong to follow in the footsteps of other jurisdictions who have made similar arrangements; an increased ability to combat groups who use illicit arbitrage techniques in Hong Kong's already massive pools; and an increased visibility for Hong Kong racing internationally as impetus for and benefits of commingling. "This will serve as an opportunity for us to help export Hong Kong's racing brand and our premier racing products to overseas racing fans," he said. "With the bill now being passed, our team will work hard on further implementation proceedings and will discuss with our overseas partners. We hope related measures and new arrangements for commingling will be in effect as the new racing season starts in September." Click [here](#) for Engelbrecht-Bresges's full statement.

UP WITH THE BIRDS EARLY PLATE FAVORITE

Sam-Son Farms's **Up With the Birds** (Stormy Atlantic) was installed the 2-1 morning-line favorite when entries were drawn Wednesday for Sunday's Queen's Plate S. at Woodbine. The bay sophomore, who will break from post seven, has been off since scoring a 4 3/4-length victory in the May 26 Marine S.

"We did that on purpose to give him six weeks," trainer Malcom Pierce said. "I'm not worried about it. I want to go into the Plate with a fresh horse."

Sam-Son Farms has won five Plates--Regal Intention (1988), Dance Smartly (1991), Scatter The Gold (2000), Dancethruthedawn (2001) and Eye of the Leopard (2009). The legendary operation also sends out homebred **His Race to Win** (Stormy Atlantic).

There have been 34 fillies to win the Queen's Plate and two of the fairer sex will take on the boys Sunday. **Nipissing** (Niigon), 7-2 second choice, breaks from post nine as she looks to follow up on her score in the June 9 Woodbine Oaks. "The trip will probably be the same as the Oaks," jockey Steve Bahen said. "Sit within four or five lengths, get a clean trip and hopefully it will happen again. [The mile and one-quarter distance] will help her even more."

Canadian champion juvenile filly **Spring in the Air** (Spring at Last) is one of three Mark Casse trainees in the 12-horse field. She is coming off a runner-up effort behind Nipissing in the Oaks. Joel Rosario has been named to ride Spring in the Air, as well as her stablemate and Plate Trial winner **Dynamic Sky** (Sky Mesa), but it is expected that Gary Boulanger will ride the former. Boulanger, who returned from an eight-year retirement this season, won the 2001 Plate with the filly Dancethruthedawn.

WET WEATHER FOR THURSDAY TRACKWORK

Two days before South Africa's premier race, the G1 Vodacom Durban July, most trackwatchers were eagerly awaiting that telling final piece of work. The horses were ready; it was the culmination of a long campaign, planned and executed with military precision by their respective trainers... then the weather intervened. After weeks of sunshine, with the odd cloud appearing, Thursday morning dawned grey and wet. A cold front had hit the coast overnight and by early morning, the downpour was steady and constant.

Clairwood Racecourse, where most of the favorites for the Vodacom Durban July are stabled, was shrouded in a grey mist as the rain came down in a steady drizzle, with visibility nonexistent. To add to the general dark mood, the going on two of the training tracks were found to be too heavy, leaving the beach sand track as the only option for any serious work.

First out was the Vaughan Marshall-trained pair of **Tribal Dance (SAf)** (Tiger Dance) and **Hill Fifty Four (SAf)** (Captain Al {SAf}). Both horses jumped from the 600-meter mark and sprinted up smartly in their final fast work. Marshall was very pleased with both and while he would have liked the talented Hill Fifty Four to carry less than his allotted 59.5 kgs, he is not overly concerned with the weight.

Also out in the drizzle and the murky darkness was **Do You Remember (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}), the only filly in the race. She did a steady half pace, mainly stretching her legs. Trainer Geoff Woodruff confirmed that he was just keeping her ticking over, being careful not to ask too much of the diminutive filly so close to raceday.

Next up, the multiple Group 1-winning 3-year-old **Capetown Noir (SAf)** (Western Winter), made his appearance under regular race rider Karl Neisius. The near-black colt looked extremely fit and muscled. Jumping from the 600-meter mark, he sprinted up smartly and was hard-held when he reluctantly eased

up at the end of the gallops. This final workout was certainly very impressive and Neisius and trainer Dean Kannemeyer had good reason to smile.

Another sterling performance was delivered by the Sean Tarry-trained **Whiteline Fever (SAf)** (Right Approach {GB}). Under the guidance of race rider Bernard Fayd'Herbe, Whiteline Fever was a bundle of rippling muscles and Fayd' Herbe had the gelding under a tight hold before proceeding smoothly through the gears.

Race favorite and 2012 Vodacom Durban July winner **Pomodoro (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) also churned up the beach sand. Going a steady half pace over the final 600 meters, the colt appeared to be race ready, but seemed to have dropped some weight in the last couple of weeks, which is concerning.

Two of the main challengers, the Justin Snaith duo of **Run for It (SAf)** (Dynasty {SAf}) and **Jet Explorer (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}), came out just as the rain finally started to clear. Jet Explorer, partnered by the experienced M J Byleveld, appeared overeager and fought his rider all the way from the 600-meter marker. Stable companion Run For It came out under his usual workrider and went through his paces in a thoroughly workmanlike manner. Snaith is a great believer of the compression suit, made so popular by Black Caviar, and both Run For It and Jet Explorer spend some time in their suits each afternoon.

Finally, it was the turn of the Fred Crabbia-owned **Astro News (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}), a recent addition to the Charles Laird stable. An impressive winner of the G3 Cup Trial over 1800 meters in his last start a month ago, the gelding appeared very fresh and, despite a citation bit, he tested the strength of his rider's arms fighting all the way. It was a similar performance to what he had delivered during the Vodacom Durban July Gallops a week ago. This unwillingness to settle could be a problem come Saturday, especially if there is no early pace. Jockey Kevin Shea is likely to have his hands full.

The rain has certainly put a dampener on affairs and officials will be hoping that it clears up overnight. The Greyville track has already been tested to its limits this season, with Durban experiencing one of its wettest winters ever and while racing will not be cancelled, any further rain could lead to a soft to heavy track come Saturday.

Fresh off the heels of Shanghai Bobby (Harlan's Holiday)'s unbeaten championship season, Jack Wolf and Donald Lucarelli's Starlight Racing appears locked and loaded for another run at the prestigious summer/fall juvenile stakes races if **All in Blue** (More Than Ready)'s impressive debut victory was any indication.

"He was the third favorite on the tote board and wasn't getting much action for a [Todd] Pletcher horse," said Wolf when reached by phone while driving back to

Starlight's Saratoga summer base after attending Thursday's race at Belmont Park. "I think Todd felt like his other horse [We Miss Artie] was training better than ours, but as we know, Shanghai Bobby didn't train that well in the morning, but showed up in the afternoons. Hopefully, this is another horse like that."

Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency as [hip 158](#) at last year's Fasig-Tipton August sale, All in Blue, the second

foal from the winning 8-year-old Buddha mare Cloud Rise, caught the attention of former trainer turned bloodstock agent Frankie Brothers.

"Frankie's got a tremendous eye and we all like More Than Ready as a sire," Wolf commented. "I thought that he looked better than any other horse in the paddock [yesterday]. He's very well-balanced and very athletic. [rider] Javier [Castellano] was very impressed with how easy he did it, too. He didn't have to use the stick coming down the stretch, and he beat a fairly nice group of horses in a very decent time."

All in Blue has some mighty shoes to fill before being compared to previous superstars for Starlight, including the aforementioned Shanghai Bobby, and fellow flashy grays Monba (Maria's Mon), Octave (Unbridled's Song) and Take the Points (Even the Score).

"It's hard for me to get Frankie to buy a gray horse--I love these gray horses," Wolf added with a laugh. "He's been doing this for so long. He deserves all the credit."

The Starlight frontman is looking forward to taking another crack at the popular \$100,000 NYRA juvenile bonus, offered to the connections of any 2-year-old that breaks its maiden during the Aqueduct winter/spring meeting or the Belmont spring/summer meets and goes on to win a graded stakes at any NYRA track in 2013.

"With the \$100,000 bonus available that we were lucky enough to get last year with Shanghai Bobby, it sure would be nice to participate in that again," Wolf said.

As for what's next for All in Blue, Wolf concluded, "Todd's the one that's an expert on placing these horses. As usual, we'll see how he comes out of the race and go from there. I'm not sure what else Todd has in the barn, but I'm sure that if he comes out of this one in good order, we'll probably be looking at [the GII Sanford S. July 21] or one of those other stakes races later in the meet at Saratoga." -*Steve Sherack*

MAJOR GAINS FOR KZN YEARLING OPENER

A total of 126 head changed hands for R11,375,000 (US\$1,133,519), a 61% increase from last year's opening session. The average rose by 51% to R90,278 (US\$8,996) while the median jumped by 50% from R40,000 to R60,000. Topping the session was [lot 58](#), a Daytona Stud-consigned son of Silvano (Ger) who went for R650,000 (US\$64,772) to Mr B D Burnard. "The sale was very strong," offered TBA CEO Tom Callaghan. "The aggregate was up an incredible R4 million on last year, and the median was up a remarkable 50%."

The strength of the sale is due in part to a much stronger catalogue, with good support from the Cape breeders. There were much better bred yearlings on sale, and the country's top sires were strongly represented." The second and final day of the sale takes place today starting at 12:00 p.m. local time.
