



BLACK CAVIAR TO EXCEED AND EXCEL

Australian sprinting superstar **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}--Helsing {Aus}, by Desert Sun {GB}) will be bred to Darley's Exceed and Excel (Aus) (Danehill) during the upcoming Southern Hemisphere breeding season, according to *Racing Post*.

A perfect 25-for-25 on the racetrack for trainer Peter Moody, Black Caviar won 14 Group 1 races in her native Australia, and traveled to England to take the G1 Diamond Jubilee at Royal Ascot last year. Currently the highest-rated horse in the world by the International Federation of Horse Racing Authorities, the 6-year-old is also the

highest-ever rated sprinter by that organization. The two-time Australian Horse of the Year was retired after her victory in the G1 TJ Smith S. at Randwick in Sydney Apr. 13.

Exceed and Excel, who stands at Darley's Kelvininside Farm in New South Wales, leads the 2012-13 Australian sire table with \$11.2 million in progeny earnings. The 13-year-old is responsible for 24 stakes winners Down Under this season, including G1 Golden Slipper winner Overreach (Aus) and G1 Champagne and G1 Sires Produce S. winner Guelph (Aus). His highest-earning Australian representative is Helmet (Aus), victor of the G1 Caulfield Guineas, Champagne and Sires Produce. His shuttling career to Darley's Dalham Hall in Newmarket, England has also gotten off to a successful start, with multiple Group 1 winner Excelebration (Ire) leading the charge. He stands for an advertised fee of A\$88,000 (US\$81,374).

HILLSTAR ADDED TO KING GEORGE

Sir Michael Stoute yesterday supplemented the G2 King Edward VII S. winner **Hillstar (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) for Saturday's G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. Sir Evelyn De Rothschild's homebred 3-year-old was added at a cost of £75,000 to make a total of 11 contenders for the 12-furlong feature, headed by Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's six-time Group 1 winner **St Nicholas Abbey (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}).

'PARTY' IN THE DEL MAR PADDOCK

Barretts' second annual paddock sale at Del Mar posted major gains Sunday evening and was topped by **Oscar Party** (Dixie Union), who was hammered down for \$510,000 to trainer Jim Cassidy. She was consigned to the sale as [hip 27](#) by Steve Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds. Cassidy, who was buying on behalf of Deron Pearson, was impressed by the conformation of last year's Kentucky Downs Juvenile Fillies S. winner. "She just looks like, when she fills out, she'll be a decent sort," said Cassidy. "We thought we'd spend \$300,000, \$350,000, but she was the only jewel in the crown [Sunday] night and there were a lot of people on her. I think there was about five or six people bidding on the filly."

Oscar Party, a half to GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity winner Major Gain (More Than Ready), has two wins in seven career starts and earnings of \$103,777. Most recently, she finished third in the GIII Regret S. at Churchill Downs June 15 for trainer Wayne Catalano and owner James Covello. As for the bay's near future, Cassidy said, "I'll evaluate her in the next couple of days and I'll probably take her to the track for three or four days and see where we're at. I'll get a work in about a week and hopefully run her in the [G1] Del Mar Oaks [Aug. 17]." **Cont. p4**

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Oxbow Expected to Arrive Friday...

Calumet Farm's GI Preakness S. winner **Oxbow** (Awesome Again) is expected to arrive at Monmouth Park from Saratoga Friday for a tilt at Sunday's

GI Haskell Invitational. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has not sent out the 'grey bay' for an official work since July 6 (5f in 1:02 flat at Churchill). He finished second in the GI Belmont S. last out June 8.

"[Oxbow] worked here and he's doing very well," the Hall of Famer said from Saratoga. "He went five-eighths, but I let him breeze through the stretch here last Monday. I thought that 97-degree heat might cook him.

The thing is, he puts so much into his works in the morning that I backed off. I didn't work him in the heat. I'm not going to. He'll just gallop up to the race." Lukas, who paired with Oxbow's rider for his lone previous Haskell win with Serena's Song in 1995, added, "We're keeping him happy and we're ready."

Third in 2011 and 2012, St Nicholas Abbey is currently favorite to improve on those efforts, and Joseph O'Brien is hoping he can deliver. "He seems in very good form, he seems to be working nicely and we're looking forward to it," O'Brien said yesterday. "The ground was quite slow last year and I got back a long way, and the year before they went very slow and I probably didn't have him in the right place, so I think we probably have legitimate excuses. Hopefully I won't get the blame again. I think he's quite a straightforward horse; I don't think what happens in the race is going to matter to me too much. The quicker the ground, the better. He wants good-to-firm ground and if it got any softer than good, I would have a little worry." Heading the opposition is Jean-Claude-Alain Dupouy's similarly prolific top-level performer **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) and Dr. Christoph Berglar's **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), who had that rival back in fifth in the June 23 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time. Ryan Moore had been set to renew his partnership with Novellist, but now that he is on Hillstar it could be that William Buick is called upon for the German challenger. Novellist's trainer Andreas Wohler told *The Daily Telegraph*, "He is a very good-moving horse, and if the ground is fast on Saturday, that is not really a concern. I expect him to run well."

Jim and Jackie Bolger's G1 Irish Derby winner **Trading Leather (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) and Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Ektihaam (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) are other notables. "To have a horse going who is a genuine contender is really exciting," the latter's trainer Roger Varian said yesterday. "It's a huge race, one of the top races in Europe, and to be involved is massive for me."

Lea Drills for Fourstardave...

Claiborne Farm and Adele Dilshneider's **Lea** (First Samurai) worked four panels in :48.60 over the Oklahoma Training Track turf in Saratoga yesterday morning as he prepares for a rematch with Horse of the Year Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the Spa's GII Fourstardave H. Aug. 10. A second-out maiden winner here a year ago, the homebred finished off his season with a score in the GIII Commonwealth Turf S. under the Twin Spires Nov. 17. He began his 4-year-old season with an off-the-turf allowance victory in Louisville June 1, but was second, beaten two lengths, by Wise Dan in the GII Firecracker H. June 29 over yielding sod. "We ran in a couple races before coming to New York, and unfortunately Wise Dan is running at this level," trainer Al Stall, Jr. said. "We'd sure like to get a firm turf course like he caught last year [here], just because of how well he ran. We were doing a little bobbing ourselves over that course at Churchill Downs. It wasn't the course's fault; it was the weather." Stall added, "He's in good shape. He'll be ready to go."

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NTRA ISSUES STATEMENT ON MONZANTE

National Thoroughbred Racing Association President and Chief Executive Officer Alex Waldrop yesterday issued a statement regarding the death of 2008 GI Eddie Read S. winner **Monzante** (Maria's Mon), who failed to finish a \$4,000 claiming race at Evangeline Downs July 20 and was euthanized.

"We know very little about the specific events surrounding the recent death of the gelding, Monzante, but the death of any horse while racing is a cause for concern," the statement read. "The 25 racetracks accredited by the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance adhere to a rigorous set of standards and protocols to foster a safer racing environment, including pre-race veterinary examinations, post-race veterinary inspections, reporting of injuries and fatalities, post-mortem veterinarian examinations, the establishment of an injury review committee and retirement and retraining options for owners and trainers of older and infirmed horses. We urge all tracks and participants, including Evangeline Downs and its horsemen, to seek accreditation and take full advantage of the industry's growing body of knowledge and best practices related to the safety of our human and equine athletes."

Monzante, a 9-year-old gelding at the time of his death, was bred by Juddmonte Farm and began his career in England before being purchased for 100,000gns at Tattersalls July in 2007. He resurfaced for trainer Mike Mitchell in Southern California that November, and recorded his greatest victory in the Eddie Read the following summer. Transferred east in the summer of 2011, Monzante proceeded to fall through the claiming ranks, switching stables four times before being claimed by owner/trainer Jackie Thacker for \$10,000 at Evangeline Downs in May of last year. Monzante had been on the shelf for eight months prior to last Saturday.

The Louisiana Racing Commission has launched an investigation into the incident, which has sparked outrage on twitter. As of Monday evening, the fan-sponsored @ProjectMonzante had over 100 followers.



GARY BISZANTZ:

Gulfstream Park recently announced a five-hundred dollar bonus to be paid to trainers for all starts at Gulfstream, and in my opinion the plan is a well-intentioned but misdirected program!

Our industry knows Gulfstream is making every effort to attract Calder trainers to race and stable at Gulfstream while both tracks argue over dates, which hurts Calder's business.

What Gulfstream management has overlooked or isn't much concerned about is that the owners pay all the bills in training. The owners put up the capital to purchase the horses. Incentivizing the trainer only encourages him to run, possibly when the horse is not 100%.

When the industry and vet community agreed to reduce bute levels from five micrograms down to two micrograms, it was done to give the regulatory veterinarian a better chance to identify horses during a pre-race examination that were a bit off and needed more time, which could prevent injuries to both horse and jockey. I question whether the bonus to trainers will encourage some trainers to enter and run when maybe a few more weeks off would have been in the best interest of the horse. Money talks!

The plan is a clear example of an idea that was designed to improve Gulfstream Park's profits and definitely take horses away from Calder. The Thoroughbred industry doesn't need this type of conflict.

I believe any and all monetary bonuses given by racetracks should be directed to the owners of the horses if you want the Thoroughbred industry to grow. Trainers do a good job, but they all bill the owners what is required to run their training operations and the owners pay!

Gulfstream needs to re-think their bonus policy. Owners need help as much as anybody. Very few owners are racing profitable stables and this program will not encourage new owners to invest.

Common sense speaks loudly here!

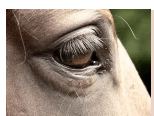

Not for the first time, the Coolmore/Ashford axis was in splendid form in the weekend's big events, with Majestic Warrior, Dylan Thomas and the much-missed Montjeu all being in Group 1-winning form.

For a few horrifying moments a couple of months ago, it seemed highly unlikely that Montjeu's daughter Chicquita would ever have the chance to add to her sire's magnificent record. Chicquita appeared to be heading for a decisive victory on her second start when she ducked to her right, collided with the hedge and took a horrible-looking fall with only 100 metres left to race ([video](#)).

Remarkably, the filly was quickly on her feet. Even more remarkably, she reappeared just over three weeks later to finish a creditable second to the exciting Treve in the G1 Prix de Diane. And now Chicquita has broken her maiden by taking the Irish Oaks, despite again showing an alarming tendency to hang, this time to her left.

So Paul Makin's €600,000 purchase at Arqana has gone from near-death experience to Classic victory in

the space of two months. The Australian owner can surely now look forward to further triumphs from a filly who--according to her trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre--"could have a great career if she manages not to do anything stupid." Her handler, who has trained so many high-class fillies, nominated the G1 Prix Vermeille and the G1 Arc as likely future targets, adding that "she could be better at four than she is now." **Cont. p8**

This prediction concurs with what I wrote about Montjeu fillies in October 2011, following the victories of Sarah Lynx in the GI Canadian International and of Miss Keller in the GI E.P. Taylor S. The full article is available in the [Columnists Archive](#), but the most relevant part pointed out that:

Montjeu was a high-mettled individual, as was his broodmare sire Top Ville, and it wasn't long before there were reports that Montjeu's fillies could be difficult to manage and often need careful handling. For example, I believe John Velasquez didn't carry a whip on Miss Keller at Woodbine.

I suspect it is no coincidence that Montjeu's three Group 1-winning fillies all gained their Group 1 victories after the age of three--Montjeu's dam Floripedes didn't race at two, didn't break her maiden until the August of her 3-year-old season and didn't become a Group winner until Oct. 1.

Montjeu's first female G1 winner, Montare, was four when she won the 2006 Prix Royal-Oak. The second, Miss Keller, was four before she became a Graded winner and five when she won the E.P. Taylor S., a year after finishing a good second in the same race. And Montjeu's third G1-winning daughter, Sarah Lynx, didn't become a stakes winner until the August of her 4-year-old campaign, when she took the G2 Prix de Pomone.

The dates of the first group victories by Montjeu's other daughters stand at Oct. 23 of Clowance's 5-year-old campaign; July 31 of Pink Symphony's 4-year-old season; Oct. 27 of Albisola's 3-year-old season; Oct. 2 for the 3-year-old Maria Royal; and Sept. 4 of Pacifique's 3-year-old year.

In other words, the distinction of being the earliest group-winning daughter of Montjeu belonged to Mont Etoile, winner of the G2 Ribblesdale S. on June 22 as a 3-year-old, until Wading took the Rockfel S.

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So, has this situation changed much in the intervening 21 months? The answer is a definite "No," as Chicquita is the only new group-winning daughter of Montjeu since October 2011. Nor has the imbalance between the sexes of Montjeu's group winners changed much, as his 22 Northern Hemisphere-sired Group 1 winners are dominated by 18 sons. There are now 11 group-winning daughters, but they come from a total of more than 40. Strangely, the situation is being reversed by Montjeu's stallion sons (at least so far). All three of their Group 1 winners are fillies--including Treve, the Motivator filly who defeated Chicquita in the Prix de Diane--and their 18 Group winners consist of 12 daughters and six sons.

Montjeu is by no means the only member of the Sadler's Wells male line to have shone with Chicquita's family. For example, Sadler's Wells himself sired the dual Classic winner Alexandrova--winner of the Irish Oaks seven years before Chicquita--from Chicquita's fourth dam Souk. Sadler's Wells's son Baratheas was responsible for the G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Magical Romance and the G2 Lancashire Oaks winner Pongee, while another son, High Chaparral, got into the act via his son Golden Sword (out of a daughter of Souk). Golden Sword ran very well to be fifth in the 2009 Derby and second in the Irish Derby. **Caulfield cont. p9**

It is Montjeu, though, who has the unusual record of having sired stakes winners from three generations of Chicquita's female line. He sired the stayer Lion Sands (Timeform 116) from Chicquita's third dam, the Darshaan mare Puce, and also sired the 2008 Derby fifth Washington Irving (Timeform 115) from Puce's three-parts-sister Shouk. Next came Pacifique, his Group 3-winning daughter out of Chicquita's second dam, the Zafonic mare Platonic. Pairing Montjeu with Zafonic mares yielded some rich rewards. In addition to Pacifique, this partnership's 20 foals included the high-class Papal Bull, who went within half a length of winning the King George, and the Group 2 winner Maria Royal.

Although some of these smart performers hadn't had a chance to prove their worth before 2010, it is still easy to understand Montjeu's appeal as the first mate for Chicquita's dam Prudenzia, a listed winner over 1 3/8 miles, in 2009.

Pacifique was only a yearling when Chicquita was conceived, but had already garnered a listed victory and a Group 3 second by the time her younger relative came under the hammer at Arqana's 2011 August sale. Pacifique later proved her class and her stamina by taking the G3 Prix de Lutece over 1 7/8 miles. No wonder Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock was prepared to go to €600,000 to secure the young Chicquita on behalf of Makin.

"She is a beautiful filly from a quality family that is only going to extend its influence," the agent explained.

Pritchard-Gordon was clearly correct, as the 2012 Arqana sales saw Prudenzia's next foal, a three-parts-sister to Chicquita by Galileo, sell for nearly twice as much. This €1.1-million filly--the sale's top-priced filly--is now named Sinnamary and is in training with Mikel Delzangles. Prudenzia's current yearling--another filly by Galileo--is [Lot 33](#) in next month's Arqana sale and she is followed by a 2013 colt by Invincible Spirit.

Chicquita is the first Group 1 winner produced by a daughter of Dansili. As Dansili has sired such talented racemares as Proviso, Passage of Time, Giofra, Emulous, Fallen For You, The Fugue, Price Tag and Sunday's Group 2 winner Dank, there is every reason to think that Chicquita could be the first of many top winners. It may be worth remembering, though, that Dansili started out at a fee of £8,000 and spent his first six seasons at £12,500 or less. His record as a broodmare sire is therefore likely to improve exponentially when the progeny of his younger daughters reach the track.

Another of Montjeu's Grade I-winning daughters, Sarah Lynx, is bred along similar lines to Chicquita, as her dam is by Dansili's sire Danehill. So too is the dam of Montjeu's Group 3-winning daughter Albisola, and it mustn't be forgotten that Camelot, who went so close to winning last year's Triple Crown, has a Danehill mare as his second dam.

Irish Statistics Show Stability, Modest Rises:

Horse Racing Ireland yesterday released statistics from the first six months of the Irish racing season, which showed stability or growth across most platforms. Bloodstock sales at public auction grew for the fourth straight year, rising 8.3% from last year to €25.8 million. Bloodstock sales are up 84% over the last four years. Entries and total runners are up 3.2% and 0.2%, respectively. While total on course betting and on course betting excluding the tote were down 7.1% and 8.3%, respectively, total tote betting, on course tote betting and off course total betting were up 1.4%, 1% and 2%. Total and average attendances were both up 0.6%, while prize money and sponsorship were up 4.1% and 1.5%, respectively. The number of active owners is down 4.4%, and new registered owners is down 11%.

"International demand for Irish bloodstock remains strong, driven by the success of Irish horses at home and abroad," said Brian Kavanagh, chief executive of HRI. "Irish-bred horses have had a particularly successful season in Hong Kong. Six of the last seven European champion 2-year-olds were trained in Ireland, including the 2012 champion Dawn Approach [Ire]."
