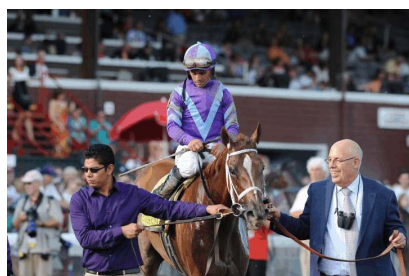

winner at the highest level in the United Nations S. July 6, got things going at Saratoga, rallying to score in the Sword Dancer Invitational just a few minutes before **Admiral Kitten** doubled the tally in the Secretariat S. at Arlington Park. **Real Solution** crossed the line

second behind **The Apache (SAf)** (Mogok) in the Arlington Million, but was herded out several paths by the South African and was ultimately promoted to the victory by the stewards. **Cont. p3**

A WIN FIT FOR A PRINCESS

King of Prussia Stable's **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior) all but locked up an Eclipse Award as champion 3-year-old filly, delivering yet another knockout punch by easily defeating **Fiftyshadesofhay** (Pulpit) in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. A tracking

fourth for Javier Castellano behind the first flight of runners, the Pennsylvania-bred filly, winner earlier this season of the GI Kentucky Oaks, looped her rivals approaching the stretch and ran out a convincing winner. "There wasn't a whole lot of pace," said

winning trainer Todd Pletcher, who earned his first Alabama victory. "She was doing it on her own; she was in a nice rhythm, so I thought she was in a perfect spot. I thought she won pretty convincingly. Anytime you run a mile and a quarter, it can be a taxing race, but I thought she did it well within herself." Since 1999, five fillies have completed the Kentucky Oaks/Alabama double, with four of them going on to be named champion. **Alabama S. cont. p6**

A PADDY PARTY IN DEAUVILLE

The European yearling sales season didn't take long to register its first seven-figure transaction of the year when, 14 lots into the first session of Arqana's August Sale, a Dubawi (Ire) half-brother to Group 1 winner Nahoodh (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}) was knocked down for a round €1 million.

Though the trade was made in Deauville, both vendor and purchasing agent of **Lot 14** are Irish, with Ballylinch Stud the successful consignor of the strong chestnut colt, who went the way of father-and-son team Peter and Ross Doyle acting for an undisclosed "established client of Richard Hannon." John Ferguson, who had previously gone to €620,000 for an Oasis Dream (GB) colt out of Mambo Light (Kingmambo) on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, was the under-bidder.

"Dubawi is a brilliant sire, and the colt is a half-brother to a Group 1 winner, so we were expecting him to sell well, but you can never anticipate a figure like that," said an understandably delighted John O'Connor, manager of Ballylinch Stud. **Cont. p14**

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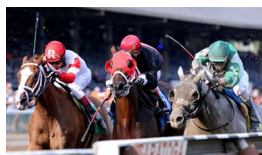

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The 'Real' Deal...

Real Solution's dam, the Claiborne-bred Reachfortheheavens (Pulpit), was claimed by the Ramseys for \$25,000 in late 2007 and was sent to Kitten's Joy in her first year at stud in 2008. The resulting foal was born in Pennsylvania and was subsequently exported to Italy to be trained by trainer Gianluca Bietolini. The bay was dismissed at odds of 19-1 for his first career appearance at the Capannelle in Rome in November 2011, but belied those odds to score by 2 1/2 lengths in heavy ground over a mile and three-sixteenths. He was the cat's meow of that country's 3-year-old crop in 2012, returning to Rome to thrash a conditions field by seven lengths last March before a first black-type win by five lengths in the Premio Botticelli the following month. Frankie Dettori was recruited for the G2 Derby Italiano three weeks later and the betting public hammered Real Solution into 2-5 favoritism, but he never got untracked, finishing a one-paced sixth before getting some time off. Runner-up against a conditions field he should have handled back at Rome in September, the colt was repatriated and made his 4-year-old bow in the GIII Fort Marcy S. at Belmont Park, where he was an even fourth over an 8 1/2-furlong trip short of his optimum. He got that chance to stretch out a bit in Belmont's GI Manhattan H. June 8 and finished willingly to be third, beaten 1 3/4 lengths by Point of Entry (Dynaformer).

WIN AND YOU'RE IN®

Looking to give the Ramseys their second winner on the program (*see Secretariat S. below*) in this "Win and You're In" test for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, Real Solution jumped fairly and raced in mid-division, as defending race champion **Little Mike** (Spanish Steps) secured a fairly easy lead while tracked by **Mull of Killough (Ire)** (Mull of Kintyre), **Rahystrada** (Rahy) and Nates **Mineshaft** (Mineshaft). The Apache covered a bit of ground while close up, while favored **Indy Point (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner) took up a spot towards the back of the field. Real Solution was shuffled back a bit into about eighth position while saving all the ground as Little Mike got his opening half in a smooth :48.99. Steered off the fence and around a tiring Nates Mineshaft leaving the three-eighths pole, Real Solution enjoyed a clear passage into the stretch between Rahystrada and **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). He turned his attention to The Apache, who made an eye-catching sweep to the front at the quarter pole for Christophe Soumillon, and had that one in the crosshairs as they laid it down for the final eighth of a mile. Real Solution poked his nose in front for a few strides late, but ultimately crossed the line second. However, the head-on showed that The Apache came out several paths and stewards were left with no choice but to take down the apparent winner. "He broke really good. The first two and a half [furlongs]," said winning rider Alan Garcia. "I took him back out of there; he was nice and relaxed. At the top of the stretch, I had plenty of horse to go by and the other horse bumped us more than four times--made me lose my momentum. If that didn't happen, we might have won by two or three lengths." Soumillon disagreed. "As you can see, we were the better horse, but he got scared by the (Jumbotron) screen and shifted out," the Belgian commented. "We were the best horse."

Dank came with a scintillating turn of foot once pointed for home by jockey Ryan Moore and stormed past her rivals to land this "Win and You're In" event for the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf Nov. 1 at Santa Anita. Runner-up in a Listed stakes at Haydock last August, the James Wigan homebred earned a first win at pattern level in the G3 Atalanta S. at Sandown the following month before closing the season with a fifth in the Listed Rosemary S. at Newmarket Sept. 28. The bay was first-up for seven months in the G3 Dahlia S. at headquarters May 5 and got her nose down right on the money, then gave an excellent account of herself when dropped back to the testing straight-course mile at Royal Ascot, finishing a half-length third behind Duntle (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) in that June 19 test. She stretched back out to nine panels for her latest, the G2 Kilboy Estate S. at The Curragh July 21, and carried a hefty 135 pounds to a convincing 1 3/4-length success. She arrived in Chicago as the first-ever runner for trainer Sir Michael Stoute in the Beverly D. and left with the spoils. Illinois-bred La Tia (City Place) won the break and made the early running from Canadian raider Solid Appeal (Successful Appeal) and a three-wide Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro) as Dank settled in centerfield. La Tia did the heavy lifting, getting her half-mile in :48.16 and three-quarters in a solid 1:11.76 and led them into the lane. Solid Appeal tried, but couldn't get past and Marketing Mix game under pressure from Gary Stevens, but Dank was just finding her best stride and flew home on the grandstand side for an easy win. Gifted Girl rounded out the exacta, while Gill Modesty H. heroine Ausus came from the tail to touch Marketing Mix out of third. "She's been real aggressive all year," said victorious rider Ryan Moore. "She wasn't at her best over the last couple, but she was in excellent condition coming into this, and when she kicked in, it was all over." Gary Stevens said it wasn't the favorite's day. "She was pulling and not settling like she normally does. She was comfortable, but she was pulling, which took away from her kick," he offered.

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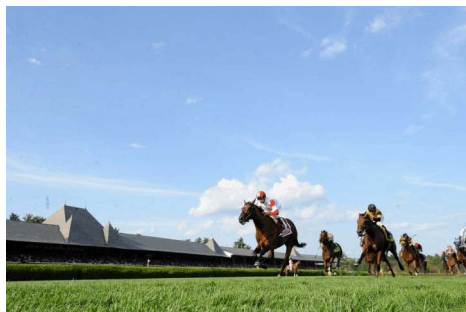

Big Blue Kitten, winner of the GI United Nations July 6, doubled his Grade I tally here and confirmed his status as one of the nation's best turf horses. The progressive homebred put together optional claiming wins at Gulfstream Mar. 3 and Churchill May 2, but came on too late when second to Boisterous (Distorted Humor) in the nine-furlong GII Monmouth S. June 9. The added two furlongs of the U.N. hit him right

between the eyes, however, and he won that going away by 1 1/4 lengths in that Monmouth centerpiece. Here, the Ramsey homebred was near the back of the pack early as entymate Stormy

Lord (Stormy Atlantic) led through honest, but not suicidal, splits of :49 4/5, 1:14 1/5 and 1:39 2/5. Jockey Joe Bravo crept Big Blue Kitten closer on the far turn, but had to wait for room as several rivals got the jump on them, including Twilight Eclipse, who hit the front a furlong out. Once in the clear, however, Big Blue Kitten unleashed a furious turn of foot and sailed past Twilight Eclipse. "I left it up to Joe," said Chad Brown, who also conditions yesterday's GI Arlington Million winner Real Solution for Ken and Sarah Ramsey. "He has so much confidence in this horse since the first time he rode him [in the Monmouth S.]. He really talked me into running in the United Nations, and I was super confident bringing him up here and keeping him on this horse. In the paddock, Joe felt he was the winner every step of the way. He says, 'I just love this horse. I'll work the trip out,' and he did."

Princess of Sylmar was 2-5 to win this prestigious event, and after doing so in impressive fashion, might be the same odds to collect an Eclipse Award as the nation's best 3-year-old filly at year's end. Winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks May 4 and GI CCA Oaks at Saratoga July 20--both at nine furlongs--the Penn-bred filly was taken back in fourth by Javier Castellano as Carnival Court emerged to set fractions of :23 4/5 and

:48 flat as Montana Native (Yes It's True) and Fiftyshadesofhay pressed. Staying a bit closer than is her norm, Princess of Sylmar took aim on the trio on the far turn, quickly powering up to take command. Fiftyshadesofhay kept on fighting and kept Princess of Sylmar

honest down the lane, but the latter was too classy and powered away. Asked if his filly has clinched championship honors, trainer Todd Pletcher said, "I have to think so. The Kentucky Oaks, Coaching Club American Oaks--that's a pretty hard trifecta to win. She has definitely established herself as the champion 3-year-old filly, unless somebody does something [big]." Pletcher said he hasn't made plans for Princess of Sylmar's next race. "We'll see how she comes out of it," he said. "I don't think we'll make a decision right away. We never make decisions right after a race, but Ed [Stanco, owner] is committed to running her next year, and, who knows, maybe even as a 5-year-old. At some point you don't want to be greedy, but at the same time she is doing unbelievably well, and sometimes you have to take advantage of that, so we have some thinking to do." The Alabama has been an important indicator of championship success. Four of the last five winners of the race--Questing (GB), Royal Delta, Blind Luck and Proud Spell--went on to divisional honors.

A maiden winner for \$50,000 at first asking over the Keeneland Poly last October, Admiral Kitten closed an abbreviated freshman campaign with a victory in the El Joven S. at Retama Park Nov. 10. A forgettable 11th in his seasonal debut in the John Battaglia Memorial S. at Turfway Mar. 2, the homebred missed by a nose to Infinite Magic (More Than Ready) in a second-level allowance back at Keeneland Apr. 14, then rounded out

the exacta behind Noble Tune (Unbridled's Song) in the GII American Turf S. at Churchill May 3. He went favored in each of the first two legs of the Mid-America Triple, but was frustrated on each occasion, going down by a length behind

General Election (Harlan's Holiday) in the GIII Arlington Classic May 25 before missing by a nose to Infinite Magic, with Stormy Len another nose back in third, in the GIII American Derby last time out July 13. "We were able to sit back and relax, that's kind of the horse's style," Napravnik explained. "We got a clear trip around the second turn and he was just finishing fast. 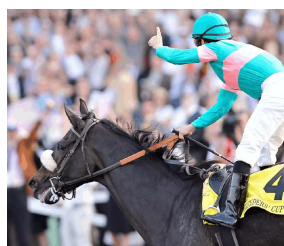

MORNY MAGIC

Deauville is treated to a rare American visitor today as **No Nay Never** (Scat Daddy) bids to back up his scintillating performance in the G2 Norfolk S. in the G1 Darley Prix Morny. Rated by Wesley Ward as the best that he has trained, the Coolmore acquisition will be in the hands of David Flores as he attempts a rare double. "He went over to Deauville last Thursday, so he's had plenty of time to acclimatize," Ward told *PA Sport*. "Since Ascot he's done a few serious breezes and he looks like a rhino--he's built like a tank. The thing is, he'll be taking on some much nicer horses this weekend, the better horses come out later on in the year as it progresses. Before the race at Ascot, I couldn't see him getting beaten looking around the paddock, just his coat and everything--he looked the best. The competition will be stiffer in France. I've been really happy with him since then. He's a fantastic specimen to have anything to do with and he's a pleasure to deal with." Heading the home defense is Gerard Augustin-Normand's unbeaten filly **Vorda (Fr)** (Orpen), who had the re-opposing **Omaticaya (Ire)** (Bernstein) and **Vedeux (Ire)** (Elusive City) back in second and third, respectively, in the G2 Prix Robert Papin at Maisons-Laffitte last time July 21. She commands respect, as does another filly in Sheikh Rashid Dalmook Al Maktoum's **Rizeena (Ire)** (Iffraaj {GB}), who beat No Nay Never's stable companion Sweet Emma Rose (City Zip) in the G2 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot June 19 before finishing runner-up under a penalty in Newmarket's G2 Duchess of Cambridge S. over this trip last time July 12. "She's in very good form and I think the track will suit," her trainer commented. "Ryan [Moore] has been to sit on her twice at home and he's been very happy with her. The ground should be ideal at Deauville and six furlongs there should be perfect. We'll be looking at Group 1s from now on and the obvious one after this would be the Cheveley Park at the end of the season."

The colt's dam Mise (Ire), an unraced daughter of Indian Ridge (Ire), currently has a filly foal by Invincible Spirit (Ire) and is in foal to that sire's Classic-winning son, the Ballylinch stallion Lawman (Fr). O'Connor's comments regarding Dubawi's sire prowess was echoed by his first-session figures. The Darley flagbearer was leading sire by average on the first day for those stallions with more than one lot sold, his four yearlings averaging an impressive €567,500.

O'Connor added: "He has a fabulous physique and was well liked by all the good judges, and obviously we're really pleased with that price. That was only our second yearling through the ring this year, so if we can continue this way we'll be delighted."

"It's great to bring a horse to a sale where you think he will be one of the top lots. He's a mature, good-looking colt and we're thrilled with where he's going to be trained. Richard Hannon does a fantastic job and this is just the sort of horse he and the Doyle's like. We've always brought types to this sale that we think will suit this market. We've had a lot of success here, but then I think we bring horses that justify that. It has to be the right type--it's August, so you need a mature-looking horse and he's exactly that."

A short time later, [Lot 33](#), a Galileo (Ire) three-parts sister to G1 Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), became the only other horse to reach seven-figures during the session when equaling the session-topping €1 million. Consigned by Ecurie de Monceaux, she was purchased by John Magnier. **Cont. p15**

Colleville Coup...

The Doyle team struck again later for the session's sole yearling by Kendargent (Fr), the young sensation of the French stallion ranks who was profiled by Sue Finley in yesterday's edition of *TDN* ([click here for story](#)). Haras de Colleville, which stands the grey son of Kendor (Fr), is represented by just two yearlings in total at Arqana this week, both by their home stallion, and were rightly enjoying a chilled bottle of champagne following the sale of [Lot 30](#) for €450,000. Already named Luxe Vendome (Fr), the colt is a half-brother to Style Vendome (Fr) (Anabaa), the winner of this

season's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, who was bred by Guy Pariente, the owner of Haras de Colleville, and sold at this same sale two years ago for €92,000.

Following his Classic victory, Style Vendome was sold privately to Sheikh Joaan Bin Hamad Al Thani, and he is believed to be the new owner of his yearling half-brother.

Like Toronado and Olympic Glory, he will also be trained by Richard Hannon.

"Monsieur Pariente raced the sire and the dam of this colt, so it's really special," said Haras de Colleville manager Guillaume Vitse. "Kendargent was standing for just €1,000 at the time that this colt was conceived, so to sell for €450,000 is incredible. He's going to a very good home. Richard Hannon is going to train him and we're really pleased about that."

"We have only sold three or four Kendargents, and of course that was by far the biggest price we have ever made, so we're pretty happy," added an emotional Vitse, who gave the horse a kiss after the sale, but added that they had not expected to bring him back home. "We love our yearlings, but we bring them here to be sold. Every horse we offer, we expect to find a home."

The colt's dam, Place Vendome (Fr) (Dr Fong), is also an Arqana graduate. The three-time winning sprinter was bought by Pariente at the 2005 October Sale for €28,000. Her Orpen 2-year-old, Prestige Vendome (Fr), is in training in France with Nicolas Clement.

Keeping the Dream Alive...

Dreamkeeper (Ire), one of the most exciting 2-year-olds in training in Russia and by the world's best sire, Galileo (Ire), was bought from this sale last year for €350,000 by Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock on behalf of owner Alexander Negenetz. The same team struck again for that colt's full-sister, [Lot 18](#), offered by Ecurie des Monceaux, who was a little more expensive at €400,000 but will eventually make a lovely addition to Negenetz's broodmare band. The owner/breeder, who is based in Krasnodar where Dreamkeeper recorded his recent five-length domestic Group 1 success, is currently expanding his bloodstock operation. The French-bought siblings are out of Naissance Royale (Ire) (Giant's Causeway), a multiple graded stakes winner for Monceaux Stable when trained by Christophe Clement.

Just as last year, Lucien Urano's Ecurie des Monceaux sits atop the vendors' table, having sold 10 yearlings for a total of €2,710,000, led by the three-parts-sister to Irish Oaks winner Chicquita (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}). Peter and Ross Doyle ended the session as leading buyers, with four yearlings purchased for €2,340,000.

Parties and Pedigrees...

With 41 yearlings fetching six- or seven-figure sums on the opening night, it's clear that the August Sale is serious business for those buying and selling but, with the backdrop of the holiday season in one of the most beautiful seaside towns in France, there's plenty of fun to be had, too.

In August, Deauville is not just packed with horse-traders and their entourages, but also holidaymaking Parisians. It's a rare Thoroughbred auction that has sightseers packing the ring simply to watch the spectacle unfold, but this is very much the norm at the August Sale, with onlookers standing four or five deep on the upper tier of the auditorium. **Cont. p16**

The Arqana team does a great job of creating a holiday atmosphere even for those engaged in the sale, with an eve-of-auction party, held this year at the polo club in the center of Deauville La Touques racecourse while a match was in progress. For those not too jaded from a late-night/early-morning finish in Le Drakkar, the popular meeting spot for the British and Irish in town for the sale, the *Racing Post*, Weatherbys and the Royal Hotel co-hosted a very smart lunch on the first day of the sale. Former Breeders' Cup Vice-President Carter Carnegie, the newly-appointed International Executive for Great British Racing International, was spotted among the guests. Having only started his new role on Monday, he's wasting no time in familiarizing himself with the leading players of all nationalities on the European sales circuit. --*Emma Berry*

Esteemed Connections...

Later in the session, a pair of yearlings closely related to two of France's most successful distaffers of recent times sold for €650,000. First up was lot [54](#), a son of the now-deceased but increasingly-important Monsun (Ger) who sold to Mandore International Agency. From Haras des Capucines, the April-foaled bay is a grandson of the listed-winning and group-placed dam Soignee (Ger) (Dashing Blade {Ger}), who is responsible for the high-class Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}). Mandore's Nicolas de Watrigant said, "He has been bought for a new investor from China and I hope he will be trained in France. He is a gorgeous colt and the outcross has already worked out beautifully, so I'm really happy to get him." Also selling for that price was the same draft's Galileo half-sister to Zagora (Fr) (Green Tune). Like Stacelita, she was a classy French export who transferred her ability Stateside and rounded off her career with a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf in November. Vendor Charles-Henri de Moussac said, "He's a lovely colt who has a lot going for him. We had a lot of visitors, so I'm not surprised he sold so well. It is a really nice way to start, but there is a long way to go." Ferguson also snapped up a daughter of Dubawi from the Monceaux consignment whose dam is the 2007 GI Beverly D S. winner Royal Highness (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}). Lot [49](#) hails from a family that has served Godolphin well, thanks to Electrocutionist (Red Ransom), and he fetched €500,000.

Later, he paid €320,000 to add another daughter of the sire to his roster from Haras du Mezeray. Lot [73](#) is out of the prolific Straight Lass (Ire) (Machiavellian), who has produced the 2008 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner Naaqoos (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) and fellow sire Barastraight (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), and also the dam of last year's G3 Prix de Cabourg winner Mazameer (Ire) (Green Desert). Dubawi was also responsible for another highlight when Haras de l'Hotellerie's lot [27](#) sold to Form Bloodstock for €450,000. He is a half-brother to Lily of the Valley (Fr) (Galileo {Ire}), who beat Stacelita in the 2010 G1 Prix de l'Opera. Buyer Jehan Malherbe commented, "He has been bought for Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and is a really nice colt who was cheap for a Dubawi. He will go into training with Mike de Kock." Alongside South African interests, Australian representation was also in evidence, and Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds paid €460,000 for another from the Hotellerie consignment by Dansili (GB). Lot [91](#) is a three-parts brother to the multiple Stakes winner and Group 1-placed Chrysanthemum (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), and was the sole offering by the Juddmonte sire on the day.

Nothing Ventura'd...

Lot [89](#), the Makfi (GB) daughter of Ventura (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}), who is famed for her stellar daughter Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), was a highlight of the Haras des Capucines consignment, and ultimately sold to Oceanic Bloodstock for €360,000. Vendor Eric Puerari was not overly excited by the price achieved, however. "She sold for a fair price, but it was not outstanding," he commented. "I feel the market is rather difficult and the good horses sell well, but it depends too much on a few buyers." Oceanic also paid €320,000 for lot [78](#), a Galileo filly from the same draft whose dam is the dual Classic-placed Tamazirte (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). Michel Zerolo said, "She has been bought for an American client, Rick Porter, who is a new investor in Europe. She is a lovely filly with a great pedigree and, although she is a late foal, she will be given all the time she needs to develop. She will go into training with Jean-Claude Rouget." Another notable day for Galileo was capped by the sale of Haras d'Etreham's lot [25](#), who hails from the extended family of Pilsudski (Ire). "She is a lovely filly who I have bought for a South American client," Philippe Jousset of France Turf International explained after subduing his rivals with a bid of €280,000. "The market is strong and that is a reasonable price for a Galileo from such a nice family. She will stay in training in France, but it is not decided with which trainer yet." After such a vibrant trade, it was no surprise that the opening session average of €214,323 was up by 48% on last year and the median of €128,000 represented a steep rise of 35%. 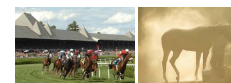

Guillot Preps Moreno & Salutos Amigos for GIs.....

GII Dwyer S. victor **Moreno** (Ghostzapper) worked five furlongs in :59.68 over Saratoga's main track yesterday in preparation for the GI Travers S. Aug. 24. He set a speedy pace in his last start in the GII Jim Dandy S. July 27, where he finished third.

"He traveled really good for the Travers," trainer Eric Guillot said. "I chose today [to work Moreno] because you know how he's a looky-loo; he's got the earplugs and the blinkers. I figured with the Alabama [being run today], the apron would be full of people, and sure enough I was right. Last Sunday, when I worked him [1:12 flat for six furlongs] he was more focused on the rider. Today, he's got his ears pricked and he's looking around at people eating Dunkin' Donuts."

Facing the powerful Pletcher pair of Verrazano (More Than Ready) and Palace Malice (Curlin) in the Travers, Guillot believes moderate fractions will be key to his horse having a shot at the win. **Cont. p18**

"I would imagine Todd wouldn't be pressing his own horse with Palace Malice and Verrazano together; that wouldn't make much sense," Guillot said. "So, somebody's going to push me, and, hopefully, they push me so far up front, or push me to the point where the other one can't catch up. That would be the best-case scenario."

Guillot also worked his GI King's Bishop S. contender **Salutos Amigos** (Salute the Sarge) yesterday over five furlongs in 1:02.53. The colt was third in his last outing in the GII Amsterdam here July 28.

Salutos Amigos has overcome a foot issue that has plagued him since Guillot purchased him.

"I knew it would take six months to grow out [the foot]," Guillot said. "They've grown out. I don't have any more glue on the horse. The day after I shoe him, he goes like a champ. I don't have to keep him on any kind of medication to keep his feet right. The horse went from shuffling like he was on egg shells to striding out like a good horse."

War Dancer Puts in Final Pre-Travers Breeze...

Trainer Ken McPeck breezed GI Travers S. contender **War Dancer** (War Front) under regular rider Alan Garcia yesterday. The colt worked five furlongs on the Oklahoma training track in 1:02.33.

"He went great; better than ever," Garcia said. "He was moving sweet. I'm looking forward to the Travers. The way I'm feeling the last two times I breezed this horse, he couldn't be better."

McPeck was also pleased with the GII Virginia Derby hero's work.

"It was a nice work," McPeck said. "He did it well. Alan seemed to think that he could have left the other horse earlier in the breeze. It looks like it sets up pretty nice for us. War Dancer does everything you ask him to do, whenever you ask him to do it. He's drilling the feed tub, and that's what he's got to do going into this."

War Dancer only raced on the dirt once in his seven career starts when fourth in a Gulfstream Park maiden Feb. 9.

"We think he'll handle the dirt fine; we just haven't given him much of an opportunity on it other than the one race in Florida," McPeck said. "He's made the mile and a quarter already in the Virginia Derby, and that was a very heavy turf course."

Mucho Macho Man Sets Sights on the Woodward...

Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) went six furlongs over the main track at Saratoga in 1:14.43 yesterday in advance of his next start in the GI Woodward S. Aug. 31.

"He went good, very good," trainer Kathy Ritvo said. "He was very strong today. He came out of his race really good and showed us that he's ready to get ready to run again. He's very sharp; he can't be doing any better."

The multiple graded stakes winner was third in his most recent outing in the GI Whitney Invitational H. Aug. 3.

"He ran a monster race [in the Whitney]," Ritvo said. "It's been kind of a slow start to this year, but he's picking it up. He'll be running his third race [off a layoff] in the Woodward, and it should be a good one."

The multi-millionaire has a very respectable black-type resume, including a third place finish in the 2011 GI Kentucky Derby and his hit the board in 17 of his 21 lifetime starts.

"I don't understand how you can find a more consistent horse," Ritvo said. "He ran a good race coming back in the Criminal Type, and he took a huge step to the Whitney. Huge."

Lighthouse Bay Gets Ready For Next 'Test'...

GI Prioress S. heroine **Lighthouse Bay** (Speightstown) put in a five furlong breeze in 1:01.21 at the Spa yesterday over the main track.

"It went really smooth," trainer George Weaver said. "I made the decision to only work her once. The fact that she worked in 1:01 and change was good because usually by herself she can very easily have gone much slower. She's not a horse that goes over there and is a flashy work horse. I took it as a sign that she was eager and wanting to go as well as she did."

The chestnut is preparing for her next outing in the GI Test S. here Aug. 24. She will be attempting seven furlongs for the first time in that.

"She seems to be in fine form," Weaver said. "Hopefully, she'll go over there and run her race for us on Travers Day. They call it the Test, and it will be a test for her, but she has the right style to run a good seven furlongs. Until you do it, you don't know for sure, but we're delighted to be able to be pointing for the Test. She deserves to be in there after winning the Prioress, for sure."

Baby J Prepares For First Grade I 'Test'...

GIII Victory Ride heroine **Baby J** (J Be K) recorded her first work since that test yesterday, breezing six furlongs in 1:14.50 at Saratoga. The bay will make her next start in the GI Test S. Aug. 24.

"She went nice and easy and galloped out good, so we're going to take a shot at the Grade 1," trainer Patrick Reynolds said. "She won the Victory Ride. She got knocked sideways at the eighth pole and got up and got the job done. When you have a horse like that, you've got a good shot. She's a tryer and wants to do it."

Baby J's score in the Victory Ride gave owner Paul Pompa Jr. the confidence to step up to a Grade I.

"He said let's lock and load and see if we can't stretch her [to seven furlongs]," Reynolds said. "It's the Test. It's a big race. Everyone knows the Test. We have our fingers crossed."

He is the sire of 125 Stakes performers including 19 group and 36 listed winners to date. They are headed by the 2006 G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis scorer Lord of England (Ger), the 2000 G1 Premio Vittorio du Capua hero Faberger (Ger) and a host of other classy runners including Proudswings (Ger) and Soave (Ger). As a damsire, Dashing Blade is responsible for 15 individual group winners and 21 listed winners, headed by Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}) and Earl of Tinsdal (Ger) (Black Sam Bellamy {Ire}). Gestut Etzean's Ralf Kredel said, "He will be sorely missed after 22 years. He has been so good to us and we are glad to have his best son Lord of England here, who has champion potential as well."
