

ORFEVRE FARES WELL IN ARC DRAW

Japanese hopes of a landmark first success in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe received a boost yesterday as **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn}) drew stall eight for the Longchamp feature. Having advertised his well-being and served notice that he remains the force of old in the course-and-distance G2 Prix Niel last time Sept. 15, Sunday Racing's brilliant but wayward 5-year-old will bid to go one better than when caught close home by the shock winner Solemia (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}). Drawn wide in 18 on that occasion, the chestnut still looked much the likeliest winner until appearing to lose

concentration and collide with the rail in the final yards, and trainer Yasutoshi Ikei is set on redemption tomorrow. "His preparation has gone very well," Ikei said. "All the work he's done has been in such a

way that he will stay mentally right. He's made a lot of progress mentally. On Sunday, there will be lots of runners and maybe it will be difficult to get a perfect run, but I have done my work and Orfevre is ready. Everything he's done has been so that he's in top form for Sunday and now it's up to the horse and Christophe Soumillon. I really thought we would have won last year, I was very disappointed. Orfevre had a relapse that day, but I really hope he can give the Japanese fans something to cheer on Sunday. I want to set the record straight." Like Orfevre last year, John Deer's

Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) was worst off after drawing post position 18. Reverting to a mile and a half after being campaigned solely at shorter so far this term, he has the soft ground he requires here, but the triple Group 1 winner comes into this test on the back of defeats in the

PACE APLENTY IN SHADWELL

Reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry) has posted 14 Beyer Speed Figures of 100 or better in his illustrious career, including 12 in a row. His nine rivals as he goes in defense of his title in today's G1 Shadwell Turf Mile S. at Keeneland, which offers an all-fees-paid trip to the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile, have seven such speed figures combined, and four of those are owned by Wise Dan's stablemate, 2011 Mile runner-up **Turallure** (Wando). It's difficult to conceive of Wise Dan surrendering his nine-race winning streak here as he looks to remain in the discussion for back-to-back Horse of the Year honors. Perfect in his five trips to the post this term, the chestnut overcame a 129-pound impost to defeat lone speed King Kreesa (King Cugat) in the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 10 and exits a course record-setting performance in winning the G1 Woodbine Mile Sept. 15. He is back on 20 days' rest, just as he was last year, but trainer Charlie LoPresti could just as easily have trained up to the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile four weeks from today. That he has entered his charge is a sign that he's rearing to go. **Cont. p5**

Al Kazeem's jockey James Doyle was having to come to terms with the highly unfavorable draw dilemma yesterday. "You always fear the worst, but I was a bit disappointed with that draw," he commented.

"Someone has to be drawn there and it's us. If there were three or four pacemakers in the race, we could have tucked in but there isn't and I'll have to sit down with Mr. Deer and Mr. Charlton and devise a plan.

Orfevre was drawn out there last year, but it probably got him beat as he had to come round the field and was committed earlier than he would have liked. They had eight millimeters of rain last night and there is a patchy forecast from here on in, so the more rain the better, as a mile and a half with cut in the ground is perfect. I just think he'll be slightly better over a mile and a half. You dream about riding in the Arc through your childhood, so I'm really looking forward to it." Al Kazeem is not the sole class act who will have the burden of a wide stall

to overcome, with Shinji Maeda's Sept. 15 G2 Prix Niel scorer **Kizuna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) in 11, Dr. Christophe Berglar's **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}) in 12 and Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}) in 15.

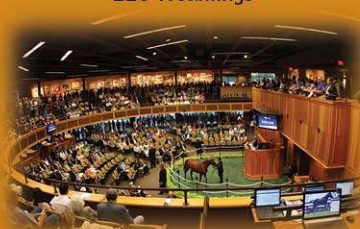

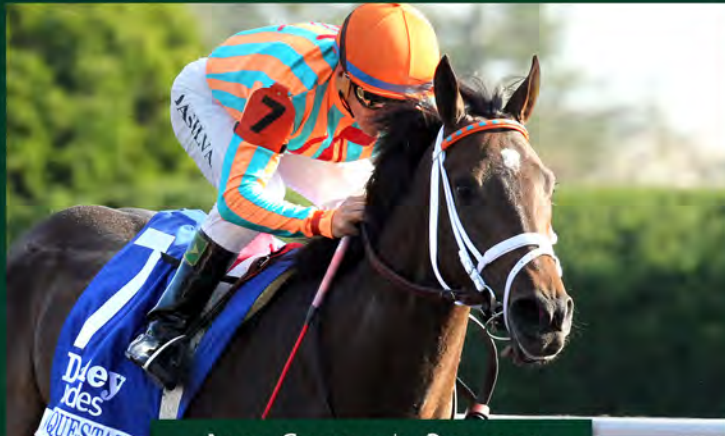

A talented field of 13 sophomore turfers will line up for today's GI Jamaica H. at Belmont Park. **Admiral Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) is slightly favored on the morning line at 7-2. the GII American Turf S. at Churchill May 3, GIII Arlington Classic S. May 25 and GIII American Derby July 13. The stretch-runner is coupled with likely rabbit **Get in Line** (Divine Park), a well-beaten fifth after setting the pace in the off-the-turf GIII Hall of Fame S.

win in the GII Virginia Derby July 13. He returns to grass after finishing sixth, beaten six lengths, in the GI Travers S. Aug. 24. "We were confident he'd run well in the Travers, and it doesn't surprise me he ran his best number in that race," trainer Ken McPeck said. "If the race had set up a little better for him, he might have finished better. We could have run in the Secretariat at Arlington or stayed in New York for the Travers, and we felt like he deserved a chance to run on the dirt."

Up With the Birds (Stormy Atlantic) invades from Canada. Second in the Queen's Plate S. July 7, the Sam-Son Farms' homebred enters off a decisive score in Woodbine's Breeders' S. Aug. 18. **Stormy Len** (Harlan's Holiday) could be an interesting wildcard here. The dark bay has run well in defeat in his last three attempts, including a good second in the Secretariat, as well as a close third versus older horses in Woodbine's GI Northern Dancer Turf S. Sept. 15. "I've always felt he was going to make a better 4-year-old than a 3-year-old," trainer David Donk offered. "I'm really happy with the progress he's made since early summer."

HOW 'SWEET' IT IS

Treadway Racing Stable's unbeaten **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense), a jaw-dropping come-from-behind winner of her first two attempts in the slop, including the GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga Sept. 1, headlines Saturday's GI Frizette S. at Belmont. Trained by Leah Gyarmati, Sweet Reason made up an 18-length deficit to graduate impressively in an off-the-turfer upstate Aug. 9. The one-mile Frizette is a Breeders' Cup Challenge "Win and You're In" race in the Juvenile Fillies division. "She's training really well," Gyarmati said of Sweet Reason, who fired a best-of-16 four-furlong bullet in :47 4/5 Oct. 1. "She has been training over a fast track. Obviously, you don't know what she'll do in the afternoon. I hope she does the same. I feel really good about it." Gyarmati continued, "I love her running style. I love a horse who sits back like that. It's so much easier on them, and you're not at the mercy of what everyone else is doing. She is so laid back; nothing bothers this filly." Repole Stable's **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat), a runaway debut winner on a fast track at the Spa July 19, was a distant second behind Sweet Reason in the Spinaway. "She's the kind that has a good mindset and you can do whatever you want with," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We felt like there was a lot of speed in the Spinaway, so we opted to let her settle. If we need her to be on the lead, she's that type. Sweet Reason has been very impressive. I think the question is, is she as good on a fast track? It looks like we're going to get a chance to find out." Darley Stable's **Divided Attention** (A.P. Indy), a half-sister to champion Folklore (Tiznow), may have a conditioning edge over her rivals exiting a maiden win over track and trip at second asking Sept. 12. "It's a tough spot, but she is bred to get the mile," trainer Kiara McLaughlin said. "She got the mile last time, so we're happy to try a Grade I. There aren't a lot of other options. She ran well when she broke her maiden, so, hopefully, she fits. We'll see how we do."

Strong Mandate (Tiznow), a dazzling winner of the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Sept. 2, meets a pair of promising ☆ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ☆ in today's GI Champagne S. at Belmont, a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" event. The Robert Baker and William Mack colorbearer, produced by millionaire Clear Mandate (Deputy Minister), has come a long way since finishing a well-beaten fifth in his Saratoga unveiling July 22. The bay cruised to a 4 1/2-length maiden win with the addition of blinkers Aug. 17, then romped by 9 3/4 lengths over **Casiguapo** (Sightseeing) in the mud going seven furlongs last time. "The first one, we lead them over there, let them break, let them go around--even looking at him, you can see he's not a 5 1/2-furlong horse," Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "When he broke his maiden, we put him in a situation that was more adaptable to him, and he responded. We had blinkers on him, which we knew we were going to do, and made our usual adjustments. He didn't disappoint us there, and he certainly even moved forward off that when he ran in the Hopeful. You don't see big horses like this accelerate like he did in the Hopeful, and so easily." Tabor, Magnier and Smith's **Havana** (Dunkirk) earned a 102 Beyer Speed Figure--highest of any juvenile on the year--when going wire-to-wire in his 5 1/2-furlong debut at the Spa Aug. 23. The runner-up that day Kendall's Boy (Sky Mesa) came back to graduate impressively at Churchill Downs Sept. 13 and starts in today's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland. "In his training, I've always felt like he finishes his works well and he gallops out strongly," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "He's not one of these horses who seems desperate for the wire in any of his works or in his race, so there's only one way to find out for sure, and we like what we've seen." Lanes End Racing and Dell Ridge Farm's **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy) was also very impressive at first asking, earning the Rising Star moniker. Trained by Hall of Famer Shug McGaughey, he rallied from no fewer than 22 lengths back and came flying in the stretch while riding the rails to a 4 1/2-length decision in the slop Aug. 31. Misconnect (Unbridled's Song) and Purple Sky (Pulpit), second and third that day, came back to graduate next out. "It's a tall order going from a maiden to a Grade I, but he's been doing very well," McGaughey said. "He's training well, everything is good, and we're excited about running him. We'll see what happens."

A field of 14 juvenile colts and geldings is set to face the starter for today's GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland, a "Win and You're In" test for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Not since 2006, when Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) parlayed a useful third over this Polytrack into a blowout victory across I-64 at Churchill, has the Futurity produced a winner of the Juvenile. The Breeders' Futurity was won by Boston Harbor (Capote) and Favorite Trick (Phone Trick) in 1996 and 1997, respectively, before tacking on a win on Championship Day. Windy Hill Farm's **Smarty's Echo** (Smarty Jones) will have to overcome the 13 hole if he is to pull what would certainly be an upset here, but he made a successful transition to synthetic racing last time, taking a one-mile Arlington maiden with a strong speed figure. Prior to that, he outran his odds when third to **School On a Hill** (Student Council) in a one-mile grass test in Chicago Aug. 22, and worked a bullet half-mile in :45 4/5 last Sunday. **Conquest Titan** (Birdstone) was hammered into 4-5 for a hot Churchill maiden June 30, but dropped back after showing some early speed to split the field in fourth. While the winner that day, Candy Dandy (Candy Ride {Arg}), disappointed as the even-money choice in the GII Saratoga Special S. Aug. 11, Conquest Titan became the third next-out winner to emerge when posting a 5 1/4-length success in the Aug. 24 Swynford S. at Woodbine. **General Jack** (Giant's Causeway) has been outstanding in two starts on turf for his trainer and co-owner Mike Maker. A debut third behind Tiger Bourbon (Big Brown) and ahead of subsequent GII With Anticipation S. hero Bashart (War Front) sprinting at Belmont July 12, he graduated in style in the Shakopee Juvenile S. going a two-turn 7 1/2 furlongs Aug. 3.

The bay defeated Incognito (Bernardini) to break his maiden Feb. 17, then posted a solid 3 1/2-length victory over Battier (Tale of the Cat) in the Private Terms S. at Laurel Mar. 9. The homebred was most recently a decent fourth behind Verrazano (More Than Ready) in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 6, and it must be viewed as highly positive that trainer Bill Mott takes in this apparently ambitious spot. Mr Palmer has trained brilliantly for his return at Churchill Downs. **Power Broker** (Pulpit) seems to have turned the corner in the second half of 2013 and is arguably the class of this bunch. A Churchill allowance winner May 13 after failing to make the Derby Trail, he led from flagfall to finish to defeat **Micromanage** (Medaglia d'Oro) in the Easy Goer S. on the Belmont S. undercard June 8. The chestnut exits a distant runner-up effort to Verrazano in the GI Haskell Invitational S. July 31. Trainer Bob Baffert took the 2009 and 2010 renewals with Micromanage (Candy Ride {Arg}) and Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike). **Uncaptured** (Lion Heart) has been slightly disappointing this season, with just one victory from six outings in the restricted Prince of Wales S. at Fort Erie July 30. He is coming off a third to Edge of Reality (Lawyer Ron) in the GIII Smarty Jones S. at Parx Sept. 2. **Holy Lute** (Midnight Lute) is something of a wild card here for the Jim Cassidy barn. Despite being at a serious experience disadvantage, the gray defeated Fury Kapcori (Tiznow) and Tiz a Minister (Ministers Wild Cat) in Del Mar's El Cajon S. Aug. 30. The Bob Baffert trainee captured a narrow victory over **Seaneen Girl** (Spring At Last) in the GII Black Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico May 17. She won the GIII Iowa Oaks at this distance next time out at Prairie Meadows June 29 and returned to take a respectable second behind Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) when last seen in Saratoga's GI Alabama S. Aug. 17. Following that runner-up finish in the Black Eyed Susan, Naveed Chowhan's Seaneen Girl came up empty when sixth in the GII Appalachian at Arlington Park July 20. The former claimer redeemed herself next time out with a six-length victory in the GIII Monmouth Oaks Aug. 10 and was a tired seventh last time in the GI Cotillion S. at Parx Sept. 21. Both of the Bernard Flint trained filly's wins this year came at this distance and her career-high Beyer Speed Figure of 94 matches that of Fiftyshadesofhay. GI Hollywood Starlet S. heroine **Pure Fun** (Pure Prize) seeks her first win of 2013 as the 3-1 second choice on the morning-line for Magdalena racing and trainer Ken McPeck. The neatly bred bay got reasonably far back off a pedestrian pace set by Ethnic Dance (Tribal Rule) and closed well to be second, beaten 1 1/4 lengths. **Dorsett** (Artie Schiller) finished even faster, with a final furlong in a wicked :10.65, though that was only good for a sixth. Prior to that start, the bay proved easily best in the Mystic Lake Derby at Canterbury Aug. 3 and he, like Infinite Magic, will need some help on the front end.

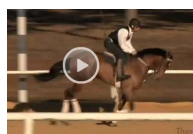

She was no match for She's Offlee Good in the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie Sept. 7, finishing fourth, but can be a factor here at bettable odds.

CUP FAVORITES LOCK HORNS IN TURNBULL

The road to Flemington's Spring Carnival continues Down Under this weekend, and the next stop for the current top three G1 Melbourne Cup favorites is today's G1 Turnbull S. at the flagship Victoria racecourse.

Puissance de Lune (Ire) (Shamardal) lived up to his billing as the early favorite with a smart victory in Caulfield's G2 P.B. Lawrence S. to kick off his campaign. Nailed on the wire by Foreteller (GB) next out in the G1 Makybe Diva S. over this course Sept. 7, Puissance de Lune finished second in a loaded G1 Underwood S. two weeks later after chasing a slow pace while wide near the back of the pack. His rail draw here should ensure him a shorter trip around this time. Last year's G1 Melbourne Cup runner-up **Fiorente (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), off 172 days after that sparkling effort, took a few tries to get warmed up this year, but he found the winner's circle last out in Moonee Valley's G2 Dato'tan S. going 1600 meters Sept. 14.

The Gai Waterhouse-trained import should enjoy the added distance here as he looks for his first victory at the highest level Down Under. After dabbling at the handicap level for more than a year, the 4-year-old **Hawkspur (NZ)** (Purrealist {Aus}) blossomed last season, collecting a pair of Group 3s before notching his first top-level victory when taking the G1 Queensland Derby at Eagle Farm June 8. The gelding collected Randwick's G2 Chelmsford S. second out Sept. 7, and came with an unlucky late charge to finish fourth in the G1 George Main S. Sept. 21.

Off a half-step slowly and steadied off the heels of Battlefield Angel soon after the break, My Conquestadory was the last to make the clubhouse turn after an opening quarter in :23.25 and was settled one from the tail as they turned down the backstretch. The field bunched up as the pace slackened a bit, and Eurico Rosa da Silva was forced to tap on the brakes for two or three strides right at the half-mile marker with absolutely nowhere to go. Still in a jackpot midway on the turn, she began threading her way between rivals and had advanced all the way up into fifth while never being asked nearing the short stretch.

Battlefield Angel led off the turn, but My Conquestadory was steered out to the four path turning for home, raced straight past Battlefield Angel at the eighth pole and was ridden out to score impressively. Rosalind, exiting a third in the GII Pocahontas S. Sept. 7, rallied for second ahead of Battlefield Angel in third. "She didn't break sharp, but she was very, very relaxed," da Silva explained. "I was worried in the middle of the turn because there were so many fillies in front of me, but every time I need her, she was just galloping. I was waiting for a hole, and every time it opened a little bit, I put her in. In the stretch when we had a free run, she just ran so easy."

Three-for-four over synthetic tracks coming into this "Win and You're In" test for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, **Sum of the Parts** won a non-two-lifetime allowance in the spring of 2012 and made a successful return to this venue to wire the field in this event 12 months ago to the day. A sneaky good fourth behind fellow sophomore **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg) in the Sprint Nov. 3, the dark bay resumed with a dismal last-of-seven effort in the Col. Power S. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 16, then led into the stretch before fading to fifth in a stakes-quality allowance on the Churchill main track May 1. He was last seen finishing a tired fifth behind **Go Blue** or **Go Home** in the Karl Boyes Memorial S. at Presque Isle June 10 and was let go at better than double his morning line in this title defense.

Exceptionally sharp from the gate, **Sum of the Parts** led within a matter of strides while taking only token pressure from longshot **Jasizzle** (Jazil) with **Go Blue** or **Go Home** not far away. The Tom Amoss trainee remained clear into the turn and into the lane, repulsed a challenge from **Go Blue** or **Go Home** and held sway late as Canadian raider **Laugh Track** lunged late to grab second. "I made a grave error with him last spring: I brought him back too quick and tried to do too much with him before I ran him, and it cost me," trainer Tom Amoss admitted. "When you make those kinds of mistakes, you're going to have to sit and wait, which is what we did and he came back really good this spring. I told the group I was with, 'This the most athletic horse I've trained. He's the quickest horse I've ever trained out of the gate.' He really showed that today. All the credit goes to the horse." Amoss said he'd discuss it with his owners, but that his vote was to press on for a return trip to California for the Sprint Nov. 2. Favored **Gentlemen's Bet** (Half Ours) was beaten for speed, launched a middle move and settled for fourth. "He really struggled--I mean a lot," jockey Mike Smith stated. "I finally got him running a little bit but he just really didn't like it, pulled up just really blowing."

SAEZ OFFICIALLY DECLARED INNOCENT

The New York Gaming Commission declared yesterday that Luis Saez was not carrying a buzzer or any other device during his winning ride on Will Take Charge (Unbridled's Song) in this year's GI Travers S.

Eric Guillot, trainer of Travers' runner-up Moreno (Ghostzapper), filed a complaint against Saez alleging that Saez was carrying a buzzer, which he used to stimulate Will Take Charge in the final stages to beat Moreno to the wire by a nose. Guillot stated that his brother saw Saez place the device under his mount's saddle pad during the gallop out while watching the NBC footage of the race.

In Guillot's official statement he said, “After suffering biggest defeat in our career, my brother Chip, who was here cooking Cajun food, had recorded races on NBC line for family. Once he got home and watched replay on NBC on big plasma TV, he said it was obvious the kid had trouble celebrating cuss of black device in right hand switching too left hand and tucking under left shoulder under saddle pad! We feel this has crossed every integrity line of horse racing and would like this investigated an resolved! (sic)”

The N.Y. Gaming Commission launched a thorough investigation, which included searching Saez's locker and the track itself for evidence of a device, analyzing several videos and photographs, and interviewing Saez, as well as, other jockeys near him at the finish.

The official report stated their conclusion that, “The Commission's investigation concluded that Mr. Saez was not carrying any sort of electrical device and that Mr. Guillot's allegation was wholly unsubstantiated. This conclusion was reached unanimously by the three Stewards and the staff of the Commission.”

“This has been a terrible time for my family and for my professional life,” Saez said in a statement. “I was confident all along that my name would be cleared as I had done nothing wrong.”

Stonestreet Stables' **Teen Pauline** (Tapit) will seek her first black-type win on the turf Oct. 14 in Belmont's Pebbles S.

She was fourth in her first two starts for Todd Pletcher on the dirt before he switched her to the turf. She won her grass debut in a Saratoga allowance Aug. 11 and was second next out to Midnight Watch (Stormy Atlantic) in the Riskaverse S. on the sod there Aug. 30.

"We were just a little frustrated with the results we were getting on the dirt," said Pletcher. "We felt like her action indicated to us it might be worth giving her a shot on the turf. We breezed her on the turf and we liked what we saw, and there we went."

Boisterous Attempts Third Straight Knickerbocker...

Boisterous (Distorted Humor) looks to become the first three-time winner of the GIII Knickerbocker S. for owner Phipps Stable in Elmont Oct. 12. The Shug McGaughey trainee has captured six of his 10 starts over the lawn at Belmont, including the last two editions of the Knickerbocker. He was most recently scratched from last Saturday's GI Turf Classic at Belmont. Other likely runners include **Grand Arch** (Arch), **London Lane** (Langfuhr), **Mr. Commons** (Artie Schiller), **Tetradrachm** (Badge of Silver), and **Za Approval** (Ghostzapper).



RACING INDUSTRY PLAYING CATCH-UP, TECHNOLOGICALLY SPEAKING

The rapid development of communication technologies coupled with competition from other sports and entertainment options threaten to leave horse racing in the dust unless the industry creates innovation with new investments, cautioned several key speakers at the Sixth Racing & Betting Business forum in Paris Oct. 4.

Philippe Germond, chief executive of France's PMU betting operation—one of the event sponsors along with the European Pari-Mutuel Association and the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities—said the rise of sports betting in many parts of the world continues to drain customers from racing. Other speakers noted that racing often does not keep pace with other sports in marketing and presentation through media.

"Due to the economic environment, most of us are facing a decline in horse race betting. The only way to react is through innovation and investment," Germond warned the approximately 150 attendees from 27 nations in a message that was similar to the one he delivered at this event in 2012.

Rian du Plessis, group chief executive of Phumelela Gaming and Leisure in South Africa, concurred with strong words.

"For us to be around in 10 years' time, we have to innovate, diversify, re-invigorate [fans] and find new customers," du Plessis said.

Much of the forum was devoted to industry executives and consultants from Facebook, Twitter and online gaming operations providing their views of how best to accomplish those overarching goals.

Drew Sheinman, Breeders' Cup Ltd. chief marketing officer, delivered the breaking news that Breeders' Cup

is joining with NBC Sports to offer a major new online game that will award a \$1-million prize to the fan who can correctly predict the top 10 finishers of this year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Dubbed the 'Million Dollar Finish,' the game will be heavily marketed.

"It's a very simple concept to reach a broader audience and get fans excited about horse racing," Sheinman said. "NBC will be

promoting this once we announce it. We're really excited about this because I think it's going to capture the imagination of casual fans.

"It's going to be exciting, it's going to be compelling, it's going to be of great interest to the casual fan," he continued. "Certainly core fans can be involved as well. There's going to be a lot of handicapping around the chance to win \$1 million, but [attracting new and casual fans is] really the primary objective."

Sheinman, previously involved with marketing of diverse sporting and entertainment interests from Coca-Cola to the New York Mets, said he was recruited to his Breeders' Cup position to be a "change agent" and previously had no background in horse racing. Looking forward to the upcoming 30th anniversary of the Breeders' Cup, he said the organization has "very aggressive plans for world expansion of our brand."

When asked after his presentation to elaborate on that initiative, he said "the plans still are very much in the early stages of thinking, not execution," but added that "in a very authentic way, the Breeders' Cup has a leadership position" in the global sport by virtue of the races it conducts and with which it is affiliated around the world "without any marketing efforts." **Cont. p21**

A large part of the forum was devoted to social media and networking strategies and new technologies for wagering. John Hartig, *Daily Racing Form* chief executive officer, said most of his energies since taking the helm about four years ago have been focused on a "cultural shift" to transform the publication from a newspaper to a digital business. Today, he said he ties bonus compensation for editorial staffers to "audience growth" primarily through social media.

Form reporters have been encouraged to use Twitter to relay information at live events

with the goal of stimulating wagering through the *Form's* advance deposit system, and the *Form* continues to develop and promote handicapping competitions with the same goal, Hartig said.

"I don't have any analytics showing social media drive wagering, but it is a big part of our business plan," he stated.

Julien Codorniou, director of gaming platform partnerships for Facebook in the European, Middle Eastern and African markets, declared that Facebook "is the largest gaming platform in the world" with 260 million people playing games through Facebook every month.

"The Facebook news feed is made for betting stories," he said, adding that wagering is becoming a "priority" for the social medium's ongoing growth.

"And we believe we can help you fix this industry's biggest problem," Codorniou said, identifying that challenge for horse racing as "discovery and engagement" of new and casual fans.

As mobile telephone usage skyrockets, Facebook is a primary beneficiary. He noted that 23% of consumers' time on mobile phones is devoted to Facebook usage, with the average user opening Facebook 14 times a day on their mobile phone; more Facebook users now utilize their phones than they do standard Internet browsers.

Benjamin Ampen, Twitter's London-based manager of new markets in Europe, pitched that medium as the best way to maximize the chances of news or promotions going viral around the globe. The immediacy of Twitter "will enable you to put the right content in front of the right people," he said.

Globally, people exposed to tweets about betting are much more likely not only to visit betting websites but also to open a betting account and deposit funds for wagering, Ampen said.

The Irish-based bookmakers Paddy Power utilize both social media and a sharp-edged advertising program to reach punters in unique ways, reported Dan Thomson, head of retail for the organization in the United Kingdom. Paddy Power has grown by about 40 betting shops a year in the UK over the last four years to a total of 232 retail outlets.

"We see ourselves very much as a challenger brand with a unique personality, irreverence, mischief and fun," Thomson said, describing Paddy Power's recent stunt campaign billed as "right behind gay footballers," which was developed to gain attention following a poll showing that no major soccer players identified themselves as gay. The campaign generated 72,000 tweets in one week and featured popular giveaways of rainbow-colored athletic shoe laces.

In addition to generating attention in such creative ways, Paddy Power also offers unique betting opportunities, such as a current promotion giving enhanced show prices for the mounts of National Hunt jockey Tony McCoy. These types of promotions are expensive, yet typically tend to generate more overall revenues, Thomson said, while at the same time building up the Paddy Power brand.

New technology also was emphasized at the forum, with Paul Lee, Deloitte's head of global research for technology, media and telecommunications, noting that many sports have upgraded television coverage to ultra high definition, making them "more compelling to viewers."

"I don't think, being from the outside, that horse racing has kept up," Lee observed.

Riko Luiking, chief executive of the German Tote, said racing organizations have been busy improving wagering technologies including betting applications, with mobile apps now generating higher average wagering and more wagering overall than web betting.

Visionary concepts including Google glass, which would allow a racing fan to obtain past performance information about horses while they circle the paddock as well as providing immediate photographic capabilities, might be the way of the future, although Luiking opined that an augmented reality application is perhaps more realistic. With such an application, a fan could point his or her device at horse's saddle towel and immediately receive that runner's past performance and other details, making racing "much more fun for young people."

Nate Simon, president of Louisville-based United Tote, related how his company has developed its mobile wagering application and how a primary benefit is reduced costs to racetracks, which no longer have to keep as many betting terminals or associated technicians in place.

Simon also suggested that horse racing should follow the example of ultimate fighting by developing reality television shows focused on the sport and its participants to generate interest worldwide.

Germond revealed that the PMU, which is one of the world's biggest operators of betting on racing, has what he called ambitious plans to move into the future that include:

- More acquisition and review of customer habits as programs are developed to attract new bettors both old and young and those who are educated fans along with those who are new to the sport;
- The development of stronger customer relationships through social media and networking, including loyalty programs targeting the up to 90% of customers who are from the retail betting market rather than sophisticated punters;
- Integration of technologies in the retail other sides of the market, and;
- The evolution of the organization's workforce.

In closing the forum, du Plessis said that the scope and depth of the initiatives racing must take to move forward seem "daunting." However, "it sounds to me like many of the participants here have made quite a lot of progress," he concluded.

WHO WILL WIN THE PRIX DE L'ARC DE TRIOMPHE? *by Mark Cramer*

In races like the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, I normally look for the best odds among many contenders and play the value. But for this 2013 renewal, in what has been deemed by many experts as one of the two or three best ever Arc fields, it is frightening that I see one horse above the rest.

Certainly the value factor enters into my decision. We know that either **Orfevre (Jpn)** (Stay Gold {Jpn})--who should have won last year's Arc but for a moment of distraction--or the undefeated **Treve (Fr)** (Motivator {GB}), with her already legendary turn of foot in the G1 French Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille, will be the very legitimate favorites. Treve looked impeccable in her last workout and you can see a well of confidence beaming in the eyes of trainer Criquelette Head-Maarek.

The German champion **Novellist (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), five-length winner of the prestigious G1 The King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., could follow in the steps of Danedream to win the Arc for Germany. Lots of public relations have been flowing in the European press on Novellist, who has "only" won nine of 11 lifetime. Trainer Andreas Wohler tells us not to worry about his charge's unimpressive win at Baden Baden, which he assures us was only a prep.

For the moment, Orfevre is hovering between 2-1 and 5-2 in the books, with Treve at nearly 9-2. Late money has come in on Novellist, who is now averaging 5-1 and might even overtake Treve as second favorite. If you watch Treve's French Oaks, 5-1 might be an overlay. Treve is in the red silks, coming up the rail in the stretch ([click here for video](#)).

Treve was purchased following the Oaks win by Qatari interests, and winning rider Thierry Jarnet lost the mount to Dettori, who won the Vermeille with Treve. However, following an injury to Dettori, the popular Jarnet regained the mount. No doubt he has a score to settle.

Then there is the Aidan O'Brien supplemented entry **Leading Light (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), with five wins in six career races, and averaging 14-1 in the books. Doncaster G1 St. Leger winners usually disappoint in the Arc, but it's hard to punch holes in Leading Light's career.

Andre Fabre is the Arc record holder, with seven victories. He has five entries this Sunday. His stretchout horse, **Intello (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}), should handle the distance if you judge from his dad's progeny, but there are serious question marks with mainly sprint breeding on the dam side. (Fabre won the BC Classic with Arcangues in 1993, at record odds of 133-1. He cannot be dismissed.)

Fabre's **Flintshire (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) threw in a clunker, attributed to the soft going, in the G1 Prix Niel prep race. Fabre's also got the filly **Pirika (Ire)** (Monsun {Ger}), third to Orfevre in the G1 Prix Foy prep race, but this trainer is zero for 15 with fillies in the Arc. Fabre's **Ocavango (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) was defeated by two others in the Prix Niel after getting a perfect trip over his preferred soft going. You can get as much as 50-1 on Fabre's fifth and least known, but most intriguing entry, **Penglai Pavillon** (Monsun {Ger}). The limits of this late-developing front runner are unknown. With four wins in seven career starts, Penglai Pavillon is two-for-two on heavy going. They may have to seed the clouds to get enough moisture in the ground to make him happy.

In the end, it looks as if Orfevre and Treve have beaten the best horses, and in the most dazzling way. None of the seven horses defeated by Novellist at Ascot came back to win in their next race. But even if you judge it as a below-par field, you can't blame Novellist for a five-length win.

But I am looking to another horse. Both the history of the Arc and a pedigree factor point to the other Japanese entry: **Kizuna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). First of all, contrary to Orfevre, Kizuna is a 3-year-old, and the sophomores have ruled the Arc over the past 20 years, winning 75% of the time even though they've made up less than 50% of the total entrants. French analyst Gerard de Chevigny attributes this dominance to the increasing precocity thanks to currents of American pedigree, which have made French horses flourish at a younger age.

Kizuna does not lack American pedigree. His sire, Deep Impact, was a son of none other than Sunday Silence. Deep Impact was one of four Japanese horses to finish in the money in the Arc, although he was later DQ'd because of a positive drug test that did not involve any wrongdoing. On Sunday, Yutaka Take, who rode Deep Impact that day, has a chance to redeem himself on Deep Impact's son.

Another of Deep Impact's sons, Gentildonna, nosed out none other than Orfevre in the Japan Cup. If one son of Deep Impact can defeat Orfevre, then why not another?

I ask myself, is it an objective or a poetic analysis that points me to Kizuna?

Let me try at more empirical evidence. Of all prep races, the Prix Niel, won this year by Kizuna, has produced by far the most winners of the Arc, while the Prix Foy, won by Orfevre, has produced none in recent years. In the Niel three weeks ago, when Kizuna ran nearly four seconds faster than Orfevre's Prix Foy, they were both carrying the same weight. For the Arc, Kizuna will get a 3 1/2 kilo weight advantage.

On the other hand, horses trying the Arc for a second time have most often declined in performance. None of them, however, had all the qualities of an Orfevre. Treve, Orfevre and Kizuna all turned in impressive workouts in the Chantilly forest, but Kizuna's raised the most eyebrows because of its unorthodox methodology during the 6 1/2-furlong work. [Here's](#) a glimpse.

Yutaka Take made the horse really work, something unheard of on the Old Continent in morning gallops.

"I worked a la Japanese," said trainer Shozo Sasaki, "or above all, a la Sasaki. I prefer to work him normally, as if I were in Japan. Then, even if he gets beaten, I will not be able to say that it was because of the lack of work. I don't want any regrets."

In fact, Kizuna was not supposed to win the Prix Niel prep. He went into that race following a 3 1/2-month layoff and he had never raced on soft ground.

Of course, given the history of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, it is entirely possible that a horse I have not even mentioned in this article could win.

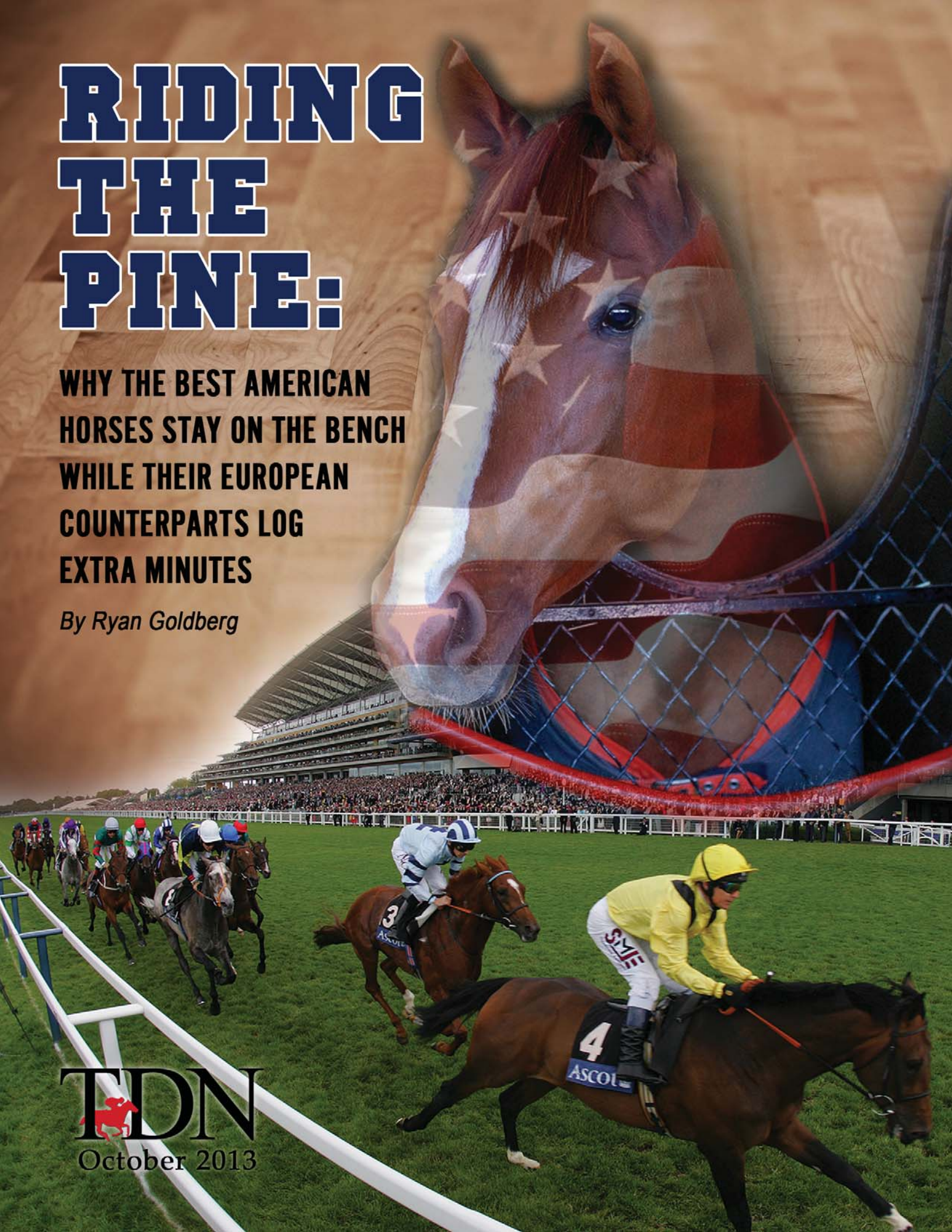

On Aug. 11, the Prix Jacques le Marois at sun-drenched Deauville Racecourse on the Norman coast was billed as the race of the season in Europe. Six Group 1 winners graced its marquee, and as so often happens in Europe, trainers went out of their way to figure out who had the best – in this case the best miler, regardless of gender or age.

It did not disappoint. Moonlight Cloud, the diminutive five-year-old mare with a truckload of courage,

squeezed between horses a furlong and a half out and, with an acceleration that took your breath away, burst clear for what looked certain to be a comfortable victory. But Olympic Glory left the pack and with a bold charge nearly caught Moonlight Cloud. She held on by a short head.

The time went up, and the Deauville habitués rejoiced. Moonlight Cloud had lowered a course record held by Goldikova, another French heroine and her former stablemate in trainer Freddy Head's barn. It was unanimously voiced that here

set a course record for six and a half furlongs. Two course records in a single week.

The horses in her wake, too, were not strangers to such short layoffs. The filly Elusive Kate, who finished seventh, had won Deauville's Group 1 Prix Rothschild two weeks earlier. This was her third race in 30 days. Aidan O'Brien trainee Declaration of War, a respectable fourth, had finished third in the Sussex Stakes at Goodwood 11 days earlier. Godolphin's Dawn Approach, a disappointing fifth as the 2-1 favorite, also came from the Sussex, losing there by a narrow margin.

The Jacques le Marois was his fifth consecutive Group 1 race in 99 days. Both horses had flown from Ireland to England for the Sussex, back to Ireland and later to France.

Declaration of War showed no wear and tear. Ten days later, O'Brien saddled him in the Group 1 Juddmonte International at York. With an added two and a half furlongs in front of him, he triumphed over the best middle-distance horses in Britain – his third race in three weeks. Only soft ground kept him from headlining the Group 1 Irish Champion Stakes at Leopardstown 17 days after that.

This state of affairs seems unthinkable in American racing. Two races in a week? An extended campaign with a start every two and a half weeks? The best American horses routinely race every six weeks, save for the Triple Crown; Game on Dude, for instance, has raced five times since early February, his average layoff 49 days, a figure set to rise once he

enters the Breeders' Cup Classic after winning the Pacific Classic more than two months ago. What explains this major divergence?

George Strawbridge Jr., who bred and owns Moonlight Cloud, races in Europe and America and keenly observes both landscapes. He immediately points to Lasix as the main offender. "The recovery time would not allow it," he says. "Whenever you dehydrate a horse to that extent, it is not possible.

Look at the human athletes. They don't dehydrate themselves before the race."

Lasix is one explanation to that question, and there are several. The particular nature of horse racing makes anecdote and logic a clear frontrunner to the normally scant scientific evidence. So for this article, the opinions of some of the most successful trainers in Europe were solicited, plus American trainers and owners. What follows is what they had to say.

According to statistics compiled by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities, horses in Europe average about the same number of starts, six per year, as horses domestically.

It is well known that American horses used to race almost twice as frequently before the introduction of Lasix in the 1970s. In group or graded races, however, horses in Europe appear to compete with greater frequency than their American counterparts, even though the latter – or perhaps because of this – encounter year-round racing, as compared to the spring-to-fall European calendar.

This season, trainers Aidan O'Brien and Jim Bolger have become models for running their hardier horses time and again. With Dawn Approach

a regular participant in the best mile races, Bolger’s three-year-old homebred Trading Leather has kept longer distances; he began his season on May 16 at York and raced three times in 23 days. Then he won the Irish Derby at the Curragh on June 29, received a four-week rest, and has finished second or third against older horses in three Group 1 races since then.

By comparison, reigning American champion Wise Dan made his seasonal bow a month before Trading Leather, in the Maker’s Mile at Keeneland, and has raced

four times – on turf, like his European peers – since then.

“When you handle a horse that can run like this the temptation is to run him every couple of weeks,” Morton Fink, Wise Dan’s owner, said after the six-year-old gelding’s record-setting Woodbine Mile performance on Sept. 15. “He is a money machine. It will never happen as long as Charlie [Lopresti, his trainer] and I have anything to do with him.”

Fink however signaled that Wise Dan would likely race in the Shadwell Mile at Keeneland three weeks later, his same setup for the Breeders’ Cup Mile as last year.

Declaration of War, a four-year-old son of War Front bred in Kentucky by Joe Allen, raced seven times in 129 days, all but one of them Group 1 races. O’Brien said he does not make any hard and fast rules on the spacing of races; with some horses, the next day he would hardly know they’d had a race, while others can take longer to recover. In other words, the individual horse tells you.

“As I’ve said many times before Declaration of War has an unbelievable constitution, so I don’t think it’s entirely fair on the American-trained horses to use him as a basis for comparison,” O’Brien says. “But I’d have to say that many of the best horses we’ve had here, like Giant’s Causeway, Galileo, Rock of Gibraltar were able to show up for the big races time after time.”

GRADE 1 EXACTA

LAUGHING (IRE) and TANNERY (IRE)

Both formerly trained in Ireland, they gave owner Richard Santulli a 1-2 in last Saturday's Grade 1 Flower Bowl Invitational Stakes at Belmont Park. This was **LAUGHING's** fourth straight Graded Stakes success while **TANNERY** also scored in a Grade 2 since moving stateside.

The season, too, is shorter. O’Brien pointed out that there are no Group 1 races in Britain and Ireland until the month of May. The fixture list, as they call it, shoe-horns the big races from April to mid-fall, and they often lay close to one another, as in the 13 days separating the Prix de l’Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp and Champions Day at Ascot.

John Gosden, one of Europe’s most successful trainers, cites the fixture

list as the principal reason for these short layoffs. “Obviously a lot of the horses are pretty tough here,” he says. “But it’s a strange thing. It’s slightly like saying the foot is being fitted to the shoe.” He continues: “The program is becoming increasingly crowded with major festival races. And we have the highest quality of turf racing here....People want to compete.”

The aforementioned Elusive Kate and The Fugue,

two of Gosden’s stars, are proper examples. The Fugue, a four-year-old daughter of Dansili, easily defeated her own sex in the Group 1 Yorkshire Oaks on Aug. 22, as part of the British Champion Series, and so returned quickly against the boys in the Irish Champion Stakes on Sept. 7, where she outstayed Al Kazeem, a winner of three Group 1 races this season who was making his sixth start since late April.

Gosden suggested however that short layoffs generally demand a longer one thereafter. Moonlight Cloud, for instance, will return to the races about seven weeks after her course-record double, in the Prix de la Foret at Longchamp on Arc day.

But for the Cambridge graduate, who trained in California for a decade until returning to England in 1989, Gosden remembers a much harder horse then. "In the old condition books everything used to turn around every two weeks," he says. "If you were going for the Santa Anita Handicap, you'd have the San Antonio two weeks ahead of the Big Cap. But two to three weeks was very much the norm."

The San Antonio now sits four weeks before the Big Cap. Game on Dude won both this year.

But, Gosden adds, "We would say that you run your Triple Crown in a little bit of a hurry. It's all over in five weeks, isn't it?"

Indeed, the Triple Crown reveals a lesson that when their hands are forced, American trainers – and their exceptional charges – are occasionally still up to the challenge. The old-school barns of Shug McGaughey and D. Wayne Lukas, for example, made every dance this year with Orb, Oxbow and Will Take Charge. Will Take Charge then ran second in the Jim Dandy and won the Travers and Pennsylvania Derby, starts separated by four weeks; the Breeders' Cup Classic will be his 10th start of the year. The best older horses are seen far less.

So much purse money is concentrated in races for two and three-year-olds, which offers disincentives for hanging around, but this still defies belief since the older horses should better handle the rigors of frequent racing. Take Cross Traffic, the highly regarded Whitney winner. The four-year-old son of Unbridled's Song didn't make the races until this year, so you might assume he had a lot in the tank. His average layoff has been almost 50 days. Following a heartbreaking loss in the Met Mile on May 27 – his fourth race since breaking his maiden on Jan. 24 – he returned 68 days later in the Whitney. His win that day offered a glimpse of a breakout star.

It looked like he'd wheel back in the Woodward, but trainer Todd Pletcher decided to pass the race and wait for the Jockey Club Gold Cup.

He finished second-to-last after stumbling badly at the start.

Pletcher said at the time:

"Getting a race at a mile and a quarter five weeks out

puts us in a better position for the Classic than a mile-and-an-eighth race nine weeks out." The takeaway being that Cross Traffic either couldn't handle both races, or his trainer saw no reason to try.

The Fugue winning the Group 1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks at York on August 22. She returned for a win against the boys two weeks later in the Sept. 7 Irish Champion S.

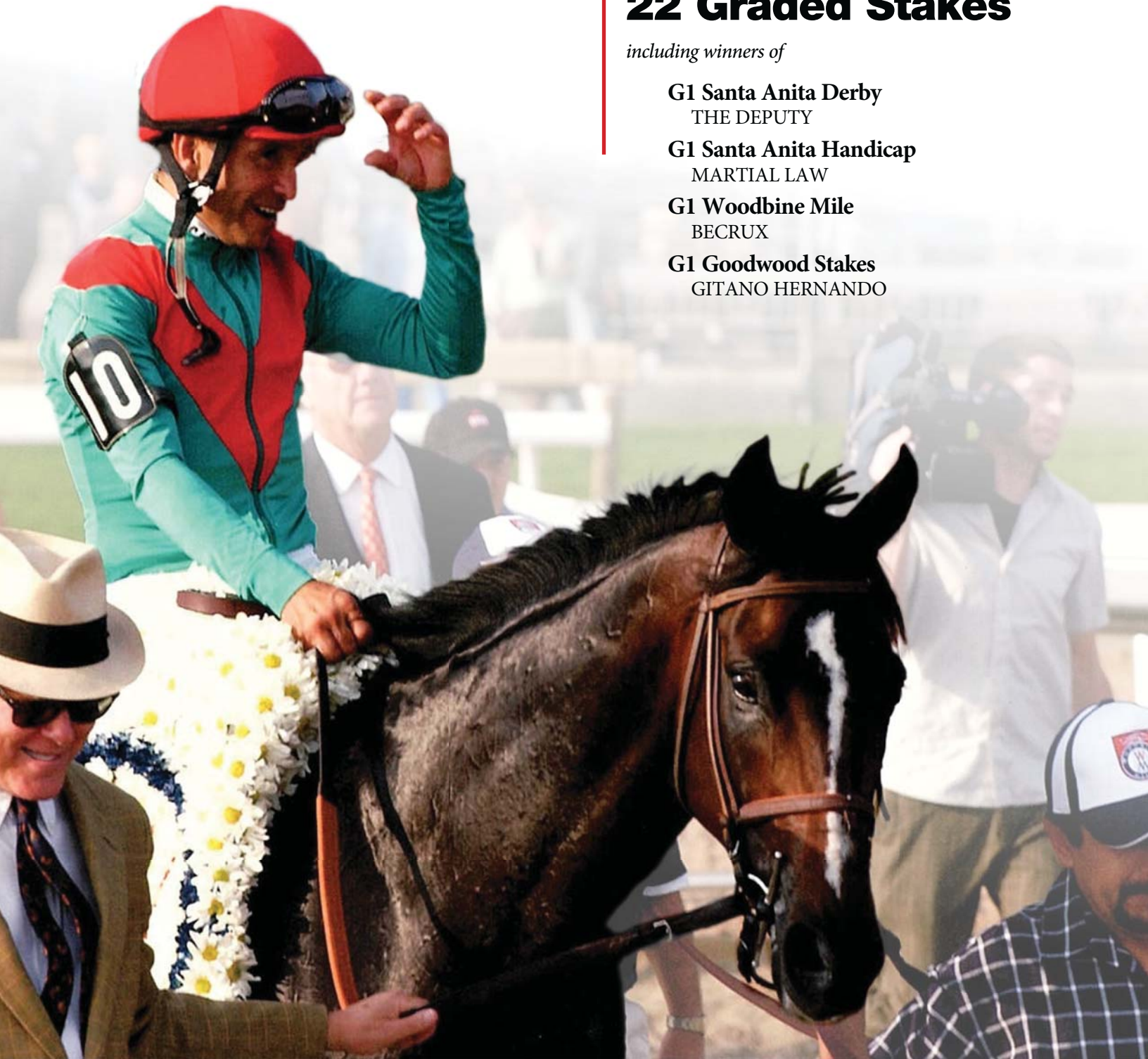

There are other similar examples. Last year, Wise Dan went five for six, from late April to early November, with an average of 41 days between starts. He had no trouble winning the Shadwell Mile 20 days after the Woodbine Mile, and the Breeders' Cup Mile 28 days after the Shadwell. Havre de Grace, in 2011, made seven trips to post in seven-and-a-half months. During her 2010 championship season, Zenyatta raced six times, for an average layoff of 48

days. Blame raced five times that year. In 2009, Rachel Alexandra never tasted defeat in eight starts, and of course won the Preakness two weeks after the Kentucky Oaks.

There is a thinking among American trainers that the opportunities of year-round racing and purse largess across the country allow them to pick their spots. There is also a desire among the new generation of trainers to keep their win percentages high. Prize money in Britain is famously low, which

might generate more starts, but then again the largest stables there, like Godolphin or Coolmore, are driven by prestige, not dollars.

“There are so many opportunities around that you can afford to wait to race and train in between,” says trainer Shug McGaughey. “We have 12 months of top racing in different places and different jurisdictions. We can miss a good race here or there.”

The Breeders' Cup, McGaughey added, dictates

the late summer and fall schedule; wanting to keep the powder dry, no trainer will race close to that weekend. Moreover, he pointed out Belmont recently carded a \$125,000 overnight stakes whereas Churchill had a similar \$150,000 stakes the following week. A trainer can enter and scratch if he chooses. "We're not forced to run back on short rest," he says.

You'd expect sprinters would take less time to recover, and to some degree that seems true. For example, Trinniberg raced eight times last year during his championship season, about once a month between March and September, when he was afforded a six-week layoff before the Breeders' Cup. Probably the only trainer to embrace short layoffs in recent years was Rick Dutrow, like when Willy Beamin upset last year's King's Bishop Stakes three days after winning the state-bred Albany Stakes; such

is the incongruity of that decision in American racing circles that it was met with shock.

Back in England, trainer Mark Johnston attempts to answer this question by delineating between American and European training methods. He is often singled out for running his horses back quickly.

"I think nothing of it at all frankly," he says. "But at the same time, I wouldn't be breezing - what you call galloping - at home. I'm a big believer in letting them do their fast work on the racecourse. It fascinates me that there are trainers - particularly when you look to the United States - but there are trainers at home,

who won't run their horses back quickly and there are owners who won't let us run them back in a fortnight."

Two-time Group 2 winner Universal, who Johnston trains for Abdullah al Mansoori, was one of the hard knockers of the European season. He raced four times in under two months this winter in Dubai, including two races in a week, and then came to England, where he earned his way out of handicaps and into group races. His layoffs looked like this: six days, 14, 14. Following a short break, this pattern was mostly repeated with a pair of Group 2 fixtures and the Group 1 King George VI at Ascot.

Sadly, the tough horse broke his pastern in early September, an injury which occurred during his longest period away from the races. He would have tried for Group 1 glory thrice more, in Ireland, Canada, and Japan.

Besides the style of training, there is the setting.

Most horses in Europe are graced with

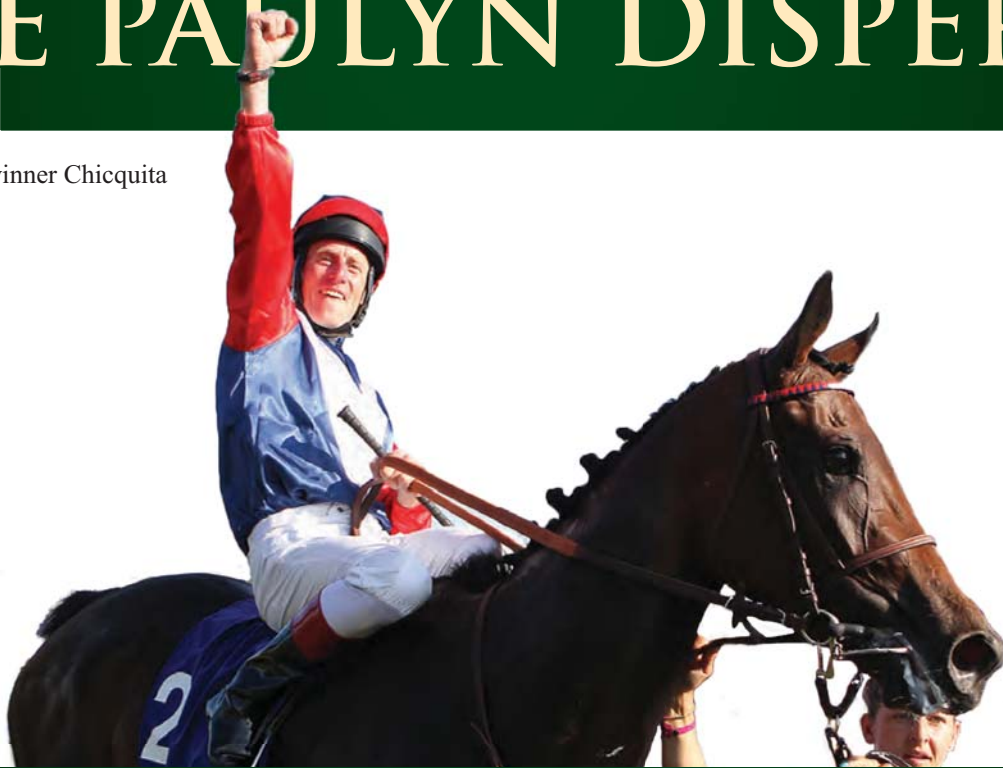

opportunities to train over stamina-building terrain in pastoral settings.

“It’s much easier to get a horse fit, hard, hard fit, under European training conditions than it is training on a flat dirt oval,” says English trainer Jeremy Nosedo. “My experience in America, training on American ovals in cities and such, it is without question a much harder environment to train a racehorse than a European environment.”

There is a refrain that

says a dirt horse must run through dirt and a turf horse runs over turf, and Nosedo returns time and again to the contrasting tempo and style between races on these surfaces.

“The demands on a horse in a dirt race are acutely more than in a turf race,” he says. “Our turf races would not bear resemblance to a dirt race where a horse is decelerating in the last quarter mile and running slower than the first quarter. In our races, the quickest

furlongs are normally the penultimate two furlongs – maybe not the last furlong, but the second-last and third-last furlongs are normally the quickest part of the race. So our horses aren’t being taken to that same level of... exhaustion at the end of a race, like American horses.”

This observation begs the question if American grass horses are racing with greater frequency than their dirt counterparts. This seems only intermittently the case. Wise Dan had an easy summer

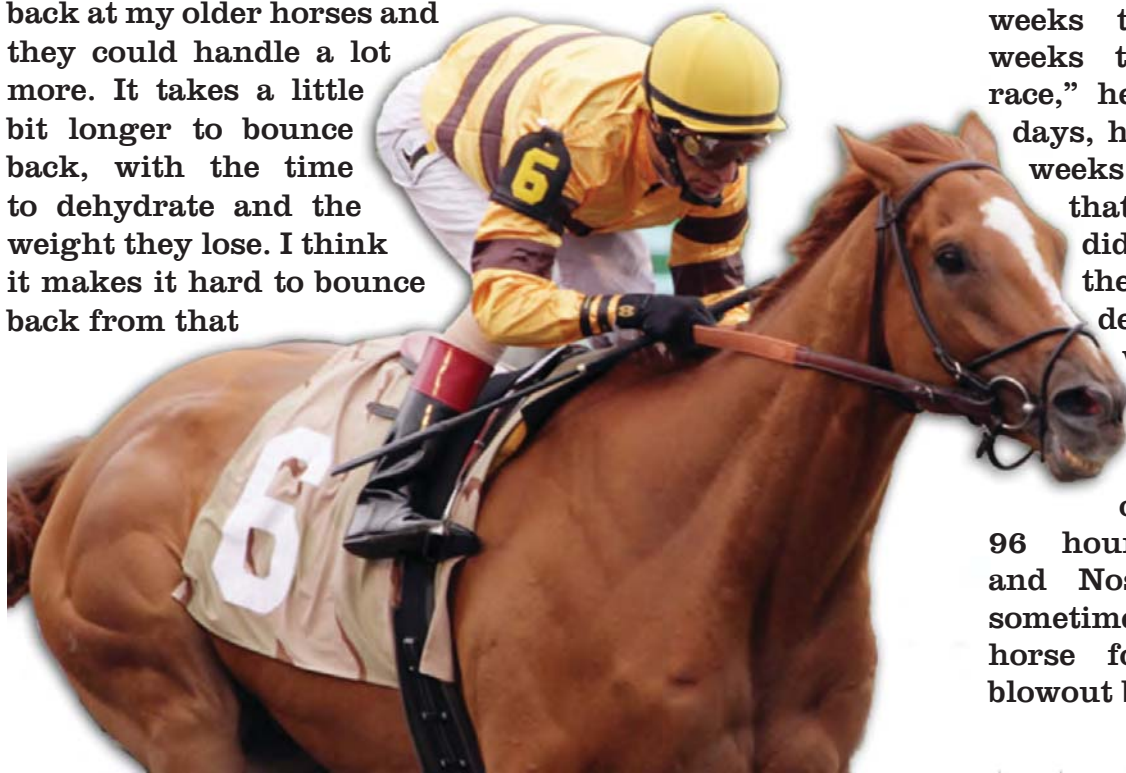
before a likely three-race fall campaign. Big Blue Kitten won the United Nations 27 days after the Monmouth Stakes; otherwise, his layoffs averaged almost 44 days. Last year, Little Mike ably traveled from east to west and in between, for a start every 46 days in a seven-race campaign from January to November. The Phipps bay Point of Entry won the 2012 Elkhorn Stakes at Keeneland 15 days after snagging an allowance there; after two and a half months off, he won three Grade 1 turf routes in New York before losing to Little Mike in the Breeders' Cup turf. His average layoff between those races was 37 days. This is at the mercy of the NYRA stakes calendar.

When this subject was first broached with McGaughey, he immediately suggested Lasix. "I've looked back at my older horses and they could handle a lot more. It takes a little bit longer to bounce back, with the time to dehydrate and the weight they lose. I think it makes it hard to bounce back from that

on short rest....I think some of the horses today, you have to space them out a little bit." This squares with physiological sense. Owner Bill Casner, who took his horses off the popular diuretic, observed extreme weight loss in some of his horses.

"We weigh them the morning after they've hydrated all night long, and horses will lose anywhere from 35 pounds on up," he told the Thoroughbred Daily News last year. "A bucket of water weighs 40 pounds and these horses will usually drink a couple of buckets of water from the time they're cooled out until the next morning. They've consumed 80 pounds of water, yet they've still lost 35 pounds on up."

"Trainers in this day and age understand that it takes anywhere from four weeks to seven or eight weeks to recover from a race," he added. "In earlier days, horses ran every two weeks. That was ideal and that was because they didn't have to deal with the metabolic stress of dehydration combined with the stress of a race."

Horses in England are allowed to train on Lasix up to 96 hours before a race, and Nosedá said he will sometimes give Lasix to a horse for a three-eighths blowout beforehand.

"I never found a problem with a horse performing below par 96 hours later," he says. "So without knowing, I'm not sure if Lasix is a good enough reason."

There is certainly a desire in the States, for commercial breeding purposes, to remain spotless on the track. Breeders everywhere define what happens on the track. In Germany, all the big races are run at 12 furlongs, so breeders produce sturdy horses. Australian trainers seem to delight in racing their horses on short rest – making Europe look mild by comparison – and the best ones often contest a 10-furlong Group 1 on Saturday before tackling the two-mile Melbourne Cup on Tuesday. Hence Australian horses are bred for durability. It's no secret that the majority of American breeders prioritize speed and precocity over durability and resilience.

Gosden says you have to assume the breed is getting softer, and American horses more delicate and fragile, if they require a large amount of recovery time between major races.

"We can talk about medication as long as you like, but medication obviously allows a less durable individual to race," he says. "But I think the other major factor is that, from 1980 onwards, people started breeding for the sales and not so much breeding to race. And that meant that if a filly was related to something decent, even if she was unsound, had a wind

problem, anything of that nature, she could still be bred because she had the pedigree and then the foal would go to the sales."

"It is very noticeable to me as a trainer," he continues, "and you can discuss this with any trainer in Europe, but the breed has got a lot softer and weaker. And that is largely due to the fact that people bred a lot to the sales, and the old traditional breeders would've culled that stock. They wouldn't have dreamt of breeding to it. Nor would they dream of breeding to a stallion that required various medications."

He believes that European horses are not as tough as he remembers from 30 years ago, perhaps in part because of imported American stock. Of course, American horses were once heralded the world over for the very thing they now lack. Gosden recalls watching Charlie Whittingham during his time in California.

"Whittingham would train them long. They would be doing three-eighths, two half-miles, two five-eighths, two three-quarters, two seven-eighths, two mile works. Then, if they'd done that and done it to his liking – and we're talking proper works now, on the clock, miles in 37 and change, 38 – once they'd done that they could run."

Gosden says nobody trains that way any more because the horses cannot handle it. So the horses changed, not the trainers?

"There was a lot of that adapting to the horse and also there was a lot of..." he sighed, "I don't know, there was a lot of protecting the horse more. For the old purist trainers, if the horse could not stand its preparation, then it doesn't really deserve the right to run. They didn't try to fiddle them along to the races, they trained them."

Barry Irwin, the globe-trotting president of Team Valor International, concurred with Gosden.

“I can’t begin to tell you how much fitter the horses over there are,” he says. “They’re training on a forgiving surface, so they can go all out on turf. Here we’re training around soundness.” Horses racing on dirt “give everything they’ve got and they can’t run back in a week.”

That said, Irwin says he sees a follow-the-herd mentality and lack of confidence among trainers here. “There are so few guys in this country who put a foundation in a horse,” he says, singling out Bill

Mott as one of the few.

In his early years on the track, Irwin says, a horse would jog a minimum of 30 days and gallop 60 days before a recorded breeze, often up to 45 and 90 days. “Now, a guy jogs two weeks and gallops a month before he starts breezing,” he says. “Sometimes less.”

What’s left is a horse that cannot race with any regularity even if the trainer wants to. Given all the explanations, the effects seem clear-cut: the rarity of seeing the best American horses on

the track makes it harder to market the sport, harder to sell the stars. Rarer still to find the American Moonlight Cloud.

As a result, George Strawbridge finds himself breeding and racing more often in Europe. He likes to see his horses race.

Pat Parker, who passed away in February at the age of 88, bequeathed more than \$630,000 to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. While she always loved horses, Parker was especially fond of broodmares and became concerned for their future once they were no longer able to bear foals.

"We were moved to tears when we were notified of Pat's bequest," said Diana Pikulski, TRF Vice-President, Secretary and Director of External Affairs. "We created Pat's Paddocks in her honor to bring awareness to the cause in which she so believed, and inspire others to give in Pat Parker's honor. Pat's Paddocks will be happy places for the many mares with the TRF."

Even after she was widowed and had retired to St. Croix, Parker returned to the United States twice each year: one trip to visit the mares and new foals at Niall and Stephanie Brennan's stable in Ocala, FL and one visit to Saratoga Race Course for a day at the races. For 18 years, Parker was a partner in all but one of 11 foals out of the mare, Meg's Habit (Crafty Prospector). Meg's Habit was owned by Parker's friend, Meg Carrothers, and out of these foals, 10 made it to the races and nine were winners that totaled more than \$1.5 million in earnings.

Parker's bequest to the TRF is nearly half of what her horses earned. Pat's Paddocks is the ideal means to bring awareness to an often overlooked need. **Cont. p3**

"You have to remember that a broodmare might be 12, 13 or 14 when she is no longer having foals, and probably hasn't been ridden for years," said Stephanie Brennan. "It's not like they can suddenly become show horses or event horses. A lot of farms might keep them around as companion horses, but there are a lot of them out there and there are a lot of them that keep turning up in places where they shouldn't."

Another whose first yearlings are on the ground this year is Rip Van Winkle (Ire), who was responsible for the leading colt when Tinnakill House's lot [506](#) was knocked down to Alberto Panetta for €68,000. His dam is a half-sister to the dual group-winning and Group 1-placed sprinter Baron's Pit (GB) (Night Shift).
