



RECORD-SETTING OPENING TO TATTS

A day of fiercely strong trading at the Tattersalls' October Sale culminated in a new European yearling record of 3.6-million guineas (US\$6,079,311) when a colt by Galileo (Ire) sold to the Coolmore team which stands the world's preeminent stallion.

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The transaction contributed to the highest-grossing session at Park Paddocks since the start of October Book 1 in 2003. A 79% clearance rate was achieved from the 124

yearlings sold for 26,319,000gns, a rise in aggregate of 14%. The sector which benefited from the greatest increase, of 28%, was the average of 212,250gns, while the median of 117,500gns was up by 7%.

Just as last week at Goffs, John Magnier held his nerve against a determined rival to ensure that the Galileo colt, a full-brother to G1 Investec Oaks runner-up Secret Gesture (GB), was another expensive addition to the team of bluebloods at Ballydoyle. His price is the highest for a yearling anywhere in the world this year, superceding the A\$5 million (US\$4,717,853) paid for Jimmy (Aus), the Redoute's Choice (Aus) half-brother to Black Caviar (Aus) at the Inglis Easter Sale.

Qatar Racing bought into Secret Gesture in training earlier this year after her victory in the Lingfield Oaks Trial and now race her in partnership with her breeder Newsells Park Stud. The operation's advisor David Redvers stunned the packed sales ring at Tattersalls Tuesday with an opening bid of one million guineas for [lot 144](#) and for a while it looked as if his aggressive tactics might work. But as auctioneer Philip Myerscough's gavel hovered, Magnier jumped into the fray, prompting a lively contest between the two. Redvers bowed out as the colt's price reached 2.6-million guineas, but Sheikh Fahad Al Thani himself took up the running by countering Magnier's riposte and helping the colt's price tag rise by another million guineas.

"Obviously he's a very nice horse--Galileo speaks for himself and it's a cross that is just magical," M. V. Magnier of the son of the Danehill mare Shastye (Ire), a half-sister to the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sagamix (Fr) and fellow Group 1 winner Sagacity (Fr). "You never think you have to go that far to get a horse, but he ticked all the right boxes for the lads and all the right people were on him." The same cross is responsible for undefeated champion Frankel (GB).

Magnier earlier signed for the first son of Galileo through the Tattersalls ring ([lot 11](#)) at 525,000gns. The colt, out of G1 Beverly D. S. winner Mauralakana (Fr) (Muhtathir (GB)), was consigned by Highclere Stud.

DAVID GREATHOUSE PASSES AWAY

David Greathouse passed away Tuesday in Kentucky. Greathouse, who had been battling liver cancer, was 63. He is survived by his wife, Buffy, two children (son Deuce and daughter Emma), three brothers and two sisters. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.

"David was multifaceted, in the best sense of that word," said longtime friend and business associate Kerry Cauthen. "He really was an exceptional horseman and he was also an exceptional horse-businessman. He knew every part of the industry, from the breeding to the raising side to the actual dollars-and-cents side of the business."

Greathouse, along with brothers John, Allen and Edward, ran Glencrest Farm, which was established in 1950 by his father, John W. Greathouse. Influential in the breeding sector through the last six decades, Glencrest developed a number of significant stallions, including Clever Trick and Wavering Monarch. The operation was also responsible for producing a pair of Classic winners: Pike Place Dancer (Seattle Dancer), winner of the 1996 GI Kentucky Oaks and Venetian Way (Royal Coinage), victorious in the 1960 GI Kentucky Derby. **Cont. p3**

"He really got excited about horse racing," recalled Catuthen. "He lived it and he was raised in it. He knew how to deal with the tough part of it, but he also knew when you were having fun, you'd better enjoy it."

Alone or in partnership, Glencrest bred 44 black-type winners, including Grade I winners Adieu (El Corredor), Dream Empress (Bernstein) and Roamin Rachel (Mining). Glencrest also campaigned several high class racehorses, among them Devil May Care (Malibu Moon), Panty Raid (Include), Honey Ryder (Lasting Approval), in addition to Glencrest homebred Zoftig (Cozzene).

"He was one of the most charming and fun people you could ever meet in the horse business," said Cauthen. "He brought a lot of people to the game and showed them the good sides of what we do and how to enjoy it."

Further expanding Glencrest's sales business in 2002, Greathouse partnered with Cauthen, Dan Kenny and John T.L. Jones Jr. to form Four Star Sales.

"They were the elder statesmen and I was the raw workforce," explained Cauthen. "I've learned a tremendous amount from David by osmosis, just from being around him and watching him work and sell through Four Star Gencrest's stock. He pinhooked when that was profitable, he bought mares and put them in foal and resold them when that was profitable. He bought fillies off the racetrack as well. He raced horses and stood stallions. You name it, he did it at some point in time. I don't think there is anything that he didn't do."

Panty Raid is listed among the biggest sales' successes for Four Star when bringing \$2.5 million at Fasig-Tipton November sale in 2008, in addition to Honey Ryder, who realized \$1.75 million at the same venue the following year.

"[Panty Raid and Honey Ryder] were Glencrest-directed investments and that is something that they were very good at," said Cauthen of the Greathouse family. "That was what it was all about, trying to present our stock in the best light possible on a very professional level."

In addition to his duties at Glencrest and Four Star Sales, Greathouse was a member of Keeneland Association, Thoroughbred Club of America and Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders/Kentucky Thoroughbred Association.

"He was making plans for next year and the year after that," said Cauthen. "He was walking down to watch his 2-year-olds every morning. He was in good spirits and felt good, so this is very unexpected."

Cauthen added, "He was very optimistic about his future and he was moving forward. He wasn't going to let this slow him down. He was going to live his life to the end and he did."

Remembering David Greathouse...

David Greathouse left not a moment of his life unlived.

To everyone who knew him, he was Fatty. And, whether he was holding court outside his Four Star barn, clutching a fistful of tickets at the Thoroughbred Club, hanging out on the rail at the Oklahoma training track, getting the bets right on the first tee, exalting the merits of next year's foal crop or choosing just the right red wine, he always brought a distinct "Fattiness" to the proceedings.

Plenty of Guineas for Dollar...

"Shocked," was Newsells Park Stud's Manager Julian Dollar's reply when asked for his reaction to the sale of the operation's Galileo colt out of Shastye for a European record of 3.6-million guineas. "In my heart of hearts, I hoped he'd make seven figures. None of us [at Newsells Park] have ever sold a yearling for seven figures. I hoped he was special enough. But that was incredible--it was all a bit of a blur."

Dollar said that the full-brother to Oaks runner-up Secret Gesture (GB) had looked a star from day one.

"He's always been gorgeous and utterly professional with a lovely temperament. When you get all the ingredients right, you can get lucky," he commented.

Sheikh Fahad Al Thani was underbidder on the colt and Dollar said that he was grateful for the Sheikh's help in reaching the staggering price.

"In some ways, I would have loved him to get him, but he's going to a brilliant trainer [Aidan O'Brien]," Dollar said.

Confirming that Shastye has a filly foal by Shamardal and is in foal to Street Cry (Ire), Dollar added, "But I'm sure I will be sending her back to Galileo this year!"

Dollar paid tribute to Newsells Park Stud's founder Klaus Jacobs, who bought Shastye--a daughter of Danehill out of the Sagace (Fr) mare Sageneca--for 625,000gns at Tattersalls in 2005 with the help of John Warren. Sageneca is the dam of 1998 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Sagamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}).

"The foundations of this lie with Klaus Jacobs--this would have meant an awful lot to him."

Earlier in the day, Newsells Park sold [lot 51](#), a Dalakhani (Ire) filly out of Neartica (Fr) for 450,000gns to Tony Nerses. A Fastnet Rock (Aus) colt, [lot 126](#), also went for 150,000gns to Tina Rau Bloodstock.

"I hoped the sale would start with enough of a bang for them to do justice to themselves," said Dollar.

Half an hour after Shastye's colt went through the sales ring, another son of Galileo from Newsells Park ([lot 159](#)) made 400,000gns. This one is out of So Squally (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), a full-sister to the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf and G1 Coronation Cup winner Shirocco (Ger), and was sold to American owner Marc Keller.

David Redvers did get his hands on a Newsells Park offering on behalf of Sheikh Fahad. Yet another Galileo, this time a half-sister to G1 1000 Guineas heroine Speciosa (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) ([lot 164](#)), for which he signed the ticket at 375,000gns.

Not surprisingly, Newsells Park Stud led all vendors at Tattersalls with a tally that will be hard to beat. The stud sold seven yearlings for 5,113,000gns and has another nine to sell over the next two days.

G1 WOODWARD STAKES WINNER



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Strength in Depth from the Off...

There was barely time to draw breath as Book 1 of the October Sale got underway on Tuesday at midday. The first lot into the ring ([lot 1](#)), a full-brother to the dual GI Canadian International winner Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), sparked an early skirmish between Grant Pritchard-Gordon, Dermot Weld and Ross Doyle, with the latter coming out on top at 600,000gns. The docket was signed under the name of Sheikh Joaan Al Thani's Al Shaqab Racing and it was a name which would be featured many times throughout the first session of Tattersalls' flagship sale.

Buying through Peter and Ross Doyle Bloodstock and Nicolas de Watrigant's Mandore International, Al Shaqab Racing accounted for 12 yearlings sold on Tuesday, including four of the top 10 lots, for a total of 4,410,000gns.

The colt from Lady O'Reilly's Castlemartin Stud held sway through more than 100 lots, but was joined at the top of the table by another Irish-consigned yearling, this one an Invincible Spirit (Ire) filly ([lot 117](#)) bred by John and Clodagh McStay at Oaklawn Stud in Co. Kildare. The first foal of Romie's Kastett (Ger) (Halling), a winning sister to Jeff Smith's top-class campaigner Norse Dancer (Ire), the March-foaled filly was pursued by both Sheikh Mohammed and Sheikh Joaan, with John Ferguson folding as Sheikh Joaan's agent De Watrigant placed the winning bid.

"I'm absolutely delighted," Clodagh McStay said as the filly left the ring. "It's the mare's first foal and she's the most expensive yearling we've ever sold."

De Watrigant also went to 550,000gns for [lot 32](#), a Camas Park Stud-consigned Sea the Stars (Ire) half-brother to dual-hemisphere winner Grand Ducal (Ire) out of the Shirley Heights (GB) mare Mood Swings (Ire).

"He's a very good-looking, well-balanced colt from a good farm," De Watrigant said. "I don't know where he'll go next year yet."

Fresh from his success in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe with Treve (Fr) on Sunday, Sheikh Joaan arrived at Tattersalls on Tuesday, as did the man who would have ridden Treve on Sunday, if not for a broken ankle sustained in a race fall the previous week. News that the star filly would stay in training has obviously heartened Frankie Dettori who, despite, hopping round the sales ground on crutches, was all smiles as he chatted in the sun with his new boss.

Two for Teo...

Frankie Dettori's former boss Sheikh Mohammed may have been denied on the 600,000gns Invincible Spirit filly, but he made his presence felt nonetheless with the purchase of 19 yearlings through the day to come out on top of the buyers' list after outlaying 4,510,000gns.

It took just a matter of minutes for the ruler of Dubai to spend 820,000gns on a pair of Teofilo (Ire) colts catalogued as [lot 52](#) and [lot 53](#). The former, a half-sister to Night Lagoon (Ger) (Lagunas), the German champion 2-year-old filly and subsequently dam of G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner Novellist (Ire) (Monsun {Ger}), sold for 320,000gns through Rathbarry Stud, having made 140,000gns when offered as a foal at the December Sale.

Next into the ring was the colt out of Neverletmego (Ire), a Green Desert half-sister to the stakes-winning trio of Halfway to Heaven (Ire), Tickled Pink (Ire) and Theann (GB). Their dam is Trevor Stewart's outstanding sprinter Cassandra Go (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), herself a half-sister to the late Irish National Stud stallion Verglas (Ire). The Ballyhimikin Stud-consigned colt was knocked down for 500,000gns to John Ferguson. "He's out of a Green Desert mare from a lovely pedigree and he deserved to make the price that he did," Ferguson said. "It's obviously a stallion I know well."

Former champion 2-year-old Teofilo, who stands at Darley's Kildangan Stud, has enjoyed great success with his offspring this season, including G1 Irish Derby winner Trading Leather (Ire), G1 Prix Jean Prat winner Havana Gold (GB) and G1 Irish St Leger heroine Voleuse de Coeurs (Ire), who was recently sold from Dermot Weld's stable to continue her racing career in Australia, where her immediate target will be the G1 Melbourne Cup.

Also on the list was Athassel House Stud's New Approach (Ire) colt ([lot 128](#)) out of the Green Desert mare Sandtime (Ire), a 100,000gns foal pinhook who was resold for 440,000gns, and a Sea the Stars colt from Stanley House Stud, sold on behalf of the Hon. Earle Mack, at 360,000gns.

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On the Best-Seller List...

Eleven yearlings made 500,000gns or more during the first day of the October Sale (compared to eight last year), including Glenvale Stud's Galileo filly out of Singing Diva (Ire) (Royal Academy) ([lot 149](#)), who sold for 525,000gns. Grant Pritchard-Gordon of Badgers Bloodstock signed the ticket, but was unable to divulge the name of his client.

A pinhooking triumph for Tony and Roger O'Callaghan's Tally-Ho Stud came in the form of [lot 68](#), a Raven's Pass colt out of the Green Desert mare Palatial (GB), who turned a 75,000gns investment into a handsome profit when selling for 525,000gns.

He was another purchase for Ross Doyle, who said of the February-born colt, "I saw him on the farm a couple of months ago and he's done really well. He's very strong with a great walk and a great attitude. He's been well-pinhooked by Tally-Ho, as usual."

Bred by Cheveley Park Stud, the yearling is a half-brother to G2 Park Hill S. winner Spacious (GB) (Nayef), who was runner-up to Natagora (Fr) in the G1

1000 Guineas.

Hascombe & Valiant Stud's Dansili (GB) colt out of Rebecca Sharp (GB) (Machiavellian) ([lot 104](#)) sold to John Warren for 525,000gns after Warren locked horns with his former employee Ed Sackville. The buyer of 1000 Guineas winner Sky Lantern (Ire) had to give way to his old boss, who signed for the colt on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed Obaid, the breeder of Dubawi (Ire). Like Dubawi's dam Zomaradah (GB) and his black-type-earning half-sisters Emirates Queen (GB), Princess Nada (GB) and Dubai Queen, the Dansili colt will be trained in Newmarket by Luca Cumani.

John Warren Bloodstock was fourth on the purchasers' table, having bought seven yearlings for 1,330,000gns. Four of those were for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's syndicate business and the others for Sheikh Mohammed Obaid.

Warren's son Jake said: "We are always looking for a cross-section of horses to provide our syndicates with as much diversity as possible, and there is no better place than this sale to do that. From Highclere's

perspective, we bought well at Goffs, including a very exciting Acclamation [for €310,000], so we're nearly there. In this market, you have to make the best of it that you can."

He continued: "On the whole, it's been a good day for both sellers and buyers, with bargains on both sides. It was fantastic to see the top lot sold for so much--it's great that there is a market for horses like that. He was a lovely horse and Newsells Park Stud deserves a lot of credit for sending mares to Galileo. Even if you do have the cash, you need to be brave enough to do it--and they are reaping the reward."

Highclere Stud, which is owned and managed by Lady Carolyn Warren, ended day one in second on the consignors' list, selling nine horses for a total of 2,435,000gns with a top price of 525,000gns for Muralakana's Galileo colt.

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Kelly's UK String Expands...

Luca Cumani will also benefit by the addition of a smart Galileo filly to his Bedford Horse Stables. California owner-breeders Jon and Sarah Kelly, buying through Jamie McCalmont, secured a beautiful future broodmare prospect when signing for the daughter of Sassenach (Ire) (Night Shift) ([lot 131](#)) for 450,000gns. She will join eight horses already in training for the couple in Newmarket.

"I race horses in England because I don't like the drugs in American racing," said Jon Kelly. "I don't give my 2-year-olds Lasix--I think we're ruining the stallions with all the drugs." Kelly already has two mares by Galileo at stud. In addition to their own farm, the Kellys board mares with Helen Alexander at Middlebrook Stud and with the Seitz family at Brookdale Farm.

Their new recruit is from a family which has been in the news of late. The yearling's half-sister Fairy Of The Night (Ire) (Danehill), a listed winner who is the dam of Sea the Stars's first stakes winner My Titania (Ire). Like Sea the Stars himself, the Galileo filly was bred by the Tsui family's Sunderland Holding Inc. and offered by Luke Lillingston's Mount Coote Stud. Her full-sister Dress Rehearsal (Ire), a €300,000 purchase back in 2006, won the GIII Orchid S. for Bill Mott and Swettenham Stud.

Stimulating Trade...

Welsh stud Llety Farms scored a notable success when [lot 57](#), a homebred Stimulation (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) colt, sold to Ross Doyle for 110,000gns--the highest price the farm has ever received for a yearling. The strong bay is out of the Fraam (GB) mare Noble Nova (GB), whom Llety Farms' owner David Hodge bought for just 800gns at the Tattersalls December sale in 2009.

"She was a very nice, correct type of mare from the family of the dual Group 1 winner Peeress," said Hodge. "She wasn't looking great at that point, but you should see her now--she's stunning."

Noble Nova's first foal for Llety Farms, New Bidder (GB), by their late stallion Auction House (GB), has won.

Stimulation won the G2 Challenge S. in 2008 when trained by Hughie Morrison. His first yearlings have been well received. From a stud fee of £3,000, they had averaged £11,249 before Noble Nova's son entered the ring. A colt by the Averti (Ire) mare Miss Poppy (GB) made £43,000 at Doncaster Bloodstock Sales' Premier Yearling Sale at the end of August, but the first of his three representatives at Tattersalls this week has far outshone that.

"We're thrilled he is going to Richard Hannon," added Hodge. "This is a third-generation family business and days like this mean a lot. It shows that everybody's got a chance."

"We liked the colt from day one," he continued. "He ticked all the boxes as a foal and has a great walk, attitude and temperament. Stimulation is stamping his stock strongly. Like him they are active, nice horses with a good attitude."

A filly out of the Septieme Ciel mare Catalane, [lot 315](#), is due to sell on Wednesday while a half-brother to Group 3 winner Jimmy Styles (GB) is catalogued for Thursday.

Four of her last five yearlings to sell at public auction made 750,000gns, 265,000gns, 2.5-million guineas and 1.7-million guineas, respectively, with the last being this May-foaled bay's full-sister Nazym (Ire) who topped this sale 12 months ago. Brigid, who is also the dam of the 2007 G1 Fillies' Mile winner Listen (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), is also connected to this year's G1 Irish 2,000 Guineas hero Magician (Ire), another star performer for Galileo.



OPENING DAY

In yesterday's opening session (of three) of Tattersalls' October 1 yearling sale, 124 yearlings changed hands for a total of 26,319,000gns--a 14% rise from last year's opening day, with 11% fewer sold; an average of 212,500gns (+28% from last year); and a median of 117,500gns (+7% from opening day last year). But how exactly did yesterday's session break down, and what can we project from that for the rest of Europe's top yearling sale, which runs through tomorrow?

First we have to acknowledge the arrival of Qatari interests as major players at the yearling sales now, just as they are at the racetrack. Arc-winning owner Sheikh Joaan's Al Shaqab racing was one of three operations to spend over 4-million gns yesterday; they bought 12 horses for a total of 4,410,000gns. John Ferguson, on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, signed for 19 yearlings totaling 4,510,000 gns., and Coolmore's M.V. Magnier signed for two Galileo colts--including the new record 3.6-million gns. (a little over \$6 million) European yearling, a full brother to Secret Gesture consigned by Newsells Park--for a total of 4,125,000 gns.

Combined, the three Tuesday 4-million gns buyers purchased 33 yearlings for a total of 13,045,000 gns--just a hair under half the day's gross. If you add in the purchases by David Redvers for Qatari Sheikh Fahad, and by Sheikh Mohammed's brother, Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell operation, the two Qatari and two Dubai operations plus Coolmore bought 41 yearlings--almost exactly a third of the day's 124 sales--for a total of 15,105,000 gns., which is 57% of yesterday's gross, and an average of 368,415gns (about \$621,000). The other 83 yearlings sold averaged 135,108gns (about \$228,000).

It was notable, of course, that after the 3.6-million gns (about \$6-million) sale-topper, the next two highest prices were tied at 600,000gns (about \$1 million). In fact, a total of 10 yearlings sold for between 500,000 (about \$834,000)--600,000gns (about \$1,012,000), and another 19 brought between 300,000 (about \$506,000)--499,000gns. So a total of 30 yearlings yesterday--nearly one of every four sold--brought final bids of \$500,000 or more.

When projecting what all this means for today and tomorrow, we'll make the assumption that there's not going to be a 3.6-million guinea yearling every day. If we assume that will be the only one in the sale (simply for the purposes of projection), and that the rest of the sale will be more or less like yesterday's (as the catalogue is alphabetical by dam once through the whole three days), our best guess is that the sale will end up with 372 yearlings selling for a total around 72-million guineas, an average of around 193,000gns, and a median (as yesterday's) of 117,500gns. That would be an 11% decline (as was yesterday) in the number sold, but a 5% increase in the sale's gross, and an 18% gain in both average and median from 2012. In dollar terms, we'll project the gross at \$121 million for an average around \$325,000; by comparison, Keeneland Book 1 grossed \$153 million, for an average of \$280,925.

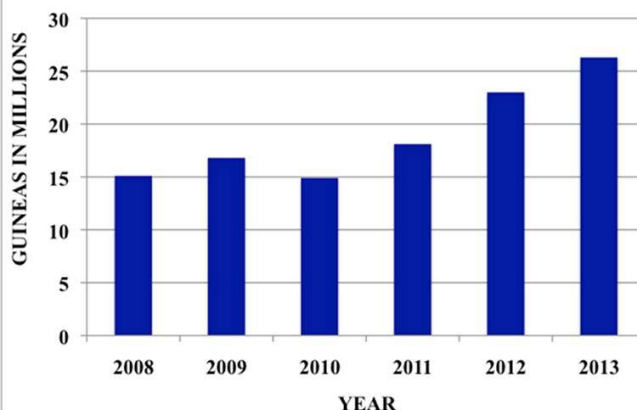

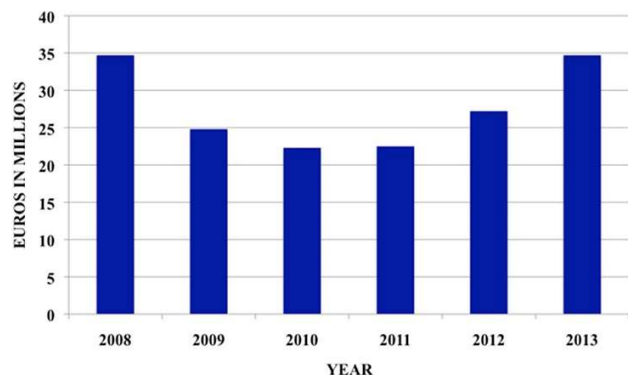

Enjoyed the article (*Dean Towers' Op/Ed Charging to Enter the Track*, click [here](#)) and I'm 100% for anything to promote horse racing. However, our local track did this immediately after opening and lost business from many bettors who said no thanks, and went back to the dog track where they were welcomed with no charge to enter or to park. The irony: they preferred driving 60 miles just to get in free! If you charge \$20-40 to get through the doors, you had better "up the entertainment value" because gamblers are notorious for spending money at the window, but will balk every time about things like paying to get inside. I'm reminded of an acquaintance who would go to Vegas to gamble, but would spend hours, if not days, comparison shopping trying to save \$10 on airline fares! When there's no live meet going on....there is zero entertainment value, so there's only a small window for being able to charge admission. And, I can't see tracks that have casinos, like my favorite, Delta Downs, charging race fans an entrance fee, when they don't charge their slot players. People who ride the bus to Louisiana, do indeed pay \$15/trip and get back \$5 to play with when they get there. Some see this as being a big bargain--it's a bargain because with the cost of gas, you can't drive it for \$10. So, the something-in-return idea works even when the return is smaller. You know, like those "free" \$1,000 tee shirts! Gamblers won't like spending \$100 before they ever get to the window to spend \$1,000. You also have to beware of the \$20 to get in, \$10 to park, \$10 now (here) for programs, \$30+ to eat...some race fans (not bettors) will be comparing you to other sporting events that have priced themselves so high, many people are not able to attend. A fee is perfectly understandable at the major racetracks and major racing events, where you're getting real entertainment value, as well as a wonderful experience for your money...but maybe not the smaller, local tracks...even those with casinos.

Totally true that (young) people are lining up paying big bucks to get into packed night clubs, but keep in mind just what they're paying for inside those doors. Again, you'll have to up the entertainment value at race tracks.

This is just the opinion of someone who loves both horse racing and slots and would like to see EVERY racetrack packed to capacity. There is no sport more beautiful or thrilling than horse racing.

Krone to be Inducted into National Women's Hall of Fame:

Retired jockey Julie Krone will be inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame along with eight other famous American women. The induction will take place during a ceremony to be held in Seneca Falls, N.Y. Oct. 12.

Inductees are selected annually based on their lasting contributions to society through fields such as arts, athletics, business, education, and philanthropy. Over 100 women were nominated this year and the judges narrowed it down to the following: Betty Ford, Ina May Gaskin, Julie Krone, Kate Millett, Nancy Pelosi, Mother Mary Joseph Rogers, Bernice Resnick Sandler, Anna Jacobson Schwartz, and Emma Hart Willard.

The leading female Thoroughbred jockey of all time, Krone was the first woman inducted into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame in 2000. She was also named ESPN's Professional Female Athlete of the Year in 1993.

Krone was the first woman to win the GI Belmont S. in 1993 aboard Colonial Affair, the first to win a Breeders' Cup event in the GI Juvenile Fillies with Halfbridled in 2003, and the first to capture a million dollar event in the 2003 GI Pacific Classic on Candy Ride (Arg). She initially retired in 1999 and became a commentator and analyst for TVG, but in 2002 she returned to the track for a two-year comeback.

"The 2013 Inductees again represent the spirit of Seneca Falls and the groundbreaking events that inspired the nation and the world," said Beverly Ryder, Co-President of the Board of Directors. "We are grateful for the work of all the women we honor this year as their pioneering achievements have opened doors for so many. These great women include those who have pioneered work in economics, treatment of addiction, education, obstetrics, and the political arena. Their efforts impact the lives of both women and men, girls and boys, and provide us with outstanding examples of the importance of perseverance, commitment and the desire for change."

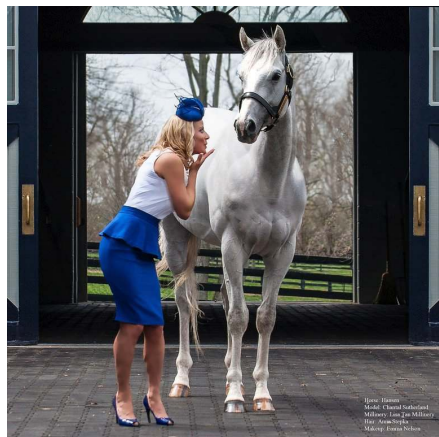

Gerard Butler will face a disciplinary panel hearing of the British Horseracing Authority in November as a result of the high-profile "Sungate" affair. Set to face charges of breaking seven rules of racing by using the joint treatment which contains the anabolic steroid stanozolol, the Newmarket-based trainer has been called to appear between Nov. 18-20. The discovery of the administering of the prohibited substance via the licenced drug took place in February. The maximum penalty could result in a 10-year disqualification from racing.
