to Ascot's new banner afternoon for perhaps his easiest task so far in the G1 QIPCO Champion S. today. In his pomp when annexing the inaugural reinvented race two years ago, the eagle of Chantilly returned to that peak to take the world's greatest off the bridle for a few strides in

2012 and seems to be back to near his best in what has been a masterclass of patience and preparation by trainer Corine Barande-Barbe. A daughter of a pair of psychoanalysts, the conditioner has needed to play some mind games with her increasingly cute veteran stable star this term, but a diversion to a straight track for the Sept. 20 G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffitte triggered an awakening of his potent prowess which was again evidenced in Longchamp's G2 Prix Dollar a fortnight ago. "All year I wanted him to be at the top for the Champion S. and I believe he is," Barande-Barbe told *PA Sport*. "We know he likes Ascot and he has the soft ground, so all the lights are green. He is the favourite for the race, which is normal, but the race is not over until it has been run and you have to give consideration to the opposition."

RECORD-SETTING OCTOBER SALE WRAPS

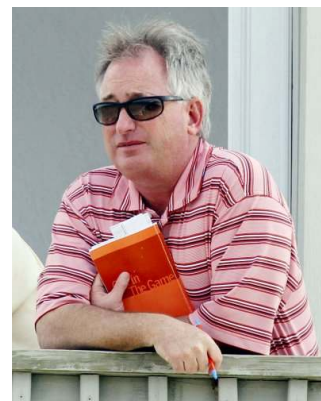

Consistently strong trade throughout Books 1 and 2 at Tattersalls meant there were still plenty of buyers with orders to fill in attendance for the single-session Book 3 auction, which ended with a 38% increase in aggregate at 2,304,300gns. That trickle-down effect was to the benefit of Trickle-down Stud which sold the top lot--a racey colt by Dutch Art (GB) (lot **1673**) at 57,000gns--and finished the session as leading consignor, with 16 sold for 144,500gns. Surprisingly, the clearance rate dropped slightly, but 83% of the 259 lots offered found buyers, at an average price of 10,668gns (+27%) and median of 6,900gns (+15%).

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Godolphin's **Farhh (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) tries this trip again, having come up slightly short against Nathaniel (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) when runner-up in Sandown's G1 Eclipse S. last July and in the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York in August. During a nine-race career punctuated by setbacks, the highly consistent and reliable performer has yet to encounter soft ground, and that could prove a decisive factor as he bids to topple Cirrus des Aigles. Returning from another injury-imposed break since his romp in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. May 18, the Saeed bin Suroor trainee is joined by stable companion and Mar. 9 G1 Al Maktoum Challenge Round 3 winner **Hunter's Light (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}). "[Farhh] is doing well," their conditioner said. "He has run well over this trip three times in Group 1s and is a happy and sound horse at the moment. I think that the cut in the ground will suit him. We will let him take his chance and see what happens. Hunter's Light is a tough horse. He is very good condition, and we wanted to let him take his chance in this race. We are putting a hood and a visor on him to try and make him focus more. This is the right distance for him, and he has won in testing ground before." In a renewal with significant French flavor, Andre Fabre sends across an intriguing contender in Team Valor's **Triple Threat (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}), and trainer Jean-Claude Rouget is represented by Daniel-Yves Treves's **Morandi (Fr)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}).

Sept. 21. He only started to come into himself at this time last year when winning the G3 Prix de Conde at Longchamp and G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud by a combined 19 lengths on testing ground. Further representation of a largely below-par crop of 3-year-olds comes in the form of **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and **Hillstar (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who have yet to meet, but who have both been partnered in their finest hours by Ryan Moore. It is significant that that jockey has opted to partner Ballydoyle's G1 Epsom Derby winner, even if he has looked an out-and-out stayer on his last two starts when second in the Prix Niel and seventh in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe 13 days ago.

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Hillstar also appears to want more distance than this 10 furlongs on the evidence of his win in the G2 King Edward VII S. over 1 1/2 miles at the Royal meeting June 21 and third in the July 27 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., both at this track, so any further easing of the ground can only help.

Commenting on the day's trade, Paul Thorman, who runs Trickledown with his wife Sara, said, "There's still a good market for a nice colt, but at this level it's harder to sell the fillies, especially one which looks like more of a 3-year-old type. But we've brought 17 to this sale and sold 16, which is pleasing. Overall, the October Sale has been remarkable. There's still a very narrow target but when you hit the target, and you have what the market's looking for, there's a vibrant trade."

O'Callaghans Strike...

Another Dutch Art colt featured among the more expensive lots of the day when a trio of O'Callaghan brothers gathered to buy lot [1587](#), the first foal from the winning Refuse To Bend (Ire) mare Straitjacket (GB). David O'Callaghan signed the docket at 50,000gns, and the compact chestnut colt will join the team of Yeomanstown Stud's potential breezers. The stud has already enjoyed success with Dutch Art in the breeze-up sales, having consigned subsequent G2 Lennox S. winner Garswood (GB) last season.

"We're fans of the stallion. We tried to stand Caspar Netscher but that didn't work out," said O'Callaghan, referring to the sub-fertile group winner who is now back in training. "I thought this was the best horse in the sale. He's a fast-looking model and we'll bring him back to the breeze-ups."

The colt was consigned by Keith Harte, who has recently taken up residence at The Woburn Stud and had a busy time over the previous four days of Book 2, selling 15 yearlings for a solid average of 52,267gns. Also heading to the breeze-ups after making 50,000gns is lot [1606](#), a Kyllachy half-brother to the dual listed-winning sprinter Anne Of Kiev (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Their dam Top Flight Queen (GB) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}), a daughter of G1 Yorkshire Oaks runner-up Blessed Event (GB), was a winner herself and has been a consistent broodmare for Deerfield Farm with five winners to her name, two of which have earned black type on the flat.

Not all of the top lots of Book 3 are going breezing, and a battle between trainers William Muir and Noel Quinlan for Usk Valley Stud's Iffraaj colt (lot [1765](#)) ended with Quinlan the victor at 52,000gns. The great grandson of successful Meon Valley matriarch Reprocolor (GB) will race for Maurice Regan of Newton Anner Stud. The team of Quinlan and Regan are currently responsible for the good juvenile Speedfiend (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}), who

was fourth in last weekend's G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket.

"I like Iffraaj, he's had a good year and this colt is from a really good family," said the Irish-born Quinlan, who trains in Newmarket. "I like a horse who stands over a lot of ground but is not too heavy-topped. He was really light on his feet."

Tregoning's Sir Percy Connection...

Marcus Tregoning is perfectly justified in pursuing the offspring of his 2006 Derby winner Sir Percy (GB) and the trainer went to 52,000gns for a colt by the Lanwades Stud sire from the family of top sprinter Overdose (GB). Bred by Sir Percy's owners Anthony and Victoria Pakenham out of the Bertolini mare Bermondsey Girl (GB), the athletic colt was described by Tregoning as "one of the nicest I've seen by the stallion".

He added, "He was a great mover like his sire and just a really nice individual."

Victoria Pakenham, who, with husband Anthony, has given her stallion plenty of support since he retired to stud in 2008, said, "I'm absolutely thrilled he's sold so well. Sir Percy's had a great couple of weeks at the sales--the trainers really like his offspring and he has a great winners-to-runners ratio which is borne out by the stats. I'm so pleased that Marcus will be training this horse. This is the first time we've used The Castlebridge Consignment and they've done a fantastic job with the horses."

The Pakenhams later sold another Sir Percy colt (lot [1677](#)) for 26,000gns to trainer David Elsworth, while McCalmont Bloodstock signed for a sharp-looking colt by the sire out of Stowell Hill Stud's Dominica (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) at 29,000gns.

Another Juddmonte Star in the 'Makin'...

Three-time Grade 1 winner Champs Elysees (GB) (Danehill) has made an eye-catching start to his stud career, with his nine first-crop winners to date including the listed winner Avenue Gabriel (GB). As a brother to Dansili (GB) and Cacique (GB) from a first-rate family, the Juddmonte sire has every right to be popular and his yearling son out of the Clever Trick mare Trick Of Ace (lot [1610](#)) made the day's top ten lots when selling for 44,000gns to Peter Makin. The trainer went home with six yearlings from Book 3, making him the joint-busiest buyer alongside Jono Mills of Rabbah Bloodstock, who has been active all week at Tattersalls. Trick Of Ace, a winner four times in America and half-sister to GII La Prevoyante H. winner Prospectress, is the dam of five winners, including Peter Onslow's homebred Group 3 winner Trick Or Treat (GB) (Lomitas {GB}).

Wise Dan was last seen finishing second in the rained-off GII Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland Oct. 5. The 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero is scheduled to ship to Santa Anita Oct. 29. "I might jog him in the morning on the training track to see how he came out of the work," LoPresti said. "Sunday will be his off day."

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BUSY SANTA ANITA WORKTAB

Several Breeders' Cup contenders breezed Friday morning at Santa Anita, including GI Santa Anita Derby hero **Goldencents** (Into Mischief).

The handsome bay worked five furlongs in :59 under leading rider Rafael Bejarano in preparation of the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile. "I thought he looked great," trainer Doug O'Neill said. "Raffy and the horse looked great together."

O'Neill also sent out GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile hopeful **Bond Holder** (Mineshaft) out for a five-furlong breeze in 1:00.80 Thursday. "He worked great," O'Neill said of the

GI FrontRunner S. winner. "There was a lot left in the tank. It's exciting. He really came out of the FrontRunner in great shape. He'll need to pick it up to win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but he's heading in the right direction." Defending GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner **Trinniberg** (Teuflesberg), a well-beaten seventh in the GI Santa Anita Sprint Championship Oct. 5, worked a half-mile in a bullet 46.60 Friday. "He went very nice without the whip," trainer Bisnath Parboo said. **Mizdirection** (Mizzen Mast) worked seven furlongs on turf in 1:24 under Hall of Fame rider Mike Smith as she gears up for a title defense in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. "That's the exact time I got her in," trainer Mike Puype said. "It was a nice strong work. She's right on schedule."

"The softest he's run on is at Goodwood, and he didn't run up to his best that day, but I put that more down to the track than the ground. Everyone knows he wasn't right in France and now we move on. He's been in very good form since then and I'm looking forward to seeing him run again." In a race which has been largely dominated by 3-year-olds since its upgrade to its current status in 1987, Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad Al Thani's **Olympic Glory (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) adds further ballast to that generation's cause. **Cont. p10**

SOFT APPROACH

☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Dawn Approach (Ire)** (New Approach {Ire}) is back at Ascot today for what could prove his greatest test in a renewal of the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. set to be determined largely by the testing ground. Proven in conditions with some ease, Godolphin's four-time Group 1-winning miler has yet to run on this type of surface which is in stark contrast to the livelier turf that was prevalent when taking the G1 St James's Palace S. at the Royal meeting June 18. He exits a no-excuses second to Tornado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 31 and a fifth as the favorite when under the weather in Deauville's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 11. To some degree, Dawn Approach has his previously lofty reputation to restore.

Uneasy on Longchamp's turning circuit when flopping in the May 12 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Moulin on his last outing Sept. 15, he showed in the meantime what a force he is on a straight track when a short-head runner-up to Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the Jacques le Marois in which Dawn Approach ran so flat. With blinkers on for the first time and an ultra-confident Richard Hughes back in the saddle, he could be about to hit a peak. "Olympic Glory is a big bull of a horse who seems better in the second half of the season and, while more rain might be a worry for some of the other principals, it would not bother our fellow who has shown he can act in the mud," trainer Richard Hannon explained. He did not enjoy the hill or the turns at Longchamp last time, but this straight mile will suit him, and the blinkers do seem to have made a difference. He needs a few wake-up calls to get him focused, and the headgear might just do the trick, but we know we need a career-best performance if he is to pull it off." Having beaten Olympic Glory by five lengths in the Moulin, the Niarchos Family's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Maxios (GB)** (Monsun {Ger}) has every right to be in this line-up, but that performance may have owed as much to a combination of Stephane Pasquier's aggressive tactics and the homebred's love of Longchamp than to his superiority over the runner-up. Another fascinating international contender is Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Mar. 30 G2 Godolphin Mile and Sept. 27 G2 Joel S. winner **Soft Falling Rain (SAf)** (National Assembly), but it is hard to escape his connections' pessimism regarding his prospects of handling this ground.

Runner-up subsequently in the G1 Irish St Leger over 14 furlongs at The Curragh Sept. 15, he needs no further rain. "Ahzeemah worked really well earlier this week and is ready to go," Saeed bin Suroor said. "Two miles is no problem for him and it's a case of so far, so good. He won on good-to-soft at York, but I wouldn't want to see the ground get too soft for him." Representing the sophomore class is Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's **Eye of the Storm (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who comes into this on the back of wins in the Sept. 18 Listed Listowel S. over 12 furlongs on heavy ground and The Curragh's Listed Loughbrown S. on good-to-firm over this trip 11 days later.

RUN TO THE LIGHTHOUSE

Keeneland's GII Lexus Raven Run S. will bring an interesting mix of 3-year-old fillies to the starting gate this afternoon. The George Weaver-trained **Lighthouse Bay** (Speightstown), who upset the Spa's GI Prioress S. at 21-1 two races back July 27, enters off a flat fifth in the GI Test S. there Aug. 24. Lighthouse Bay was a gate scratch from the Catinca S. at Belmont Park Oct. 2. "We had her

in a race at Belmont three weeks ago, but there was an incident at the starting gate and she had to be scratched," Weaver said. "But she is doing well and had a nice work at Saratoga Monday before coming here." The synthetic surface looms as a major question for the filly. "[Thursday] morning was the first time she has set foot on an all-weather surface," Weaver continued. "I hope she adapts to it. I've found that they either like it or they don't. I like to come in right on top of the race. A lot of times, they will do well the first couple of days on the all-weather and then go through an adjustment period. This way they can run before they adjust."

Silsita (Macho Uno) pulled a minor upset when taking Saratoga's My Princess Jess S. July 20, but faltered to sixth stretching out to 1 1/8 miles in the GII Lake Placid S. Aug. 18. Given the 7-2 nod on the morning line, she could prove successful off the bench. **Ciao Bella Luna** (Tribal Rule) will make her first start since transferring to the Wayne Catalano barn. She took the GII Beaumont S. over similar conditions Apr. 14 for conditioner Jerry Hollendorfer and has since finished second in the Railbird S. at Betfair Hollywood Park and fourth stretching out in the GII Hollywood Oaks June 22. Tim Keeley homebred **My Option** (Belong to Me) has registered two top efforts over the synthetic when finishing second in the Purple Violet S. at Arlington Park June 1 and winning the GIII Arlington Oaks July 20. She has since tallied two third-place finishes over the turf in the Hatoof S. Aug. 17 and GIII Pucker Up S. Sept. 14, but looks to improve with this distance cut.

Lucky Nine 'Stuffy' Ahead of Manikato...

By all accounts, top Hong Kong sprinter **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) has thrived since arriving at the Werribee International Horse Center Sept. 24, but trainer Caspar Fownes admits that the 6-year-old is "a ways away from being where I want him" just six days ahead of the gelding's first of two Australian starts in the A\$1-million G1 Sportingbet Manikato S. at Moonee Valley Friday night. A dual International Group 1 winner, Lucky Nine was put through his paces in an 1100-meter jumpout this past Tuesday, but was hard-riden by jockey Brett Prebble to best a maiden winner by a neck ([video](#)). "He certainly looks very well but he blew the house down after the trial," said trainer Caspar Fownes, who was on hand for that last piece of work. "He's just done so well in that environment [at Werribee] and not having a workmate to keep him up to the task in his gallops means he's a little stuffy, which is not a bad thing because he's extremely happy and healthy. It's all about the second race." Assuming he pulls up sound out of the Manikato, Lucky Nine is programmed for a start in the G1 Patinack Farm Classic up the Flemington straight course Nov. 9. "He was always going to come on for the first run but I still felt in my heart that he was going to be very competitive in his first run, so he'll gallop either tomorrow or Sunday and we'll see what Brett says," revealed Fownes. "It would be nice to get a partner for him, to keep him up to the task, and then we can get a better gauge on him." Should Lucky Nine win the Patinack and the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in addition to his victory in the G1 KrisFlyer International Sprint this past May, he would earn a US\$1-million bonus for winning three legs of the Global Sprint Challenge.

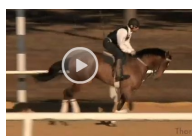

Wheatly Way's first stakes winner was Bevo (Prospector's Gamble), victorious in the GI Futurity S. and GII Saratoga Special. Her daughter Moonlight Sonata (Carson City) captured the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. and produced five winners from five runners, including sales topper and graded stakes winner Wilburn (Bernardini).

"Wheatly Way was a tremendous mare," Michael Helmbrecht said. "She was the cornerstone of our breeding operation. I'm truly going to miss the old girl."

Scurfield, former CHRB Chairman, Dead:

Ralph Scurfield, who served more than eight years on the California Horse Racing Board from January 1991 through September 1999, passed away Tuesday in a Sacramento hospital at the age of 85. Scurfield devoted 40 years of his life to public service, including terms with the Sacramento Planning Commission, the Sacramento City Council, and the California State Fair and Exposition Board. He was greatly respected within the horse racing community during his years of service on the CHRB. He devoted countless hours of his personal time to the business of the Board and the betterment of the California horse racing industry, especially in matters concerning the health and safety of racehorses and workers in the industry. He was so respected by his fellow commissioners, that they elected him chairman for seven consecutive years, making him the second-longest tenured chairman in CHRB history. The Association of Racing Commissioners International also named him chairman in 1998. Scurfield is survived by his wife, Barbara; three sons, Donald, David, and Steven; two stepsons, Ken and Chris, and 14 grandchildren. A celebration of his life will be held Tuesday, Oct. 22, beginning at 1:00 p.m. at the Sutter Lawn Tennis Club in Sacramento.
