Breeders' Cup week officially kicked off with the Post Position Draw held at Santa Anita Park Monday. Headlining the \$5-million GI Breeders' Cup Classic was

8-5 morning line choice **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again), who drew post nine in the 12 horse affair. "I like his outside post; I didn't want to be buried down on the inside," said trainer Bob Baffert of his charge's post. The

powerful bay will be partnered by Mike Smith, who will be searching for his fourth win in the Classic. Also likely to get some support Saturday is **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), who was installed as the second morning-line choice at 5-1. The 5-year-old drew the six hole. "It's very good and I'm happy with it," said Mucho Macho Man's trainer Kathy Ritvo. "I'd probably prefer not to get the one, but everything else is fine. We're going to let [jockey] Gary [Stevens] handle it. He's going to have to see how it goes." Trying to become the first repeat winner of the Classic since Tiznow is **Fort Larned** (E Dubai), who drew the seven slot. Trained by Ian Wilkes, the bay was listed at 6-1 on the early line. "That's OK," said Wilkes. "Seven's a lucky number for me and looks good. Now it is all up to [jockey] Brian [Hernandez Jr.]." Friday's card also boasts a star-studded cast, including **Royal Delta** (Empire Maker), who will try and annex her third consecutive victory in the \$2-million GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Looking to block that rival's coronation is GI Kentucky Oaks heroine **Princess of Sylmar** (Majestic Warrior), who defeated the two-time champ in their only meeting in the GI Beldame S. Sept. 20. Trained by Bill Mott, Royal Delta drew the four, while her junior will exit post six.

Somewhat overlooked in the proceedings after tasting defeat for the first time this year in the Oct. 5 GI Shadwell Turf Mile is reigning Horse of the Year **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry), who took last season's GI Mile hero en route to a year-end championship.

This year's Breeders' Cup will also feature a potent draft from overseas, including **Declaration of War** (War Front), who will contest the Classic and **The Fugue** (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who is slated for the Turf. **Cont. p3**

GRAYDAR OUT OF DIRT MILE

Twin Creeks Racing's **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song) will not run in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile due to a quarter crack in his left front hoof. The Todd Pletcher trainee tallied three graded victories this season in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Feb. 9, GI New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 30 and GI Kelso H. at Belmont Sept. 28. Originally pointed to the Classic, the 4-year-old was rerouted to the Dirt Mile following his breeze Saturday. "We believed Graydar had a huge chance in the Breeders' Cup," said Pletcher. "This is a setback but hopefully he can be 100% for the [GI] Cigar Mile [at Aqueduct Nov. 30]." Added Randy Gullatt, manager of Twin Creeks Racing Stables, "We're obviously disappointed. A Breeders' Cup win is a top goal of ours, but we're always going to do what's in the best interest of the horse first. Graydar's comeback had gone perfectly until this point. He was undefeated this year and was sitting on a big race in the Breeders' Cup. Hopefully, this foot issue resolves quickly and we can make the GI Cigar Mile before he retires to stud."

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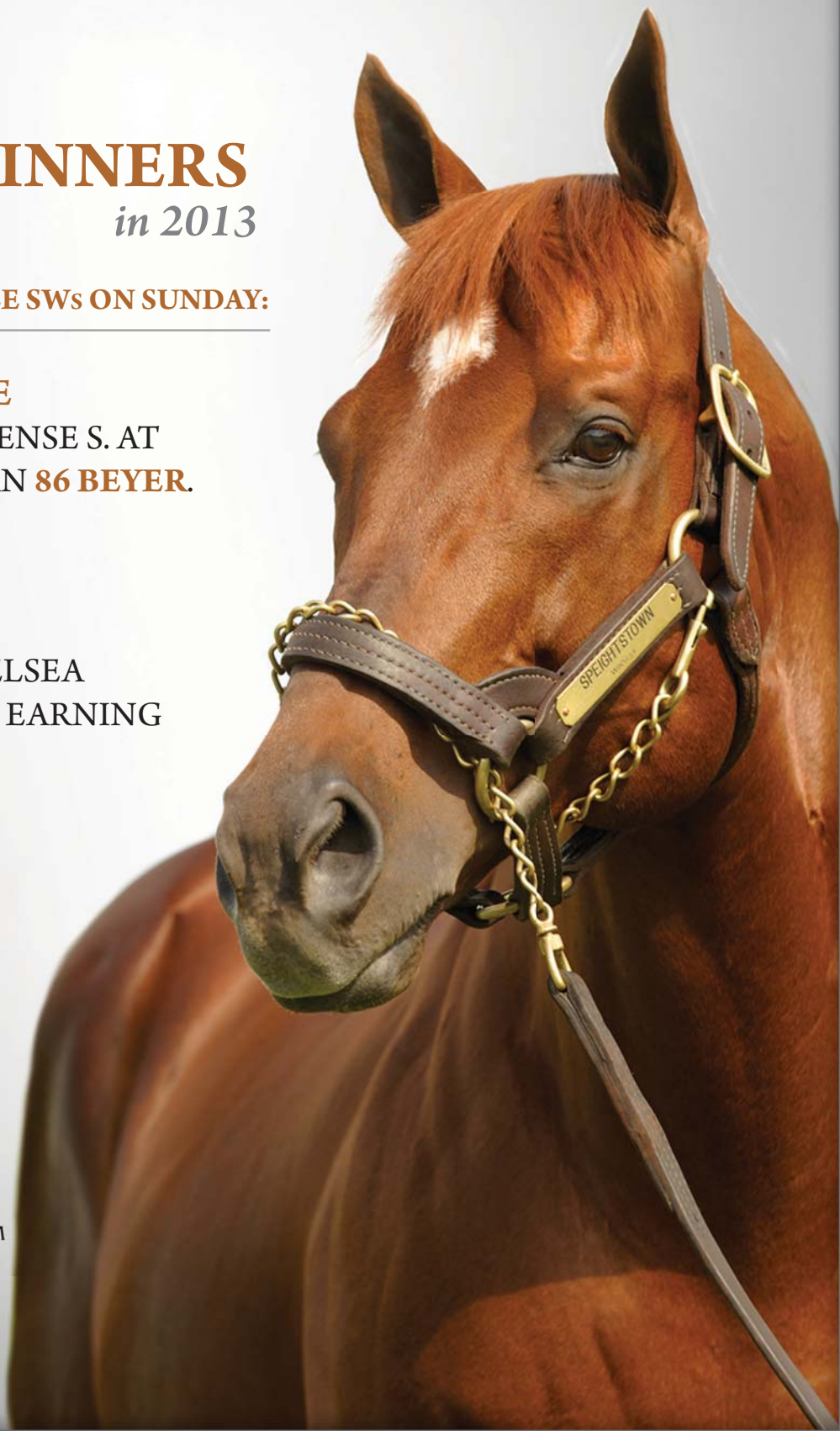

Trainer Bob Baffert's pair of GI BC Classic contenders in **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again) and **Paynter** (Awesome Again) registered their final moves before Saturday's contest. The former, who is undefeated in five starts this season, covered five panels in :59 in company. "It's so quiet out there right now that I wanted to give him a target and get him focused," Baffert said.

"It was a terrific work for him and I'm glad we're done with that. He's a totally different horse this year. He's not the same horse that ran here last year--thank God. He's bigger, he's filled out and he's a happy horse. I've spaced his races out and that's allowed me to keep his weight on." Paynter went the five panels in 1:00 in company with stablemate Flashback (Tapit). "He was a little rusty," Baffert commented. "But he's doing great now. I think he'll be right there Saturday."

"Today was not to squeeze the lemon dry," said conditioner Ian Wilkes. "It was to get the horse coming off the track wanting to do more. Today he walked off like he was wanting to do more, so I was happy."

Hernandez commented, "He worked great this morning. He went just like Ian wanted him to. He cruised right around there to five-eighths and it looks like he's going into the Classic like he did last year."

As for his race tactics, Wilkes said, "He can do whatever you want with him. He can lay off, he can sit behind or he can go to the lead. Last year he ran along [the half mile] in :46. When you run along at that sort of pace--that's racehorse time--and if someone wants to go with him, go with him. But he can sit behind, it doesn't matter. I'm not concerned about that. The horse is right where you want him. He's doing really well. I'm very pleased with him."

Hernandez offered, "I'm very excited. This is what we get up in the morning for, to compete in big races like this and to go in there with the defending champion is very exciting."

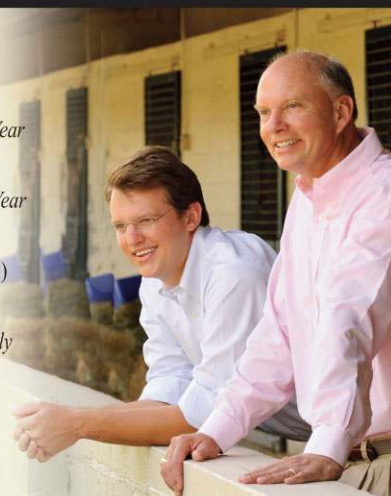

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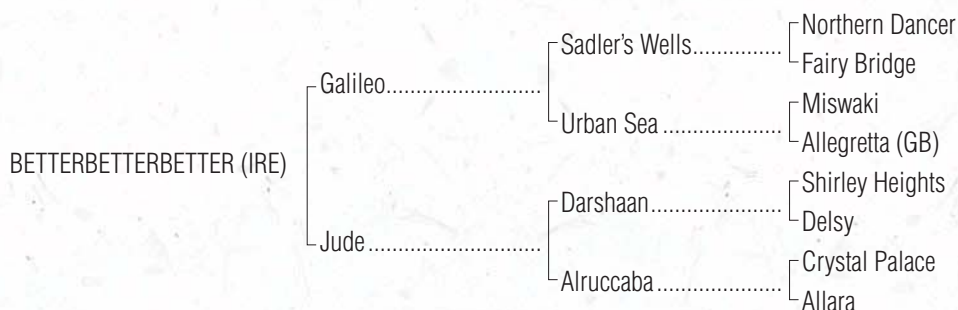

CUMANI LOOKS FOR ELUSIVE CUP VICTORY

Luca Cumani has trained the winners of group races in 12 countries and has handled such international

champions as Alkaased, Falbrav (Ire), Baratheia (Ire) and Kahyasi (Ire), but one jewel missing from the Bedford House trainer's resume is the G1 Melbourne Cup--a fact he will look to rectify Nov. 5 when he saddles Marwan Koukash's Mount Athos (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the A\$6-million race. This year will mark the eighth time Cumani has participated in the Melbourne Cup--his best previous finishes being runner-up efforts with Purple Moon (Ire) in 2007 and Bauer (Ire) in 2008 and his second straight year with Mount Athos, who closed strongly down the middle of track to be fifth last year after being hung wide throughout in the 3200 meter race.

Cumani, speaking from Melbourne yesterday, noted that the 6-year-old has come through his preparations well. He is currently residing at the Werribee International Horse Center under quarantine with the rest of the international brigade. "He's very good," Cumani said, "He traveled well and has settled in well, so all is good." A winner of three minor races in Britain as a 3-year-old in 2010, Mount Athos was purchased by Koukash for 190,000gns at that year's Tattersall's Autumn Horses-in-Training Sale. He was a first-out winner as a 4-year-old for David Wachman in Ireland the following April, but failed to shine in five outings for that stable thereafter, and was turned over to Cumani at the end of the season. What reappeared last year was a different horse, with Mount Athos winning three straight races--including the G3 Geoffrey Freer S. at Newbury, prior to his Melbourne Cup voyage. Mount Athos scraped home 12th in the G1 Japan Cup three weeks after the Melbourne Cup, but made amends with a first-up nine length victory in the G3 Ormonde S. at Chester May 10. A pair of off-the-board finishes--albeit both with legitimate excuses--followed in Royal Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. June 22 and the G2 Goodwood Cup Aug. 1, and he rounded off his preparations for the Cup with an encouraging second-place finish under top weight in the Listed March S. at Goodwood Aug. 24.

Cumani said Mount Athos is in “just as good of form” as last year. Mount Athos will be ridden by Craig Williams, one of Australia’s leading riders, in the Melbourne Cup. Click [here](#) for footage of Williams working Mount Athos last Friday.

Having already trained group winners in Great Britain, Ireland, France, Italy, Dubai, Canada, the U.S., Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore and Australia, Cumani certainly has the experience to guide Mount Athos through his international campaign. Of his reasons for traveling to so many international races, Cumani said: “I’ve always held the belief that for racing to get to the next level, it has to become a truly global

sport. Like golf and tennis, they weren’t truly global until they started being spaced on the world stage as opposed to their individual states, and therefore I’ve always been a firm believer in the international races.”

With the rising frequency in global travel of horses has come an array of theories about how to best handle such travel. Cumani noted that, over the years, he has found it helpful to allow his runners to arrive at their destination with plenty of time to acclimatize.

“The longer the trip, the more preparation there has to be, and the longer recovery time at the other end,” he explained.

“If you’re going to France or Ireland, it’s almost the same as racing in England. If you’re going to the States, I’m a believer in going about six days before, just to give the horse enough time to recover from the trip, and put in a little bit of training just to make sure he doesn’t go into the race out of preparation or not knowing where he is.”

Cumani indicated that even after all that traveling he isn’t ready to slow down yet, and he has his sights set on further overseas victories, including a target in Germany.

“The only country that we haven’t won a group race in and we haven’t raced in yet is Germany,” he said. “We’ve never had a runner in Germany. I don’t know why, just by coincidence, so I hope that if and when we have a runner there we can make it 13.”

In the meantime, Cumani is hoping to make it a long overdue Melbourne Cup number one with Mount Athos next week.

VICTRIX ON TOP AT TATTS *By Emma Berry*

A snapshot of the increasingly international nature of the bloodstock industry was provided by the 220,000gns session topper during the opening day of Tattersalls' bumper Horses-in-Training Sale. Bred in Ireland by Yukiko Hosokawa from the Japanese mare Matikanehamatidori (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), **Victrix Ludorum (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) raced in England and has now been bought by a member of the Qatari Royal Family. Most key indicators saw slight decreases yesterday, with an aggregate of 5,509,300gns (down by 6%) for 257 horses sold at a clearance rate of 83%, which fell by six points. The average of 21,437gns was 9% lower than that on the corresponding day last year, while the median also dropped, by 20% to 10,000gns. David Redvers fended off a two-pronged attack from the DoYLES--first Peter, then Ross--to make the winning bid for Victrix Ludorum, [lot 322](#), on behalf of Sheikh Fahad Al Thani. Julie Wood's 3-year-old filly landed two valuable Tattersalls Millions sales races last season for the Richard Hannon stable and earned black-type with two placed finishes in listed sprints this June.

"She's been bought as a broodmare prospect--I think Invincible Spirit's going to be a very good broodmare sire," said Redvers. "She's from one of the best, most current families in the book, and she was a hell of a 2-year-old."

That family includes the outstanding G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Treve (Fr) (Motivator {GB}), whose fifth dam, Margarethen, is the fourth dam of Victrix Ludorum, while other illustrious relatives include Derby winner Generous (Ire), Oaks winner Imagine (Ire) and George Strawbridge's six-time Group 1 winner Moonlight Cloud (GB).

As ever, buyers from all corners of the globe have assembled at Park Paddocks for this popular autumn fixture. Among the destinations for horses sold during the first session are Australia, America, Hong Kong, Dubai, Qatar, Kuwait, France, Sweden, Norway, Italy and the Czech Republic, while a number will remain in Britain and Ireland with a variety of National Hunt trainers who add another tier of interest to this sale.

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Eighteen of Hannon's current team went through the ring on Monday, bringing a total of 824,000gns to make his East Everleigh Stables the leading consignor of the session.

They included [lot 315](#), the Rock Of Gibraltar (Ire) colt Juan Alonso (Ire), who was knocked down to Dan O'Donnell for 115,000gns. The Hong Kong-based agent was standing with Peter Ho, who confirmed that the 2-year-old will join the 58 horses he trains in Hong Kong.

"He's still young and a bit on the leg, so there's scope for improvement, and he should be able to race over a longer trip in time," said O'Donnell of the dual seven-furlong winner out of the young Spinning World mare Izzy Lou (Ire). Peter Ho bought his first horse in the UK from Robert Sangster in 1997, and has enjoyed shopping for European horses ever since. His best runner has been the Irish-bred Mr Medici (Medicean {GB}), whose Sha Tin victories include the G1 Champions & Chater Cup and two Group 3 contests. He also represented Ho at the VRC Spring Carnival in 2010, with appearances in both the G1 Melbourne Cup and G1 Caulfield Cup.

which is the destination for another quartet signed for by Mulcaster during the opening session to put Chris Waller Racing at the top of the buyers' table.

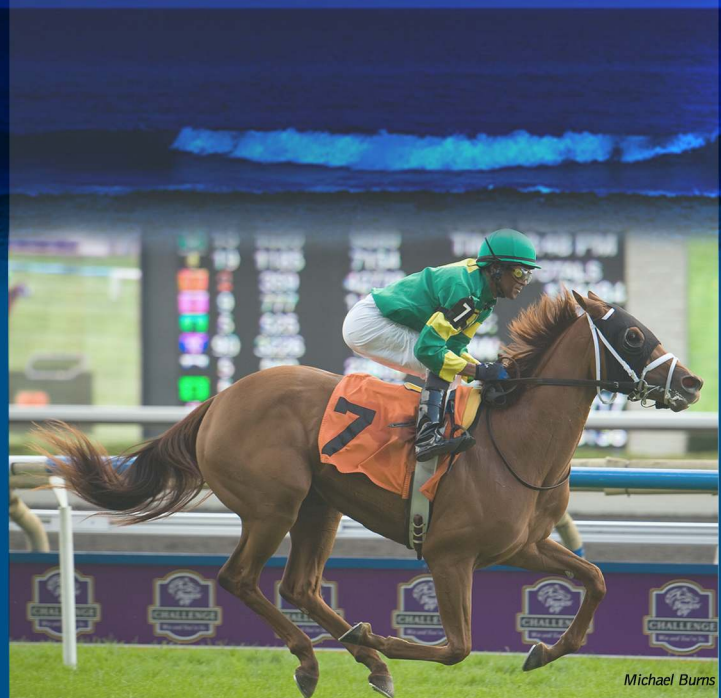

The winner of three races--most recently a mile handicap at the Curragh on September 29--Campanology ran in the colors of Andrew Tinkler, whose principal trainer is also one of the world's leading jockeys, Johnny Murtagh. He topped the draft from Murtagh's Fox Covert Stables on the Curragh, which sold seven horses in training on Monday for 329,000gns. Another pick from the stable was [lot 257](#), Rich Coast (GB) (King's Best), who won the listed Navigation S. at

Cork after the catalogue was printed and was sold for 95,000gns to continue his career in Ireland, but this time with one of the country's leading jumps trainers, Noel Meade. On the day Rich Coast secured his black-type win, another Murtagh-trained King's Best gelding, Royal Diamond (Ire), won the G3 QIPCO Champions Long Distance Cup on British Champions' Day. The 7-year-old, whose nine wins include last year's G1 Irish St Leger, was ridden by his trainer at Ascot and was also offered for sale on Monday, but he was bought back at 140,000gns.

Potential U.S. Jumping Star...

Leading American jumps owner Irvin S Naylor picked up three horses at Tattersalls' July Sale, and he added another two to his team yesterday, including the handsome grey Dalakhani (Ire) gelding Deficit (Ire), who was sold from Michael Bell's Fitzroy Stables for 140,000gns. Lincolnshire-based trainer Steve Gollings buys on Naylor's behalf in the UK, and while 83-rated stayer Deficit ([lot 378](#)) is likely to be shipped to America ahead of the next stage of his racing career over the sticks, Zamoyiski (GB) (Dutch Art {GB}), who was bought for 105,000gns in July, has remained in England with Gollings.

The trainer, who won Aintree's G2 Old Roan Chase on Saturday with Conquistador (GB) (Hernando {Fr}), hopes to run Zamoyiski in the Listed Wensleydale Juvenile Hurdle at Wetherby on Friday.

He said: "I think [Deficit] could be a really high-class jumper in America. Jamie Spencer, who rides a lot for me, recommended him to me. I thought Zamoyiski would be going to America after I bought him in July, but Mr Naylor left him with me and I'm really looking forward to running him over hurdles."

Gollings also signed for [lot 364](#), Response (GB), a 3-year-old gelding by New Approach (Ire) out of the GII Lake Placid H. winner Spotlight (GB) (Dr Fong). Bought for Naylor for 23,000gns, the former Highclere Thoroughbred Racing representative has been placed in each of his six starts, earning a rating of 75.

The sale continues today at 9am local time.

Joshua Tree on the Road Again

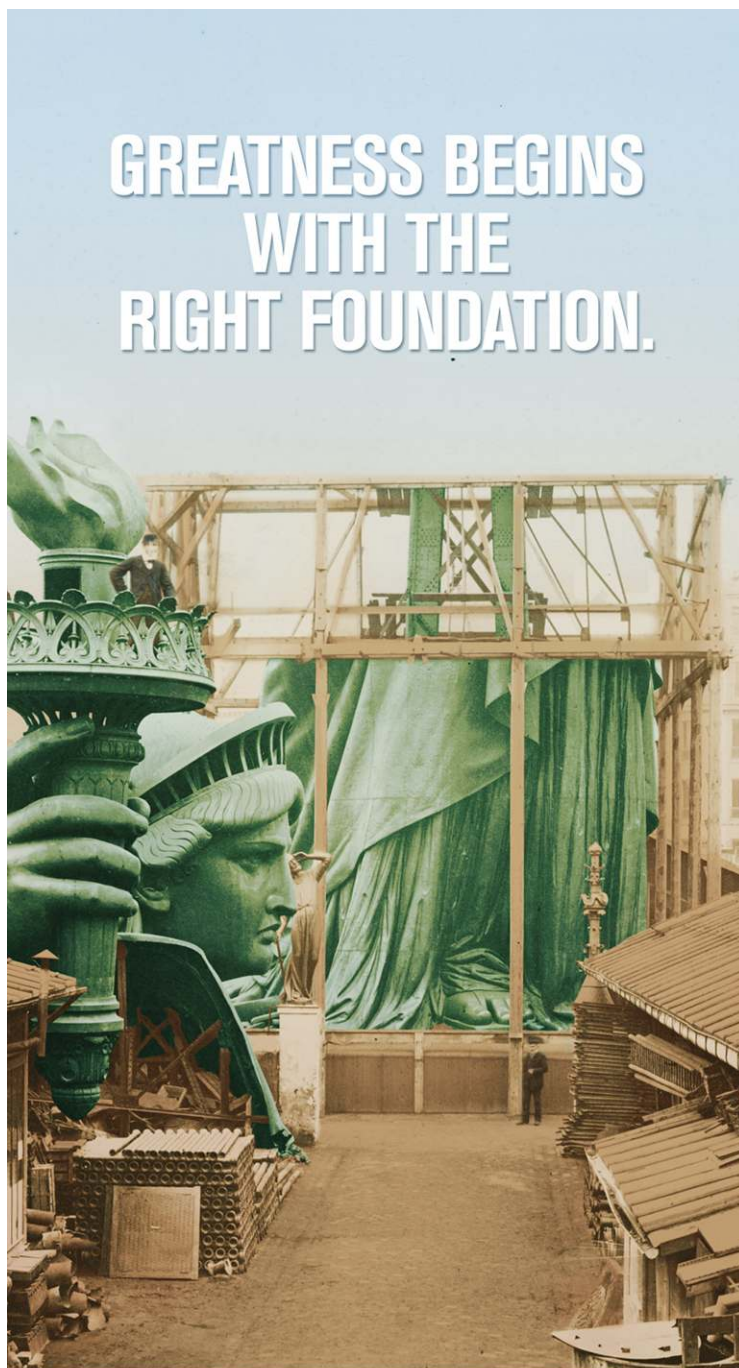
Trainer Ed Dunlop has reported that **Joshua Tree (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), who recorded his third victory in the GI Pattison Canadian International at Woodbine yesterday, could continue on the international campaign that has become his trademark. The 6-year-old, who has already raced in 10 countries, could be bound for assignments in Japan and Hong Kong. "He's in the [G1] Japan Cup [Nov. 24] and the [G1] Hong Kong Vase [Dec. 8], but we'll get him home, talk to the owners and go from there," Dunlop told *PA Sport*. "The Canadian International has obviously been a big part of his plans for this year and it's great that it came off." Dunlop added: "I've only had the horse this year and many people are part of his story. I'm delighted to have played a small part. To go out there four times, winning three and finishing second once, is an amazing achievement for the horse, and well done to his owners and everyone concerned with him."

'Cloud' Has Hong Kong Target

Freddy Head has committed his stable star **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) to the Dec. 8 G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin. As the entries for the star-studded meeting were unveiled yesterday, George Strawbridge's six-time Group 1 winner was the main draw among the overseas raiders. "Moonlight Cloud is very well and we intend to run her in the Hong Kong Mile," her trainer commented. "She seems to be getting better with every run, and although the race is late in the year, she is very fresh and I am very happy that she is as well as she was during the summer. For the moment she is in half work, but in two weeks she will start her preparation and then we will probably ship her to Hong Kong a week before the race. I think the race is good for her."

Cup Aim for 'Cirrus'

Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) is being prepared for a tilt at the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 8, trainer Corine Barande Barbe announced yesterday. Runner-up in last Saturday's G1 British Champion S., the 7-year-old will tackle the 10-furlong test if he continues to please. "Cirrus des Aigles has come out of Ascot very well and is likely to go for the Hong Kong Cup," she said. "He was very well after the race at Ascot and when he went to the vets he was bucking and singing. As usual, he has been getting better and better from race to race this season, and I think the real Cirrus des Aigles is back. He has been a bit unlucky when he has gone to Hong Kong in the past. The first time in the Hong Kong Vase, he was not mature enough, but still ran a good race to finish fifth. He was caught wide with Stacelita in the Cup and then the next year he got boxed in, but wasn't beaten far on both occasions. Hopefully, we will get better luck this year and we are going there to get some revenge."

HK INTERNATIONAL NOMS RELEASED

The Longines Hong Kong International races, set for Dec. 8 at Sha Tin Racecourse, have drawn a total of 241 nominations, headed by 68 Group 1 winners. The four races--the Cup, Vase, Sprint and Mile--are worth a total of HK\$72-million (US\$9,286,488).

The nominations include 12 of the 50 top-rated horses currently in training, including star French filly Moonlight Cloud (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}); British fillies The Fugue (GB) (Dansili {GB}) and Sky Lantern (Ire) (Red Clubs {Ire}); top miler Olympic Glory (Ire) (Choirir {Aus}); perennial top performer Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}), and Hong Kong Champion Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}).

The G1 Longines Hong Kong Cup over 2000 meters has drawn 95 nominations, the G1 Hong Kong Mile 101, the 1200 meter G1 Hong Kong Sprint 61, and the 2400 meter G1 Hong Kong Vase 79. A total of 95 horses have been cross-entered. This year's nominations include horses from 19 countries. Among the possible runners to represent the U.S. are Big Blue Kitten (Kitten's Joy), Indy Point (Arg) (Indygo Shiner), Little Mike (Spanish Steps), Marketing Mix (Medaglia d'Oro), Real Solution (Kitten's Joy), Goldencents (Into Mischief), Obviously (Ire) (Choirir {Aus}), Mizdirection (Mizzen Mast) and Private Zone (Macho Uno).

Past winners nominated include Lord Kanaloa (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) (Sprint), Lucky Nine (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) (Sprint), California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) (Cup, twice), Dunaden (Fr) (Nicobar {GB}) (Vase) and Red Cadeaux (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) (Vase).

"The Longines Hong Kong International Races is not only Hong Kong's premier sports event, but also one of world horse racing's greatest occasions, and a glance down the list of excellent nominations for this year's event gives a clear indication of that," said Bill Nader, the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "We are pleased to have 12 horses from the world's top 50 together with the raft of Group 1 winners that have been nominated. The likes of Moonlight Cloud, Lord Kanaloa, Cirrus Des Aigles, and of course Hong Kong's very own heroes Lucky Nine, California Memory and Military Attack are big name draws on any day. Their planned participation vindicates our assertion that the Longines Hong Kong International Races at Sha Tin in December really is the Turf World Championships."

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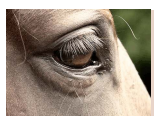

Unlike their Australian counterparts, European breeders were rather slow to appreciate Danehill's vast potential as a sire and sire of sires. Fortunately Danehill Dancer, a member of his third crop, helped change all that. In winning the Phoenix S. and National S. in 1995, Danehill Dancer became the first son of Danehill to become a Group 1 winner in the Northern Hemisphere. Unfortunately, some of the shine was knocked off these achievements when he ended his career with a sequence of six straight defeats at the ages of three and four. Consequently, he began his stallion career at the modest fee of IR4,000gns at a Coolmore satellite in Ireland.

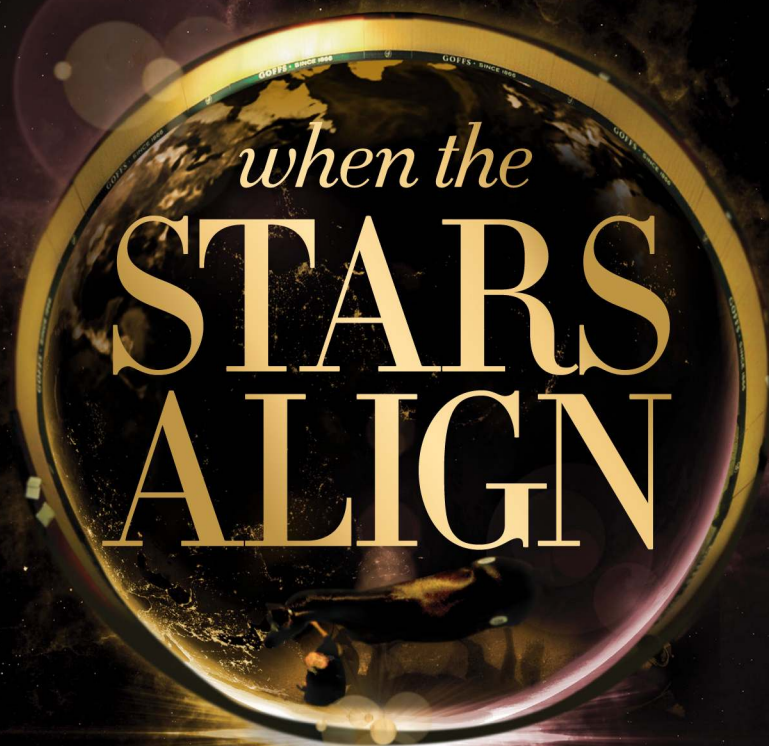
That didn't stop him becoming one of Britain and Ireland's leading first-crop sires in 2001, when his total of 19 2-year-old winners was bettered only by Danehill himself. After that

Danehill Dancer's fee started its rapid upward climb. By 2006 Danehill Dancer had taken his first title as champion sire of 2-year-olds, at the principal expense of Danehill, and he topped the list again in 2008 and 2009, in addition to topping the general sires' table in 2009.

One of the major contributors to Danehill Dancer's 2008 2-year-old title and his 2009 sires' championship was his admirably tough son Mastercraftsman. He emulated his sire's victories in the Phoenix S. and National S. on his way to being rated the best 2-year-old in Europe. Unlike his sire, Mastercraftsman continued to flourish. After adding to his Group 1 collection in the Irish 2000 Guineas and St James's Palace S., he made Sea The Stars work for his victory in the Juddmonte International. He then joined Danehill Dancer at Coolmore, starting at a fee of €20,000, and he too has wasted little time in making his mark.

He now looks fairly certain to end the year as Britain and Ireland's leading first-crop sire, thanks principally to the group successes of Amazing Maria (G3 Prestige S.), Craftsman (G3 Killavullan S.) and the unbeaten Kingston Hill. In winning the Racing Post Trophy very smoothly by 4 1/2 lengths, Kingston Hill is now vying with Toormore and War Command for the title of Champion 2-year-old, which Mastercraftsman secured only five years ago.

Kingston Hill's Group 1 success came little more than an hour after Craftsman had taken the Killavullan S. The ground conditions at Doncaster and Leopardstown were so soft that both colts recorded roughly eight seconds more than the average time.

This reminded me of when I reviewed Mastercraftsman's pedigree in these pages following his very decisive victory in the Irish 2000 Guineas. I wrote:

"I can't think of a better way of describing Danehill Dancer's progeny than to trot out the old line which states that, when the going gets tough, the tough get going."

"The going was certainly tough at the Curragh over the weekend, when the ground was officially described as heavy. Many horses find such extreme conditions beyond their capacity...However, the last few years have taught us that very soft ground is not a problem for many members of the Danehill Dancer clan and the Coolmore stallion notched up three group successes during the two-day Curragh meeting, headed by the Classic victories of Mastercraftsman and Again...."

"The fact that Mastercraftsman and Again both started favorite indicates that both these 3-year-olds were proven on very soft ground. Mastercraftsman had won the G1 National S. on similarly heavy conditions and Again's previous group successes had come on soft and heavy ground. Other Danehill Dancer group performers with winning form on heavy ground include Alexander Tango, Anna Pavlova, Carribean Sunset, Danehill Music, Deauville Vision, Decado, Indesatchel, Lizard Island, Pride of Nation, Savethisdanceforme and Snaefell..."

"The danger with drawing up a list like this is that it can convey the wrong impression. Just because a stallion's progeny can cope with certain conditions does not necessarily mean that they NEED those conditions to excel. The truth is that the Danehill Dancers can be very versatile and we have seen Choisir record a spectacular sprint double on fast ground at Royal Ascot, while another Group 1-winning son, Where Or When, thrived on a sound surface."

I have repeated all of the above simply because the debate will now move on to whether Mastercraftsman's progeny actually NEED a lot of give in the ground. If Mastercraftsman's own record is anything to go by, the answer is "No." Although two of his three Group 1 victories came on heavy ground, he owed his position as champion 2-year-old largely to his victory in the G1 Phoenix S. on good to firm going. On that occasion he pulled 4 1/2-lengths clear of a field which included Art Connoisseur, an impressive winner of the Coventry S. and Bushranger, who went on to Group 1 victories in the Prix Morny and Middle Park S.

The ground was also good to firm when Mastercraftsman fought back very gamely to take the St James's Palace S. and when he gave Sea The Stars a good race at York.

I cannot imagine a more important topic for *TDN* readers than the intent and reality of the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978 on U.S. racing and breeding.

As Tony Chamblin stated in his letter Sunday, he inserted an approval clause into the IHA to assure the racehorse owners' purse account at the host track received a fair share of off-track wagers.

The key word is the "host" track, the one putting on the show. That's the track and purse account that must receive enough revenue for live racing to continue.

Hollywood Park, host of the inaugural Breeders' Cup, will not continue. Now every major track in America's three largest markets has struggled or gone into bankruptcy: Belmont, Aqueduct, Arlington, Santa Anita and Hollywood.

No sport and underlying industry benefitted more from New York, Los Angeles and Chicago, than Thoroughbred racing and breeding. The peer competition among the leaders of Wall Street, industry and entertainment brought prestige and relevance to racing as a sport and fueled the major breeding centers of Kentucky, Florida and California.

The IHA was going to take Thoroughbred racing to a level higher than any other sport could even aspire. The monopoly on legal wagering would expand. The sport with the largest attendance would become an even more dominant enterprise, attracting the best and brightest. That's how sports grow and assure their future with coming generations.

What stopped the IHA from delivering on its promise to racing and breeding and caused the sport to go backward?

More than 10 years after the law passed, tracks struggled to implement off-track wagering. Technology was improving and facilities were being developed, but there was much unrest about who would get what from the wagers.

On February 3, 1989, I was invited to present the idea for national marketing to the Thoroughbred Racing Association (TRA) convention in Los Angeles. During and after that meeting, intense discussions were going on among track officials, but they were not talking about marketing.

That was the day racing got sick. That was the day the small track owners formed cartels against the major tracks and fixed the price paid to host tracks at 2%. That meant the host track would get half (1%) and the host purse account would get 1%. The receiving tracks, casinos and OTB's just taking the bets would keep the rest of the takeout, at that time about 16%.

No host track can produce live racing for 1% of the wager. No purse account could survive at 1%. It was an insane business model. But the approval clause in the IHA was absolute, so the horsemen at each host track could veto this bad deal.

But they didn't. One by one the horsemen spit the bit and approved the small tracks' price fix. 1% would be paid to the host track and 1% to the purse account. The intent of the approval clause was destroyed.

That same year Arlington Park reopened. Richard Duchossois delivered the best racetrack America had ever seen. It was big enough and grand enough to serve our third largest market, but such a beast had to be fed. Arlington did not have a chance against the 1% model. Each year as off-track wagering increased, Arlington fell further, until it was sold.

1) The intent of the IHA was to expand the distribution of wagering on the host tracks' races across state lines. Period.

That meant every U.S. track, which already had its fixed costs met, would see a windfall of profits as off-track bettors in 30+ new states wagered on their product. What track owner could want more? Since the purse accounts got half of the takeout, purses were going to go through the roof.

Instead, the small tracks chose a model to maximize profits from their own customers when they bet on other tracks' races. It was a bad decision that has done enormous damage, however, it can still be corrected.

2) The intent of the approval clause in the IHA was to prevent the host track owner from giving away the product for less than full value. Period.

Over the years, the approval power has been abused and leveraged by horsemen for things that were never intended or envisioned by the IHA. Too many races were added, drugs and medication were added and protected, etc.

In 1989, the percentage of handle going into purses was 8%. Each year, as off-track wagering has grown, the racehorse owners' share has fallen further and further. In my opinion, today the percentage of all-source (on-track and off-track) handle into purses is about 4% while the takeout has climbed to 20%.

Most of the money going to purses now is from artificial sources. The amount paid to host tracks has increased as ADW's are leveraged, but the small amount receiving tracks and OTB's pay still cripples the host tracks.

All laws need revision from time to time. Technology changes, opportunities change. The IHA needs minor revision for the sport to get well.

Prior to off-track wagering, the racehorse owners' image rights to their horses had little value. Today with technology reaching homes and mobile individuals, those rights have great value. New ideas for racing, both domestically and internationally, will be born from racehorse owners' property rights.

The IHA must establish the legality of racehorse owners' property rights. It protects the tracks' property rights, but leaves the racehorse owners with the vague issue of sharing those rights with trainers.

I don't believe the owners and breeders, whose influence was used to pass the IHA, intended for the law to cause Hollywood Park and our other major racetracks to fail, but unintended consequences occurred and were not corrected.

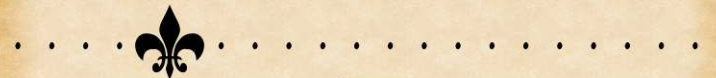
For the sake of the sport, for the sake of the breeding industry, for their own sake... racehorse owners must gain control of the IHA. There are a lot more racehorse owners and breeders than track owners and trainers, but you will not be seen until you stand up.

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Although Kingston Hill's three-race career has taken place on a soft surface, his trainer Roger Varian has no doubts that the colt will prove just as effective on faster ground.

"He's a beautiful-moving horse," Varian said, "and usually those very good-moving horses like better ground."

Varian also added that Kingston Hill has a great cruising speed and a great turn of foot, two assets which could make him a serious threat to all the other 2000 Guineas contenders. I see no reason why he shouldn't be effective at a mile, especially during the early months of his 3-year-old season.

Mastercraftsman probably owed his ability to stay a mile and a quarter to his broodmare sire Black Tie Affair, winner of the 1991 GI Breeders' Cup Classic before siring Evening Attire (GI Jockey Club Gold Cup) and Formal Gold (GI Woodward S. and DonnH.).

There is also some stamina in Mastercraftsman's female line, which traces to Dangerous Dame, who also numbers Broad Brush, Exceller and Capote among her descendants. Mastercraftsman's third dam Tobira Celeste produced the top-class Celestial Storm, runner-up in the St Leger, the King George and the Champion S., and Thawakib, a Ribblesdale S. winner who became the dam of Arc winner Sakhee.

The Arc also fell to Kingston Hill's broodmare sire Rainbow Quest, who made his mark on the Racing Post Trophy by siring Armiger and Crowded House, the winners in 1992 and 2008.

Rainbow Quest went close to defeating the top miler Lear Fan in the Craven S. on his reappearance at three and that effort earned him a tilt at a vintage edition of the G1 2000 Guineas, in which he finished fourth to El Gran Senor.

The first win by Kingston Hill's dam Audacieuse came in the May of her second season, when she won decisively over a mile at Saint-Cloud. She was better suited by distances around a mile and a quarter by the fall, though, winning the Listed Prix de Liancourt and the G3 Prix de Flore.

Clearly she wasn't an out-and-out stayer. For this she can thank the fact that her dam Sarah Georgina was a six-furlong 2-year-old winner by the speedy Persian Bold.

The next dam, Dance By Night, did her winning over seven furlongs as a juvenile. Dance By Night also became the dam of Danseuse du Soir, a first-rate sprinter-miler who numbered the G1 Prix Robert Papin, G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix de la Foret among her successes.

All in all, Kingston Hill's pedigree suggests there is possibly a bigger question mark hanging over his stamina for the Derby than over his speed for the 2000 Guineas.

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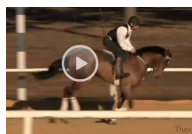

The Sin-G1 Longines Singapore Gold Cup, the final leg of the Triple Crown, will be the next target for the colt. Super Ninetyseven finished sixth behind Cash Luck (Aus) (Bradbury's Luck {Aus}) in the Kranji Mile, the first leg of the Triple Crown, Oct. 6. "I just hope the handicapper is kind to him," Freedman commented. "He's come a long way in a short space of time. From a staying point of view he's got the right sort of credentials to win a race like the Gold Cup. It looks a little easier this year without a horse like Better Life (Aus) (Smarty Jones)."
