



KEENOV MOMENTUM CARRIES INTO BOOK 2

The Keeneland November sale entered into its second book Thursday in Lexington, but the results remained the same with figures up across the board. During the auction's third session, 255 horses sold for \$28,168,500. The session average was \$110,465--up 16% from a year ago, while the median was up 20% to \$90,000. "I think the market carried forth from Book 1 very well," reported Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "There was strong competitive bidding, both on mares and foals, all through the day. And we hope this momentum continues." Through three days of selling, 497 head have grossed \$114,700,500, compared to 443 bringing \$83,783,500 a year ago. The cumulative average is \$230,786--up 22%--while the median of \$140,000 is up 40%. The buy-back has hovered around the 20% mark all week and, at the close of business Thursday, was at 20.22%. "Every single number was up in a good consistent manner, except one," said Keeneland's Vice President of Sales Walt Robertson. "The buy-back rate was down in a good consistent manner." Russell added, "All indicators were in the direction we like." Twin Creeks Farm paid the day's highest price when securing Little Bug (Dixie Union) for \$410,000, while a Harlan's Holiday colt was the session's top-priced weanling after selling to Baccari Bloodstock for \$350,000. The Chilean-based Don Alberto Corp. maintained its position as the sale's leading buyer, signing for 22 head for \$8,435,000 over three days. CALI 'GOLDEN' BOY LIKELY FOR CIGAR

Goldencents (Into Mischief), runaway winner of last Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Santa Anita, is being pointed at the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 30, according to owner Josh Kaplan of WC Racing. Kaplan and his partner Glenn Sorgenstein recently bought out minority owners Dave Kenney and Rick Pitino's RAP Racing. "[Trainer Doug O'Neill] wanted to stay in our backyard and head towards the [GI] Malibu [S.], but there was mention of the Cigar Mile, and obviously, the incentive bonus [purse upped to \$1 million for a Breeders' Cup winner] is there for us," Kaplan said. "We just left it in Doug's hands and he said, 'Hey, you know if the horse is training well and he is in good shape that we will pull the trigger.' Looks like that is where we are headed. It's all up to the horse at this point in time, but all of us say yes." **Cont. p12**

GRAYDAR RETIRED TO TAYLOR MADE

Grade I winner **Graydar** (Unbridled's Song--Sweetest Smile, by Dehere) has been retired to Taylor Made Stallions for the 2014 season, where he will command a fee of \$15,000, stands and nurses. Taylor Made purchased an interest in the 4-year-old in August, shortly after the passing of longtime Taylor Made resident Unbridled's Song. Campaigned by Steve Davison's Twin Creeks Racing, Graydar took Gulfstream's GI Donn H. in February, Fair Grounds's GI New Orleans H. in March and Belmont's GI Kelso H. Sept. 28. **Cont. p13**

Twin Creeks, Bedouin Team for Topper...

Twin Creeks Farm and Taylor Made Stallions announced yesterday that the Grade I winner Graydar (Unbridled's Song) will be retired to his late sire's former residence, and Twin Creeks' Randy Gullatt didn't wait long to purchase some mares to breed to the 4-year-old. Included was yesterday's sale topper, **Little Bug** (Dixie Union--Gin Running, by Go For Gin), who was knocked down late in the session for \$410,000. She sold as [hip 750](#); Gainesway was the underbidder.

Offered by Neal Clarke and Conor Doyle's Bedouin Bloodstock, agent for Edward and Theresa DeNike, Little Bug was in foal on an Apr. 3 cover to Tiznow, and the resulting offspring will be closely bred to her talented half-siblings, the Grade II winner Tizfizz and SW & GISP Fury Kapcori, both by Tiznow. Little Bug is also a full-sister to SW Dixie Commander. Horse of the Year Favorite Trick (Phone Trick) is under the third dam.

"I thought this was an exceptional mare," said Gullatt. "We just retired Graydar to stud, and I thought this was a star mare for the horse. I love the fact that Tiznow has worked well with the family, and we're excited about the foal she's carrying, but most of all I think she'll be perfect for Graydar."

A winner of five of six lifetime, Graydar won this season's GI Donn H., GII New Orleans H. and GII Kelso Invitational S.

Twin Creeks stands another son of Unbridled's Song in Mission Impazible, who resides at Sequel Stallions in New York, and has been very active in supporting that graded stakes winner, who like Graydar, was trained by Todd Pletcher. Gullatt said Twin Creeks will be similarly bullish in backing Graydar.

"We've bought four mares here for Mission Impazible, and two for Graydar," said Gullatt. "We're supporting both heavily--it's all chips in!"

Gullatt also signed for [hip 731](#) yesterday, the stakes winner **Justenufappeal** (Exchange Rate--Hasty Appeal, by World Appeal), who went for \$140,000 and was another tabbed for Graydar. The 5-year-old mare was carrying a member from the first crop of To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) and is a half to GSW Dr. Park (Honor Grades), SW & GSP Kelly Leak (Runaway Groom) and GSP Privileged (Southern Image).

"We're believers in runners," added Gullatt.

When asked how he was finding the market, he commented, "One word: *strong*."

Bedouin Bloodstock, the consignors of Little Bug, enjoyed a banner afternoon Thursday. In addition to the session topper, it sold the 4-year-old mare **Struck It Lucky** (Smart Strike) ([hip 508](#)), in foal to Harlan's Holiday, to Don Alberto Corp. for \$300,000; the 7-year-old mare **Reforestation** (Forestry) ([hip 448](#)), in foal Super Saver, for \$220,000; and the 4-year-old mare **I'm Always Hopeful** (Arch) ([hip 711](#)), in foal to More Than Ready, for \$145,000. **Cont. p4**

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"We're delighted," said Doyle. "It's one of the best days we've ever had. It's just been...peachy."

The sale of Little Bug was a hugely successful one for Bedouin clients Edward and Theresa DeNike, who made a savvy claim when they halted the then-4-year-old for \$25,000 at Golden Gate in November of 2009--some 11 months after her sister Tizfiz won the GI San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita. Last year, another sibling, Fury Kapcori, added to the page by winning a stakes at Fresno, then ran Violence (Medaglia d'Oro) to 1 1/4 lengths in the GI CashCall Futurity.

"It's just a happening family," said Doyle. "Tizfiz was a mare that another client of ours owned, so we're really familiar with the page. And these mares are just getting started, so it's an emerging family."

The DeNikes, who live just outside Seattle, have bred two out of Little Bug: a yearling colt by Mineshaft, and a weanling Street Sense filly who followed her into the ring. They bought back the filly for \$120,000.

"They've been clients for four or five years, and have a big racing operation on the West Coast," said Doyle. "They're great people and great clients."

Edward DeNike is the president of SSA Containers, an international cargo operations firm based in Seattle. The DeNikes also breed and race Quarter Horses.

session of the Keeneland November sale.

"He had me at hello," Baccari smiled. "To be honest, he walked by me once, twice and I said, 'We're leaving. I don't need to see him anymore.'"

The bay colt, whose size belies his April foaling date, is out of Indivia (Tiznow), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Payton d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro).

"He's just a very unique package for that sire," Baccari

explained. "I really liked his female family. Being out of a Tiznow mare I thought might give him the ability to go two turns. Of course with his sire's passing, they will be really hard to get, but I just thought he had a great two-turn look. In my opinion, he's the best one that I've ever seen by that sire."

CORRECTION: A story in yesterday's *TDN* incorrectly said that GSW **Agave Kiss** (Lion Heart) sold Tuesday at Keeneland November--she actually sold on Monday at Fasig-Tipton for \$1.5 million. We regret the error.

Baccari was prepared for the colt's final price tag.

"I knew it was going to be high," he said. "Because if you look at what some of the other horses have been bringing, there have been some other stallions that aren't quite as strong that will bring within \$100,000 of what he brought. That is when I knew I was going to have to put on my big boy pants."

Baccari said he hadn't decided whether the weanling will be raced or pinhooked, but he has no concerns about sending the youngster back through the ring.

"I'm not worried because of how strong the market is right now," Baccari explained. "If you look at what some of these pedigrees are bringing by some sires that are unproven, they are bringing not too far away from him. I'd rather buy something I know that can work."

The weanling was bred by T/C Stable and was consigned by VanMeter Sales.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

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Gift that Keeps Giving...

The family-driven partnership that claimed A Bit of Pressure (High Yield) for \$75,000 six years ago notched another smart score from the mare yesterday at Keeneland. A Kitten's Joy weanling colt who was produced by the multiple-stakes-placed mare made \$225,000 to the bid of Brian Graves, who signed for the colt under the banner Blue Sky Stables.

The colt, put through as [hip 547](#), was consigned by Nursery Place, which is owned by John Mayer and his wife Martie and helped run by their son Griffin. Another son, Walker, works for trainer Charlie LoPresti. The Mayers joined with Happy Broadbent, Martie's brother, and longtime partner John Donaldson to claim A

Bit of Pressure at Aqueduct in March of 2007. Two months later, her brother Past the Point (Indian Charlie) broke his maiden impressively at Churchill, and by the end of the year had run third in the GII Super Derby. A year later, Past the Point ran Curlin to 1 1/4 lengths in the GI Woodward S.

A Bit of Pressure has been a rock-solid producer for the partnership. In addition to yesterday's Kitten's Joy colt, they sold Army Hero, a Lemon Drop Kid colt from the mare for \$260,000 at the 2011 Keeneland September Sale, as well as a \$150,000 Unbridled's Song yearling colt and a \$135,000 Smart Strike weanling colt. The latter was purchased at the 2012 Keeneland November Sale by Glencrest, who pinhooked her back at this summer's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale, where he realized \$250,000.

"She's a gorgeous mare, and she throws great-looking foals," said Broadbent shortly after watching the Kitten's Joy sell. "This one's a beautiful colt--he's going to be a runner."

Added Griffin Mayer, "We loved him. I had several people tell me he was one of the best-looking ones they've seen."

A Bit of Pressure, who is currently in foal to Maclean's Music, is catalogued during Saturday's session as [hip 1372](#).

The Kitten's Joy colt wasn't Nursery Place's only big transaction on the day. It sold 11 of 12 through the ring for \$2,185,000, an average of \$182,083. Included were three mares who made \$250,000 each:

- [hip 505](#), the 4-year-old **Stormy Tak** (Stormy Atlantic--Lady Tak), in foal to Unbridled's Song, who sold to XIB, agent for Pauleeanna Thoroughbreds;
- [hip 593](#), the 4-year-old Carmen's Mystery (War Front), in foal to More Than Ready, who sold to Don Alberto Corp.; and
- [hip 733](#), the 5-year-old Keep On Singing (Hennessy), in foal to Arch, who sold to Demi O'Byrne.



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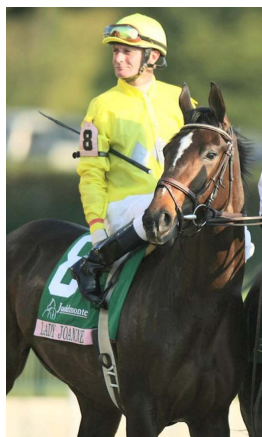
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Ida Goes 'Above' and Beyond...

Four years ago, Dr. Masatake Iida went to \$1.6 million to purchase Shackleford's Grade I-winning sister **Lady Joanne** (Orientate) at Fasig-Tipton November. Yesterday, at Keeneland November, he added one of

her daughters to the fold. Iida, through Polo Green's Nobu Araki, acquired the 4-year-old **Above Heaven** (Mr. Greeley--Lady Joanne, by Orientate) for \$310,000 from the Adena Springs consignment ([hip 548](#)). The chestnut sold in foal to Forestry, the sire of Shackleford.

Winner of the GI Alabama S. at three, Lady Joanne was carrying Above Heaven when Adena Springs purchased her for \$1.25 million at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale. Adena foaled out Above Heaven, put Lady Joanne back in foal to Tiznow, and sold her to Iida at Fasig November in 2009. Iida subsequently sent Lady Joanne

to Japan.

Above Heaven, who is unraced, "will be bred to Tapit," explained Araki, who said the mare would remain in the States. He added he was extended to land the her. "I thought she might go for \$150,000, but the market's strong," smiled Araki, who was on the phone with Iida.

Above Heaven is a granddaughter of Broodmare of the Year Oatsee (Unbridled), who in addition to Lady Joanne and the Classic-winning Shackleford is the dam of MGSW Afleeting Lady (Afleet Alex), MGSW Baghdaria (Royal Academy) and SW & MGSP Stephanoatsee (A.P. Indy). Afleeting Lady RNA'd for \$2.7 million at Fasig November a few days ago.

It was Iida's second purchase at Keeneland November. During Tuesday's opener, he secured the Chilean champion **Casablanca Smile (Chi)** (Ocean Terrace--Periza, by Sadlers Congress {Ire}) ([hip 101](#)), in foal to Mineshaft, for \$710,000. He was also an underbidder on Monday's \$2-million Joyful Victory (Tapit) at Fasig.

Iida, a veterinarian, is a prominent owner and breeder in Japan and is president of Chiyoda Farm, a leading breeding and training operation that his father, the late Dr. Tadashi Iida, helped establish.

Masatake Aida has seven mares in the U.S., including four at Araki's Polo Green Stable and another three at Taylor Made.



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Tara Continues Strong Sales Week for Eclipse...

Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners, which began the week with a bang when selling In Lingerie (Empire Maker) for \$2.4 million at Fasig-Tipton, enjoyed another strong result in the sales ring Wednesday at Keeneland when selling stakes-winner **Tara from the Cape**

(Leroidesanimaux {Brz}). The 3-year-old mare, in foal to Bodemeister, was purchased for \$300,000 by Freyer Bloodstock.

Tara from the Cape is another in a growing list of stakes winners for the partnership, which was begun just three years ago. She won the 2012 Thomas Greene Memorial S. at Delaware in her second start and was third in the P. G. Johnson S. before fourth-place efforts in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies

Turf.

"She was an extremely talented and fast filly," commented Eclipse President Aron Wellman. "We had really high hopes for her after last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf and, unfortunately, she suffered a training accident down in Palm Meadows preparing for her 3-year-old year and we had to retire her."

Wellman added it was gratifying to watch Eclipse's young racing prospects turn into sought-after broodmares.

"All these mares we've sold this week we bought early on in their careers," he explained. "In fact, all of them were bought after they had raced just one time, very early on in their career. So we buy them speculating that they will be graded caliber with much to prove. And it's nice to be able to develop them into that caliber of an individual and execute for our partners and then execute the exit strategy by sending them through the sales ring and getting good money for them."

"I will say, without question, buying is more fun than selling," he continued. "But it's the evolution of our business model and selling these valuable mares is a fun part of the process. To be able to sell them as well as we have all week long and put some money back in our partners' pockets is a big feather in our cap. Hopefully the partners will continue to support the industry and the sport and put it right back into the game."

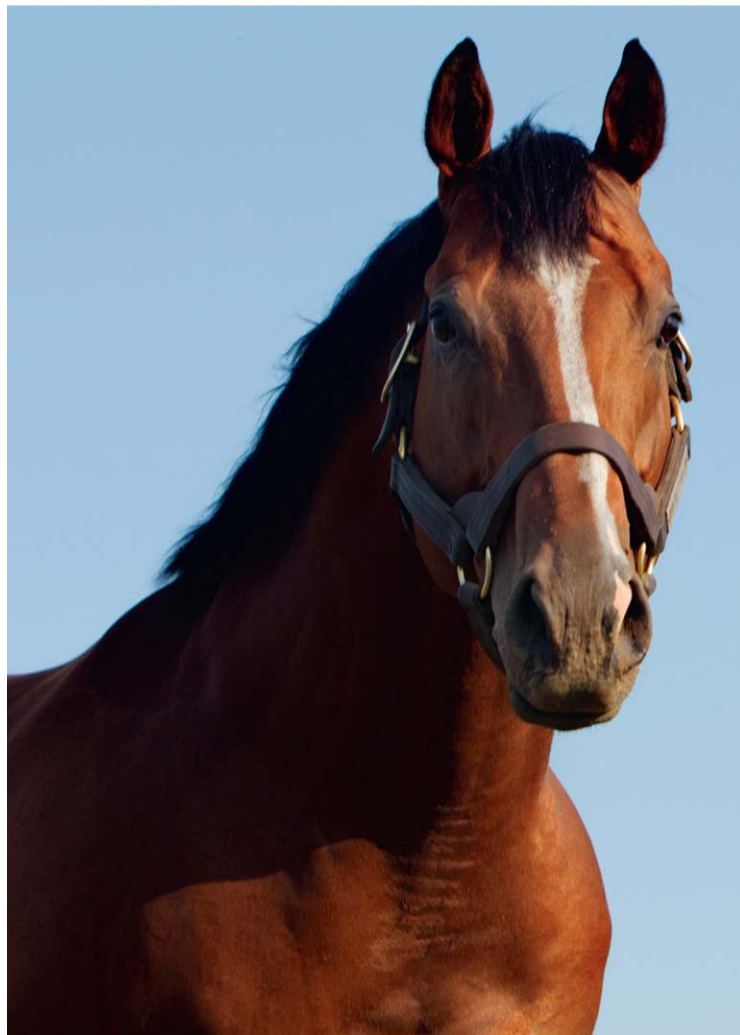

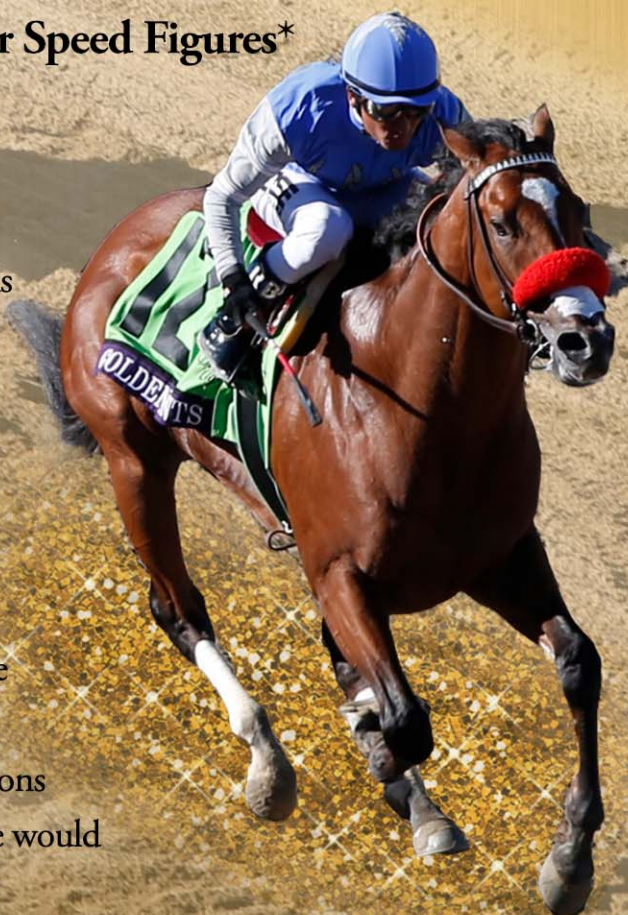

Don Alberto Goes on Buying Spree at Keeneland...

The Solari-Heller family's Don Alberto Corp., which last month completed the purchase of Vinery, has gone on a buying frenzy at this week's breeding stock sales to populate the 417-acre Lexington farm. Don Alberto signed for 22 broodmares during the first three sessions of the Keeneland November sale, in addition to the five purchased at Monday's Fasig-Tipton November sale.

Carlos Heller has been in Lexington this week, accompanied by veterinarian Roberto Navarrete and agent Fernando Diaz-Valdes.

"When [Heller] was here in September, he was just stopping by to look at some farms," Diaz, acting as interpreter, said. "He was impressed with Vinery, and fortunately it was for sale. So they decided to buy it, but it was an empty place. There were no stallions. There were no broodmares. The next step was logical: come here to the November sales and buy some broodmares."

Don Alberto was the leading buyer in Keeneland November's Book 1. Its 20 broodmare purchases through three days of the sale totaled \$8,435,000. The group's highest-priced purchase was the \$850,000 for **Reach the Stars (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) ([hip 214](#)). It also paid \$735,000 for **Snow Fall** (War Front) ([hip 42](#)); and \$700,000 for **Sacristy** (Pulpit) ([hip 23](#)).

At Fasig-Tipton, Don Alberto purchased five broodmares, led by **Malvinia** (A.P. Indy) ([hip 95](#)) for \$800,000; and **Washington Bridge** (Yankee Gentleman) ([hip 130](#)) for \$750,000.

The Solari-Heller family owns Haras Don Alberto in Chile. The family's business interests, run under the umbrella Bethia Holdings name, include retail, transport, agriculture, communications, health, real estate, water and sanitation, and financial business industries.

Haras Don Alberto is home to 300 mares and over the years has hosted shuttle stallions like Stormin Fever, Proud Citizen, Fusaichi Pegasus, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) and Bluegrass Cat. It is currently home to shuttle stallions Dylan Thomas (Ire), Henrythenavigator and Stevie Wonderboy. **Cont. p11**

The family's involvement in horse racing is now in its third generation. The late Alberto Solari began breeding Thoroughbreds three decades ago. His daughter Liliani Solari is principal owner of Haras Don Alberto and is chairwoman of Bethia Holdings. Carlos Heller, his grandson, is president of Club Hipico de Santiago.

Diaz said the family was planning to breed to race and was looking to buy well-bred mares in foal to leading stallions to create a top-level racing operation. He added some mares would be shipped from Chile to be bred to North American stallions.

Of his long-term goals, Heller said, "My dream is the Kentucky Derby."

Graydar was forced to miss the Breeders' Cup after developing a quarter crack. "Graydar's quarter crack that forced us to miss the Breeders' Cup wasn't healing like we hoped to be able to make the Cigar Mile or any other Grade I's left on the racing calendar," trainer Todd Pletcher explained. "He's among the most talented horses I've had the privilege to train. The performance that will always stand out to me was his Donn Handicap win this year. You just don't see horses turn in a dominant performance on that stage in just their fourth career start. It was very special, and knowing this horse and how brilliantly fast and good-looking he is, I'm very excited about his future as a stallion." Graydar, a \$260,000 2011 Fasig-Tipton Florida graduate and half-brother to multiple graded stakes-placed runners Union Course (Dixie Union) and Star of David (Bernstein), retires with a record of 6-5-0-1 and earnings of \$841,560. "Graydar is the closest thing I've seen to Unbridled's Song, and obviously we've had the privilege to be around a lot of good ones through the years," said Taylor Made President and CEO Duncan Taylor. "His combination of looks, class, and sheer brilliance remind me of his sire, both on and off the racetrack, and he has that special presence about him like Unbridled's Song had. We're extremely excited about Graydar and look forward to continuing our great relationship with Steve Davison, [Twin Creeks manager] Randy Gullatt and the group at Twin Creeks. We've always felt that Graydar would be a great heir to carry on his terrific sire line." Graydar, who was bred by W. S. Farish, will stand as a Twin Creeks Racing/Taylor Made Stallions venture.

TAPIT TO STAND FOR \$150,000 IN '14

Gainesway's leading stallion Tapit (Pulpit) will stand the 2014 breeding season at \$150,000, the farm announced yesterday. The 12-year-old was booked full while standing for \$125,000 in 2013. "We felt that a fee of \$150,000 for a stallion who can get Grade I winners on all surfaces is very fair in the current marketplace," commented Gainesway's Michael Hernon. "Tapit is not one-dimensional--colts, fillies, turf, synthetic--it doesn't matter. He's got enormously high-quality mares in foal to him, weanlings on the ground out of superb mares and many top mares already booking." Tapit was represented by 2013 graded winners Joyful Victory, Flashback, Honorable Dillon, Untapable and Tapicat. He currently has sired 11 Grade I winners and is the sire of four Breeders' Cup winners. The gray stallion has also proven popular in the sales ring this fall. "Tapit was the leading sire at Keeneland September this year by gross and average, with an average over \$400,000," Hernon said. "He also had four individual yearlings bring \$1 million or more. And, as of Wednesday, his covering sire average at the November sales was close to \$1 million, with a median of \$750,000." Tapit's \$150,000 fee matches the 2014 fee of Claiborne's War Front announced last month.

"Fast Bullet was as brilliant and talented as they come, and is as nice a horse physically as I've ever seen. Speed and class runs in the family. His dam is a half-sister to Eclipse Champion and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Brave Raj." Bred in Kentucky by Roy Gottlieb, the 5-year-old was campaigned by Zayat Stables. The handsome chestnut compiled a record of 7-4-0-0, and earnings of \$330,334. "Fast Bullet was a Zayat's family favorite," Ahmed Zayat commented. "He was such a courageous competitor. I've had many fast horses, I don't know that I've owned any faster than him. We plan to support him with our mares as well as in the sales ring and on the racetrack." Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert added, "God doesn't make horses this fast very often. He had world class speed." Fellow Hall of Fame trainer D. Kirramosa was sent off the favorite for Victoria's premier race for 3-year-old fillies on the back of a victory in Saturday's G2 Wakeful S., which had produced 21 of the last 30 Oaks winners, and she did not disappoint her backers in collecting her first win at the highest level. A first-out winner in her native New Zealand Mar. 13, Kirramosa finished fourth when thrown to the wolves in the Kiwi version of the G1 Sires' Produce S. Mar. 30. She resurfaced five

months later in Australia when her trainer, John Sargent, opened a stable at Randwick in Sydney, and finished fourth in her sophomore debut in a Canterbury handicap before emerging victorious in a Newcastle conditions event Sept 18. Fourth in the Listed Reginald Allen Quality at Rosehill 10 days later, she was second-best in a Randwick handicap Oct. 19, but appeared a different horse when adding blinkers for the Wakeful over this strip five days ago, running out a 1 1/2-length winner.

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Crossing over from her wide barrier on the run into the first turn, Kirramosa and Nash Rawiller took up fourth place early, about six lengths off the lead, while traveling one path off the fence. Tipped three-wide and cut loose at the top of the lane, Kirramosa matched strides with Zanbagh at the 200 meter mark. That pair overwhelmed the game frontrunner Solicit in the final strides, with Kirramosa finishing just the better. "We needed every yard of it, but the way she won today was very good," winning trainer John Sargent told *Racenet.com.au*. "[Zanbagh] was coming back strong but it was very good riding from Nash, he judged it perfectly.

"There's not a lot of her, she's only a light filly but she's got a very good constitution and a great temperament," Sargent added. "We'll just put her aside now for six weeks and we'll probably target Sydney in the autumn."

Kirramosa becomes the first Group 1 winner for second season sire Alamosa (NZ) (O'Reilly), who stands at Wellfield Lodge in New Zealand.

LUCKY AND BUFFERING: ROUND TWO

Tonight's VRC Sprint Classic marks the rematch of **Buffering (Aus)** (Mossman {Aus}) and **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the one-two finishers of the G1 Manikato S. at Moonee Valley Oct. 25. The veteran Buffering was earning a much-awaited first Group 1 victory that day while holding on from the Hong Kong-invader Lucky Nine in the dying strides, and the latter's trainer Casper Fownes revealed after the race that Lucky Nine was not at peak fitness, and he expects an improved run in this spot. While the 1200 meter distance is the same, the course could not be more different, as the two favorites will switch from Moonee Valley's quirky square track to the Flemington straight. While Buffering has never won over today's course he has been four-times placed, twice behind Black Caviar (Aus) (Bel Esprit {Aus}). Lucky Nine will run up a straight course for the first time. **Sessions (Aus)** (Lonhro {Aus}) made a strong late run to be third in the Manikato, and looks to be coming into his best form. **Rebel Dane (Aus)** (California Dane {Aus}) could manage only fifth that day, but was likely hampered by a troubled trip.

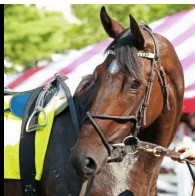

Third that day was **Sacred Falls (NZ)** (O'Reilly {NZ}), who searches for his first win since a breakthrough victory over Pierro (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) in the G1 Doncaster Mile in April.

Out of the Gate with Kathy Ritvo

Kathy Ritvo is the trainer of 2013 GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Mucho Macho Man. Raised in Braintree, Mass., Ritvo was born into a horse racing family. She took out her trainer's license in 1990 at 18 and has since amassed nearly 200 wins with purse earnings of more than \$8 million. In 2008, Ritvo was diagnosed with cardiomyopathy and underwent a heart transplant. Within six months she returned to training horses, against the advice of her doctors. Ritvo took over the training of Mucho Macho Man in 2010 and on Saturday became the first female trainer to win the Classic when Mucho Macho Man fended off Will Take Charge and Declaration of War in a thrilling conclusion to the race's 30th edition. She is married to Tim Ritvo, president and general manager of Gulfstream Park.

You had an amazing Breeders' Cup. After such a tumultuous year, what were your expectations coming into Saturday?

KR: I thought he would run really well. He had been training very well at Santa Anita and had a very good prep race for the Breeders' Cup. Cont. p19

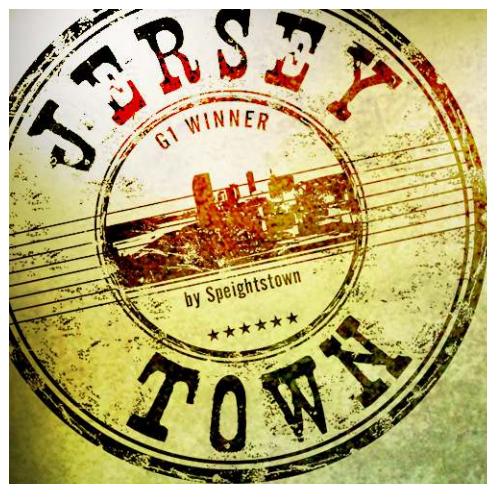

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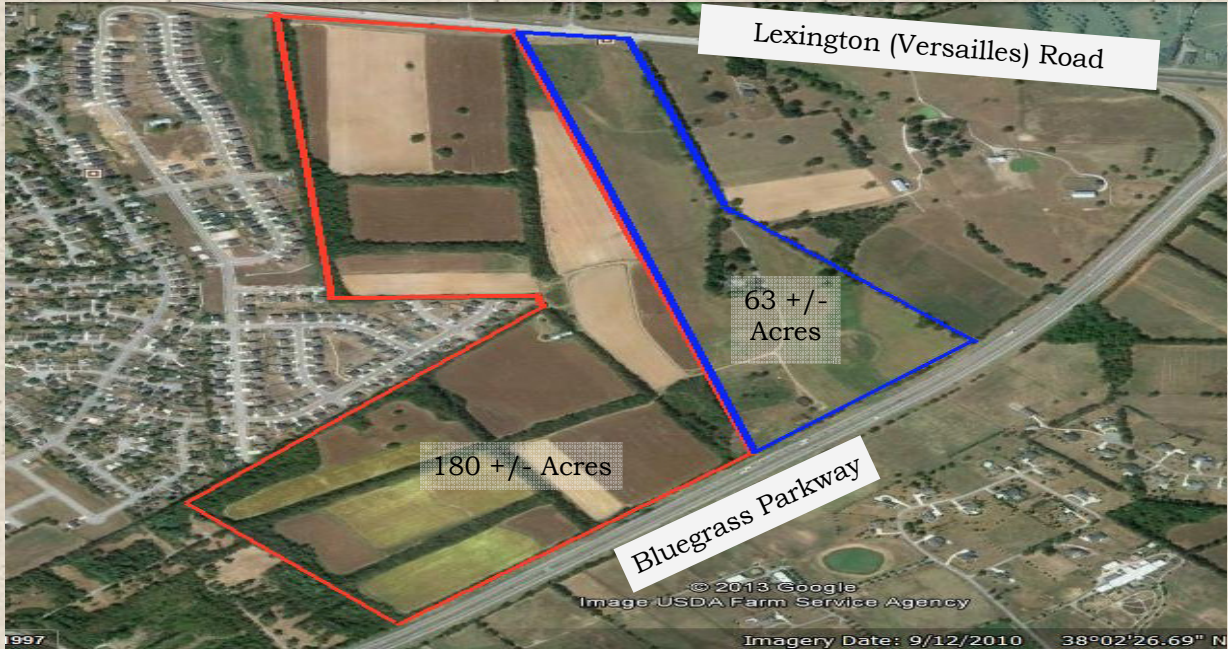

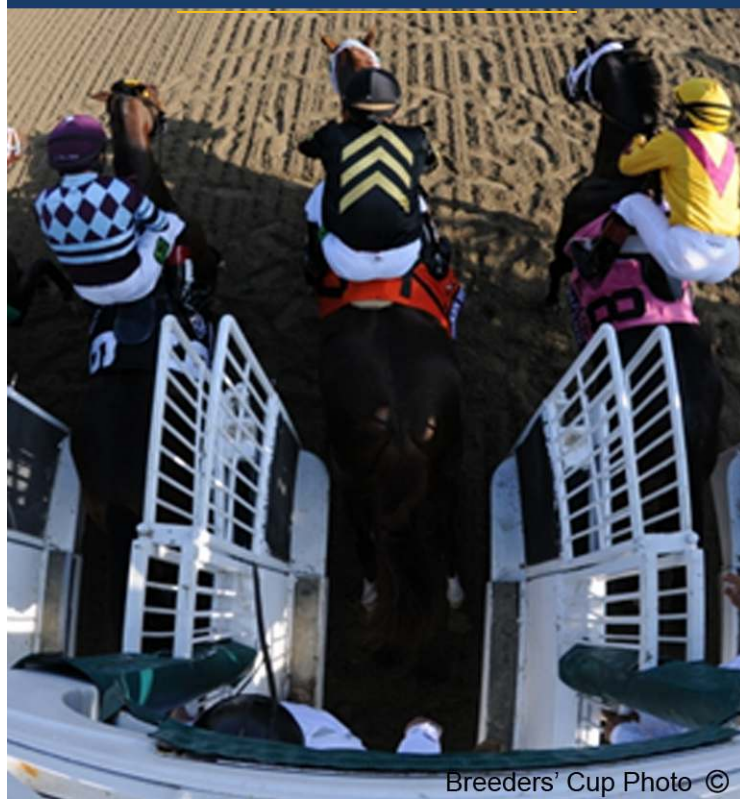
