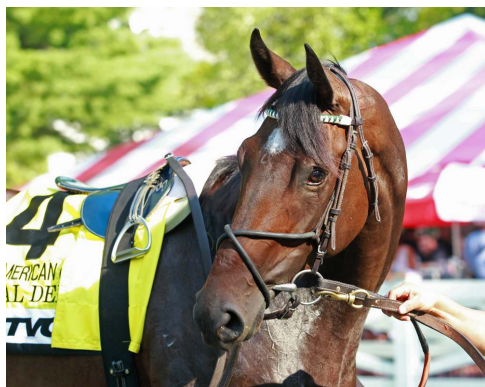




ROYAL DELTA RETIRED

Royal Delta (Empire Maker--Delta Princess, by A.P. Indy), a two-time Eclipse Award and GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner, has been retired from racing, Besilu Stables' Fabricio Buffalo confirmed Wednesday. She will be bred to Coolmore's Galileo (Ire)

(Sadler's Wells). Bred by the late Saud bin Khaled's Palides Investments NV Inc, Royal Delta raced in those colors at two and three for trainer Bill Mott, earning **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★** status with a 12-length debut victory in October 2010,

posted her first added-money success in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. the following May, then overwhelmed her rivals by 5 1/2 lengths to register a breakthrough Grade I victory over It's Tricky (Mineshaft) in the Alabama S. in the summer of 2011. The lanky dark bay was a distant runner-up to Horse of the Year Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in that year's GI Beldame S., but, with that one opting for a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, outclassed her rivals and secured champion 3-year-old filly honors with a handy defeat of It's Tricky in the Ladies' Classic under the lights at Churchill Downs. The next morning she made the 60-odd-mile drive across Interstate 64 to be sold in the Keeneland November Sale some 96 hours after her Breeders' Cup score. The bidding was fierce, with Adena Springs's Frank Stronach and relative newcomer Ben Leon the last titans standing, and it was the Florida-based Leon who was extended to \$8.5 million ([video](#)) for the sale's prized offering ([click here for sale coverage](#)). Snowden will set up a public training operation with his son and assistant Paul at Warwick Farm in Sydney. During his time with Darley, Snowden oversaw the campaigns of Group 1 winners Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality {Aus}), Helmet (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), Denman (Aus) (Lonhro {Aus}) and Guelph (Aus) (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). "It has been a rewarding six years and I am proud of all that we have achieved," Snowden said. "It is the right time to move on with my son Paul and take on a new challenge. It is something we have always wanted to do. With an operation like this it is only fair that there is plenty of time for a transition. Sheikh Mohammed has provided me with an amazing opportunity and I will be forever grateful. When the time comes, we will deal with the farewells, but for now my focus is on producing results for Darley." Darley's Managing Director Henry Plumptre said, "Sheikh Mohammed is very grateful to Peter for his efforts since joining Darley. Peter's record speaks for itself and we have been very fortunate to have him as our head trainer. His legacy will continue as we benefit from the offspring of champions Sepoy, Helmet and Denman."

One of the first to approach Leon post-sale was Bill Mott, whom the new owner entrusted with the care of the filly, and she was second to an in-form Awesome Maria in the GII Sabin S. in February 2012, then

returned from a trip to the G1 Dubai World Cup to win the GII Fleur de Lis H. by a whopping eight lengths. She added a courageous victory in the GII Delaware H. and drilled It's Tricky by 9 1/2 lengths to go one better in the Beldame before showing her heels to the field in recording a

second straight Ladies' Classic at Santa Anita and ringing up a second straight Eclipse. Connections could easily have called time on her career 12 months ago, but Royal Delta remained in training, winning the GII Sabin S. by five lengths and repeating in the GI Delaware H., this time by better than 10 lengths. She also added a sixth Grade I tally in this year's Personal Ensign H. and heads to the breeding shed with a sparkling record of 22-12-5-1 and earnings of \$4,811,126.

Reminiscing About Royal:

Owner Benjamin Leon:

"I've had many great moments in my life but the joy and pleasure that Royal Delta has brought to me and my family is indescribable. She offered us the opportunity to enjoy wonderful places, people and experiences. She was a gift that allowed us many thrilling moments and we will be forever grateful. Retiring her was a tough decision, especially given the fact that she looks as good as she does, but we believe in doing what's in her best interest. I would like to give special thanks to her Hall of Fame trainer and my friend Bill Mott who has guided her through such a successful racing career and also to my friend, Mike Smith, her Hall of Fame rider. I am looking forward to our future and the new chapter in her life."

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RACETRACK ROUND-UP

Wise Dan Parades at Churchill Closing Day

Reining Horse of the Year **Wise Dan**, a leading contender to repeat that honor after a second straight win in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, will be paraded in the paddock at Churchill Downs on closing day, Nov. 30. Trainer Charlie LoPresti will van Wise Dan from his Keeneland barn in Lexington to Churchill Downs so that area fans can show their appreciation to the 6-year-old gelding. The is slated between Races three and four around 1:15-1:45 p.m. ET.

Churchill Announces Purse Reductions

Churchill Downs announced a reduction in purses that will affect four races scheduled during the eight days remaining in the 25-day Fall Meet that continues through Nov. 30. The adjustments included a purse reduction of \$25,000 each for a pair of stakes (now \$150,000-added) scheduled for Nov. 30: GII Kentucky Jockey Club and GII Golden Rod S. Additionally, Churchill Downs officials have opted to eliminate one race each on two of the remaining racing days. The races will be dropped from the programs scheduled for Sunday, Nov. 24, and Wed. Nov. 27. Each of those racing cards will now consist of nine races.

GAME IS ON FOR THE DUDE

Looking for redemption following a ninth-place effort in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again) is reported to be in fine fettle as he rounds out his 2013 campaign in the Nov. 29 GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs. Bob Baffert, who is pleased with the bay's progress since that lackluster effort, indicated a high impost would be the only issue that could derail plans for his charge's cross-country trip.

"The weight is a factor," said Baffert. "He's coming off a loss, so I guess he'll get some consideration."

Weight assignments will be announced Friday, Nov. 22.

Game On Dude won all five starts prior to the Classic, including the GI Pacific Classic and GI Hollywood Gold Cup, in which he carried a career-high 127 pounds. Also among this season's Clark nominees is **Will Take Charge** (Unbridled's Song), who finished a nose behind Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) in the BC Classic.

In his most recent a.m. preparatory move for ahead of the Clark, Game On Dude completed six furlongs in 1:12.60 at Santa Anita Nov. 17.

"He's doing really well," said Baffert. "Right now, all systems are go."

Baffert indicated the 6-year-old will have one more pre-Clark work this weekend before he ships to Kentucky on Wednesday.

TOP TURFERS TO COLLIDE IN HONG KONG

A total of 55 horses from nine racing jurisdictions on four continents have been extended invitations to the Longines Hong Kong International Races to be staged at Sha Tin Racecourse Sunday, Dec. 8. Of that number, fully 21 are winners at the Grade/Group 1 level,

including a pair of defending champions in their respective races. **Red Cadeaux (GB)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) provided owner and former Hong Kong Jockey Club executive Ronald Arculli with an emotional victory in last year's G1 Hong Kong Vase (2400

meters), and the likeable chestnut--most recently runner-up in the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 5--will have to deal with the likes of **The Fugue (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) if he is to become the third horse to register multiple victories in the event. The latter, whose connections opted for the Vase instead of the G1 Hong Kong Cup at 10 furlongs, exits a narrow defeat at the hands of Magician (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf and will try to join Borgia (Ger), Vallee Enchantee (Ire), Ouija Board (GB) and Daryakana (Fr) as members of the fairer sex to beat the boys in the Vase. Also possible for the Vase are **Mount Athos (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}), **Simenon (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) and **Dandino (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), third, fourth and fifth, respectively, in the "Race that Stops a Nation." After briefly toying with the idea of pointing for the G1 Hong Kong Mile, **Lord Kanaloa (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) is back to defend his title in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in what could well be his final career appearance. The 5-year-old successfully stretched out to the 1600 meters earlier this year for an emphatic win in the G1 Yasuda Kinen, but will come into the Sprint off a second consecutive victory in the G1 Sprinters' S. at Nakayama Sept. 29. The main threat looks to be Hong Kong's **Lucky Nine (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the 2011 champion, who is returning from a two-race stint in Australia. No European runner has ever succeeded in the 1200-meter heat, but **Sole Power (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) will try to return to the form that saw him take the G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 18.

Though two-time defending champion California Memory (Highest Honor {Fr}) will miss the G1 Hong Kong Cup via a possible career-ending injury, the day's richest race at HK\$22 million (US\$2.8 million) will feature an interesting clash between reigning Hong Kong Horse of the Year

Military Attack (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) and French stalwart **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}), who was withdrawn from last year's Cup on the eve of the race. **Little Mike**

(Spanish Steps) will fly the flag for the United States in the race as he cuts back to the distance at which he won the 2012 G1 Arlington Million. Mike Smith is scheduled to ride. **Side Glance (GB)** (Passing Glance {GB}) looms an interesting candidate off a last-out victory in the G1 Mackinnon S. at Flemington Nov. 2, while last year's Hong Kong Derby hero **Akeed Mofeed (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) suggested he may be a force to be reckoned with when a slashing second to Endowing (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in last Sunday's G2 Jockey Club Cup. The G1 Hong Kong Mile looks the race of the meeting, as it has attracted Cartier Horse of the Year finalist **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), perfect in four starts this season in France, and the tough 3-year-old filly miler **Sky Lantern (Ire)** (Red Clubs {Ire}). Local horses have annexed the last seven runnings of the Mile, and it will likely be up to the progressive **Gold-Fun (Ire)** (Le Vie Dei Colori {GB}) to keep the trophy in Hong Kong. The handsome chestnut ran down Helene Spirit (Ire) (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) in the G2 Jockey Club Mile last weekend. **King Kreesa** (King Cugat) is the second of two Americans likely to make the trip. Winner earlier this summer of Belmont's GIII Poker S., the New York-bred was runner-up to Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) in the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 10 and landed the Mohawk H. at Belmont Oct. 19. "The outstanding quality of this year's overseas selections for the Longines Hong Kong International Races emphasises the esteem in which this event is held and its importance in the international calendar," said Bill Nader, Hong Kong Jockey Club's Executive Director of Racing. "Moonlight Cloud is one of the sport's true show stoppers. Her presence alongside champions that include European Classic winners, a Breeders' Cup winner and two returning heroes from last year's edition of the Turf World Championships, is testament to the event's premier standing among international horsemen." CLASSIC FAMILY TO THE FORE

As many fresh faces arrived at Goffs for the third round of foal trade, Timmy Hyde of Camas Park Stud made his presence felt in the ring when pushing the bidding past the six-figure mark for the first time for a High Chaparral (Ire) weanling ([lot 592](#)), who was eventually knocked down for €120,000. As the auction of more than 900 foals draws to its conclusion today, the Goffs team can feel justifiably satisfied with

a strong renewal of this section of its November Sale ahead of tomorrow's much anticipated Paulyn Dispersal, which runs from lots 1104 to 1128 within the mares' section. The clearance rate, which has been strong all week, improved by eight points on the same session last year at 87% for the 188 foals sold from 216 offered. This naturally led to an increase in aggregate of 16% to €4,818,500, as well as rises in average of 6% to €25,630 and median, which was up by 5%, to €22,000.

From the strong German family of St Leger winner Masked Marvel (GB), the sales-topping colt's dam Wurfklinge (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) is a sister to Group 2 winner and top broodmare Wurftaube (Ger), whose offspring include Deutsches Derby winner Waldpark (Ger) (Dubawi {Ire}) and Masked Marvel's dam Waldmark (Ger) (Mark Of Esteem {Ire}).

"It's a terrific family and he's by a great sire. I thought he was a very good-looking colt," said Hyde, who plans to bring him back to auction as a yearling.

The April-born colt was offered by Tom Gaffney's Churchtown House Stud, which acquired Wurfklinge as a 4-year-old at Tattersalls for 25,000gns. She was offered for sale carrying this colt at Goffs last year, but was led out unsold at €38,000.

A yearling average in excess of €85,000 for 60 yearlings sold this autumn is testament to the early popularity of Coolmore sire Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and his weanlings are similarly in favour, with a colt out of the Danehill mare Sumingasefa (GB) ([lot 568](#)) another on Hyde's list. He bought the April-born half-brother to two winners for €85,000.

Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock saw off attempts from Tony and Roger O'Callaghan plus Eddie O'Leary to secure a close relative of Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}), the treble Group 1 winner who has recently been retired to the Royals Studs in Norfolk. The Big Bad Bob colt ([lot 672](#)) is the second foal of Al Kazeem's Motivator (GB) sister Fire Up (GB) and brought €95,000 for consignor Catherinestown Stud Farm.

"I'm Al Kazeem's biggest fan and we're planning to send him a good group of mares for various clients," said Brown of his pinhook. "I'm a fan of Big Bad Bob too, but the fact that Al Kazeem was so close up on the page was really appealing."

Irish National Stud resident Big Bad Bob enjoyed a good day with his three colts offered returning a total of €155,000. Paddy Twomey signed the docket on behalf of Abbey Farm for a €90,000 Approve (Ire) colt ([lot 614](#)) out of an Exceed And Excel (Aus) half-sister to this season's group-winning juvenile Hot Streak (Ire) (Iffraaj {GB}). He is the first foal of Ashtown Girl (Ire) and was consigned by Cregg Stud for Barry Noonan. The colt, a descendant of Height Of Fashion (Fr), is another who will be returning to the sales ring within a year.

While there's been plenty of interest in the offspring of young, unproven sires this week, one who has enjoyed a great year on the track and whose sales results have benefited accordingly is Ifraaj (GB) (Zafonic). G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf heroine Chriselliam (Ire) and G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Rizeena (Ire) have advertised the precocious prowess of his runners and a pair of colts by the Kildangan Stud resident fetched €78,000 and €68,000, respectively.

Jamie Railton signed for the more expensive of the pair ([lot 499](#)), the first foal of Mujarah (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), a half-sister to G3 Curragh Cup winner Tactic (GB) (Sadler's Wells), their dam Tanaghum (GB) (Darshaan {GB}) being a daughter of Classic-winning champion 3-year-old Mehthaaf (Nureyev). The second ([lot 561](#)), out of the Hawk Wing mare Soxy Doxy (Ire), was bought by pinhooker Paula Flannery of PF Bloodstock, who also signed for a Dandy Man colt ([lot 661](#)) out of the unraced Easee On (Ire) (Hawk Wing) for €36,000.

Colts dominated the top end of the trade, with just one filly making the day's top 10. That was Moorfield Stud's daughter of Arcano (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) ([lot 685](#)) out of the Second Empire (ire) mare Hi Katriona (Ire), who fetched €62,000 and was one of 11 foals bought throughout the sale by the top pinhooking outfit Tally Ho Stud.

The O'Callaghan family team is leading the buying bench to date with an outlay of €350,000.

[Lot 648](#) was the first foal of Derby winner Pour Moi (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) to be offered for sale and fetched €40,000 to a bid from Emerald Isle Bloodstock. The Coolmore stallion has eight weanlings in the sale, with the remaining seven, including a Jim Bolger-bred half-sister to Group 3 winner Rehn's Nest (Ire) (Authorized {Ire}) ([lot 781](#)), going under the hammer today.

The final foal session begins at 11 a.m. local time and is followed by a small catalogue of yearlings.

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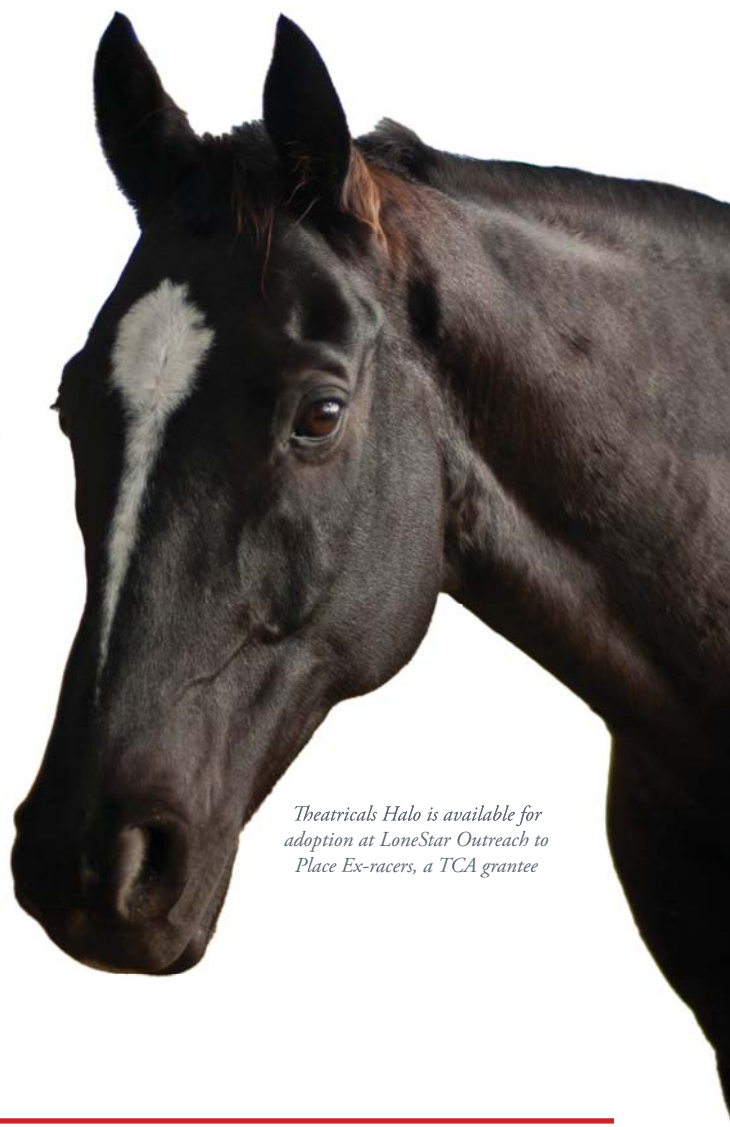

One of the pick of a clutch of choice Acclamations on offer today, this March-foaled bay is a full sister to the group-winning sprinting juvenile and sire Lilbourne Lad (Ire), whose first crop are selling here.

Also a half to the pattern-race performer Bobbyscot (Ire) (Alhaarth {Ire}) and Ballydoyle's smart Bluebell (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}), her page includes the Newberry Stud family of the Classic-placed Gothic Dream (Ire) (Nashwan).

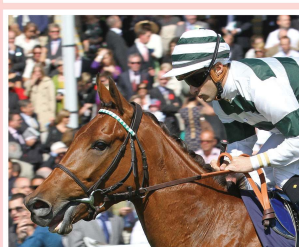

The letter will be presented by Subcommittee member and State Representative of Kentucky Brett Guthrie during Thursday's hearing to discuss H.R. 2012, Horseracing Safety and Integrity Act of 2013. The letter was signed by Alex Waldrop--President and CEO of the NTRA, as well as Chairman of the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC).

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It details comprehensive advances in uniform national medication guidelines, an enhanced penalty system focused on repeat offenders, restrictions on the use and administration of furosemide (Lasix) and a laboratory accreditation and quality assurance program. Eight states in the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast have already committed to enacting the reforms. Nearly a dozen other states are in the process of adopting them. Meanwhile, industry representatives are appearing before the California Horse Racing Board Thursday to advocate for adoption of the reforms in California and, earlier this week, the Illinois Racing Board overwhelmingly approved the initiation of rulemaking that will lead to that state's compliance. An excerpt from the letter reads, "We continue to work cooperatively with regulators and local industry groups in multiple jurisdictions to push this initiative forward...[Y]ou have our commitment that we will work diligently toward full implementation of the Reforms on a nationwide basis, because the Reforms are in the best interests of the health and safety of both horse and rider, enhance the integrity of our sport, ensure a level playing field for our competitors, assist horsemen who race in multiple jurisdictions and accomplish the uniform regulation of racing in the United States."

NTRA LETTER PROMOTES RECENT NATIONAL REFORM EFFORT

The Subcommittee on Commerce, Manufacturing and Trade of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, will hold a hearing at 10:00 A.M. on Thursday, November 21 regarding the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act (H.R. 2012). This bill, which was introduced by Rep. Joe Pitts (R-PA), designates the U. S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), a non-governmental agency, as the authority to permit/prohibit the drugs and medications that may be administered to a horse in a race subject to an interstate off-track wager.

The NTRA is submitting a letter to the subcommittee to inform them of the national reform effort recently undertaken by the horse racing industry to enhance the safety and integrity of our sport. The reforms, which are comprehensive and far reaching, include: 1) uniform national model medication guidelines; 2) a penalty system designed to target individuals with multiple medication violations; 3) restrictions on the use and administration of furosemide; and 4) a laboratory accreditation and quality assurance program (the "Reforms"). RECORDS FALL AT NZB READY TO RUN SALE

The New Zealand Bloodstock's Ready to Run Sale ended its two-day record-setting run in Karaka Wednesday, with new marks for average, median and turnover. In all, 232 juveniles sold for NZ\$18,462,500. The average rose 9% to NZ\$79,580, while the median was up 4% to NZ\$50,000. The clearance rate was 62%.

"There has been some very good competition over the past two days, particularly at the top end of the market," commented NZB Co-Managing Director Petrea Vela. "We would have liked to see the clearance rate strengthen even further, but the returns are still ahead of last year with some very pleasing results. We are grateful for the support of all who have participated this week, and wish buyers the very best of luck with their Karaka purchases."

A colt by **High Chaparral (Ire)** brought the sale's top price when selling for NZ\$430,000 (US\$355,529) to **David Ellis**. [Lot 401](#), consigned by **Regal Farm**, is out of **Deduction (NZ)** (**Zabeel {NZ}**), a three-quarter sister to two-time Australian Horse of the Year **Might and Power (NZ)**.

"I genuinely think this is the nicest colt I've bought here at Karaka since [multiple champion] **Darci Brahma (NZ)**," commented **Ellis**, who was the auction's leading buyer with seven purchased for NZ\$910,000. "He's an absolutely stunning colt, on the same cross as [MG1SW] **It's a Dundeel (NZ)** (**High Chaparral {Ire}**)."

Ellis added, "At the Karaka Sales in January, I bought four colts for a syndicate that had the misfortune of losing the **Fastnet Rock (Aus)** colt when he broke his leg at trackwork just a couple of weeks ago. So I have bought this colt to replace him. He's a colt that we could send to Christchurch for the G1 2000 Guineas and then train on for the G1 New Zealand Derby and the big staying races in Australia."

[Lot 319](#), a son of **O'Reilly (NZ)**, was the sale's second-highest priced lot when selling for NZ\$340,000 to the bid of the Sydney-based **Round Table Racing** and **James Harron Bloodstock**. The youngster is out of **Aria (NZ)** (**Centaine {Aus}**) and is a half-brother to last weekend's group winner **Floria (NZ)** (**Savabeel {Aus}**).

"He was our number one pick of the sale," said **Bruce Slade**, director of **Round Table Racing**. "He's not only physical, but we did a lot of stride analysis and he has a great gallop as well as probably the best pedigree in the sale. He picked himself, really. Thankfully we had enough to secure him."

"**Gai Waterhouse** will be training him," **Slade** added. "We will target 3-year-old middle distance races in Australia with him, as he fits into that category and the New Zealand-breds have it to themselves."

Slade said he is optimistic about the sale's graduates.

"We've selected this sale because it has been getting results and with these horses we're one step closer to getting to the races for the owners," he explained.

The Ready to Run Sale's third leading buyer was the **China Inner Mongolia Rider Horse Group**, which purchased six lots for NZ\$655,000. Leading the group was a NZ\$220,000 son of **Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)** ([lot 371](#)).

"The good price and good quality are the main reasons we are targeting New Zealand horses," said **Lang Ling**, a Manchu restaurateur and hotelier who heads the group. "Compared with other racehorse sales in the world, Irish and American for example, the horses in New Zealand are more affordable, especially because of the free trade agreement between New Zealand and China. We have purchased over 400 horses from New Zealand since last year and recently met with New Zealand's Ministry of Agriculture, who told us that China imports 20% of resources from New Zealand."

Lang added, "Of the horses we have purchased at this sale the **Savabeel** [[lot 26](#)] and the **Holy Roman Emperor** [[Lot 371](#)] will remain in New Zealand and we will target the G1 New Zealand Derby and hopefully other Australasian races. The **Iffraaj (GB)** and the **Alamosa (NZ)** will be going back to China."
