A FLAT OUT RUNNER

Squaring off against a star-studded field of more flashy types in yesterday's GI Cigar Mile H., the old veteran **Flat Out** (Flatter) asserted his superiority to provide Hall of Fame conditioner Bill Mott with a second renewal in three years of the race named for the most accomplished horse he has ever trained. The Preston Stables colorbearer, who was running for a \$750,000 purse as a Grade I winner thanks to added incentives from NYRA, uncorked a powerful turn move from midpack and dispatched with pacesetter **Private Zone** (Macho Uno) in the final sixteenth to win by 1 1/4 lengths at 6-1 odds. **Verrazano** (More Than Ready) took third, while Breeders' Cup winners **Groupie Doll** (Bowman's Band) and **Goldencents** (Into Mischief), favored at 3-1, could do no better than fourth and seventh, respectively.

"This horse, I can't say enough about him," said Mott, who annexed this race two years ago with To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) and with Cigar himself in 1994 when it was contested as the NYRA Mile. "He's just been a real tough, durable horse, a horse that I've always felt may be as good at a flat mile as he is at 10 furlongs. Although he has won the [GI] Jockey Club Gold Cup twice at 10 furlongs, [he's] versatile enough to get up and get the job done at a mile." **Cont. p3**

Lane's End Racing and Dell Ridge Farm's ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ **Honor Code** (A.P. Indy) looked defeated as **Cairo Prince** (Pioneerof the Nile) gained command in the stretch

in yesterday's GII Remsen S. at the Big A, but he called on all of his class to fight back and post a thrilling nose decision. Off to a slight stumble at the start, the 4-5 chalk was placed in a tracking fourth along the inside through a glacial opening quarter in :25.84. Jockey Javier Castellano quickly got a sense of the slow

fractions and had his charge challenge for the lead from the outside through a half mile in :52.74. Honor Code poked a head in front at the top of the lane, and was immediately tackled by the aforementioned unbeaten winner of the GII Nashua S. Nov. 3. Cairo Prince took over in the stretch and looked to have it all wrapped up, but Honor Code never said die while pinned on the inside, and got his nose down on the line first in dramatic fashion. "He showed a lot of guts," Hall of Fame trainer Shug McGaughey said. "I'm proud of him. I think the horse in second is a nice horse, and it was a peculiar race." **Cont. p5**

Flat Out, winner of Belmont's 2011 Jockey Club Gold Cup for Scooter Dickey and the 2012 running for Mott, needed three starts to round into form this year at age seven, but when he did, he earned a gaudy 116 Beyer Speed Figure for besting the talented Cross Traffic (Unbridled's Song) in that venue's one-mile

GIII Westchester H. Apr. 27. Third as the favorite with slight trouble in the GI Metropolitan H. May 27, he grabbed a second GII Suburban H. title July 6. Flat Out was out-headed by Alpha (Bernardini) in

Saratoga's sloppy GI Woodward S. Aug. 31, and could only muster a third-place run after an awkward start behind former stablemate Ron the Greek (Full Mandate) when trying for a Jockey Club three-peat as a prep for Santa Anita.

Content to track from the back of the first flight as Private Zone posted solid splits of :22.59 and :45.39 with that runner's stablemate Goldencents and an eager Clearly Now (Horse Greeley) in closest pursuit, Flat Out caught the eye when mounting a bid four or five wide on the turn. He kept on coming in the stretch despite failing to switch leads, and was taken in hand nearing the wire to score snugly. The stewards conducted an inquiry into a bad stumble by Clearly Now near the top of the stretch, but determined that he caused his own trouble. Cont. p4

"He broke very well," said winning pilot Junior Alvarado of his trip. "I put him in the race and made sure he wasn't too far back. I had a perfect trip. I couldn't ask for anything better than that. For him, I think it was the dream trip--on the outside, clear, nothing bothering him, the speed was going very fast in front. When I asked him, he definitely gave me all he had. He's a very nice horse and he made a very nice run."

Preston Stables is the nom de course of Art Preston, a Texas-based geologist who spent more than four decades in the gas and oil business. He has been involved in Thoroughbred ownership since the 70s, and operates Oxbow Farm in Paris, Kentucky. In addition to the various stakes campaigners to run under the Preston Stables banner, he owned two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Da Hoss along with his brothers J.R. and Jack as Prestonwood Farm.

SAY WHAT?

Doug O'Neill, trainer of Private Zone and Goldencents:

We've got to try to dissect [Goldencents's performance]. [Jockey Rafael Bejarano] said [Saratoga Snacks {Tale of the Cat}] kind of stumbled and almost came over in front of Goldencents. After that, he thought he had him in a good spot, but just didn't kick on like we had hoped. No real excuse, just trying to figure it all out.

[Private Zone] ran big. He ran huge. It's one of those things where the 5-2 runs like a 30-1 shot and the 30-1 shot runs like a 5-2 shot. Just a head scratcher, but we'll regroup. We'll go over them good and figure out a game plan.

Todd Pletcher, trainer of Verrazano, Forty Tales (Tale of the Cat) and Capo Bastone (Street Boss):

I thought Verrazano ran well. It was obviously a very tough race with a lot of experienced veterans, so I thought he ran well.

Irad [Ortiz, aboard Capo Bastone] said he got clobbered at the start and lost all chance. Forty Tales put in his run, but just flattened out a little bit."

Buff Bradley, trainer of Groupie Doll, who was making her first start for Many Pope's Whisper Hill Farm after Bradley, his father William, Carl Hurst and Brent Burns sold her for \$3.1 million at Keeneland November:

[Rider] Rajiv [Maragh] had some problems on the backside going into the turn. You can't [alter course] like that on this track. We took a shot. Mandy did a great job bringing her up here. That's why they load them in the gate. You have a good horse, you have to run, you have to see.

McGaughey continued, "We'll give him a little time and take him to Payson. He's going to run that far [Triple Crown distances], we just have to figure out how he wants to do it." A sparkling last-to-first debut winner in the Saratoga slop Aug. 31, he followed with a heart-breaking second going a one-turn mile in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Park Oct. 5. McGaughey decided to skip the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita in favor of this spot for his two-turn debut.

Castellano has been aboard Honor Code in his last two starts. "I didn't put him up there; he put me there," the rider, who was winning his fifth race on the card in the Remsen, said of Honor Code's trip "The way he ran the first part, he showed me more speed and was more comfortable and relaxed. I felt the pace was slow. The opportunity was there; I took it. I know he's a come-from-behind horse, but the pace was slow. I didn't want to fight him." Castellano continued, "I think Cairo Prince tried to make the strong, sweeping move and tried to get the jump. My horse is a big, long-striding horse and he anticipated it a little bit. He found a second gear and he came back. He galloped out very strong. The horse showed me he would like more distance. Today, he proved a lot. He's a special horse, and you can put him wherever you want."

Trainer Todd Pletcher took his third-straight renewal of this race--and second in a row for owner Mike Repole--while completing the exacta as well for good measure. Stopchargingmaria aired by 5 1/2 lengths when unveiled sprinting at the Spa July 19, and splashed home second behind Sweet Reason (Street Sense) in the GI Spinaway S. Sept. 1. She was third behind Artemis Agrotera (Roman Ruler) and the Spinaway winner in Belmont's GI Frizette S. Oct. 5, and skipped the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies for the day-later local GIII Tempted S. Nov. 3, which she took by a decisive 10 3/4-length margin.

Attempting to go two turns for the first time against several runners who appeared on pedigree to be more suited to the distance, the dark bay kept token pressure on Penwith through easy splits of :25.38, :50.65 and six furlongs in 1:15.45. The pacesetter opened up a sliver of daylight at the top of the lane, as the other Pletcher representative Got Lucky looked like the main danger as she snuck up the inside. Penwith made things tight on the rail for Get Lucky, but that rival squeezed her way through, only to be immediately tackled by her stablemate in a close finish for the top three.

"I was pleased with both of their races," Pletcher said of the top two. "[It was a] big effort by Got Lucky in her second start. The thing I thought [Stopchargingmaria] had going for her is a good foundation and the fact that she has a good mind. She's very ratable. She's kind. She's not the kind you have to worry about getting too headstrong, but it's a mile and an eighth, and it's a long way for 2-year-old fillies."

Repole and Pletcher teamed up last year in this event with

Unlimited Budget (Street Sense). While that runner settled for third in the GI Kentucky Oaks after two subsequent graded wins at Fair Grounds, fellow Pletcher trainee Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) took the Aqueduct route to an upset victory on the first Friday in May.

"It's nice winning this race back-to-back years. To win it with Unlimited Budget and now with Stopchargingmaria, it's fun," offered Repole. "[Stopchargingmaria] was so close to being a Grade I horse. We put her in Grade III company last time and she won impressively. Today, she had an advantage with four races under her belt as opposed to some of them who had run once or twice. I didn't know if she would get this distance, but if she ever was going to win at 1 1/8 miles, today was the day."

This race lost much of its luster with the late defection of heavy morning-line favorite ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Almost Famous (Unbridled's Song), but Tapiture seized the opportunity to break his maiden at the right time. Second to subsequent GI Hopeful S. romper Strong Mandate (Tiznow) in a Saratoga sprint Aug. 17, the chestnut just missed when third in the GIII Iroquois S. over track and trip Sept. 7. Dropped back against non-winners here Oct. 27, the Winchell homebred settled for third behind Culprit (Street Sense) and Notability (English Channel).

Squeezed out ever-so-slightly soon after the break, Tapiture tugged his way up between horses to be second leaving the backstretch behind a half in :47.67 set by Laddie Boy. He put a head in front of that rival while in the two path late on the turn, and left the pacesetter in his dust by midstretch to pull well clear.

"My horse is a little green--he doesn't know how to run yet," said rider Ricardo Santana, Jr. "My horse had run three times already and he's learning. I had a lot of confidence in my horse. When I asked him, he finished really good."

Steve Asmussen, who said that Tapiture will now join his Fair Grounds string, added, "We had planned on running him in a maiden race at the beginning of the meet as a prep for this. It didn't go as planned, but he came out of it good, trained really well and just stayed the course. It's awfully fun to have another nice homebred for the Winchells." **Cont. p8**

She asserted three deep leaving the home bend as lukewarm favorite **Bird Maker** revved up in behind, and **Stonetastic** braced for various challenges on the front end. **Vexed** took over in midstretch, and kept finding with the help of left-handed Shaun Bridgmohan encouragement to keep **Bird Maker** always safely at bay and earn a record-tying 32nd stakes winner for co-owner Claiborne Farm.

"To me it looked like she took a pretty big step forward," offered winning conditioner Al Stall, Jr. "I liked the way she acted in the paddock--she was really flat-footed. Shaun said that once she got clear of [jockey] Corey [Lanerrie on **Stonetastic**]--he was putting a little heat on her--she really just dropped it and started galloping along and finished up when she saw some horses coming to her. I think we saw what we needed to see so it's a question of just managing her and trying to get back here in May [for the GI Kentucky Oaks]."

Vexed, out of a half-sister to MGSW **Lattice** (**Arch**), has 3/4-brothers by Claiborne resident **Blame** (**Arch**) foaled in 2012 and 2011. "That mare has been good to us," confirmed Claiborne's Dell Hancock. "She has a nice **Blame** yearling, so let's hope he can come on and be a nice horse and go from there."

Hammered down to prohibitive favoritism, Last Gunfighter proved worthy of that faith in earning a career best. The John Gunther homebred was away well from the three hole and settled near the back of the pack in the two-path early. The 5-2 second choice, Alpha (Bernardini), seized command and loped along on a comfortable lead through fractions of :25.09 and :51.14 with Last Gunfighter tracking from the outside. Sent five wide on the turn for home, Last Gunfighter set his sights on Street Spice and began to wear him down with Mister Marti Gras in hot pursuit on the grandstand side. Last Gunfighter drew clear of those rivals in the final furlong to post a clear victory over Mister Marti Gras. Street Spice rounded out the trifecta and pacesetting Alpha held on for fourth.

"We left the gate quickly because he broke so good," said jockey Joe Bravo. "I just had a ton of horse and I let him run closer to the pace than I wanted to, but the pace was so slow. I just wanted to keep him relaxed. He's a big monster and when he gets in his stride, he just takes over."

Last Gunfighter graduated in his first start for trainer Chad Brown at Belmont Oct. 12 of last year, after four previous attempts for conditioner Helen Pitts. That was the start of a six-race win streak that lasted half way into this

season and included Aqueduct's GIII Excelsior S. Mar. 23 and the GIII Pimlico Special S. May 17. His hot streak ended with a valiant second to yesterday's GI Cigar Mile H. hero Flat

Out (Flatter) in Belmont's GII Suburban H. July 6, which he followed with a victory in Monmouth Park's GIII Philip H. Iselin S. Aug. 18. The bay entered this test off back-to-back fifth-place finishes in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont Sept. 28 and GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Nov. 2.

Last Gunfighter's 2-year-old half-brother Lawmaker (Malibu Moon), another Gunther homebred trained by Brown, won on debut at Laurel on Thanksgiving day.

On the engine from her inside draw, she led through fractions of :23.82 and :48.04, kicked for home with a clear lead, and, while drifting out late when collared by longshot Toasting, dug in gamely to win by a head.

Global View angled to the rail and settled near the back of the pack as Ontology (Tapit) streaked out to the early lead. The pacesetter was under a strong hold while racing through fractions of :23.63 and :47.21. He turned for home with a two-length advantage after three-quarters in 1:11.63, but Global View, who had made steady progress along the rail, was tipped out and was winding up for a powerful stretch run. He easily surged past the tiring pacesetter and strode clear. "He's a really nice horse and has always acted like a nice horse," commented winning trainer Tom Proctor. "He's bred to run all day, so I wasn't worried about that. He relaxed, [Joe Talamo] gave him a good trip, and it makes a horse look better when they get a good trip. "That's the best \$25,000 ever spent," trainer Jim Cassidy said of Full Ransom's pricetag as a Barretts May juvenile. "She was reasonably cheap, but she had all the parts in the right place and I really liked her. I liked the way we didn't rush her today. [Victor Espinoza] took hold of her and she got a very good trip wide. The greatest thing about 2-year-olds is they're as honest as the day is long. They haven't figured out anything bad yet." Espinoza added, "I didn't really have any plan going into the race, just leave her alone and make her happy. It just depended how she broke out of the gate. I took my time, swung her to the outside and it worked out well today."

Favored Clenor (Ire) (Oratorio {Ire}) trailed the field for much of the race, rallied in the middle of the course into the stretch and was crowded by the eventual winner before finishing fifth. "When she was trailing behind the others, they slowed it up so much," said Leandro Mora, assistant to trainer Doug O'Neill. "[Full Ransom] boxed her in all the way--which is the proper thing for any rider to do. When she finally got out, the race was over."

He has campaigned, in partnership, stakes winners Dextera (Ger) and Maid for Music (Ire). Breeder Gregg James purchased Retroesque (Red Ransom), with Full Ransom in utero for \$1,700 out of the OBS January sale in 2011.

DIVERSE CAST FOR HOLLYWOOD DERBY

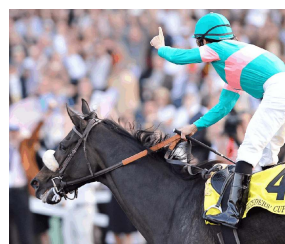
A group of 10 sophomore turfers come from all over to contest today's GI Hollywood Derby. Getting the 5-2 nod on the morning line is Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **Admiral Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). Never worse than second in seven efforts on the grass, the homebred was beaten a head by **Infinite Magic** (More Than Ready) in Arlington's GIII American Derby in July, but returned the following month to annex the GI Secretariat S. with **Jack Milton** (War Front) back in third and fellow Ramsey representative **Amen Kitten** (Kitten's Joy) sixth. The bay was most recently second--one spot ahead of Jack Milton--in Belmont's GI Jamaica H. Oct. 5. The main local hope is lightly raced Stronach homebred **Rookie Sensation** (Unbridled's Song). Trained by John Shirreffs, the grey donned cap and gown second out on the stretch-out over this main track in June before falling a head short in an 8 1/2-furlong Del Mar allowance in July. He broke through at that level with an impressive last-to-first rally Aug. 31, and saved ground before exploding to victory in Santa Anita's GII Twilight Derby on Breeders' Cup Friday Nov. 1. Four also-rans from the Twilight Derby re-oppose here: **Gervinho** (Unusual Heat) (third), **Dry Summer** (Any Given Saturday) (fourth), **Irish Surf** (Giant's Causeway) (seventh) and **Dice Flavor** (Scat Daddy) (eighth). Keith Brackpool's Gervinho took a division of the Oceanside S. at Del Mar in July, and finished second in a division of the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 1. Juddmonte Farms and John Gosden send out the lone European invader in **Seek Again** (Speightstown). The chestnut most recently took a York handicap Oct. 12 for which he earned a solid 109 Racing Post rating.

Better Lucky was second in the June 8 GI Just a Game S. and third in the Sept. 14 Noble Damsel S. before returning to the winner's circle with a narrow victory over **Dayatthespa** (City Zip) in the Oct. 5 GI First Lady S. at Keeneland last time out. Tiz Flirtatious, first or second in six starts after the Matriarch, won the Aug. 11 GII John C. Mabee S. and Sept. 28 GI Rodeo Drive S. She is coming off a close-up sixth-place effort in the Nov. 2 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. Dayatthespa was favored in last year's Matriarch, but she jumped a shadow and propped, losing all chance and finishing fifth. She has raced just four times this year, winning a pair of New York-bred stakes and finishing second in the June 29 GIII Eatontown S. and again in the First Lady. Little Red Feather Racing's **Egg Drop** (Alphabet Soup) is three for four since moving to the turf this summer. TATTERSALLS DECEMBER

RECORD-BREAKING TATTS FOAL SALE ENDS

by Emma Berry

After the dazzlingly strong trade of Friday's session, there were still plenty of buyers with money burning holes in their pockets at Tattersalls Saturday for the final foal day, as was evident by another eight six-figure transactions on a traditionally quieter day. Yet another double-digit rise in aggregate was achieved as the curtain fell on a record-breaking December Foal Sale.

Turnover for the final session, from 149 lots sold (78%), was 4,724,800gns (+28%), bringing the total for the whole sale to 31,420,400gns, a 30% increase on the 2012 turnover. The final-session average of 31,710gns (+29%), compared favourably to the sale's average of 42,460gns (+25%), while the median was 23,000gns (20,000gns on Saturday), an advance of 15%. The one area which did not register an improvement was the clearance rate of 78%, which was down six points, with vendors perhaps deciding to be bolder on reserves in a stronger market.

"More than 30-million guineas have changed hands over the past four days, a sum unprecedented even at the height of the market in 2006 and 2007," said Tattersalls' Chairman Edmond Mahony in his end-of-sale statement. "An average in excess of 40,000gns is also unprecedented and to have sold more than 70 foals for 100,000gns is a clear indication of a foal catalogue of outstanding quality."

The quality act on the final day came from the Irish National Stud, which consigned a colt by its stallion Invincible Spirit (Ire) ([lot 1136](#)) for Italian breeder Giovanni Caiani. He was the most expensive weanling of the day at 220,000gns, knocked down to John Ferguson, who ended the sale as leading vendor, spending over 3-million guineas on 19 weanlings.

The colt is the first foal of the Celtic Swing (GB) mare Growling (Ire), an unraced half-sister to prolific group winner Pressing (Ire) (Soviet Star), who was also bred by Caiani under his Agricola del Parco banner.

"The problems that Italian racing are experiencing are just too difficult. There is not the quality of stallions in Italy and although I have usually sold yearlings in Italy, I think my mares deserve for their progeny to be sold here," said Caiani, who owns "a few mares."

Ferguson also accounted for the second-top lot of the day ([lot 1280](#)), Ballyhampshire Stud's Exceed and Excel (Aus) half-brother to recent French listed winner Riskit For a Biskit (Ire) (Kodiac {Ire}).

M. V. Magnier is never far away when colts by High Chaparral are put through the ring and he signed for [lot 1198](#), from Bob Lanigan's Tullamaine Castle Stud, at 180,000gns.

The January foal is the first of his dam, the dual winner Penny Post (Ire) (Green Desert), who is very closely related to Group 1-winning Danzig siblings Zieten and Blue Duster. Cont. p15

Day of the Dutch...

As headmaster of the Elms School in Malvern, Clive Ashby has passed on plenty of wisdom to his pupils over the years and some of his notable former students among the bloodstock community include David Redvers, Ollie Fowlston, and Will Douglass. And as the breeder of a Dutch Art colt out of Czarna Rosa (GB) (Polish Precedent) ([lot 1186](#)), the teacher gave a masterclass in producing a good commercial foal when the youngster was knocked down to Rathbarry Stud for 135,000gns.

"Clive's been a very good breeder for a long time and he's struck gold with this colt," said Simon Sweeting of Overbury Stud, which consigned the half-brother to listed winner Mabait (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}), who is still in training at the age of seven.

Overbury may be associated in many people's minds with National Hunt stallions--it is the home of multiple champion jumps sire Kayf Tara (GB) and young hopeful Schiaparelli (Ger)--but over the years the Gloucestershire farm has also stood a number of flat stallions, including the former leading first-season sire Bertolini. Recently, Overbury has welcomed new recruit Cityscape (GB)

(Selkirk), who will be available for viewing at Longholes Stud near Tattersalls from today until Wednesday (11 a.m. to 3 p.m.).

"I'm very happy to be involved in both flat and jumps breeding," Sweeting said. "In fact, we've

stood more flat stallions than National Hunt, but because Kayf Tara has been so successful, people naturally think of the jumpers."

Sweeting's draft included another son of Dutch Art, out of a sister to GI E.P. Taylor S. winner Lahaleeb (GB) (Redback {GB}), who sold to Michael Fitzpatrick of Good Will Bloodstock for 95,000gns.

The offspring of the Cheveley Park Stud stallion were much in demand on the final day of foal trade.

Sweeting has a number of mares in partnership with Charlie Wyatt and the good friends were in a celebratory mood after Wyatt's Dukes Stud sold a Dutch Art colt to Shadwell for 160,000gns. [Lot 1150](#) is out of Alice Alleyne (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) who was bought at Tattersalls in 2010 for 50,000gns by Charlie's father, Major Michael Wyatt. Her page has received a good update this season courtesy of her half-sister Avenue Gabriel (GB), who became the first stakes winner for Champs Elysees when winning the Listed Flame Of Tara S. at the Curragh.

Dukes Stud also sold a filly by Dutch Art ([lot 1156](#)) out of multiple winner Amitola (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}) for 50,000gns to Farranamanagh House Stud.

"It's always nice to have a stand-out draft of Saturday foals, this day has always worked well for us," Charlie Wyatt said. "They were by popular sires and thankfully there's still plenty of money around. Dutch Art remains so popular and they are very pleasing results, especially when you think what he stood for when we used him."

Dutch Art's fee in 2012 was £12,000 and it is set to rise to £35,000 next year. His average for 20 weanlings sold at Tattersalls this week was 79,975gns.

The most expensive foal by Darley's first-crop sire Poet's Voice (GB) sold this week was offered by Mickley Stud. A May foal ([lot 1185](#)), the colt was bought by Shadwell for 140,000gns to the delight of co-breeders Richard Kent and Alan Stennett of Allseasons Bloodstock.

"He was born beautiful and he's stayed that way. We've booked three nominations to Poet's Voice because of him," said Kent, who runs the Shrophshire-based Mickley Stud, home to stallions Captain Gerrard (Ire), Overbury (Ire) and Phoenix Reach (Ire). "The mare's always done a great job for us--she lives with a herd of cows!"

The colt's dam Shemriyna (Ire) (King Of Kings {Ire}) was bought by Huntingdon/Norris for €58,000 from the Aga Khan's draft at Arqana's December Sale in 2008 and had proved to be quite a money-spinner for Allseasons Bloodstock. Her Multiplex (GB) filly Hayyona (GB) fetched 130,000gns as a foal, while last year's weanling by Champs Elysees (GB) realised 165,000gns.

Leading Stallions...

While Dutch Art had six of the top 10 foals of the last session, other stallions who enjoyed a good week at Tattersalls included Aga Khan Studs' Sea the Stars (Ire), who had 16 youngsters sell for an average of 186,375gns.

Juddmonte's Champs Elysees (GB), a brother to Dansili (GB) and Cacique (GB), is very much back in favour and recorded an average of 46,538gns for 13 foals from a 2012 stud fee of £7,500.

Top of the averages, albeit with smaller numbers sold, were the Darley duo of Dubawi (Ire) and New Approach (Ire). The former had just two presented for sale and they made 450,000gns (overall top price) and 300,000gns, respectively, while New Approach's quintet sold, of seven offered, achieved an average price of 300,000gns.

Edmond Mahony reflected on the record-breaking week at Park Paddocks, saying: "As ever, the cream of the British and Irish foal crop has been sent to Tattersalls and Park Paddocks has been a hive of activity all week, with pinhookers and many of the world's leading owners battling at all levels of the market."

"The sustained demand for foals certainly gives cause for optimism as we look forward to the Tattersalls December Mares' Sale starting on Monday. Widely regarded as the most international fixture in the bloodstock sales calendar, this year's catalogue has quality in abundance and we are looking forward to welcoming the usual cosmopolitan crowd in their annual quest for some of the finest breeding stock to be found anywhere in the world."

DANCING RAIN BACK IN SPOTLIGHT

As the focus was on a lively sales ring during Friday's frenetic foal session, a horsebox arrived at Tattersalls almost unnoticed, bringing with it one of the most talked-about horses of the sales season.

Ever since it was announced that the 2011 G1 Oaks winner Dancing Rain (Ire) (Daneshill Dancer {Ire}) was to be sold in foal to Frankel (GB) at the December Mares' Sale, speculation has been rife as to her potential value and the identity of her future owner.

Her three-quarter-sister Sumora (Ire) (Daneshill) was sold in foal to Galileo for 2.4-million guineas in 2011, but that was before the market returned fully to rude health and without the collective hysteria surrounding Frankel. Whatever price Dancing Rain achieves in the ring, one thing that can be guaranteed is that the Tattersalls auditorium will be at bursting point when she enters on Monday afternoon.

While it may be a daunting arena for the youngsters who have been selling this week, Dancing Rain is likely to handle the attention with aplomb. Like all good mares, the statuesque chestnut has an air of haughtiness about her, as if expecting constant admiration.

She was admired enough as a yearling for Liam Norris and William Huntingdon to bid €200,000 for her at Goffs on behalf of her owners, the brothers Martin and Lee Taylor.

Their gut feeling that she was something special was confirmed when she won her maiden on her 3-year-old debut following one placed run at two. Less than two months later she was a Classic winner, making all under Johnny Murtagh to land the Oaks at Epsom for trainer William Haggas.

Dancing Rain arrived at the Taylors' Clairemont Stud in Hampshire last Christmas Eve and has been under the care of Norris's wife Jenny ever since.

"She's been an absolute delight to have around," Jenny Norris said. "Her transformation to a broodmare has been phenomenal, she just took it all in her stride. When she was first being turned out in the paddock every day she seemed to be saying, 'Is this all you want me to do?'"

"She quickly adjusted to the lifestyle, however, and is just the most wonderfully straightforward mare, even when she was taken to Juddmonte to be covered by Frankel."

Norris is being assisted at the sale by Rachael Andre and they have been kept busy since their arrival on Friday with plenty of people viewing the mare yesterday, and many more expected Sunday.

"We wanted to bring her here in good time and make sure everyone had a chance to see her properly," Norris said. "She's settled in really well. She walks out of her box and poses beautifully for everyone. She's such a professional."

While for outsiders, Monday's sale is being considered as one of the auction highlights of the year, hammer fall will bring with it a tinge of sadness for those closely connected with such a special horse.

"I suppose it didn't really hit me until we started driving up here on Friday that these would be the last few days I'll spend with her," Norris admitted. "It will be hard to say goodbye, but it has been such a privilege to be involved with her so far and at the same time it will be exciting to see who her new owner will be."

EUROPEAN SALES RAMPS UP FOR TATTS

A decade ago, bloodstock agent Michel Zerolo and his partner in Haras des Capucines, Eric Puerari, joined forces with the de Chambure family's Haras de Etreham to form European Sales Management. The new consigning group essentially had one function: to sell horses at Tattersalls in Newmarket, almost exclusively at its December Breeding Stock Sale.

"The idea was that, instead of two commercial French operations going to a foreign market and competing with one another, we thought it made sense to pool our resources and combine our efforts, and have a much bigger platform," explained Zerolo, who himself is based in South Florida, where he operates his Oceanic Bloodstock.

To that end, European Sales Management has been a resounding success. Past triumphs include the sale of **Countess Lemonade** (Storm Cat) to Bobby Flay at December for 700,000gns (\$1,142,704) in 2010.

That was three years before the half to G1SW **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danahill) saw another sibling, **Ruler of the World (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), achieve Group 1 success in the Epsom Derby.

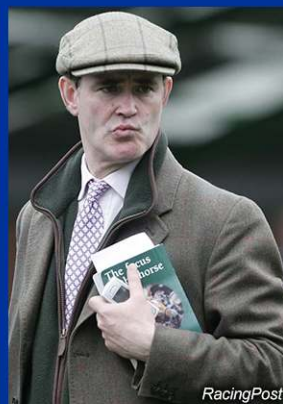
A year later, European Sales Management sold the Group 2-winning **Testosterone (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}) for 1,200,000gns (\$1,954,260). Other notables include the 1,100,000gns (\$2,376,066) **Sweet Stream (Ity)** (Shantou) and the 800,000gns mares **Guadalajara (Ger)** and **Elusive Wave (Ire)** (Elusive City).

"We've been very careful to take only to Newmarket what we felt was high quality," said Zerolo. "Selling there is basically a once-a-year occurrence."

The phrase 'high quality' could aptly be used to describe the 13-horse draft European Sales Management will be bringing to this year's renewal of Tattersalls December, which includes two 'wild card' entries. The consignment features a trio of Group 2 winners and four more that are listed winners.

Several horses will be familiar to American racefans, having carried prominent owner Martin Schwartz's blue and orange colors in the States. Most notable is **Dream Peace (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), who sells at Tattersalls as [lot 1853](#). Dream Peace came to America with a win in the G2 Prix de la Nonette to her credit and was maybe unlucky not to have won at the highest level here. She placed in five North American Grade I's in 2011-13, including a pair of seconds in the GI Diana S. (by 1 1/2 lengths and by a head), and a pair of thirds in the GI E.P. Taylor S. (by a short neck in her first try, in 2011).

"Dream Peace is the only group-winning Dansili filly on offer in Europe this year, I believe," said Zerolo. "She was multiple Grade I-placed in America and is a beautiful filly and has a beautiful pedigree."

Dream Peace is out of Truly a Dream (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}), who herself won the E.P. Taylor when it was a Grade II. Truly a Dream is also the dam of G1SP Catcher in the Rye (Ire) (Danahill). Dream Peace is offered as a horse out of training.

Schwartz has at least two other at Tattersalls with European Sales Management, including another Group 2 winner in **Laugh Out Loud (GB)** (Clodovil {GB}), who captured the G2 Prix de Sandringham in 2012 and also ran third in that year's G1 Sun Chariot S. The 4-year-old sells three horses after Dream Peace as [lot 1856](#) and is another catalogued as a horse out of training.

"If you look at Laugh Out Loud, she was one of the better milers of 2012," said Zerolo. "She was a Group 2 stakes winner and Group 1-placed, and ran against the best fillies in Europe at a mile. She's a very high-quality filly." **Cont. p18**

The third Schwartz runner on offer at Tattersalls is **Dealbata (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who goes as [lot 1857](#). Now five, Dealbata won the Mohegan Sky S. and was second in the GIII Noble Damsel S. at Belmont in 2012, and won the Listed Prix Solitude in France a year earlier.

European Sales Management's ties with Schwartz traces to Zerolo's longstanding and fruitful relationship with the successful investor. Some of the very best turf fillies to race in America in the last five or six years were purchased by Zerolo, usually as horses-of-racing age, on Schwartz's behalf. They include the 2012 GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine **Zagora (Fr)** (Green Tune), whom Zerolo bought privately for Schwartz. At the time, she was listed performer in France, but didn't need those credentials to draw Zerolo's attention. After all, he and Puerari had bred her and sold her as a yearling for €95,000. Zerolo would go on to sell her a second time; after her Breeders' Cup win, Zerolo's Oceanic Bloodstock consigned her to the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, where she was hammered down to Mandore International Agency for \$2.5 million. A few months later, she was named Zerolo and Schwartz's second consecutive champion turf female in the U.S., following on the heels of the superb Grade/Group 1 winner **Stacelita (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}). Other horses the men have teamed up on include the Grade/Group 1 winners **Alterite (Fr)** (Literato {Fr}, heroine of this year's GI Garden City at Belmont, and the Classic winner **Elusive Wave** (Elusive City).

"We've had good luck, but listen, all the credit goes to Martin," said Zerolo. "He steps up to the plate and writes the check, and he gets rewarded. It doesn't always work--we've had our bad stories--but it's not just blind luck. There are very few like him."

Not all of European Sales Management's standouts are former Schwartz runners. **Peace Burg (Fr)** (Sageburg {Ire}), who raced for Cuadra Montalban and Ecurie D Primes, followed Laugh Out Loud's example and won this year's renewal of the G2 Prix de Sandringham. She's offered in the same buying block as her aforementioned draftmates, going through as [lot 1855](#).

Other highlights include the 'wildcard' 4-year-old filly **Pearls or Passion (Fr)** (Monsun {Ger}), offered as [lot 1857A](#).

"She's the only stakes-winning Monsun filly who's still in training, and she has a big future ahead of her," said Zerolo. "She'll be a very desirable item."

Like many who sell overseas, Zerolo is hopeful that more Americans start making the trip to places like Tattersalls in order to access international pedigrees that, in many cases, has American rootstock.

"I came to America in the late '70s, and grew up in the years of Vincent O'Brien and Robert Sangster," said Zerolo. "The best pedigrees could only be bought at Keeneland July, Fasig Saratoga, and a little bit in September, which back then wasn't what it is today. Now, with 30 years of the Maktooms, and in the last 10 years the Yoshida family, buying the better mares and better fillies in training, there's less and less European pedigrees, and to some degree American pedigrees, at Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton."

"Now the market is much more international. People are looking for good pedigrees, no matter where they are. It's only a matter of time before a Mandy Pope travels over. Or a guy like John Sikura, who's always been a great consumer of top-class European pedigrees. There are no barriers anymore."

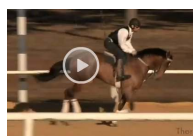
