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ECLIPSE AWARD FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

The finalists for the 2014 Eclipse Awards, which will be held Saturday, Jan. 17 at Gulfstream Park in Hallandale Beach, Florida, were announced by National Thoroughbred Racing Association, the *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers and Broadcasters yesterday. It came as no surprise that GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Bayern** (Offlee Wild), GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner **California Chrome** (Lucky Pulpit) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf winner **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran) were named as the top three finalists for Horse of the Year. After failing to fire in the Preakness, Kaleem Shah's ★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Bayern dominated in Belmont's GII Woody Stephens S. June 7 and proved those who doubted his ability to route wrong with a 7 1/4-length win in the 1 1/8-mile GI Haskell Invitational S. July 27. Turning in another head scratcher when 10th as the favorite in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23, the bay romped once again in the GII Pennsylvania Derby prior to his controversial victory in the Classic. Dazzling in both the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 8 and GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 5, California Chrome became the people's horse after capturing the first two legs of the Triple Crown. Off the board in both the GI Belmont S. June 7 and the Pennsylvania Derby, the flashy chestnut rebounded with a valiant third in the Classic and boosted his chances for a championship with an easy win on the turf in Del Mar's GI Hollywood Derby Nov. 29. If Bayern or California Chrome win the highest honor, it will be the first time since Curlin's win in 2007 that a sophomore was named Horse of the Year. The pair also join last year's champion juvenile **Shared Belief** (Candy Ride {Arg}), who beat older foes in both the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24 and the GI Awesome Again S. Sept. 27, in the 3-year-old male category.

FRESHMEN STAR ON THE GOLD COAST

The opening session of the Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale was highlighted by a strong top end of the market and growth across most key indicators at the Bundall complex in Queensland yesterday. A total of 140 horses (77.3%, down from 79.7% last year) changed hands for A\$23,335,000, a figure that was up 20.3% from last year's gross of A\$19,400,000 from the same session. The average was up 17.7% to A\$166,679, while the median remained steady at A\$130,000. An A\$850,000 (US\$686,253) filly from the first crop of Sepoy (Aus) topped trade when hammered down to Michael Wallace of the China Horse Club.

"It's been sensational," Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said. "Effectively you can say the market is up 20%, which is outstanding. In saying that, there are horses here to be sold. Buyers should not be intimidated by the market, as there's some really nice lots who were passed in who will turn out to be good horses. There will be some great opportunities coming up during the next few days," he added.

Cox suggested that the market had responded positively to an outstanding line-up of yearlings by exciting first-season sires.

"You wouldn't have ever thought a first-season sire would be setting that higher level for a start but to be there topping the market is incredible," he offered. **Cont. p9**

Opening his account with four straight wins in England in 2012, Main Sequence did not see the winner's circle again until this year when he was sent to U.S.-based conditioner Graham Motion. The strapping chestnut has lit up the turf on these shores

with four consecutive Grade I victories in Monmouth Park's GI United Nations S. July 6, Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer Invitational S. Aug. 17, Belmont's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic S. Sept. 27 and the Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 1. The Flaxman Holdings homebred is also a finalist for older

male and turf male. He is joined in the former by GI Met Mile winner **Palace Malice** (Curlin) and reigning two-time Horse of the Year and champion older male **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry). Wise Dan also defends his title against Main Sequence in the turf male category and they are joined by GI Breeders' Cup Mile upsetter **Karakontie (Jpn)** (Bernstein). Topping the older female category is **Close Hatches** (First Defence), who kicked off the season with wins in Oaklawn's GII Azeri S. Mar. 15 and GI Apple Blossom H. Apr. 11. The bay beat a field that included MGISW Princess of Sylmar (Majestic Warrior) and two-time champion Beholder (Henny Hughes) in Belmont's GI Ogden Phipps S. June 7 and romped in Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign S. Oct. 5. **Don't Tell Sophia** (Congaree), who upset Close Hatches in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. at Keeneland Oct. 5 and ran second in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 31, and GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf heroine **Dayatthespa** (City Zip) round out that category. Winner of the GI First Lady S. Oct. 4, Dayatthespa headlines the turf female division, which also includes GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup heroine **Crown Queen** (Smart Strike) and F/M Turf runner-up **Stephanie's Kitten** (Kitten's Joy). Distaff, GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Cotillion S. heroine **Untapable** (Tapit) is the heavy favorite for top 3-year-old filly honors and is joined by GI Acorn S. victress **Sweet Reason** (Street Sense) and GI Alabama S. winner **Stopchargingmaria** (Tale of the Cat). GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies upsetter **Take Charge Brandi** (Giant's Causeway) more than likely sealed the deal on champion juvenile filly honors with subsequent wins in the GIII Delta Downs Princess S. Nov. 22 and the GI Starlet S. Dec. 13.

However, voters may still give consideration to undefeated GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf winner **Lady Eli** (Divine Park). GI Spinaway S. romper **Condo Commando** (Tiz Wonderful) rounds out the trifecta. The juvenile male category is a bit more wide open, with GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile upsetter **Texas Red** (Afleet Alex) taking on dual Grade I winner **American Pharoah** (Pioneer of the Nile) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero **Hootenanny** (Quality Road). The top male sprinter category is also anybody's game and includes two-time GI Breeders' Cup Mile victor **Goldencents** (Into Mischief), two-time GI Vosburgh S. and GI Cigar Mile hero **Private Zone** (Macho Uno) and GI Breeders' Cup Sprint upsetter **Work All Week** (City Zip). GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint victress **Judy the Beauty** (Ghostzapper) headlines the female sprinter division. Fellow nominees include Acorn and GI Test S. winner Sweet Reason (Street Sense) and GI Ballerina S. heroine **Artemis Agrotera** (Roman Ruler). In the human categories, trainer Todd Pletcher seeks his seventh Eclipse award, while Hall of Famer Bob Baffert hopes to clinch his fourth and Chad Brown looks to win his first. Ken and Sarah Ramsey look to repeat in both the owner and breeder categories. They are joined by Kaleem Shah and Midwest Thoroughbreds in the owner category, and Adena Springs and Winchell Thoroughbreds in the breeder category.

GALILEO TOP APEX SIRE, TOO

It's been a hard road to the top of the APEX charts for Coolmore's **Galileo**, the consensus world number one. It's one thing to be the top sire in North America and Europe by progeny earnings on the *TDN* General Sire List three straight years (2012-2014), while siring 60-some black-type horses a year, but it's quite another to also be the top sire by indexes calculated using numbers of runners. The APEX A Runner Index is calculated using the percentage of a sire's runners which achieve certain earnings thresholds, so for sires which have the highest number of runners, it's more difficult to sustain high percentages no matter how many good horses they have. At the end of 2013, for example, after nearly a decade-long reign by **A.P. Indy** as the top North American or European sire by A Runner Index, it was Claiborne's **War Front**, with fewer than a quarter of the number of year-starters as Galileo, who displaced A.P. Indy as the leading sire of 2013 by APEX A Runner Index.

But Galileo has now scaled this pinnacle too. Since the beginning of 2008, in the seven countries covered by Northern Hemisphere APEX ratings, Galileo has 149 A Runners from 1,822 year-starters (a horse is counted as one 'runner', or 'year-starter', each year it starts; similarly one horse could in theory be an A Runner in seven straight years, and would be counted as seven runners and seven A Runners. That's just the way you have to do it when using annual earnings calculations). That is the second-highest number of year-starters among the top 50 NA/EU sires by 2008-2014 A Runner Index, behind only Coolmore's Ashford branch's **Giant's Causeway** (2,099 runners). That equates to 8.18% A Runners/Year-Starters, which divided by 2% (this population's average), yields a chart-topping 4.09 A Runner Index. War Front isn't far behind, with a 4.02 A Runner Index (8.04% of year-starters). Galileo's 149 A Runners 2008-2014 does put him in a league of his own in that regard; Giant's Causeway is second by number of 2008-2014 A Runners, with 114. Rounding out the top five in that category are Juddmonte's **Dansili** (90), WinStar's **Speightstown** (89), and Lane's End's **Smart Strike** (89).

With his last crop of 3-year-olds in 2014, Lane's End's A.P. Indy (3.68), in third by 2008-2014 A Runner Index, makes his final appearance as an APEX sire. Speightstown (3.49) ranks fourth, while in fifth is one of three 'slots states' sires in the top 20, the retired New Mexico sire **Desert God** (3.38), a son of Fappiano himself.

APEX BULLET POINTS

- APEX Ratings are assigned only to sires which had 10+ 3-year-olds of the last year covered (this year, that means 10+ foals of 2011). This has two effects: first, it eliminates those 'random' sires, often in small jurisdictions which never compete in the 'big leagues'. Including those has the effect of inflating earnings indexes so that average sires look better than average because they are compared to 'minor league' sires. Second, restricting it to sires with 3-year-olds means freshman sires, with their first 2-year-olds, are not rated; in our experience, their ratings are just too volatile.
- The indexes are calculated on a rolling seven-year basis; each year, the last year is added and the eighth previous dropped off. These calculations cover the period 2008-2014. Therefore, they are 'career' figures for all sires with first foals 2006 (2-year-olds of 2008) or later; Tapit, Speightstown, Medaglia D'Oro, Candy Ride, and King Kamehameha, in Japan, all had their first foals in 2006. The seven-year cutoff means that once-great sires which are no longer as good are not rated on their career figures, but on their results for the previous seven years.
- The figures are calculated on racing in seven different countries, representing five different 'jurisdictions' and summarized in three regions. The five jurisdictions are: US and Canada (North America); Britain and Ireland; France; and Germany (these three combined as 'Europe'); and Japan.
- There are 17 different APEX Ratings, of which the most important is the Combined, or Total, A Runner Index. The calculations are made separately in each of the five jurisdictions and the results added together to yield a Combined, or Total figure.
- Sires are rated (via indexing) by their efficacy in siring runners which achieve certain earnings thresholds in each jurisdiction. The calculations are made according to the following breakdown:
 - A Runners: are the top 2% of earners/runners in a given jurisdiction in a year;
 - B Runners are the next 2%;
 - C Runners are the next 4%;
 - ABC Runners are the three categories combined, or the top 8%.

To try and put it as simply as possible, the top 2% of earners in North America in 2014 earned \$134,635. If a sire had 100 runners in North America, and two of them had earnings of \$134,635 or more, the sire's 2014 North American A Runner Index would be 1.00 (in other words, his 2.00% divided by the population's 2.00%). If a sire had 100 runners in the year and four earned \$134,635 or more, his index for that year would be 2.00 (his 4.00% divided by the population's 2.00%); if he had 100 runners but just one earned \$134,635 or more, his index would be 0.50 (his 1.00% divided by 2.00%).

Then we just do various calculations, including creating ABC Age Indexes for a sire's proficiency at siring 2-year-olds; 3-year-olds; 4-year-olds; and 5-year-olds and up. This provides insight into a sire's proclivities, for example Giant's Causeway's respective indexes are: 1.35 - 1.90 - 1.93 - 2.82. Generally, they get better with age.

These calculations are earnings-based, so state/provincial jurisdictions with successful slots programs do routinely find their way on these lists. The other two 'slots state' (or, to be accurate, 'slots province') sires stood in Ontario: **Niigon** (3.15, ranks equal ninth), a son of Unbridled who unfortunately died young in 2012; and **Philanthropist** (3.04, equal 12th), who now stands at South Africa's Drakenstein Stud, alongside Trippi and Duke of Marmalade.

Keeping in mind the A Runner Index measures the frequency with which a sire gets runners which rank in the top 2% of earners, some more familiar names constitute the balance of the A Runner Index Top 20: in addition to Galileo, Europe supplies or supplied **Monsun** (3.26, dead); **Dansili** (3.15); Darley's **Dubawi** (3.04); and **Montjeu** (3.02, dead). **Unusual Heat** (3.20, ranks 8th) is still the king of California. The remaining 11 are Kentucky sires: besides War Front, A.P. Indy, and Speightstown (ranked 2-3-4), these include: Adena Springs' **Ghostzapper** (3.35); Darley's **Medaglia d'Oro** (3.12) and **Bernardini** (2.75); Three Chimneys' **Dynaformer** (2.89, dead); Giant's Causeway (2.72); Ramsey Farm's **Kitten's Joy** (2.71); Hill 'n' Dale's **Midnight Lute** (2.69); and Gainseway's record-breaking 2014 leading sire **Tapit** (2.68). True, by the way: this list includes most of the leaders by progeny earnings, but does not mirror it. That's the objective. More next week (Thursday, Jan. 15), but in the meantime we'll let you know when all the numbers are up on the *TDN* website.

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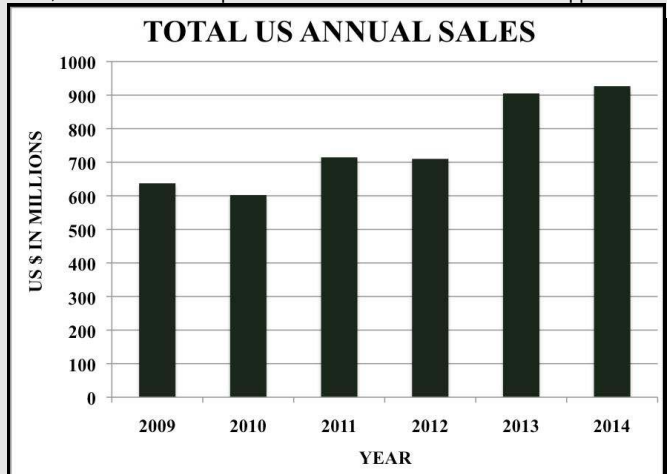
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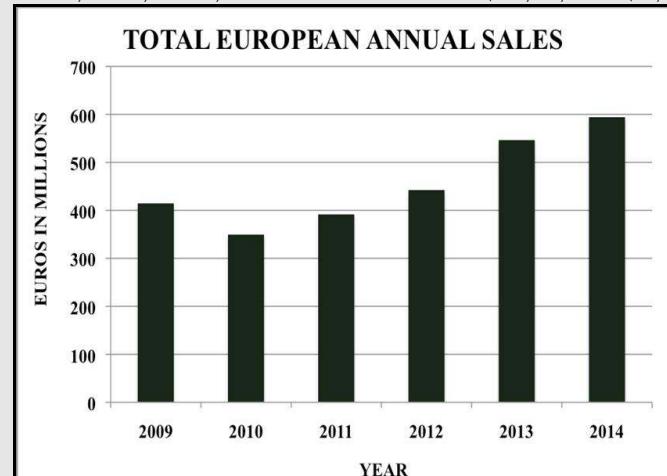

Weekly Sales Ticker by Bill Oppenheim

"When we look at the combined 2014 annual sales figures, the North American market accounts for about 55% of the number of horses sold and total revenues in the combined NA/EU auction marketplace; Europe now accounts for 45% of the combined market. The averages for the total 23,168 horses sold were strikingly similar: \$71,988 in North America; \$72,515 in Europe. The most significant difference was the 62.5% clearance rate from the catalogues in North America, vs. 69.1% in Europe."

ALL CALM ON THE CALDER 'FENCEGATE' FRONT--FOR NOW

More temporary stalls in tents are going up while the threats of eviction appear to be quieting down at Calder Race Course & Casino.

Churchill Downs Incorporated, which owns the track but leases a portion of the backstretch property to Gulfstream Park for year-round training and a 40-day autumn race meet, has been closing down the former main stable area of 60 barns since Dec. 1 in preparation for an unspecified future construction project.

Over the past five weeks, horsemen have been scrambling to find new homes for 600 Thoroughbreds that had been ordered to move out by Jan. 1.

In addition to 460 permanent stalls Gulfstream leases for the horsemen in a separate part of the backstretch, horses remaining on the property have already been relocated to 160 temporary stalls in tents in a parking lot. Scores of others have been transferred off the property to private stabling.

Trainer Edwin Broome still has a string of 14 horses stabled in the fenced-off area, which he estimated holds about 150 other horses awaiting transfer.

"Right now, I've got to give Churchill Downs [Incorporated] a little bit of credit," Broome said. "Churchill hasn't imposed any more restrictions on us. They're leaving us alone, they're letting us train. No more threats. That is what we want, for them to leave us be until the first of April. I don't know if they're going to keep doing it, but right now they're letting us be."

Kent Stirling, executive director of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, agreed that the tense situation is in a lull for the time being. But he said the current peace comes only after more "scare tactics" last weekend from CDI.

According to Stirling, for the second time in as many weeks, CDI demanded the tearing down of temporary tents after the FHBPA and Gulfstream thought CDI had granted permission for them to go up. The first disassembling was ordered in late December after electric and plumbing lines had already been connected to tents in an employee parking lot. The most recent tear-down order came for 200 stalls in tents alongside a backstretch pathway to the racetrack.

"Everyone's saying, 'Well, hold on, we're doing everything we can to move, and you guys are doing everything you can to make life miserable,'" Stirling said.

The new plan, allegedly with CDI's blessing, calls for 500 temporary stalls in tents that are being erected along the outside perimeter of the backstretch straightway where vans and heavy equipment used to be parked, Stirling said.

"We'd much rather stay where we're at," said Broome.

Broome said his only concern about remaining behind the fence is that to get horses to the racetrack, they have to be hand-walked through an opening that has

substantial vehicle traffic. Broome said he hoped CDI would relent and re-open the main path to the track.

"Give us a chance so nobody gets hurt," Broome said.

"As we explained to the horsemen, it's not ideal," Stirling said. "But for 90 days, just suck it up and let's try to get through this thing. When people start to move north, we can move other outfits into the other 460 [permanent] stalls or go over to Gulfstream [where stabling is currently at capacity]. As miserable as Churchill Downs has made life, I think the horsemen have been very resilient."

Stirling said it is "bizarre" how some 660 temporary stalls have to be built alongside 60 perfectly good unused permanent barns--especially considering how lucrative Gulfstream's alleged offer was to lease the barn area from CDI.

"Even though they were offered \$900,000 for the three months for those 500 or 600 stalls, [CDI] turned it down," Stirling said. "That's like found money. I would think they would have jumped at that."

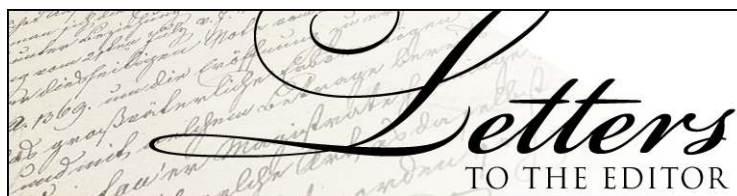

Hit Out of the Park...

The South Australian-based Mill Park Stud sent three of its seven-strong draft through the ring yesterday, and it was apparent the 25-hour cross-country trek had little effect on the horses, which each brought prices in excess of A\$300,000. The first through the ring was [lot 13](#), a colt from the last crop of the ill-fated champion 2012/13 first-season sire Northern Meteor (Aus), who fetched A\$300,000 from Scone Thoroughbred Services. He was followed by the session-topping Sepoy filly, [lot 143](#), and [lot 185](#), a colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus), brought up the trio when sold to David Raphael for A\$575,000 late in the session. ([Click here](#) for a TDN feature on Mill Park Stud). **Cont. p9**

"The results were well beyond what we were hoping, especially starting off with the Northern Meteor colt for \$300,000--that was just a fantastic result," said Mill Park Stud's Chris Watson. "It was good to see him get

off to a fast start for the last of the Northern Meteors. The Sepoy filly, that was an amazing result. It's exciting, she's going to a really good judge in Michael Wallace. It's a really good home and she's obviously staying in Australia for a while, so that's great to see. And the Redoute's Choice colt is going to a really good trainer in Gerald Ryan, so we couldn't be happier. It's

been a fantastic day for us."

Lot 143 was the leading light in an exceptional opening session for Darley's first-season sire Sepoy (Aus) (Elusive Quality), who was Australia's champion 2- and 3-year-old after wins in the G1 Blue Diamond and G1 Golden Slipper S. as a juvenile, and the G1 Manikato S. and G1 Coolmore Stud S. as a sophomore, all in 2011. The chestnut is the first foal out of the dual listed winner Celebrity Girl (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}), and she was hammered down to Wallace after a prolonged bidding war that included Peter Devitt, seated alongside trainer David Hayes, and Californian Jon Kelly, standing near the front of the ring. Wallace noted the September foal would remain in Australia to race, and that a trainer had not yet been identified.

"She's a filly with an exceptional pedigree," Wallace remarked. "She has great similarities between her sire and her mother. She's an outstanding first foal from some of the best breeders in Australia in Mill Park, so she has plenty going for her. That was probably a little more than we expected to pay, but diamonds don't come cheap."

Wallace added, "We always knew there was going to be intense competition for a filly like that. She ticked all the boxes for a lot of people, so there was always going to be plenty of interest."

Sepoy's six yearlings sold on the day averaged A\$367,500.

The Redoute's Choice colt, who is the second foal from the G2 Villiers S. winner Dances on Waves (Aus) (Anabaa), marked the fourth purchase of the day for David Raphael, who was acting on behalf of his own Stallion Racing and Damien Flower's Jadeskye Racing. The colt will be trained by Gerald Ryan.

"Gerald [Ryan] knows the mare so well and when you are buying Redoute's, you are buying at the top end, and that is what we are trying to do," Raphael said. "It is hard to compete against the big boys--they have got good money and the Australian currency is down, so the international buyers can step in and really buy some cracking horses."

On behalf of Stallion Racing and Jadeskye, among others, Raphael purchased ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) for A\$460,000 at the 2013 Gold Coast sale. Turned over to Ryan, Rubick won the colts and geldings division of the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude S. in just his second start last February and added a first-up victory in the G2 Schillaci S. this past October.

Of his newest acquisition, Raphael added, "We all looked at him separately. When I first saw him when he walked out of the box, I thought, 'He has got it.' He is expensive and there will probably be other horses by Redoute's from the Easter Yearling Sale that will be as good, but you have to put them on the line at some stage and buy the one you want." **Cont. p10**

Waterhouse Ready and Willing...

Trainer Gai Waterhouse knew it would take some pocket power to secure [lot 153](#), a son of More Than Ready from the draft of Segenhoe Stud, but with her proven track record with the sire as a confidence booster, the Hall of Famer stayed strong to secure the flashy chestnut for A\$600,000 late in the session. The October foal is the third produce of the multiple group winner Chinchilla Rose (Aus) (Lion Hunter {Aus}), herself a full-sister to Leone Chiara (Aus), the dam of exciting young sire Star Witness (Aus) (Starcraft {NZ}) and Group 3 winner Nostradamus (Aus) (Medaglia d'Oro {Aus}).

"I liked him a lot--from the moment I saw him, I fell in love with him, and I've had such success, especially with the likes of Sebring, with this sire," Waterhouse reasoned. "He's probably a little underrated with many people. I knew what the reserve was, and I thought, 'Why pussyfoot around?' I knew I had a chance to buy him by forcing the market."

Waterhouse conditioned the successful young sire Sebring (Aus) (More Than Ready), himself an A\$130,000 Magic Millions graduate, to win the G1 Golden Slipper. She confirmed this colt would be trained for a syndicate.

"A group of people came together--Segenhoe has taken an interest in him, so it's really exciting," Waterhouse added.

Agent Guy Mulcaster went to the same sum late in the session for [lot 195](#), a son of Fastnet Rock (Aus) from the draft of Coolmore Stud. Mulcaster noted the son of Delta Girl (NZ) (General Nediym {Aus}) would be trained by Chris Waller. Of the new owners, he remarked, "We'll be working on that tonight before we get back here tomorrow."

Mulcaster added, "He looked good on the farm and he looked good when he got here. He's a real good walker, so hopefully he goes on to be a good racehorse."

Rookie Stars...

This year's roster of first-crop yearling sires in Australia is one of the strongest in memory, and the early part of the session was dominated by the rookies, with a colt by Sepoy causing early fireworks when selling for A\$460,000 to David Raphael. [Lot 43](#), from the draft of Riversdale, is out of Academy Idol (Aus) (Made of Gold {Aus}), who has produced two stakes-placed winners from three foals to race.

Raphael predicted big things to come from Sepoy.

"He was expensive--he wasn't cheap, but I think by the end of the year we'll get through all the Sepoys, and the average might even be above that," Raphael noted. "We might even come through the end of the year, through Easter, and he might be at market price."

Of the roster of first-season sires, Raphael said, "I think there's some really nice first-season sires. It's exciting to have Sepoy, Smart Missile, So You Think, Foxwedge--they're all really nice horses. I'm normally conservative--I'd rather wait for a proven product, but I just think there's some really nice first-season sires."

The early-August foal was secured for Stallion Racing, Jadeskye and Teeley Assets, the same team that races Rubick (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) with Coolmore. The 3-year-old Rubick cost Raphael the same price here in 2013.

"He was the horse we all wanted, and it's a bit spooky--he's the same price as Rubick for the same team," Raphael said, noting that he expected to pay between A\$400,000 and A\$500,000 for the colt.

Of his stable star Rubick, Raphael said, "He's back [in training] and he looks great. He's grown a bit, he's a bit longer. He looks really good."

Newgate Farm's Foxwedge (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) finished second to Sepoy in the Coolmore Stud S. and earned his Group 1 in the following year's G1 William Reid S., and he made a statement early in the session when a pair of colts that went through the ring consecutively fetched A\$350,000 and A\$150,000. The former, [lot 24](#), was secured by young trainer Bryce Heys, who worked with the G1 William Reid S. winner Foxwedge during his six-year tenure with trainer John O'Shea. Heys, who secured his trainer's license in late 2013 and trains from Ellerslie Lodge at Warwick Farm in Sydney, said the resemblance of the colt to his sire was "uncanny."

"He's an outstanding colt and he has all the physical traits his father has," said Heys after bowing out of the bidding on the second Foxwedge colt, who was hammered down to Gai Waterhouse. "I was fortunate enough to be involved with his father, and it's uncanny how his father can leave someone so similar, so here's hoping he's just as fast."

Heys noted the colt was purchased for "a bunch of new clients." The strapping bay is out of Xaar's Jewel (Aus) (Xaar {GB}), and is a three-quarter sister to the G2 Villiers S. winner Ninth Legion (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}).

So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}) was undoubtedly one of the best racehorses Australia has seen in recent years and he proved himself a worldwide champion, winning 10 Group 1 races across the world. His progeny are therefore under the microscope of the most astute buyers and he passed the test early in the session yesterday when trainer Anthony Cummings shelled out A\$350,000 for a colt catalogued as [lot 80](#) from Coolmore Stud.

"I thought at that price he was pretty good value," Cummings explained. "He's not going to be a huge horse, but he's full of quality, really nicely built and an athlete."

Cummings noted that his father, Australia's legendary trainer Bart Cummings, trained So You Think, while he conditioned another first-season sire, Smart Missile (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}).

"I think they're going to be the pick of the first-season sires this season," he predicted.

Of the new ownership group, the conditioner commented, "I have some stable clients taking half and I think the Coolmore boys are taking half."

So You Think was purchased by Coolmore midway through his 4-year-old campaign before relocating to Ballydoyle in Ireland, and he now stands dual hemisphere at Coolmore Ireland and Australia. His other six-figure prices yesterday included an A\$325,000 colt hammered down to trainer Robbie Laing.

Kelly's Choice...

American Jon Kelly made waves here a year ago when swooping for the A\$1-million sale-topping Redoute's Choice colt during his first visit to the sale, and the California businessman didn't take long to get into the action yesterday, signing for a Redoute's Choice filly for A\$450,000 while sitting alongside Gai Waterhouse. [Lot 86](#) is out of the dual Group 3 winner Augusta Proud (Aus) (More Than Ready), and she is from the family of GI Florida Derby and GI Hopeful S. winner Mercedes Won (Air Forbes Won).

"I found her very nice and the price was right, so I bought her," Kelly remarked. "It's as simple as that. I have a lot of confidence in Gai, so we'll see how well we do."

The early afternoon provided a fruitful spell for Redoute's Choice. Three lots later, another filly by the three-time champion sire fetched A\$280,000 from Corumbene Stud, and a further two lots later agent Gary Mudgway paid the same A\$450,000 sum for a Redoute's Choice colt. Mudgway noted

[lot 91](#), a son of G3 Doomben Roses scorer Awesome Planet (Aus) (Giant's Causeway), would go into training with Leon Corstens, who conditions the colt's Group 2-placed three-quarter brother Awesome Rock (Aus) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}), an A\$575,000 yearling here two years ago from Newgate Farm.

"Leon rates the horse really highly, and this colt will be given time to develop out and I think he'll make a lovely 3-year-old," Mudgway said. "Redoute's Choice is obviously on fire. He has the fastest horse in Australia in Lankan Rupee, and young horses coming up like Panzer Division and Scissor Kick. We're very hopeful and very happy to be buying off Newgate Farm."

Henry Field of Newgate remarked, "He's a very nice horse, and he's a brother to a very smart horse in Awesome Rock. He was the right horse with the right pedigree, so that was his mark."

Newgate was founded five years ago by Field, and he noted the operation has grown considerably.

"The farm is going really well, it's built up over the last five years to a situation now where we have 1000 acres of land, a beautiful band of broodmares and we've just bought [three-time Group 1 winner] Dissident, who will be our fifth stallion. It's built up very well."

Newgate signaled its indication for further growth recently when adding Bruce Slade to its roster of personnel. Slade is the former racing manager to Gai Waterhouse and founder of Round Table Racing.

"It's great to have Bruce Slade on board as our director of sales," Field noted. "He's one of the top young guys in the industry, so it's piecing together really well. His role will be to help grow the operation, manage and recruit stallions and manage the sales consignments and stallion syndicates. He's one of the top young guys in our industry, so it's great to have him on board."

Commenting on the opening day's trade, Field added, "It's been a very good market. I think AusHorse have done a great job bringing people into Australia. We've had seven horses go through the ring, six have been sold and every one of them has sold in excess of their reserve, which is a good sign of the depth of the market."

A 'CARNIVAL' ATMOSPHERE IN DUBAI

For the next eight Thursdays and a couple of Saturdays, the sprawling Meydan Racecourse plays host to the Dubai International Racing Carnival, which kicks off this evening with the running of Round 1 of the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge going the modified one-turn mile.

Despite a return to a conventional dirt surface for the first time since Well Armed (Tiznow) won the 2009

G1 Dubai World Cup, a smattering of internationally and turf-flavored pedigrees line up for the quarter-million dollar event, including Godolphin's **Outstrip (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}). Best known to the American audience as the winner of the 2013

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, the homebred will be trying the main track for the first time, but has a license to adapt to it.

The gray colt is the first foal to race out of Asi Siembre (El Prado {Ire}), whose major career victory came in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. over the Keeneland Polytrack, but who also crossed the line second in the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and was runner-up in a pair of Grade II tests on the main. She was acquired by Sheikh Mohammed's operation for \$3 million at Fasig-Tipton in November 2007.

Outstrip, his dam's second produce, defeated The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in the 2013 G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster and kicked home to best Giovanni Boldini (War Front) at Santa Anita two starts later. He was winless in four runs last year at three, but ran with credit when a close third to Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G1 St James's Palace S. and when fourth to that top miler in the G1 Sussex S.

"We are really looking forward to running him," said trainer Charlie Appleby. "He is a real favourite in the yard as he was my first Group 1 winner and he was running with credit in good company last season. We train on dirt and he handles it really well at home. He should really like Meydan and the turns, so we are hoping for a big run. We just need to see how he copes with any kickback in a race situation."

Zabeel Racing International's **Surfer** (Distorted Humor), multiple Group 2-placed on the old Tapeta track, is bred top and bottom to excel on this surface, but had not experimented with it until last time, when he registered a half-length victory over fellow American-bred **Ennobled Friend** (Malibu Moon) in the Listed Dubai Creek Mile over the track and distance Dec. 28.

Emirates Flyer (GB) (Acclamation {GB}) was runner-up in last year's G3 UAE 2000 Guineas and was beaten less than four lengths when third to Toast of New York (Thewayyouare) in the G2 UAE Derby in March. The bay has one start since, a second-place effort over the Wolverhampton all-weather in October, but he--like many of his rivals--has surface questions to address.

Grand Salute (Brz) (Salute the Sarge), a three-time stakes-winner in Uruguay before being sold to Sheikh Ahmed bin Rashid al Maktoum, will look to bounce back here off a somewhat disappointing sixth to Surfer in the Dubai Creek Mile last time out.

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CATCHING THE 'FEVER' IN DUBAI

Perhaps the most intriguing story in international racing now is beginning to unfold in the Middle East with shades of one of the sport's all-time great fictional tales, Walter Farley's *The Black Stallion*, transformed by a real-life script involving modern Arabian royalty and high stakes.

The big, blackish and undefeated South American wonder horse **Sir Fever (Uru)** (Texas Fever) has begun training at the secluded Godolphin Marmoom Stables in the Dubai desert following a journey across the Atlantic Ocean to seek greater glory.

The destiny of the colt with the relatively obscure pedigree seems oriented to follow the path blazed by

his fellow Uruguayan Triple Crown winner Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes), who went on to victory in the world's richest race, the G1 Dubai World Cup.

Godolphin trainer Charlie Appleby will guide Sir Fever in this chapter of his racing life, and he said Jan. 7, the day

before the Dubai International Racing Carnival was set to kick off at Meydan, that he is delighted with the colt following his acquisition from Uruguay's Stud Oro Negro.

"He looks great and he shipped over well. At the moment, we're just going to let him settle into his surroundings, which he is doing well--he's nice and relaxed. He's just having a very easy time of it. In a couple of weeks, I'm going to start cantering him. Then I can probably say a bit more what we're going to look to go towards [a specific race]," Appleby said.

"We have plans, obviously, to run during the Carnival, to aim toward Super Saturday and World Cup night," he continued. "Those plans will be clearer in the next couple of weeks after he's settled in more and we've gotten to cantering him."

Representatives of Godolphin leader and Dubai Ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum sealed a deal to buy the paternal grandson of GI Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop in November after he won the Gran Premio Nacional at Maronas to sweep the Uruguayan Triple Crown.

The sale price has not been confirmed, but the previous owners had indicated they wanted at least \$1- \$1.5 million for the colt, whose sire won two of 12 starts including the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. at Turfway Park for breeder Stonerside Stable and trainer Mike Stidham.

Sir Fever's dam is Sirina (Arg) (Rainbow Corner {GB}), and through her, in a storybook twist, he shares his fifth dam Umbella (GB) (Umberto {GB}) with Invasor.

When Appleby learned he was to be Sir Fever's trainer, he took action to speed the colt's transition to Northern Hemisphere racing by sending two of his stable lads to Uruguay to work with him. Based on his past experience, Appleby knew that since most South American-based horses are not regularly trained under saddle, they can be "very keen and a bit tricky to adapt."

"The lads spent a month with [Sir Fever]--they did the quarantine with him in Uruguay--so we're already sort of a month ahead of where we would be when we receive a horse like this," Appleby explained. "They've done a fantastic job settling the horse in. He had a month of being under tack and hacking around his own track in Uruguay."

"That was our plan--to get him into our routine as quickly as possible, so that when he arrived in Dubai, it wasn't too much of a culture change for him," Appleby explained.

In his 10 races, all winning efforts in Uruguay, Sir Fever has displayed ability to adapt, winning from 1000 meters (about five furlongs) to 2500 meters (about 1 9/16 miles) while coming from behind or sitting on the pace. Since the Uruguayan Triple Crown is run on dirt and because of Invasor's precedent, he was a natural candidate for the Dubai World Cup Carnival, with Meydan's previous all-weather track having been converted to dirt. The training surface at Marmoom, where Appleby conditions his horses for the Dubai Carnival races, also is dirt.

As a Southern Hemisphere-bred 3-year-old, Sir Fever is eligible to race in either the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby at 1900 meters or the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup at 2000 meters on the \$30-million World Cup program set for Mar. 28.

Invasor--who was bought and raced in Dubai and the United States by Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum and now stands at his Shadwell Farm in Lexington--suffered his only career defeat in the UAE Derby when beaten by Godolphin's Discreet Cat (Forestry).

Trained by Kieran McLaughlin, Invasor captured the 2007 Dubai World Cup the following year after collecting trophies from five Grade I American events (Breeders' Cup Classic, Whitney H., Pimlico Special H., Suburban H. and Donn H.) and reigning as 2006 Horse of the Year in the U.S.

For now, Appleby is not looking too far ahead with Sir Fever. His only immediate goal is to ease the colt into serious training and then see what targets appear to be most suitable. That being said, Sir Fever has done nothing to disappoint his new trainer.

"He's a good-looking horse. He's a natural athlete. He's a strong, good-bodied horse and light on his feet. He shipped well and he's settled in well and he's an exciting horse for the future," Appleby said. "In two or three weeks, I'll have him up and cantering and we'll know a bit more about where we are with respect to his fitness and how he's adapting to the training here, but so far we couldn't be any happier with him."

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GENTILDONNA JRA HORSE OF THE YEAR

Propelled by a season- and career-ending victory in the G1 Arima Kinen Dec. 28, Sunday Racing Co. Ltd's **Gentildonna (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) easily outpointed G1 Dubai Duty Free S. hero **Just a Way (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) to earn Horse of the Year honors in Japan, it was announced Wednesday.

The 5-year-old daughter of G1SW Donna Blini (GB) (Bertolini), the first two-time winner of the G1 Japan Cup, began 2014 with a smashing victory in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic and was fourth in search of a third consecutive Japan Cup before storming down the Nakayama stretch to close her racing career in style in the Arima Kinen. Gentildonna was also a unanimous choice for best older filly or mare, winning that award for the second straight season.

Just a Way did not leave empty-handed, as that 5-year-old was named best older colt or horse by a wide margin over 2014 Japan Cup hero **Epiphaneia (Jpn)** (Symboli Kris S). In addition to his smashing success in the Duty Free S., Just a Way cut back to the 1600 meters for a last-jump success in Japan's premier race at the distance, the G1 Yasuda Kinen in June.

In more hotly contested divisions, G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas) and G2 Asahi Hai winner **Isla Bonita (Jpn)** (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) was given the nod as top 3-year-old colt, ahead of G1 Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) victor **One and Only (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}), while **Harp Star (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}), the G1 Oka Sho winner, defeated G1 Yushun Himba (Japanese Oaks) victress **Nuovo Record (Jpn)** (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in the 3-year-old filly division.

The juvenile divisions were won in unanimous fashion by top colt **Danon Platina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}) and filly **Shonan Adela (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}).

Improvements Slated for NYRA Tracks:

The New York Racing Association's Re-organization Board of Directors recently approved a 2015 budget of \$36 million for improvements at Belmont, Saratoga and Aqueduct. These improvements include new security systems, technological upgrades to customer service, simulcast, television and on-line platforms.

"Continuing the progress reflected by two years of targeted, long-term capital investments, we are continuing to transform the New York Racing Association for future growth and success," stated Christopher Kay, CEO and President of NYRA. "These investments will support our collective efforts to provide an enhanced guest experience, while further improving the quality of racing at our three championship Thoroughbred tracks."

A new barn will be built at Belmont and several other barns will be expanded for a total of 200 new stalls to be installed before the track's May opening. Another 50 stalls are expected to be added by the fall.

"Our added stalls are a huge plus," said Glen Kozak, Vice President of Facilities and Racing Surfaces. "The New York Racing Association bears a twinremendous cost to keep three tracks open for training, and we are fully confident we will be able to take on the increased capacity of horses at Belmont and Saratoga."

The new stalls will help accomodate horses displaced from Aqueduct in May, when training will be limited to Belmont and Saratoga through mid-October. They will also give trainers with large strings an opportunity to consolidate their horses in to one barn.

"From a racing surface standpoint, Belmont is more than equipped to handle the influx of horses," said Martin Panza, Senior Vice President of Racing Operations. "Between the 1 1/2-mile main track, the one-mile training track and the pony track, we can certainly accommodate the additional horses. Obviously, stall space will be at a premium when racing transitions from Aqueduct to Belmont, and we hope that will encourage trainers to participate in our enhanced Aqueduct spring meet [Apr. 1-26]."

The 2015 budget also includes fund for a new dormitory for backstretch workers with 47 double-occupancy rooms, each with their own restroom, set to be completed in October.

TAA Accreditation Now Available:

Equine aftercare organizations can apply for accreditation with the Thoroughbred Aftercare Alliance from now through Apr. 15, 2015. Once they have been accredited, such organizations are eligible to receive funding grants from the TAA to go toward the care and rehabilitation of Thoroughbreds in their care.

According to the TAA Code of Standards, accreditation status is determined after a complete review of five areas: operations, education, horse health care management, facility standards and services, and adoption policies and protocols.

At minimum, organizations applying for accreditation must fulfill the following six requirements:

1. Organization must have a current status as a 501 (c) 3 tax-exempt organization with Internal Revenue Service or be a registered charity in Canada.
2. Organization must have been operational for a minimum of three years.
3. Organization must house a minimum of 50% and/or a minimum of five Thoroughbreds.
4. Organization must have an official euthanasia policy consistent with the AAEP.
5. Principals of the organization have never been convicted of killing, abandoning, mistreating, neglecting, abusing or otherwise committing an act of cruelty to a horse.
6. Currently there are no legal proceedings pending against the organization, or a principal of the organization and related to the organization.

Upon submission of the application for accreditation, aftercare organizations may also be subject to a site inspection.

"A great deal of the TAA's initial success can be attributed to the very high and thorough code of standards," said Jimmy Bell, president of the TAA. "These transparent requirements and attention to detail provide great comfort and confidence to so many TAA supporters."

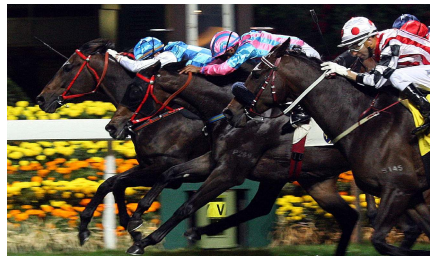

MUNCE TO RETIRE FROM SADDLE

Following the conclusion of Saturday's races at the Gold Coast, jockey Chris Munce will conclude his 30-year career as a jockey and will immediately take up training, the 45-year-old announced Wednesday.

"I knew retirement was coming when I went to bed the night before a race meeting and didn't dream about riding winners," Munce explained to *Australian Associated Press*.

Munce is one of the few jockeys in the history of the

jockeys' premierships in Brisbane and over 2,500 career scores overall.

However, Munce's was a checkered career from time to time, as he did a stint in jail following a 2007 conviction in Hong Kong for betting offenses and returned to Brisbane upon completion of his sentence. His career stalled once more when he was diagnosed with throat cancer in 2012, but he told *AAP* he has been given the all-clear.
