TECHNICAL KNOCKOUT IN FOY

With help from the stewards, Starlight Racing's **Itsaknockout** (Lemon Drop Kid) kept his unblemished record intact in yesterday afternoon's GII Besilu Stables Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. The Todd

Pletcher trainee graduated by a nose going seven furlongs here Dec. 7, and added a 5 1/4-length victory in a one-mile optional claimer Jan. 4. The 5-1 shot finished 2 3/4 lengths behind favored **Upstart** (Flatter) at the wire in the Fountain of Youth, but was given new life when that rival's number flashed on the tote board. The chalk herded Itsaknockout significantly in late stretch before pulling away comfortably, but the stewards saw enough to make the somewhat controversial change. "I feel bad for the connections of the

other horse," said trainer Todd Pletcher, who was winning his third Fountain of Youth. "He crossed the finish line first, but definitely we got impeded a bit and [Itsaknockout's rider] Luis [Saez] had to stop riding for a couple strides. I don't know how it would eventually affect the outcome. The thing I'm most proud of is for this horse to run this well in his third lifetime start, first time around two turns and first time in a stake. It was a very, very good effort. He was in between horses in a situation he hasn't been in before, so it was a big effort." **Cont. p3**

RACING'S 'MAIN' MAN RETURNS IN STYLE

Last year's champion older male and turf horse **Main Sequence** (Aldebaran)--making his first start since annexing the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Santa Anita Nov. 1--picked up right where he left off in Saturday's GII Mac Diarmida S. at Gulfstream Park with a well-timed late burst to remain a perfect five-for-five since joining Graham Motion's string in America. It was 3/4 of a length back to his arch rival **Twilight Eclipse** (Purim) in second. "He was awesome," Motion commented. "It's a huge relief. I think he kind of won for fun, to be honest. On to Dubai, hopefully. Fingers crossed." **Cont. p5**

STARS ALIGN FOR RAMSEYS

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's **International Star** (Fusaichi Pegasus) continued to burn bright at the Fair Grounds yesterday, earning his second-consecutive graded stakes victory in the GII Risen Star S. Drawn in the 10 hole, the GIII Lecomte S. hero worked his way to the rail under Miguel Mena and bided his time in midpack behind splits of :23.29, :47.08 and 1:12.16. He quickened cutting the corner and, just like in the Lecomte, squeezed up the rail and kicked away. **War Story** (Northern Fleet) ran on late, but came up a length short.

"The post position worried me," revealed Mena. "You never know if you can get to the rail, where he wants to be. I was impressed because I moved at the five-sixteenths pole to get through and he came through a tight hole and then another one at the quarter-pole and kept running and drawing away. I think more distance will be no problem. He rates well, he loves the rail; it doesn't matter how tight the hole is--he goes for it. When I put him on the rail, he grabs the bit and when we come up to a tight hole, he just goes for it. Not many horses do it. The more you save, the more you're going to get. He's not much to look at it, but he has a big heart." **Cont. p5**

Away well, Itsaknockout pressed **Bluegrass Singer** (Bluegrass Cat) briefly before dropping back several slots into a joint third with Upstart to his outside and longshot **Juan and Bina** (Indian Charlie) along the rail. **Frosted** (Tapit) inched away ominously after six furlongs in 1:11.65, and seemed en route to victory at the head of the lane as Upstart and Itsaknockout began to rev up. The leader hit a wall in upper stretch, and was immediately tackled by Upstart with Itsaknockout joining the fray as the tiring Frosted caused a mild chain reaction. Upstart and Itsaknockout pulled away to settle the issue, and while the latter never got closer to the favorite than about a half-length, he was forced to tap on the brakes when the GII Holy Bull S. romper came out in deep stretch while receiving left-handed encouragement.

"That was a tough decision. I did think [Upstart] would get taken down because he really bothered me," offered Saez, who had never before won a graded stakes race for the powerful Pletcher barn. "When we came into the stretch, I felt like my horse wanted to run, so I thought we'd win the race. But the other horse came out and bothered me. I couldn't ride my horse. He's a little better on the outside. Today there was a little speed outside of us so we had to play with that. At the three-eighths he really responded." **Cont. p4**

Don Lucarelli, co-managing partner of Starlight Racing, added, "I think this is the first inquiry where we've ever been put up. We've been taken down in a tough beat with Take the Points (Even the Score) here in [the 2010 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H.], but this is a little bit of redemption. I think the second time that he interfered with him a little bit was the clincher in my mind. It seemed like Luis had a little problem staying in the saddle. He definitely ran a winning race. He had the momentum and he was coming. We knew he had the talent, but you have to always wonder until they do it. This sealed it. We had never won this race and naturally it gives us a lot of aspirations for going to the [GI Kentucky] Derby. We're just excited for all the partners. We had a big crowd here today. We really rolled the bones and it paid off."

Upstart's trainer was, understandably, displeased by the stewards' decision. "Bad call," he said. They have to understand that when the horse gets hit behind the girth, the only place the horse can go is to the right. It's disappointing. The horse ran great, we just don't get credit for it. Don't know what's next, but we might have to go to New York."

The winner's dam is a half to Grade II winner Rush Bay (Cozzene).

A facile debut winner sprinting on the Belmont sod last June, International Star was a distant second in that venue's restricted Rockville Center S. in July before filling the same slot when stretched out and returned to turf for Saratoga's GII With Anticipation S. in August. He continued to display his versatility by annexing Woodbine's GIII Grey S. on the Polytrack Oct. 5, but checked in ninth--albeit beaten only 3 1/4 lengths--in Santa Anita's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf 26 days later. Fourth behind subsequent GIII Jerome S. winner El Kabeir (Scat Daddy) and race favorite Imperia (Medaglia d'Oro) in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 29, the bay bested returnees War Story, Tiznow R J (Tiznow) and Hero of Humor (Sharp Humor) in the Jan. 17 Lecomte and fired a five-panel bullet in 1:00.25 back at Gulfstream Park for this on Valentine's Day.

"He was doing super and he ran as advertised," said winning trainer Mike Maker. "I wasn't worried about the post. Realistically I thought we had an outside trip and we wound up having a trip like in the Lecomte turning for home looked." On returning for the [Mar. 28 GII] Louisiana Derby, Maker said, "[We're] not going to change routes for him; he loves it here and there's no reason to change course."

Reunited with jockey Rajiv Maragh, who missed the mount on Main Sequence in the Breeders' Cup with a broken arm, the chestnut tarried at the back of the pack after exiting from post one as longshot Change of Command was allowed easy fractions of :26.07, :50.95 and 1:16.17.

The BC Turf third Twilight Eclipse was in an ideal tracking spot in second, while Maragh angled out Main Sequence for clear running down the backstretch. Twilight Eclipse got the jump on his rival at the top of the stretch and put a head in front of Change of Command at the furlong grounds, but Main Sequence came storming down the middle of the course and was never in danger of not getting to the wire first, covering his final eighth in an explosive :11.20.

"I was a little concerned at the top of the stretch because it looked like he kind of asked him and they motored away from him a little bit," Motion said. "But once he got that turn of foot going, he's gone. There's not much stopping him. Every time he's run, to me, he's improved. Every race, knock on wood, he's come out of it a little better. I just loved the way he behaved today. That was exciting to see him like that."



Main Sequence
Kenny Martin

Winner of the 2012 G3 Derby Trial S. and runner-up to Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in the G1 Epsom Derby for trainer David Lanigan, Main Sequence has continued to amaze since closing out his overseas campaign with 10 straight losses, capped by an eighth-place finish in the 2013 G1 QIPCO Champion S. at Ascot. A neck winner over Twilight Eclipse with first-time Lasix in the GI United Nations S. at Monmouth July 6, the Flaxman homebred posted carbon copy decisions in Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer Invitational Aug. 17 and nabbed the West Point runner again in Belmont's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Sept. 27. He defeated next out G1 Longines Hong Kong Vase winner Flintshire (GB) (Dansili {GB}) by a half-length in Arcadia; it was another 1 1/4 lengths back to Twilight Eclipse in third that day.

"He's a superstar," Maragh said. "I never remember getting that feeling from any other horse. He blows your socks off the way he finishes. He's a wow horse, definitely."

On getting the mount back, Maragh continued, "It's very special. It just goes to show you what kind of people I'm dealing with from the owners, Flaxman, the trainer Graham Motion and John Velazquez. He rode him in the Breeders' Cup perfectly and won. He compensated me, which shows what an honorable guy he is. He didn't have to do that. Everybody involved with this horse all deserve this. Special horse, special people."

This race appeared on paper to be loaded with early speed, but that didn't seem to phase the stretching out Ekati's Phaeton, who seized the early lead and never relinquished it in a valiant effort. A debut winner here in August, the dark bay doubled up with a 10 1/4-length allowance romp the following month. She faded to sixth when stretched to a grassy mile for the Our Dear Peg S. Oct. 4, and resurfaced to be second in Gulfstream Park West's House Party S. back sprinting on the dirt Nov. 29. She became the first graded stakes winner for her young sire (by Tale of the Cat) with a dueling victory in the Jan. 3 GIII Old Hat S., but tired to fourth behind Birdatthewire and Lassoofthemohicans (Indian Charlie) in the seven-furlong GII Forward Gals S. Jan. 24.

Since the extra ground appeared to do her no favors this time around, Ekati's Phaeton was a disregarded 26-1 shot. Drawn in post 10 in a crowded affair, she was allowed to roll from the start and, after a :23.18 opening quarter, sped to the half in :45.60. Both Eskenformoney, in between horses, and Birdatthewire looked to have her measure in the stretch, but Ekati's Phaeton kept on battling and got it by a short neck. **Cont. p8**

"This filly has the most speed of any filly I've ever trained, and I trained Musical Romance (Concorde's Tune) to win the [2011 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint]," said trainer Bill Kaplan. "In all of her races prior to this one, I've been trying to teach her to stay off it a little bit and keep herself in reserve. We didn't do too good last time doing it that way, but the rider [Luis Saez] said she wants to be up front, so I told him to just let her go. We let her go today and he proved he was right. She's an amazing horse. She's carried her speed a mile and I don't see why she can't carry it further. She jumped a shadow or something after an eighth of a mile, but once she got the lead she was holding them off on the turn, I thought she had something left. He never really asked her until they turned for home. We'll have to think about [what's next]. Now the [GI] Kentucky Oaks is in the process, but we still have to go two turns with her. That shouldn't be a problem."

Purchased by Phaedrus Flights for \$50,000 at the 2013 OBS August yearling sale, Ekati's Phaeton RNA'd for \$150,000 at OBS March after a :10 1/5 breeze. "We bought her as a yearling, and she went to the 2-year-old sale at OBS," noted racing manager John Dowd. "She breezed well, but bucked shins, so we decided to go to the races with her. She's always been very athletic and fast. It was just a question of how she could carry her speed. We'll take things one day at a time. The [Mar. 28 GI Gulfstream Park] Oaks is a possibility, or we could cut back [in distance]."

It was a case of the student taking it to the teacher in Saturday's GIII Mineshaft S., as Michael Dilger, a former assistant to Todd Pletcher, sent out Street Babe to a somewhat improbable victory. Red Rifle, in from Florida for the Pletcher barn, was an excuse-free third after sitting a perfect trip.

A half-brother to this breeder's talented and precocious filly Richwoman (Successful Appeal), Street Babe had his career debut delayed until this past Nov. 20 going Aqueduct's one-turn mile. Well supported at 4-1 that afternoon, the dark bay was last of the sextet and was as many as a dozen lengths out of it in the early stages, but came with a bold run into the final quarter mile and streaked home to score by four lengths. His first try against winners at Gulfstream Dec. 31 could not have shaped much differently from his first appearance, as Street Babe found himself on the engine setting a moderate pace and held reasonably well into the final eighth of a mile before being overtaken late by Fast Falcon (Awesome Again) and was beaten 2 3/4 lengths.

The tote read 21-1 at the off, theoretically an underlaid price against much more experienced rivals, but the decision to bring him to the Bayou paid massive dividends. Drawn two from the outside in stall eight, Street Babe went forward under Kerwin Clark, but was committed to a three-path trip as Mystery Train led from Nates Mineshaft (Mineshaft) with Red Rifle enjoying the run of the race inside of Street Babe in fourth. Mystery Train took them through a solid half in :46.97 and still held the call as they reached the head of the stretch, but Clark had Street Babe poised, while Red Rifle was steered out widest with every chance if good enough. The longshot struck to the lead with a little less than a furlong to the wire and, while Mystery Train battled gamely at the fence, the wire came in plenty of time. Red Rifle found his best stride far too late in third.

"You're going to see a lot of this horse--he was just playing around," commented Clark, who was able to accept the mount when Larry Jones chose not to enter Albano (Istan). "When the horse came up on the outside, I thought we were beat, but he cut away. When he got to the front, he was playing around again or he would have won easily."

Street Babe could return for the GII New Orleans H. Mar. 28 or could await the \$1.5-million GII Charles Town Classic Apr. 18.

Overlooked by the bettors, the bay assumed the early advantage and clocked comfortable early splits of :24.26 and :49.03 from the fence. Still in hand and looking eager to go on turning for home, the gelding swiftly extended his edge when asked for a bit more in the stretch and hit the wire a never-in-doubt winner. "The horse was training well, so it didn't surprise me," said Ricky Giannini, assistant to winning trainer Brad Cox. "The race just happened to set up like it did last time and I believe he might have finished faster than he did last time. Just goes to show us that he's improving significantly right now. You know what they say, 'When the horses are doing good, you have to run them.' There's no reason to keep them in the barn. Obviously the [GII Mervin H.] Muniz [Jr. Memorial H. Mar. 28] will be the target now being the same distance and track and he has two wins here now. Happy to have Florent [Geroux] on him too--he's doing so good here and knows this horse really well."

After a stewards' inquiry and both trainer and jockey objections from the connections of Sheer Drama, House Rules was left up to earn a much-deserved first graded stakes win. Trained originally by Hall of Famer Allen Jerkens, the dark bay broke her maiden by 5 3/4 lengths over this track and trip last January before finishing second to ill-fated 'TDN Rising Star' Onlyforyou (Malibu Moon) in the GII Davona Dale S. on this card 12 months ago. She was second by a neck in the GII Gulfstream Park Oaks in March, but was off the board in both the GI Acorn S. and GI Mother Goose S. at Belmont in June before being transferred to Jerkens's son Jimmy. House Rules resurfaced to cruise by 6 1/2 lengths in a Saratoga allowance Aug. 17, but was last in the GI Cotillion S. at Parx in September behind champion Untapable (Tapit). She bounced back again to air in the slop at Aqueduct Nov. 6, but again came up empty when stepped up in class for that venue's Nov. 29 GIII Comely S. House Rules had last been seen storming home 9 1/4 lengths over this distance and surface in the Jan. 2 Bal Harbour H. The second choice here settled under Javier Castellano in fifth and in the clear before advancing four deep after a half in :45.95. She put a head in front of Sheer Drama with favored Wedding Toast battling on along the rail, and shifted over in midstretch once clear, forcing Sheer Drama to take up. Sheer Drama gathered herself up to nab second from the chalk, but never seriously threatened the winner. **Cont. p13**

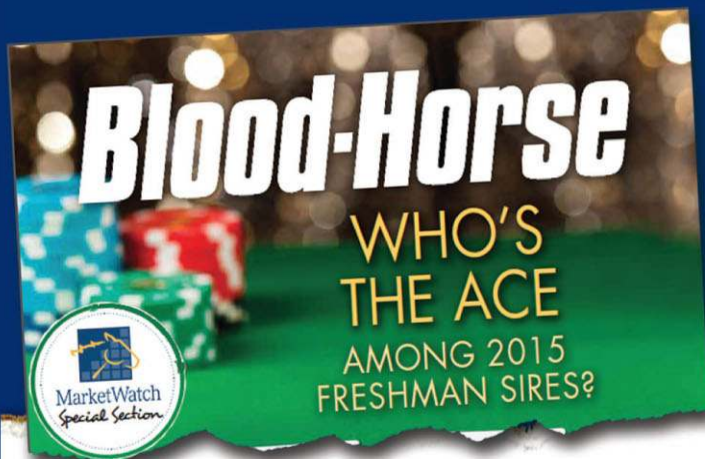

Tipped off the rail into the stretch to avoid the fading favorite, C. Zee squeezed through rivals in midstretch and kept on gamely to reel in Happy My Way and post the mild upset. Mean Season faded to last and was vanned off. "He's that kind of horse," Gold said of the winner. "I knew he was capable of it. Look at the races he's run and the things he's done. He had a terrible trip last time; he was taken out of the race at the quarter-pole and by the time he recovered he was a half-length short. So I didn't lose faith in him. It was a tough race, and he got it done."

SOUTHWEST WORTH THE WAIT

A field of 11 lines up Sunday for Oaklawn's GIII Southwest S., which was postponed from its traditional spot on Presidents' Day due to winter weather. Harry Rosenblum and Robert LaPenta's **Far Right** (Notional) rallied up the rail to win the local Smarty Jones S. Jan. 19 going away after favored **Mr. Z** (Malibu Moon) drifted out in deep stretch and checked in third. A third-out graduate sprinting 6 1/2 panels at Churchill Downs Sept. 13, **Far Right** followed with a pair of third-place finishes in that venue's one-mile Street Sense S. Oct. 26 and with a troubled trip in the GIII Delta Downs Jackpot. S. at today's distance Nov. 22. "I'm confident," trainer Ron Moquett said. "I just want a good trip for everybody. It's going to be a fun race for everybody that wants to bet. We like our chances with the proper trip." Although still eligible for a 'one-other-than' allowance, **Mr. Z** garnered significant attention after a juvenile campaign that included Grade I placings behind Carpe Diem (Giant's Causeway) in the Claiborne Breeders' Futurity and Dortmund (Big Brown) in the Los Alamitos Futurity. Owned by Zayat Stables LLC and trained by Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas, the chestnut got the better of **Far Right** in the Delta Jackpot, a race where he was beaten a nose by '**TDN Rising Star**' Ocho Ocho Ocho (Street Sense). **Bayard** (Speightstown) and **Private Prospect** (Discreet Cat), second and fourth, respectively, in the Smarty Jones, also resurface here. The former, who has never been worse than third in his career, annexed Remington's Kip Deville S. in September and the Springboard Mile in the mud Dec. 14. He is one of two Steve Asmussen trainees along with **Bold Conquest** (Curlin). That Ackerley Brothers Farm colorbearer finished second, beaten just a neck, to stablemate Lucky Player (Lookin at Lucky) in Churchill's GIII Iroquois S. Sept. 6, and was a distant third when last seen in the Breeders' Futurity. The chestnut shows some quick works at Fair Grounds leading up to this.

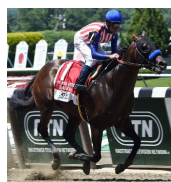

Gill Southwest S. - I'm going to side with a comebacking son of Curlin that I was quite high on last summer as a 2-year-old here. **Bold Conquest** tipped his hand with a strong second first out at the Spa after chasing three deep throughout behind the promising Blame Jim (finally resurfaced to finish second as the favorite to the talented Stanford earlier this month). The chestnut showed plenty of heart winning a stretch-long duel to graduate next out at Saratoga Aug. 16, then returned on short notice and came within a neck of annexing the Sept. 6 Gill Iroquois at Churchill while making his two-turn debut after a wide trip and another lengthy throwdown in the lane. Bold Conquest--the second foal out of the multiple stakes-placed Distorted Humor mare One for Jim--admittedly took a small step backward when a distant third behind the jaw-dropping Carpe Diem in the GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity after falling farther back than usual early (maybe the consecutive stretch battles caught up with him?), but the time off appears to have done him quite well. Love the five-furlong bullet in :59 3/5 (1/21) two works back at Fair Grounds and it can't hurt that Asmussen and Santana Jr. teamed up to win this last year with Tapiture, who was also returning from the bench off a winning effort in Churchill's Gill Kentucky Jockey Club.

Saturday's Results - As Steve said, **Gorgeous Bird** did very little running. Can't win them all... **Keen Ice** did what I feared he might--he ran on for a good third, but I wonder if he's the type who will always tease you like that. If he gets into the Derby, though, he might be the type to spice up the trifecta or super.

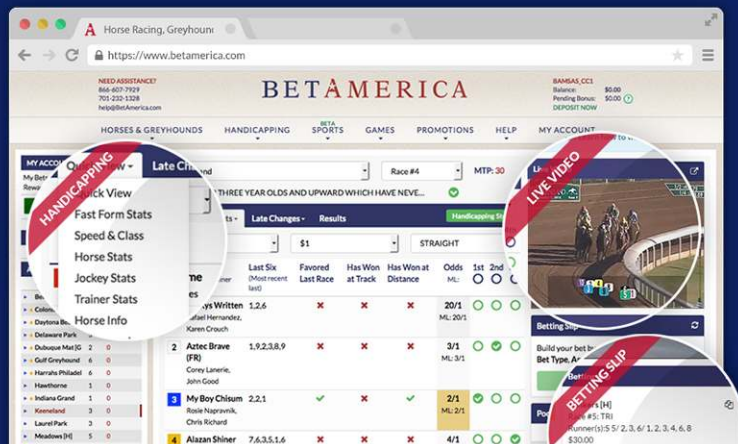
Gill Southwest S. - **Kantune** has always caught my eye as a horse with talent, and while he took seven starts to finally earn his diploma, his early losses look pretty good in hindsight. The Mark Casse pupil split GII San Vicente S. winner Lord Nelson and sidelined MGISP and Gill Sham S. romper Calculator on debut at Del Mar in July, for example, and was a close third behind the highly regarded Prospect Park and Cyrus Alexander going this distance at Santa Anita Dec. 27. He finally figured it all out last time over this track and trip Jan. 23, pressing a somewhat moderate early pace before really turning it on in the stretch to win by a visually impressive 3 1/2 lengths. Kantune is a textbook example of a popular angle: when a horse who has professional maiden tendencies finally breaks through, the light sometimes goes on so to speak, and he comes right back to win again. He'll get tested for class here, certainly, but Casse shows confidence to wheel back on short rest and the Gary Barber colorbearer could be sitting on a career-best effort. **Selection: #9 Kantune (12-1).**

FAST FILLY MAKES 'SENSE' AT BARRETT'S

When [hip 116](#) became the third horse to turn in the one-furlong bullet time of :9 4/5 during Friday's under-tack preview of the Barretts Selected 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale, the speedy move wasn't a surprise to consignor Kim McCarthy.

"She had previously breezed really well," McCarthy revealed Saturday morning. "So I was, I don't want to say cautiously optimistic, but when I saw that breeze I was thinking, 'I kind of like this.' And she was really happy here. So I expected a good work. I was thinking she might be able to go that fast, but I would have been happy with a :10."

By GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense, the juvenile is out of stakes winner Bold Angel (Cat Thief). Her third dam is Angel Fever (Danzig), the dam of Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus.

"She is a large, lanky beautiful filly," McCarthy said of the January foal. "She's the kind that you say, 'Wow. Look at her.'"

Monday's Barretts sale will be the bay's fourth trip through the sales ring. She was bred by Hunter Valley Farm, which purchased Bold Angel with her in utero for \$65,000 at the 2012 Keeneland November sale. The filly herself RNA'd for \$100,000 at the 2013 Keeneland November sale and again for \$115,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Sale. She most recently RNA'd for \$34,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale.

"I've had her since the beginning of February," McCarthy said. "She was in Louisiana getting ready."

After a break of some two decades, McCarthy began consigning under the McCarthy Bloodstock banner in 2010.

"For a while, when I was younger, I thought, 'This is what I'll do,'" McCarthy said of her early days in sales prep. "And then you find a boyfriend and you get married and things take you in different avenues. So I hadn't done it for 20 years and now here we are back doing it again."

McCarthy admitted she originally thought to follow in her father's footsteps and become a trainer.

"My father is a horseshoer and he trained racehorses," she said. "When I was going to school and thinking, 'What am I going to do when I grow up,' I decided I was going to train horses. Then I realized, that's a lot of work--seven days a week. Who wants to work seven days a week the rest of their lives? So then I thought maybe no more training and I started doing some books. I do books for a few trainers."

McCarthy Bloodstock has consignments at both yearling and 2-year-olds sales in California, but McCarthy admits she especially enjoys working with the juveniles.

"I just love the 2-year-olds," she said. "They are a lot of fun. You see them change every day. I don't have children, so this is my in-place-of-children."

Hip 116, the last entry in the catalogue, will be the final horse to sell at the Hinds Pavilion in Pomona--Barretts home since its inception in 1989. Starting with its May sale, the company will hold its sales at Del Mar.

"I am very sad [about the move]," McCarthy said.

"This is the best track to train on. The horses stay healthy. You don't have any soundness issues. The facility is fabulous. But it just looks like the people that run it aren't interested in staying in the horse business or any animals for that matter. It's kind of sad."

The Barretts Select sale begins Monday at 2 p.m. PT.

Globetrotting sprinter **Gordon Lord Byron (Ire)** (Byron {GB}), last seen finishing fourth in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 14, tuned up for another trip to that nation for the Mar. 15 G1 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup with a spin over the Dundalk course prior to racing yesterday. The 7-year-old gelding completed a mile over the course

under jockey Wayne Lordan. "He just did what we wanted and he's in good shape," said trainer Tom Hogan. "He did a mile on his own at a nice clip. He worked with another horse here last Friday, and will come back here next Friday to do another bit with another horse. He

Hogan added, "He'll fly out of Stansted on Mar. 4. It's his fifth time running in Hong Kong--he's nearly run more times there than he has at Dundalk."

Oct. 18. It will be no easy task, though, as the QSJC is expected to attract Hong Kong's top two milers, Able Friend (Aus) (Shamardal) and Gold-Fun (Ire) (Le Vie dei Colori {GB}).

Fab Fevola (Aus) (Falvelon {Aus}) officially made the running away from the rest of the pack up the stand's side rail. Jockey Craig Newitt began to work on Lankan Rupee approaching the 300 meter mark and the homebred responded with gusto, sweeping past Deep Field in a matter of strides to score by 2 3/4 lengths geared down. The 3-year-old **Brazen Beau (Aus)** (Invincible Spirit {Aus}) put in a valiant run to be second. Trainer Mick Price praised the winning ride delivered by Newitt, who had jetted back in from Singapore for the appointment.

"[Newitt] wanted to tag Deep Field like he did if he was able to, and it worked out really well," Price told *Racing Network*. "It was a great day, it was fantastic. The race was run properly and truly and the best horse on the day won and it was great to watch." **Cont. p18**

The regally bred Lankan Rupee made a rather forgettable beginning to his career, winning just two of his first eight starts, but the ultimate equipment change--a gelding operation--resulted in a complete turnaround for his 4-year-old campaign. Lankan Rupee won first-up off the layoff from that procedure at Moonee Valley, and after finishing third over the same course three weeks later wouldn't be beaten again in six starts over six months. Lankan Rupee earned his first stakes score at the 2013 Melbourne Cup Carnival in the Listed Earl Grey S., and doubled up in the G3 Heffernan S. nine days later at Caulfield. Off for the traditional Australian summer holiday thereafter, Lankan Rupee returned to annex the G2 Rubiton S. last February before firing off three Group 1s in succession: the Oakleigh Plate, the Newmarket H. over this strip and the T J Smith S. at The Championships in Sydney. Lankan Rupee was just touched off when second in his first two outings as a 5-year-old--the G2 McEwan S. and the G1 Moir S.--at Moonee Valley in September, and after taking the G1 Manikato back at that course four weeks later he was widely tipped to return to his typical dominant form back over the Flemington straight in the G1 Darley Classic. Lankan Rupee raced prominently on that occasion, however, and likely set the race up for the powerful duo of Terravista (Aus) (Captain Rio {GB}) and Chautauqua (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who swept past him in the final 100 meters. Off for 13 weeks since that effort, Lankan Rupee warmed up for this assignment with an eye-catching barrier trial win Feb. 9, but nonetheless the previously unbeaten Deep Field was dispatched favorite yesterday. That rival's trainer noted after the race, "He just wasn't good enough, the winner was too good. We'll wait for another day."

For Lankan Rupee, his next day is likely to come in the Newmarket, when he will attempt to defend his crown before moving on once again to the T J Smith.

Lankan Rupee is from the family of Classic winners Grosvenor (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}) and National Gallery (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), as well as Horse of the Year and champion sire Lonhro (Aus) (Octagonal {NZ}).

PARRANDA SET TO SALUTE IN SINGAPORE

A field of nine--four males and five females--each owned by an entity of the China Horse Club, is set to go to the post for today's CECF Singapore Cup, at a shade over S\$3 million the richest race to ever be contested in the country. The G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup carries prize money of an even S\$3 million.

To say the 1800-meter event is a head scratcher would be an understatement--just ask those who will saddle the runners. There does seem to be a consensus, however, that the race absolutely goes through

Christophe Clement-trained **Parranda** (English Channel). Winner of the GII Royal Heroine S. and GIII Wilshire S. and narrowly defeated in the GI Rodeo Drive S. while campaigned for most of the 2014

season by Jerry Hollendorfer and partners, the elegant chestnut was offered at Fasig-Tipton November and 'ticked all the boxes' for the China Horse Club, who were extended to \$800,000. Turned over to the capable hands of Clement, she prepped for this overseas test with a facile success in the GIII Marshua's River S. at Gulfstream Jan. 10 and looks to have these at her mercy, given her race fitness advantage and a trip that suits her probably better than any of her eight competitors.

Illinois-bred **My Option** (Belong to Me) also makes her first appearance for Clement since being acquired by the CHC for \$290,000 at the Keeneland November sale. She returns to the turf for the first time since checking in third in the GIII Pucker Up S. in 2013, and her better form is over synthetic tracks, including wins in the GIII Arlington Oaks and GIII Chicago H.

The third and final American-bred in the field is **Bajan** (Speightstown). A \$300,000 FTKNOV purchase, the attractive blaze-faced bay was a dual black-type winner at two and managed a third in the GI Santa Anita Oaks while raced by Eclipse Thoroughbred Partners and Ronald Frankel. She makes her first start in over four months and is another for whom the turf, and to a lesser extent the distance, are question marks.

On sheer class, **Auvray (Fr)** (Le Havre {Ire}) would compete for favoritism Sunday. Previously trained by Elie Lellouche for the sire's breeder Gerard Augustin-Normand and Mme Vidal, the sleek bay 4-year-old has won half of his 10 career tries, including the G3 Prix de Lutece and G2 Qatar Prix Chaudenay, both over 3000 meters, last year. Led into the ring at the Arqana Arc Sale just a few hours after the Chaudenay, Auvray fetched a bid of €800,000 to top the event. The knock on him is that he's never won at a distance less than 11 furlongs and may not have the speed to keep pace at this shorter trip. But connections have a hunch he can be effective at nine and 10 furlongs, so it pays to pay attention.

Orbec (Fr), the second of three in the race for Le Havre, sports inferior form to Auvray, but completed the exacta behind that one in an 11-furlong conditions race at Longchamp in April. Runner-up in the Listed Derby du Languedoc at Toulouse in June, he went one better for Augustin-Normand in the Listed Grand Prix de Clairefontaine at Deauville when last seen Aug. 29. Augustin-Normand celebrated a unique double when Orbec proved the third-dearest lot at the Arc Sale at €600,000.

If there is an X-factor in the race it would have to be **Zululand (Aus)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). The field's lone 3-year-old is trained by Jason Warren, who is no stranger to traveling one to Singapore, having sent over

hasn't gone close in five starts this term while trained by David Hayes and Tom Dabernig. Even though he acts and looks like a horse who wants 1400-1600 meters and looks overmatched on bare form, he has made such a good impression physically this week that he is tough to eliminate completely.

SHAW OPTIMISTIC ABOUT 'ROCKET' RETURN

South African-born and now Singapore-based trainer Patrick Shaw lights up noticeably when the subject of **Rocket Man (Aus)** (Viscount {Aus}) comes up. And with obvious good reason. A professional trainer since 1990, Shaw registered his biggest success on South African soil with Teal (SAf) (Foveros {GB}) in the G1 Durban July S. in 1995 before relocating to this country in 2001. Through a close association with fellow South African owner Fred Crabbia, Shaw's career continued to flourish, but he gained international recognition with the emergence of Rocket Man in 2008.

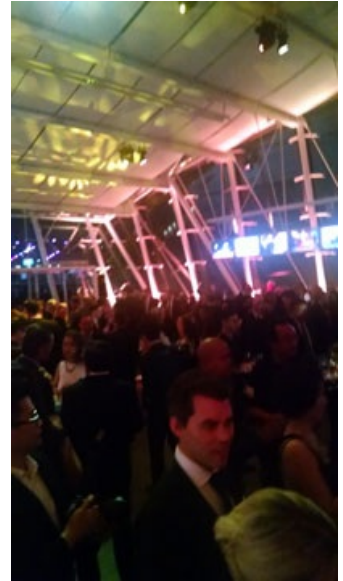
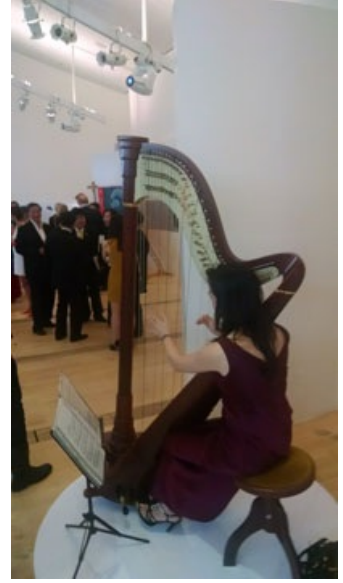
"Obviously, he's been magical," Shaw said Friday after winning the day's second race at Kranji. "He's one of those horses that every trainer dreams of having. You go to the races wondering if he's going to do his best, but with him, you know he's going to do his best. Every time he's got beat, he's had an excuse. If it was up to me and nobody else, I'd say he should be unbeaten. He was beaten twice in the KrisFlyer, but just unluckily, and was beaten in Dubai on a much heavier track than he's used to, but as I say, he's always done his best."

An A\$60,000 acquisition out of the 2007 Magic Millions National Yearling Sale, the gelding won his first seven races on the bounce, including the first of a remarkable four straight successes in the Lion City Cup, the country's top domestic sprint. He was sent off the even-money favorite against the likes of Hong Kong champion Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) and Aussie legend Takeover Target (Aus) (Celtic Swing {GB}) and Godolphin's Diabolical (Artax) in the 2009 KrisFlyer. Always traveling well for Robbie Fradd, with 4-1 joint-second choice Sacred Kingdom waiting in the wings, Rocket Man slipped through to lead in upper stretch, but the Hong Kong raider called upon his experience for a narrow victory, clocking a quick 1:07.80 for the 1200 meters ([video](#)). Sent to Dubai for his first of three consecutive appearances in the G1 Golden Shaheen, Rocket Man finished ahead of all but Kinsale King (Yankee Victor), repeated in the Lion City and dropped a narrow decision to the Green Birdie (NZ) (Catbird {Aus}) over unsuitably easy ground in the 2010 KrisFlyer. Sent to Hong Kong later that year, he dead-heated for the win in the Jockey Club Sprint and just missed to J J the Jet Plane (SAf) (Jet Master {SAf}) in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint, then three months later, became the first horse to post a Group 1 success for Singapore, defeating Euroears (Langfuhr) in the 2011 Golden Shaheen. He finally got a well-deserved KrisFlyer by turning the tables on Sacred Kingdom and returned to Dubai in early 2012 to finish

second to Krypton Factor (GB) (Kyllachy {GB}) in the Shaheen. He came back to Singapore for his fourth Lion City score, but was forced to miss the KrisFlyer and hasn't been out since.

Exceptionally fit and trim, the 58-year-old Shaw has been nursing Rocket Man back to health and

holds out hope that the champ can make it back to the races over the coming months to attempt to improve on a remarkable record of 27-20-5-0. His career earnings stand at \$4,925,807.

"He is in his second full month back in training," the Johannesburg native said in the Champagne Room at Kranji Friday afternoon. "He's had two of what we call 'half-paced' [workouts], which is a stepping stone to a faster bit of pacework. That should come in the next two weeks, I'm just waiting for a bit of rain. In Singapore we haven't had rain for a good, solid month. The track is hard and I'm not obviously not going to take any chances with him. Veterinary-wise and training-wise, he's sound as ever and we just hope we can get him back for the Lion City [Cup, 1200 meters, Apr. 26] and the KrisFlyer [International Sprint, 1200 meters, May 17]."

Shaw explained the nature of the various ailments that have kept Rocket Man on the shelf.

"It began with a suspensory ligament and gave him a full six months off," he recollected. "The suspensory went well, and then all of a sudden, he got a ligament below the suspensory running to the coronet band, which to me is more crucial to the suspensory. I've raced horses with a suspensory, and if it was just the suspensory, we'd be running. But obviously with the ligament below the suspensory, you have to worry about both of them, so that's why I gave him all this time off. So hopefully we'll get him back."

Shaw knows Rocket Man is the gift of a lifetime and wants to relish whatever the gelding has left to offer. He is simultaneously realistic about the future.

SANTA ANITA SPRING STAKES ANNOUNCED

Santa Anita Park announced yesterday the stakes schedule for its 2015 Spring Meet, highlighted by six Grade I events during the Apr. 25 to June 28 stand. The centerpiece of the calendar will once again be the June 27 GI Gold Cup at Santa Anita, formerly the Hollywood Gold Cup.

In addition to the Gold Cup, the other Grade I races on the schedule are the May 9 Vanity S., the May 25 Gamely S., the May 30 American Oaks, June 13 Shoemaker Mile and the June 27 Triple Bend S.

The track will offer a total of 35 stakes throughout the 38-day meet, including 15 additional Grade II and Grade III contests.

It will mark the second consecutive year that Santa Anita holds the Spring Meet, which begins after the conclusion of the venue's winter season. The dates occupy the same spot on the calendar formerly held by now-closed Hollywood Park.

Long run as the closing day feature for the Winter Meet until last year, the GIII San Juan Capistrano S. over 14 furlongs on the turf will again wrap up the Spring Meet June 28.

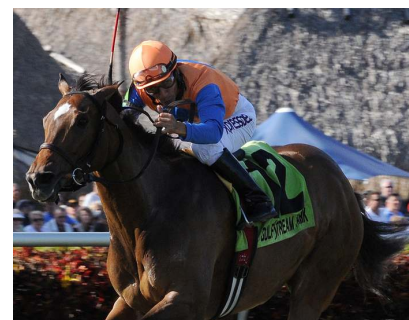

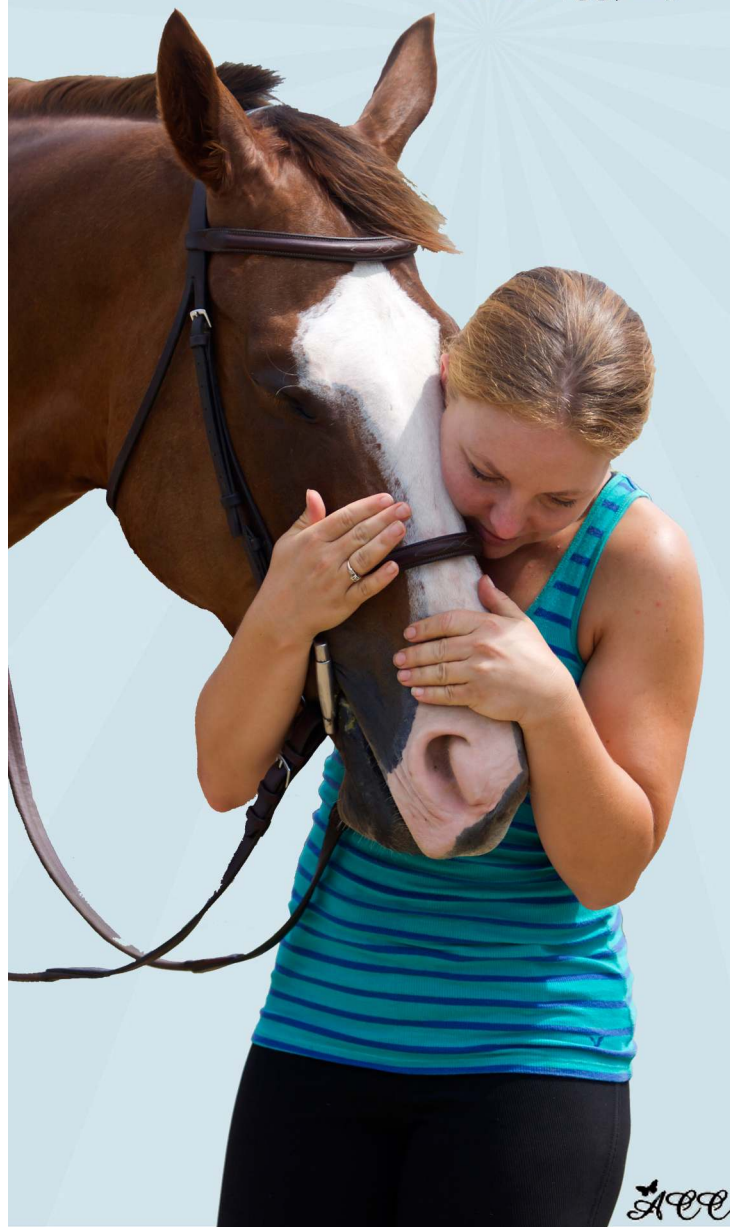
