SHARED BELIEF LIKELY ARKANSAS BOUND

Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}), who annihilated the field in Saturday's GI Santa Anita H., will likely make his next start in the Apr. 11 GII Oaklawn H., trainer Jerry Hollendorfer revealed during a radio interview on Mike Willman's "Thoroughbred Los Angeles" Sunday morning on AM 830, KLAA. "He came out of the race very good," Hollendorfer said. "We're very grateful to have a good horse like him." As for calls to send Shared Belief to Dubai for the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup, Hollendorfer said, "No, we're not going to Dubai. There are lots of races in this country to run in with plenty big enough purses. We just don't want to make a trip over there."

SANTA ANITA DERBY NEXT FOR DORTMUND

Dortmund (Big Brown), who took his record to a perfect five-for-five with his win in Saturday's GII San Felipe S., exited the race in fine shape and remains on target for the Apr. 4 GI Santa Anita Derby.

"It was a walk in the park for him," trainer Bob Baffert said of his charge's 1 1/4-length victory.

San Felipe runner-up **Prospect Park** (Tapit) and third-place finisher **Bolo** (Temple City) are also considered likely for the Santa Anita Derby.

"He came out of the race great," trainer Clifford Sise, Jr. said of Prospect Park, who was making his stakes debut Saturday. "I talked to [co-owner

and breeder] Marty [Wygod] and he's very happy with the way he ran. We feel like he'll run all day and with the trip he had yesterday, we've got a pretty fresh horse this morning."

Ocho Ocho Ocho (Street Sense), who suffered the first loss of his four-race career when eighth in the San Felipe, is also likely to start in the Santa Anita Derby.

"He's a little cut up," trainer Jim Cassidy said Sunday morning. "Both front legs have some lacerations on them. He had a rough trip. It happened from the gate and then at the first turn. Mike [Smith] said, 'Just throw the race out. I never got a chance.'" **Cont. p3**

ROSE BLOOMS IN FLORES

Harlington's Rose (Harlington) came charging down the center of the track to win the GIII Las Flores S. by 3/4 lengths Sunday at Santa Anita. The 4-year-old filly raced along the rail with the chasing pack as **Global Hottie** (Dixie Chatter) and **Tribal Gal** (Tribal Rule) battled through an opening quarter in :21.70 and a half in :44.78. Shuffled back in traffic on the turn, she angled off the rail and split horses to loom a threat into the lane. She found her best gear while rallying five wide in deep stretch and surged clear in the final sixteenth to earn the first graded tally of her career.

"She has developed," trainer Steve Knapp said of the winner. "When she was two and three, she wanted to run off. Now, she's learned how to relax behind horses and this made her a much, much better horse. She's rating well now and the layoff probably helped her out a little bit and she's just sharp right now."

Winning rider Joe Talamo added, "You can put her in any spot and she's definitely a good horse. It was a really nice race. I was able to save some ground on the turn and she came out and just blasted off. I think Steve could have ridden her today. I was following Global Hottie and she came out at the half-mile pole, so I went inside and she ducked back in, so I had to take up a little bit, but fortunately I had enough horse to get her momentum going again." **Cont. p3**

FLORIDA DERBY ON TAP FOR UPSTART

Upstart (Flatter), disqualified from first and placed second in the Feb. 21 GII Besilu Fountain of Youth S., will likely make his next start in the Mar. 28 GI Besilu Florida Derby. "Right now, we're certainly pointing to the Florida Derby," confirmed trainer Rick Violette, Jr. "We'll follow his lead if he makes us change course, but that's where we're going." The dark bay had his first work since the Fountain of Youth Saturday morning, going four furlongs in :48.48 at Palm Meadows. "He went an easy half," Violette said. "We just let him blow off some steam, and he was great, and he cooled out great. I galloped him [Sunday] morning. He didn't need a day off. I'm really happy with where we are. He's rebounded from the tough race in the Fountain of Youth."

Harlington's Rose was twice stakes placed before breaking through with a 1 1/4-length victory over this track in the Kalookan Queen S. last December. She was third behind Sam's Sister (Brother Derek) in the Jan. 19 GII Santa Monica S. and was third again, beaten a half-length, over the Las Flores track and trip in a Feb. 12 optional claimer.

Owned by Thomas Halasz, Ryan Johnson, Paul Newhart and Martha Miller, Harlington's Rose was a \$7,500 OBS August yearling and a \$20,000 Barretts October yearling in 2012. She is the first foal out of stakes winner A Rose for You, who was purchased, with this foal in utero, for \$25,000 at the 2010 Keeneland November sale. The mare, in foal to First Dude, brought \$40,000 from Arindel Farm at the 2013 OBS October sale. She produced a filly by First Dude last year.

GOTHAM RUNNERS AOK SUNDAY

Zayat Stables' **El Kabeir** (Scat Daddy) will now be aimed at the Apr. 4 GI Twinspires.com Wood Memorial after exiting his win in Saturday's GIII Gotham S. in fine shape. "He ate up well last night and looked great this morning," said trainer John Terranova. "He's happy, sound, and was excited to see everybody [today]. All looks well." Terranova was pleased to see El Kabeir settle off the pace Saturday. "I was very impressed, visually," Terranova said of the Gotham. "The way the race unfolded, he showed a whole new dimension. A lot was thrown at him yesterday and he made two big moves; it was very impressive. We're real proud of him."

Gotham runner-up **Tiz Shea D** (Tiznow), making his first start for Bill Mott after being purchased privately by Adam Wachtel a month ago, also was doing well Sunday morning. "He was good this morning, jogged well and very happy," said Mott's son and assistant Riley Mott. "He came to us in great shape, obviously, and he's thrived since being here and been training very well." The Wood remains a possibility for the colt, who was making his second start in the Gotham after a four-length debut win at Parx Feb. 7 for owner Daniel Shea and trainer Jason Servis.

"We're very pleased with how he ran and the Wood would seem to be the next logical step, but we'll speak to Mr. Wachtel and the boss [Bill Mott] and we'll get him back to the track and make a decision from there," said Mott.

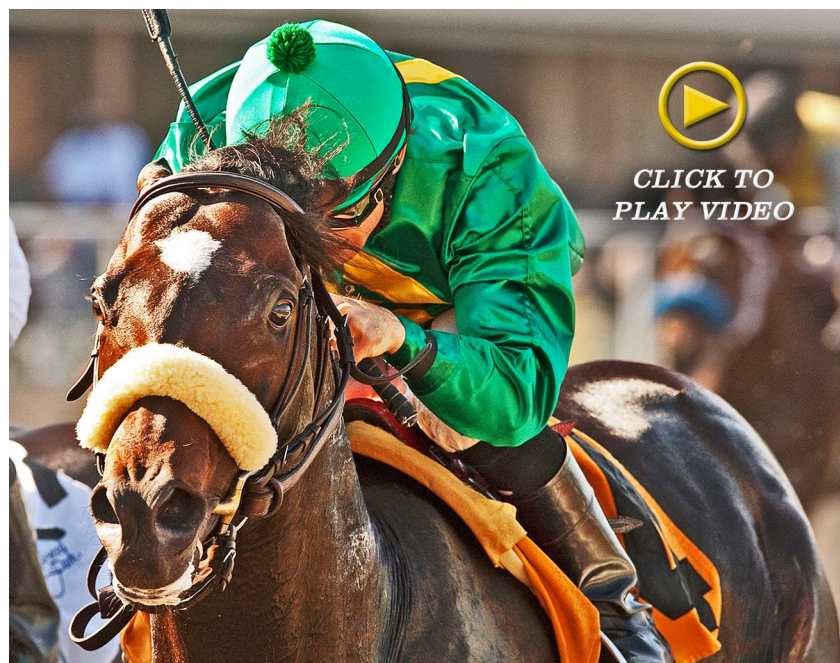
Also likely bound for the Wood is Gotham third-place finisher **Classy Class** (Discreetly Mine). "We thought he ran well from the hand he was dealt," said Art Magnuson, assistant to trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He broke a little flat-footed and ended up back a little far, but no complaints, I think Junior [Alvarado] worked out the best trip he could and he ran well. We were unlucky not to run second. Experience-wise it was an educational trip and he showed courage."

MEYDAN GROUP TO HOLD SECOND CHENGDU INTERNATIONAL CUP

The Meydan Group has announced that it will this year again team up with the Municipal Government of Chengdu, the capital of Sichuan province in South West China, to stage the second running of the Chengdu Dubai International Cup race day. The race meeting, to be held Apr. 3 at Jinma racecourse, in China's Wenjiang District, will be organized under the Emirates Racing Authority's rules of racing--a signatory to the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities. Race fields will consist of horses transported from the UAE to Chengdu and shipped back afterwards. Five turf races over distances from 1400 to 2418 meters will be contested by horses prepared by Dubai Racing Club trainers and ridden by jockeys who take part in the UAE race season and the Dubai World Cup Carnival. The feature race will be presented by Longines.

A spokesperson for the Wenjiang District Government said, "China's long and storied history is closely tied to the horse and we are pleased that this passion for the horse continues to this day. Last year we became a part of history as the partnership with the UAE brought international racing to the District of Wenjiang with the first Chengdu Dubai International Cup. Now we prepare for the second running of this race day as we develop the sport of horse racing in China. We are proud of this event and our bond that has grown between the District of Wenjiang, the Emirate of Dubai and the wider United Arab Emirates."

SATONO CROWN STAMPS CLASSIC CLAIMS

Satono Crown (Jpn) (Marju {Ire}) stretched his unbeaten record to three with a smooth win in the G2 Hochi Hai Yayoi Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas Trial), a race whose roll of honor includes such future stars as Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), To The World (Jpn) (King Kamehameha {Jpn}), Victoire Pisa (Jpn) (Neo Universe {Jpn}) and Special Week (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). The dark bay had made a winning debut in a 1800-meter 2-year-old newcomers' event at Tokyo Oct. 25, and doubled up a month later under Ryan Moore in the G3 Hai Nisai S. over the same trip. Breaking from post four yesterday, Satono Crown tracked the early leaders and was nudged along by jockey Yuichi Fukunaga to keep up with the solid pace set by Just For You.

Fukunaga started asking his mount for more around the bend and the colt offered a decisive response, hitting the front entering the straight and pulling clear of his rivals in a matter of strides. **Bright Emblem (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}), who had been spotted two lengths off the pack in mid-race and rounded the turn widest of all, produced an impressive late rush to grab second place, 1 1/2 lengths adrift of the winner.

Tagano Espresso (Jpn) (Black Tide {Jpn}) hung on for third, a further 2 1/2 lengths back.

The winning jockey told *Racing Post*, "In the previous race, he got in trouble at the break, so the staff trained him not to do the same thing. I got a good position after the good break and he is near complete as a

racehorse and good to handle. I expect success in the big races in future." Purchased for the equivalent of \$480,000 as a yearling, the Northern Farm-bred Satono Crown is a full-brother to G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Lightning Pearl (Ire) (Marju {Ire}). VERCINGETORIX RETIRED

Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's **Vercingetorix (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}--National Vixen {SAf}, by National Assembly), who disappointed in the G1 Jebel Hatta at Meydan Saturday when checking home sixth, has emerged from the race with a pulled sesamoidal ligament and will not race again. Trainer Mike de Kock reported on his website that Christophe Soumillon felt something was amiss with the 5-year-old entering the straight. "Christophe couldn't persevere with Vercingetorix, but he said the horse wanted to carry on, he was trying to run to the end which shows just how courageous he is, he had more rivals behind him than ahead of him at the post despite his discomfort," said de Kock. "It's a big setback, Vercingetorix would have been a serious runner for us on World Cup night, we had him on top of his game for this race, he was extremely well," the South African trainer continued. "But we have to face reality. This is what I hate about racing. One gets up, only to go down. I guess it happens in most other sports. Thankfully our horse is okay, the injury is not life-threatening."

Vercingetorix won seven of his 10 starts, including the G1 Daily News 2000 in his home country, the 2014 G1 Jebel Hatta and a pair of Group 2 events. He also ran second to Just A Way (Jpn) (Heart's Cry {Jpn}) in last year's G1 Dubai Duty Free. A stud career now looms for the son of leading South African-based stallion Silvano, with Mike de Kock expressing confidence that the horse would be syndicated to stand in his native country. "Vercingetorix's owner, Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, has agreed that, ideally, [Vercingetorix] should return to South Africa as a stallion. Jehan Malherbe of Form Bloodstock and I will present any proposals received to the sheikh for consideration," de Kock said.
