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'PHAROAH' TO GET REBEL YELL

For the second time since 2010, the reigning Eclipse Award-winning 2-year-old gets his sophomore season started in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park. The Bob Baffert-trained Lookin at Lucky (Smart Strike) overcame a tough trip to just tag Noble's Promise (Cuvee) five years ago, and today, Zayat Stables' **American Pharoah** (Pioneerof the Nile) makes the first of two programmed appearances ahead of what connections hope will result in a trip to Louisville for the GI Kentucky Derby on the first Saturday of May.

Fifth behind Om (Munnings) as the 7-5 chalk in what has become an amazingly key Del Mar maiden Aug. 9, American Pharoah was audaciously stepped up into the GI Del Mar Futurity 25 days later and made light work of that bunch, defeating Calculator (In Summation) by 4 3/4 lengths. Stretched to two turns for the first time in Santa Anita's GI FrontRunner S. Sept. 27, he never gave his rivals a chance, dictating a comfortable pace before kicking home 3 1/4 lengths to the good of Calculator and Texas Red (Afleet Alex). Withdrawn on the eve of the

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile with a bruise of his left front foot, he remained in the barn as Texas Red ran away with the race, further franking the FrontRunner form.

He returned to the worktab Feb. 2 and has since recorded a half-dozen drills, including a race-like six panels from the gate in a freakish 1:10 2/5 Mar. 6. He also figures the lone speed of a short field and should handle these, provided his fitness holds out.

"A lot is expected from this horse, and he hasn't run in a while, but we feel confident that he's going to run well," Baffert said. "He just needs some racing luck."

UNTAPABLE LOOKS INVINCIBLE IN AZERI

Like American Pharoah, Winchell Thoroughbreds' champion **Untapable** (Tapit) is pegged as the 1-2 morning-line favorite for her return to the races in today's GII Azeri S., the final local prep for the \$600,000 GI Apple Blossom H. during the Racing Festival of the South Friday, Apr. 10. And like that champion, it's tough to go past the heavy chalk in spite of the winter's absence.

The homebred bay was nothing short of sensational in 2014, winning each of her six tries against her fellow females, culminating with her 1 1/4-length defeat of Don't

Tell Sophia (Congaree) with short of an easy trip in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 31. It says much that Untapable was made the 7-5 chalk when facing the boys in the GI Haskell Invitational S. July 27, but she never got untracked that afternoon, finishing a well-beaten fifth and effectively dashing any hopes of Horse of the Year contention. It's all systems go, according to trainer Steve Asmussen. **Cont. p4**

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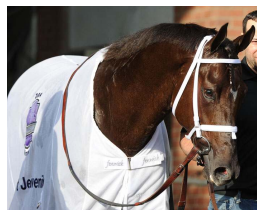

Though he may be limited in what he can accomplish this afternoon, Harold Lerner's **The Truth Or Else** has some things going for him. A maiden winner in a busy seven-race campaign at two, the son of dual Grade III victress Lakenheath (Colonial Affair) managed placings--albeit it distant ones--behind Daredevil (More Than Ready) and Upstart (Flatter) in the GI Champagne S. and in back of Blofeld (Quality Road) and El Kabeir (Scat Daddy) in the GII Nashua S. ahead of a sixth in the GII Remsen S. Lasix went on for the first time in this track's GIII Southwest S. Feb. 22, and the colt far exceeded expectations with a runner-up effort to Far Right (Notional) after making a bold move into contention.

Madefromlucky has shown marked improvement since being stretched to two turns. Runner-up in a Monmouth maiden last August, he belied odds of 10-1 to graduate going 8 1/2 furlongs over the Gulfstream main track Dec. 23. After an interest in the colt was purchased by Everett Dobson's Cheyenne Stables, the chestnut returned 1-5 to his backers for a workmanlike 1 1/2-length success in Hallandale Feb. 4. John Velazquez, in to pilot Untapable (Tapit) in the GII Azeri S., retains the call for the Todd Pletcher barn.

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Last Week - Well, we're both still showing a profit, but not by much after hitting a bit of a cold spell. **Classy Class** gave me the best run of my three selections last weekend in the Gotham, but hung a bit late to just get tagged for second after awaiting racing room in the stretch. **Danzig Moon**, meanwhile, never put in a serious rally to finish a well-beaten fourth behind the ultra-impressive Carpe Diem in the Tampa Bay Derby. **Lord Nelson** was equally disappointing with a fourth-place finish after sitting a perfect trip just behind the leaders in the San Felipe. I hate to get attached to one particular horse before the final preps take place, but the one that I want right now on the first Saturday in May is Carpe Diem.

GII Rebel S. - There are plenty of times to make a case against the favorite and take a shot with a price. This is not one of them. Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert's success at Oaklawn is no secret and champion **American Pharoah** figures to have things his own way against six overmatched rivals here. There doesn't appear to be any other major speed to keep him honest early, which is a very scary scenario for a horse that already appears to tower over the competition. I probably will take a small flyer in my personal wagers on Bold Conquest after being so high on him last time in the Southwest, but it's hard to imagine him running for anything better than second in this one. **Selection:** **#4 American Pharoah (1-2).**

Last Week - Neither **Combat Driver** nor **Great Stuff** ran a step, finishing ninth and fifth, respectively, in the Gotham and Tampa Bay Derby. I thought **Bolo**, however, ran a very solid race to be a close third in the San Felipe. Traveling without cover throughout his dirt debut, the dark bay made a menacing move into the stretch before being repelled by Dortmund and just tagged late by Prospect Park. Bolo earned a significant speed figure top for the effort, and looks like he may very well be effective on dirt after all.

GII Rebel S. - It's hard to deny that this isn't exactly the best betting race we've seen so far in this contest. There's simply nobody to run with champion **American Pharoah** early, and nobody good enough to reel him in late. The abbreviated juvenile campaign might be somewhat of a knock, but looking at the bay's last two bullet works leading up to this, he appears to be doing just fine. Hall of Famer Bob Baffert's success in Hot Springs is also well documented--he's won an incredible four of the last five renewals of this race to go with four Southwests and one Arkansas Derby. One might argue that American Pharoah got an easy lead when breaking his maiden in the GI Del Mar Futurity, but he duplicated that effort with a less advantageous trip in the GI FrontRunner S. while besting next-out GIII Sham S. winner Calculator, GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Texas Red and Speakeasy S. romper and eventual GII San Vicente S. winner Lord Nelson. **Selection: #4 American Pharoah (1-2).**

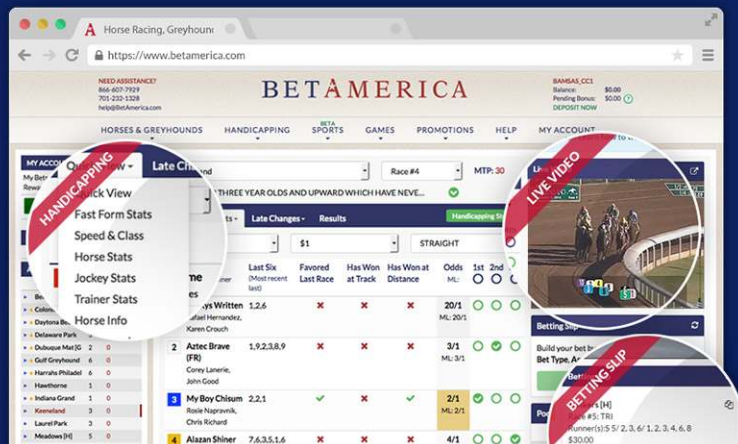

It's hard to believe that there is any graded event in California that Hall of Famer Bob Baffert has not won, but the GI Santa Margarita S. has managed to elude him. The conditioner seeks his first win in that

1 1/8-mile event at Santa Anita today with Mike Pegram, Karl Watson and Paul Weitman's **Tiz Midnight** (Midnight Lute). Earning her diploma over this strip last summer, the bay reeled off two more wins in Del Mar optional claimers before being dropped into the deep end in the GI Zenyatta S. here Sept. 27, where she finished a very respectable second to champion

Beholder (Henny Hughes). Sixth to eventual champion 3-year-old filly Untapable (Tapit) in the track-and-trip GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 31, Tiz Midnight garnered her first black-type success next out at Los Alamitos in the GII Bayakoa S. Dec. 6. The 5-year-old failed to factor in her seasonable bow in this venue's Paseana S. Jan. 11, where she finished sixth as the favorite behind Bayakoa runner-up **Warren's Veneda** (Affirmative) going 1 1/16 miles over a wet/fast surface. Fellow Hall of Famer Jerry Hollendorfer, who won this race last year with Let Faith Arise (Kafwain), looks to return to the winner's circle with **Thegirlinthat song** (My Golden Song), owned by Hollendorfer in partnership with D. Gatto, S. Melen, P. and T. Russo and S. Taub. Second to 'TDN Rising Star' **Cassatt** (Tapit) in the Zia Park Oaks Nov. 26, the dark bay captured her 4-year-old debut in the GII La Canada S. going 1 1/16 miles over this strip Jan. 17 and was third last time behind Warren's Veneda and **Uzziel** (Harlington) in this venue's GII Santa Maria S., run at that same distance, last time Feb. 14. Fox Hill Farms's GIII Monmouth Oaks heroine Cassatt followed her victory in the Zia Park Oaks with a 5 3/4-length romp in the Tiffany Lass S. at the Fair Grounds Dec. 21. The Larry Jones trainee kicked off this season with another victory in the 1 1/16-mile Houston Ladies Classic Jan. 24. Fellow 'TDN Rising Star' **Dame Dorothy** (Bernardini) seeks her first victory at the highest level for owner Bobby Flay and trainer Todd Pletcher. Victorious in her first four starts, which included Belmont's GIII Turnback the Alarm H. Oct. 26, the bay lost her perfect record when finishing third in Aqueduct's GIII Comely S. Nov. 29. The 4-year-old returned to her winning ways last time with a win in Gulfstream's seven-furlong Sunshine Millions Distaff Jan. 17.

"She is doing extremely well and this race will be a good starting point to her four-year-old campaign," said Asmussen, who sent the filly out for a one-mile gallop over a muddy track on Wednesday morning.

The Ken McPeck-trained Take Charge Lady (Dehere) nearly took down the colors of the Horse of the Year for whom this race is named in the 2003 Apple Blossom, and the stable will try to play spoiler this afternoon with the hard-knocking **Flashy American**. Sixth in this a year ago, she took the GIII Sixty Sails H. in her next start for her lone success of the season. She most recently returned from a freshening to run TDN Rising Star **Mufajaah** to a neck, with fellow Rising Star **Gold Medal Dancer** third, last time out in the GIII Bayakoa S.

The latter, a three-time winner entering this term, posted a 5-1 upset of this track's Pippin S. Jan. 17 before earning her first graded-stakes black-type in the Bayakoa. She was rumored to have run her last race, but connections press on for at least one more go this afternoon.

TAPITURE RETURNS IN RAZORBACK

Winchell Thoroughbreds homebred **Tapiture** (Tapit) headlines an intriguing field of seven in Oakawn Park's 1 1/16-mile GIII Razorback H. Winner of last term's GIII Southwest S., the Steve Asmussen pupil failed to

fire in the GI Kentucky Derby, but enjoyed a successful second half of the season, starting with a win in Churchill Downs's GIII Matt Winn S. June 14. A nose victor over GII Robert B. Lewis S. winner Candy Boy (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the 1 1/8-mile GII West Virginia Derby Aug. 2, the chestnut was a solid second behind

GI Breeders' Cup Classic victor Bayern (Offlee Wild) in the GII Pennsylvania Derby Sept. 20. Tapiture was last seen completing the exacta behind runaway Goldencents (Into Mischief) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 31. Another entry who was on last year's Triple Crown trail is Daniel Dougherty's hard-knocking **Ride on Curlin** (Curlin). One of just three sophomore to compete in all three legs of the Triple Crown, the Billy Gowan trainee was off the board in the Derby, but finished second to Horse of the Year California Chrome (Lucky Pulpit) in the GI Preakness S. two weeks later. Pulled up in the GI Belmont S. June 7, the bay was shelved for the rest of the season and returned with a late-running victory in a six-panel Oaklawn optional claimer Jan. 15. Second as the favorite to last year's Razorback winner Golden Lad (Medaglia d'Oro) in the track-and-trip Essex H. last time Feb. 14, the 4-year-old has never won going two turns, though he has hit the board several times. Matthew Schera's \$285,000 Keeneland November purchase **Race Day** (Tapit) takes another crack at black-type company for trainer Todd Pletcher. Winner of two of his first four starts for previous owner WinStar Farm and trainer Kellyn Gorder, the gray romped by 8 1/2 lengths in his debut for the Pletcher barn in a Gulfstream optional claimer Dec. 21. The 4-year-old finished third as the chalk last out in that venue's one-mile GIII Fred W. Hooper H. Feb. 7. Michael Langford's **Carve** (First Samurai) racked up three consecutive wins last summer before ending that streak with a second in the GIII Ack Ack H. Sept. 6. Off the board in both the Homecoming Classic Sept. 27 and the Dirt Mile Oct. 31, the dark bay returned to winning ways in the track-and-trip Fifth Season S. Jan. 16. Bob Baffert-trained 'TDN Rising Star' **Midnight Hawk** (Midnight Lute) scratched out of his home state's GII San Carlos S. last week in order to take the trip to Hot Springs with champion stablemate American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) to compete in this spot. Owned by Hill 'n' Dale Equine Holdings, Kitchen, Pegrarn, et al, last year's GIII Sham S. victor finished off last term with an optional claimer third on the Del Mar synthetic Nov. 30 and was a wide-trip ninth behind Shared Belief (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26. The gray kicked off his 4-year-old season with a victory in a one-mile Arcadia optional claimer last time Feb. 6.

LUCKY SEVENS FOR PLETCHER

Seven weeks out from the GI Kentucky Derby, trainer Todd Pletcher has seven prospects on course for America's biggest race. That's a big group but not out of the ordinary for--look, here is that number again--the seven-time Eclipse Award winner.

This is a non-racing weekend for members of the Pletcher septet, who are headed for final preps in late March and early April. Pletcher said Friday that GII Tampa Bay Derby winner **Carpe Diem** (Giant's Causeway) is bound for the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 4 at Keeneland; GII Fountain of Youth winner via DQ **Itsaknockout** (Lemon Drop Kid) will be pointed toward the GI Florida Derby Mar. 28 at Gulfstream Park; **Far from Over** (Blame) will return to the site of his GII Withers S. win at Aqueduct for the GI TwinSpires.com Wood Memorial S. Apr. 4, and John Battaglia Memorial S. winner **Royal Son** (Tiznow) is being considered for other races, but is likely to be sent back to Turfway Park for the GIII Spiral S. Mar. 21. **Cont. p6**

Still to be determined, Pletcher said, is where GII Swale runner-up **Daredevil** (More Than Ready), Islamorada winner **Materiality** (Afleet Alex) and **Stanford** (Malibu Moon), DQ'd from second to sixth in the Islamorada, will run next. In all likelihood, one or more of them will face other Pletcher stablemates.

An eighth Derby candidate, unbeaten **Khozan** (Distorted Humor), underwent successful sesamoid surgery on his right rear Monday and is expected to return to training this summer.

Carpe Diem, Daredevil, Materiality and Stanford all competed last weekend. Far From Over, Itsaknockout and Royal Son are scheduled to breeze at Palm Beach Downs Saturday morning.

Pletcher is well-versed in preparing a squadron of runners for the Derby. He has had Derby starters in 14 of the last 15 years and in 12 of those races has saddled multiple runners. He had a record-tying five starters in 2007 and 2013, and four in 2000, 2010 and 2014.

Alphabetically, 'TDN Rising Star' Carpe Diem is at the top of Pletcher's list of candidates. He may be there on

talent, too. Co-owned by WinStar Farm and Stonestreet Stables, Carpe Diem was an impressive five-length winner in the Tampa Bay Derby, which was his 2015 debut.

"He came out of it very well," Pletcher said. "It seems like he's in good shape out of the race. The plan all along was the Blue

Grass as the first choice for the final prep. It still is and that's where we're headed."

The Tampa Bay Derby was Carpe Diem's first start since finishing second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in November. Prior to that effort, the hulking bay posted an impressive victory in Keeneland's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity Oct. 4.

"We were certainly very optimistic that he had made that transition from two to three that you're hoping for and he breezed very well," Pletcher said. "You're always worried when you're running a horse of his caliber, and he hasn't run in a while and you're going to a track that you've never run on, especially a surface like Tampa's that can be a little quirky at times. We had concerns like all trainers do about everything, but we were confident that he was coming up to it well and we were ecstatic with the way he ran."

Fellow 'TDN Rising Star' Materiality won his racing debut in January and took the Islamorada by 5 3/4 lengths to push his way into the Derby prep picture.

"We were very impressed with the way he handled the step out to a mile and an eighth," Pletcher said. "So far, he seems to have come out of it very well and we're trying to decide between the Florida Derby, the Wood Memorial or possibly the [GI] Arkansas Derby [Apr. 11], if we felt that we needed more time. It's a case of just trying to assess how he's doing and if 22 days is going to be enough time between races to turn around for the Florida Derby. It will be one of those three races and if we're leaning in any direction right now it would be ever so slightly to the Florida Derby."

Pletcher said that he and his staff are still trying to decide what is next for Royal Son.

"He's in a little bit of the same boat as Materiality with a quick turnaround," Pletcher said. "But he ran so well at Turfway in the Battaglia that that's our first choice, if we feel like he breezes accordingly tomorrow and that 21 days is enough time." **Cont. p7**

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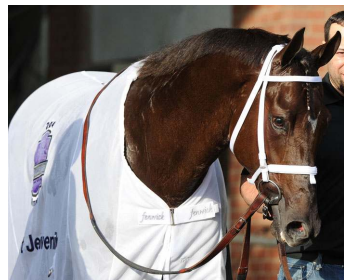

"We're pleased with his race," Pletcher said. "Even though he ran second, we thought he ran very well. We basically have the same three possible races for him as we do for Materiality. All things being equal, I would be leaning every so slightly toward the Wood Memorial.

Pletcher said that Stanford could run next in the

GI Louisiana Derby Mar. 28 or the GIII Lexington S. Apr. 11 at Keeneland.

With seven prospects for the May 2 Derby, there is a pretty good chance that Pletcher will have multiple runners in the Wood and the Florida Derby.

"Look, it's a great problem to have," Pletcher said. "It can be uncomfortable at times. You hate to run horses against each other and generally only one can win. In these cases, the only fair thing to do is to do what you feel is correct for each individual horse and each individual owner. That's all you can do and sometimes that means running two stablemates against each other which a lot of times is harder on the trainer than the horse."

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UPSTART, FROSTED WORK AT PALM MEADOWS

Ralph Evans' **Upstart** (Flatter) and Godolphin Racing LLC's **Frosted** (Tapit), second and fourth in the Feb. 21 GI Fountain of Youth S. respectively, each posted six-furlong workouts at Palm Meadows Training Center Friday morning. Both colts are being pointed toward a potential start in the Mar. 28 GI Besilu Stables Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park.

Upstart, who crossed the wire first in the Fountain of Youth, only to be disqualified and placed second behind Itsaknockout (Lemon Drop Kid) for interference, completed his breeze in 1:13.40. It was his second work since the race.

"It was a terrific work," commented trainer Rick Violette. "He went in 13 and change and he got a good blow out of it. I don't think the racetrack was all that fast when he was working around 8:30, 8:35 (a.m.)."

Violette said earlier this week that the Florida Derby is now Upstart's next main objective on the road to the GI Kentucky Derby.

"He came out of it good, so all systems are go," noted Violette. "I'm thrilled with where we are."

Meanwhile, Frosted stopped the clock in 1:11.65 while working in company--the fastest of four moves at the distance. The grey took the lead turning for home in the Fountain of Youth, but stopped abruptly and tired in the stretch.

"We're trying to eliminate some things that happened to him in the Fountain of Youth," explained trainer Kieran McLaughlin. "We don't know why he kind of pulled himself up or stopped. We put him behind horses [yesterday] and we were very pleased with his work. What we were happy to see was a very serious work and that he did it the right way."

The trainer added that while a start in the Florida Derby remains a possibility, Frosted could alternatively compete Apr. 4 in Aqueduct's GI Wood Memorial S. or Keeneland's GI Blue Grass S.

"We're happy with where we are, but we still don't know exactly where we're going," McLaughlin said.

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TDN Q&A

OBS PRESIDENT TOM VENTURA

The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's President Tom Ventura recently sat down for a Q&A session with the TDN's Steve Sherack to discuss the upcoming new-look OBS March 2-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The two-day auction--to be held at 11 a.m. Mar. 17 and 18--has expanded its format for 2015 with a total of 610 juveniles catalogued (up from 411 in 2014). In 2014, records were established for gross (\$37,627,500), average (\$187,201) and median (\$135,000). The co-topping 'TDN Rising Star' *Carpe Diem* (Giant's Causeway), winner of last term's GI Claiborne Breeders' Futurity, kicked off his sophomore campaign in style with an impressive win in the GII Tampa Bay Derby. He was one of three seven-figure juveniles to go through the ring at OBSMAR in 2014.

Q: Tell us a little bit about what led to the change of expanding the format for this year's OBS March sale. What kind of response have you gotten from consignors and potential buyers so far?

A: It wasn't an easy decision because we had such a good sale last year. But, after talking with the buyers and consignors about opening it up a little more, it seemed that the timing was right. We had the support of the consignors and also interest from the buyers. Some of the buyers may have become a little more hesitant, maybe, to come to the March Sale as the average kept creeping up. We thought that we could get broader participation from the buyers [by expanding] and they were very receptive as we went around and got feedback. The consignors felt that by putting in that next group of horses that were a little more advanced in training, that if the buyers were here for them, that it was good timing [for the expansion] as well.

Q: Coming off a pair of record-breaking March sales, including a trio of million-dollar transactions in 2014, how much more difficult was it to make this change now?

A: Like I said, we were coming off some really strong years. From our end, we wanted to make sure that we were able to retain that top group of horses. We didn't want to expand the sale just for the sake of expanding and then lose some of that upper-end horse. We got commitments from the consignors that they were going to stick with us with those horses. We thought we needed to make a gradual expansion and we got about 200 more horses. We wanted to make sure that we still kept those top-end horses and just added some other ones that were a little more advanced in their training that would stack up physically here as well.

Q: Were you originally planning on making OBS March a three-day sale this year?

A: We thought that three days would be the maximum that we would have. When the numbers came in and the cut-off was in the 600 range, we thought that holding the breeze show over three days was the right thing to do to give us some room to maneuver [in case of bad weather]. We felt that selling 300 horses a day--by that time all the homework is done--that we could get that amount sold each day and not tie up the buyers any longer.

Q: Are 2-year-old select sales becoming a dying breed? While things appeared to go well with a new venue for the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale at Gulfstream Park, Keeneland April was eliminated from the calendar in 2015, and of the 116 catalogued at Barretts, there were 48 outs and 22 RNAs. What are your thoughts on boutique 2-year-old sales?

A: You need to have numbers to attract a wider group of buyers. It's difficult when you keep a sale for 150 horses or so, and we weren't in that position by any means with March being at 400-plus [in 2014]. It certainly isn't an easy task to hold a boutique-type sale anymore. Especially when you have people traveling a long ways from either California to Florida or even from Japan to anywhere in the U.S.

Q: Will the expansion of the March sale have any effect on your April and June 2-year-old sales?

A: We'll have 1,200 horses again in April, that's our capacity. June remains to be seen. That sale really expanded in numbers last year. And I'm not sure if we'll have quite those numbers again this year. But April certainly hasn't been impacted by this at all.

Q: What are your expectations for OBSMAR and how do you see the market for 2-year-olds playing out in 2015?

A: At the end of the day, it's how these horses do on the racetrack. We're certainly coming off not only a good year in the sales ring, but a tremendous year at the track. You have six Grade I wins at Saratoga [Itsmyluckyday, Palace, Stopchargingmaria & V.E. Day], you really don't need to say more than that. That doesn't even count Carpe Diem, who is among the leaders on the Derby trail. From that end, the horses have certainly been performing at the highest levels.

In addition, when you've got the purse structure in New York and a little bit more stability in South Florida, I think that bodes well for the 2-year-old market this year, too.

Q: In early February, it was announced that beginning with the March Sale's under-tack show, OBS would begin to implement the Association of Racing Commissioners International guidelines for controlled therapeutic medications. The first phase includes adopting the ARCI medication schedule for administration of nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs and bronchodilators.

The policy regarding the use of a riding crop was also refined. At any time during a breeze, a rider may only use the riding crop while both hands are holding the reins and they're prohibited from striking the horse beyond the finish line. Excessive whipping before the beginning of the work or in preparation for a breeze is also prohibited.

Can you discuss these changes?

A: We thought that it was important that we get on board with the push toward uniformity of raceday medication with the goal of by next year's 2-year-old season adopting the complete ARCI standards. It's for the longterm benefit of the sale as it will benefit the horses as well and we think it's the right direction to go. We do believe that this year it's very likely that the medication guidelines of the ARCI will be part of a bill that will be passed in the Florida legislation. We thought that we would get in front of that. We thought it was important that we take this position and build some additional buyer confidence.

Regarding the whip, there were always restrictions, we just refined them a little by extending when the riders can/can't use them.

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JOCKEY CLUB RELEASES DATABASE STATS

The Jockey Club released comparative fatality statistics for 2013 and 2014 and a six-year statistical summary from its Equine Injury Database yesterday. A release read:

The incidence of fatal injury for 2014, 1.89 per 1,000 starts, was slightly less than it was in 2013. In 2013, it was 1.90 per 1,000 starts.

Dr. Tim Parkin, a veterinarian and epidemiologist from the University of Glasgow, who serves as a consultant on the Equine Injury Database, performed the analysis.

"In 2014, the incidence of fatal injury on turf increased 27% after showing a 20% decrease in the prior year; however, the incidence of fatal injury decreased 3.8% on dirt and 1.6% on synthetic over 2013," Parkin said.

The prevalence of race-related fatal injury for the six-year timeframe from January 1, 2009, through December 31, 2014, was 1.91 per 1,000 starts. The data was based on analysis of 2,180,443 starts.

When comparing race distance, shorter races (less than 6f) saw a slightly higher injury rate versus middle (6f to 8f) and long (more than 8f) races. This is consistent each year over the six-year span.

Similar to prior years, 2-year-olds continued the trend of the lowest rate of catastrophic injuries. However, unlike four of the previous five years, in 2014, 3-year-olds had a higher rate of catastrophic injuries than horses four years old and older.

The statistics include only injuries that resulted in fatalities within 72 hours from the date of the race. Summary statistics are subject to change due to a number of considerations.

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CONEYGREE PROVES 'FAIRYTALES DO HAPPEN'

To an extent, National Hunt racing is now not too far removed from the Flat in that the big stables dominate and wealthy owners are so powerfully represented that it is hard for the smaller operators to figure at major events.

While there was plenty of cheer at the Cheltenham Festival for those who invest heavily in jump racing--three winners for Rich Ricci, three for JP McManus, two for Gigginstown House Stud, and a one-two in the Triumph Hurdle for Simon Munir and Isaac Souede--the result to strike at the heart of everyday jumping folk was the astonishing performance by Coneygree (GB) (Karinga Bay {GB}) in steeplechasing's blue riband, the G1 Cheltenham Gold Cup.

The 8-year-old hails from a stable which contains

only 10 horses and he is trained by the son-in-law and daughter of one of the most cherished members of the jumps fraternity, Lord Oaksey, who died in September 2012. However, it wasn't just Coneygree's remarkable back-story which captivated spectators, but the

manner in which he triumphed. Still classified as a novice after only nine previous starts, he put his 15 rivals to the sword from the fall of the starter's flag after being driven to the lead by his young jockey Nico de Boinville and retaining that position at a fearsome gallop throughout. One by one, more battle-hardened chasers dropped away in surrender.

The record book will show that he beat Djakadam (Fr) (Saints Des Saints {Fr}) by 1 1/2 lengths, with a further two lengths back to Road To Riches (Ire) (Gamut {Ire}), but this in no way conveys the extraordinary courage and assured jumping display over the 22 fences and three miles, 2 1/2 furlongs of Cheltenham's undulating and stamina-sapping New Course. **Cont. p11**

"I knew he would answer my every call," said de Boinville, one of the less established names of the weighing-room but respected nonetheless for his role as work rider of the great Sprinter Sacre (Fr) (Network {Ger}) in his everyday employment at Nicky Henderson's stable. "It's the first time I've ridden in a top-class Grade 1 race--it's the greatest feeling in the world and I couldn't ask for much more."

De Boinville rides out at trainer Mark Bradstock's stable once a week and has developed an enviable partnership with eight-time winner Coneygree, who is ridden on a daily basis by the trainer's wife, Sara.

The jockey added, "I'm just so grateful to Lady Oaksey and the syndicate, and to Mark and Sara for keeping the faith--there are so many good jockeys out there that I admire, respect and look up to who could have easily taken that ride."

It's easy to imagine that Lord Oaksey, though not there to offer his approval, would back the former amateur rider de Boinville wholeheartedly. A formidable amateur jump jockey himself, when riding as Hon. John Lawrence, Lord Oaksey was also a hugely respected racing journalist for the *Daily Telegraph* and *Horse & Hound* and popular broadcaster in the early days of *Channel 4 Racing*. He bred Coneygree from his mare Plaid Maid (Ire) (Executive Perk {GB}) who was bought for just £3,000 to give him some fun in retirement.

In his autobiography, *Mince Pie For Starters*, Oaksey recounted his narrow defeat on Carrickbeg in the 1963 Grand National, saying, "I had little time to feel the crushing disappointment of 'so near and yet so far' as I had to file my report for the *Sunday Telegraph* within minutes of weighing in. I rushed into the changing room to wipe the worst of the Aintree mud off my face, then, still in my riding colours, ran across the Ormskirk Road to file the story."

Written in 2003, the book ends by Oaksey predicting that Plaid Maid's newborn first foal would win the G1 Cheltenham Gold Cup and he confided that he had struck a bet of £10 at odds of 1000/1. His aim may have been slightly off target but his ambition was true.

That foal, later named Carruthers (GB) (Kayf Tara {GB}), went on to win the G3 Hennessy Gold Cup at Newbury in 2011 and, still in training as a 12-year-old, runs in Saturday's Midlands Grand National. His next-door neighbour at the Bradstocks' Old Manor Stables in Letcombe Bassett--his much bigger half-brother Coneygree--has now fulfilled that dream, and another close relative could soon join the fold as, five minutes before the off in the Gold Cup, their half-sister Maid Of Oaksey (GB) was covered by Kayf Tara (GB) (Sadler's Wells) at Overbury Stud.

"It's because my father was the greatest," said Sara Bradstock as she bounced around the Cheltenham winner's enclosure. "That's where we've got this luck from; he deserved it and he's looking down. He's not here but he is here in spirit."

She added, "I can't believe it. I have been saying to people 'When we win the Gold Cup' in the same breath that I say 'When we win the lottery'. It's that amazing. It means anyone can do it. It doesn't need hundreds of thousands of pounds. The little mare cost £3,000 and look what she's done. Fairytales do happen."

Counting Down to AP's Farewell...

The jumps season doesn't officially end until late April, but Friday marked the final appearance at the Cheltenham Festival of the sport's most successful jockey of all time, AP McCoy, 40, who last month announced that he is to retire on the day he is set to be crowned champion jockey for the 20th consecutive time.

The final race of the Festival was renamed the AP McCoy Grand Annual Chase in his honor and, riding in the race for his boss JP McManus, McCoy had to settle for fourth place on the favourite Ned Buntline (GB) (Refuse To Bend {Ire}).

The previous day, he had recorded his 31st (and what would transpire to be his final) Festival victory on Uxizandre (Fr) (Fragrant Mix {Ire}) in the G1 Ryanair Chase. On that occasion, and on his farewell ride at jump racing's headquarters, he was given a rousing reception by fans pressed layers-deep along the walkway and around the paddock.

With more than 4,000 winners to his credit, he has ridden 221 this season alone--almost 100 more than his nearest rival in the table, Richard Johnson. It seems unlikely that National Hunt racing will ever again witness a talent akin to AP McCoy.

CAPTAIN CAT EYES WINTER DERBY GLORY

Flat racing's Pattern season gets underway in the UK at Lingfield Saturday with the running of the £100,000 G3 Winter Derby, where Roger Charlton's dual G3 winner **Captain Cat (Ire)** (Dylan Thomas {Ire}) bids to add another feather to his cap. The 6-year-old gelding really came into his own last season, finishing in the money in all bar one of his nine outings. He opened his account at Pattern level when landing the G3 Sovereign S. in August and was back for more in the G3 Superior Mile Sept. 6. He also achieved a creditable fifth to Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on British Champions Day, but connections were at loss to explain his below-par performance on his final start of the season, when he finished last of 10 in the G1 Hong Kong Mile.

"Captain Cat seems in good form," Charlton told *Sky Sports*. "He has had no setbacks and has been doing regular exercise. This race has been the plan for a while." The trainer added, "Lingfield suits him. There may be fitter horses in the race, but he seems good. I think he can hold his own at this level. He made terrific improvement last year and was not beaten far in a Group 2 and ran well in a Group 1, but he needs to improve again."

Captain Cat's 10 rivals include Godolphin's **Tryster (Ire)** (Shamardal), who is unbeaten in three starts this year, all in handicap company. His latest effort at Kempton earned him a 100 official rating. Trainer Charlie Appleby commented, "Tryster goes into Saturday's race with a nice, progressive profile. He has come out of his last win at Kempton Park very well, has a decent draw in stall four and a mile and a quarter is a great trip for him."

Another with progressive form to his name is Marco Botti's **Grendisar (Ire)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), who scored in his last two starts including the Listed Winter Derby Trial S., in which he had **Cloudscape (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), dual US-graded winner and multiple Grade I-placed **Grandeur (Ire)** (Verglas {Ire}) and **Alfonso de Sousa** (Henrythenavigator) behind him.

The winner of the Winter Derby is awarded an automatic and free berth in the £200,000 All-Weather Championships middle distance final, to be staged over the same course and distance on Good Friday, Apr. 3.

Pride Of Dubai's new connections would be required to pay the late nomination fee of A\$150,000 Monday.

'PORTENO' HEADS LATINOAMERICANO

G1 Carlos Pellegrini hero **Idolo Porteno (Arg)** (Jump Start) heads a strong Argentine delegation and an international field of 13 bidding for glory in today's G1 Longines Gran Premio Asociacion Latinoamericana de Jockey Clubes e Hipodromos, South America's most prominent weight-for-age event.

This year's 31st renewal of the Latinoamericano, which will be run at 2100 meters on the dirt, marks the second time it will be staged at Hipodromo Argentino de Palermo in Buenos Aires. The race is reserved for horses 3-years-old and older who are nominated by the nation and track members of the Asociacion Latinoamericana de Jockey Clubes.

Idolo Porteno, the top local hopeful, reappears for the first time since winning South America's prestigious Carlos Pellegrini on turf at San Isidro in December, and seeks his third -straight Group 1 triumph after also previously annexing the G1 Gran Premio Dardo Rocha on dirt at Hipodromo La Plata in November. His trainer, Alfredo Gaitan Dassie, will bid for his first victory in the multinational Group 1 after prior failed attempts with Sebaorg (Arg) (Candy Stripes {Arg}) in 1996 at La Gavea in Rio de Janeiro and with Send in the Clowns (Brz) (Know Heights {Ire}) in 2011 at San Isidro. Legendary jockey Jorge Ricardo has a return assignment on Idolo Porteno, who will break from post five. **Cont. p14**

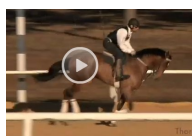
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
