PHAROAH MOPS UP IN THE SLOP

For the second year in a row, the third time in the span of four years and for the ninth time in the last 18 years, the world of Thoroughbred racing and the sports world at large is on the brink of a Triple Crown. Sent off the 9-10 favorite to follow up on his hard-fought defeat of **Firing Line** (Line of David) and 'TDN Rising Star' **Dortmund** (Big Brown) in the GI Kentucky Derby May 2, Zayat Stables' **American Pharoah** (Pioneer of the Nile) came through for his backers with a much easier success in the GI Xpressbet.com Preakness S. before a record 131,680 ultimately rain-soaked fans at Baltimore's Pimlico Race Course.

The homebred, who Zayat bought back for \$300,000 at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, will attempt to become the 35th horse in history to complete the sequence and the first since Affirmed outlasted Alydar to secure the 1978 Triple Crown. The Preakness score was the sixth overall for an increasingly introspective trainer Bob Baffert and the fourth of his four Kentucky Derby winners to earn the right to press on to the GI Belmont S. with a Triple Crown on the line (Real Quiet, 1997; Silver Charm, 1998; War Emblem, 2002). For jockey Victor Espinoza, who partnered with the latter, it was his third Preakness victory and second in a row. He becomes the first rider in history to be in the saddle for three Triple Crown attempts, and will have ridden the post-time favorite in six consecutive Classics when American Pharoah takes his place at Big Sandy in three weeks' time.

"God willing, he comes out of his race well and we could be talking about history," Ahmed Zayat commented following the win. "How could I be more happy than that? This is a dream come true." **Cont. p3**

Saturday's G1 Al Shaqab Lockinge S. at Newbury may have looked wide open on paper, but in hindsight Richard Hannon had the race in an iron grasp with **Night of Thunder (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) edging out **Toormore (Ire)** (Arakan) for a one-two for the stable and a fourth edition since 2010 for Hannon Sr. and Jr. combined. Sent off the 11-4 joint-favorite, last year's 2000 Guineas hero, who was most recently second to

Charm Spirit (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. on Champions Day in October, raced in a share of sixth early up the middle of the track as the pace proved strong. Sent to the far rail to challenge passing the quarter pole, the chestnut

was soon in front and battled gamely into the headwind to hold off his barnmate by a neck. "He's a big type and he had a puff when he went to win his race, so there has got to be more to come," rider James Doyle said. "This is just the start of his campaign. He has a great attitude--he went down to the start like an old hunter--and full credit to Mr. Hannon, who has done a fantastic job with him." **Cont. p13**

The Genesis of a Dream...

Sent to Zayat homebred Pioneerofthe Nile during his second year at stud in 2011, Littleprincessemma (Yankee Gentleman), a one-time \$250,000 Keeneland September acquisition by Team Zayat, produced the colt who would come to be known as American Pharoah Feb. 2, 2012. The decision was ultimately made to test the market with their colt, and he was entered as part of the Taylor Made consignment at the 2013 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. At the end of the day, the Zayat braintrust decided they could not part with their asset, took him home, turned him over to Bob Baffert and the rest, as they say, is history.

The word was out on American Pharoah and he was the 7-5 chalk for his Aug. 9 debut over the Del Mar Poly, but he had run his race by the time they'd hit the eighth pole and he checked in a midpack fifth. It's the last time he's tasted defeat, and led to the only time in his career to date, that he has failed go off the chalk in any of his trips to the post. Instead he was the second choice to Skyway (Sky Mesa) in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 3, but there were no mistakes this time, as he overcame the inside post to romp by 4 3/4

lengths over Calculator (In Summation), who would go on to flatter the form via his future performances. American Pharoah pummeled Calculator by 3 1/4 front-running lengths in the GI FrontRunner S. at Santa Anita Sept. 27 and would have been a clear favorite for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but the injury bug struck and it was the end of the line for American Pharoah--for 2014, in any event.

While Dortmund and Firing Line were knocking each other around in Southern California and while many of his other peers were hard at work in the other corners of this country, American Pharoah was being brought along slowly by Baffert and the colt registered just a half-dozen works ahead of his sophomore debut in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park Mar. 14. Leaving nothing to chance over a sloppy track and while trying to conserve energy for more important spots along the way, Victor Espinoza was allowed to set a leisurely early pace and American Pharoah never took a deep breath, defeating recent GII Peter Pan S. hero Madefromlucky (Lookin at Lucky) by 6 1/4 lengths. Returned to the midwest for the GI Arkansas Derby a month later, the Zayat runner not only defeated Far Right (Notional) by eight devastating lengths without being fully extended, but he also proved that he could switch off enough in the run to stalk and not lead. That would prove virtuous for his next start.

With those two preps in the bag, American Pharoah headed to Churchill Downs, the target squarely on his back. With a jaw-dropping five-furlong breeze (:58 2/5, 1/33) the Sunday prior, he confirmed the fact that he'd be a handful beneath the Twin Spires. And that he was.

Despite getting a little worked up in the preliminaries and despite having to deal with a draw less than optimal, American Pharoah sat a stalking trip outside of his pacesetting stablemate Dortmund and Firing Line, was floated wide into the lane, but knuckled down and worked his way past the latter to give the Zayats a much-deserved win in the Run for the Roses following a series of tough beats.

Reign Despite the Rain...

Early-week forecasts suggested inclement weather could play a role in the Preakness, but that was subsequently revised and the bulk of the day was run under ideal conditions. About an hour prior to the feature, the skies darkened over Baltimore, winds began to pick up and the track was sealed. At T-minus 10 minutes, the skies opened in a torrential downpour, necessitating the evacuation of the

Pimlico infield, and by the time the field was loaded away shortly after 6:20 p.m., the track had turned into a sea of mud.

"I had a great trip other than I felt like I should have been on a shark or a dolphin," deadpanned Corey Nakatani after riding Calumet Farm's **Mr. Z** (Malibu Moon) to a fifth-place finish. **Preakness S. cont. p5**

Having drawn the one hole, there was always going to be a fair amount of strategizing for Baffert and Espinoza. When the rains came, the pilot filed a new flight plan.

"All changed with the rain, but it worked out well," he explained. "I had to bounce out of the gate to take the lead with all the rain. I took a chance and sent him as quick as I can. Sometimes you have to make decisions. That's my job. Today, I made the right decision."

With the speedy Dortmund drawn alongside and Mr. Z in the three hole, Espinoza had American Pharoah under the proverbial gun and the colt was fast enough to outfoot Mr. Z under the wire for the first time. Dortmund was relegated to third position, while the major development in the second half of the field involved Firing Line, who stumbled out of the gate, could not get a prominent spot and raced four deep into the clubhouse turn. Meanwhile, back on the business end, Espinoza was throwing all caution to the wind and was able to clear Mr. Z, though they had to go the opening quarter in :22.90 to do so. They raced past the 5 1/2-furlong pole in a crisp :46.49, positions largely unchanged, though GIII Coolmore Lexington S. winner Divining Rod had gotten down inside and raced up to within about five lengths of American Pharoah. Things appeared to be getting interesting at the half-mile pole, as American Pharoah's advantage had all but melted away, with Mr. Z prompting right at his saddle cloth and Dortmund poised three deep as the far-turn run loomed.

Divining Rod was also still going well while saving ground and it looked like the stage was set for something special for the final 45 seconds. But with an internal quarter in :24.93, American Pharoah had something left and began to inch clear again three-eighths of a mile down, Dortmund was making hard work of it for Martin Garcia and Divining Rod loomed the only real danger. Still confidently handled at the quarter pole, American Pharoah widened his advantage into the final eighth of a mile and was shown the whip while winning with total authority. Divining Rod tired in the final 150 yards and was caught by longshot Belmont S.-bound Tale of Verve for second. **Cont. p6**

Victor Espinoza was seen on the NBC broadcast dumping rainwater out of his boots from the winner's circle.

"The first thing I thought about is there is SO much water in my boots," he said during the post-race press conference before paying homage to his mount. "Today was an amazing race for him. I couldn't really see how far I was in front because there was so much water in my eyes. I wasn't really worried about it. I was so focused with American Pharoah to see how he is traveling on the messy track."

Baffert's three previous Derby winners had won by a combined three-plus lengths, and the conditioner was counting his lucky starts that he didn't have to sweat it nearly as much this time around.

"I've never won this race so easily and handily," he stated. "The other horse, Silver Charm, it was a dog fight. War Emblem was a tough race (3/4 of a length) and Real Quiet. [American Pharoah] and Victor galloped."

Of the also rans, **Danzig Moon** (Malibu Moon, sixth) and **Firing Line** (Line of David, seventh) were the chief disappointments of the race.

"I never saw him. It was pretty bad," Danzig Moon's trainer Mark Casse commented. "He hasn't stopped coughing since he came back. That happens when they eat all that stuff. God decided he wanted to rain on it, so what do you want to do? It's just frustrating. You work and work and work to get him ready, and you just want to have a shot at a fair race. If they beat you, they beat you. Look, American Pharoah is a good horse, and I think he has a shot at the Triple Crown."

Firing Line's jockey Gary Stevens lamented, "We stumbled out of the gate and that was our race today." Firing Line's trainer Simon Callaghan was non-committal about a start in the Belmont.

Baffert was at first uncertain as to where American Pharoah would be sent to continue his training, but a late-night tweet indicated he would board a Louisville-bound Tex Sutton flight Monday morning.

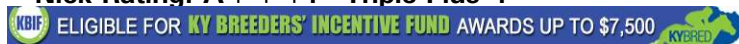

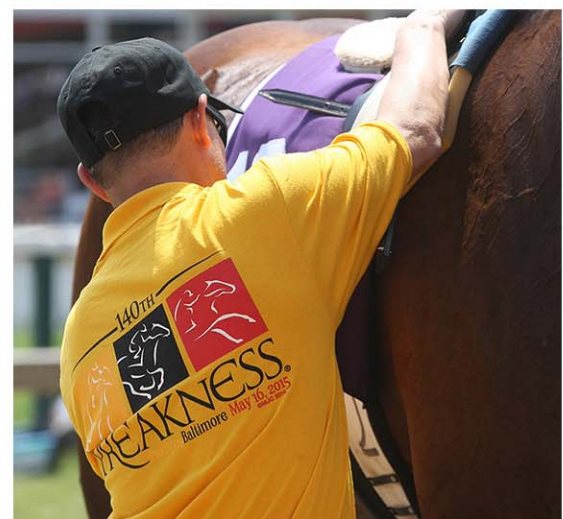

ISN'T IT IRONICUS? DON'T YOU THINK?

Stuart Janney homebred **Ironicus** (Distorted Humor) graduated in his second start at Gulfstream last January and hasn't finished out of the trifecta in seven starts since. The gray was second in an optional claimer last February, third in a yielding Belmont allowance in October and second in an optional claimer at the Big A to wrap up his sophomore season. Ironicus returned after a short time on the bench to annex a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 31 and most recently rallied to finish second by a half-length in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 15.

Ironicus was unhurried as he rated along the rail towards the back of the field early. He inched into contention on the turn and was sitting within striking position at the top of the lane, where he split foes to join the leaders. With a quick turn of foot, Ironicus grabbed the lead and shook loose down the stretch to win going away.

"This race set up perfectly for us. In his last race, the leader just galloped and he made a run but didn't have a chance to win," winning jockey Javier Castellano said.

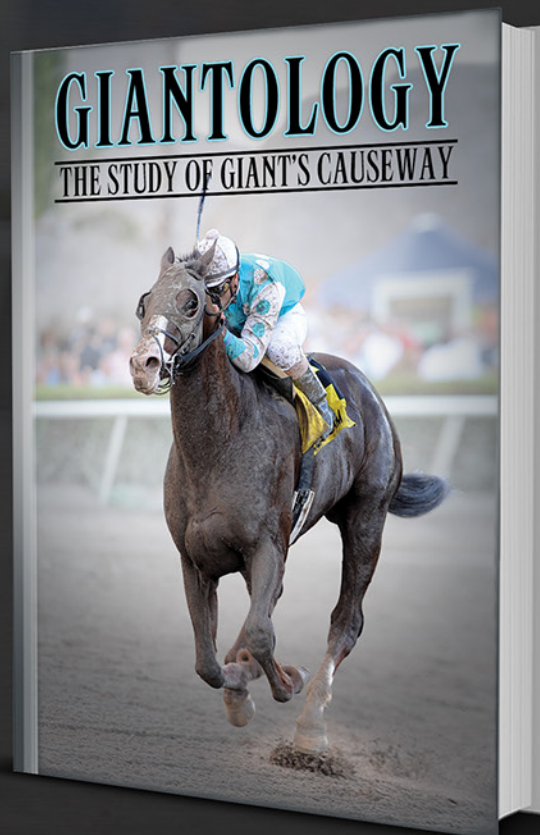

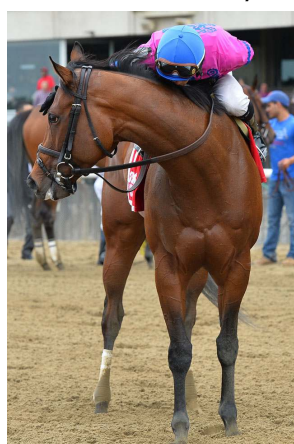

Trainer Neil Howard pronounced himself happy with the third-place performance of Stoneway Farm homebred **Ahh Chocolate** (Candy Ride {Arg}) in Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico and suggested that the filly has earned a crack at more glamorous spots over the coming months. "We haven't stamped anything yet, but we're thinking about all of the appropriate 3-year-old filly races," trainer Neil Howard commented. "I've got to talk to Mr. [Jim] Stone and Terri [Burch]. I think the [GI] Mother Goose [June 27] is on our radar with as good as she ran yesterday. But it's definitely a step forward yesterday." The bay, who belied debut odds of 24-1 to break her maiden at first asking at the Fair Grounds Feb. 21, successfully stretched out to a route of ground with a 1 3/4-length Keeneland allowance score Apr. 8. A handful of lengths off a moderate pace Friday, Ahh Chocolate came with a wide rally and was just outfinished for second by the more seasoned GIII Fantasy S. winner Include Betty (Include). "She came out of the race real good," Howard added. "That [slow pace] didn't help her but we were more than pleased. With that kind of a race with such a lightly raced filly, we were more than pleased."

Divisidero (Kitten's Joy), ultra-impressive in coming from well off the pace to win the GII American Turf S. May 2, returned to the worktab Friday morning, going a half-mile in :49 flat over the Churchill main track. "[I was] very pleased, he really finished up strong and we're just letting him stretch his legs basically because he was needing to do something," trainer Buff Bradley offered. "He came back just like he always does like he hadn't done anything and that's what we were looking for. When he comes back from a work he doesn't even take a deep breath, he's just cool as can be, his ears are forward, and he's looking around like 'Let's do something.'" Divisidero has the \$1.25-million GI Belmont Derby July 4 as a longer-term goal, with one start in the interim to come in the \$500,000 GIII Penn Mile or the \$200,000 Pennine Ridge S., both to be run May 30. "The only thing about the Penn Mile is that I really don't want to back him up to a mile," Bradley stated. "I'd like to keep stretching him out. The race in New York is at nine furlongs so that stretches him out a little bit, too. The Belmont Derby is a mile-and-a-quarter, so were really kind of hoping to get there."

Unbeaten at two and impressive on the second of his two six-furlong starts in the Listed Doncaster S., Night of Thunder received a blow to his esteem when suffering a 4 1/2-length defeat by Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury on his return last April and went to the Guineas with little obvious claims of reversing that form. In the event, he managed just that despite veering markedly across the course under Kieren Fallon, and there are still those who find the result difficult to swallow in light of subsequent events. Brushed aside

again by Kingman in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot as the balance of superiority seemed to be restored, he went to Sandown and finished eighth of nine attempting the 10-furlong trip of the G1 Coral-Eclipse before taking in

the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp after a two-month break. Third to Charm Spirit and stable companion Toronado (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) in that mile contest, he would arguably have had more of a say had he not missed the break and been forced to make up ground as the race was being decided up ahead and more ill-fortune was set to dog him in the QEII. Again, it was Charm Spirit who looked to benefit from his travails as he struggled to find room at a vital stage before charging to a half-length defeat on heavy ground that probably played against him. **Cont. p14**

Able to sit off a fast tempo on this perfect surface, Night of Thunder had some prime talent to stalk in the mare and other joint-favourite Integral (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and Toormore as they laid up close to the pace-setter Yuften (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). Toormore had taken over passing halfway, but--as he hit a flat spot that may have been down to needing this reintroduction--the Godolphin representative was unleashing the acceleration that had won him the Newmarket Classic down the far side. Muscling aside the outsider Arod against the fence as Toormore's second wind saw off Integral, the favorite battled gamely to assert into the headwind.

Hannon is keen to keep the first two apart now. "Night of Thunder looked to me like he was going to win very well and then just got tired, as he's had a long time off the track, and Toormore has run a super race so I couldn't be more pleased. I think both of them will improve, and definitely Toormore will. He's been a bit heavy all this year, as he doesn't do too much at home. Night of Thunder shows us a bit more at home, but he too will improve for it."

Hannon continued, "He has nothing to prove now that he's won the Guineas and a Lockinge. They will probably both go to Royal Ascot for the [June 16] G1 Queen Anne S. As the year goes on, the races open up in Europe and they don't have to go for the same ones. These horses have speed and they get a trip. Toormore might get a mile and a quarter, so nothing is impossible at this stage. To get Godolphin and Sheikh Mohammed involved is the ultimate compliment and this horse has gone and done the business."

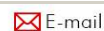
James Doyle, in his first season with Godolphin, was typically humble reflecting on his initial Group 1 success in the royal blue.

"I thought I would have a chance of four winners today, but it has been a good day," Moore said. "Pity I didn't win the Lockinge. I can't remember how many five-timers I've had--not enough!" *Racing Post*

"I'm just getting to know him and if I had my time again, I'd probably have done things differently and waited as he got a bit tired, but I wanted to secure my pitch against the rail. He is a hardy horse and he still stretched all the way to the line--he didn't stop and that's what I like."

He added, "This is what I want, this is what John Ferguson wants and what His Highness Sheikh Mohammed wants. Days like today are important and it's a feeling of relief for everyone." 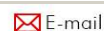
BOTTI HOLDS ITALIAN DERBY ACES

Italian champion trainer Stefano Botti will saddle a record six horses Sunday at the Capannelle in the G2 Derby Italiano. The 39-year-old Botti--who has a record of three wins, three seconds and two thirds with 17 Derby runners since he became the Master of Cenaia's training center in 2009--holds all the aces. Three of his horses are owned by Scuderia Effevi, who purchased a share of the unbeaten **Goldstream (Ity)** (Martino Alonso {Ire}) and also has the undefeated filly **Sound Of Freedom (Ire)** (Duke Of Marmalade {Ire}), the winner of the G3 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas), who can become the first female to win the Italian Derby since Archidamia in 1936.

Another Botti charge, **Time Chant (GB)** (War Chant), registered a career high when landing the Listed Campobello Nov. 1 at San Siro. **Roccia D'Oro (Ire)** (Rock Of Gibraltar {Ire}) is unbeaten in two starts and **Firun (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) snatched the Premio Guido Clerici, a well reputed Derby trial, Apr. 11.

Trainer Bruno Grizzetti bids for a third Derby win with **Azari (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}) who finished fast to grab second behind Hero Look (Ire) (Lope De Vega {Ire}) in the G3 Italian 2000 Guineas. **General Sherman (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) was third there, and is expected to improve with the step up in trip. **Greg Pass (Ire)** (Raven's Pass) strolled home in his debut Mar. 28 at San Siro, and stepped up to collect a brave win in the Listed Premio Emanuele Filiberto four weeks later.

German raiders have won the Italian Derby three times, and this year Peter Schiergen will send **Graasten (Ger)** (Sholokhov (Ire)), an unexposed dual winner. Jens Hirschberger will saddle **Summer Paradise (Fr)**, a well regarded son of Authorized (Ire), who opened his account in his third start in a maiden at Hannover May 3. The colt in entered in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. **Field p15**

With Ballydoyle supplying only a likely bit-player this time in **Kingfisher (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), it looks likely that Moyglare Stud's **Forgotten Rules (Ire)** (Nayef) will be able to extend his perfect tally on the level despite a penalty accrued as a result of his

stood still over the winter that Bjorn Nielsen's homebred can turn the tables on five-pound better terms, but Forgotten Rules appeared highly progressive in 2014 and a defeat would be a disappointment.

"We're very happy with Forgotten Rules and hopefully with a few more showers, he'll get his ground and he should run a very good race," trainer Dermot Weld said. "He's still a big, immature horse but he's improving all the time."

Biographer's conditioner David Lanigan is hopeful of a bold show from the British raider and told *PA Sport*, "He's done well over the winter and this is a nice race to start him off. If the ground is right, he'd go to [Royal] Ascot and I don't think the [Gold Cup] trip would be a problem at all. He's a lazy horse in his races and gives himself every chance to stay."

Military Attack was free of excuses when beaten 3 1/4 lengths here last year and it has been something of a frustrating year for him since joining the barn of Caspar Fownes. He owns a single victory over 1600 meters from his five starts and has acted like a horse whose age may be catching up to him. He was most recently seventh in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 26, but possesses the inherent class to bounce back here.

No locally based runner has been successful in the SAI Cup since Ouzo (NZ) in 2000, but **Stepitup (Aus)** (Hussonet) will represent perhaps the best chance of righting that wrong. Winner of 10 of his 25 starts, the 5-year-old has rounded into his best form of late and dove home late to best Singapore Gold Cup hero **Quechua (Arg)** (Pure Prize) in the Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Kranji Apr. 26, with **Wild Geese (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) a close fourth.

Lucky Nine (Ire) (Dubawi {Ire}) returns to arguably his favorite venue as he goes in search of a third consecutive win in the KrisFlyer, however his form has been far short of his best this term. The 8-year-old is

winless in five appearances since defeating **Emperor Max (Aus)** (Holy Roman Emperor {Ire}) and **Zac Spirit (Aus)** (Flying Spur {Aus}), including a ninth in the Apr. 26 Sprint Cup at Sha Tin. Instead it will likely be his compatriot **Aerovelocity (NZ)** (Pins

{Aus}) who will go favored, and deservedly so based on his body of work. Victorious in the G1 Longines Hong Kong Sprint in December, he added the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen in late March and looks to add yet another international Group 1 here.

PARX JOCK GRANTED STAY AMID BUZZER DISCOVERY; BACK IN SADDLE SATURDAY

Angel Castillo, who was abruptly removed from his mounts and ejected from Parx racetrack on Tuesday after Pennsylvania Horse Racing Commission officials allegedly linked him to the discovery of an electrical horse shocking device in a common area of the jockeys' quarters, has been granted a stay and ride five mounts on Saturday.

Castillo's reinstatement and the disclosure that there will be a hearing to adjudicate the matter was confirmed by the jockey's attorney, Alan Pincus.

Since Tuesday, multiple phone messages left for Walter Remmert, the acting executive secretary of the PHRC, have gone unreturned.

"They've given him a stay. He's back on. We are supposed to be having a stewards' hearing in the next few days, where he will be vindicated," Pincus said. "They got the wrong fellow. I think that they are starting to understand that, but we have to go through the hearing process."

According to Pincus, regulatory officials at Parx "shook the jockeys' room down" between races four and five on Tuesday, using a metal-detecting wand to search for an illegal shocking device. Pincus said he could not speculate on whether officials were acting on a tip or if they singled out specific riders.

Both Castillo and his locker were searched and no illegal device was found, Pincus said.

Castillo was then allowed to go down to the paddock to ride the next race. But in the interim, according to multiple news reports, a so-called "battery" or "machine" was found in a common area of the jockeys' quarters. Allegedly, the electrical device was concealed within or attached to a riding glove bearing the initials "A.C."

"I haven't seen the glove, but Mr. Castillo routinely lends gloves to other jockeys. I think that was the case that sent them in the wrong direction," Pincus said.

Castillo was then taken off his mounts, detained, and then escorted off the premises. Adding to the confusion, Pincus said Castillo, a native Venezuelan, does not speak English, and the jockey was not given any paperwork indicating that he was officially suspended or charged with a violation of racing rules.

"It's our opinion that in a rush to judgment, the commission got the wrong fellow," Pincus said.

Pincus said security camera footage in the jockeys' room could possibly be used to exonerate Castillo, but "I haven't been able to get access to it."

Pincus said it was his understanding that even though the ejection took place at the behest of the racing commission, Castillo's hearing would take place before the Parx stewards.

"They've assured me it will take place during the next sequence of racing dates," Pincus said.

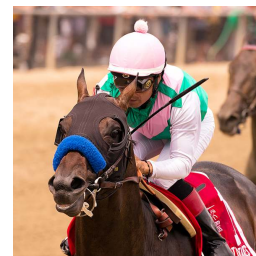

The Kentucky-bred failed to stay after employing front running tactics when stepped up to 1 1/16 miles in the GIII Coolmore Lexington S. behind GI Xpressbet.com Preakness S. third Divining Rod (Tapit) at Keeneland Apr. 11 and was looking to improve with first-time blinkers in this class drop. This is basically a speed horse that really should be going one turn. Going into today we had to plan a little differently. I told the jock [Martin Garcia] to get out there and make them catch him." 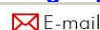

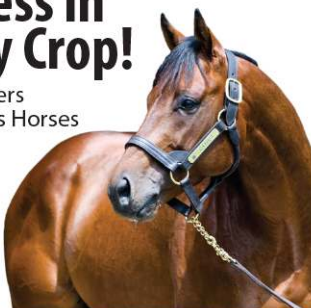

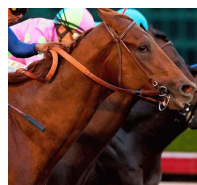

Crystal Zvezda did a lot wrong when slowly away and keen before staying on into a non-threatening third to the smart Marsh Hawk (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}). More professional when taking a Lingfield maiden on the Polytrack over the same trip late the next month, the bay was tucked away by her conditioner, who has proven so adept at handling the family. With Ryan Moore wearing that air of invincibility that comes chasing a fifth win in six races on this valuable card, the chestnut was guided across from her

widest draw to tag on to the back of the field near the rail. Lit up temporarily by that maneuver, the homebred soon settled and was waiting for the command still at the tail of the field with three furlongs remaining. Gradually angled out, Crystal Zvezda produced the kind of acceleration that marks her out as a leading Oaks candidate when in the clear down the center and had gone from the back to a dominant force in less than 100 yards. With the race already decided at the furlong pole, she was pushed out with tender hands to assert her clear superiority over all bar the favorite Pamona, who stayed on strongly after a troubled trip.

For winning trainer Sir Michael Stoute, the result was a poignant one. "The mare had a Frankel foal this week, but didn't survive and before Mrs [Renee] Robeson died in the spring she told me she thought she was sending me the best she had ever bred," the master of Freemason Lodge said. "She's a quality filly with great acceleration, but she's taken a long time to come to herself this spring and hasn't handled the bad weather. I only decided a week ago I would get her moving and the [June 5 G1 Epsom] Oaks is certainly a possibility, but we'll see how she comes out of this. She's well-entered and will continue to be."

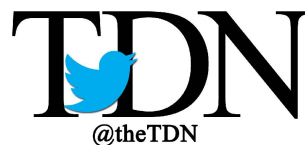
