After a few anxious moments for takers of the 2-5 on offer, the bay got to the long-time leader **Ivawood (Ire)** (Zebedee {GB})

and **Endless Drama (Ire)** (Lope de Vega {Ire}) just before the 100-yard pole and stayed on to best the latter by 3/4 of a length to provide Aidan O'Brien with a 10th renewal. For Ryan Moore, the triumph represented a third mile Classic so far in 2015, and he was quick to excuse the winner's less-than-flashy performance. "That ground is just slow enough for him and it just blunted his pace a little bit, so I'd be very happy with him," his rider commented. "He had the gears and class to go through the gaps, as he didn't have a lot of room. I felt I was on the best horse and he put his head down and fought at the end." **Cont. p8**

FRAMMENTO WORKS FOR BELMONT STAKES

The GI Belmont S.-bound **Frammento** (Midshipman), 11th in the GI Kentucky Derby, put in another workout over the Oklahoma Training Track in Saratoga Springs Saturday morning. With a trackside temperature of 38 degrees at 7:30 a.m., the chestnut worked four furlongs in :49.30. "He worked great," Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito said. "We're happy with it. He galloped out nicely. Everything went good. He has been developing nicely. I'm excited about going to the Belmont; it's nice to have another chance." Frammento, owned by Nena Moss of Mossarosa LLC, is expected to be Zito's 25th starter for the Belmont. Both of Zito's Belmont wins spoiled Triple Crown bids; in 2004, Birdstone beat Smarty Jones and in 2008, Da'Tara defeated an eased Big Brown. "We always have a good Belmont," Zito added. "Our horses always run good in the Belmont. That's what you hope happens. Hopefully, we'll be OK." Frammento followed a third-place finish in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 21 with a fourth-place finish in the GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 4. Mike Smith will ride in the Belmont.

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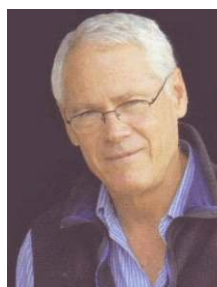

'PHAROAH' GALLOPS AGAIN AT CHURCHILL

American Pharoah (Pioneerof the Nile) continued his preparations for the GI Belmont S. by galloping 1 3/16 miles over the Churchill Downs main track under regular exercise rider Jorge Alvarez Saturday morning at 8:30 a.m. It was the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner's second time galloping over the track since arriving at trainer Bob Baffert's stable Monday. Baffert's chief assistant Jimmy Barnes continues to be pleased with American Pharoah's training since capturing the second leg of the Triple Crown. "These are just our easy days, so we're basically just keeping him happy and keeping some weight on him," Barnes said. "We don't get serious until another week or so." Baffert will return to Louisville for a one-day stopover Tuesday and will determine when American Pharoah will work. "He hasn't decided whether he will have one or two workouts," Barnes said. "He should be letting me know soon." Barnes added that the Zayat homebred will likely ship to Belmont Park Tuesday, June 2.

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The new *TDN* Topics feature ([click here to read TDN Topics: Should the Crop Be Banned?](#)) creates a great opportunity for those of us who care about the long-range health of racing to stand up and be counted. Therefore, I am moved to write one last time, despite being "retired" from 40 years of handicapping, betting, pedigree analysis, breeding, and racing.

The question: Should crops be banned?

My belief: Crops should not be banned. Crops need to be carried for jockey and horse safety, plain and simple. Crops are an essential tool as an aid in focusing a horse and controlling a dangerous situation.

It is not crops, but *whipping* that needs to be banned.

To me, discussion of whether whipping actually hurts horses or not, or whether whipping is necessary for optimal performance, is just a lot of blah blah blah. When our racing industry continues to decline year after year because of public perception, the realities of punishment or abuse are irrelevant. Public perception is everything. **Cont. p4**

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If we wish to thrive in the future, we need to ban whipping to bring in enough new fans to grow the sport. End of story.

It's a reality of life that many would-be fans are turned off because of whipping. (One neighbor at my Kentucky Derby party watched American Pharoah get whacked over 30 times in the stretch and said, "If he were hitting a dog or even a chicken, he'd probably be thrown in jail"). My neighbor is not the Lone Ranger. There are many out there like him. All we have to do is ask our neighbors what they think (or ask our young daughters). At the end of the day, it doesn't matter if the horse is being hurt or not; only the perception matters. It defies basic business sense as well as common sense to keep on whipping.

It's not easy to change a culture created by habit. Contemporary jockeys whip because for the last 100 years they have always whipped. It's what they know. It's what they've always seen. It's what they've always done. Jockeys are not the bad guys in this, however. The fault lies in the rules.

In an "animal welfare world," we need to step back and get enough perspective to see that what has worked historically is now out of step with the times and with the future. The rules need to be changed and then enforced for all to see. Simply put, we need to ban whipping in order to grow our fan base and we need to grow our fan base in order to gain back lost media coverage throughout the year.

I agree with Graham Motion's perspective that the sport will not be harmed if whipping is banned. Over time, jockeys will adjust to the new level playing field and bettors will not see a change in their win percentage. The serious handicappers and horseplayers among us might even find more satisfaction.

Those of us who have bet on and watched thousands of races (in my case many thousands of races at more than 40 tracks) have torn up countless tickets when jockeys have snatched defeat from the jaws of victory with their use of the whip. If you are someone who watches closely, how many times have you watched a rider reach back to whip and get out of sync or lose momentum? How often have you seen a horse shy, veer, or duck in or out because of whipping? The way I see it, we won't be giving up much and the hard-core gambler part of me would be very happy if no one carried whips except for safety.

If we go hands and heels and use a crop for safety and control only, we will find out which jockeys have the most talent and horsemanship (meaning the best hands, communication, timing, and athleticism). We will also find out which racehorses are the soundest and most genuine. The best horses and jockeys will prevail and we will always have a winner. And, if we are smart in this way, maybe our industry can regain some of its lost stature in the hierarchy of American sports.

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LOTS A LEMON IN THE SELENE

A pair of fillies by Lane's End stalwart Lemon Drop Kid look to lead the market for Sunday's GIII Selene S. at Woodbine. Pin Oak Stable's **Don't Leave Me** is batting .750 coming into her second start of the season, including a perfect two-from-two mark over Polytrack. The narrow winner of her rained-off six-furlong debut last August, she annexed a seven-furlong allowance over the turf in her next appearance, but was a disappointing sixth to Conquest Harlanate (Harlan's Holiday) in the

GII Natalma S. to close an abbreviated freshman campaign. The gray, a daughter of See How She Runs (Maria's Mon)--winner of the 2002 Selene when it was a Grade I--made the most of her 3-year-old bow when swooping seven wide into the lane before finding the line 3/4 of a length best in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Park Mar. 21.

Where as Don't Leave Me has experience over the synthetic surface, Woodford Racing's **Season Ticket** will be making her first appearance on the track--on raceday, in any event. The Ontario-bred has made each of her four starts on the turf, winning her maiden going a mile at Gulfstream Jan. 4 before finishing unplaced in two subsequent runs, including a 10th in the GIII Florida Oaks. She regrouped in a first-level allowance going 9 1/2 furlongs at Keeneland Apr. 24, coming from next to last in that field of eight to be a strong second. She figures to take her fair share of money, though her two local breezes would appear to leave something to be desired.

The latter's stablemate **Ol' Fashion Gal** (Sky Mesa) will also be stepping onto the Polytrack for the first time, but in contrast to Season Ticket, her morning trials appear more promising. Winner on short rest of the 2014 GIII Jimmy Durante S.--the former Miesque S.--at Del Mar last November, the chestnut has been well-beaten in a couple of starts this term, including a latest ninth in the Apr. 4 GIII Providencia S. on the grass at Santa Anita.

Less than 3 weeks after Juddmonte's homebred **BRAGGING** prevailed in the Group 2 Charm Spirit Dahlia Stakes at Newmarket, a continent away, **XTRA LUCK** won the Grade 3 Louisville Handicap at Churchill.

Third in the GII Bessarabian S. on the main track in November, she was fourth in both the Jan. 4 GII Monrovia S. and Feb. 8 Wishing Well S. down the hill at Santa Anita. The chestnut most recently finished fifth, beaten just 3/4 of a length, going this distance in the GIII Willshire S. in Arcadia Apr. 26.

Well back early behind solid early splits, **Sky Treasure** revved up at the top of the lane and worked her way through a seam and out into the clear in midstretch as one of some six or seven rivals lined up across the track. Second choice **Deceptive Vision** dug in when joined on her outside by **Sky Treasure**, but the latter simply had too much left and pulled clear to seal the deal.

"She's always been a really nice filly, closing," offered winning rider **Gary Boulanger**, who had piloted **Sky Treasure** for the first two starts of her career as well as the **Bessarabian**. "I always thought a lot of her, and didn't get to ride her a whole bunch. She has a big move if you ride her right. I got a perfect trip through the turn, and I really hadn't asked much of her. I split horses, got outside of [**Deceptive Vision**], and she gave me a gear and spurred right by her. It worked out great for us today."

The winner's second dam is dual Canadian champion **Bold Ruritana**. **Sky Treasure** has a 2-year-old half-brother by **Red Giant** and a yearling half-brother by **Harlan's Holiday**.

Gleneagles was so authoritative in the G1 2000 Guineas three weeks ago that few expected a reversal in this Irish equivalent, but the panache that had characterized his performance at Newmarket was missing on this ground, which had dried from yielding to good by the off-time. Some of his juvenile displays had also lacked flashiness, but the handsome bay only seems to know how to win and it is no coincidence that he has been readily compared to his dam's full-brother, Giant's Causeway, by those closest to him. This may have been the slowest surface that he had encountered so far in his career, however, having glided over the slick turf when capturing the G1 National S. here and Longchamp's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere that he later lost in the stewards' room. Anchored behind Convergence (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) early with the outsider Mohaayed (GB) (Intikhab) keeping him in a pocket on the fence, Gleneagles was over two lengths adrift of Ivawood as the gap opened by Convergence drifting left passing the quarter pole.

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Without the push-button acceleration that was on offer in the 2000 Guineas, Ryan Moore had to become animated, but he waited with the whip until a furlong later as his mount arrived between Ivawood and Endless Drama. In front shortly after, he was pushed out to the line as Gleneagles appeared to idle in customary fashion.

"He's got a real flowing action and the quicker the ground, the better it is for him," Moore said. "He really impressed me at Newmarket, but I felt I got there a little too soon and he switches off so it was really a matter of getting a run at some stage. They went a good gallop and it sorted it out for the better horses to come to the fore. He took a while to get into gear on that ground, and he only does what he has to do."

Aidan O'Brien and the Coolmore team's quandary now is whether to stick to the plan of bypassing Epsom in favor of the "Iron Horse" route, which takes in the June 16 G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot.

"He was trained hard for Newmarket and did three half-speeds since, so he was ready for today but it was borderline whether we would run on this ground," the Ballydoyle conditioner explained. "He showed today that he is courageous as well as good, and Giant's Causeway was like that. To win a Guineas on this ground at The Curragh, you usually have to get a mile and a quarter, but I always thought he was a miler--Giant's Causeway with more speed."

O'Brien added, "He sailed through :11 furlongs at Newmarket, so the bottom line is he's fast and is a very good horse, and it's up to the lads to decide where he goes. He's the best miler we've had, I know that, but he wants fast ground to be at his best and I'd be surprised if he ever wins by very far."

John Magnier also revealed that the decision to leave him in the June 6 G1 Epsom Derby had been made after dinner with Lester Piggott. "The next thing is probably to think about the St James's Palace and the Derby is unlikely, but we left him in after I had dinner with Lester and we reminded each other that when he rode The Minstrel in this he got off and said he'd ride him in the Derby."

Magnier added, "You probably saw the real Gleneagles at Newmarket and ground conditions weren't in his favor today, so let's see at Royal Ascot."

Endless Drama's trainer Ger Lyons said of the runner-up, "It's all systems go for the St James's Palace, subject to everything being okay. He showed he gets a mile well and it took what Aidan says is the best he's had for a while to beat him. He needs to be dropped in and ridden like that. In a good race you can do that. He should improve again."

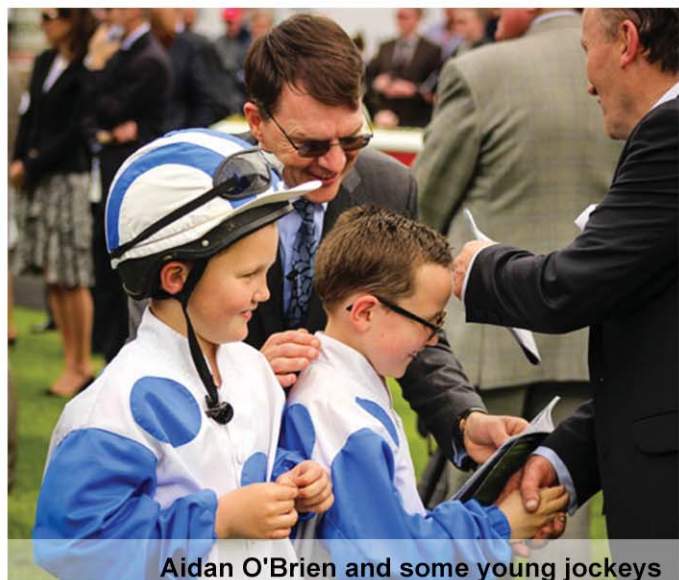

Second to War Command (War Front) in the G2 Futurity S. over seven furlongs here at two, Mustajeeb returned at three to annex the G3 Amethyst S. at a mile at Leopardstown prior to finishing third behind Kingman (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) in testing ground in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas back here in May. Dropping back to seven to win the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot the next month, the homebred re-appeared to be second in the G2 Clipper Boomerang Mile back at Leopardstown in September prior to finishing sixth in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile. Able to lay up easily with the early pace in fifth here, the chestnut was sent past Majestic Queen and to the front with 150 yards remaining and the result was decided there with his excess stamina kicking in as Maarek closed.

"I feel vindicated, as I've been saying for a long time that he is a six-furlong horse," winning jockey Pat Smullen commented. "He has so much pace and could be a very good sprinter this year. I made too much use of him in the Breeders' Cup from my inside draw and he showed so much speed there he could never have got home doing that." Trainer Dermot Weld added, "The G1 Diamond Jubilee S. [at Royal Ascot June 20] is the race for him. We wanted to see how he did over this trip and he's answered the call."

Mustajeeb's third dam, Allez Les Trois (Riverman), produced the G1 French Derby scorer Anabaa Blue (GB) (Anabaa), as well as the dam of dual Group 1 winner and sire Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef). His fourth dam is Allegretta (GB) (Lombard {Ger}), the dam of Urban Sea and King's Best.

Introduced at her trainer's favorite Galway festival in late July, Brooch captured a weak-looking maiden by 9 1/2 lengths and managed the quick step up into black-type company with aplomb when following up in the Listed Vincent O'Brien Ruby S. over an extended mile at Killarney three weeks later. Left alone until the G3 Denny Cordell Lavarack & Lanwades Stud Fillies S. at Gowran Park a month later, the homebred improved again to register a third straight win over another furlong before being allowed a winter's rest. Picking up where she left off here, Brooch showed her inherent

talent to rescue the reputation of a race with a possibly over-inflated status. Positioned in third early under Pat Smullen, she looked to be temporarily in trouble as Ramone cruised to the lead approaching the quarter pole, but soon built a head of steam to reel in that rival and dominate the last 1 1/2 furlongs.

"She was a big, unfurnished filly last year and the boss was very patient with her," her rider commented. "She's filled the frame over the winter and ideally she could go further than this, as she was on her head a bit early on." The owner-breeder's racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe added, "She's done it well and we have to try and find out how good she is in the top races now. I would think Dermot [Weld] will want to head to the G1 Pretty Polly S. [at The Curragh June 28]."

Beset by niggles and rarely getting the ground with his preferred cut, the relatively unexposed Pearl Secret at last delivered on his immense promise to claim a career high here. The powerful chestnut, who hit the board in the 2013 G1 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot, had registered almost as many missed engagements as he'd had runs, and lined up for this straight dash coming off an eighth in the May 10 G3 Prix de Saint-Georges at Longchamp on seasonal return. Runner-up in this last year, he made little impact in his second stab at the King's Stand, finishing 10th, but gained a confidence-boosting win in the Aug. 30 Listed Beverley Bullet Sprint. Pearl Secret then ran fifth, to the re-opposing G Force (Ire) (Tamayuz {GB}), in the Sept. 6 G1 Sprint Cup over this course and distance, and closed out last term with a 14th, albeit just three lengths off the winner, in the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye at Longchamp. Jockey George Baker took an immediate pull to anchor the eventual winner at the back of the field. Easing into contention from halfway, the 6-year-old swooped for control just inside the eighth pole and was driven out to hold on gamely from Jack Dexter. "We went a good, strong gallop, which was ideal as he's a big, strong horse," explained rider George Baker. "He relaxed into a lovely rhythm and probably got there a little too soon. He idled a bit when he got to the front, but boy he's a smart horse on his day. If there's some rain about for the top five-furlong races then I think he's got a really big one in him." Trainer David Barron added, "He'll be in all the big sprints, but the ground wouldn't want to be any quicker for him than it was today."

Still green when third in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. over seven furlongs here in September, Michael Tabor's daughter of the accomplished miler Red Evie (Ire) (Intikhab) struck gold in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp in October, where she powered away from Ervedya (Fr) (Siyouni {Fr}). While that G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches heroine may have been compromised by the way the race panned out, the form has a solid look with the next four fillies home all looking above-average. Second in the seven-furlong G3 Athasi S. on her return--in the heavy conditions in which most of the stable's horses seem to under-perform--here 20 days ago, she has been wound tight in the interim.

"We were hoping the ground wouldn't be as bad as it was for her last time, and she got stuck in the mud after traveling well," explained O'Brien, who is seeking a seventh edition. "It was good for her and for Ryan to get a feel of her and the petrol ran out near the end. She came out of it well and this is the race we were looking to get her really started in. Hopefully, she'll travel well and have a nice run and we will be looking forward to seeing what she does after that."

Ballydoyle is also represented by the fascinating **Kissed By Angels (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is herself a daughter of another high-class miler in Lillie

Langtry (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), and last year's G3 C L & MF Weld S. winner **Qualify (Ire)** (Fastnet Rock {Aus}). The former looked a class act when putting **Devonshire (Ire)** (Fast Company {Ire}) and **Stormfly (Ire)** (Dark Angel {Ire}) in their place to break her maiden in the G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial over this trip at Leopardstown May 10, a week after Qualify had suffered a contrasting fate when last of 13 in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. "Kissed By Angels won her trial in Leopardstown very easily and Qualify had a disappointing run in the Guineas, but we think she'll leave that well behind," O'Brien added.

Jim Bolger had spoken of heading towards the Irish Oaks with **Pleascach (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) after the homebred's highly impressive win in the May 13 G3 Blue Wind S. over 10 furlongs at Naas with the proviso that this would be a target if she showed him the right signals in the interim. Her inclusion has to be proof that she is in prime condition, and she appears to be one of the versatile performers her trainer excels with. "I'm not so sure about the mile, but she's a talented filly and we are going to be there and hope for the best," he said.

His Highness The Aga Khan has yet to win this Classic, but in **Raydara (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) he has a live contender with solid formlines. Beating the subsequent G2 Rockfel S. winner and 1000 Guineas runner-up Lucida (Ire) (Shamardal) in the G2 Debutante S. over seven furlongs here when last seen in August, the homebred was forced to skip Newmarket three weeks ago and trainer Mick Halford's patience could be rewarded on home soil. "The plan was to go to Newmarket for the 1000 Guineas, but she just wasn't sparking at the time and we said we would just wait for this weekend," he told *PA Sport*. "She has been to the racecourse for a gallop and I'm happy with her. Her form from the Debutante S. looks rock-solid and was well advertised in the English Guineas, so you'd be hopeful she could run a nice race, but a Classic is a Classic."

Dermot Weld has some serious ammunition this term, and in addition to the Apr. 12 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial scorer Stormfly, he has the untapped potential of **Joailiere (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}) to call upon. The latter, who sports the Moyglare silks carried to glory by Trusted Partner in 1988, was off the mark by seven lengths on debut over seven furlongs at Gowran Park Apr. 11 and has earned her ticket here with some solid homework.

Third in the Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial on unsuitably soft ground in only her second outing, **Military Angel** (Big Brown) remains an unknown quantity and at least has a faster surface to aid her. "She'll really appreciate better ground and I'm looking forward to running her," trainer Michael O'Callaghan told *PA Sport*. "I thought her run in the trial was very good. It was only her second ever start and she'd never encountered that sort of ground. The first few pulled a long way clear and she had Legatissimo in behind her that day, so the form is exceptional."

WELCOME GREY

Despite its prestigious honor roll, The Curragh's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup has come under scrutiny from the European Pattern Committee of late, and the exclusion of Ireland's most exciting older horse, Free Eagle (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}), from the latest renewal serves as a body blow. Thankfully, **The Grey Gatsby (Ire)** (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) is on hand to add vital bolster to Sunday's edition, and add more luster to the fairytale for small-time owner Frank Gillespie. When the smart, but seemingly exposed, grey caused an upset in York's G2 Dante S. in May, it was viewed as something of an aberration, but after his emphatic follow-up success in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club at Chantilly at the start of June, he had to be taken more seriously. It was only when beating Australia (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in Leopardstown's G1 Irish Champion S. in September that the grey ensured his place at the top table. Second to Solow (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) in the nine-furlong G1 Dubai Turf at Meydan Mar. 28, the grey is reported nearer to his peak condition by trainer Kevin Ryan.

"We didn't go to Dubai all guns blazing and he hadn't come in his coat," he told *PA Sport*. "Coming back in trip wasn't going to be ideal on a sharp track, but the horse took no harm. The 10 days out there did him good. It helped his coat to progress and he enjoyed it. We have him in good shape and we've left a bit on him to go to Ascot. The Curragh will suit him. It's a big, galloping track and hopefully he'll get some pace in the race."

Two years on from his first top-level success in this, John Deer's **Al Kazeem (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}) is back seeking a fourth in this sphere. Second to Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Champion S. at Ascot in October and to Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in the May 3 G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp, the 7-year-old is close to coming full circle since re-entering training with Roger Charlton after his failed stint at stud. "He looks great and is finally getting his summer coat," his conditioner said. "He looks big and burly, but that's how he is and he does as much work as I give him. I took him to Newbury on Sunday to work and he seems fine. He's taking on children, compared to him, and they are improving but I imagine he'll run very well."

One of the "children" that Charlton is referring to is Sheikh Mohammed Obaid Al Maktoum's **Postponed (Ire)** (Dubawi {Ire}), who excited when dominating the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York over 12 furlongs and who made a satisfactory return when second in the G3 Gordon Richards S. over a quarter mile shorter at Sandown last time Apr. 24. "Postponed is very well; I've been very happy with him," trainer Luca Cumani told *PA Sport*. "I hope the ground is suitable. He's a much better horse when it is good or faster, but I understand it is supposed to dry out as the weekend goes on."

THE EAGLE'S LAIR

While the catalogue of accomplishments of **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) is thickening all over the world year upon year, there is no doubt that Longchamp is where he is happiest, and therefore hardest to quell. Of the 20 occasions that the country's most popular horse has turned his attentions to the

Bois de Boulogne, he has been successful on 13 of them as well as being demoted in last year's G2 Prix Dollar, which would have been his 11th pattern-race win here were it not for the stewards' intervention. On Sunday the 9-year-old bids for back-to-

back renewals of the G1 Prix d'Ispahan, in which he also finished second during his campaigns in 2011 and 2012 before being stripped of the silver medal in the latter race due to a prohibited substance. In his latest display of verve when upstaging the slightly younger Al Kazeem (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the May 3 G1 Prix Ganay, Cirrus des Aigles demonstrated that he still carries the fire, but he has a different task at hand this time faced with the relatively youthful **Solow (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}). So dominant when dealing with The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) in the nine-furlong G1 Dubai Turf at Meydan last time Mar. 28, the Wertheimers' 5-year-old is attaining an air of invincibility.

"He was very impressive in Dubai and came out of it very well—he never felt the race and took it well," trainer Freddy Head said ominously for the diehard Cirrus fans. "I was very pleased, as I wasn't sure he would travel that well, but he adapted very well. He is bred to run over a mile and a half and even two miles, but a mile or an extended mile is fine for him and I think he might get a mile and a quarter now, as he's more relaxed. We'll see what he can do, but he could be very good. From the first day I had him, I thought he was something special."

Cirrus des Aigles' trainer Corine Barande-Barbe told *PA Sport*, "Christophe Soumillon judged the ride right in the Ganay and he knows the horse very well. He lets Cirrus des Aigles do what he wants—the race was not hard for him and his rhythm was perfect. That win gave us a lot of pleasure and he has been doing very well since then." **Cont. p13**



Aside from this obvious match, it will be interesting to see how close OTI Management Pty Ltd and Alain Chopard's habitual front-runner **Gailo Chop (Fr)** (Deportivo {GB}) finishes off them at the business end. Not seen since wiring Deauville's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano over 10 furlongs in August, he has winning form here from the G3 Prix la Force and G3 Prix Noailles last April.

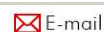

GULFSTREAM PARK TO SUBSIDIZE SHIPPING COSTS THIS SUMMER *By T.D. Thornton*

In an attempt to bolster the horse population during the summer months, Gulfstream Park will pay for shipping costs incurred by racing outfits that want to either relocate or return to south Florida, Gulfstream Vice President of Racing P.J. Campo said Saturday.

"If guys are looking for spots, or if they have an overflow of horses that meet the conditions, we'd love to have them," Campo said. "We've been working [to defray costs] with some outfits from Ocala from the farms, and if some new outfits would want to come between now and September, we would work with them," Campo said.

The news of the subsidy comes on the heels of

Friday's announcement that the Gulfstream-owned Palm Meadows Training Center will remain open during summer months for the first time since its construction in 2002.

"Obviously with Palm Meadows staying open it gives us access to more space," Campo said. "We're full here at Gulfstream Park [1,350 horses] and we're filled at Gulfstream Park West [435]."

Last summer, in an attempt to avoid head-to-head race meets

at Gulfstream and Calder Race Course, Gulfstream agreed to lease Calder for a 40-day autumn race meet.

Rebranded "Gulfstream Park West," the dates swap satisfied Calder's statutory requirement to maintain casino operations while giving Gulfstream control over Thoroughbred racing in south Florida.

As part of that agreement, the main stabling area at Calder was to remain open only through Jan. 1, 2015. After that, Gulfstream and the horsemen had the right to use only 435 stalls for six more years [the length of the horsemen's gaming-revenue agreement with Calder].

In late December, Churchill Downs Inc., which owns Calder, erected a fence around 60 barns in the main stabling area and began evicting horses for an unspecified construction project. As a result, hundreds of horses either had to vacate the property or get relocated to temporary stalls in tents in a parking lot and along a maintenance road.

The situation grew tense and there were implicit threats that the horsemen might withhold simulcasting rights from CDI entities as retribution for the Calder stabling shutdown. That did not happen, and the problem was partially resolved by the construction of 150 new stalls at Gulfstream and the spring migration of the horse population to northern racing circuits.

When asked if the South Florida stabling crisis from last winter had finally reached an equilibrium, Campo said, "we really didn't have a stabling crisis. That wasn't our issue. That was Churchill Downs's issue."

According to Equibase, racing will continue at Gulfstream through Oct. 3 before moving eight miles west to the Calder property for the Gulfstream Park West meet Oct. 7-Nov. 28.

"We've had an outstanding April, we've had a great May, and we just want to continue that through the Gulfstream Park West meet and then back into the winter Gulfstream Championship meet," Campo said. "At Palm Meadows we have about 250 horses, so we're sitting pretty good as far as horses for the summer."

Campo said horsemen from anywhere in the country are welcome to query him with a shipping request.



FOOD TRUCKS BRING OUT THE CROWDS AT MONMOUTH *by Ben Massam*

With a massive crowd of 23,483 on hand Saturday at Monmouth Park, Robert Kulina, president of Darby Development--which operates the venue--said he couldn't be happier with the public's reception of both the annual Food Truck Festival and the racing product. Monmouth paired a 12-race card with the first day of a weekend-long culinary event featuring 38 food trucks parked in the backyard.

"We're having a very good day," said Kulina from the Oceanport racetrack Saturday afternoon. "Everything's packed. We have the makings of a great weekend."

The Food Truck Festival, which was held for the first time as a single-day event during Memorial Day weekend of 2012, has expanded every year in response to heightened public interest.

"We maxed out in the size of the grounds at 22 or 23 trucks, and then we expanded it out to the parking lot," added Kulina. "We now have 38 trucks. It's a great way to introduce Monmouth to a lot of new people."

While bringing more patrons through the gates at Monmouth is surely the immediate goal, Kulina said he believes that a broader initiative must be taken by all storied racing venues to expose younger fans to Thoroughbred racing.

"I think it's the obligation of places like Monmouth Park, Del Mar, Keeneland and Saratoga to introduce racing to new fans," he continued. "All of us have these old venues that are historically well-maintained. If we can do this with these other great tracks, it will create a lot of new fans. I'm probably one of the few people in the industry that doesn't think the game is anywhere near dead. Every industry has to change the marketing mix of their product, and I think we have done that a lot here in the last decade."

As the crowds continued to pour in Saturday at the Oceanport oval, Kulina added that he hopes a memorable Memorial Day weekend will translate to return visitors during the track's other high-profile events. Father's Day [June 21] and the Fourth of July weekend historically attract large crowds of younger fans, while the GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 2 serves as the annual racing centerpiece of the meet.

"We do five of these food-type events in the course of a season, and they're all different," concluded Kulina. "We've had great success with them."

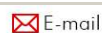

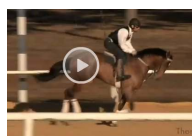

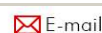
