With defeat in last term's G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier interrupting a streak of eight consecutive wins, **Solow (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) added luster to Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's Super Sunday with an authoritative score in Longchamp's G1 Prix d'Ispahan. The homebred grey, who is rated as Europe's top performer on the Longines World Rankings, was so impressive when annexing the G1 Dubai Turf at Meydan in March and turned this return to home soil into another victory parade as old stager **Cirrus des Aigles (Fr)** (Even Top {Ire}) failed to shine on the ever-drying turf. Steadied in third spotting **Gailo Chop (Fr)** (Deportivo {GB}) five lengths on the front end, the 3-5 favorite quickened to the fore passing the eighth pole and needed minimal encouragement from there

to easily account for the longtime leader by 1 1/2 lengths. George Strawbridge's consistent yardstick **Sparkling Beam (Ire)** (Nayef) at last got her Group 1 placing and was two lengths adrift at the line, while Cirrus des Aigles faded from an initial second when push came to shove and finished the same margin further back last of the four. It was later revealed he had broken a shoe in the running of the race. **Cont. p10**

NOT FOR CACH-ING

Sent to Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Irish 1000 Guineas just 11 days after winning the G3 Blue Wind S. over a quarter mile further at Naas, **Pleascach (Ire)** (Teofilo {Ire}) justified the boldness of her breeder, owner and trainer Jim Bolger to provide Coolcullen with another Curragh Classic. With a perfect pace scenario tracking a pair of her stable's lesser lights, the 11-2 second favorite was in front from the quarter pole and saw off the 5-4 crowd's choice, **Found (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), to prevail by a half-length. There was a brief period of anxiety for Bolger, as the winner had to survive an inquiry into possible interference to the runner-up in the finale. "She spotted something and shifted left in the last 75 yards, but I wasn't worried as the runner-up was a long way away from me," rider Kevin Manning commented. **Cont. p7**

Sheep Pond Partners tasted success at the Arcadia oval when their talented filly Lady Eli (Divine Park) whooshed home to land the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' Turf, and that group teams with prominent New York owner Michael Dubb on the Chad Brown-trained **Danza Cavallo (Fr)** (Sunday Break {Jpn}). The bay made 11 trips to the races in France, but only twice did she face her fellow females while winning three of those starts, including the Listed Prix Madame Jean Couterie in her final appearance at Vichy last July. Hard Not to Like (Hard Spun) would have been one of the favorites for last Saturday's GIII Gallorette H. at Pimlico, but was taken out of that race by Clement in favor of this spot. Victorious in the 2014 GI Jenny Wiley S., the Ontario-bred was purchased for \$1.5 million at last year's Keeneland November sale and came home first in Tampa's GIII Endeavour S. Jan. 31, only to be disqualified and placed second behind the Brown-conditioned Testa Rossi (Fr) (Dr Fong). The 6-year-old mare exits a third to another Brown inmate, Ball Dancing (Exchange Rate), in defense of her Jenny Wiley title when last seen Apr. 11.

Moulin de Mougin (Curlin) was extremely impressive in annexing Del Mar's GII John C. Mabee S. going this distance, then miraculously avoided catastrophe when she slipped and fell off the final turn in the GI Rodeo Drive S. The Ran-Jan homebred was given plenty of time to bounce back and was ambitiously spotted against males in the Apr. 4 Thunder Road S. going a flat mile. She came home a never-in-it ninth, but figures to come on for the effort, and a repeat of her Mabee success lands her right on the wire. Her chances will be done no harm by having drawn the one hole here.

A trio of runners will be cutting back from the 10 furlongs of the GII Santa Barbara H. Apr. 18. **Queen of The Sand (Ire)** (Footstepsinthesand {GB}) was just able to overcome the modest fractions set on that occasion by **Fanticola** (Silent Name {Jpn}) and was able to drop her nose on the wire after being in tight in the final furlong and a half. Fanticola in turn had 1 1/4 lengths on **Three Hearts** (Hat Trick {Jpn}), who was blocked when the real running started in upper stretch.

Ashleyluvssugar is the fourth foal out of Ashley's Folly, who produced a Good Journey colt in 2013, a Good Journey filly in 2014 and a colt by Coil this year.

"[Ashley's Folly] was a pretty darn good mare and everything she's foaled has won a maiden special weight, and now this is her first graded stakes winner," explained trainer Peter Eurton. "Our goal, for me, and I hope it's the same for everyone, is to go in the [GIII 1 3/4-mile] San Juan Capistrano [S. June 28], which has always been a fun race and I've always thought it would be pretty cool to win."

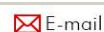

Splitting Bocca Baciata (Ire) (Big Bad Bob {Ire}) and the subsequent Listed Cheshire Oaks winner Diamondsandrubies (Ire) (Fastnet Rock {Aus}) when second in the 10-furlong Listed Salsabil S. at Navan Apr. 18, the homebred stayed at that trip for the Blue Wind and annihilated the smart Zannda (Ire) (Azamour {Ire}), who had previously been a close second in Newmarket's Listed Pretty Polly S. While most would have pointed at the middle-distance Classics after that Oaks prep, Jim Bolger has always thought outside the box and diverted her here with the Irish forecast mainly dry for once. Although the ground came right for Pleascach, the draw of 15 was unfavorable, and it a short took time for Kevin Manning to organize her from that wide posting. Soon perfectly positioned in third, she was provided with a genuine tempo set by the predetermined stable rabbit Mainicin (Ire) (Teofilo {Ire}) and even enjoyed the unexpected additional help of fellow barnmate Steip Amach (Ire) (Vocalised) just ahead. Left in front and there to be shot at from the quarter pole, she saw off the smooth-traveling Bocca Baciata first before having to battle harder as Ryan Moore delivered Found inside the final furlong. Despite veering into that rival's space late on, there was every chance for the hot favorite to claw her back if she was able. "It's very satisfying and a great day," Bolger said after the announcement came from the officials that the result would stand. "It's hard to win any big race in Ireland, but to win a Classic with one of our own is the stuff that you dream about and it doesn't happen very often. The ground was a big factor here and the good ground was a requirement, even though she coped well when it was on the soft side at Naas. We had a half-length to spare at the line and even with drifting left, I don't think the runner-up had any chance of beating her."

Bolger is now eyeing an audacious tilt at the G1 Irish Derby back at this venue June 27. "She's very likely to go straight there and then to the [July 18] G1 Irish Oaks after that," he said. "I've never run a filly in the Derby before, but it has been won by a few fillies and she's probably the best one over a mile and a half that I've had. She's better than most I've had. Entering her in the [Irish] Derby wasn't so much what I thought about her, it was really what I thought about the colts, with all due respect to our neighbors. We think she's very good--she's right on that level with the colts. She's explosive, just like her name."

Aidan O'Brien said of Found, "She got beaten, but ran a good race and it was a big step up on the last day. It's now a case of whether she goes up to an Oaks trip, but the lads will decide on that over the next few days. Jim's filly is very good and she just got away from us and was gone."

Pleascach becomes the sixth Group 1 winner for the Bolger homebred Teofilo. Bolger purchased Pleascach's dam, Toirneach, for \$110,000 at Keeneland September in 2006 through BBA Ireland and trained her to pair of wins.

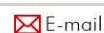

Two years on from his defeat of Camelot (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) in this prize, Al Kazeem came full circle with a typically tenacious fourth top-level success and first since returning from a failed spell at stud. Runner-up to Cirrus des Aigles (Fr) (Even Top {Ire}) in the 10-furlong G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp last time May 3, the 7-year-old started just minutes after his Ganay conqueror had flopped uncharacteristically in the G1 Prix d'Isphahan, but he proved that consistency is its own reward by upstaging a trio of much-younger rivals.

Settled in third by James Doyle early as Postponed led, the bay was asked to join the action as the ultimately disappointing The Grey Gatsby (Ire) (Mastercraftsman {Ire}) tackled the long-time leader inside the last quarter mile. As that 11-10 favorite began to lose momentum, Al Kazeem muscled his way between the pair with a furlong remaining and battled gamely as the closer, Fascinating Rock, launched his

challenge out wide. For James Doyle, the win had a rare emotional depth coming on the horse that provided his first in this category in 2013, and on whom he had captured the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Eclipse in the same year before upstaging on Noble Mission (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the

G1 Champion S. in October.

"He's done everything for me and standing here two years ago, it was a new thing for me so I can't speak highly enough of the horse," he commented. "The ground today was perfect. He doesn't need any jar in it and I just felt it was a bit holding in France the other day and he got a bit stuck. He showed his class and traveled so well and when I got a gap I knew he'd take a bit of beating. He has even perhaps quickened up a bit these days--at the three [pole] I was cantering all over them." Trainer Roger Charlton added, "He's amazing, looks amazing, is brave and all you need in a good racehorse. I'm lucky to have one as good as that and to have him back from stud. I'd say it's my proudest moment. As long as he's enjoying himself, he'll keep going and one day I'm sure he'll go back to stud. It's a great credit to his constitution that he never runs a bad race. He's never looked at another filly and just gets on with his work."

Charlton added, "He'll probably go next for either the [June 20] G2 Hardwicke S. or the [June 17] G1 Prince of Wales's S. and as he's won a Group 1 here, he'll probably go for the Prince of Wales's. A horse like him is good for racing. Jumpers are around for a long time and having him has to be good for racing."

Fascinating Rock's conditioner Dermot Weld said, "He ran the race of his life and I'm very proud of him. If we'd got a drop of rain last night, I think he'd have won as he just changed his legs once or twice in the last furlong and it's cost him the race. He's a Group 1 horse and has always been so consistent."

As he bore down on her nearing the line, Curvy pulled out extra to ward off his challenge and lead home a Coolmore one-two that was not entirely expected beforehand. "She was always a nice filly last year, but was big and weak and has been progressive this season," trainer David Wachman said. "I always thought she would be capable of this level and she is very straightforward, but pulls herself up in front. She could go for the G2 Ribblesdale S. [at Royal Ascot June 18] and likes this ground." **cont. p10**



Aidan O'Brien was not championing the Derby claims of Giovanni Canaletto afterwards. "It looked like Epsom might come a bit quick for him and maybe the best thing might be to go to Royal Ascot or come back here for the [June 27] G1 Irish Derby, but there is a lot to be decided."

"This horse is a champion and is such a fluent mover with a fantastic action," beamed trainer Freddy Head. "When he moved on and quickened, it was so easy for him and the race was over."

"Even though he has won his last two races at nine furlongs, I shall go with my original plan and take him to the [June 16 G1] Queen Anne S. [at Royal Ascot]," Head said. "Ascot's mile on the straight course is a stiff mile and you need to be able to stay to get it."

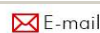

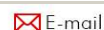

AVERAGE SOARS AT MAGIC OPENER

The Magic Millions National Sale got underway on the Gold Coast Sunday with the first of two sessions of weanlings, and it was offerings from the dispersal of Wood Nook Farm that dominated proceedings. That operation was responsible for the three top-priced lots, headed by a A\$500,000 son of Medaglia d'Oro.

On paper, this year's opening day outperformed last year's, where weanlings from the Teeley dispersal took center stage. Upon conclusion of trade Sunday, the average jumped 41.5% to A\$61,628. A total of 215

youngsters changed hands for A\$8,936,000, compared to 264 sold for A\$8,276,500 last year. The buyback rate was a dark spot, however, jumping to 25.6% from 17%. The halfway mark of trade Sunday saw a sudden flurry of activity when the Wood Nook weanlings were presented, and it was [lot 111](#), a colt by Medaglia d'Oro out of the Group 3-placed Starfish (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), who commanded the most attention, and was eventually hammered down to agent James Harron, on behalf of owners Edmund and Belinda Bateman, for A\$500,000. Starfish, herself a daughter of the G1 Australia S. victress Stella Cadente (Aus) (Centaine {Aus}), has produced the Group 2-placed Wolf Cry (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}) as well as the winning Glenbawn Dame (Aus) (Shamardal), who has won again since the printing of the catalogue. The Medaglia d'Oro colt is her fourth foal. That Darley shuttler has gained acclaim this season as the sire of G1 Golden Slipper winner Vancouver (Aus), and Harron expressed delight with both his new colt and his sire.

"He's an exceptional colt," Harron said. "He's by a great stallion who's making headway in Australia, including the champion 2-year-old in Vancouver and plenty of other top performers. He's doing it in both hemispheres. [The colt] was a stand out for us and I'm pleased to have got him."

Medaglia d'Oro was also the sire of a A\$280,000 filly ([lot 154](#)) purchased by Solis/Litt Bloodstock.

Consigned by Yarramalong Park, the bay is out of See the Music (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}), an unraced full-sister to three-time Group 1 winner Mentality (Aus). Solis and Litt will also take home [lot 15](#), a colt by Foxwedge (Aus) from Newgate Farm. That youngster is from the family of Grade I winners Buryyourbelief, Discreet Cat, Discreetly Mine and Awesome Maria.

The first-crop weanlings by another Golden Slipper winner, Pierro (Aus), are highly sought after, and it was a bay colt by that young Coolmore sire ([lot 109](#)) who made the day's second-highest price of A\$300,000 two lots before the session topper entered the ring. The third foal out of the G2 Wakeful S. winner Rocha (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus})--who has also produced a winner by Medaglia d'Oro and is herself out of the G1 Australian Oaks winner Larrocha (Aus) (Danehill)--was purchased by Segenhoe Stud. The page boasts plenty of black-type, as it is also the family of G1 Victoria Derby winner Blackfriars (Aus) (Danehill). **cont. p14**

"He probably made a bit more than we wanted to pay, but in this market the good types with the pedigree are popular," Segenhoe's Peter O'Brien said. "We like Pierro and we're delighted to have him."

Sandwiched between that pair from the Wood Nook dispersal was a son of the ever-reliable Fastnet Rock (Aus) ([lot 110](#)), who fetched A\$280,000 from Amarina Farm, which also shelled out A\$220,000 earlier in the day for a filly by another proven sire in More Than Ready.

Pierro ended the session as leading sire by average (three or more sold), with six sold of 12 catalogued at a A\$196,667 average. Fastnet Rock was next with five of eight sold for an average of A\$184,000, followed by Pierro's old racetrack rival All Too Hard (Aus) with five of nine sold for a A\$180,000 average.

Reflecting on the opening day of trade, Magic Millions Managing Director Vin Cox said, "It's been quite spectacular. The gross of almost A\$8.8 million is higher than last year's day one gross with 50 fewer horses being offered."

"It's a stunning set of statistics," Cox added. "Our average is up over 40% on last year and over 70% on the sale the previous year. The top three lots of the day were from Wood Nook Farm. We're flattered to have been chosen by Bob and Rosemary Scarborough to hold their dispersal sale and we hope that we did the weanling section justice."

Unlike many of her competitors in these Classics, Mikki Queen was slower out of the blocks as a juvenile, and did not get going until Dec. 7, when she finished second over 6 1/2 furlongs on debut at Hanshin. She graduated by two lengths two weeks later over the same course when given an extra furlong, and was shelved until the Feb. 14 G3 Daily Hai Queen Cup, where she was beaten a quarter-length in second and therefore missed the opportunity to make the Oka Sho lineup. featuring

"I'm so happy she was able to demonstrate her ability," said jockey Suguru Hamanaka, who has ridden Mikki Queen in each start. "I especially concentrated on her break, since she's been struggling at it so far. I thought I would relax her [in the early stages] to get her turn of foot in the stretch. She responded well and quickened being driven, so I just prayed for the best. It was my fault that she wasn't able to start in the Oka Sho, so my hopes to do well today were definitely higher than ever."

Mikki Queen's dam, Musical Way, was purchased by Katsumi Yoshida as a filly off the track for 300,000gns at Tattersalls December in 2008. She has produced four foals in Japan, all by Deep Impact, including a yearling colt by that champion sire.



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Gran Premio 25 de Mayo

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TURF BERTH ON THE LINE IN GP 25 DE MAYO

Ordak Dan (Arg) (Hidden Truth), victor of the 2013 G1 Gran Premio 25 de Mayo, will bid to earn a second trip to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf as the headliner among 15 horses entered for this year's edition of the race on Monday at San Isidro. The 6-year-old, who was sidelined after defeating two eventual G1 Carlos Pellegrini winners in Soy Carambolo (Val Royal) and Going Somewhere (Brz) (Sulamani) when scoring an upset win in the 2013 edition of the race, is rounding back into top form, as evidenced by his runner-up effort in the 2000 meter G1 Gran Premio Miguel Alfredo Martinez de Hoz over the course earlier this season. South America's winningest jockey, Brazilian Jorge Ricardo, has the assignment for new trainer Juan Carlos Etchechoury Jr.

Ordak Dan's biggest challenge may come from recent G1 Gran Premio Republica Argentina winner **Rio Vettel (Arg)** (True Cause), who is unbeaten in two starts on dirt this season and will try to transfer his good form on the lawn. Other contenders include this season's G1 Miguel Alfredo Martinez de Hoz winner **Alma de Acero (Arg)** (Versallesco {Arg}), who will be seeking his sixth straight win; Group 1 winner **Ecologo (Arg)** (Easing Along), conditioned by four-time 25 de Mayo winning trainer Alfredo Gaitan Dassie; and **Forever Sale (Arg)** (Not For Sale {Arg}), hero of the Gran Premio de Honor in April at Palermo.

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"This is a very historic race and is wide open with no dominant figure," said John Fulton, South American representative for the Breeders' Cup. The Gran Premio 25 de Mayo, one of the most important races on the national calendar, will anchor two other Group 1 races scheduled for the patriotic holiday card.
